The Department will fund all expenses until such time funds are appropriated to DIT or billing rates are established. Separate service level agreements will be established for system applications.

Hyde County Board of Commissioners 16SP.6.3.5 This Project consists of the purchase and operation of a Tram System to be operated on Ocracoke Island to provide pedestrian access between the NCDOT ferry dock on Silver Lake and Ocracoke Village attractions as recommended by the NCDOT feasibility study to improve public transportation on Ocracoke Island. The Department will participate in an amount up to \$250,000 in State funds. The County shall own, operate, maintain and provide annual ridership reports for the Tram System, for a period of four (4) years.

North Carolina & Virginia Railroad Company (NCVA) Northampton, Bertie and Hertford Counties P-5600A 47335FRA.3.1 The Department and NCVA entered into a Rail Freight Assistance Agreement on September 7, 2016 for track infrastructure improvements necessary to upgrade the NCVA rail line. This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to the Rail Freight Agreement allows revisions to expand the scope of work to include additional crossties, rail, turnout replacement, along with ballast and surfacing within the same parameters of the previous scope of work. Expansions of the project include 25,700 crossties (originally 17,700), 20.2 miles of rail (originally 17), and 14 turnouts (originally 11). The area where the work is to be completed is located between milepost 57 (the Virginia State Line) and milepost 186.7 (Nucor Steel in Cofield). NCVA shall perform all the work. There is no additional cost to the Department for this change in scope of work. All other provisions of the original Agreement will remain the same.

As NSR is the owner of the rail line in Beaufort and Pitt counties and leases said rail line to CLNA, NSR and the Department have entered into a Contingent Interest Agreement and Instrument of Indebtedness, executed on March 22, 2018, to secure a lien on the project assets for five (5) years. This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to both the Rail Freight and Contingent Interest Agreement allows for revisions to expand the scope of the project, as well as an increase in funding. The revised scope now includes improvements to pile, bents, and ties at 10 additional locations. CLNA will be responsible for performing all the work. As NSR is the owner of the rail line in Beaufort and Pitt counties and leases said line to CLNA, NSR agrees to the increase in the scope of work and the additional investment. The Department's participation will be increased by \$83,000, from \$375,475 to \$458,475, and the estimated cost of the entire project will increase by \$166,000 for a total of \$916,950. All other provisions of the original Agreement will remain the same.



NCDOT Revenue Sources SFY2018 - \$4.8 Billion




Uses of 2017-18 NCDOT Appropriations Total Funding = \$4.8 Billion





PRODUCT HIGHLIGHT - Cast Iron ADA Detectable Warning Tiles



ADA warning tiles in place

The Advantage® Cast Iron Premier Tactile Tile System is an ADA compliant detectable warning tile manufactured by Advantage Tactile Systems. It is used to warn the visually impaired of upcoming crossings at various places including curb ramps, pedestrian crosswalks, transit platforms, or parking areas. They are installed just after the concrete has been poured so it can anchor into place once the concrete cures. The tiles are vented to allow displacement of concrete during installation and they are tamped into place with a rubber mallet or vibration mechanism.

These tiles share several features with plastic competitors including easy installation, the ability to be recycled, and availability in many sizes. However, because they are made from cast iron, they also have the ability to withstand abuse of heavy vehicular traffic such as snow plows, forklifts, and other rolling loads. They also require less maintenance. The tiles are manufactured in accordance with ASTM A-48, Class 35B Grey Cast Iron and comply with the "Buy America" policy.

Sizing and pricing can vary, but the cost can be estimated at \$20-\$23 per square foot. The initial cost can be offset by the life-cycle savings compared to other warning tiles. Particularly, in areas where the tiles will be under occasional traffic or where snow plows are used could see the greatest benefit. PRODUCT INNOVATION – Carbon Fiber Reinforced Polymer



Steel cable (top) and Carbon Fiber cable (bottom)

NCDOT, in partnership with NC State University, researched Carbon Fiber Reinforcement Polymer (CFRP) technology which is used as a replacement for traditional steel pre-stressing strands in pre-stressed concrete. CFRP consists of polyacrylonitrile based carbon fiber strands with epoxy resin used as a binding material.

Exposed steel reinforcement can cause early deterioration in pre-stressed concrete bridge girders when steel is exposed to corrosive environments such as coastal areas. This corrosion can cause costly repairs or even replacement of bridges after relatively short service lives. CFRP is lightweight, flexible, and provides high tensile strength. More importantly, it is not subject to corrosion and it does not require special concrete mix designs. Using CFRP in place of steel reinforcement

is expected to lengthen the life of a bridge in corrosive environments and potentially reduce maintenance costs. This technology has been successfully used in Florida, Michigan, and Virginia in corrosive environments.

To implement this technology, the NCDOT is planning to use CFRP in a bridge replacement project in Harker's Island (B-4853). The CFRP, will be used in piles and girders to provide the pre-stressing tensile reinforcement in the concrete. This project will begin construction in the fall of 2019 and the Department will monitor the performance of the CFRP during the regular bridge inspection cycles.







 - Details the process of installing, replacing, maintaining markings
 - Reflectometer Requirements at time of install:
 - Thermoplastic / Polyurea (Long Life Marking): min 250-375 mcd/lux/m² (Yellow / White)
 - Paint: 200-225 mcd/lux/m² (Yellow / White)
- The replacement retroreflectivity value used was 100 mcd/lux/m².
- This value is based on information from AASHTO, MUTCD subcommittee, and a Paul Carlson (TTI) study.
- Not a Federal established min required, but one is expected through the MUTCD.

Data Acquisition

- In 2000, we began collecting state wide mobile readings of new markings on NC state roadways
- Over 9700 line miles were read in NC.
- NCSU used this data in its Pavement Marking Performance Analysis research to provide degradation models for paint and thermoplastic.



- Day time appearance maybe cracked with rounded edges but still a solid line and reflects as a solid line at night.









2. Federal Funding – Calvin Leggett		
	Calvin Leggett discussed the FY 2018 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development (THUD). The Appropriations bill provides a total of \$70.3 billion in net discretionary budget authority. The Bill is 12.65 billion more than in FY 2017. The bill includes \$9.7 billion in new infrastructure spending, of which \$7.8 billion is for transportation-related activities and \$1.9 billion is for housing and community development activities.	
	In the Budget Agreement of 2018, funding for transportation programs was increased by \$9.9 billion from FY 2017 which is a significant increase.	
	The FHWA will receive \$47.5 billion, a \$3.5 billion increase from FY 2017. The bill includes almost \$3 billion in additional FHWA formula funding, which is \$2.5 billion more than the increases included in the FAST Act of 2015.	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	The TIGER grant program received \$1.5 billion which is \$1 billion more than FY 2017. Recently we received a \$19.9 million TIGER grant for the Blue Ridge Road RR Crossing project which is Triple the amount received in FY 2017.	
	Transportation Research funding was increased by over \$100 million. Most of the increase will be used to study the safety implementation of automated vehicles.	
	The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) will receive \$13.48 billion. Increase is slightly of \$1 billion from FY 2017. Bill includes \$9.73 billion for Transit formula grants as authorized by the FAST Act.	
	Capital Investment Grants will receive \$2.645 billion, which is \$232 million more than FY 2017. \$1.1 Billion is for Bus and Bus Facilities Grants, which is \$400 million more than the authorized level in the FAST Act. This program funds the repair and replacement of buses	



	and bus infrastructure. A 10% rural set-aside for the discretionary component of the program which guarantees at least \$50 million in rural competitive grant awards. FAA will receive \$18 billion in total budgetary resources, \$1.6 billion more than FY 2017. Bill provides full funding for all air traffic control personnel and additional \$1 billion for Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants. Also, provides funding for projects which assist with airport, safety, construction, and noise mitigation. This brings the total funding for this program to \$4.35 billion. Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) fully funding safety inspectors and making important investments in Position Train Control (PTC) implementation and capital improvements on America's railroads. Bill funds Amtrak at \$1.942 billion which is \$447 million more than FY 2017. Included is \$650 million for the Northeast Corridor and \$1.292 billion for the National Network covering 46 states. Bill provides \$888 million in funding for rail safety and state good repair across the country. \$592.5 million is for Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) grants. \$524 million increase from FY 2017. The Maritime Administration (MARAD) will receive almost \$1 Billion, \$457 million more than FY 2017. Provides additional funding to accelerate capital improvements at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy.

Introduction of Chief Financial Officer – Chair Tony Lathrop and Evan Rodewald Chair Tony Lathrop introduced Evan Rodewald as the new Chief Financial Officer. Evan gave a little background on himself. 24 years with the General Assembly most recent position he dealt with larger budget issues. Focused on the General Fund (education, Medicaid), He spent 8 years as the Analyst on Transportation Highway Fund and Highway Trust Fund. Very familiar with Committee work and understand highly functioning committees. Reviewed material FAST has been working with over the last few months. Same problems we have now are the same problems from 20 years ago (gas tax – state and federal level). **DISCUSSION SUMMARY** Familiarizing himself with the Cash Model. 2. ROUNDABOUTS IN NORTH CAROLINA, MR. JIM DUNLOP, PE, NCDOT CONGESTION MANAGEMENT REGIONAL ENGINEER, EASTERN REGION

DISCUSSION SUMMARY

Mr. Jim Dunlop, NCDOT Congestion Management Regional Engineer, provided a presentation about roundabouts in North Carolina. He discussed how traffic circles have evolved into modern roundabouts that increase safety and capacity. Roundabouts are considered the safest intersection. They have high capacity and low delay. They also allow for geometric flexibility and aesthetics. Roundabouts always have a physical splitter island to direct traffic around the center island. Roundabouts reduce crashes by reducing speeds and conflict points. Lower speeds (15-25 MPH) allow for smaller gaps for traffic to enter the circle and a smoother entrance into the circle, increasing capacity by reducing vehicle stopping Once vehicles are in the circular roadway (center) vehicles have no interruptions, as they don't have to yield to entering traffic and there are no conflicts with pedestrians, bus stops or parking maneuvers. In North Carolina, we have seen an overall reduction in total crashes of 46% following the installation of roundabouts. Fatal/injury crashes have reduced by 76% and frontal impact crashes by 75%. Roundabouts are not just for intersections with relatively low traffic. A single lane roundabout can process over 20,000 vehicles per day, while a multi-lane roundabout can handle over 40,000 vehicles per day. Pedestrian and cyclist safety are also improved with roundabouts. Roundabouts can accommodate buses, large trucks and emergency vehicles. There are



US 64 and NC Zoo Connector - (R-2536)

Project Purpose

- Improve traffic flow and levels of service (LOS) on existing US 64
- Reduce congestion and thereby improve safety on existing US 64
- Enhance high speed regional travel on the US 64 Intrastate Corridor
- Improve access to the NC Zoo



Project Needs

- Existing and future traffic congestion along US 64 cause significant travel delays, increased accidents, and contributes to inefficient operation of motor vehicles.
- Accident rates along existing US 64 are above the statewide average for similar roadways in North Carolina.



Project Needs

- Congestion occurs on NC 159 (Zoo Parkway) due to local traffic mixing with traffic destined for the NC Zoo.
- Zoo visitors, and zoo-related congestion makes it difficult for residents along NC 159 (Zoo Parkway) to access their homes.


Studies and Preliminary Alternatives

44 Preliminary Alternatives

- 9 Build Alternatives were selected for detailed study
 - Planning/design studies were conducted on the 9 alternates
 - Two citizen workshops: September 30, 1998 and June 17, 1999
 - Pre-hearing open house on May 8, 2003
 - Corridor public hearing held on May 22, 2003
 - 350 in attendance, 60 submitted written comments and 22 people spoke
 - Alternative 29 chosen May 12, 2004




Project Schedule

- Environmental Permits issued July 24, 2016
- Clearing and Grubbing began August 22, 2016
- Revised Completion Date May 15, 2020 w/ early Substantial Completion Incentive

** Approximately \$167,000 of work to done per day or \$5,000,000 of work per month to complete on time.

Project Schedule



• As of February 28, 2018 the project is 46.31% complete and 6.5% ahead of schedule.

Project Quantities

- 500,000 tons of stone base
- 700,000 tons of asphalt
- 50,000 cubic yards of concrete





Erosion Control Challenges

Unique Challenge: Topography, large cut/fill areas

 Solution: Staged Stabilization. Focusing on stabilizing the project intermittently and at every stage of construction. Wattle barriers are being utilized on tall cut and fill slopes to reduce rill erosion. Numerous velocity control measures throughout the project to manage runoff velocities. Grading to drain in order to manage runoff

Unique Challenge: **Turbidity**, the nature of the soils on the project have made turbidity management a challenge.

 Solution: Innovation and creativity. The contractor is utilizing traditional Polyacrylamide devices to help reduce the turbidity of runoff. In addition, the contractor is utilizing creative alternatives such as floc logs in slope drains and tube socks filled with PAM in slope drains to try and reduce turbidity.

Erosion Control Challenges

Unique Challenge: **Magnitude** of Construction, this project involves a very aggressive schedule of large-scale grading operations

 Solution: Proactive planning and attention to detail. Mass grading of the magnitude of R-2536 can lead to an inadequately implemented EC Plan. The contractor has done a very good job of ensuring adequate workforce is available so that EC installation can keep pace with the aggressive grading schedule.

Unique Challenge: **Coordination**, there is an immense number of moving parts in construction the magnitude of R-2536.

 Solution: Communication and setting clear expectations. Subcontractors provide stabilization immediately following grade establishment, EC crews installing EC measures immediately behind clearing, stabilization and EC installation coinciding with grading operations, etc.



3. MULTI-MODAL TRANSPORTATION UPDATE – DAVID HOWARD		
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	 Chief Deputy Secretary David Howard provided updates for Deputy Secretary Julie White Rail Director Position – Posting is completed. Good candidate pool. Interviews are underway. CSX – Conversations continue on CCX and we have opened discussions on CSX asset sales. Rail Division co-hosted the Southeast Rail Forum in Greenville, SC which was well attended and very informational. Bike/Ped helmet awards announced. We invited legislators to join us for the delivery which has generated 53 legislator requests! Complete Streets Policy Review– the consultant spent an hour with the Secretary and Executive Leadership to provide input and direction to the effort. PTD – The Strategic Plan Launch was a great success with over 400 in attendance. The Secretary kicked off the day and was joined by DHHS Secretary Cohen and Rep. Torbett and Sen. Davis who both expressed their support for public transportation. Ferry – Presented to Transportation Oversight on the passenger ferry and mentioned that we would need a legislative change to allow us to sell beer and wine on the passenger ferry. We will also be seeking legislative approval to enable us not to issue refunds for tickets purchased but rather allow the ticket to be applied to a future ride. Processing refunds costs the system as well as the lost revenue from not being able to sell the seat. Aviation – Getting close to finishing disbursement of the \$50m in NCGA direct appropriation to the commercial airports. They are just back from the NC Airport Association annual meeting with 450 attendees, where many of our staff spoke.

4. RURAL & METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION – CHRIS LUKASINA, CAPITAL AREA MPO, DANA STOOGENKE, ROCKY RIVER RPO		
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Dana Stoogenke, from the Rocky River Rural Planning Organization and Chris Lukasina from Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization presented multimodal issues in rural & metropolitan planning. The presenters noted that all transportation modes play a critical role in moving people and goods and fueling the economy. Highlights of presentation included the need to incorporate Complete Streets within the Comprehensive Transportation Planning process, project development, planning, programming & construction; recommendations to study issues around TAP/CMAQ project delivery and the challenges facing multi-modal projects in STI.
