SUMMARY: There are a total of 28 agreements for approval by the Board of Transportation.

Statewide

North Carolina Department of Information Technology Center for Geographic Information and Analysis (CGIA) This Agreement is to provide Orthoimagery Advisory and Technical Services to the CGIA for the Digital Piedmont 2018 Project in 26 counties. The Agency shall reimburse the Department 100% of the actual cost of all work performed by the Department. The estimated cost of the Department's work is \$149,810.

North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission (WRC) This is a Reimbursement Agreement with WRC to continue funding two (2) positions in the Division of Inland Fisheries over a period of five (5) years. These positions are needed to support project development and review of Department projects across the state. The Department shall reimburse WRC an amount not to exceed \$975,000 for the five (5) year period. This Agenda Item supersedes the item that was approved by the BOT on May 4, 2017.

Division 1

Town of Southern Shores Dare County 44788 This Project consists of drainage improvements at the intersection of NC 12 and Dogwood Trail. The Municipality is responsible for all phases of the Project. This Supplemental Agreement is to increase funding. The Department's original participation was \$150,000. The Department shall participate in an additional amount not to exceed \$100,000 in Contingency funds.

County of Tyrrell 1B.208911 44436 This Project consists of designing a storm drainage system for the vicinity of SR 1209 (North Road Street) and North Boundary Canal in the Town of Columbia. The County is responsible for all phases of the Project. This Supplemental Agreement is to amend the Project scope to include additional construction work and to increase funding. The Department's original participation was \$39,100. The Department shall participate in an additional amount not to exceed \$305,000.

WTRY will perform the work. The Department will participate in the project cost in an amount not to exceed \$743,512.50. All other costs will be paid by NCSPA and WTRY. The estimated cost of the project is \$1,487,000.

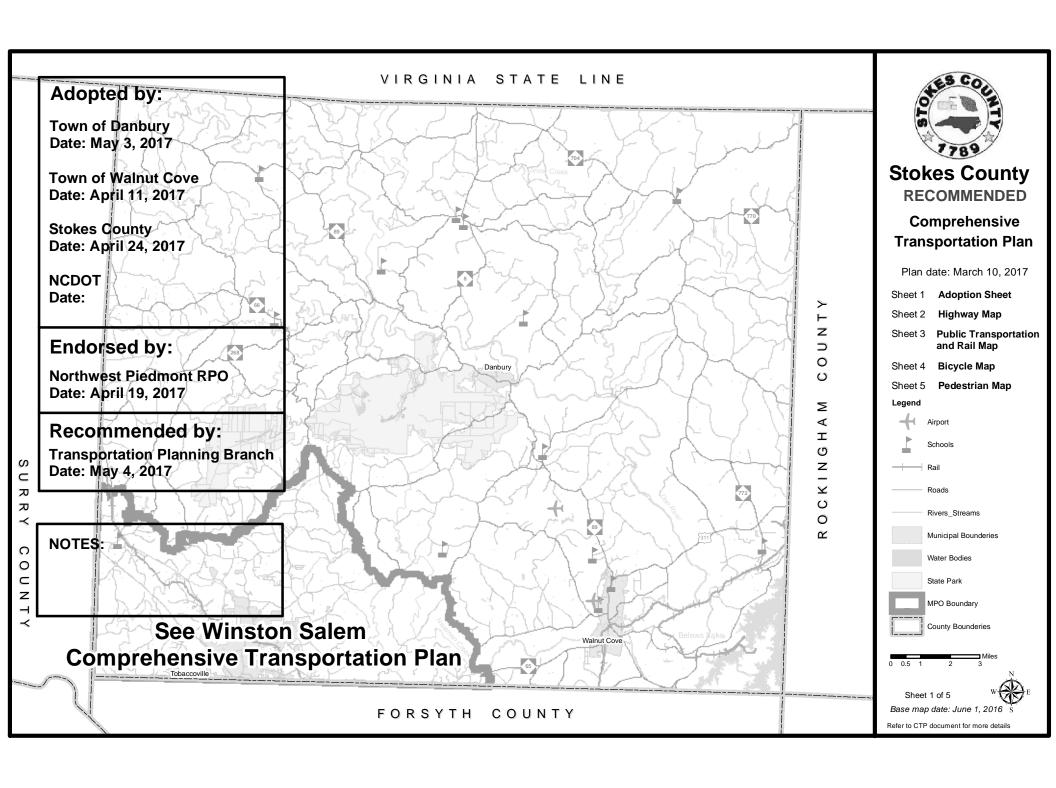

Significant mitigation amounts were accepted by the WRP and paid by the NCDOT before sufficient data was available related to the actual cost of mitigation and agreements were put in place for cost recovery that would not exceed the actual cost of producing the mitigation. Procedures for reconciling such costs are documented through the Inspector General's Office.

According to other terms of that contract, DEQ will be developing endowment estimates for mitigation sites during the coming fiscal year. NCDOT and DEQ will evaluate those endowment estimates and may alter the SFY 2017 / 18 budget to pay endowments for some mitigation sites.

No funds are included for stewardship of NCDOT-acquired mitigation sites.

CFR Planning Framework

Watershed Planning budgets traditionally focus on finding adequate, cost effective mitigation projects that will provide the optimal environmental returns for the state's mitigation investments. The 2017 / 2018 biennial budget includes funding to complete the River Basin Restoration Priority (RBRP) update process and incorporate improvements to modeling capacity. The Division has improved its River Basin Restoration Priority (RBRP) processes to realize cost efficiencies and to improve the utility of planing products. The updated process emphasizes functional analyses at variable spatial scales and data will be used to further support LWP updates within high impact Cataloging Units based upon TIP prioritization.

In addition to the previously approved CF 02/03 regional plan, DMS has incorporated funding for the development of a regional watershed plan in FB 05 in anticipation of extensive future mitigation needs in this service area.

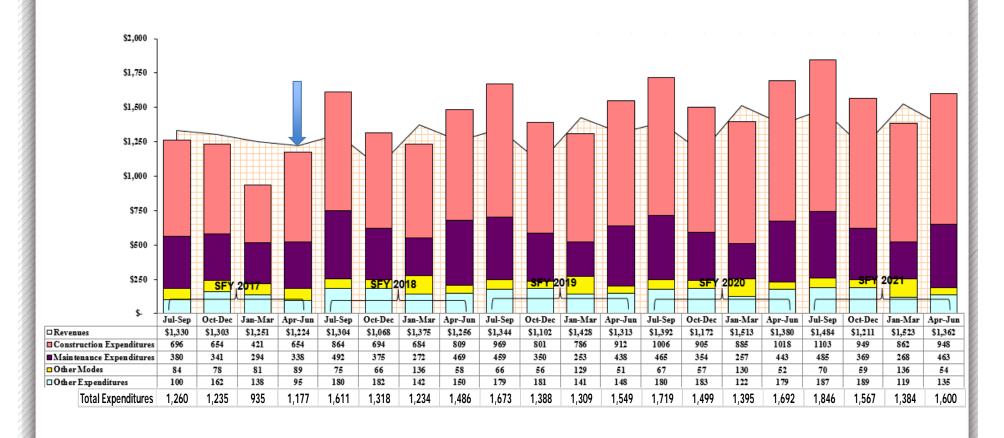

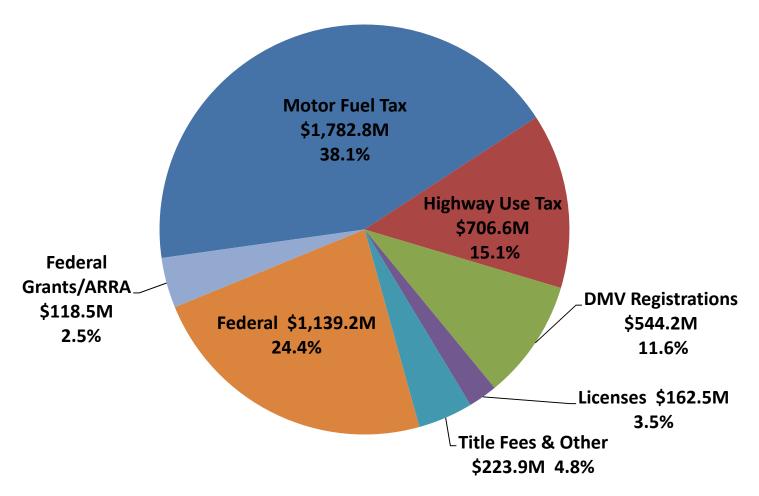

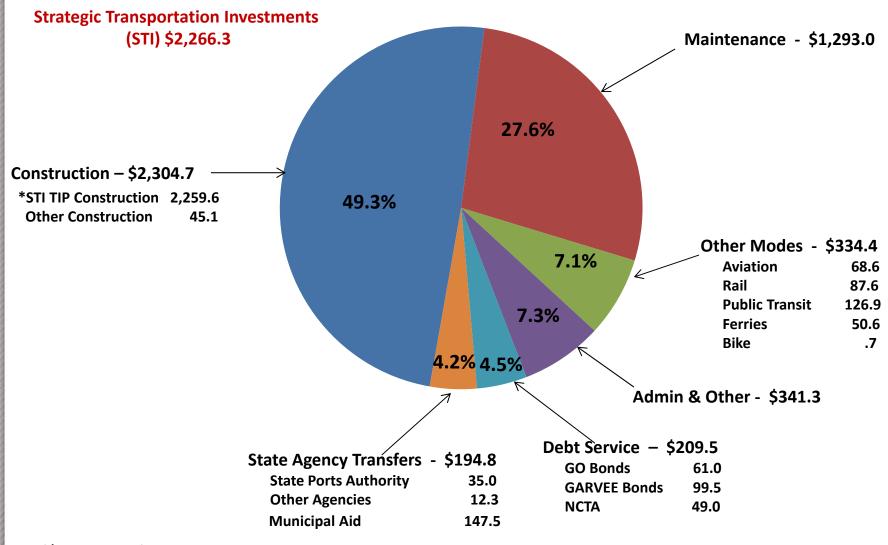
60 Month Revenue & Expenditure Projections as of May 2017



NCDOT Revenue Sources SFY2017 - \$4.7 Billion

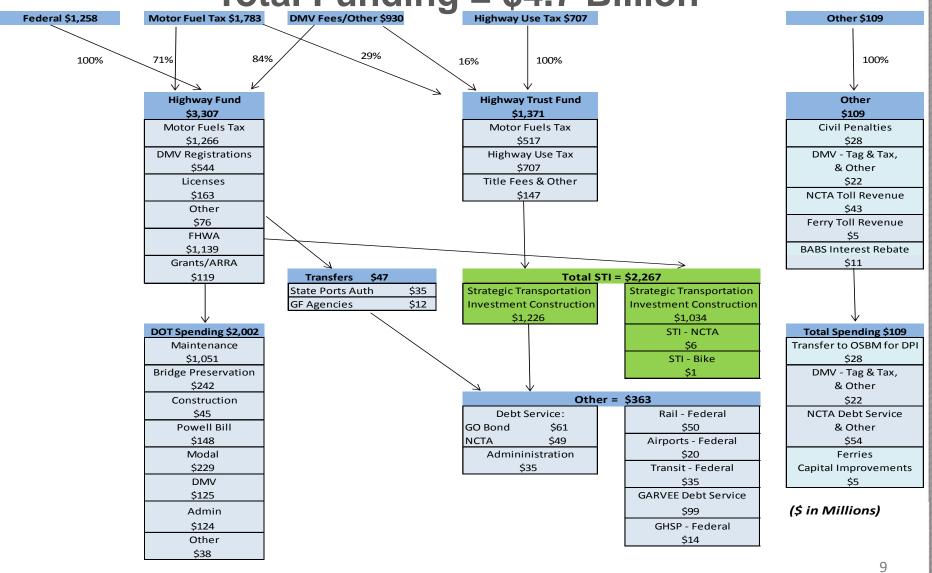


Uses of 2016-17 NCDOT Appropriations Total Funding = \$4.7 Billion

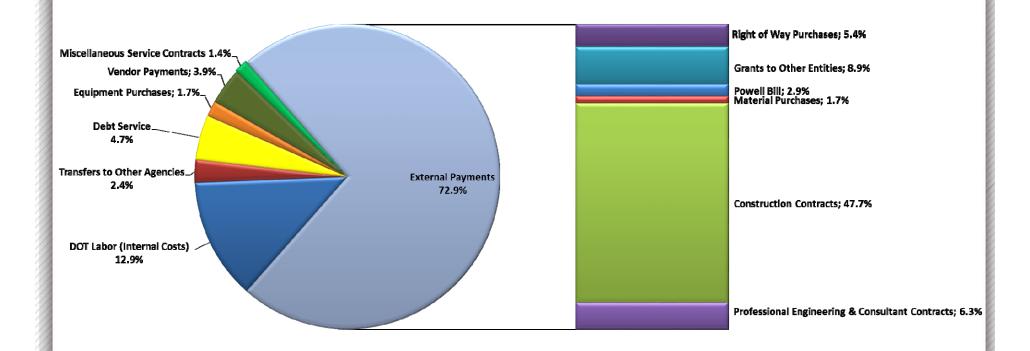

PRODUCT INNOVATION – PATTERN MASKING & PERFORMANCE PAVEMENT MARKINGS

Pattern masking is a black surface coating applied to a pavement surface when traffic patterns for work zones are revised. The masking covers the entire surface to provide a high-contrasting uniform surface to apply the new yellow and white performance lines as seen in the image below.



The placement of performance pavement markings on top of the pattern masking allows for clear lane delineations for drivers in work zones. The use of pattern masking eliminates the need to remove existing pavement markings using mechanical grinding, which may damage the roadway surface and create confusing pavement markings, as seen in the image below.



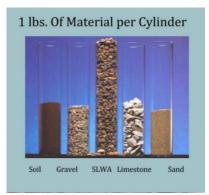
Requirements for the system include:

- A pavement masking thickness of 20 mil to ensure a 12-month service life (typical revised traffic pattern timeframe);
- A matte/non-glossy finish application to prevent glare
- Appling the masking in 6' minimum widths to ensure a uniform application in a lane;
- UV resistance (black color must not fade before 12 months);
- No Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) or petroleum;
- The ability to be resurfaced without removal of the masking and markings.

The pavement masking and performance pavement marking system was first field tested on the US 17/74 project in Wilmington. Lessons learned from the field test have resulted in adjustments which provide enhanced performance. NCDOT now requires this product in all Design-Build interstate projects to improve safety for motorists and workers in addition to saving time and money through the quick application process.

He discussed the various NCDOT programs that remove litter from NC highways, including the Adopt-a-Highway program, the Sponsor-a-Highway program, Litter Removal Contracts, Inmate Litter Pickup and NCDOT forces. The Adopt-a-Highway Program has over 4,700 volunteer groups that cover 9,814 miles. The Sponsor-a-Highway Program is a new sponsorship program that covers 231 miles. The interstate routes are covered 100% with litter removal contracts and the Sponsor-a-Highway program. There are less inmates picking up litter now due to extensive prison closings. Over 5.5 Million pounds of litter were removed from NCDOT roadways in one year. Mr. Lee also discussed enforcement and education efforts regarding litter.

If fatality rate on rural roads increases over a 2-year period, the State must obligate for projects on HRRRs at least 200% of FY09 HRRR program. 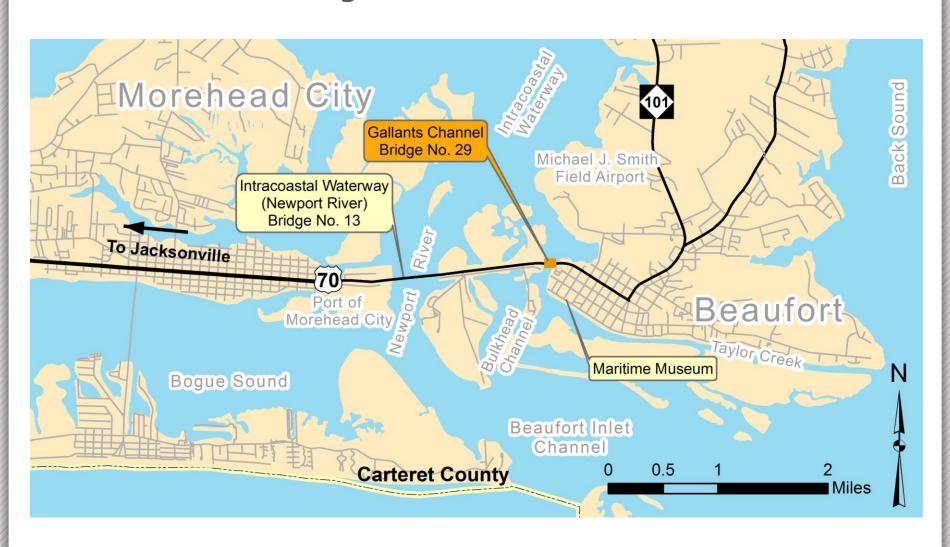

Why is the Project Needed?

- Proposed Improvements (STIP Project R-3307)
 - Widen US 70
 - Replace existing drawbridge (constructed in 1957)
- Purpose of Project
 - Increase traffic carrying capacity of US 70
 - Eliminate delays to both boating and vehicular traffic due to drawbridge openings

Project History

- 1998 Began Planning and Environmental Studies
- Purpose of Project
 - Increase the Traffic Capacity of US 70 by Widening Existing US Highway 70 to a Multi-Lane Facility
 - Eliminate Delays to Vehicular and Boating Traffic Due to Drawbridge Openings by Replacing the Grayden Paul Drawbridge with a Fixed Span High-Rise Bridge

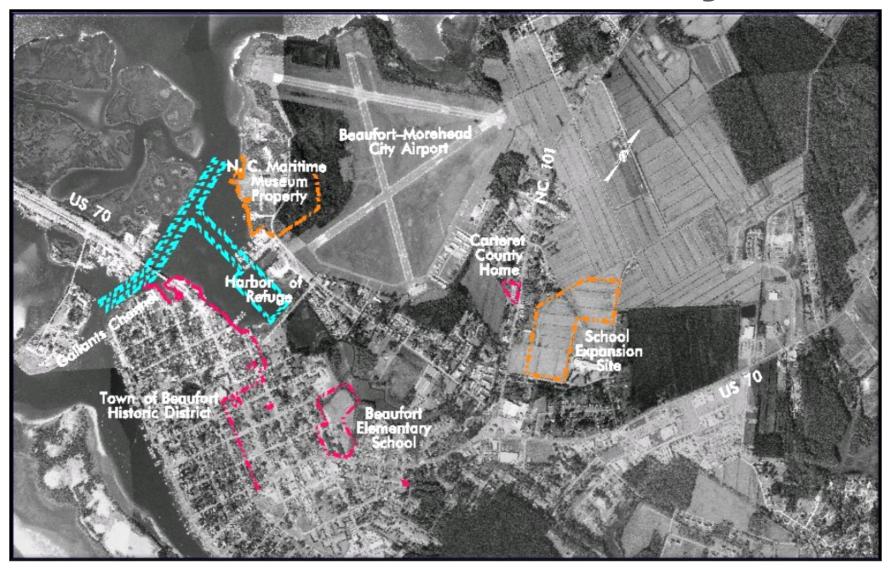

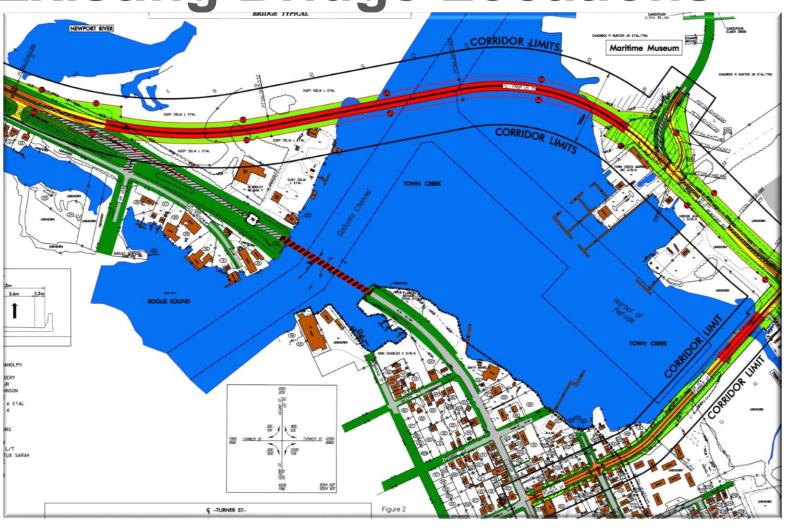

Proposed Bridge Over Gallants Channel

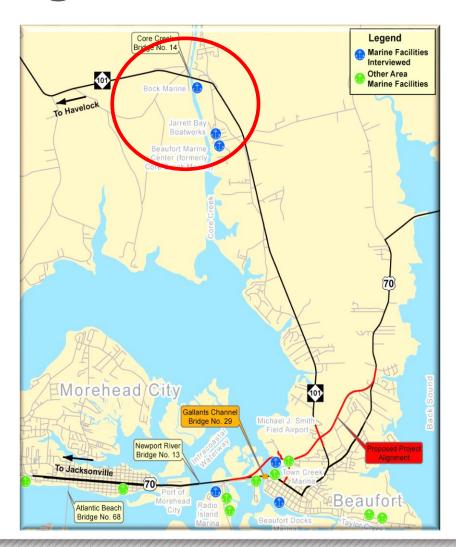


Proposed versus Existing Bridge Locations

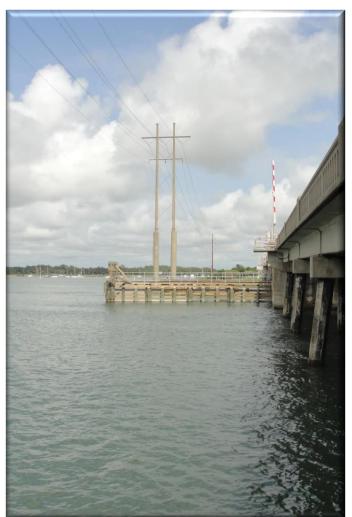

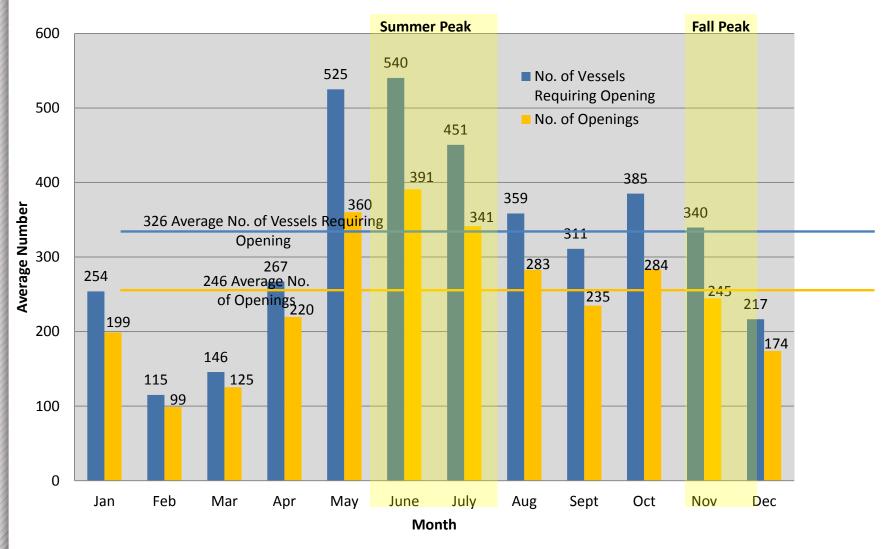

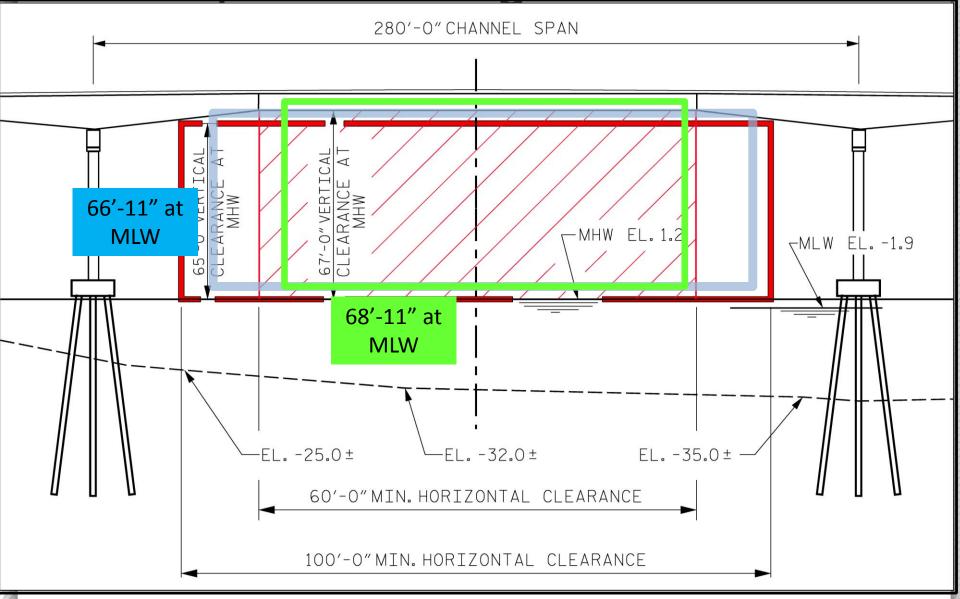

Proposed Bridge Clearance



Marine Assessment: Findings

- Positive impact for Harbor of Refuge and 1 marina; negative impact for 3 marinas
- Bridge height over 65-feet negative impact on airport, require FAA approval
- Bridge height over 65-feet limited due to power lines
- No impact to 99.7% of the vessel traffic (up to 68-feet)
- Only 39 out of 13,420 vessels surveyed (0.3%) unable to travel under the proposed bridge (without adjustment)

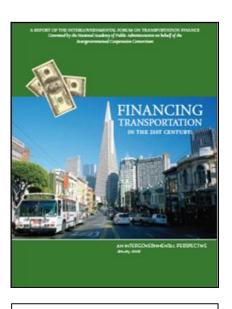


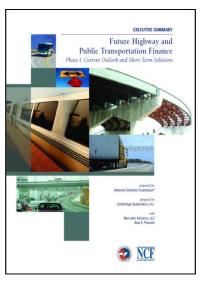
10 Year Revenue Forecast – State and Federal Sources



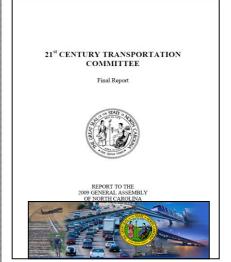

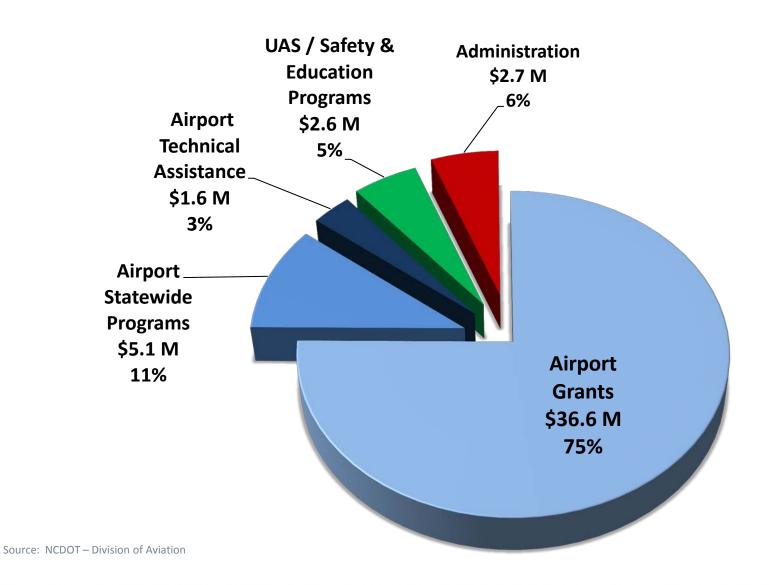

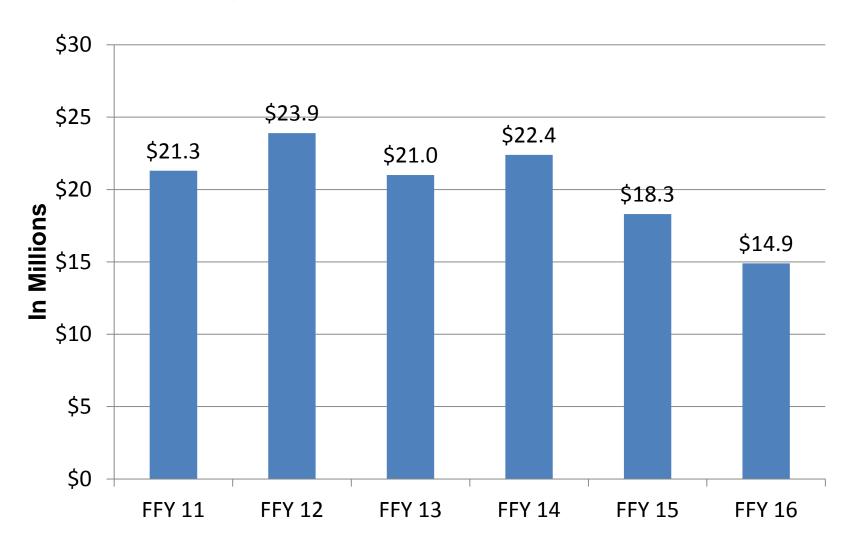

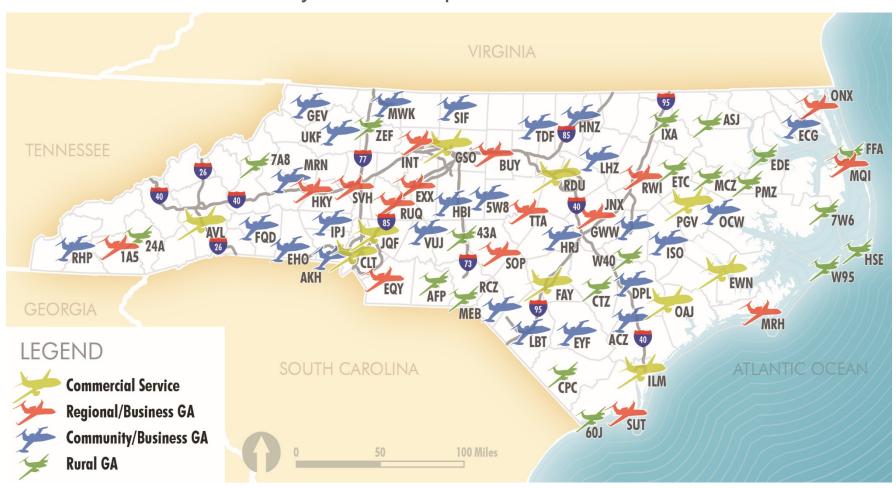

April 2017 service modifications impacted 28 Piedmont trains and 5 Carolinian trains. On April 10, Trains 73, 74, 75, and 76 operated between Kannapolis and Raleigh only, and Train 80 operated between Kannapolis and New York only due to PIP track work. On April 11 and 12, Trains 79 and 80 operated between Charlotte and Raleigh only due to CSX track work. Also beginning April 12, Trains 74 and 75 were cancelled Mondays thru Thursdays for the remainder of the month due to PIP track work, accounting for 20 cancellations. On April 24, Trains 73 and 76 were cancelled due to PIP track work. On April 25, Trains 73 and 76 were cancelled due to flash flood warnings resulting from recent thunderstorms. Disruptions for PIP project work will continue to occur as necessary through completion of the project. Average gasoline prices remained low in April 2017 but were \$0.31 per gallon higher than in April 2016.

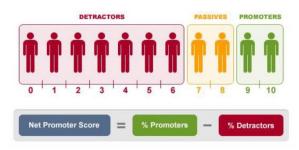
Triangle District (Source: LEHD 2014, All Jobs)

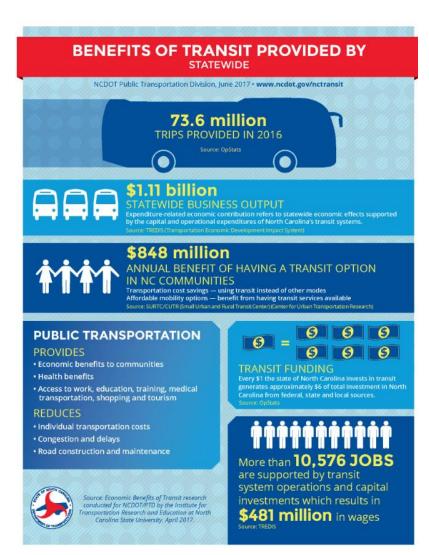

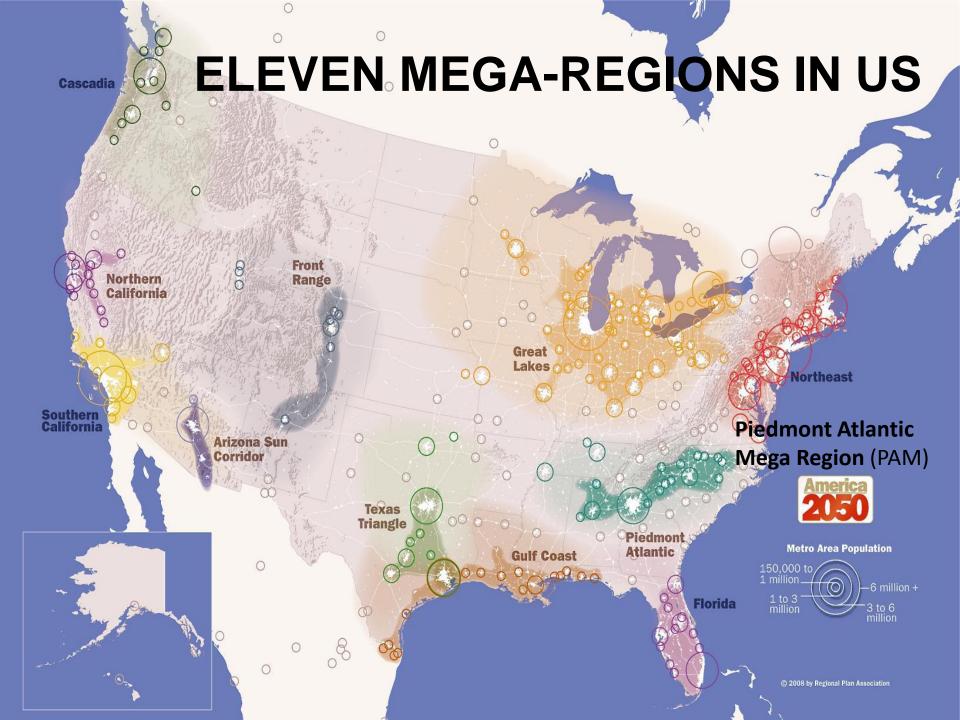

Governor Cooper Announces Borealis Compounds Will Operate New Plant in Alexander County Automotive Supplier Will Create 37 Jobs in Taylorsville

Borealis Compounds, Inc., a supplier of plastic materials to the automotive industry, will locate a new production facility in Alexander County. The company plans to initially invest \$15 million in the new plant and create 37 jobs in Taylorsville.

The NCDOT Rail Division is contributing \$175,000 towards the construction of a 2,000 foot double siding track for this facility.

Coastal Carolina Railway Completes 2014 SIAP Grant Project

Coastal Carolina Railway recently completed a \$1.148M rail improvement project, with half of the funding provided by a grant from the 2014 Short Line Infrastructure Assistance Program. This grant included: the installation of a double one-way low speed diamond with CSX A-Line in Wilson; installation of 438 bridge timbers at MP 126.1; 1,765 cross ties on BH line; installation of 7,920 track-feet of 100 pound rail; and 34,320 track-feet of ballast and surfacing on the ABA line. The improvements will reduce maintenance costs and

greatly improve railroad efficiency in these areas. In addition, the rail replacement on the ABA line will allow for the railroad to handle 286,000 pound cars. The double one-way low speed diamond was completed early last year.

Great Smoky Mountain Railroad Crossing Improvements Completed

The NCDOT Rail and Highway Division 14, along with the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad, recently completed crossing improvements to two at grade crossings on the GSMR's tracks in Jackson County, N.C. The crossings at Barkers Creek Road and Wilmont Road were in poor condition and created a rough crossing for motorists.

The projects consisted of replacing both crossings with a modular concrete "tub" style crossing. This type of crossing provides a smooth surface for motorists and does not require ties or ballast in the

crossing, so it will last for many years and is low maintenance for the railroad.

GSMR contributed the labor for the installations, while NCDOT Division 14 provided the asphalt work and traffic control during the installation process. Rail Division FRRCSI funding provided \$75,000 for materials.

Greensboro Pedestrians and Motorists Learn Lifesaving Rail Safety Tips



On June 2, business patrons, motorists and pedestrians received information about the dangers of walking on or near railroad tracks — tips that could potentially save their life.

The N.C. Department of Transportation's BeRailSafe education initiative partnered with rail safety advocacy group North Carolina Operation Lifesaver to distribute railroad safety information to patrons of businesses along East Market Street in Greensboro, all of which border or are near railroad tracks. Small bags imprinted with a rail safety message were distributed for merchants to share with customers.

"There have been 12 train-related fatalities and 17 injuries in North Carolina since January, all of which could have been avoided," said N.C. Operation Lifesaver state coordinator Margaret Cannell. "This is a critical safety issue that all North Carolinians need to be informed about."

This educational awareness event was part of a 40-country International Level Crossing Awareness Day, which focuses on promoting safe behavior by motorists and pedestrians around street-level railroad crossings and train tracks.

"The tragedy of one train-related death, whether the result of a person trespassing or a motor vehicle crash, tremendously impacts the railroad and the community it serves," said NCDOT Rail Division Director Paul Worley.
"Ultimately, it is up to the motorist to obey all rules of the road and use good judgment when approaching crossings."



Important Rail Safety Tips for Pedestrians and Motorists:

Pedestrians:

- Never walk or run on railroad tracks. Remember: "Tracks are for trains. Stay away and stay alive."
- Walking on or near railroad tracks is dangerous and illegal.
 Trains in North Carolina operate up to 79 miles per hour and can take more than a mile to completely stop. Also, tracks are on private property; you risk being cited for trespassing.
- Do not cycle or operate all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) on railroad tracks or railroad rights of way.
- Do not hunt, fish or bungee jump from railroad trestles. They
 are not designed to be sidewalks there is only enough
 clearance for a train to pass.
- Always look both ways before crossing railroad tracks and cross only in designated areas.
- Do not cross tracks when gates are down.
- Be aware that trains may operate any time throughout the day and night in either direction.
- Do not attempt to hop on board railroad cars or locomotives at any time.

Motorists:

- Always stop your vehicle when crossing gates are down or lights are flashing. Wait for the crossing gates to rise and lights to stop flashing. Look both ways, listen, and proceed with caution.
- Never stop your car on railroad tracks. When approaching an intersection at railroad tracks, keep your car behind the white lines.
- If your car stalls while crossing the tracks, get out immediately and call 911 or the emergency notification number located on a blue sign on the railroad signal equipment. If a train is coming – abandon your car! Proceed quickly toward the train at a 45 degree angle so that if the train strikes your car, you will be safe from flying debris.
- Be aware that trains may operate any time throughout the day and night in either direction.

April 2017 service modifications impacted 28 *Piedmont* and five *Carolinian* trains. On April 10, Trains 73, 74, 75 and 76 operated between Kannapolis and Raleigh only, and Train 80 operated between Kannapolis and New York only due to PIP track work. On April 11 and 12, Trains 79 and 80 operated between Charlotte and Raleigh only due to CSX track work. Beginning April 12, Trains 74 and 75 were cancelled Mondays through Thursdays for the remainder of the month due to PIP track work, accounting for 20 cancellations. On April 24, Trains 73 and 76 were cancelled due to PIP track work. On April 25, Trains 73 and 76 were cancelled due to flash flood warnings resulting from recent thrunderstorms. Disruptions for PIP project work will continue to occur as necessary through completion of the project. Average gasoline prices remained low in April 2017 but were 31¢ per gallon higher than in April 2016.

Construction of New Raleigh Transit Center Sparks Business Development



Starting in early 2018, Amtrak customers traveling on the *Carolinian* and *Piedmont* will be greeted with a new multimodal transit center in downtown Raleigh's Warehouse District. The \$79.8 million Raleigh Union Station Project moves passenger rail from the current station on Cabarrus Street to the new facility less than a mile away on West and Martin Streets.

The project includes the rehabilitation of the Dillon Supply warehouse, track and platform construction, signal and switch improvements and the extension of West Street under the tracks. The project will occur in two phases.

Phase I of the project includes: the construction of a larger waiting room and better amenities for Amtrak passengers; a center island passenger platform with level-boarding to provide better access for wheeled-mobility devices and strollers; an enclosed concourse between the station and platform; commercial rental space that can be used for retail, office or restaurants; and a large public plaza that will provide an urban gathering space. Sustainable features include green roof areas and other stormwater management features, a pollinator garden and tactile wayfinding for customers who are blind or have low vision.

The next phase of the project is planned to accommodate additional intercity and intrastate rail services, regional commuter rail, local and regional buses, taxis, bicycles and other forms of transportation.

Once completed, the multimodal center will accommodate current and future demand for rail and transit services in Raleigh and will be a boon for ridership. (The FY 2016 ridership for Raleigh was 155,191.) It has already sparked nearby business and residential development, a welcome sign of growth in the downtown area.

"The Union Station project stands to change the economic development potential of the Warehouse District," Raleigh Mayor Nancy McFarlane said. "It will replace what is currently an underutilized collection of warehouses and vacant land with a new city landmark that will not only serve as a multimodal transportation hub, but also a civic space with potential for special events and expanded dining and entertainment options downtown. The station will drive development and growth throughout Wake County and the state."

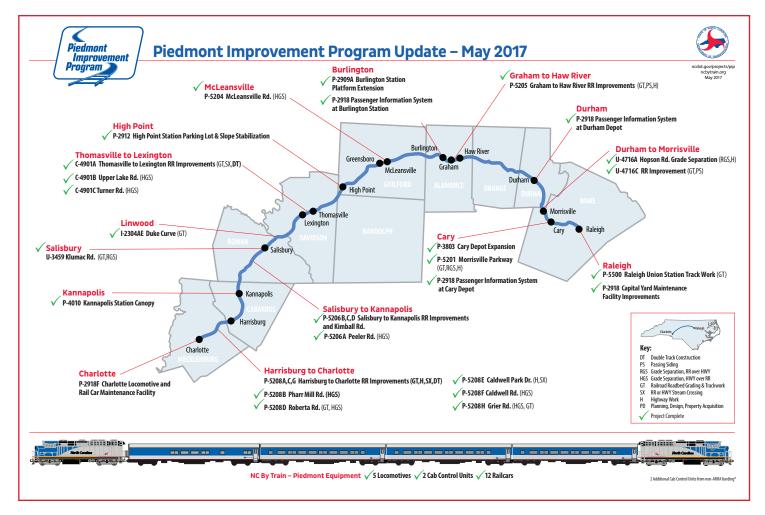
Paul Worley, Rail Division director, N.C. Department of Transportation, agreed. "When it opens, we're going to see a rise in ridership, better connectivity between trains and city buses and a walkable environment for our customers to the downtown area. We will have a true center city connection. The vision from the city, NCDOT and our Amtrak partners is going to be very significant for Raleigh."

Stephen Schuster, from Clearscapes, is the principal architect on the project. He lives in a loft near the site of the new center and can see the emerging landscape from his window. He appreciates the deep history of the railroad and industrial heritage in the Warehouse District and says that knowledge influenced the center's design. He also shares McFarlane's and Worley's enthusiasm of what it means for their community and said that the public and members of the Amtrak team were fully engaged throughout the design stage. "Amtrak had a major impact on the final feel and plan of the building," he said. "Ticketing, baggage, access to the platforms, the location of the crew base in the addition behind the building—all of that is a direct result of the input from the Amtrak team."

Schuster added, "This is going to be a great station—but it's more than that. It's also an economic driver of this entire part of downtown. The more than \$100 million private development happening across the street would not have happened without the Raleigh Union Station Project happening first."

Piedmont Improvement Program Milestone

Charlotte - On May 22, a significant segment of double track was put into service on the Haydock to Junker project. The southern 9.4 miles of the 12.2-mile project are now in service between CP Shamrock and CP Junker with trains operating on both tracks. With this work complete, the focus is now on completing the remaining track work on the northern segment for a final project cut-in by the end of June.
