WHEREAS, as a native of Hampstead, North Carolina and the Edgecombe township, Ambassador Sharpless has been an upstanding representative of Pender County; and WHEREAS, the Pender County Board of Commissioners requested that the North Carolina Department of Transportation consider naming a portion of U.S. Highway 17 through northeastern Pender County as the "Ambassador Mattie R. Sharpless Highway."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation names a portion of U.S. 17 from Union Bethel Road (S.R. 1562) to the Onslow and Pender County line as the Ambassador Mattie R. Sharpless Highway.

That appropriate signs will be erected at a suitable time.

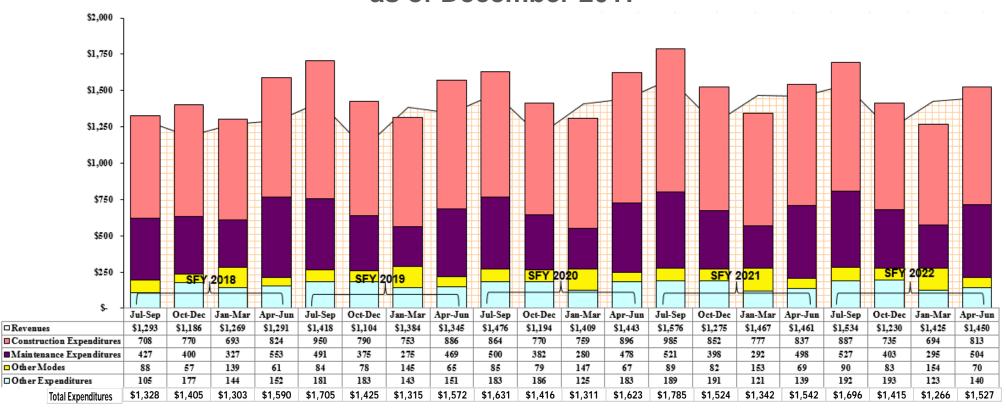

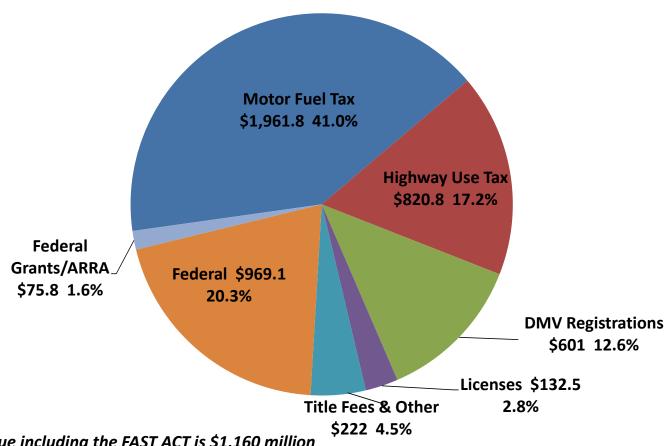

NCDOT Revenue Sources SFY2018 - \$4.8 Billion

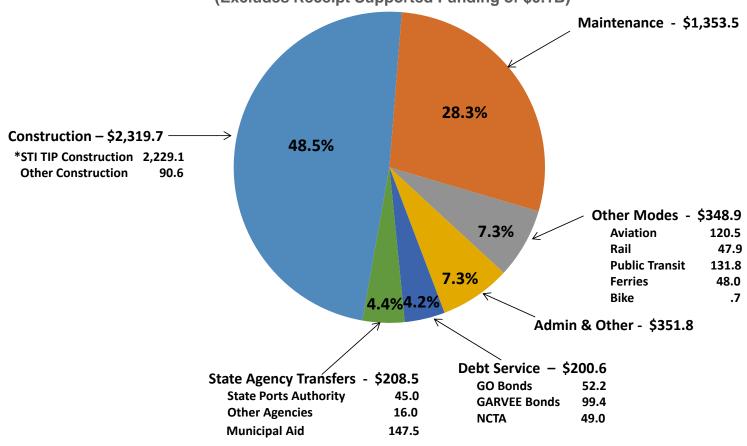

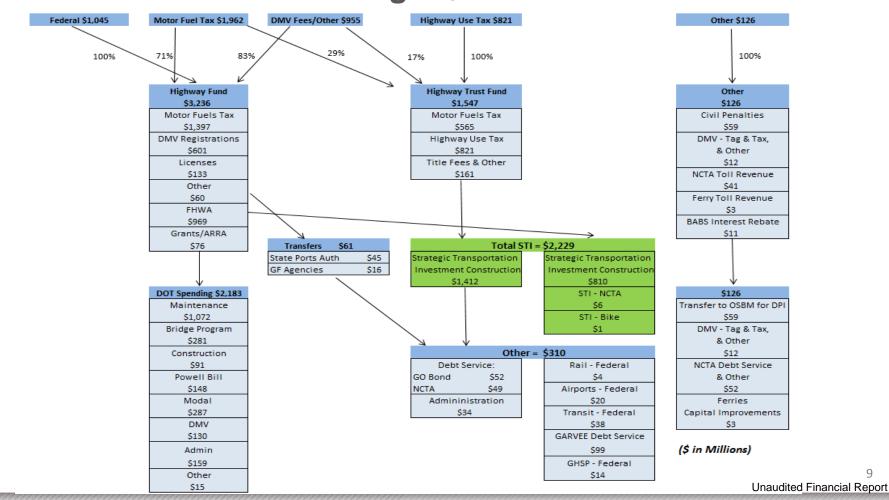

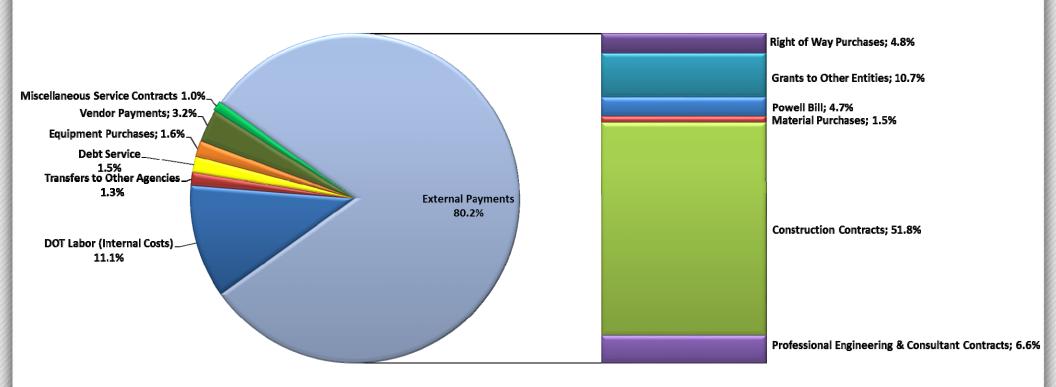

PRODUCT HIGHLIGHT – Hybrid Composite Culvert Repair System



HCCR being installed on an existing culvert

The Hybrid Composite Culvert Repair System (HCCR) was developed by the Kenway Corporation in partnership with the Advanced Structures & Composites Center at the University of Maine. HCCR was approved for use in February 2017 as a new option for rehabilitating corrugated metal pipe culverts that are showing signs of corrosion and have a minimum diameter of three feet. These types of culverts are installed under NCDOT roadways at small streams and tributary crossings. For HCCR to be used, culverts must be structurally sound.

HCCR is pre-engineered and manufactured in sectional panels using a durable and flexible composite liner. The liner is then manually attached to the existing steel culvert through stainless steel fasteners and grouted in place for stiffness and strength. Due to its light-weight and sectional design, minimal heavy equipment is needed which creates a smaller construction footprint. This smaller footprint can reduce cost, alleviate traffic impacts, and shorten installation time.

The installation method minimizes the environmental impact by reducing the amount of time that the stream needs to be diverted. HCCR closely conforms to the existing pipe, which provides minimal impact on the culvert invert elevation and provides a long term repair without the need for a redesign. Fish weirs can be added to the liner, if the design calls for them to be installed. HCCR composition is safe and environmentally friendly and does not negatively impact the stream environment. PRODUCT INNOVATION — The Sentinel

The Sentinel Portable Traffic Signal, engineered and manufactured by John Thomas Inc. (JTI), is designed for use in work zones to increase the safety of both the work zone and the workers. It has an interchangeable design, which allows it to be used on nearly any surface in multiple types of work zones. It can be mounted to a moveable cart, concrete barrier, towable trailer, or truck bed. The Sentinel has optional accessories enabling it to be customized for more specific needs such as pedestrian signal functionality and traffic sensor actuation. Other models include the Automated Flagger Assistance Device (AFAD) and Driveway Assistance Device (DAD). The AFAD allows flaggers to be located outside of the traffic lane and operate the device remotely away from traffic. The DAD is used in between a temporary signal system and helps control traffic entering a two-lane road from a driveway or low volume street to improve the safety of work zones with intersections. This product is currently under review for the Approved Product List.

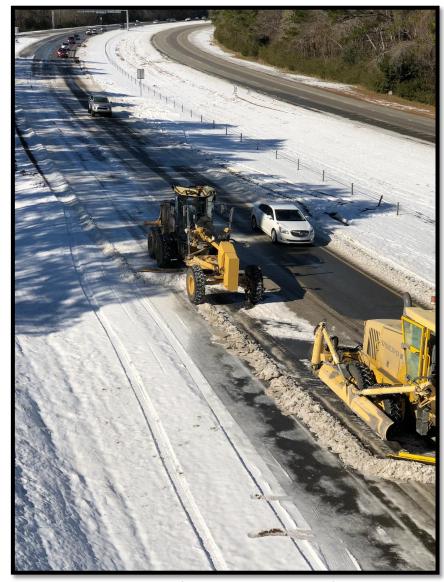

2. National Transportation Rever	Average annual spending by different levels of government by highway and transit. Nationwide on average 25% spending comes federal dollars and 75% comes from state and local dollars. Federal gas tax has not been increased since 1993. At the federal level we are facing a federal funding cliff. What this means is receipts coming in the highway trust fund aren't' keep pace with the out ways that are going out to states. Some of the reasons are federal gas tax has not been increased since 1993 and hasn't been adjusted for inflation and cars are becoming more fuel efficient so the purchasing power of the gas tax has declined. As a result of this, we are facing a cliff by 20-21. Federal funding for highways is projected to be reduced by 40% 21-23 is projected to be flattened out at 0. By 2026 the purchasing power is expected to be reduced by 52%. The administration has talked about an Infrastructure package \$200 billion dollars raising to a Trillion dollars by leveraging private investments and leveraging state and local dollars. Revenue source for the \$200B dollar hasn't been identified. Infrastructure package has included all infrastructure. Some of the principles of the Infrastructure packages is targeting federal investments, encourage self-help, align infrastructure investment with entities best suited for provide sustained and efficient investment, and leverage the private sector. AASHTO has developed their own principles around this infrastructure package. Support traditional federal program based on formula dollars, and essential to have direct funding. States primarily rely on gas tax to raise revenues for infrastructure projects. Nationwide there are 54 different revenue sources.
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FUNDING APPROPRIATIONS STRATEGIES COMMITTEE (FAST)

Georgia passed HB 170 in 2015. Increased the per gallon motor fuel tax from 7.5 cents to 26 cents, indexed from 2016-2018 for CPI increases, created hotel/motel fee of \$5, heavy vehicle annual impact fee of \$50 for vehicles 15,500-26,000lbs; \$100 for vehicles greater than 26,001lbs, new \$200 registration fee for alternative fuel vehicles and indexes fees to inflation, counties and municipalities can impose a sales tax for transportation up to 1%.

Virginia passed HB 2313 in 2013. Repealed Virginia's 17.5 cents-per-gallon gas tax entirely, implemented 5.1% motor fuel tax at the rack, implemented 6% diesel sales tax at rack, implemented motor vehicle titling tax from 3% to 4.15%, increased share of existing general sales and use tax dedicated to transportation from 0.5% to 0.6%, increased retail sales and use tax from 5.0% to 5.3%, dedicating the increase to transportation.

Provided additional tax in congested regions of Northern Virginia and Hampton Roads for regional needs.

West Virginia passed SB 1006 in 2017. Motor fuel tax is a combination of a flat rate of 20.5 cents/gal and a variable rate tax on the wholesale price of fuel. Bill increased artificial price floor of the 5 percent wholesale tax from \$2.34 to \$3.04, effectively increasing the variable rate portion of the fuel tax by 3.5 from 11.7 to 15.2 cents per gallon. Increased sales tax on motor vehicles and other motor vehicle related fees.

Oregon passed HB 2017 in 2017. Increased the states gas tax by 10 cents per gallon incrementally through 2024, established a new vehicle registration fee based on fuel efficiency, created new privilege tax on the sale of motor vehicles, new sales tax on bicycles, and established payroll tax increase dedicated to public transportation.

OReGo provides choice of state account manager or commercial account manager, adding once commercial account manager and losing one since launch. Been in operation since 2015.

PPP (P3) Option:

Can advance large complex transportation projects with revenue streams that may leverage private sources of investment capital.

Can create cost savings and production/operating efficiencies.

Typically transfers construction, financing and other risks from the public sector to private partner(s).

PPP's themselves do not create new money for state and local project sponsors. Private investment must be repaid with general revenue (taxes) or project-specific revenue (tolls).

Questions:

Do you have a rule of thumb of what is the average fuel economy of the vehicles on the road for our state? Burt Tasaico said fuel efficiency would be around 20 miles to the gallon. We assumed people drove 15,000 miles per year in the state. If you divide the total mileage by fuel efficiency you get 750 gallons of consumption per year then multiply by tax rate, you are roughly paying \$240 per year in gas tax.

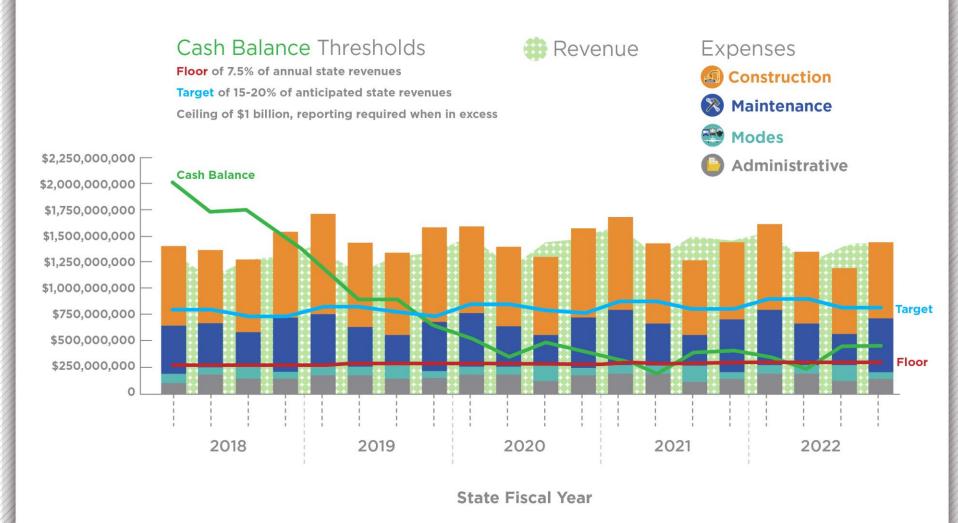

2. HOW TECHNOLOGY WILL CHANGE TRANSPORTATION, PAUL STEINMAN, PE, TRANSPORTATION GROUP DIRECTOR, HNTB North Carolina, P. C.

Mr. Paul Steinman with HNTB North Carolina, PC, presented on how technology will change the future of transportation. The expectations of our consumers are changing. People view transportation as a service, which they want to be reliable and safe. People also want convenience to get from point to point. They also want their transportation to be high tech and personalized. People also believe that transportation should be environmentally friendly and may be a shared resource. In the future, cars will be Automated/Connected, Electric and Shared (ACES).

He discussed the various types of transportation that will be affected by technology including platooning trucks, ports, 2-person pods, automated shuttles, and delivery trucks equipped with drones. He discussed the differences between automated, connected, and autonomous vehicles. "Automated" refers to technology to better transportation systems.

DISCUSSION SUMMARY

"Connected" vehicles refers to vehicles that "talk" with other vehicles and technology. Connected vehicles use information exchange platforms such as Dedicated Short Range Communications, Cellular and Satellite. These systems may communicated either Vehicle to Infrastructure (V2I), Vehicle to Vehicle (V2V), or Vehicle to Bike/Ped/Other (V2X). Examples of Driver Assist Features include Wrong Way Driver Detection, Speed Detection, Over-height Detection, Emergency Braking, Emergency Vehicle Warning, Red Light Warning, Work Zone Alert, and Tolling Alert.

"Autonomous" vehicles refers to vehicles that can function independently. The vehicles are equipped with LIDAR, Long and Short Radar, GPS/Enhanced Digital Map System, Advanced Software, and a Forward Vision System that performs lane tracking, object detection and far IR capability. Safety critical functions of the vehicle (steering/throttle) are affected without direct driver input.

Mr. Steinman also discussed some of the challenges with implementing future transportation technology including the transition period, consumer acceptance, land use planning, transportation planning, interoperability, technical expertise, data ownership, cybersecurity, transportation funding, and insurance liability issues.

3. PREPARING NORTH CAROLINA ROADS FOR AUTOMATED AND CONNECTED VEHICLES, KEVIN LACY, PE, STATE TRAFFIC ENGINEER, NCDOT MOBILITY AND SAFETY		
	Mr. Kevin Lacy discussed how various transportation aspects may change with autonomous and connected vehicles (AV/CV). Cars will become smarter and more efficient with high efficient engines, lighter materials and autonomous driving. The automotive and technology industries will evolve with new competition from tech companies and suppliers capable of producing high-tech parts at low prices. People will view cars differently, sharing cars and using them as a space to consume media and make phone calls. Many roadway characteristics will not change for a long time; pavement and bridges must be maintained. The Department/DMV's role will evolve, but how and when is uncertain.	
	Some uncertainties with autonomous vehicles include:	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	 how fast AV services will be accepted, safe useful and successful; changes to infrastructure requirements in response to AV/CV; changes to revenue collection methods with the migration to electric vehicles; changes to public transit and freight (these groups may shift to smaller vehicles that may be more demand responsive); changes to network management; changes to the Transportation Funding model; and changes to vehicle ownership (transportation may be viewed as a service). 	
	Projections for vehicle ownership will go from the current single ownership to either multiple ownership or corporate ownership.	
	The Department's processes will also change based on AV/CV ownership. Planning will include shorter planning horizons and will include new methods to represent AV services. Design will incorporate new technologies, communications networks, e-Signs, special pavement marking paints, and Electronic Vehicle charging. During construction, work zones may be managed with AVs. Anticipated changes to the Department's roles include: Public transit versus Private AV services, the relationship of DMV with AV fleet owners versus private citizens' licensing and registration, freight owner/operators, charging station owner/operators and policing/regulation of AV fleet operators. How the Department collects revenues will also need to change from the current model with the gas tax of trickle-charge taxation to a bulk-charge taxation. Since 1980 vehicle miles traveled (VMT) has doubled and fuel consumption increased by only 50%. Transitioning from a gas tax to a VMT tax may increase revenues by approximately 33%. Another option would include "buying miles" on a yearly basis. Vehicle registration fees and battery taxes are other potential revenue sources.

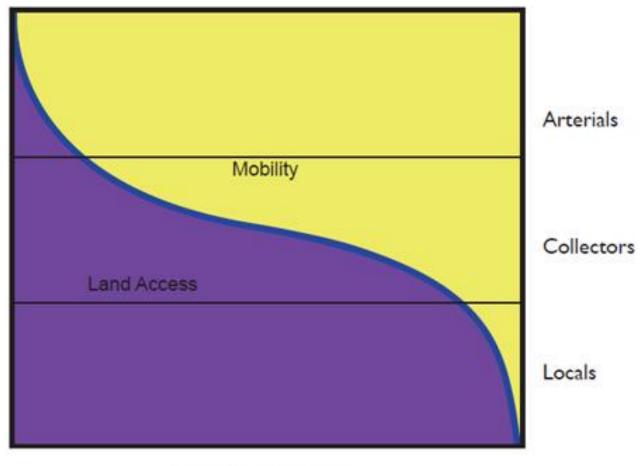

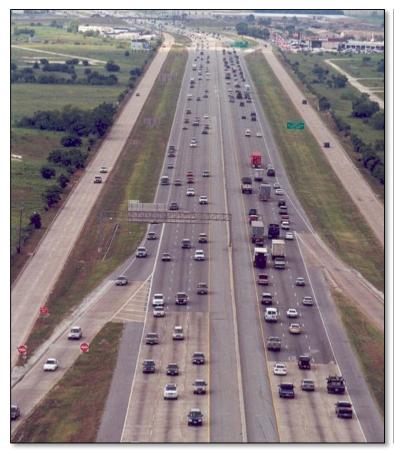

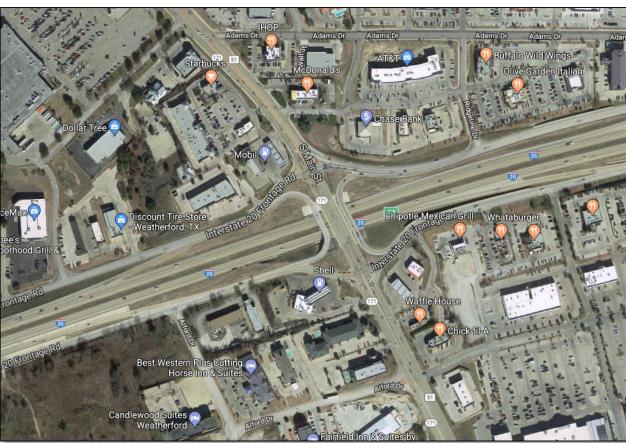


Proportion of Service

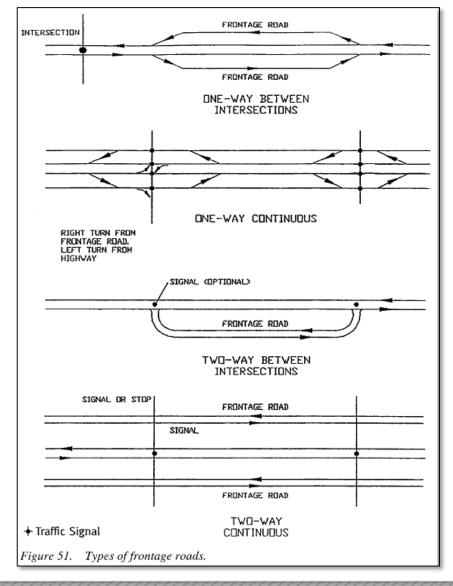
Frontage Roads Defined

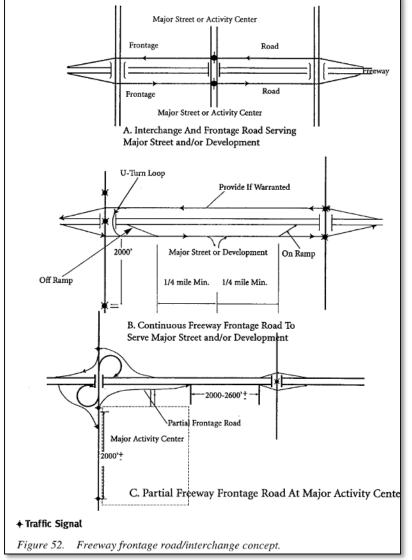
- **Purpose:** Provide lower-speed access to commercial sites along a major roadway and to separate business traffic from higher-speed through traffic
 - Ramps provide connections between the frontage roads and the freeway
 - Traffic traveling from an arterial street to the freeway first turns from the arterial onto the frontage road and then travels along the frontage road to a freeway entrance ramp
 - Traffic traveling from the freeway to an arterial street leaves the freeway by means of an exit ramp that connects to the frontage road and then travels along the frontage road to its intersection with the arterial street
- Access control technique
 - Reduces frequency and severity of conflicts along the main travel lanes of a highway
 - Direct property access is provided from the frontage roads and prohibited from the main travel lanes
 - Direct access to the frontage road is prohibited in the vicinity of ramp connections; access connecting to the frontage road is typically permitted
 - Provide access only to businesses fronting on the highway and are much safer when designed for one-way traffic
- Connections of frontage roads to side streets or onto the highway must be well away from signalized intersections, so entering and exiting traffic doesn't conflict with traffic queuing at signals
- Frontage roads maintain good visibility for businesses along a major road and typically it is apparent how to enter and exit the road to get to a business

Frontage Roads, Types

- Freeway Frontage Roads
 - Used in many urban, suburban, and rural settings to maintain integrity of local street system and provide access to adjacent development
 - Integrated using interchange and ramping system
 - Can increase connectivity and access opportunities that front along freeways
 - Generally operate one-way in developed areas and integrated with ramping pattern (diamond pattern, U-Turn loops)
- Arterial Frontage Roads
 - Control access to the through lanes on an arterial street
 - Provide access to adjoining property
 - Separate local from through traffic and permit circulation of traffic on each side of the arterial
 - May be used with grade separation structures at major cross streets (like a freeway)
 - Ultimate in access control in densely developed areas
 - Can be designed to avoid increasing conflicts at junctions and delays on intersecting roads

Frontage Roads, Types





Frontage Roads, Planning Criteria

- Requires careful planning (access management and geometry)
- Frontage roads may be considered in order to provide direct access to abutting property where
 - 1) Alternative access is not available and the property would otherwise be landlocked
 - 2) It is not feasible for the Department to purchase the access
 - 3) The frontage road allows for improved mobility together with the property access.
- Should operate one-way and should enter or leave mainline lanes as merging or diverging movements without signals
- Separation of frontage roads at cross streets should ensure sufficient storage for crossroad traffic
- Backage roads with development along each side are desirable in developing urban areas (sometimes called "reverse" frontage roads)
- Frontage roads that can be terminated at each block operate well with respect to the arterial roadway and the cross street
- Incorporate into the ring roads or eliminated where major activity centers front along an arterial roadway
- Ped and bike movements should use the frontage road

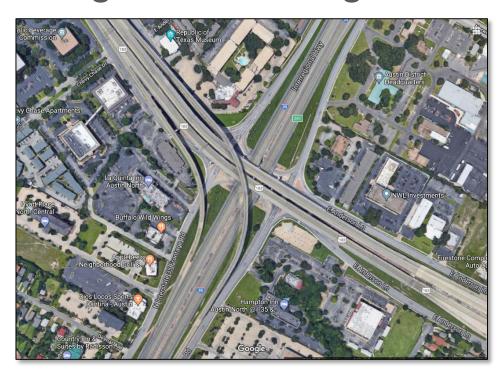

Advantages of Frontage Roads

- The "ultimate" in access control (AASHTO Green Book, 1995)
- Decreases congestion along freeway / main lines (with minimized density of access ramps to frontage roads)
- Reduces frequency and severity of conflicts along the main travel lanes
- By limiting entrance and exit ramps and/or providing alternate access to the freeway, future expansion costs and the associated traffic disruptions are reduced significantly**
- Ability to conveniently re-route traffic in the event of an incident on the main line**

** Design and local traffic conditions are key

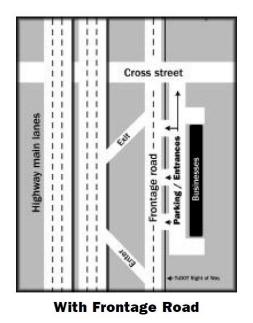
Disadvantages of Frontage Roads

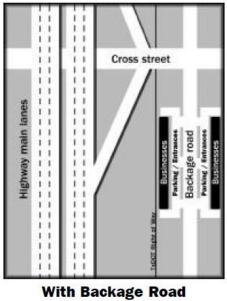
- Large footprint, high right-of-way costs in urban area
- Only commercial activities / businesses along frontage road benefit from high visibility (deep vs shallow development) and capacity
- Inhibit the ability to expand main lanes or add specialty lanes (High Occupancy Vehicle, High Occupancy Toll, bus lanes, etc.).
- Vehicles entering the frontage road or freeway conflict with faster moving vehicles, thereby contributing to congestion and crash frequency
- Increased access density along frontage roads (especially in dense urban areas) increase conflict points and contribute substantially to crash and injury incidence
- Needs additional levels at system interchanges if maintaining or continuing the frontage roads
- Limits design options for interchanges

Recent Legal Matters - Texas Timeline

- Frontage roads were often the standard for Texas access control (over 6,481 miles in 2002)
 - Constructed to avoid adverse impacts to adjacent properties where existing roadways were converted to freeways
- October 1999, Texas Transportation Commission approved a policy limiting the construction of frontage roads along I-69
- June 2001, approved the change in the TxDOT policy through Minute Orders
 - Minute Order 108544 sets policy so <u>new controlled access freeways are constructed without frontage roads</u> whenever feasible.
 - Minute Order 108545 directs TxDOT to work with local governments to determine how best to maintain local traffic circulation when frontage roads are not built.
- November 2016, Minute Orders rescinded and those controlled access highway project policies were incorporated into 43 TAC §15.54
- Frontage Road Provision Frontage roads approved under the following circumstances:
 - To improve the safety and efficient operations of a state highway corridor
 - To resolve landlocked conditions on certain remaining parcels
 - To restore circulation of local traffic from severed streets
 - If the cost to purchase the access rights would exceed the cost of the frontage road
 - If it is determined to be in the best interest of the state

Frontage Roads - Other Options





Backage Roads

- Local street or road that generally runs parallel to an arterial or highway but is not adjacent to the highway right of way
- Direct access for businesses or properties located between the highway and the backage road is provided by the backage road

Research indicates backage roads provide more access to a greater number of businesses and can increase the value of adjacent land while reducing road construction costs for individual properties.

Reduces cost for the state – backage roads typically maintained by the municipality

Final considerations – Comprehensive Evaluation of Frontage Roads

- Frontage roads are highly site-specific, dependent on:
 - Present land uses alongside freeway corridors
 - Local zoning designations
 - Expectations of future development
 - Public sentiment
 - Topographical, network and other design considerations
- Financial costs:
 - Considerably high with frontage roads
 - High land values, frontage roads preclude purchase of very high access costs
- Land near frontage roads (compared to corridors without frontage roads) exhibit:
 - Lower household incomes, population densities, percentages of bike trips to work, vehicle occupancies for work trips
 - Higher unemployment rates, commercial intensities along corridors
 - Clearly indicates impacts of shallow vs deep development

Final considerations – Comprehensive Evaluation of Frontage Roads

- Wide variety of options are available for limiting access to and improving flow and safety along freeway corridors (less ROW and less cost)
- Tendency to build frontage roads depends both on past access policies with in the state (depending heavily on legislation) and formal policy guidelines specifying the provisions of building them
- Backage roads, where development occurred on both sides of roadway, were used by several states; generous ramp-to-signal distance were required by policy guidelines; and development adjacent to the ramp-frontage road interface is generally much more restricted
- Zoning rather than frontage road provision guides development
- Frontage roads improve the operation of freeway mainline in intensely developed areas, but not in moderately developed areas (purely commercial vs purely residential)
- Arterials performed better with frontage roads
- Network capacity expanded the local network
- Arterial links and in some cases the freeway lanes performed better after the addition of frontage roads

Frontage Roads, Final Thoughts

- Another Tool in the Tool Box to help balance access and mobility
- Being used in limited cases today in NC
- Requires careful access management planning
- As always, one approach does not fit everywhere there are different strategies and different designs of each strategy
