BOARD OF TRANSPORTATION MEETING

January 6-7, 2021

As part of the Act to Provide Aid to North Carolinians In Response to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Crisis, (S.L. 2020-3, SB 704) the General Assembly enacted modifications to the laws governing public bodies. The provisions are in Section 4.31 of the Act.

The January 6-7, 2021 meeting was held via Microsoft Teams for all members of the Board and therefore, considered a remote meeting. It was held in such way due to the restrictions in place pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Based on the new law (General Statute §166A-19.24), the meeting followed the parameters set out for remote meetings. Actions executed during the January 6-7, 2021 Board of Transportation meeting included:

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions
- ensuring that the meeting minutes of the remote meeting reflect that the meeting was conducted by use of simultaneous communication, denoting the name of members participating by simultaneous communication, and recording when members join or leave the remote meeting

All members of the Board were reminded that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business during this remote meeting are deemed a public record. As always, the meeting was properly noticed, Wednesday, and was provided for members of the public to access the meetings.

Wednesday January 6, 2021

All committee reports are located at the end of this document.

Members of the Audit Committee attended the meeting beginning at 9:00am. Topics included an Office of the Inspector General (OIG) Activity Report provided by Mary Morton. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Members of the Road, Bridge and Ferry Naming Committee attended their meeting at 9:30am. Topics included were reviewing of the submitted application for Lieutenant Governor Walter H Dalton Highway. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Members of the Highway Committee convened at 10:30am. Topics included a presentation on the Departments Roadside Environmental Program and the Bridge Program. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Members of the Multi-Modal Committee convened at 10:30am. Topics included Funding items and presentations on Innovative Work in the Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Space and Rural Microtransit Pilot. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Full Board Work Session/ Finance Committee

Chairman Fox welcomed members to the meeting and thanked members of the Board for being present to handle business brought before them.

Chairman Fox stated we are continuing our remote meetings via Microsoft Teams as we have over the past several months in response to COVID-19. Today we will continue

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions
- ensuring that the meeting minutes of the remote meeting reflect that the meeting was conducted by use of simultaneous communication, denoting the name of members participating by simultaneous communication, and recording when members join or leave the remote meeting
- reminding members that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business during this remote meeting are deemed a public record.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 1:02 p.m. on Wednesday, January 6, 2021, with the following members present via conference call: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Board Member Jordan joined after the roll call.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that particular item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Members of the Advanced Technologies (ATC) Committee convened at 2:45pm. Topics included a presentation on Transformational Technology in Transportation. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Thursday January 7, 2021 Official Board Meeting

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 9:01 a.m. on Thursday, January 7, 2021, with the following members present in the virtual meeting: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that particular item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox shared "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

Approval – December 2, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated that the meeting minutes were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the December 2, 2020 meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Rosenburgh and a second by Board Member Clarke.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you hear your name please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or "aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Secretary Remarks

Secretary Boyette welcomed members of the Board, staff, and those listening to the livestream. He stated he hoped everyone had a safe holiday season. He shared the month of January has already been particularly exciting for the Department.

Project Updates

Secretary Boyette shared details on the Department's Project Updates with the Board. He stated the Department was made significant milestones and accomplished major projects over the past month. The newly open 14.4-mile, four-lane U.S. 64 around Asheboro and 1.7mile connector to the North Carolina Zoo opened on December 18th. He stated the world's largest natural habitat zoo deserves this type of gateway. He shared visitors will now spend less time in traffic and more time at one of the state's greatest attractions.

Secretary Boyette shared on December 23rd the Department opened the new sections of the Greensboro Urban Loop and Winston-Salem Northern Beltway. Both projects will bring new connectivity between the Triad region and our neighbors from the north of the state.

S-Rail Development Grant

Secretary Boyette shared an update on the S-Rail Development Grant. He mentioned the Department's Integrated Mobility Division, Federal Transit Administration (FTA) recently was awarded a nine hundred thousand grant to help spur development along the S-Line corridor. The passenger rail line will start at the Virginia border and run through Raleigh and will end at the South Carolina state line. He shared other counties such as Apex, Franklinton, Henderson, Raleigh, Sanford, and Wake Forest contributed matching funds for the grant. Each city or town will use the grant money to help develop plans for the areas around the rail stations.

Cash Balance

Secretary Boyette shared an update on the Cash Balance with the Board. He shared the cash balance has remained near the statutory reporting threshold throughout the month of December. He mentioned the Department will continue to budget within the means and prepare for the unexpected times.

Event Updates

Secretary Boyette shared his event updates with the Board. He stated on December 8th he participated in a panel discussion on leadership during chaos. This event was hosted by the North Carolina Society of Certified Public Managers. He mentioned the pandemic was the key topic, but other topics included were "Managing a Remote Workforce".

Secretary Boyette shared he also gave remarks for the Pandemic Education Seminar hosted by the Department's Office of Civil Rights office which was broadcast December 17th. He mentioned he spoke on how the Department has had to evolve its top priority which is safety in 2020 due to the pandemic over the past year.

NC F1RST

Secretary Boyette shared updates on NC F1RST with the Board. He mentioned after nearly two years the NC F1RST Commission plan released its Findings on Friday, January 8th. He shared the commission's meeting can be viewed on the NC F1ST webpage. The Findings was also presented on Monday, January 11th to the House Standing Committee on Transportation, chaired by Representative John Torbett.

Creating Revenue and Finding Transportation Solutions (CRAFTS) Tool

Secretary Boyette mentioned the public comment period for the NC F1RST Commission's recommendations to the Board of Transportation has ended. He shared he still encourages everyone to go to the NC F1RST webpage and explore the Creating Revenue and Finding Transportation Solutions (CRAFTS) tool. He stated the very useful tool developed by Department's partner SAS, will let users adjust various settings to explore the future investment and financial scenarios within the Department.

License & Theft Bust

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the License & Theft Bust with the Board. He mentioned in November of last year the NCDMV License & Theft Bureau District 2/Moore County Inspectors James Carpenter and Kenneth Cauthen were out serving the citizens of North Carolina. These inspectors tracked NCDMV's bait trailer to a wooded area behind a furniture company in the Eagle Springs Community after it was stolen Thanksgiving night. While responding with a sheriff's deputy, they found more than just DMV's trailer. Other items were:

- A small utility trailer stolen from Southern Pines; a Forest River bumper tow camper; a 2006 Black Dodge Charger.
- A 24-foot trailer that had just been stolen from Randolph County and brought to this location for sale.

Many other items including lawncare equipment and more than a dozen TVs believed to have been stolen as well. Secretary Boyette shared five people were arrested in association with these stolen items. Confidently breaking up a potentially major theft ring in Moore County. Secretary Boyette thanked the inspectors for sacrificing their time on Thanksgiving and for their outstanding work.

Brent Hamilton Award

Secretary Boyette shared details on the annual Brent Hamilton Award with the Board. He stated the Department is now accepting nominations through January 15th for the Brent Hamilton Excellence in Financial Management and Integrity Award. He mentioned the award is named after the former Fiscal Manager Brent Hamilton, who was well known for her dedication to financial work but also for her courage and strength during a long battle with cancer. He shared this award is presented to an NCDOT employee who demonstrates dedication to financial services and functions, increases financial accountability, provides excellent stewardship of public dollars, and is a role model for adhering to ethical standards. Watch for Me NC

Secretary Boyette shared details on the Watch for Me NC with the Board. He mentioned Watch for Me NC nationally recognized program focuses on reducing bicycle and pedestrian injuries and fatalities through public education and community engagement partnerships with local law enforcement. The 2021 campaign will be supported by the Governor's Highway Safety Program and the N.C. Department of Transportation's Integrated Mobility Division.

Personnel Updates

Secretary Boyette shared Helen Landi has taken the role as Interim Human Resources Director for the Department.

Secretary Boyette shared Beau Memory has accepted the position as Chief Operating Officer effective January 23rd. He mentioned Beau has worked with the agency before and has great knowledge and insight about the Department.

Chairman Fox thanked Secretary Boyette for his remarks and asked if there were any questions.

Chairman Fox stated he wanted to take some time to remember and honor a couple of members who are extended family of the Board. He shared former Vice-Chairwoman Nina Szlosberg-Landis lost her husband Kel Landis to a two-year battle with cancer. He shared former Board member Szlosberg-Landis was a long-time member of the Board of Transportation. He asked the Board to keep Nina and her family in their thoughts and prayers.

Chairman Fox shared former President Pro Tempore Senator Marc Basnight also passed in December. He shared Senator Basnight was also a former Board member of the Board of Transportation and is the father-in-law to the current Division One Board member Allen Moran. He asked the Board to please keep Allen, Caroline and their family in their thoughts and prayers. In honor of the late Senator, Chairman Fox shared photos of Senator Marc Basnight and the naming of the Marc Basnight Bridge event with the Board.

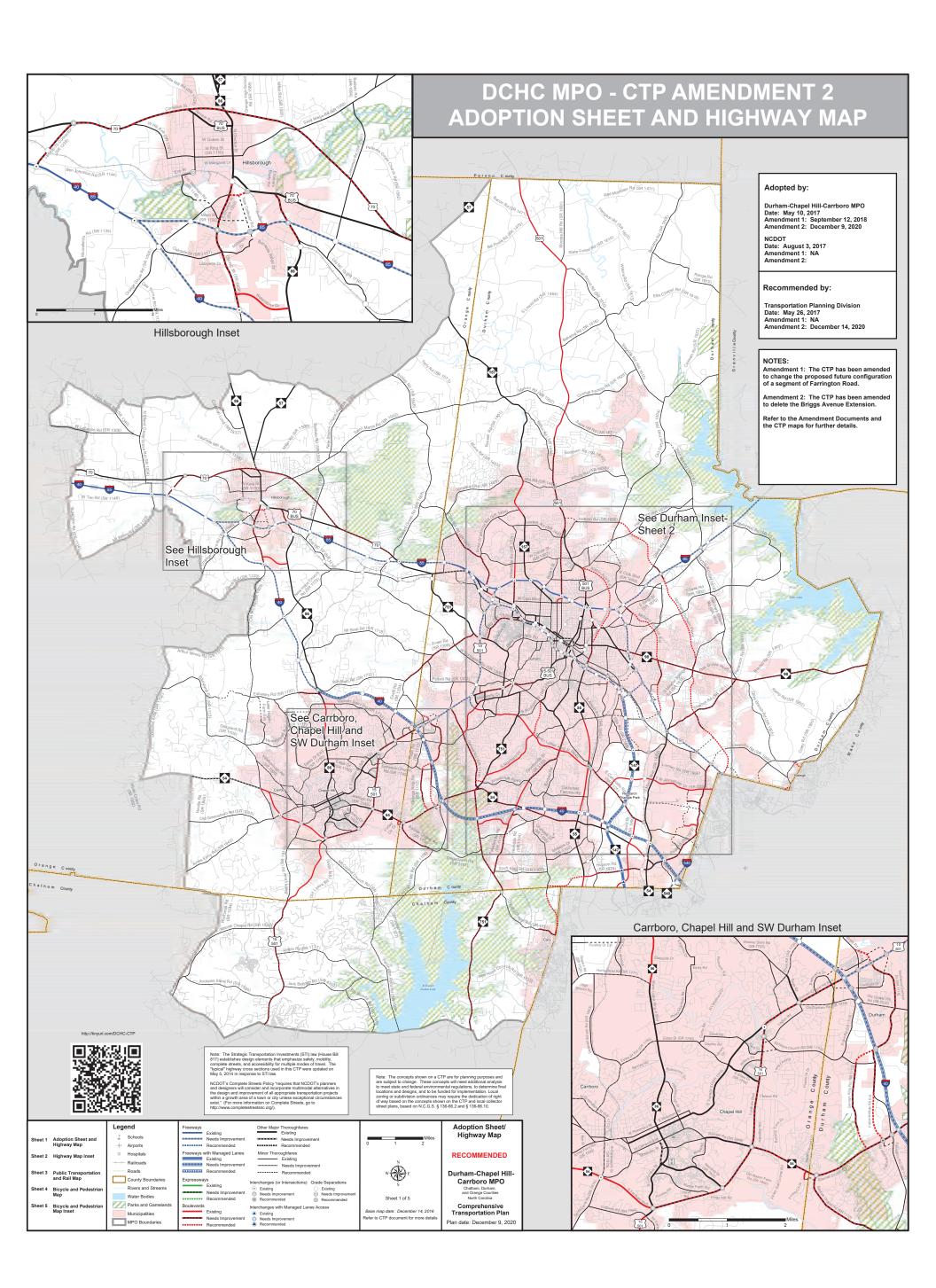

Committee Reports

Audit Committee – Committee Chair Perkins provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included an update from Mary Morton, Inspector General. Ms. Morton provided a summary overview of the purpose, findings and recommendations from the Highway Division Contracts Pre-Award Process audit completed. The Highway Division is working to implement recommendations from the audit to improve internal control processes within Divisions. Committee expressed concerns regarding the data presented on minority business participation and discussed a path forward to addressing the need to increase minority business participation in agency contracts which includes engaging our Civil Rights Office in the process.

- The following audits are in the final stages and on target for completion by month's end Heavy Equipment Utilization, State Planning & Research RPO and Powell Bill.
- Planning is now in progress for the Highway Construction Change Management and CARES Act audit engagements.

Road Naming Committee – Committee Chair Fox provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included an approval of one road designation request to bring forward to the full board in February:

 Lieutenant Governor Walter H Dalton Highway – US 74 from Rutherford/Polk County Line to Exit 178 in Rutherford County

Kevin Lacy discussed extension of the limits of an existing naming to accommodate a road project. Since the Board of Transportation already approved the designation, Kevin proposed extending the designation limits and moving the existing signs. This would save having to design a new sign and supports that will work within the new project. All that would be required is informing the Board of Transportation of the new designation limits.

A request for honorary designation of NC 107N from Moody Bridge Road (SR 1172) to Old Cullowhee Road (SR 1002) in Jackson County as the Conrad G Burrell Highway did not receive unanimous support by local Government. Chairman Fox, Co-Chair Perkins and Board Member Cody all agreed to move forward with bringing the packet to the Committee as an exception.

The committee may receive a request for exception to one-year waiting period for an officer recently killed in the line of duty in the Charlotte area.

The committee may receive a request for naming of a facility on a toll road. A meeting with the committee and the Turnpike Authority will be scheduled to discuss.

Highways Committee – Committee Chair Tarleton provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included two presentations. Mr. David Harris, State Roadside Environmental Engineer, provided a presentation on the Department's Roadside Environmental Program. The Roadside Environmental Unit is responsible for managing roadside vegetation through mowing, litter management, trimming around signs and guardrails, brush and tree trimming, invasive weed control, aesthetics, and rest areas. The Roadside Environmental Unit uses various programs to help with litter management including adopt-a-highway, sponsor-ahighway, contractor litter crews, sheriff offices, DOT crews, public education, and anti-littering campaigns. Their other areas of responsibilities include environmental compliance, stormwater management, and environmental remediation. The aesthetics they manage include the wildflower program, daylily program, ornamental beds, and aesthetic engineering. There are 9 Welcome Centers and 58 Rest Areas maintained by the Roadside Environmental Unit. Their responsibilities with environmental compliance include the erosion and sediment control program and 401 & 404 permit compliance. With environmental remediation, the Roadside Environmental Unit is involved with the remediation of hazardous materials, groundwater cleanup and underground storage tanks.

Funding for Roadside Management activities was down in 2020, due to the impacts of storms and the pandemic. In 2021, Roadside plans to increase management activities from those in 2020; however, the level of management will be down from 2018 and 2019 levels.

The second presentation heard by the Highways Committee was from Mr. Brian Hanks, State Structures Engineer, who provided an update on the Department's Bridge Program. State Funding of the Bridge Program has increased from \$150M in 2015 to \$273M in 2021. Preservation funds were added in 2018 through 2021. The bridge conditions have improved from 2014 to current, going from 16.4% deficient to 8.6% deficient. The designation of deficient does not mean a bridge is unsafe. Instead, it means that the bridge components are deteriorating. There are 3 areas of the bridge that are evaluated in making this determination – the riding surface, the support beams, and the foundations. Deficient bridges are prioritized using the Priority Replacement Index (PRI). Bridges are scored based on performance measures including the bridge condition, average daily traffic and the sufficiency rating and deficiency points. The score determines whether the structure is a very good candidate for replacement. The PRI score is used by Structures Management and the Divisions to develop the 5-year Bridge Maintenance Improvement Plan.

The High Value Bridge Preservation program includes over 200 bridges statewide that have replacement costs ranging from \$20M to \$400M. The total replacement costs of these bridges total \$9B. The Department has determined that these high value bridges may be maintained to good condition for \$300M. These bridges must be maintained as replacement costs are too great.

In summary, the Department is making progress toward goals. There needs to be a focus on Interstate and Primary system structures. Replacement projects are addressing deficient bridges. Preservation assists with extending bridge service life and slowing the number of bridges becoming deficient.

Multi-Modal Committee – Committee Chair Moran provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included two presentations. Ben Spain, Division of Aviation, UAS Program Manager gave a presentation on Innovative Work in the Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Space. Ryan Brumfield, Integrated Mobility Division, Innovations and Data Branch Manager gave a presentation on Rural Microtransit Pilot.

Finance Committee – Committee Chair Lathrop provided summary of the committee's meeting topics that included remarks from Mr. Dale R. Folwell, CPA, State Treasurer. A presentation from Sharon Edmundson, Director of the SLGFD and Secretary of the Local Government Commission, Lewis Andrews, State Treasurer's Office on Build NC from State Perspective. David Miller, Managing Director PFM Financial Advisors, LLC gave a presentation on the Bonding Basics to the committee. Stephanie King, CFO gave an update on the Overview of Draft Debt Management Policy and Financial & Spend Plan Status.

Advanced Technologies Committee – Committee Chair Zimmer provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included a presentation. JJ Eden, NC Turnpike Executive Director gave a presentation on Transformational Technology in Transportation.

The Chairman reminded members of the Board that the next meeting is scheduled for February 3-4, 2021.

Adjournment

There being no further business of the Board, Chairman Fox accepted a motion from Board Member Tillman, seconded by Board Member Overholt.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call vote on the action item under consideration. When I say your name, please say either yes ("aye") to indicate yes or if opposed, please say "no".

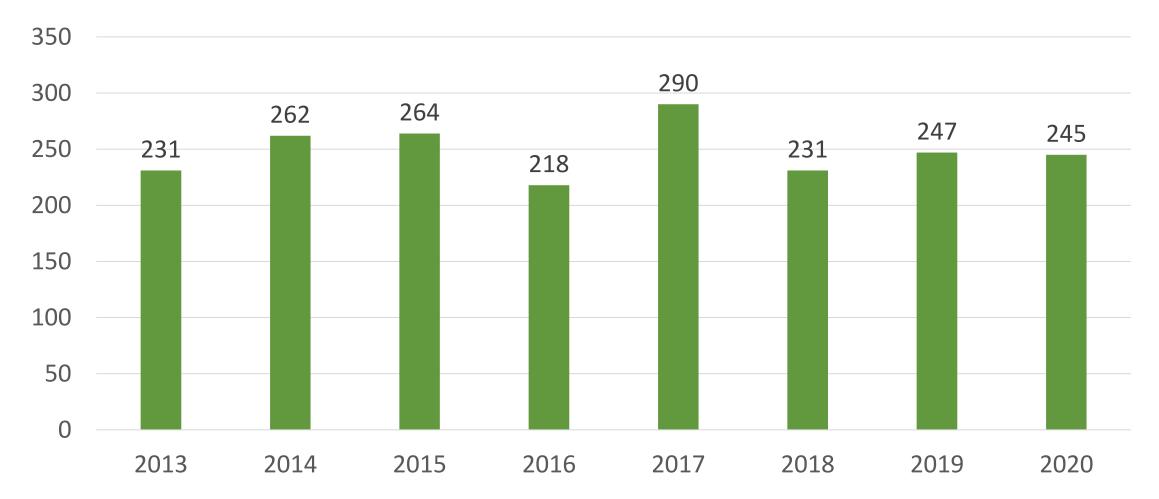

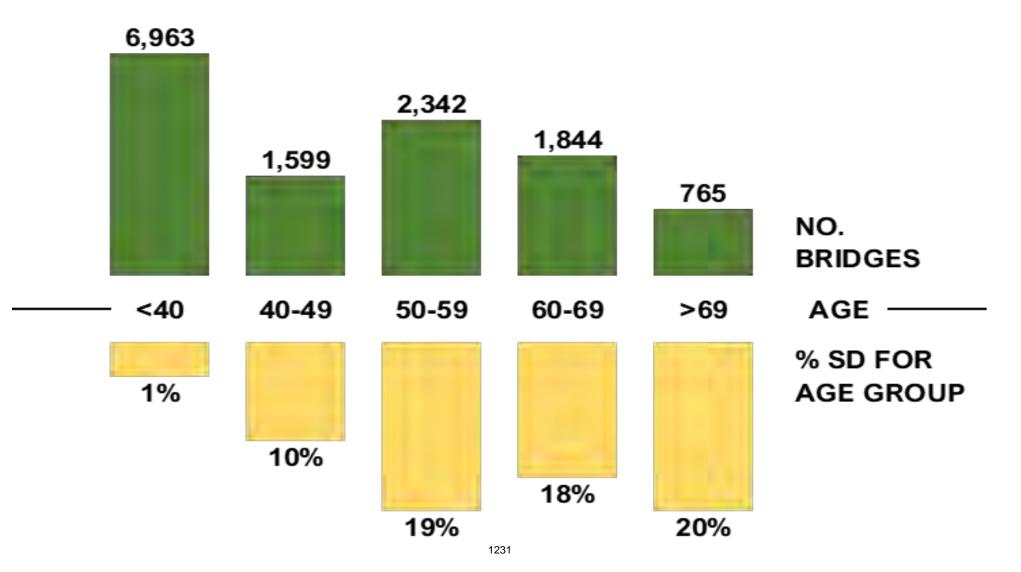

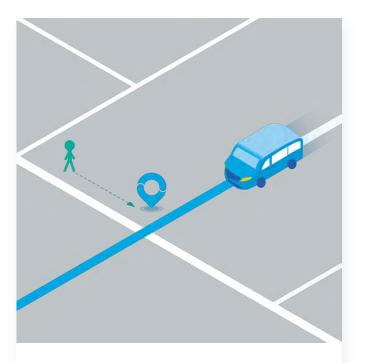

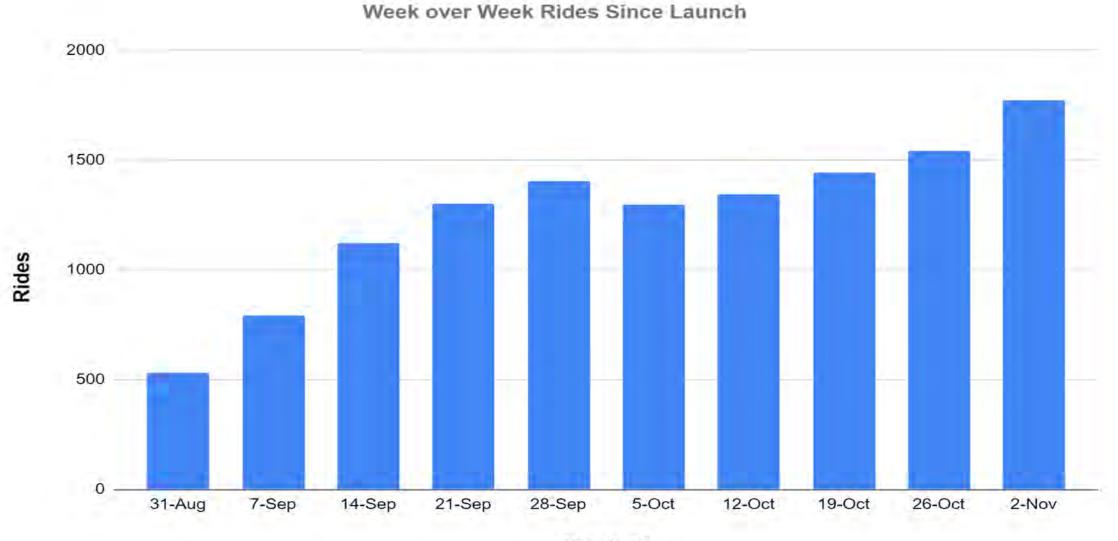

Primary Responsibilities of the DST State Debt Section

- Coordinate the issuance of debt authorized by State law
- Provide required disclosure information for the State CAFR, Rating Agencies and various regulatory agencies
- Produce and publish the Annual Debt Affordability Study; staff the Debt Affordability Advisory Committee
- Coordinate and monitor the payment of debt service and other debt related fees





Primary Responsibilities of the DST State Debt Section (Continued)

- Monitor outstanding State debt for any post-issuance compliance issues. Examples include as follows:
 - 1) Private use issues that might compromise the bond's taxexempt status
 - 2) Provide event disclosure as required under SEC Rule 15c2-12
- Provide State debt reports and analysis as requested by the General Assembly, various State agencies and other regulatory agencies etc.

Build NC Bonds

- The Build NC Bond Act of 2018 was signed into law in June of 2018
- The State issued the first series of Build NC Limited Obligation Bonds on June 27, 2019. Par = \$300 million

In July 2020, SL 2020-91 was signed into law which allowed the State to issue up to \$700 million in Build NC Bonds in Fiscal Year 2020-21

• The State issued the second series of Build NC Bonds on November 12, 2020. Par = \$700 million

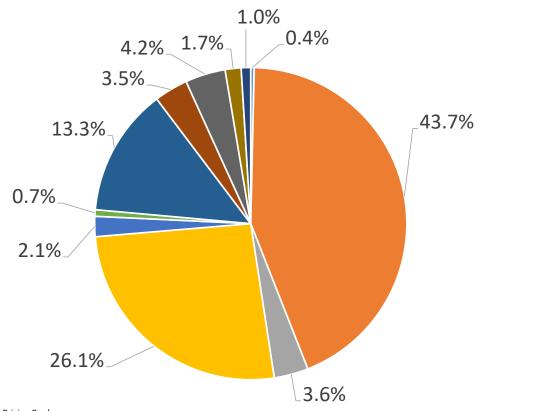

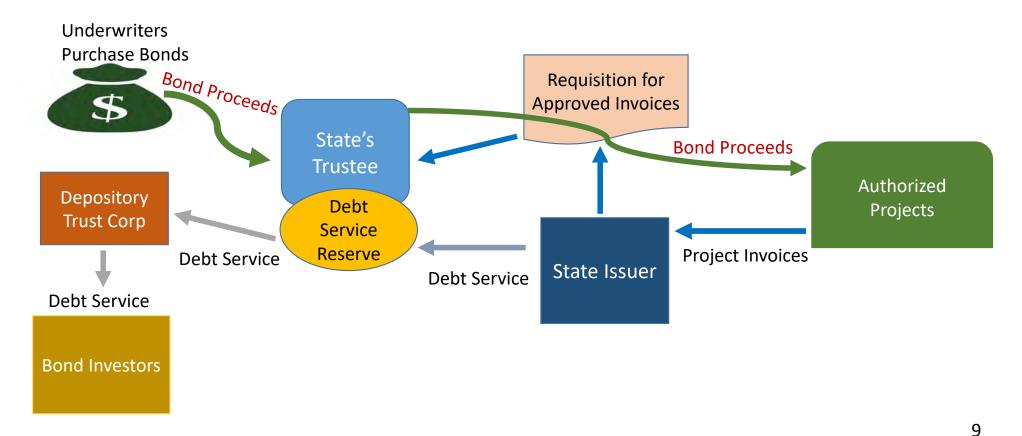

Bond Issuance Purposes

New Money Bonds

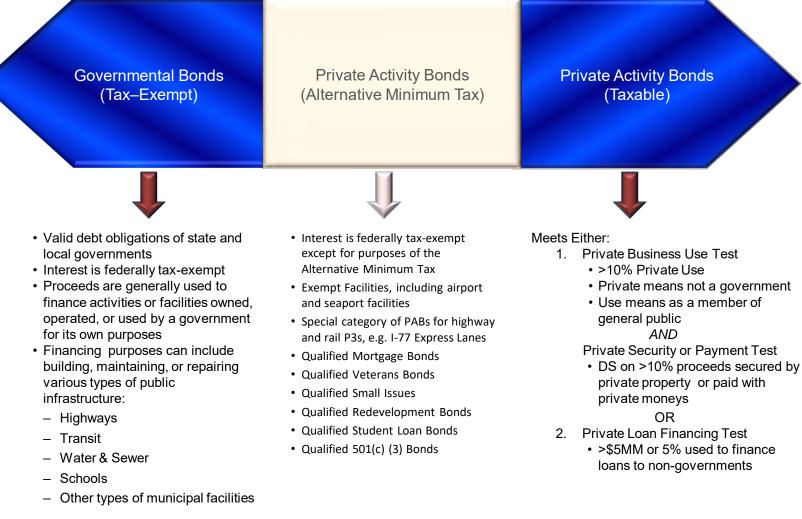
 Issued to fund Capital Projects such as roads, bridges, airports, transit, seaports, schools, power plants, water & sewer, etc.

Refunding Bonds

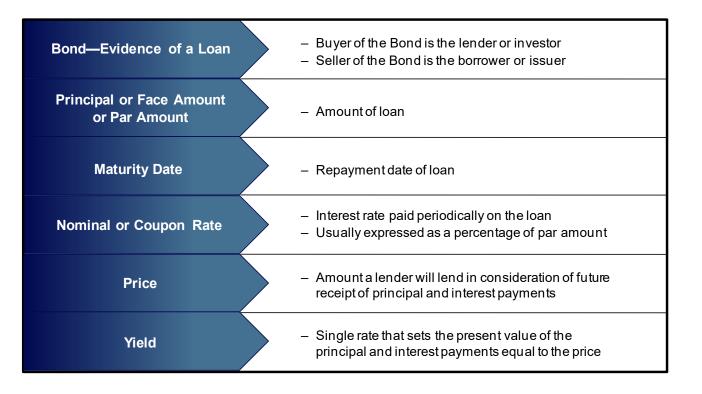
- Issued to pay off existing bonds. The old debt service payments are replaced with new debt service payments.
 - Most refundings are done to create debt service savings by issuing new bonds at a lower yield than the interest rate on outstanding bonds -"High to Low"
 - Some refundings are done to get out of the restrictions/requirements of an indenture (which sets the parameters for which they can issue bonds and requirements for funding them) on outstanding bonds
 - A current refunding is one executed at (within 90 days) the call or redemption date of the outstanding bonds.
 - An advance refunding is one executed more than 90 days before the call date and requires a legal defeasance of the refunded bonds by funding an irrevocable escrow to pay the bonds at the call date.

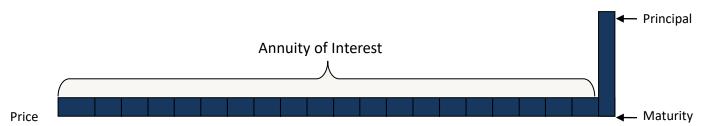

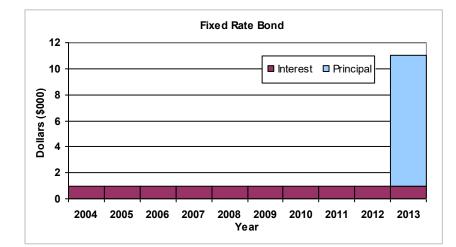




Fixed Rate vs. Variable Rate

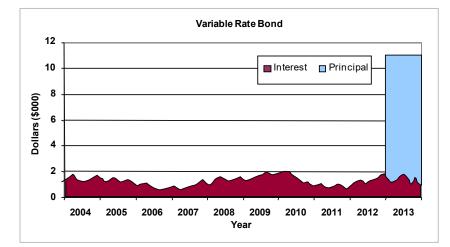
Fixed Rate

- The rates (coupons) are set on the day of the pricing and do not change throughout the life of the bonds
- Issuer will pay the exact same interest amounts (usually twice a year) for as long as they own the bonds
- Generally higher interest rate, especially for long term maturities



Variable Rate

- The interest rates are reset to different coupons at predetermined points throughout the year
- Issuer will pay varied interest payments for the life of the bonds
- Generally lower interest rates but with rate risk and budget uncertainty



Call Features

Option Call

- Call is exercised only at the option of the issuer
- Calls typically exercised to achieve savings or restructure debt

Mandatory Call

- Call must be exercised on specified date/during specified timeline
- May be required by law
- May be required by legal structure of transaction

Extraordinary Call

- Call exercised upon occurrence of certain events
- May be optional (destruction of project) or mandatory

Redemption Prices for Call Vary

- Par
- Premium
- Make-whole

Common Bond Security Structures

General Obligation Bonds

- Full Faith and Credit Pledge
- Typically the highest credit quality and lowest cost
- Taxing Power
- Not Subject to Appropriation

Appropriation Bonds

- Special Obligation Pledge
- All legally Available Revenues
- No Taxing Power
- Subject to Appropriation
- Build NC Bonds

Revenue Bonds

- Revenue Pledge
- Specifically Defined Revenue Source, often from enterprise net operating revenues
- Revenue Bonds may have a senior or subordinate lien on the revenues pledged
- Covenants to Ensure Revenue Sufficiency, e.g. a rate covenant
- No Property Taxing Power
- Not Subject to Appropriation
- GARVEE Bonds

Special Purpose Facility & Conduit Bonds

- Issued by a governmental entity on behalf of another government or a private entity
- Examples include economic and industrial development authorities
- Commonly used by airports and seaports
- · Often backed by corporate lease/rental revenues
- Often backed by parent company guarantees
- · Covenants to Ensure Revenue Sufficiency
- No Taxing Power; Not Subject to Appropriation

Asset Backed

- Indebtedness secured by an interest in the underlying asset being financed
- Mortgage backed debt
- Certificates of Participation
- Various forms of equipment leases have been used, including by ports to finance cranes

- Ultimately, credit ratings play a significant role in broadening the investor base for an issuer and usually having a strong rating enhances an Issuer's access to Investors, helping to lower their cost of capital

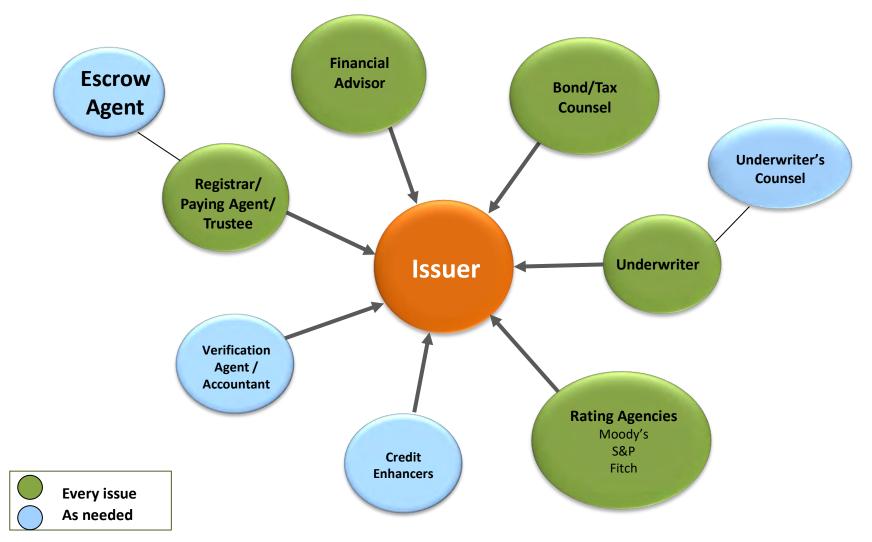

Types of Bond Sales

- Generally speaking, Issuers utilize one of two bond sale processes to access the primary capital market:
 - Competitive Sales: An Issuer procures bids from a variety of Underwriters on the obligations they are planning to issue and select one bid (i.e., the lowest costing bid)
 - Negotiated Solicitation: An Issuer selects an Underwriter or a group of underwriting firms and works with the selected Underwriter(s) to price obligations through negotiation with the Underwriter(s)
- An issuer could also Privately Place their obligations by procuring an investor, often via a RFP process, interested in purchasing their obligations and negotiating a price for their obligations directly with the Investor(s).
 - Bank Loans: Bank lending is a form of private placement
- Factors such as security type, credit rating, transaction size, and frequency of issuance typically help determine the best method of sale to utilize

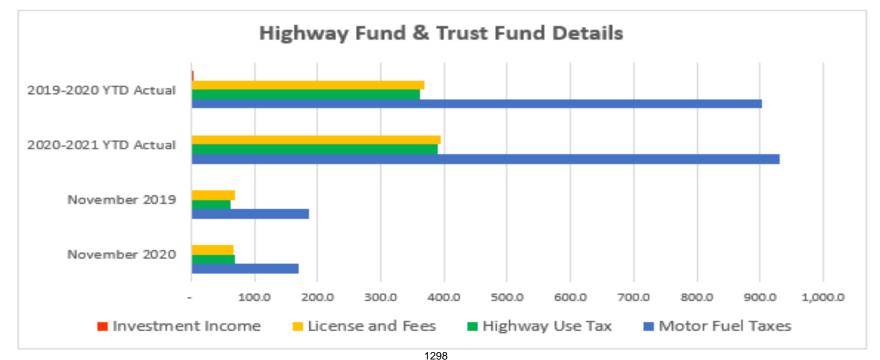

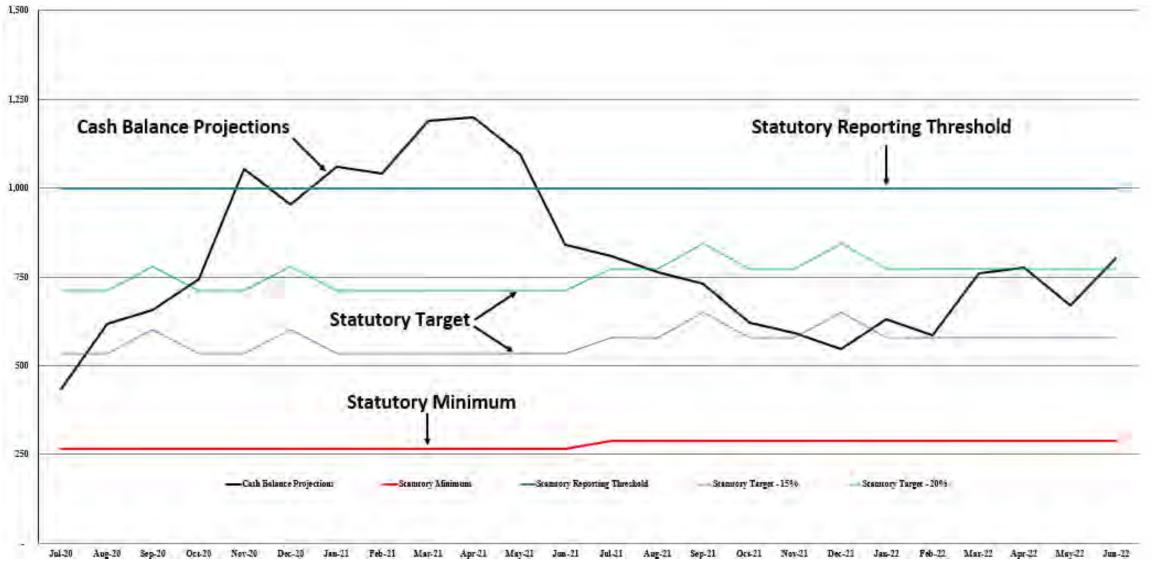

Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

November 2020 – Reporting Required

- Section 2.1 of Session Law 2019-251 requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For November 2020, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$751 million.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for November was \$1.05 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under G.S. 143C-6-11.

Spend Plan Variance

- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -6% Variance (-\$68M). Project lettings were delayed during budget restrictions.
- Contract Resurfacing -25% Variance (-\$42M). Have developed aggressive letting schedules for new contracts through fall and spring. Will provide over \$500M in new contractual opportunities and increase monthly expenditures during late SFY 2021 and through SFY 2022. Fall contract lettings will be available March 1, 2021 and spring contract lettings will be available July 1, 2021.
- Bridge Program -23% (-\$14M). As cash has improved have developed aggressive letting schedules for spring and fall 2021. Will provide over \$400M in new contracts and increase monthly expenditures during late SFY 2021 and through SFY 2022.
- Undeclared Disasters -98% (-\$11M). Snow and ice response is the primary driver of expenditures. Ideal scenario would be to experience actuals below established targets for the fiscal year. This would allow a potential redistribution of un-used spending authority for other maintenance needs across the state.

Spend Plan Variance

- Integrated Mobility Division -35% (-\$15M)
 - Due to initial spending restrictions, FY21 FTA Grants that involved state match were delayed. Agreements have now been released. Many involve bus procurement and/or facility construction and anticipate expenditures to increase toward end of state fiscal year
 - State funded programs that were held back are now released:
 - Consolidation and Coordination of Public Transportation (ConCPT)
 - Transportation Demand Management (TDM)
- Railroad Program -31% Variance (-\$7M)P
 - Due to previous spending restrictions, federal project approvals were delayed for first half of SFY 2021. Projects are proceeding now based on Federal or local project development timelines. Expect expenditures to increase in third quarter of SFY 2021.
 - Many rail projects, including FRRCSI, were previously on hold and are now being advanced. Expect expenditures to increase in third quarter of SFY 2021.
