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BOARD OF TRANSPORTATION MEETING

December 2, 2020

As part of the Act to Provide Aid to North Carolinians In Response to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Crisis, (S.L. 2020-3, SB 704) the General Assembly enacted modifications to the laws governing public bodies. The provisions are in Section 4.31 of the Act.

The December 2, 2020 meeting was held via Microsoft Teams for all members of the Board and therefore, considered a remote meeting. It was held in such way due to the restrictions in place pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Based on the new law (General Statute §166A-19.24), the meeting followed the parameters set out for remote meetings. Actions executed during the December 2, 2020 Board of Transportation meeting included:

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions
- ensuring that the meeting minutes of the remote meeting reflect that the meeting
 was conducted by use of simultaneous communication, denoting the name of
 members participating by simultaneous communication, and recording when
 members join or leave the remote meeting

All members of the Board were reminded that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business during this remote meeting are deemed a public record. As always, the meeting was properly noticed, Wednesday, and was provided for members of the public to access the meetings.

Wednesday December 2, 2020

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 11:01 a.m. on Wednesday, December 2, 2020, in Raleigh, North Carolina with the following members present via conference call: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Board members Overholt, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Chairman Fox thanked members for making any schedule changes to join this morning's meeting. He shared Governor Cooper would be joining the meeting. Chairman Fox shared it is always an honor to welcome our Governor to our meetings. We know how busy his schedule stays in a normal year and most certainly in this very unique year. He mentioned it is inspiring to know that the hard work of our Board is an important priority to him and his strategic vision. Governor Cooper joined the meeting and Chairman Fox welcomed him and thanked him for taking time to speak with members of the Board.

Governor Cooper thanked the Board for making time for him to join the meeting. He shared he wanted to take a moment to thank members for the work they are doing, especially in these unprecedented times. He acknowledged that being a member of the Board of Transportation takes a great deal of commitment and serving during a global pandemic is even more challenging. Governor Cooper commended members for their dedication. Governor Cooper recognized Board Chair Fox for his dedication to the department. He shared that he has demonstrated great leadership since becoming Chairman of the Board in 2017. Governor Cooper complimented Chairman Fox by sharing that he has led the Board well over this past year as we have dealt with unprecedented challenges. He thanked the Chairman and stated he knew the Board was in good hands with him at the helm.

Governor Cooper thanked Eric Boyette, Secretary of Transportation, for his service over the past year. He shared that when he asked Secretary Boyette to take this leadership role, he had no idea that just a few weeks later we would be in the midst of a statewide shut down to help curb the spread of Covid-19. The shutdown meant he had days not months to transition thousands of employees to a telework environment; create new systems and procedures to keep our staff and the general public safe when they visit our DMV offices or travel by ferry and train. All the while dealing with the financial impacts from less traffic volumes. Governor Cooper thanked Secretary Boyette again for his leadership during this past year. He stated that the Department is fortunate to have such strong leadership.

Governor Cooper stated even during this very challenging year, NCDOT accomplished great things. He provided examples such as the Department received multiple federal grants for the modes and was recognized nationally for leadership in the autonomous vehicle sector. The Department responded with speed and expertise to natural disasters and took swift and impactful steps to stabilize the Department's finances. The actions placed us on solid ground as we move into 2021. Governor Cooper thanked everyone for their great work and stated he looked forward to working with everyone in 2021.

Chairman Fox thanked Governor Cooper again for joining and speaking with the Board. Chairman Fox asked if there were any additional items for discussion and if none, he would accept a motion to adjourn the meeting. Chairman Fox accepted a motion from Board Member Zimmer, seconded by Board Member Rosenburgh.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call vote. When I say your name, please say either yes ("aye") to indicate yes or if opposed, please say "no".

Chairman Fox along with members Perkins, Moran, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Cody, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Clarke, Lail, McGrady, and Wells all voted yes to adjourn the meeting.

Board Members Overholt, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

The meeting adjourned until 1:00pm.

Full Board Work Session/ Finance Committee

Wednesday December 2, 2020

Chairman Fox welcomed members back to the meeting and thanked members of the Board for being present to handle business brought before them.

Chairman Fox stated we are continuing our remote meetings via Microsoft Teams as we have over the past several months in response to COVID-19. Today we will continue

- ensuring that the meeting minutes of the remote meeting reflect that the meeting

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 1:01 p.m. on Wednesday, December 2, 2020, in Raleigh, North Carolina with the following members present via conference call: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Board Member Taft was absent.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that particular item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose." Tony Lathrop, Chairman of the Board's Finance Committee, called the roll for members of the Finance Committee and presided over the Finance Committee portion of the work session. The Finance Committee meeting minutes have been recorded separately for the committee.

A general account of the Finance Committee details that the full membership of the board attending the committee on December 2, 2020 beginning at 1:00pm. Topics of discussion included:

- Financial and Spend Plan Update by Stephanie King, Chief Financial Officer
- Department's Revenue and Federal Legislation Update by Burt Tasaico, Director of Strategic Initiatives & Program Support
- Spend Plan Capacity by Stephanie King and Michelle Overby, Funds Administration Manager
- Department's Maintenance Spend Targets and Forecasting by Patrick Norman, Director of Highway Operations.

After the Finance Committee meeting Chairman Fox used the Chairman's discretion to call for a 10-minute break for the Board members. He reminded members not to hang up as the board meeting will continue and reconvene at 2:35pm.

After the break Chairman Fox called a roll call to determine members who still remained on the call. Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Board Members Jordan, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Approval – November 4-5, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated that the meeting minutes were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the November 4-5, 2020 meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Tarleton and a second by Board Member Mitchell.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you

hear your name please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or "aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Board Members Jordan, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Road, Bridge and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Board Member Cody presented a resolution naming the US 441 from Exit 74 to the intersection of NC 19 the Beloved Man Dr Jerry Wolfe Highway. The resolution was unanimously approved by the Board upon a motion by Board Member Cody and seconded by Board Member Tarleton. (A copy of the resolution is at the end of this document).

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you hear your name please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or "aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Board Members Jordan, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Board Member Cody presented a resolution naming the US 129 from the intersection of Yellow Creek Road and US 129 North to the Graham County Bridge #33 the Ronnie Milsap Highway. The resolution was unanimously approved by the Board upon a motion by Board Member Cody and seconded by Board Member Clarke. (A copy of the resolution is at the end of this document).

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you hear your name please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or "aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Board Members Jordan, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Secretary Remarks

Secretary Boyette welcomed members of the Board, staff, and those listening to the livestream. He stated he hoped everyone had a safe and enjoyable Thanksgiving holiday. He shared the Department is holding this month's committee and Board meeting in a single day as opposed to the normal Wednesday-Thursday format. Secretary Boyette thanked the Board for adjusting their schedules to join the full Board meeting today. He shared the Governor mentioned earlier this morning that he is proud of the staff and how the Department responds to situations and works to achieve our goals. Secretary Boyette stated it takes the entire Department to complete what we have accomplished.

November 11 Rain Event Update

Secretary Boyette stated before he talked about the rain event that he wanted to remind everyone that the Department is having a snow event in the western part of our state. The team there had about 16 inches on the Cherohala Skyway in Graham County and approximately 5-6 inches along the Tennessee border in Madison. He stated the weather is currently sunny in the east, but snow has already hit the western part of the state.

Secretary Boyette shared details on the November 11th rain event. He mentioned 798 sites were damaged by the rainstorm. The estimated cost from this storm is at nearly \$24M. The team continues to work extremely hard and are down to 60 closures. Secretary Boyette shared photos from across the state showing infrastructure damage following the rain event. Secretary Boyette mentioned the Department has stepped up to ensure our residents of this state are safe. The sites that are still closed are being worked on and are to open as soon as

materials are in place to complete. He stated as always, he appreciates the dedication of our staff and thanked them for the prompt and great attention.

Cash Balance

Secretary Boyette shared an update on the Department's Cash Balance. He mentioned staff continues to work hard so we can continue to bring good news on our finances. The fiscal responsibility to be prepared for things we cannot plan for such as the pandemic, disasters, and rain events remains of utmost importance. The Department's cash balance continues to increase as our revenues outperform projections. He mentioned the cash report that is produced weekly has the Department cash at about \$995M. As mentioned last month, numerous pavement resurfacing, bridge preservation and replacement projects will be started in the spring 2021. This is the visible progress people like to see, it helps our industry partners put people to work. He mentioned the Department is still going to be cautious and conservative to remain prepared for instances as we have experienced before and those we have not.

BUILD NC

Secretary Boyette shared an update on the Build NC Bonds. He shared the bond issuance was completed on November 12, 2020. He mentioned the Department's active projects are continuing and completed. He stated last month's sale was very well received in the marketplace and obtained a great interest rate on the debt. Since the projects were required to be current projects, the Department has been reimbursed around \$200 million from the trustee as of November 30, 2020.

Creating Revenue and Finding Transportation Solutions (CRAFTS)

Secretary Boyette shared updates related to the NC FIRST Commission's most recent meeting. He stated the NC FIRST Commission would like the public to be involved. This will help finalize future revenue and investment recommendations to the Commission. He thanked the co-chairs Ward Nye, and Nancy McFarlane for their leadership and Amna Cameron for her dedication to this commission and its mission. Secretary Boyette shared details about the Commission launching a web tool called CRAFTS which stands for Creating Revenue and Finding Transportation Solutions. He shared this was developed by the Department's partner SAS, to help the Commission find solutions and make decisions. The CRAFTS too allows the user to slide different levers to explore and compare financial scenarios. Links to the tool and public comment portal are on the CRAFTS webpage, found by visiting www.ncdot.gov and

searching "CRAFTS." He mentioned the Commission will review all proposals before finalizing its recommendations in January 2021.

Great Trails State Plan

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the Great Trails State Plan with the Board. He mentioned, now is the time for people to offer input on the draft Great Trails State plan. The Department is currently in the final stages of developing the plan. Using existing plans and recommendations will identify a network of shared-use paths and trails connecting every county in North Carolina. The Department recently collected more than 11,000 responses to a survey on types and locations of trails people want to see. He mentioned to review maps and to make comments, visit www.ncdot.gov and type "Great Trails" into the search box.

Tree of Life

Secretary Boyette shared that the North Carolina Governor's Highway Safety Program and North Carolina Mothers Against Drunk Driving will hold their 23rd annual Tree of Life memorial ceremony on December 4, 2020. He shared the ceremony honors those who lost their lives in car crashes on North Carolina roadways. He mentioned this year's ceremony will be held exclusively online because of COVID-19. Secretary Boyette shared the event proceeds will go to the annual holiday Booze it & Lose It campaign. The campaign will run for three weeks starting December 14 through January 5, 2021.

Employee Updates

Secretary Boyette shared Louis Mitchell has announced plans to step down as the Western Deputy Chief Engineer. Secretary Boyette shared with Louis that he wore a bowtie just for him on Board day. He mentioned Louis is a great engineer as well as a great person and soldier. He joined the Department as an engineer associate in 1992. Since then, he has held positions such as Assistant Resident Engineer, Resident Engineer, District Engineer, Division Construction Engineer, and Division Engineer and his current role as Deputy Chief. He shared Louis will be taking a new position in the private sector. Secretary Boyette thanked Louis for his dedication to this agency and providing great leadership.

Louis thanked the Secretary for wearing a bowtie in his honor. Louis shared he has been with the Department for 29 years. He stated he started his career with the Department on the Transportation Engineer Associate (TEA) Program. Louis thanked the Department and shared he will miss working with everyone.

Secretary Boyette shared Chief Human Resources Officer Darryl Bass accepted a promotional opportunity with the UNC Systems Office. He stated Darryl's last day with the Department will be December 31, 2020. The Department will have a great loss, as Darryl has been a cornerstone of our leadership team. He mentioned Darryl has always accepted his role and responsibility with great professionalism. Secretary Boyette congratulated Darryl on his new opportunity.

Secretary Boyette shared Ronnie Keeter accepted the position of Chief Engineer effective December 1, 2020. He mentioned Ronnie has nearly 28 years with the Department and has served in several roles, most recently Eastern Deputy Chief Engineer. He also has been the Division Engineer for Division Four, County Maintenance Engineer in multiple counties, District Engineer and Division Maintenance Engineer with the Department. Secretary Boyette stated with Ronnie's experience, the Department is in good hands.

Trailblazer Award

Secretary Boyette mentioned he would now take this opportunity to present the Department's inaugural Karen Collette Trailblazer Award. He shared the Karen Collette Trailblazer Award was established in 2019 to recognize an employee who has unprecedented career accomplishments and outstanding contributions. The resolution to establish the Karen Collette Trailblazer Award was signed by Secretary Trogdon, Bobby Lewis, and Chairman Fox in 2019. The award is presented to an employee who exhibits the trailblazing characteristics indicative of Karen Collette. Secretary Boyette shared that Ms. Collette worked for the Department from 1990 until she retired in 2019. Starting out in the Highway Engineering Associate Program, Ms. Collette retired as a division engineer and was the first female division engineer since the Department's inception in 1915. She personified the term trailblazer throughout her tenure. Annually, the award recognizes an individual who identifies and implements innovative changes that positively affect the Department of Transportation. The innovative changes must be lasting and have measurable impact to the organization, and the individual should be a leader and or pioneer in the transportation field.

Secretary Boyette shared this year's recipient is a true trailblazer and recognized leader in public accounting. Her demonstrated leadership, commitment to the industry, mentorship, financial innovation, and integrity personify the principals of the Karen Collette Trailblazer Award. She leads by example and her dedication to the agency are characteristics we should all aspire to emulate each day. She is a North Carolina State University graduate and second-generation DOT employee and has been with the agency for over 30 years. Known as "Kim-Possible" for her ability to handle anything we throw her way. The Department would struggle

without her institutional knowledge, her ability in the field of finance and her commitment to excellence in all things. Please join me in congratulating Kim Padfield, Director of Accounting Operations and Budget.

Secretary Boyette asked Kim Padfield to come forward to accept her award.

Secretary Boyette asked Christopher Peoples, Deputy Chief Engineer to share a special letter from Bobby Lewis, former NCDOT Chief Operating Officer, to Kim Padfield. It read, "Kim, it is with regret that I am not here today to embarrass you in person. I do not know where to begin. Many in the Department know Kim Padfield but they really do not know the tireless energy and leadership that you exert every day. I, nor the Department, could not have survived the recent challenges we had without you. You were the mainstay even when it was too hard for most. Some have said that I kept the department together "with baling wire and duct tape" during tumultuous times. What they did not know, it was you who furnished me with the baling wire and duct tape.

Albert Einstein said, "If I had an hour to solve a problem and my life depended on the solution, I would spend the first 55 minutes determining the proper question to ask, for once I know the proper question, I could solve the problem in less than 5 minutes." If I had a problem that had to be solved in an hour and the NCDOT's future fiscal solvency depended on it, I would talk to Kim Padfield for 59 minutes, and then I could answer the question in a minute. Kim, thank you for all you do for the department, your friendship, your leadership, your dedication, and your resolve to push forward when times are hard. You are most deserving of this award. Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 3:39 pm.

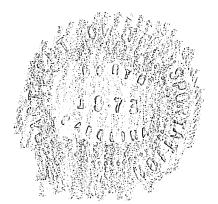

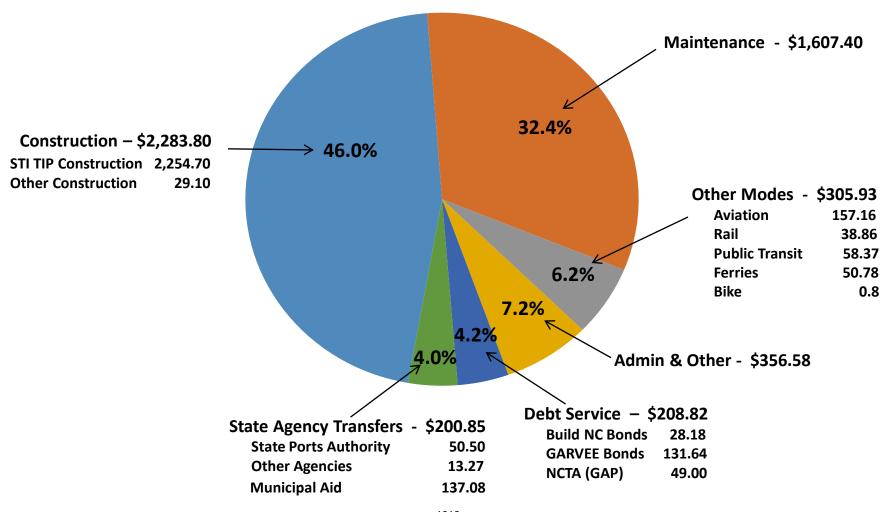

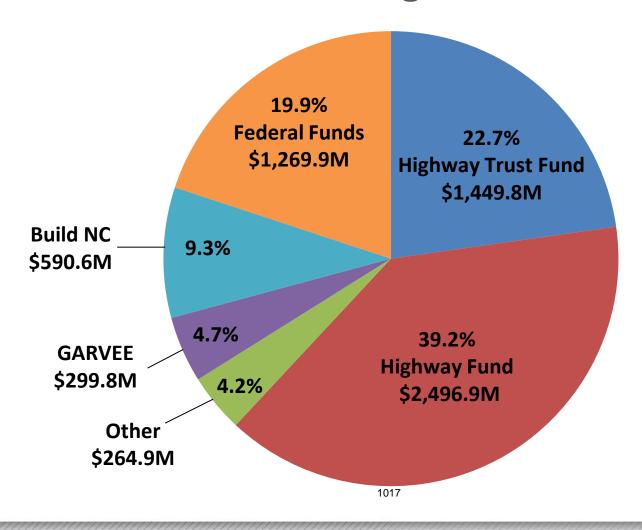
Uses of 2020-21 NCDOT Appropriations* Total Funding = \$4.96 Billion

Unaudited Financial Report

Financial Analysis

- Highway Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, cash balance increased by 19% or \$68.9 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures as a result of the cash shortage. October 2020 expenditures were \$114 million less than October 2019 expenditures.
- Highway Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Fund total revenues decreased by 9% or \$19.3 million. This decrease was primarily due to a \$17 million decrease in gasoline tax revenues over prior month.
- Highway Trust Fund Cash From September 2020 to October 2020, Cash balance increased by 6% or \$18.3 million. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures in October 2020, which were approximately \$25 million less than October 2019.
- Highway Trust Fund Revenues From September 2020 to October 2020, Highway Trust Fund revenues decreased by 4% or \$5.7 million. This decrease was mostly due to a \$3.8 million decrease in gasoline tax combined with a 1.7 million decrease in highway use tax revenues over prior month.
- As of October 2020, year-to-date actual revenues are exceeding the year-to-date forecast revenues by approximately \$31 million or 3.6%.

Key monthly actions:

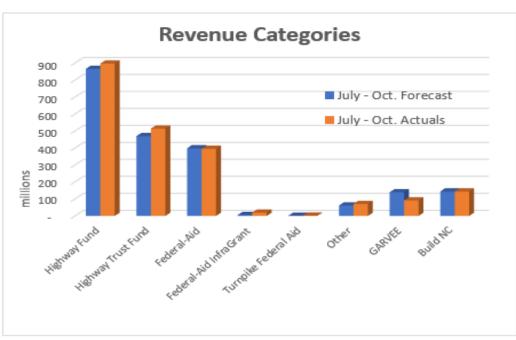
• On November 12, 2020 the NC Department of Transportation issued \$700 million in tax-exempt Limited Obligation (Build NC) Bonds, Series 2020B. Interest on the bonds will be payable semiannually on each May 1 and November 1, commencing on May 1, 2021. The bonds were issued to provide funds for the purpose of (1) funding transportation projects across the State, (2) funding the Debt Service Reserve Fund, and (3) paying certain costs incurred in connection with the sale and issuance of the Series 2020B Bonds.

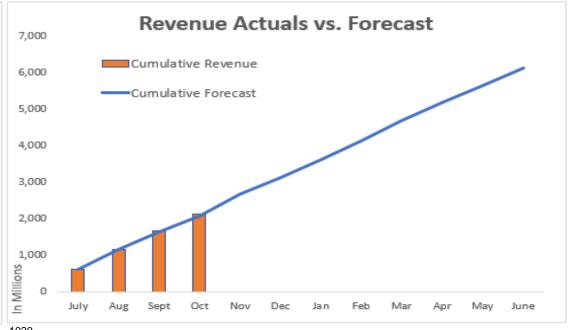
Spend Plan Analysis

- Total Revenues year to date are 2% above the spend plan forecast, or \$47.2 million. DOT realized higher
 Motor Fuel Tax revenue in July of \$80 million of deferred taxes allowed by NCDOR. All revenue line items
 are at or above the spend plan forecast, except for GARVEE revenues, which is below original forecast by
 \$47 million.
 - Other Revenue Total Other Revenues year to date is \$70.5 million or 14% above spend plan forecast. Major line items for this category include Damage Claims (\$36.8 million), Federal Transit funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$8.9 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$5.2 million), and GHSP funding (\$3.6 million).
- Total Expenditures year to date are 10% below the spend plan forecast, or \$192 million. This is a result of the slow down implemented during Spring 2020 and the lag time in reinitiating project phases.
 - Total Construction Expenditures are 7% below spend plan forecast. The majority of the variance is for GARVEE project expenditures, (\$48 million) and Build NC project expenditures (\$47 million). ROW expenditures through October total \$65.6 million, or 12.4% of the \$529 million yearly spend plan. Utilities expenditures through October total \$36.4 million, or 43% of the \$85 million yearly spend plan.
 - Maintenance Expenditures year to date are 17% below spend plan forecast. Contract Resurfacing expenditures are expected to increase as contracts are let for projects. In addition, undeclared disasters expenditures are anticipated to increase as road repairs are completed for damages related to recent rainstorms and the greater possibility of snow and ice events during the winter months.
 - Total Modal Expenditures are 15% below spend plan forecast. Modal grant payments to locals were delayed because of the cash uncertainty. Those carryforward grant payments are anticipated to be expended in the coming months.

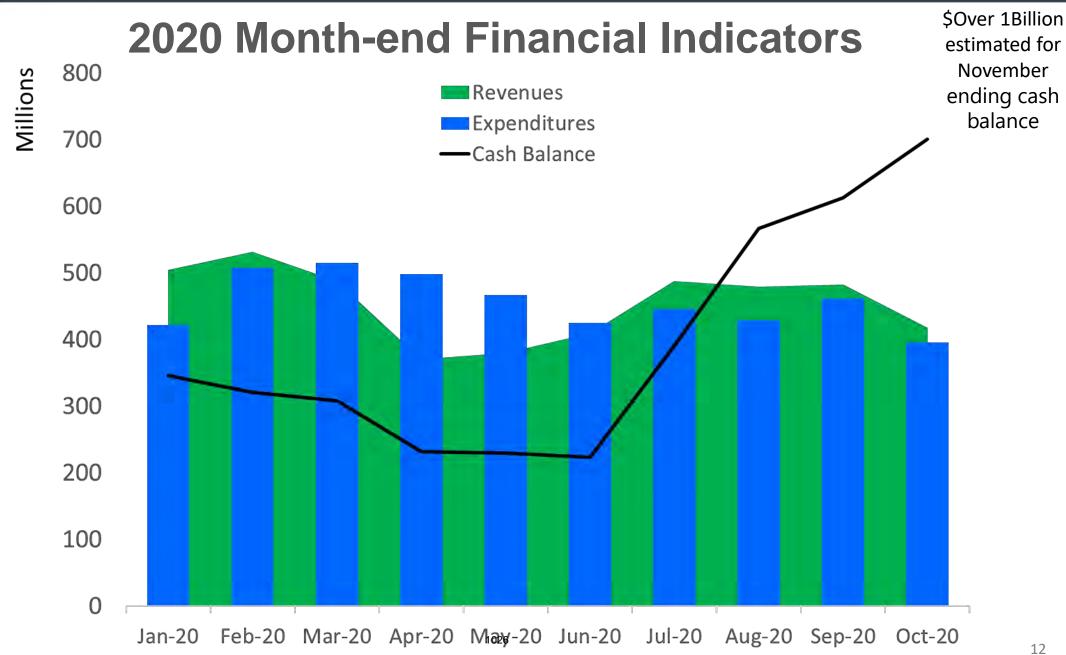

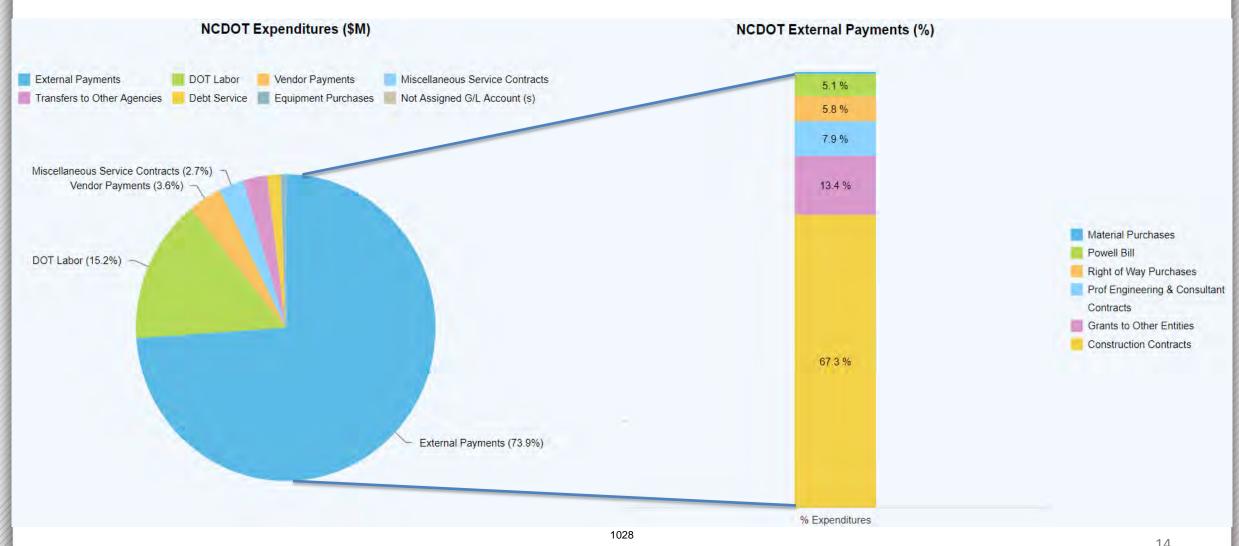

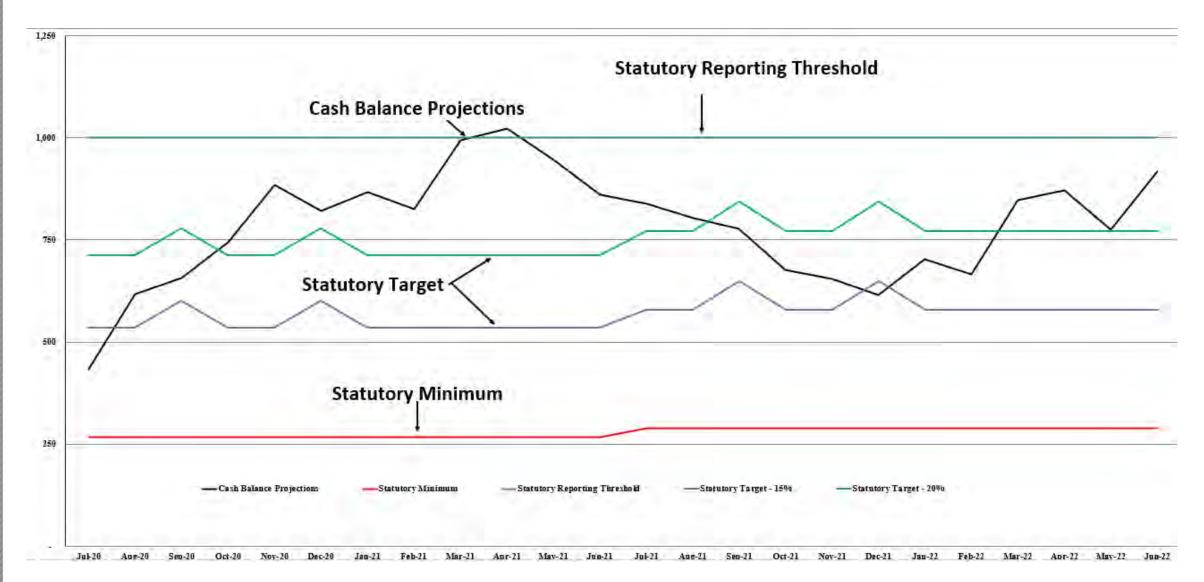
October 2020 – No Reporting Required

- Section 2.1 of Session Law 2019-251 requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For October 2020, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$627 million.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for October was \$743 million which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under G.S. 143C-6-11.

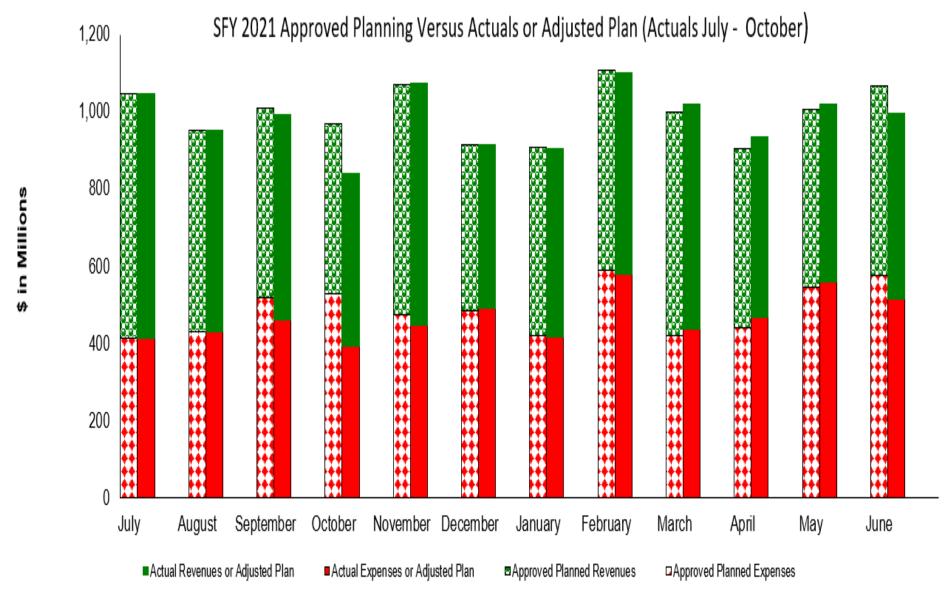

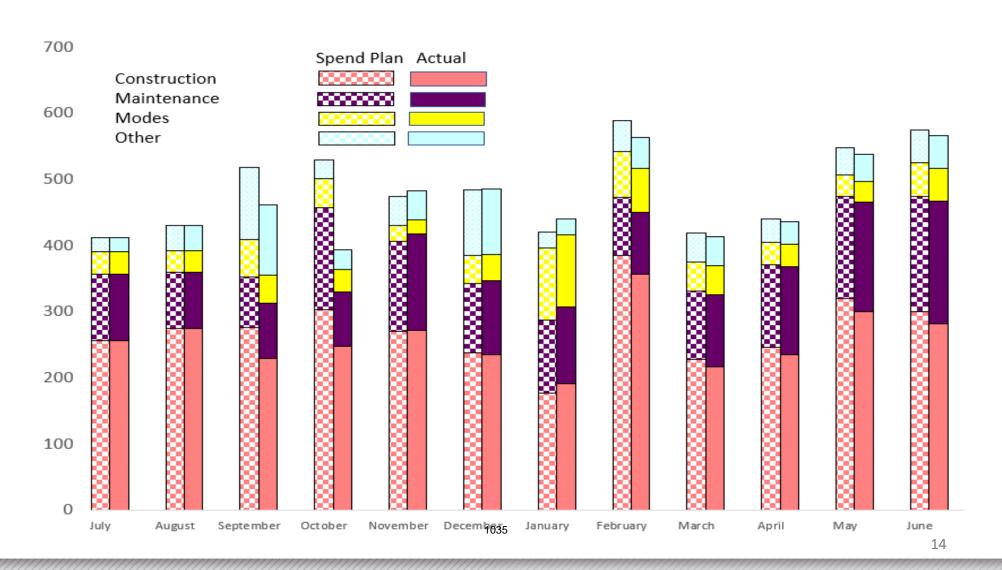

Spend Plan Variance

- Other Revenue +14% Variance (\$9M). Damage Claims significantly higher than forecast, makes up over 52% of year-to-date Other Revenue.
- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -7% Variance (-\$70M). Project lettings were delayed during budget restrictions.
- Contract Resurfacing -26% Variance (-\$37M). Have developed aggressive letting schedules for new contracts through fall and spring. Will provide over \$500M in new contractual opportunities and increase monthly expenditures during late SFY 2021 and through SFY 2022. Fall contract lettings will be available March 1, 2021 and spring contract lettings will be available July 1, 2021.
- Railroad Program -43% Variance (-\$9M). Paused or deferred programs and projects during SFY 2020. Have a backlog of Rail Industrial Access, Rail Safety and Corridor Projects that will be started and incur approximately \$30 million of expenditures through June 2021.
- Aviation -11% Variance (-\$11M). Several airport construction projects from May to August were delayed in getting started and billed due to budget constraints. As projects progress, expect expenditures will catchup during the third quarter of SFY 2021.

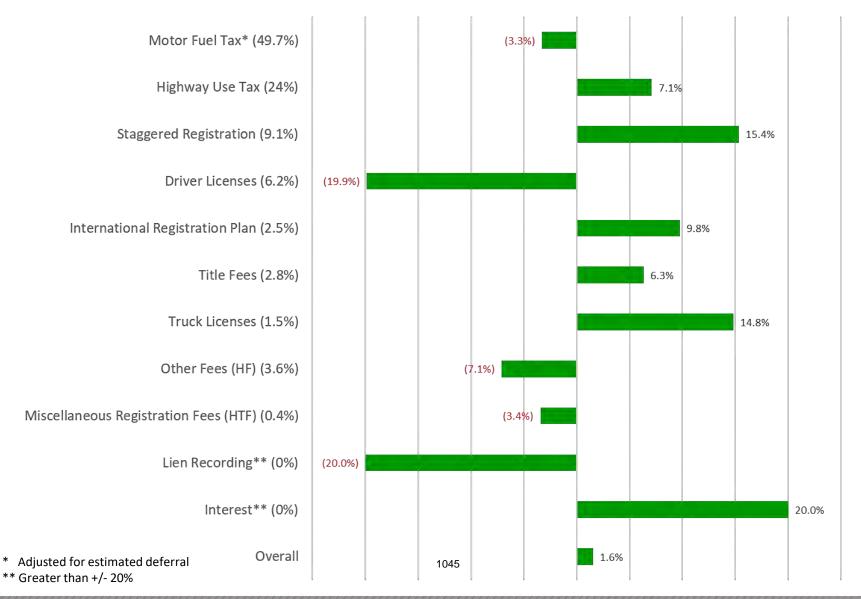


State Revenue Comparison

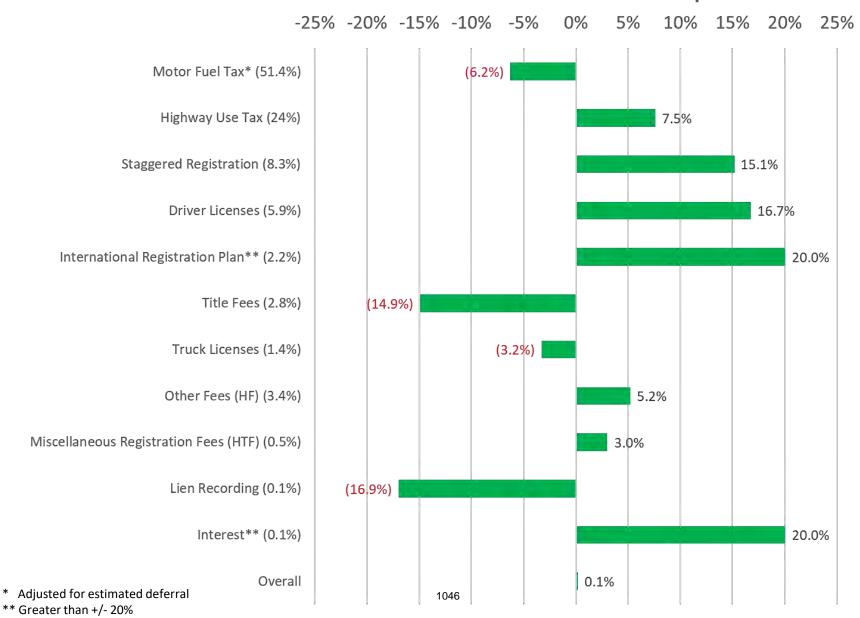


SFY 2021 Year over Year – July Comparison

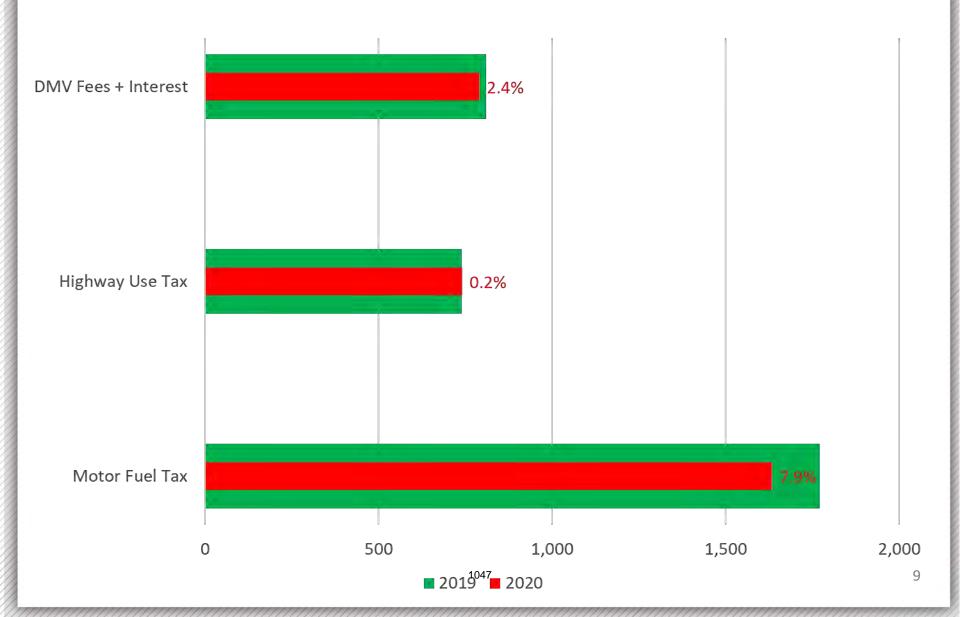

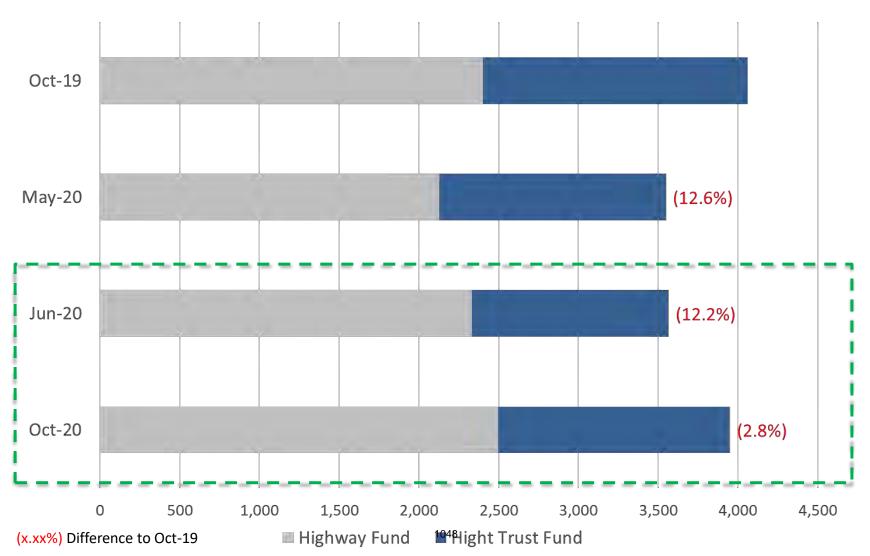
SFY 2021 Year over Year – October Comparison

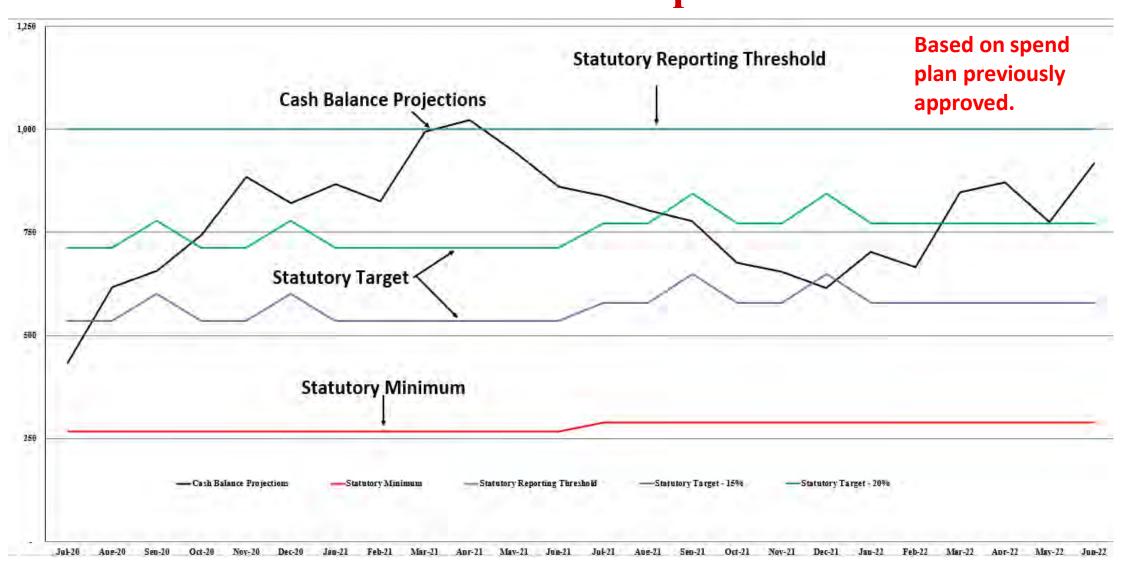

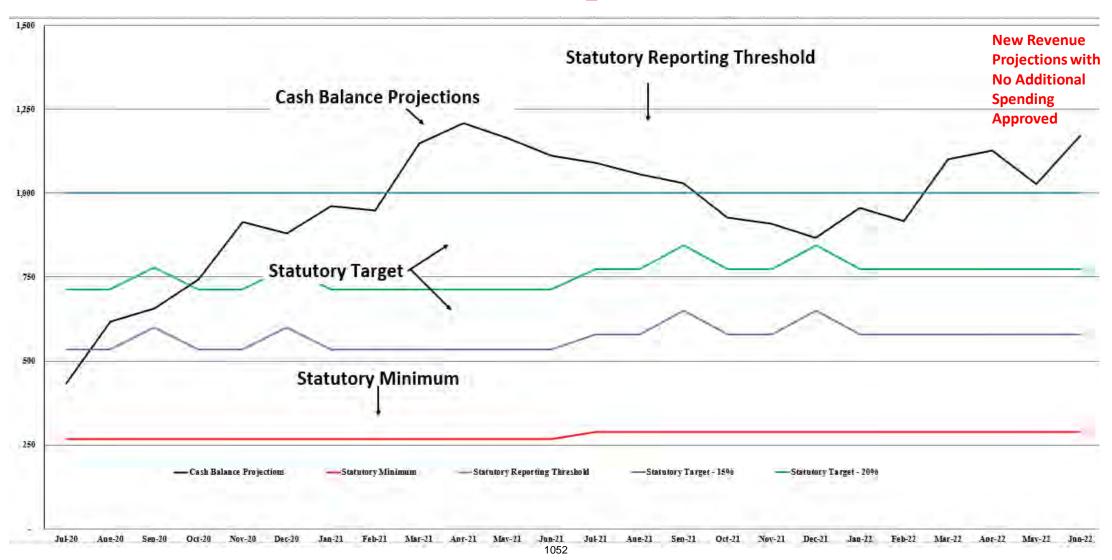

- Preliminary Engineering Additional Request of \$47 million
 - Reinitiates 139 projects with let dates in FY 22 & 23. Not starting these projects will jeopardize the project schedules established in the September 2020 STIP reprogramming.
 - Allow programs to move forward (Feasibility Studies/Express Design, Project ATLAS, Integrated Project Delivery, Open Roads Designer Implementation, etc.) which will result in more accurate project cost estimates, continued efficiency improvements to project delivery, and increase the outsourcing to private engineering firms.
- Right of Way Utilities Additional Request of \$20 million
 - Expenditures through first quarter are trending above the spend plan forecast.
 - Increase will cover expenditures on let projects and support active utility relocations on pre-let projects.

- Operations/Maintenance Additional Request of \$122 million
 - Will allow the department to move forward in delivering a substantial number of critical safety and disaster repair projects that have been due to previous budgetary restrictions. In addition, other operational improvement projects that were put on hold will be delivered.
 - FEMA/General Maintenance Reserve (\$50 million) Repairs on all remaining FEMA storm damaged sites, many of which are on routes that remain closed today.
 - Spot Safety Improvement Program (\$21 million) Move forward over 180 additional projects totaling over \$19 million. Extra capacity allows new projects to be brought forward each quarter to address safety issues across the state.
 - Contingency Program (\$21 million) Move forward over 75 projects totaling \$28 million in estimated costs.
 - Mobility/Modernization (\$23.5 million) Move forward over 50 projects totaling \$27.5 million. These include Economic Development, Industrial/Public Access, Small Construction, Spot Mobility, and High Impact/Low Cost projects identified by Divisions as most critical. 174 additional projects will remain on hold.
 - Secondary Road Construction Program (\$6.5 million) Move forward with construction and paving of an additional 10 projects totaling over \$3.5 million in estimated costs. Will also begin necessary preliminary design work on top priority secondary road construction projects in each Division.

- Integrated Mobility Division Additional Request of \$31 million
 - Fully funding all FTA grants previously approved by BOT (includes state match that helps leverage federal dollars and minimizes burden on NC transit systems dealing with loss of state ROAP funding and COVID revenue losses).
 - Reestablishes funding for the Transportation Demand Program at its historical level.
 - Move forward on recently awarded discretionary FTA grants.
- Ferry Division Additional Request of \$20 million
 - Complete construction of two river class ferries.
 - Replenish the depleted propulsion and navigation inventory.
 - Send the MV Sea Level for maintenance to ensure US Coast Guard mandated maintenance schedules are maintained and the vessel is available for seasonal demand.
 - Run service at all the existing terminals.

- Rail Division Additional Request of \$30 million
 - Freight Rail and Rail Crossing Safety Improvements (FRRCSI) Resumes projects with short line railroads, rail industry access projects, safety projects including crossing surfaces, and corridor preservation.
 - Maintenance of Rail Infrastructure Annual track maintenance payment obligation to Norfolk Southern was deferred from SFY 2020 to SFY 21. This allows payment to be restored to year of expenditure in accordance with our obligations.
 - Station Improvements A one-time appropriation by the General Assembly in 2019 has been unspent due to prior spend plans. This would advance legislative-directed programs for train station improvements.

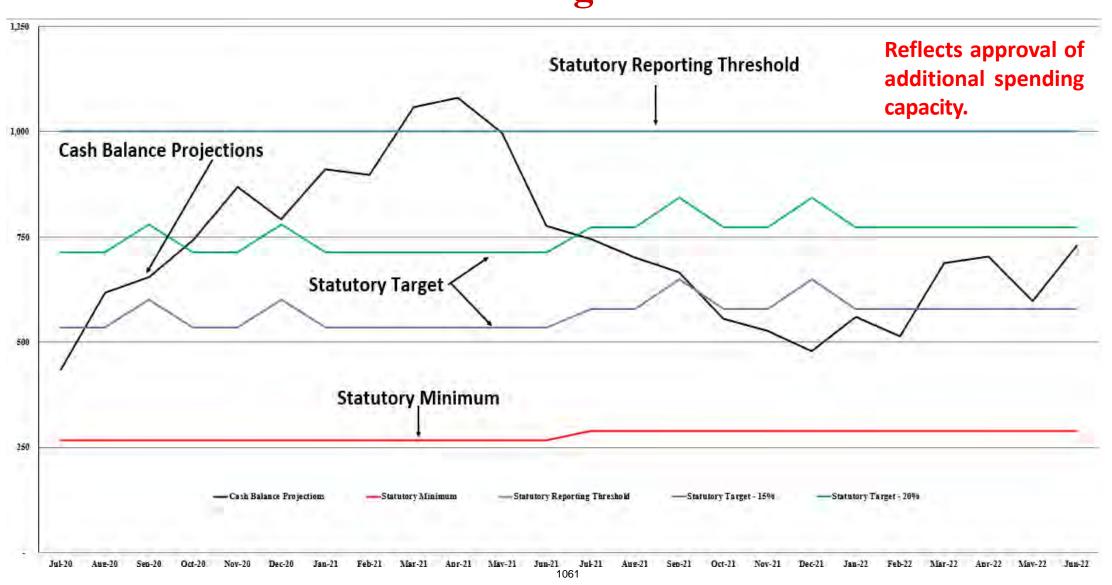

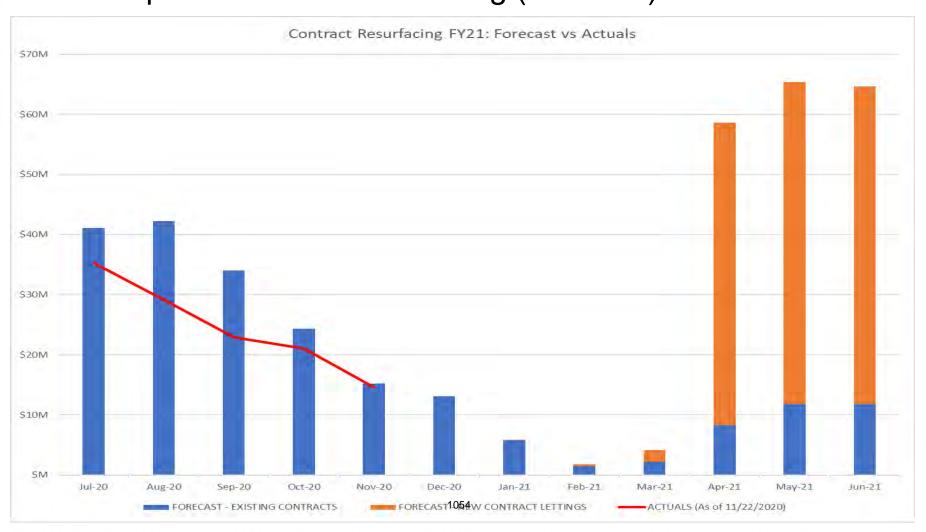

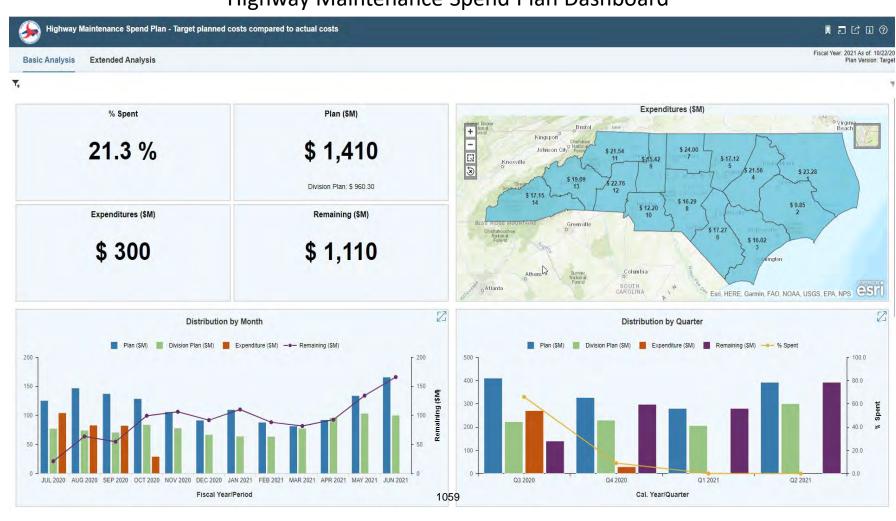

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe was born in North Carolina and grew up in the Sherrill Cove Community near what is now the Blue Ridge Parkway; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe served with distinction in the US Navy during World War II, including during D-Day and Victory in Europe Day; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe was dedicated to proliferating the Cherokee language, teaching Cherokee history and culture, and preserving the Cherokee game Indian Ball; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe served as a true testament of a Cherokee leader and should be recognized; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe received The Order of the Long Leaf Pine and an Honorary Doctorate of Human Letters from Western Carolina University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wolfe was named Beloved Man of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in 2013 and was the first man to receive this honor in more than 200 years; and

WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians Tribal Council, Jackson County Board of Commissioners and the Swain County Board of Commissioners passed resolutions requesting that the North Carolina Board of Transportation designate a portion of US 441 as the Beloved Man Dr Jerry Wolfe Highway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation names US 441 from Exit 74 to the intersection of NC 19 the *Beloved Man Dr Jerry Wolfe Highway*, and this designation will be written in English and the Cherokee language.
