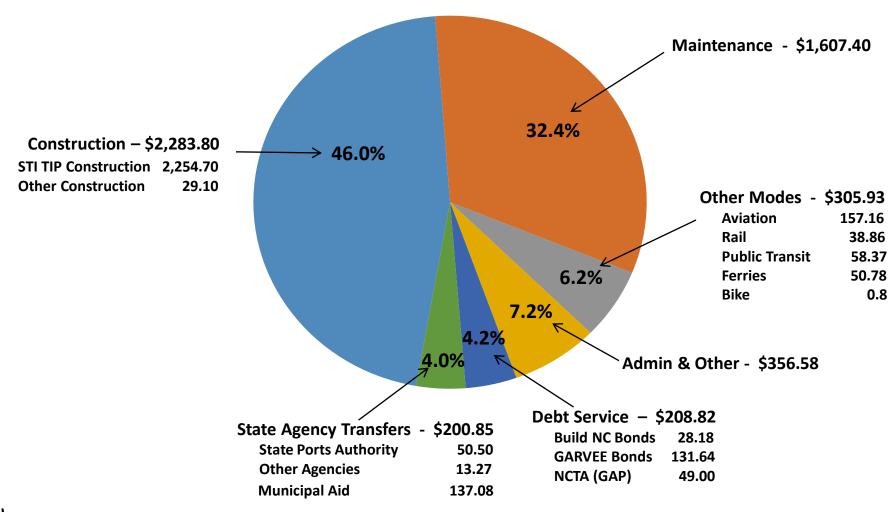

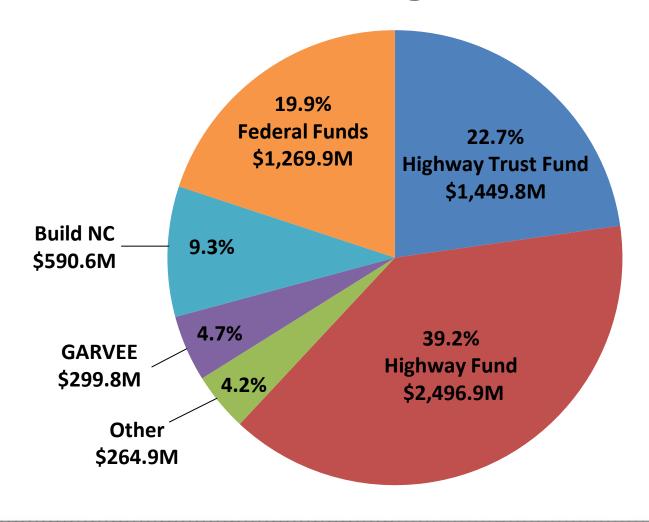
Uses of 2020-21 NCDOT Appropriations* Total Funding = \$4.96 Billion

Financial Analysis

- Highway Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, cash balance increased by 19% or \$68.9 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures as a result of the cash shortage. October 2020 expenditures were \$114 million less than October 2019 expenditures.
- Highway Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Fund total revenues decreased by 9% or \$19.3 million. This decrease was primarily due to a \$17 million decrease in gasoline tax revenues over prior month.
- Highway Trust Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, Cash balance increased by 6% or \$18.3 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures in October 2020, which were approximately \$25 million less than October 2019.
- Highway Trust Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Trust Fund revenues decreased by 4% or \$5.7 million. This decrease was mostly due to a \$3.8 million decrease in gasoline tax combined with a 1.7 million decrease in highway use tax revenues over prior month.
- As of October 2020, year-to-date actual revenues are exceeding the year-to-date forecast revenues by approximately \$31 million or 3.6%.

Key monthly actions:

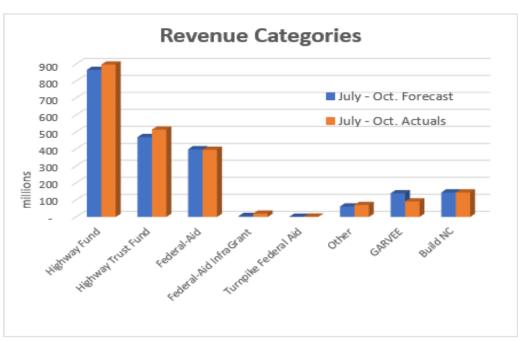
• On November 12, 2020 the NC Department of Transportation issued \$700 million in tax-exempt Limited Obligation (Build NC) Bonds, Series 2020B. Interest on the bonds will be payable semiannually on each May 1 and November 1, commencing on May 1, 2021. The bonds were issued to provide funds for the purpose of (1) funding transportation projects across the State, (2) funding the Debt Service Reserve Fund, and (3) paying certain costs incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2020B Bonds.

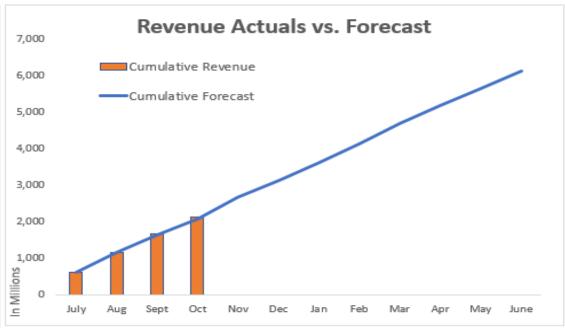
Spend Plan Analysis

- Total Revenues year to date are 2% above the spend plan forecast, or \$47.2 million. DOT realized higher Motor Fuel Tax revenue in July of \$80 million of deferred taxes allowed by NCDOR. All revenue line items are at or above the spend plan forecast, except for GARVEE revenues, which is below original forecast by \$47 million.
 - Other Revenue Total Other Revenues year to date is \$70.5 million or 14% above spend plan forecast. Major line items for this category include Damage Claims (\$36.8 million), Federal Transit funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$5.2 million), and GHSP funding (\$3.6 million).
- Total Expenditures year to date are 10% below the spend plan forecast, or \$192 million. This is a result of the slow down implemented during Spring 2020 and the lag time in reinitiating project phases.
 - Total Construction Expenditures are 7% below spend plan forecast. The majority of the variance is for GARVEE project expenditures, (\$48 million) and Build NC project expenditures (\$47 million). ROW expenditures through October total \$65.6 million, or 12.4% of the \$529 million yearly spend plan. Utilities expenditures through October total \$36.4 million, or 43% of the \$85 million yearly spend plan.
 - Maintenance Expenditures year to date are 17% below spend plan forecast. Contract Resurfacing expenditures are expected to increase as fall contracts are let. In addition, undeclared disasters expenditures are anticipated to increase as road repairs are completed for damages related to recent rainstorms and the greater possibility of snow and ice events during the winter months.
 - Total Modal Expenditures are 15% below spend plan forecast. Modal grant payments to locals were delayed in SFY 2020 because of budget constraints. Those carryforward grant payments are anticipated to be expended in the coming months as well as other programs/projects are reinitiated.

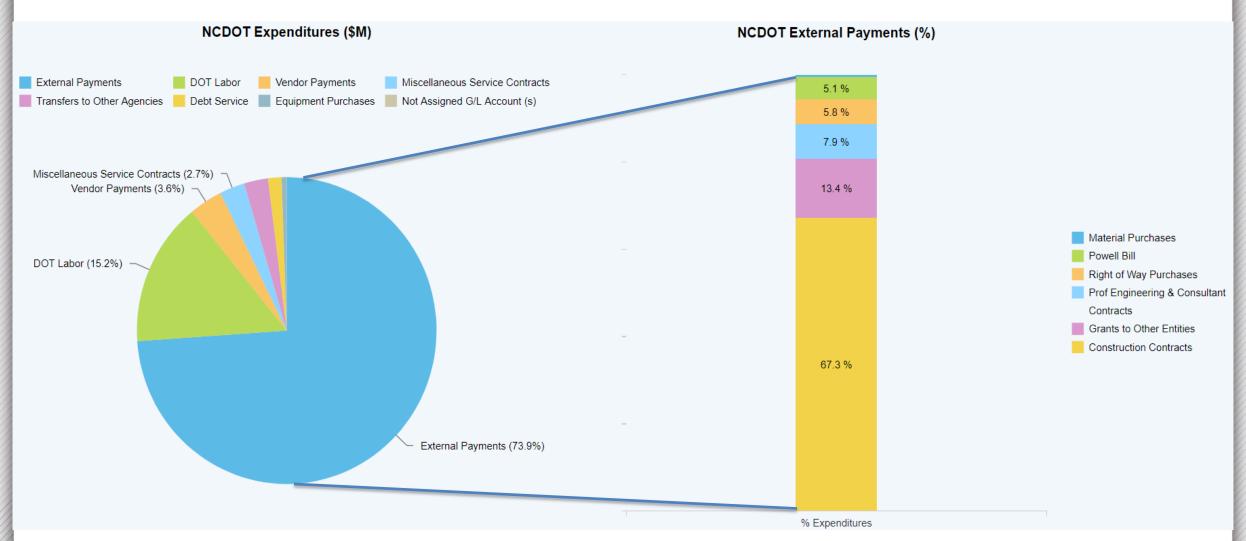


Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

October 2020 – No Reporting Required

- Section 2.1 of Session Law 2019-251 requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For October 2020, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$627 million.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for October was \$743 million which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under G.S. 143C-6-11.

NCDOT Expenditures SFY2021 as of October 31, 2020

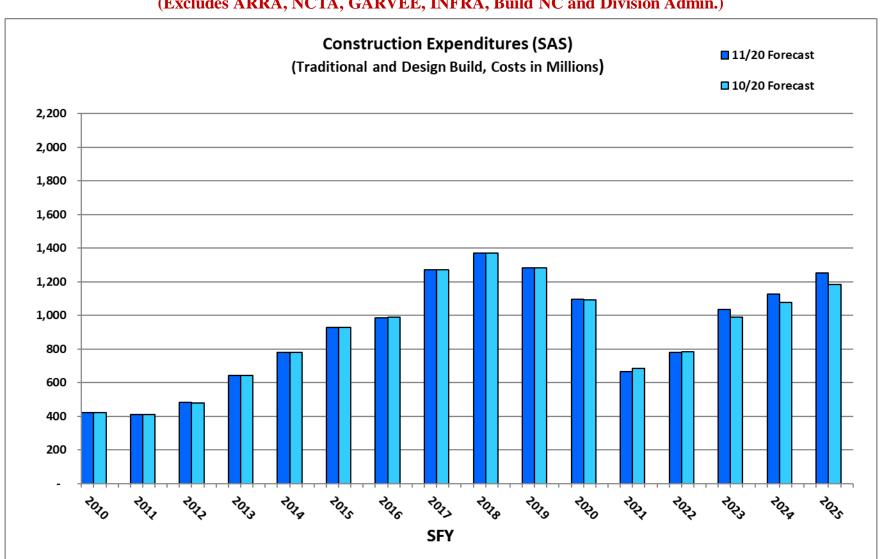

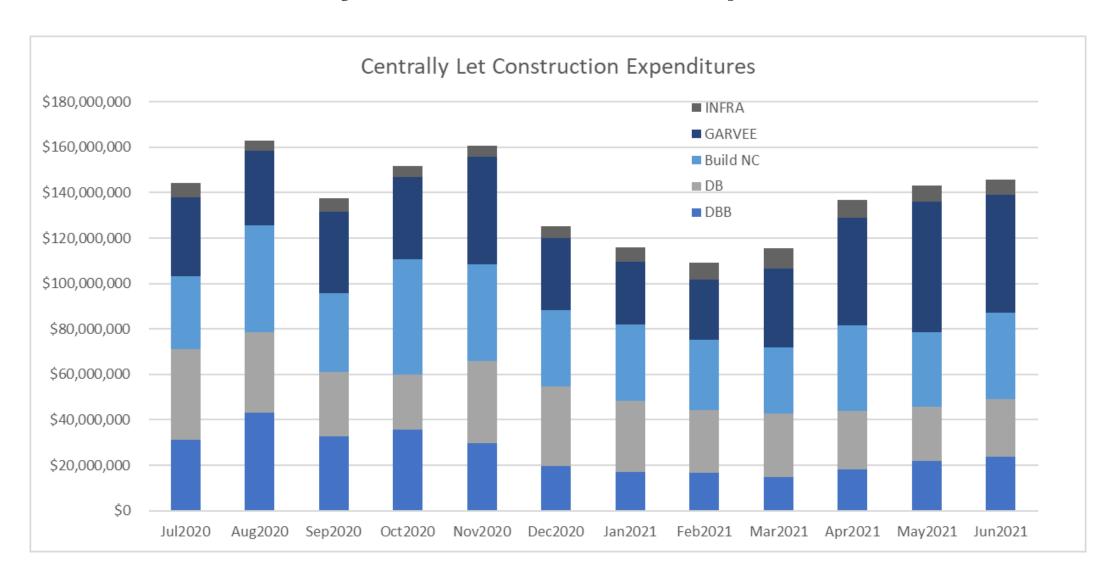
- Build NC Bonds were sold on November 12th. Initial bond proceeds were received from the trustee in the amount of \$172,484,203.46.

Centrally Let Construction Expenditure 10/20 - 11/20 Forecast Comparison

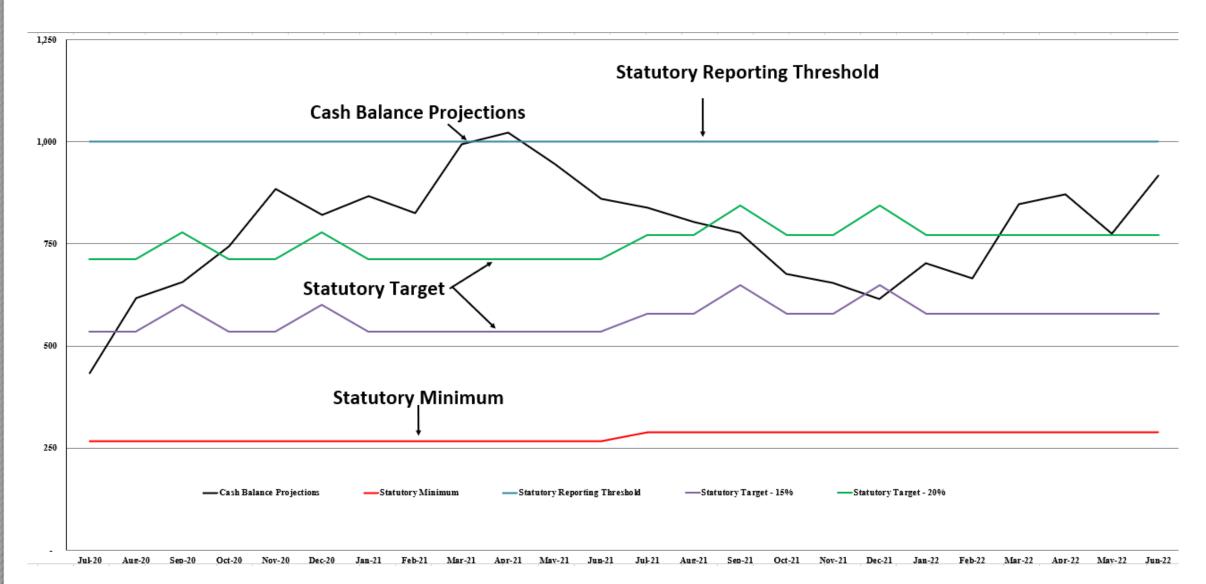

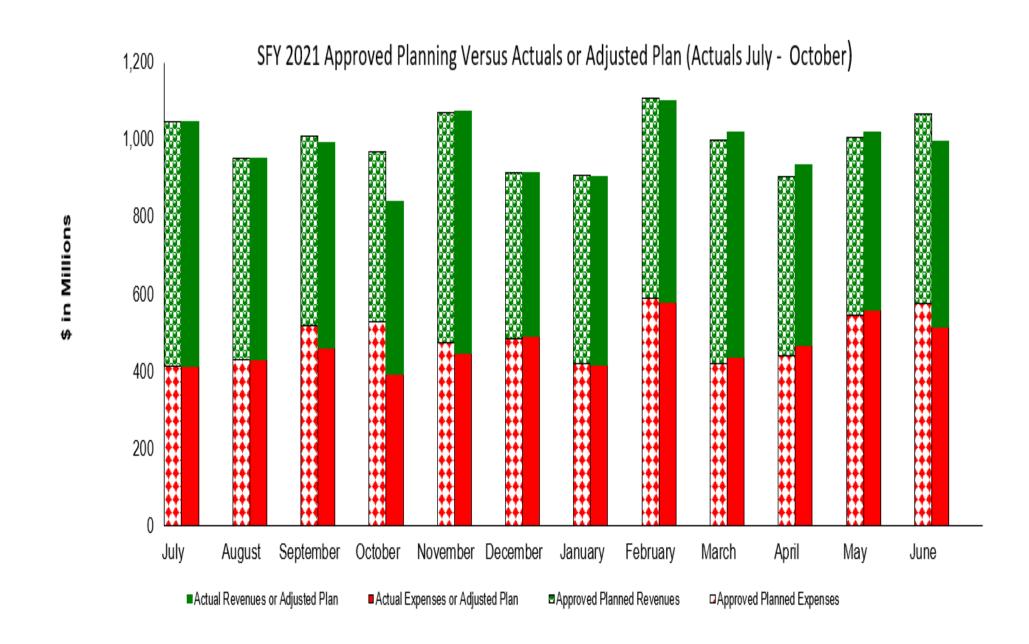

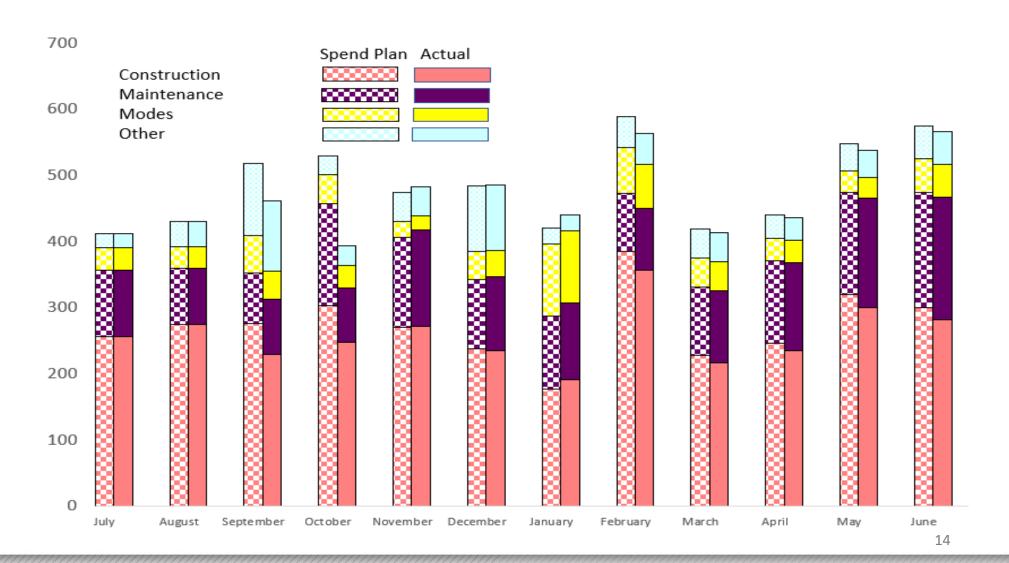

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. Overby discussed changes made to the Adjusted Spend Plan for SFY2021, including adding September actuals and updating the construction forecasts. Expanded categories for Other Construction and Maintenance are now present, per previous recommendation by the Board. A federal Aviation discretionary grant of \$25M was not received as anticipated_so line items for Airports and Other Revenue have been adjusted. She relayed the 24-month forecast and pointed out the approach to the \$1B cash balance statutory reporting threshold. October's anticipated ending cash balance was expected to be \$685M, a \$136M increase from the previous estimate. She displayed a chart that compared monthly projections to actuals. Revenues are coming in higher than expected (\$45M in September). She also noted that new revenue projections have been developed by Burt Tasaico and OSBM and those are being reviewed. Approximately \$56M less than anticipated was spent in September, \$23M of it being GARVEE. It was noted that programs have delayed many projects and it takes time to reengage to move forward. She relayed that variances (BIPs) less than 5% were seen as successful. She confirmed that municipality payments are due on October 1 and January 1, so half have already been remitted. Subsequent reporting will include visual cues to point out higher variances.

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King discussed the Spend Plan Policy. In response to Session Law 2020-91 the Department drafted this policy to guide the Spend Plan process. It details the different roles, responsibilities, development and ultimate approval of the spend plan. It also specifies the oversight and modifications which guide the process. She noted that Board Member comments have been incorporated into the policy. She also informed the Committee the Transportation Oversight Manager position at OSBM has yet to be filled but the Spend Plan approval was given by Charles Perusse, State Budget Director. Increased revenues have led to additional spend capacity, and she is hoping to present updated plans in December. Build NC bonds were priced at 1.54% of TIC and should bring in \$172.4M on November 12. The full authorized amount is \$700M, and bond proceeds will be received based on construction expenditures within a two-year window. The bond proceeds received upon the bond issuance will open up additional spend capacity that can be utilized until the end of the fiscal year.
ACTIONS TAKEN	Board member Clarke made the motion to recommend to the full Board approval of the policy and Board member Mathis provided the second. Members Lathrop, Clarke, Jordan, Mathis, Lail, Rosenburgh, Wells and McGrady individually voted in favor of recommending the policy to the full Board. It unanimously passed.



DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Hopkins presented the Division Spend Plan and noted his four agenda items: Spend plan target, development, monitoring/tracking, and moving forward to improve forecasting. He pointed out the difference between appropriations, allocations, and expenditures. He outlined anticipated statewide and at division-level expenditures and relayed a projected savings of \$200M over the fiscal year to add to the cash balance. He gave examples of charts and graphs his team uses, in addition to features of the SAP Dashboard. He discussed the influx of damaged claim reimbursements and how they are accounted for. Mr. Hopkins noted their projects and programs are continuing; not started or stopped on a fiscal year basis. When they let a contract, they think about it based on construction seasons over multiple fiscal years. He discussed projecting expenses based upon historical data and seasonal needs, rather than via a straight-line model.

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Keeter discussed HB77 mandates and shared the October 16 response to JLTOC. Divisions and Fiscal will meet quarterly to discuss reporting and trends. New Accounting IV positions are anticipated to be posted by January 2021 and filled by June 2021. He outlined how the 14 divisions are distributed over seven regions, and the interaction planned amongst all entities.

6. Ferry Division Update – Ha	rold Thomas and Mary Willis
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Thomas introduced Mrs. Willis and she began the Ferry Division Budget Discussion presentation.
	Mrs. Willis noted the 22 ferries all have various preventative maintenance plans. These vessels have a 30-year life expectancy, so Ferry wishes to implement a strong preservation plan extending the useful lifeline to an additional 15 years. Mrs. Willis then mentioned Ferry has operated with overdrafts for the past five years. She said the cost of standard operations and maintenance exceeds their current and recent appropriations. Mrs. Willis then noted over \$6M has been charged to disaster in the last 5 years; O&M expenditures would have been higher had these disasters not taken place.
	For FY 2020/2021, Mrs. Willis discussed the current Ferry cash spend target of \$45.7M and they're requesting a cash spend target of \$63.2M. She noted this is an increase request of \$17.5M; the bulk of this is addressed by bank revenue and carry forward funding on projects, plus it avoids significant service losses and reductions in force.
	For FY 2021/2022, Mrs. Willis noted the current Ferry cash spend target of \$48.6M and they're requesting a cash spend target of \$61.5M. Mrs. Willis noted next year's cash spend request is an increase of \$12.9M. Of the \$12.9M increase request, \$2M of that is addressed by the legislative changes request and \$6.1M of that is in



	appropriations; she noted it's important for their operations and maintenance to be able to insure their license positions are filled, their personnel are receiving expanded training & development, and funding is available to meet the maintenance needs of over \$500M in assets (Ferry vessels, marine infrastructure, work boats, etc.). In closing, Mrs. Willis said they are requesting guidance in determining their course for attending their overdraft. She noted if the requested increase is approved, they can reduce the deficit over a few years or, if forgiven, they can move more quickly
	to implementing new initiatives. Mrs. Willis said if current cash spend plans stay in place, further evaluations for assets, service, and labor reduction would have to be considered.
	Additional tracking statistics and comparisons to out of state systems will be prepared for subsequent discussion.

7. NC First Commission Update	– Amna Cameron
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Chairman Lathrop discussed the NCFIRST commission and the goals of DOT's partnership with them, focusing on mitigating the impact of projected declines in gas tax revenues.
	Mrs. Cameron presented an overview of the commissions' work to date. She relayed their next meeting is the last scheduled public meeting, and she is hopeful approval will be granted by all the commissioners to move forward on their recommendations. Briefing papers for information purposes were delivered. Their commissions relayed suggestions on the general fund sales tax as well as different ways to tax transportation, including moving to weight based/damage to roads models, miles driven, towing, micro-mobility, ridesharing and electric and hybrid vehicles.

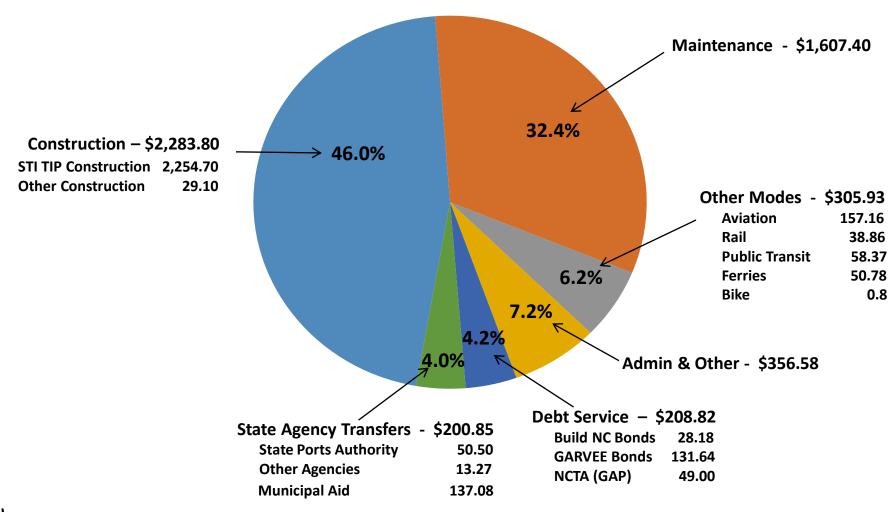

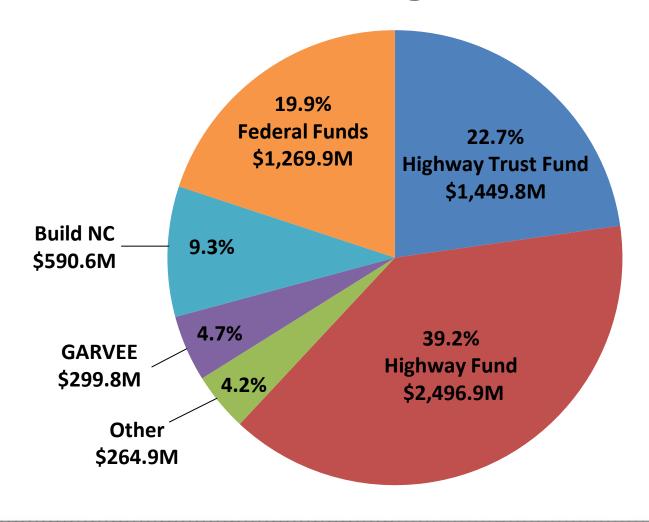
Uses of 2020-21 NCDOT Appropriations* Total Funding = \$4.96 Billion

Financial Analysis

- Highway Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, cash balance increased by 19% or \$68.9 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures as a result of the cash shortage. October 2020 expenditures were \$114 million less than October 2019 expenditures.
- Highway Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Fund total revenues decreased by 9% or \$19.3 million. This decrease was primarily due to a \$17 million decrease in gasoline tax revenues over prior month.
- Highway Trust Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, Cash balance increased by 6% or \$18.3 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures in October 2020, which were approximately \$25 million less than October 2019.
- Highway Trust Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Trust Fund revenues decreased by 4% or \$5.7 million. This decrease was mostly due to a \$3.8 million decrease in gasoline tax combined with a 1.7 million decrease in highway use tax revenues over prior month.
- As of October 2020, year-to-date actual revenues are exceeding the year-to-date forecast revenues by approximately \$31 million or 3.6%.

Key monthly actions:

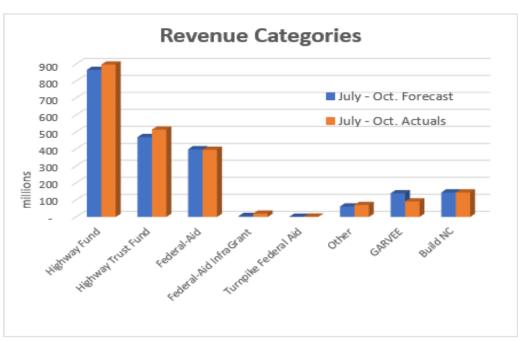
• On November 12, 2020 the NC Department of Transportation issued \$700 million in tax-exempt Limited Obligation (Build NC) Bonds, Series 2020B. Interest on the bonds will be payable semiannually on each May 1 and November 1, commencing on May 1, 2021. The bonds were issued to provide funds for the purpose of (1) funding transportation projects across the State, (2) funding the Debt Service Reserve Fund, and (3) paying certain costs incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2020B Bonds.

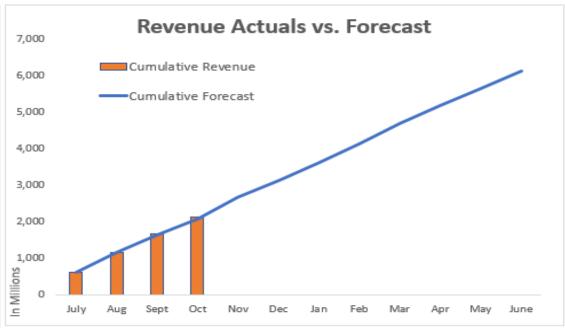
Spend Plan Analysis

- Total Revenues year to date are 2% above the spend plan forecast, or \$47.2 million. DOT realized higher Motor Fuel Tax revenue in July of \$80 million of deferred taxes allowed by NCDOR. All revenue line items are at or above the spend plan forecast, except for GARVEE revenues, which is below original forecast by \$47 million.
 - Other Revenue Total Other Revenues year to date is \$70.5 million or 14% above spend plan forecast. Major line items for this category include Damage Claims (\$36.8 million), Federal Transit funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$5.2 million), and GHSP funding (\$3.6 million).
- Total Expenditures year to date are 10% below the spend plan forecast, or \$192 million. This is a result of the slow down implemented during Spring 2020 and the lag time in reinitiating project phases.
 - Total Construction Expenditures are 7% below spend plan forecast. The majority of the variance is for GARVEE project expenditures, (\$48 million) and Build NC project expenditures (\$47 million). ROW expenditures through October total \$65.6 million, or 12.4% of the \$529 million yearly spend plan. Utilities expenditures through October total \$36.4 million, or 43% of the \$85 million yearly spend plan.
 - Maintenance Expenditures year to date are 17% below spend plan forecast. Contract Resurfacing expenditures are expected to increase as contracts are let for projects. In addition, undeclared disasters expenditures are anticipated to increase as road repairs are completed for damages related to recent rainstorms and the greater possibility of snow and ice events during the winter months.
 - Total Modal Expenditures are 15% below spend plan forecast. Modal grant payments to locals were delayed because of the cash uncertainty. Those carryforward grant payments are anticipated to be expended in the coming months.

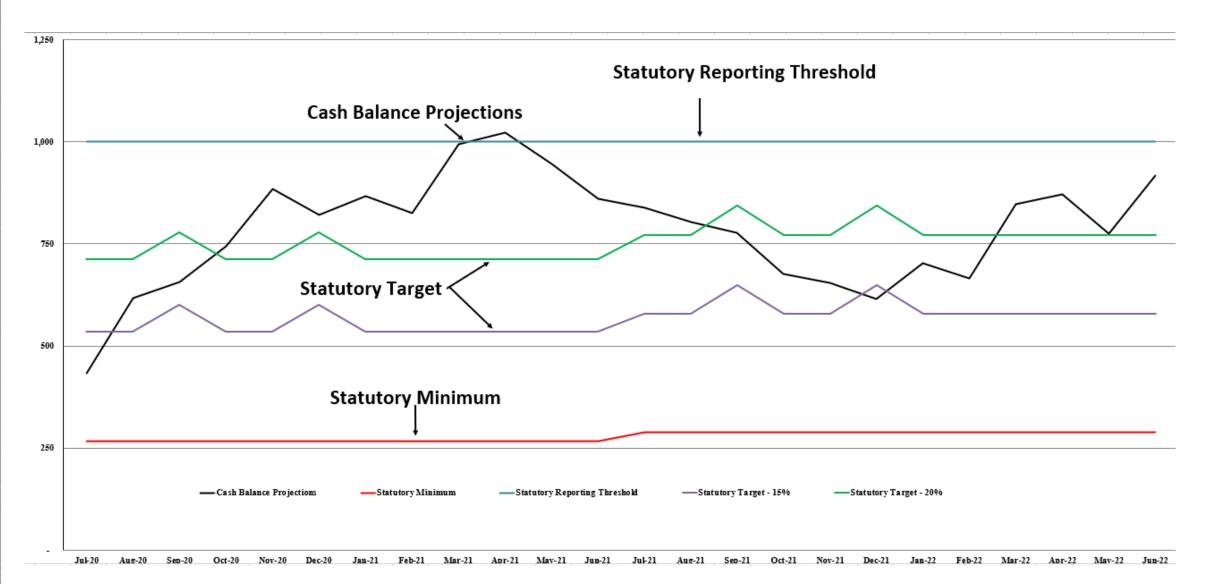
October 2020 – No Reporting Required

- Section 2.1 of Session Law 2019-251 requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For October 2020, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$627 million.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for October was \$743 million which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under G.S. 143C-6-11.

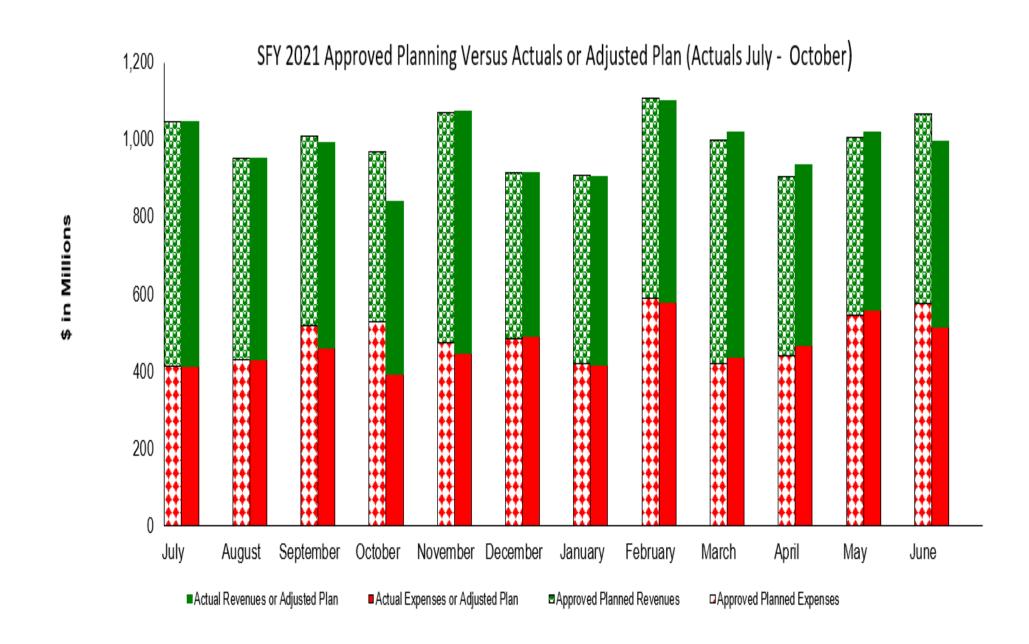

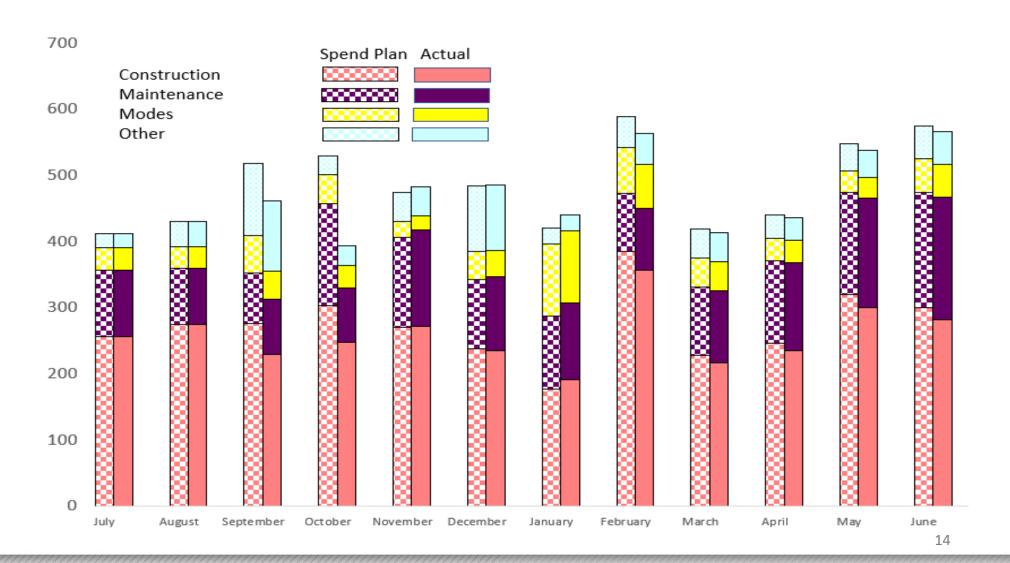

Spend Plan Variance

- Other Revenue +14% Variance (\$9M). Damage Claims significantly higher than forecast, makes up over 52% of year-to-date Other Revenue.
- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -7% Variance (-\$70M). Project lettings were delayed during budget restrictions.
- Contract Resurfacing -26% Variance (-\$37M). Have developed aggressive letting schedules for new contracts through fall and spring. Will provide over \$500M in new contractual opportunities and increase monthly expenditures during late SFY 2021 and through SFY 2022. Fall contract lettings will be available March 1, 2021 and spring contract lettings will be available July 1, 2021.
- Railroad Program -43% Variance (-\$9M). Paused or deferred programs and projects during SFY 2020. Have a backlog of Rail Industrial Access, Rail Safety and Corridor Projects that will be started and incur approximately \$30 million of expenditures through June 2021.
- Aviation -11% Variance (-\$11M). Several airport construction projects from May to August were delayed in getting started and billed due to budget constraints. As projects progress, expect expenditures will catchup during the third quarter of SFY 2021.

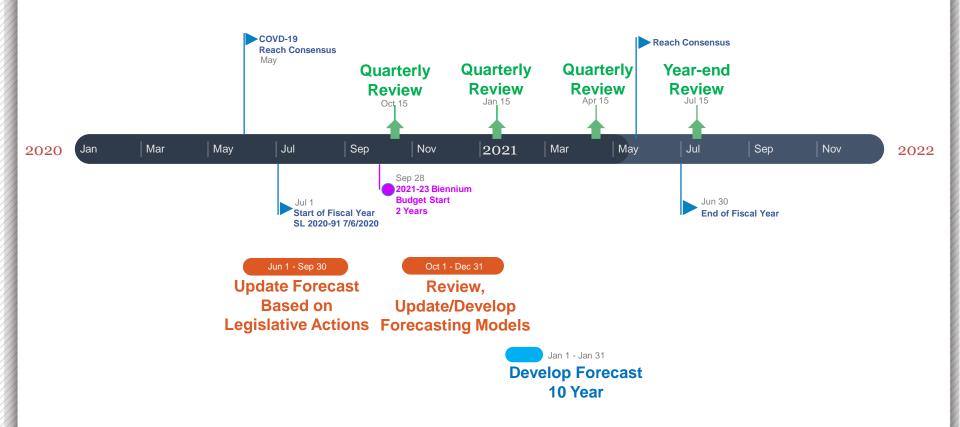




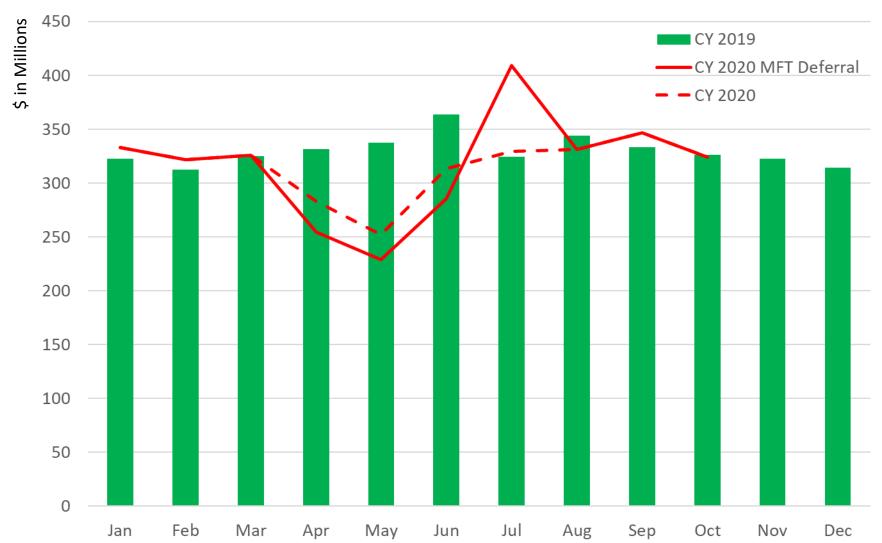

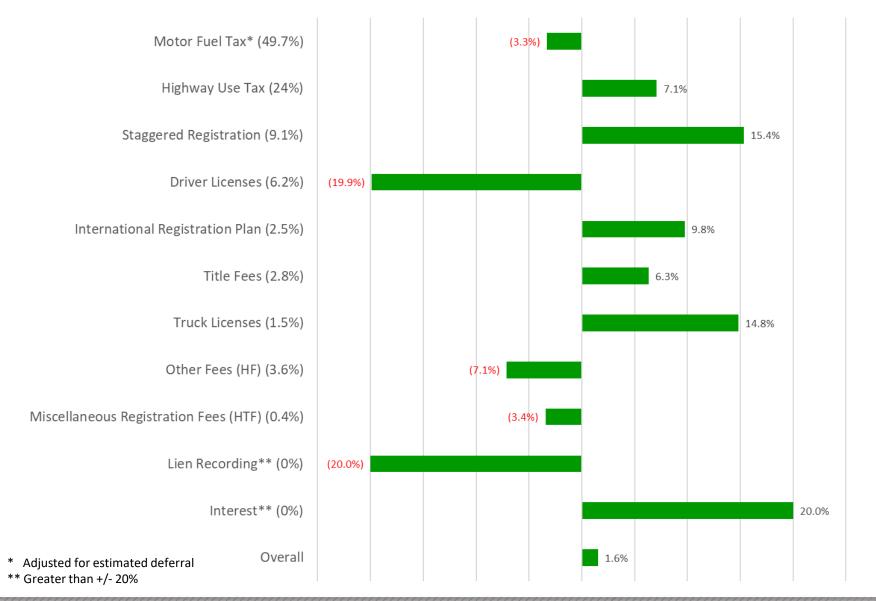


State Revenue Comparison



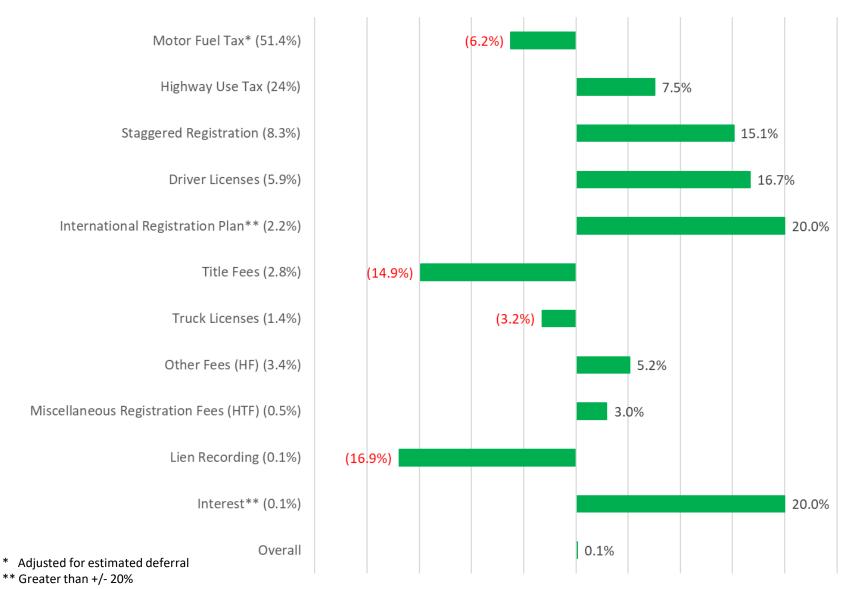
SFY 2021 Year over Year – July Comparison



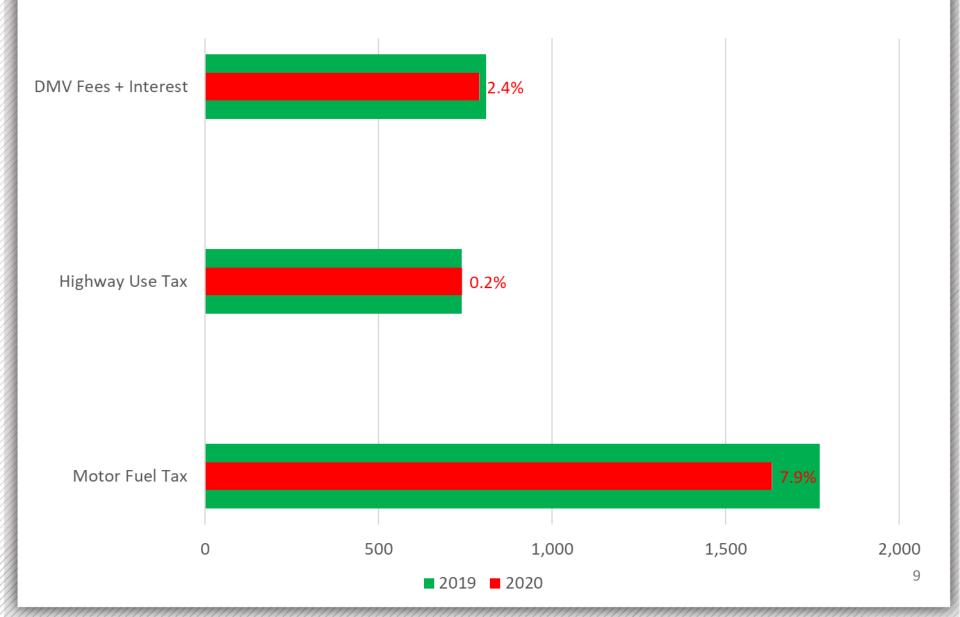


SFY 2021 Year over Year – October Comparison

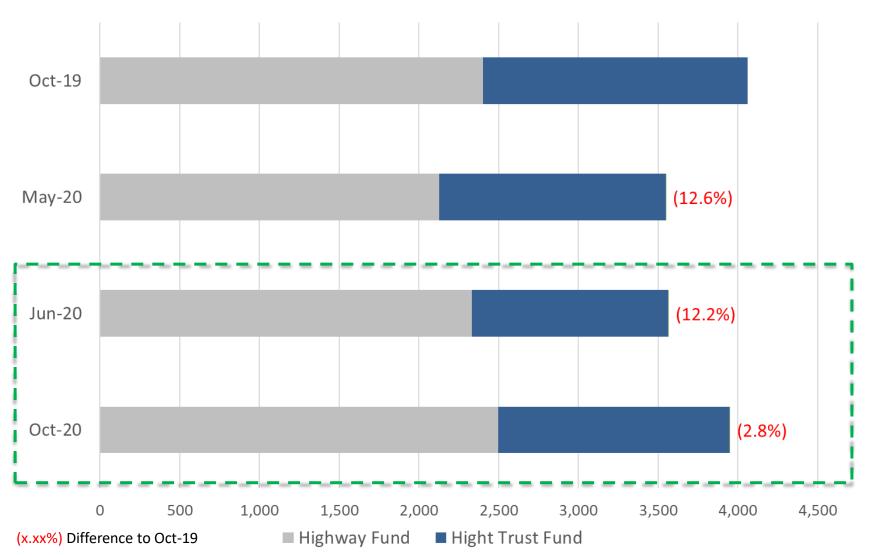




State Revenue Comparison through October

RESOLUTION FOR RONNIE MILSAP HIGHWAY

WHEREAS, Ronnie Lee Milsap was born in Robbinsville, North Carolina, and received his education from the Governor Morehead School for the Blind in Raleigh; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Milsap is widely known by residents and visitors to Graham County as a nationally recognized musician and entertainer, and he embodies the values and cultural heritage unique to many Graham County natives; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Milsap is an American country music singer, pianist and songwriter, and one of country music's most popular and influential performers of the 1970s and 1980s; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Milsap had 40 chart-topping country music singles over five decades and broke music genre rules to become one of the biggest pop/adult contemporary and rhythm and blues artists of the late 1970s and early 1980s, and became the first country music artist to be played on MTV; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Milsap was awarded six Grammys, Country Music Association Entertainer of the Year and received four Country Music Association Awards for Album of the Year, and

WHEREAS, the Graham County Board of Commissioners requests that the North Carolina Board of Transportation designate a portion of US 129 as the Ronnie Milsap Highway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
