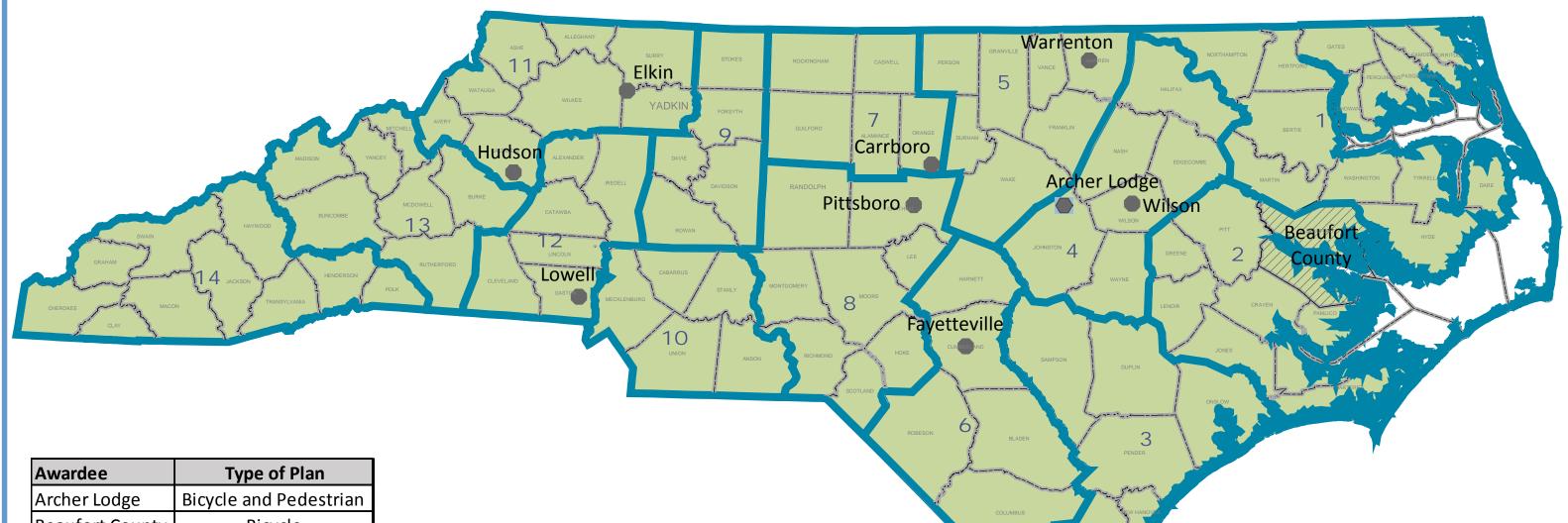

The plan is based on an analysis of existing and projected travel and land use, public involvement and field investigations of recommended improvements. It is located on the web at:

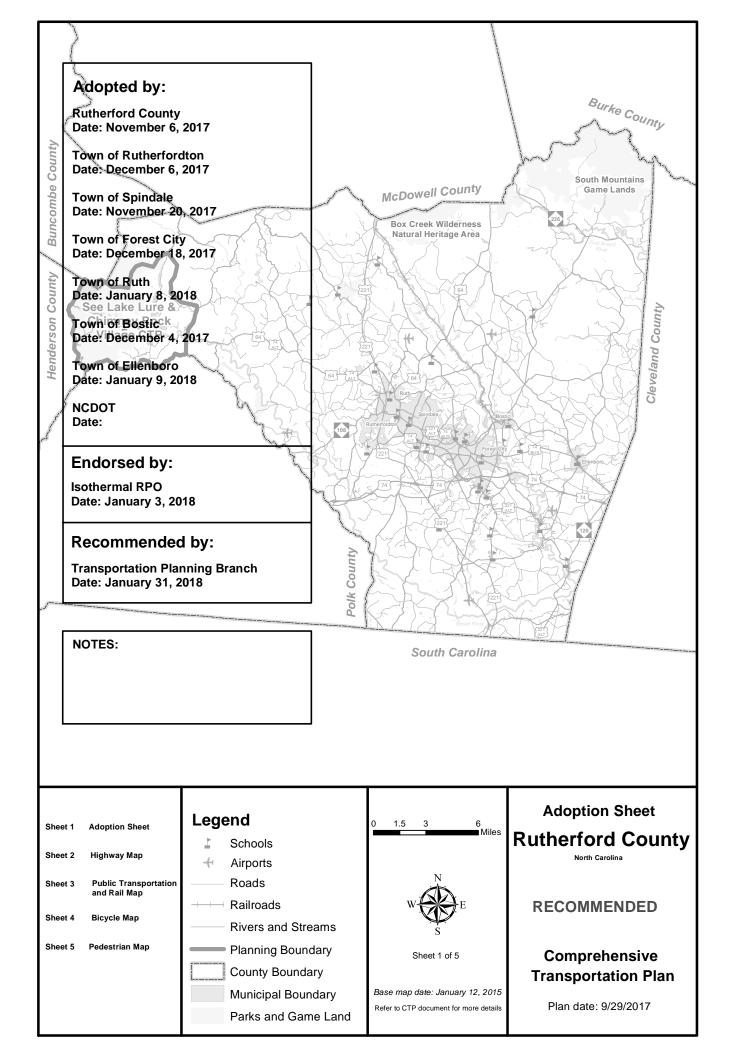

The Department's Sponsorship Policy and Procedures established the Department's general policy for sponsorship programs. It was intended to encompass current and potential sponsorship opportunities, while ensuring conformity with appropriate Federal and State guidelines. The Department identified the Rest Area System Statewide Sponsorship as a viable sponsorship opportunity in this Policy.

The Department received a Revenue Proposal from Travelers Marketing, LLC in response to our Final Request for Proposals issued on December 12, 2017. Travelers Marketing revenue proposal was submitted on January 9, 2018 in the guaranteed revenue amount of \$225,000.00 per year, for the total amount of guaranteed revenue of \$450,000.00 for two (2) years. The sponsorship agreement will allow Travelers Marketing to sponsor the Department's Rest Area System Facilities by placing Acknowledgement Signs within Highway Right of Way and within the Rest Area boundary. At this time, staff and the Secretary recommend approval of this contract which is in accordance with the Department's Sponsorship Policy and Procedures.

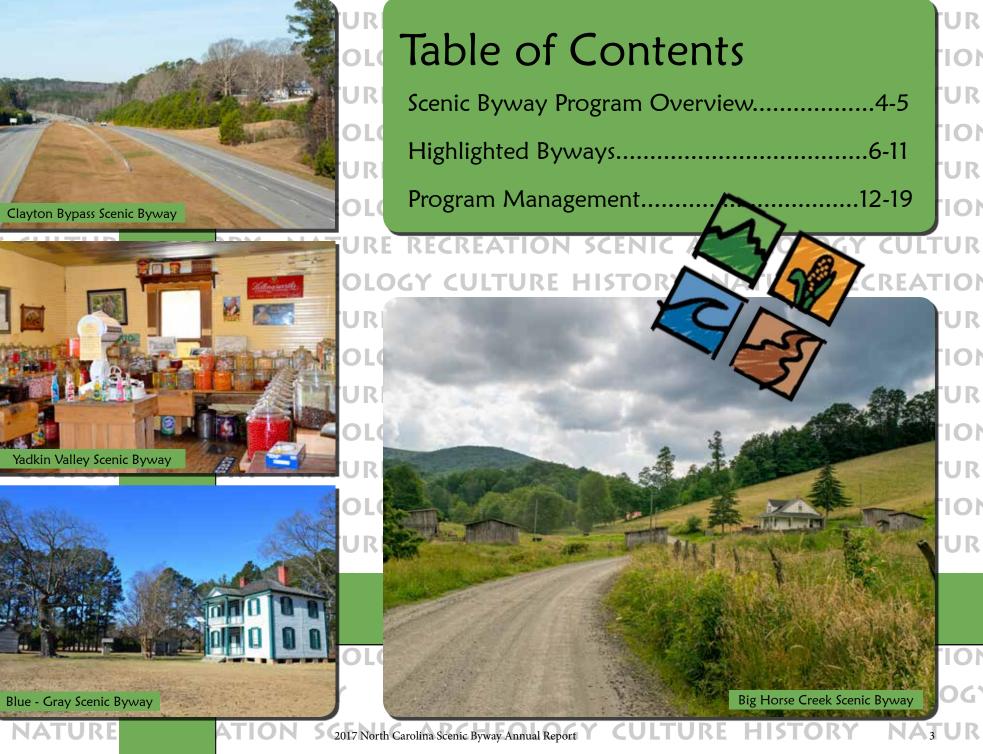

History - The North Carolina Scenic Byway Program was officially launched in March of 1990 when 31 byways were designated by the Board of Transportation. In July of 1993, legislation was enacted to define the program and assign management of the program to the Department of Transportation. In 1994 the program's policies and administrative codes were established.

Asset Inventory - There are currently 60 designated North Carolina Scenic Byways totaling almost 2300 miles. Three of those are designated as National Scenic Byways; Cherohala Skyway, Forest Heritage Scenic Byway and the Outer Banks Scenic Byway. There is also one All American Road in North Carolina, the highest national designation possible, The Blue Ridge Parkway.

Purpose - North Carolina Scenic Byways give visitors and residents a chance to experience a bit of North Carolina's history, geography and culture while raising awareness for the protection and preservation of these treasures. Following the byways, you will see some of the most breathtaking scenery from the Blue Ridge Mountains to fertile plains to the crystal blue coastline.

Little Parkway

Avery, Caldwell and Watauga Counties Length 18 Miles

Little Parkway follows US 221 connecting Linville to Blowing Rock. The route was built in 1889 by man and mule as a toll road. The byway begins at Linville. Located along the Linville River, it lies just north of Linville Gorge Wilderness, the nation's third largest wilderness area, Linville Falls and Linville Caverns.

Little Parkway winds along the side of Granfather Mountain. Grandfather Mountain at an elevation of 5,946 feet it is one of the highest in the Blue Ridge and is the home of 16 distinct ecological communities. Its name stems from the mountain's grandfather like profile against the sky when viewed from a distance.





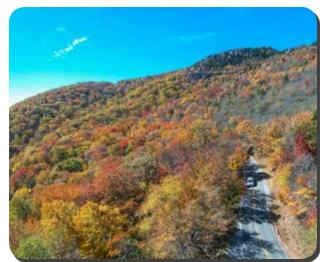
The Little Parkway is paralled by the Blue Ridge Parkway for a portion of the drive, thus the byway name. The Blue Ridge Parkway construction began in 1935 but wasn't finished until 52 years later with the Linn Cove Viaduct forming the final link. The viaduct, located five miles north of Linville, was one of the world's first bridges to be constructed using an innovative method of building from the top down to protect the mountain's ecology. It is visible from Little Parkway.



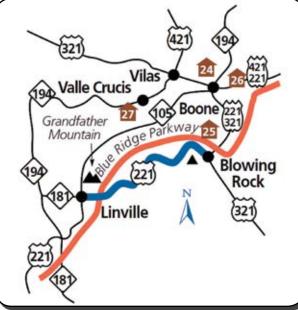

Closer to Blowing Rock the byway crosses the Eastern Continental Divide and near a large colonial revival house with huge columns. Called Westglow, the house was built by Elliott Daingerfield, one of North Carolina's most renowned artists with works in the National Gallery and the Metropolitan Museum. It is now Westglow Spa and Resort.

Before reaching Blowing Rock, there is an access ramp to the Blue Ridge Parkway. This location is close to the Moses H. Cone Memorial Park, featuring his country estate. Once called Flat Top Manor, the 13,000 square foot mansion now houses a craft shop and visitor information for parkway travelers. The park also includes two lakes and carriage trails for hiking and horseback riding.





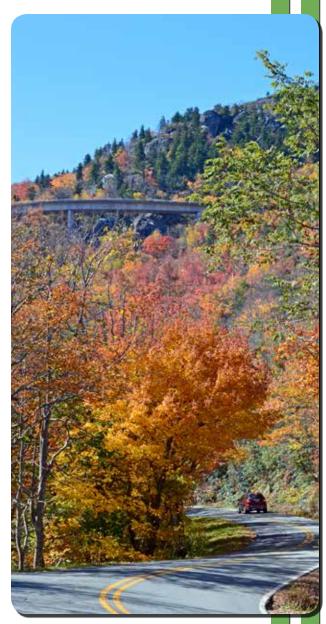

The byway culminates in Blowing Rock, a charming resort village. The town of Blowing Rock gets its name from the rock formation that lies over 1500 feet above the Johns River Gorge. At the top of the rock formation air currents flow up from the gorge below returning lite objects that are tossed over.

There is a legend of Blowing Rock that begins with a battle between the Cherokee and Catawba Native American tribes. According to the legend there were two lovers, one from each tribe. The brave was called to go to battle, but his lover begged him not to go. As they were walking together near the top of the gorge he became so distraught that he threw himself over the edge. His lover prayed for the Great Spirit to return her lover to her and her prayer was granted when a gust of wind blew the brave back up the cliff and landed him safely beside her.



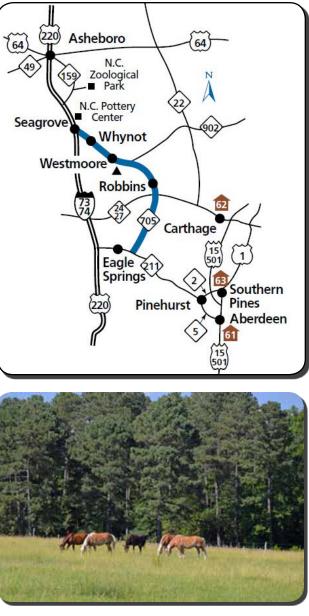

Pottery Road

Pottery Road as the name suggest takes byway travelers through the heart of an area known worldwide for the functional and artistic pottery created there. In the 18th century, several families from England settled the area for its high quality clay, suitable for farming and making utilitarian earthenware for their everyday needs. Today, their descendants continue this craft and art form. Currently there are more than 100 potters in the area commonly referred to as Seagrove Pottery, 'the pottery capital of North Carolina' and 'the pottery capital of the world'.





Moore and Randolph Counties Length 43 Miles



The Pottery Road byway route begins in the sandhills of Moore County between Pinehurst and Eagle Springs and follows NC 705. Pinehurst, an elite golf course community, was settled in 1895 and named for the Longleaf Pine forest found there. Eagle Springs was established in 1890 and named for a mineral spring owned by the Eagle family. The byway begins with an allee of mature Cedar trees that is known locally as 'Cedar Lane'. The byway route passes through the small towns and communities of Robbins, Westmoore, and Whynot before ending in Seagrove.

Robbins began in 1795 when the gunsmith Alexander Kennedy and his family settled along Bear Creek. Kennedy Rifle Works produced long guns for American soldiers until 1838 and the town was known as Mechanics Hill. After several name changes over the years, in 1943 the town renamed once again to honor a local textile mill owner and philanthropist, Karl Robbins.



North Carolina Scenic Byway Program Featured Byway - Piedmont

The Westmoore community is the location settled by the first potters including the Craven, Chriscoe, Cole, Luck, McNeill, Owen and Teague families. Jugtown Pottery is close by and was founded in 1917 by Jacques and Juliana Royster Busbee, artist and art enthusiasts from Raleigh. They are credited with a revival of the craft that had dwindled over the industrial revolution years with the availability of affordable glass wares. Often the entire area is referred to as Jugtown pottery.







The Whynot community of Randolph County received its name because the residents could not decide on a name. During the name debate it was 'Why not this?' and 'Why not that?' until finally someone remarked 'Why not name it Why Not and let's go home?' It stuck.

The byway culminates in Seagrove which was incorporated in 1913 and named for a local railroad official. The North Carolina Pottery Center is located here as well as the annual signature event in the fall, the Seagrove Pottery Festival.



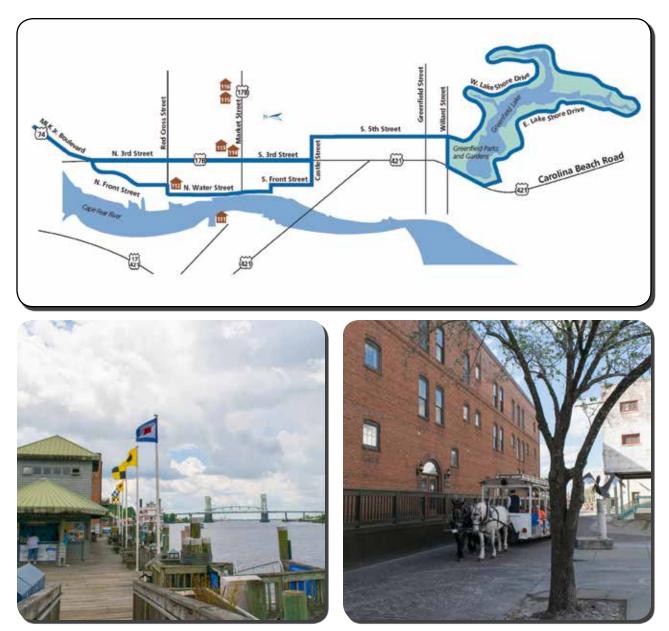


New Hanover County Length 8 Miles

The Cape Fear Historic Byway in downtown Wilmington guides travelers through one of the most scenic urban areas in the nation. The byway follows along the tranquil Cape Fear River, along thriving colonial-era streets and around Greenfield Park and Gardens.

Known as the Port City, Wilmington was incorporated in 1739 and sits on a peninsula between the Cape Fear River and the Atlantic Ocean. The city contains North Carolina's richest collection of 19th century urban architecture and still maintains the original grid pattern finalized in 1743. Wilmington was built, for the most part, by commission merchants and prosperous businessmen who indulged themselves in the extravagances of the culture of the late 1800s. Today the city is the 8th largest in North Carolina.

The byway begins on the north end of downtown at the US 74/NC 133 (Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway) and North Third Street. It passes the 1898 Memorial Park which commemorates the coup d'état in which prominent white citizens of Wilmington violently overthrew the legally elected biracial government of the city. The monument serves as a testament to the city's desire to acknowledge the injustices of the past and their commitment for an inclusive society moving forward.



The byway quickly heads to the southwest where views of the Cape Fear River waterfront dominate. Wilmington's Riverwalk is a well-maintained pedestrian promenade extending the length of Water Street with many unique shops and delicious restaurants. The USS North Carolina Battleship sits directly across the river. Near the end of the Riverwalk, the byway heads east and south where travel on South Front Street, Castle Street and South Fifth Street take the byway traveler along some of the city's most exclusive homes and the heart of the Wilmington National Register Historic District.

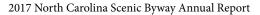

Towards the end of Fifth Street is Greenfield Park and Gardens. Here 3.8 miles of Lake Shore Drive circles the park and Greenfield Lake. The byway returns back to US 74/NC 133 at North Market Street where it ends, via Third Street where government buildings, historic churches and the Thalian Hall for Performing Arts are found.



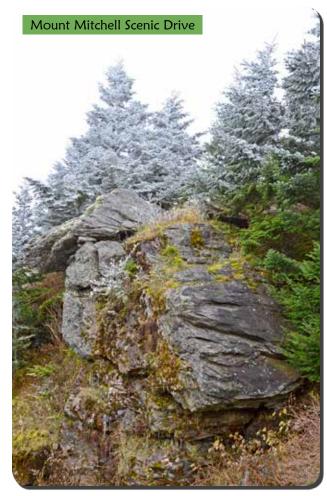






The North Carolina Scenic Byway Program operates at a variety of capacities to advocate and manage the state's byways. Some of the typical responsibilities include:

1) Scenic Byway Proposals – Process, review and assist with designation applications and byway revisions - In 2017 there were several inquiries about designations but there were no applications submitted.



Designation Process

- A non-profit organization notifies the NC Scenic Byway Program staff of interest in nominating a route for the NC Scenic Byway Program and obtains a NC Scenic Byway Study List Application.
- The submitted Study List Application is reviewed and it is determined whether the proposed route is likely to qualify for a byway designation. If the proposed byway route warrants further investigation it is added to the Study List.
- Once a route is added to the Study List, a NC Scenic Byway Application Package is furnished. This is an in-dept application requiring a detailed description of the route, justification of the intrinsic qualities identified, local zoning information and evidence of community support. A public hearing may also be required if requested within 60 days of receipt of application.
- The application is reviewed and a report and recommendation for adoption or rejection of the proposed byway is presented to the Board of Transportation.
- The Board of Transportation votes to approve or deny the designation and the applicant is notified of the decision.



2) Project Planning – Consult and monitor improvement projects to ensure context sensitive solutions for projects impacting scenic byways. Currently there are multiple construction projects occurring along scenic byways across the state.

North Carolina State Ethics Commission Statement of Economic Interest (SEI)

The State Government Ethics Act requires the disclosure of financial and personal interests by most covered persons. Public servants who are covered by the Ethics Act but who make less than \$60,000 per year, and ex-officio members of university and community college boards of trustees do not have to make these disclosures.

Initial Filing

Covered persons who are required to file an SEI must do so prior to their initial appointment, election, or employment.

Annual Filing

SEIs must be filed annually no later than April 15th.

Evaluations

The Commission evaluates the SEIs of public servants for actual and potential conflicts of interest between the public servant's public duties and private interests.

Penalties

The Commission may assess a \$250 civil penalty for late or non-filing. Criminal penalties apply to concealing information or providing false information.

Public Record

SEIs, including any attachments and evaluations are public record. HOWEVER, the Confidential Form used for providing the full names of unemancipated (minor) children, IS NOT A PUBLIC RECORD.

In addition, beginning in 2015, a filers CONTACT INFORMATION is being collected separately and will not be provided to the public as part of the online access to SEIs.

Highway Maintenance Improvement Program (HMIP)

During the 2014 Legislative session, the North Carolina General Assembly established the Highway Maintenance Improvement Program (Session Law 2014-100, Section 34.11 a, b).

The Board of Transportation approves the five-year schedule (originally a three-year improvement schedule, Session Law 2017-57 expanded the program requirement to five years) for pavement preservation, resurfacing and rehabilitation activities within each Highway Division along with their anticipated cost and publishes the schedule on the Department's website by April 1st of each year.

The Board of Transportation is scheduled to vote on the 2019 – 2023 HMIP during its March 8, 2018 meeting.

RESOLUTION FOR JULIUS CHAMBERS

WHEREAS, Julius Chambers advanced the rights of minorities and low-income people through his tireless advocacy in the forms of litigation, scholarly research, and grassroots activism, and enhanced racial equality throughout the nation from his home state of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Chambers was born in 1936 in Mount Gilead, North Carolina and graduated summa cum laude from what is now North Carolina Central University. After obtaining a master's degree in history from the University of Michigan, Chambers returned to his native North Carolina to study law at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He graduated first in his class and served as editor-in-chief of the North Carolina Law Review; and

WHEREAS, Chambers was one of the first two NAACP Legal Defense Fund Scholarship recipients and was the Legal Defense Fund's first Legal Fellow. After working as an intern, lawyer, cooperating attorney, board member and board chair, Chambers served as director-counsel of the Legal Defense Fund from 1984 to 1993; and

WHEREAS, Chambers founded the first integrated law firm in the state of North Carolina, where he worked to advance civil rights and litigated landmark civil rights cases in the United States Supreme Court. While his home and car were firebombed and his office was burned to the ground on separate occasions during the height of some of his most contentious civil rights trials, Chambers' composed refrain of 'just keep fighting' resounded across the state and the nation. Chambers won numerous cases before the United States Supreme Court, including Swann v. Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education and Griggs v. Duke Power Company; and

WHEREAS, the resolution adopted by the Charlotte City Council acknowledged the importance of Julius Chambers to the advancement of civil rights and practice of law in North Carolina and in support of the North Carolina Department of Transportation in the designation of I-85 from the I-77 interchange to the I-85 Connector in the state of North Carolina of the National System for Interstate and Defense Highways as the "Julius Chambers Highway."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation names the designation of I-85 from the I-77 interchange to the I-85 Connector in North Carolina as the *Julius Chambers Highway*.

That appropriate signs will be erected at a suitable time.

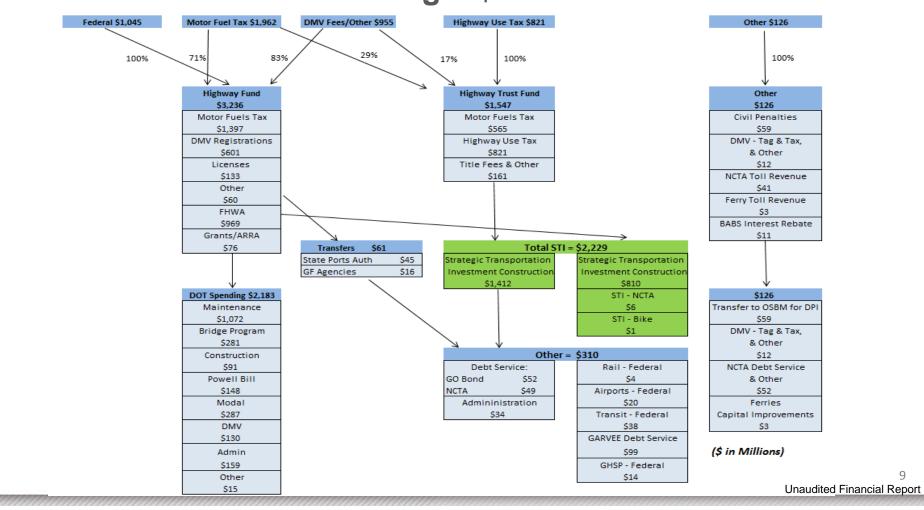

Ecoraster E50 Permeable Pavement System, designed and manufactured by Purus North America, Inc., is a soft ground reinforcing grid. It was added to the Approved Product List (APL) under NP15-7041 in 2015. It has an open grid that can be filled with sand or stone to provide stabilization for erosion control purposes. When compared to a grass shoulder, it can better prevent the displacement of shoulder material and enhance roadside drainage. Ecoraster E50 is designed to reduce pollutant runoff, sediment displacement, stormwater volume, and discharge rates while increasing stormwater infiltration. Increased stormwater infiltration helps

recharge aquifers and support the base flow of streams while reducing discharge helps decrease streambank erosion and sediment runoff. These effects can increase the lifespan and safety of heavily-traveled shoulders by reducing

erosion and ponding of stormwater. Ecoraster E50 can be used for slope stabilization as well as wetland stabilization since grass and plants can grow through the grid.

Ecoraster E50 grids incorporate internal expansion joints and locking tabs that keep the grids working together as a system for even load distribution. Ecoraster E50 is made from 100% recycled Low-Density Polyethylene (LDPE). It is resistant to

Per the manufacturer, Ecoraster E50 can provide additional support for highway pavement when used on the shoulder and has the potential to be

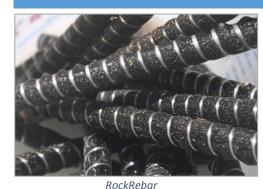

PRODUCT INNOVATION – ROCKREBAR



RockRebar, designed and manufactured by Basalt America, is an alternative to steel and fiberglass concrete reinforcement. It is made from basalt which is a volcanic rock formed from rapidly-cooled lava flow that is found near the surface of earth.

RockRebar is 1/5th the weight of steel rebar, and per the manufacturer, it is over 2 times stronger in tension than steel rebar. It was originally designed as an alternative to steel for marine construction and roadway sections exposed to salt and freeze-thaw on bridges because it is naturally rust resistant. Due to its resistance to rust the concrete may not require waterproof sealants or special concrete additives, and RockRebar can decrease the amount of concrete cover needed for degradation prevention.

RockRebar is easy to install and has shown to reduce the number of laborers and heavy equipment needed due to its light weight. It is non-magnetic, non-conductive, and UV stable which can make it a good fit for high voltage areas. The expected benefits of RockRebar are lower installation and maintenance costs as well as increased service life when compared to steel rebar. The cross section of each rod of RockRebar consists of continuous basalt filaments which are coated with a preparatory epoxy polymer. The epoxy polymer works to solidify the fibers together, and it enhances the chemical bonding with Portland cement. This product is currently being reviewed for the Approved Products List under NP17-8046.
