April 7-8, 2021

As part of the Act to Provide Aid to North Carolinians In Response to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Crisis, (S.L. 2020-3, SB 704) the General Assembly enacted modifications to the laws governing public bodies. The provisions are in Section 4.31 of the Act.

The April 7-8, 2021 Board of Transportation meeting is considered a hybrid meeting with members participating in person and via Microsoft Teams. The meeting was a hybrid due to the restrictions in place pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Chairman stated that since a portion of the board meeting is being conducted using simultaneous communication the meeting will continue compliance with General Statute §166A-19.24. Actions executed during the April 7-8, 2021 Board of Transportation meeting included:

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions
- ensuring that the meeting minutes of the hybrid meeting reflect that a portion of the meeting was conducted by use of simultaneous communication, denoting the name of members participating by simultaneous communication, and recording when members join or leave the remote meeting.

All members of the Board were reminded that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business during this remote meeting are deemed a public record. As always, the meeting was properly noticed, Wednesday, and was provided for members of the public to access the meetings.

Wednesday April 7, 2021

Members of the Audit Committee attended the meeting beginning at 8:45am. Topics included an Office of the Inspector General (OIG) Activity Report and dashboard update provided by Mary Morton. A committee summary is located at the end of this document. Members of the Advanced Technologies (ATC) Committee attended the meeting beginning at 9:30am. Topics included a presentation on electric transportation featuring a company called Arrival by Richard Colley and a presentation on North Carolina A&T Advanced Technology Center of Excellence on Connected and Autonomous Vehicle Technology by Dr. Ali Karimoddini. Members of the Workforce Committee convened at 9:30am as well. Amanda Olive, the Department's new Human Resources Director, was introduced. Members of the Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations (EDIR) Committee convened at 10:30am. Full Board Work Session

Chairman Fox welcomed members to the meeting and thanked members of the Board for being present to handle business brought before them.

Chairman Fox stated this meeting is considered a hybrid meeting with members participating in person and via Microsoft Teams. He mentioned will continue

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 1:34 p.m. on Wednesday, April 7, 2021, with the following members were present in-person or via Microsoft Teams or conference call: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Board Member Tillman joined the call after the roll call.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox stated that both the open and closed session meeting minutes from the March 3-4 meeting were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the March 3-4, 2021 open

and closed meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Moran and a second by Board Member Cody.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

The full board attended the work session where Ms. Stephanie King, Chief Financial Officer and Joe Wilson, Deputy Director of Financial Services provided an update on the Governor's Recommended Budget to the Board. Johanna H. Reese, Deputy Secretary for Intergovernmental Affairs provided a Legislative Update to the Board.

Closed Session pursuant to General Statute §143-318.11(a)(3)

Chairman Fox called for a motion to move into Closed Session per NC General Statute 143-318.11 to "consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to preserve attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body pursuant to subsection (a)(3).

A motion was made by board member Cody and seconded by board member Clarke.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call to move into closed session.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion to move into closed session.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Board member Zimmer announced his recusal on the closed session item and exited the board room.

Chairman Fox called the closed session to order.

A general account of the closed session has been recorded separately due to the nature of the topic.

The open session resumed following the closed session.

Chairman Fox noted the meeting was formally back in open session. Chairman Fox stated for the record that no votes were taken in closed session. Chairman Fox continued the meeting agenda in open session.

Product Evaluation Program Awareness

Chairman Fox noted that copies of this month's Product Evaluation Program Awareness update were provided to members of the Board for review and posted on the Board's website.

Other Business/Announcements

Chairman Fox shared that each member would be receiving a NCDOT plaque to take home. The idea for the plaque is that it can be used as a backdrop during the meetings held on Microsoft TEAMS. He thanked Brett Canipe, Division 10 Division Engineer, and his team for assisting Chris Moore, the board secretary, with the plaque design.

Adjournment

Thursday April 8, 2021 Official Board Meeting

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 9:01 a.m. on Thursday, April 8, 2021, with the following members present in the virtual meeting: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody were present.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that particular item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Road, Bridge and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Board Member Lail presented a resolution naming North Carolina Highway 273 from the southern city limits of Mount Holly near Interstate 85 north to the intersection with Morningside Drive the Officer Tyler A Herndon Highway. The resolution was unanimously approved by the Board upon a motion by Board Member Lail and seconded by Board Member Rosenburgh. (A copy of the resolution is at the end of this document).

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you hear your name please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or "aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Board Member Lail read thanking comments from the Herndon Family, Mount Holly Mayor Bryan Hough, and the Mount Holly Police Department to the Board.

Secretary Remarks

Secretary Boyette welcomed members of the Board, staff, and those listening to the livestream. He shared it was great to see everyone who could make it in-person to the meeting.

General Update

Secretary Boyette shared details of general updates throughout the department with the Board. Secretary Boyette mentioned in the next couple of months the department will gain a better understanding of the impact project cost increases and scope changes will have on the department's STIP.

Secretary Boyette mentioned it has been encouraging to see more COVID-19 vaccines issued and being offered to more people around the state. He stated the state and department

is getting closer to a new normal which gives the department a better sense of stability from a financial standpoint.

Litter Campaign

Secretary Boyette shared details on the department's litter campaign events with the Board. He stated the department has done a lot over the last few months to clean up roadsides across the state. Earlier in the month the department eclipsed the three-million-pound mark on litter collected statewide. Secretary Boyette thanked country music superstar and North Carolina native, Luke Combs, for helping the department on the campaign. Secretary Boyette mentioned that he and some of the Board members have joined crews to clean up roadsides in their respective areas. The element to the campaign had been promoting a way for the public to get involved, through the spring Litter Sweep. He mentioned the sweep will run start April 10th and end on April 24th. Volunteers will be provided with trash bags, gloves, and safety vests from the local NCDOT County Maintenance Yard offices. He shared to sign up or for more information to please visit, ncot.gov/littersweep. He also shared the new Swat-A-Litterbug mobile-friendly web application launched in March and mentioned this will give people an easy way to report when they see trash being thrown from a vehicle. To access this tool please visit ncdot.gov/litter.

Safety Campaigns

Secretary Boyette shared details on the safety campaigns with the Board. He mentioned the department will have safety campaigns going on this month as well. He shared April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month. He stated distractions unfortunately come in many forms for motorists. They can lead drivers to react slower to traffic conditions or safety hazards than drivers who are focused on the road. Secretary Boyette shared distracted driving in North Carolina last year alone left 157 dead, 608 hurt; with 43,987 total distracted driving crashes reported. He encouraged everyone who is driving to remember that is all they should be doing because it could save a life.

Secretary Boyette mentioned construction season is picking up and it is a great time for National Work Zone Awareness Week, which is set for April 26-30. During this week, the department will be highlighting the dangers of not paying attention or slowing down when driving in work zones. The department will be kicking off Work Zone Awareness Week a little earlier here in North Carolina this year. The National Work Zone Memorial will be traveling to the Welcome Center along Interstate 95 in Northampton County, the memorial will be displayed next Tuesday-Thursday free of charge to the public. Secretary Boyette explained:

- The Memorial honors those who died in work zones, including work zone workers, motorists, pedestrians, law enforcement officers, public safety officials and children.
- There are currently 1,592 names on the Memorial including 36 North Carolina fallen workers.
- We urge people to slow down and follow posted signs near work zones and be mindful of crews working near the travel lanes.
- And ask everyone to remember if you are not giving your undivided attention while driving, you're putting more than just your own life at risk.

Trade Academies

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the Trade Academies with the Board. He shared the Office of Civil Rights has started sponsoring the new Highway Construction Trade Academies around the state. He mentioned this would address a growing need for skilled labor to help safely build and maintain NC's roads and bridges.

- Four-week, full-time training course
- Funded by FHWA and initially hosted by community-based organizations
- Participants receive training for specific jobs and how to conduct job searches.
- Also receive supportive services such as needed emergency short-term housing, daycare, and transportation assistance.

Secretary stated the goal is to target women, minorities and other disadvantaged populations including veterans, the disabled, residents of our poorer Tier 1 counties where there is a need for such training and jobs. The first two programs will be hosted at Passage Home in Southeast Raleigh and the Opportunities Industrialization Center in Rocky Mount.

- Additional academies coming to James City, Fayetteville, Charlotte, and Greenville.
- Plans in the works for longer/8-week HCTA programs in Wilmington, Robeson County, the Triad, Asheville, and Morganton.

Brent Hamilton Award

Secretary Boyette shared each year, the department along with Board of Transportation, honors an employee with the Brent Hamilton Award. Secretary Boyette explained the Brent Hamilton Excellence in Financial Management and Integrity Award is presented to an NCDOT employee demonstrating exemplary dedication to financial services and functions, increasing financial accountability, providing excellent stewardship of public dollars and being a role model for adherence to ethical standards. Secretary Boyette named the 2021 Brent Hamilton Award recipient, Ms. Lynette Rogers. He stated that Ms. Rogers is highly respected throughout the Department and with external constituents. She is the first point of contact for most NCDOT payroll related questions. Others respect her and value her knowledge. Her work ethic and attention to detail is exceptional, and she is always willing to adjust her schedule to put the needs of others first. Secretary Boyette thanked Ms. Rogers for her service to the department, , shared a few work experiences with her through the years, and asked her to come forward and receive the award. Ms. Rogers came forward and received the award and thanked the Secretary and members of the Board.

Other Recognition

Secretary Boyette shared a Division 9 recognition with the Board. He mentioned residents in Division 9 sent a letter commending serval members of the Davie County Maintenance office. The letter read:

"A crew from the NC Department of Transportation was here before daybreak, assessing the situation, and as soon as Energy United was able to remove the power lines so that your folks could work safely, your men started to work. The tree was a very, very large tree and required a great deal of work from your men to clear the road and remove the debris. These men worked non-stop for several days, and each time we walked to the road to speak with them, they were so kind and pleasant. We wanted you to know how professionally each one of these men represented your organization and how much my husband and I appreciate all the hours of work they put into this job."

Secretary Boyette thanked Joe Dulaney, Doug Whisenhunt, Andy Reavis, Transportation Supervisor II Clyde E. Scott II, David Plagemann, Ronald "Beagle" Mitchell and Josh Hill. He informed the board that he sent each of them a Certificate of Appreciation for their service.

Train Service Resumes

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the department's Train Service with the Board. He mentioned the state's passenger train services resumed a full schedule this month. This will give riders the option of eight daily trains to choose from for the first time in a year. For most of 2020 the department had just one train running as an option for essential travel, but over the past few months, additional daily trips have been restored. He shared to celebrate the return to full train service, passengers can purchase tickets for 50% off regular priced fares during April. Individuals with a state-issued ID can skip making an office appointment and renew online by going to payments.ncdot.gov and follow the instructions. Obtaining an initial state-issued ID still

requires a visit to a driver license office. Information on obtaining an ID card can be found on the Department Motor Vehicle (DMV) website. He mentioned the DMV already offers online access for many services, including driver license renewals, ordering duplicate licenses and ID cards, driving record requests, driver license office appointments, registration renewals, vehicle property tax payments, duplicate registration cards, payment of insurance lapse fines, and applying for voter registration.

Personnel Updates

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the personnel changes throughout the department with the Board. He mentioned there are several new faces, several familiar, in new roles within the department. Secretary Boyette shared Amanda Olive is the new Human Resources director, replacing Darryl Bass who left the role for the UNC System a couple months back. Secretary Boyette thanked Helen Landi for her service in the interim. Secretary Boyette mentioned in the Division of Highways, the department announced this month Brian Burch as the new Western Deputy Chief Engineer, Greg Burns as the new Eastern Deputy Chief and Joey Hopkins as the Deputy Chief for Planning. He shared all three were formerly division engineers. Brian in Division 14, Greg in Division 6 and Joey in Division 5. Taking over as Division 14 Engineer is Wanda Austin, who was formerly the project delivery engineer for Division 14. Taking over as Division 6 Engineer is longtime DOT engineer Drew Cox. Brandon Jones will be moving from Division 8 to return to Division 5 as the Division Engineer. Patrick Norman, our Director of Highway Operations, will be returning to the field as the Division 8 Engineer Kristin Barnes, currently the Division 4 Deputy Engineer, will become the Acting Director of Highway Operations. Secretary Boyette shared this is an extremely talented group of individuals and the department is very excited and confident with them taking on new responsibilities in leadership roles.

2020 Scenic Byways Annual Report by Kyle Cooper, Landscape Architect, NC Scenic Byways Coordinator

Chairman Fox introduced Kyle Cooper, Landscape Architect, NC Scenic Byways Coordinator. Mr. Cooper provided an overview of the Scenic Byway program for new members of the board and reviewed three scenic byway proposals the board will be asked to consider at their next meeting. The three proposals are the McAuley Road Scenic Byway, Hanging Rock Scenic Byway, and Pacolet River Scenic Byway.

Chairman Fox shared that he would conduct a roll call vote for the vote action item under consideration. He stated when I say your name, please say either yes or "aye" to indicate yes or if opposed, please say "no".

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Moran, Taft, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, Clarke, McGrady and Cody all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Board Member Lathrop recused himself from voting on the following projects:

- Item O D.R. Horton Inc. Johnston County U-6223 48811.3.1 9709; This Project consists of construction to extend Ranch Road to US 70 Business in Clayton and realign the Ranch Road and Little Creek Church Road Intersection. At the request of the Developer, the Department shall include the construction of left and right turn lanes for a proposed subdivision development. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% for the work. The estimated reimbursement is \$203,800.
- Item O– Lennar Carolinas LLC, Wake County, 36249.4308 9738; This Project consists of a signal upgrade based on the addition of the addition of a new right-turn lane along southbound Kelly Road and new left-turn lanes along both approaches of Apex Barbecue Road. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% for the work. The estimated reimbursement is \$5,000.
- Item R Project 041NC70, Parcel 001 NC70, Guilford County; Conveyance of an approximate 0.012-acre area comprised of one (1) C-class residue, having a value of \$500 to GSO LLC for the highest offer amount of \$450; total commission \$1,000.

- Item K Project U-6010 REGIONAL, WBS 47145.1.1; US 70 (South Church Street) at SR 1226 / SR 1311 (University Drive) in Burlington. \$1,047,520.00 has previously been approved for preliminary engineering. Additional funds are requested.
- Item K Project U-6011 REGIONAL, WBS 47146.1.1; US 70 (South Church Street) at SR 1158 (Huffman Mill Road). \$450,000.00 has previously been approved for preliminary engineering. Additional funds are requested.
- Item N Project W-5802A, SR 1493, SR 1493 (LIVE OAK STREET) AT CAMPEN ROAD. REVISE TRAFFIC SIGNAL, INSTALL PEDESTRIAN CROSSING WITH SIGNAL HEADS, AND UPGRADE SIDEWALK. ACCELERATE CONSTRUCTION FROM FY 22 TO FY 21 AT THE REQUEST OF TRANSPORTATION MOBILITY AND SAFETY.

Advanced Technologies (ATC) Committee – Committee Chair Zimmer provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included: Richard Colley, Head of Policy & Regulatory Affairs providing a presentation on a company. The title of the presentation was called - Introduction to Arrival. Mr. Colley gave an overview of the new Arrival Electric Vehicle method and explained the timeline of Arrival revolution in commercial vehicles from 2021 to 2023. An overview was given on how electric vehicles operate and the approaches taken to make Arrival successful.

Dr. Ali Karimoddini, Associate Professor and Director of NC-CAV Center of Excellence and the ACCESS Laboratory provided a presentation on NC Transportation Center of Excellence on Connected and Autonomous Vehicle Technology. Dr. Ali Karimoddini gave an overview of autonomous vehicles moving forward by 2030 and the multiple connectivity processes timeline. Connectivity Autonomous Vehicles (CAV) share and process data with other vehicles, improves safety and performance and energy efficiency, reduces crashes and travel times, and provide on-demand mobility solutions and environmental benefits. NC-CAV brings together a strong and diverse team of NCAT, NCSU, and UNCC to conduct an innovative, cutting-edge, synergistic, interdisciplinary research on connected autonomous vehicles. Objectives for CAV impacts, infrastructure, applications, and manual control automation versus autonomy was explained.

Workforce Committee – Committee Chair Hunt provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included a presentation on the Department's Recruitment Performance from Human Resources Director Amanda Olive. Ms. Olive gave an overview on the department's vacancies during COVID-19. She shared the department's current hire average time is six months. She also updated the committee on the DMV headquarter move to Rocky Mount.

Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations (EDIR) Committee – Committee Chair Taft provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included a presentation on Radio Island and Offshore Wind Energy was presented by Mr. Don Kirkman, Cateret County Economic Development Director.

Finance Committee – Committee Chair Lathrop provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included Ms. Stephanie King providing the Financial and Spend Plan

Update. Ms. King shared revenues continue to be healthy, and expenditures are less than forecast in the spend plan. Business units continue to reengage programs and projects. As get into the construction season into the fall she expects the cash balance to decrease. Working on the SFY 22 and 23 Spend Plan and expect to present it for information at next month's Board meeting. Will be using the Governor's Recommended Budget revenue numbers as a base.

Mr. Burt Tasaico gave a Federal Budget and Revenue Update. He presented the State Revenues comparing 2021, 2020 and 2019 and showed where revenues are better in 2021. He also presented the Vehicle Miles Traveled to show how traffic volumes have been impacted by the pandemic. He highlighted the State Revenue Comparison that will be included in the Biennium Budget.

Mr. David Roy, Director of Finance & Budget presented a Turnpike Authority Update. Mr. Roy presented an update on the COVID impacts and revised revenue estimates for both. NCTA suspended some collection efforts and fee assessments during early stages of the pandemic. He highlighted the required coverage ratios and how COVID and reduced revenues impact those ratios. He presented the outstanding debt, annual net debt service and debt service coverage.

Road, Bridge and Ferry Naming Committee – Committee Chair Fox provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included the committee approving one road designation request to bring forward to the full board in May. The Gus Tulloss Bridge – Bridge on Sunset Avenue crossing Wesleyan Boulevard in Rocky Mount.

The Chairman reminded members of the Board that the next meeting is scheduled for May 5-6, 2021.

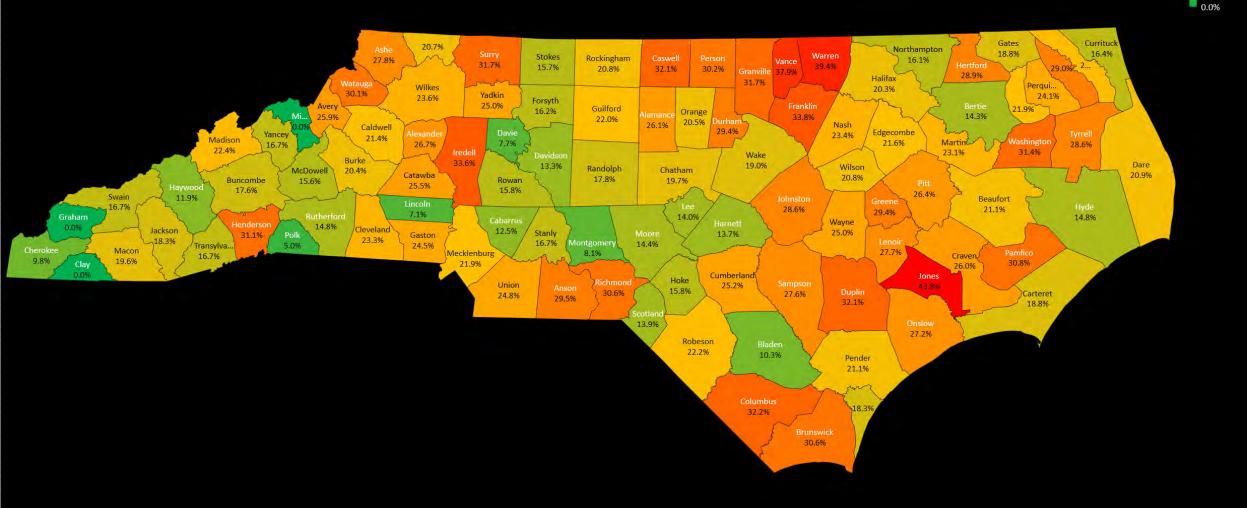

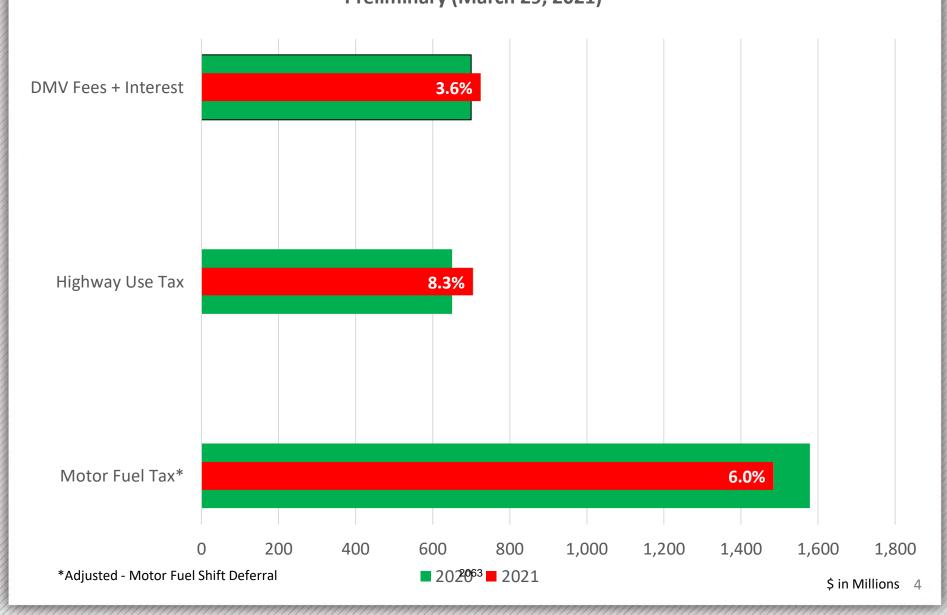


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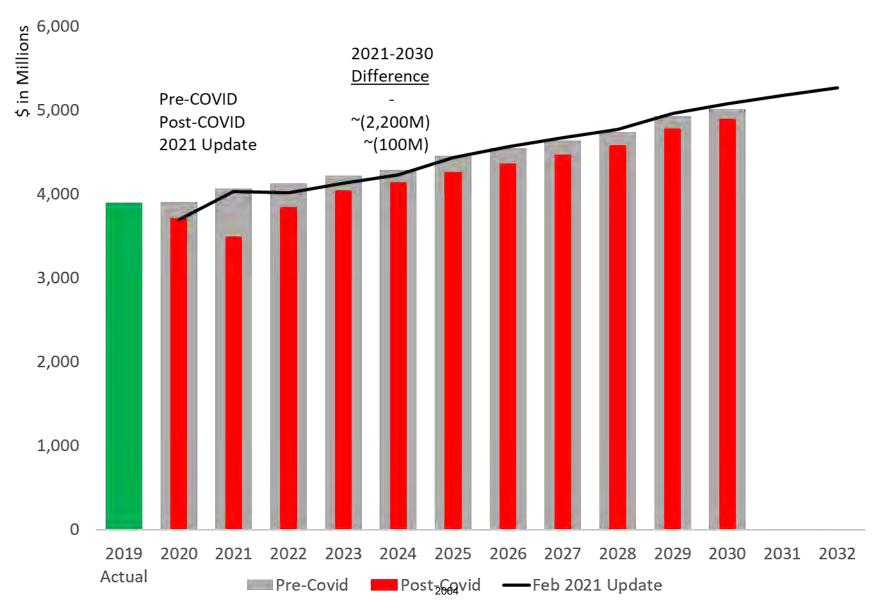

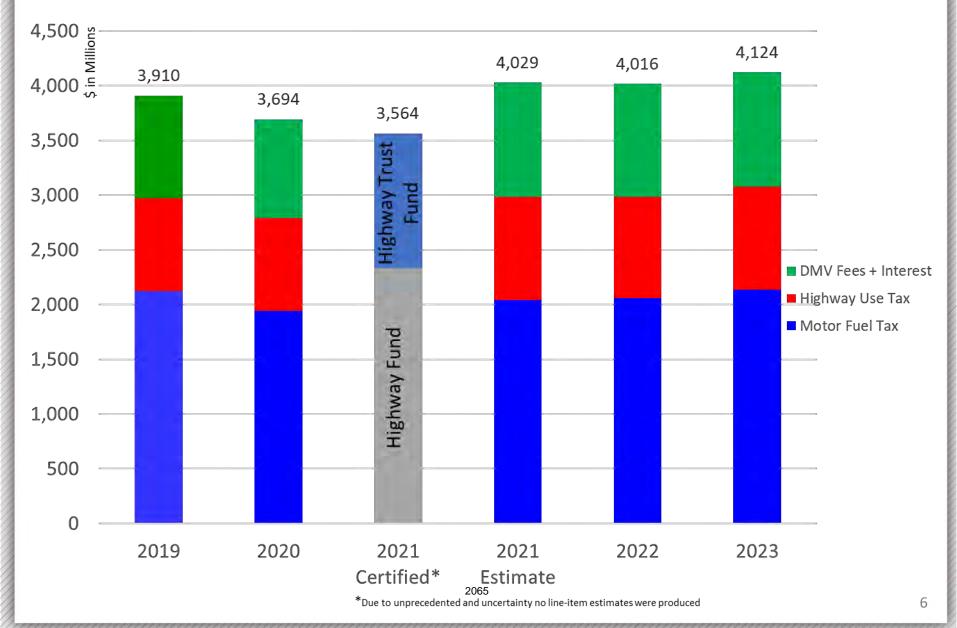
State Revenue Comparison through March Preliminary (March 29, 2021)

State Revenue Comparison – Biennium Budget



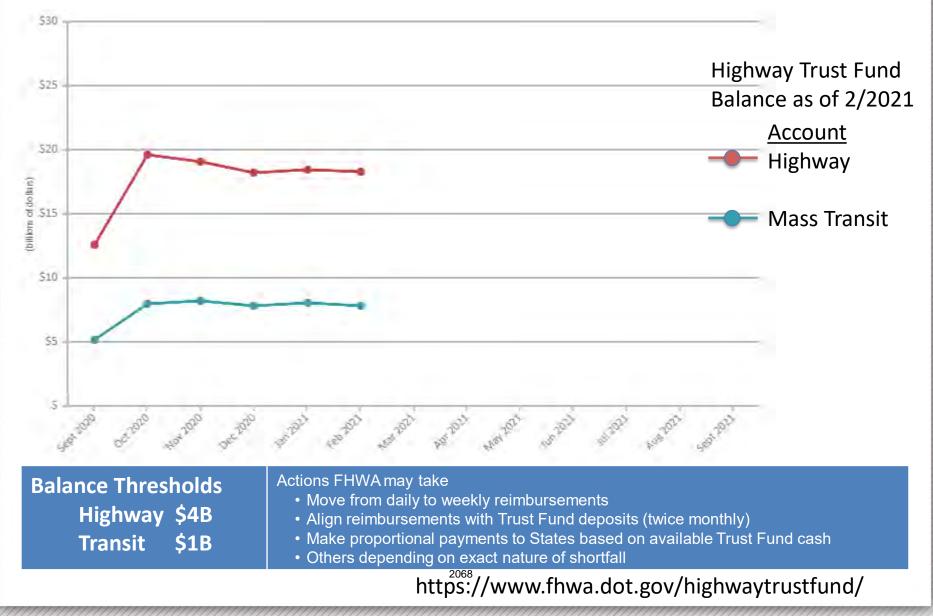

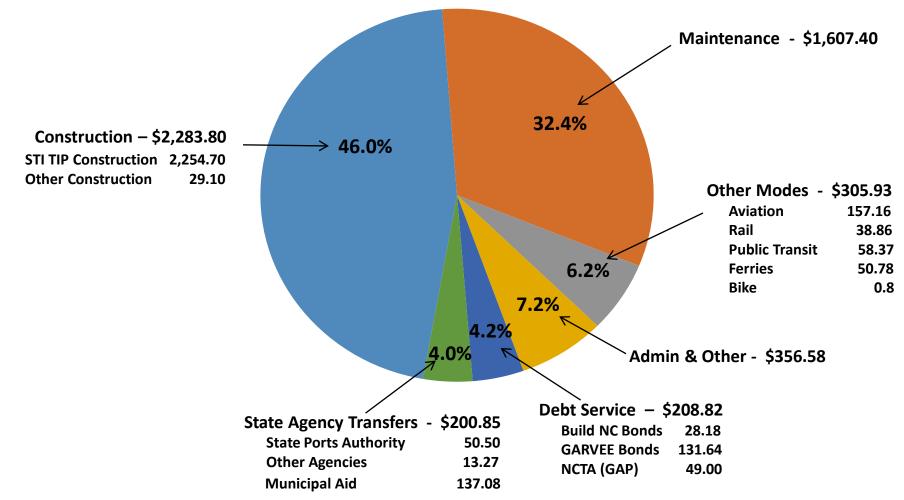

Uses of 2020-21 NCDOT Appropriations* Total Funding = \$4.96 Billion

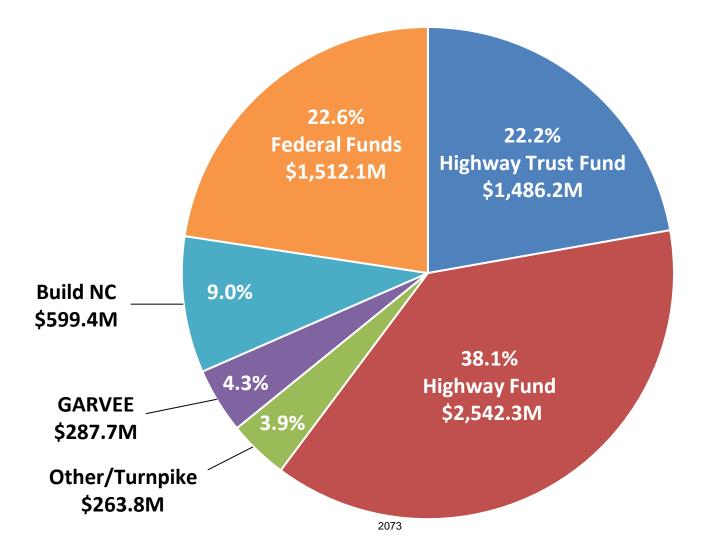

Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$116.7 million in February 2020 to \$797.2 million in February 2021. An increase of \$680.5 million or 582.9%. This increase in cash is primarily due to increased motor fuel tax and license & fees revenues for the Highway Fund combined with lower cash disbursements as a result of continued decreased expenditures.
- **HF Revenues** Revenues decreased from \$197.3 million in February 2020 to \$189.5 million in February 2021. A decrease of \$7.8 million or 4%. This decrease was primarily due to a \$.9 million decrease in motor fuel tax revenues and a \$6.6 million decrease in license & fee revenues in February 2021 compared to February 2020.
- **HF** February 2021 YTD revenues are greater than February 2020 YTD revenues by \$166.4 million, and February 2021 YTD expenses are less than February YTD 2020 expenses by \$474.9 million.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$251.4 million in February 2020 to \$601.3 million in February 2021. An increase of \$349.9 million or 139.1%. This increase in cash is primarily due to continued decreased expenditures and loan repayments from Highway Fund.
- **HTF Revenues** Revenues decreased from \$124.5 million in February 2020 to \$114.9 million in February 2021. A decrease of \$9.6 million or 7.7%. This decrease was primarily due to a \$20.1 million decrease in motor fuel tax revenue that was somewhat offset by a \$9.9 million increase in highway use tax revenue and a \$.9 million increase in license & fees revenue in February 2021 compared to February 2020.
- **HTF** February 2021 YTD revenues are lower than February 2020 YTD revenues by \$92.6 million, and February 2021 YTD expenses are less than February YTD 2020 expenses by \$189.2 million.

Key monthly action:

• On February 3, 2021, a transfer was made from the Highway Fund to the Highway Trust Fund to repay \$30 million of the Highway Trust Fund loans that began on July 6, 2018. The outstanding balance of the loans after this payment was \$860.3 million.

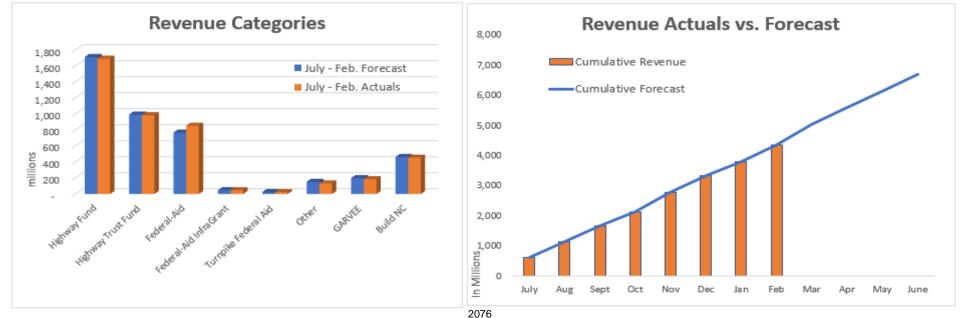
Spend Plan Analysis

- Total Revenues year to date are 0.37% above the spend plan forecast, or \$16 million. DOT realized higher Motor Fuel Tax revenue in July of \$80 million of deferred taxes allowed by NCDOR. The Department has received \$311 million of 2020 Build NC reimbursements from the trustee through February. In addition, year to date Federal Aid revenue was 11%, or \$86 million, above the forecasted amount.
 - Other Revenue Total Other Revenues year to date is \$19 million or 13% below spend plan forecast. Major line items for this category include Damage Claims (\$48.3 million), Federal Transit funding (\$16.5 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$24.9 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$10.4 million), GHSP funding (\$9.1 million), and LOGO Annual Fees (\$3.9 million).
- Total Expenditures year to date are 4% below the spend plan forecast, or \$134 million. This is a result of the slow down implemented during Spring 2020 and the lag time in reinitiating project phases.
 - Total Construction Expenditures are 3% below spend plan forecast. ROW expenditures through February total \$197.6 million, or 44.5% of the \$444 million yearly spend plan. Utilities expenditures through February total \$73.0 million, or 54.5% of the \$134 million yearly spend plan.
 - Maintenance Expenditures year to date are 7% below spend plan forecast, or \$49 million. The SFY 2021 Spend Plan for Contract Resurfacing, Bridge Program and Pavement Preservation was realigned in the Spend Plan Amendment #2 to the fiscal year projected cash outlay.
 - Total Modal Expenditures are 4% below spend plan forecast. The Integrated Mobility Division SFY 2021 Spend Plan was realigned in the Approved Spend Plan Amendment #2 to the projected cash outlay. In addition, over \$37 million was paid to the City of Charlotte for the CATS Blue Line in February.

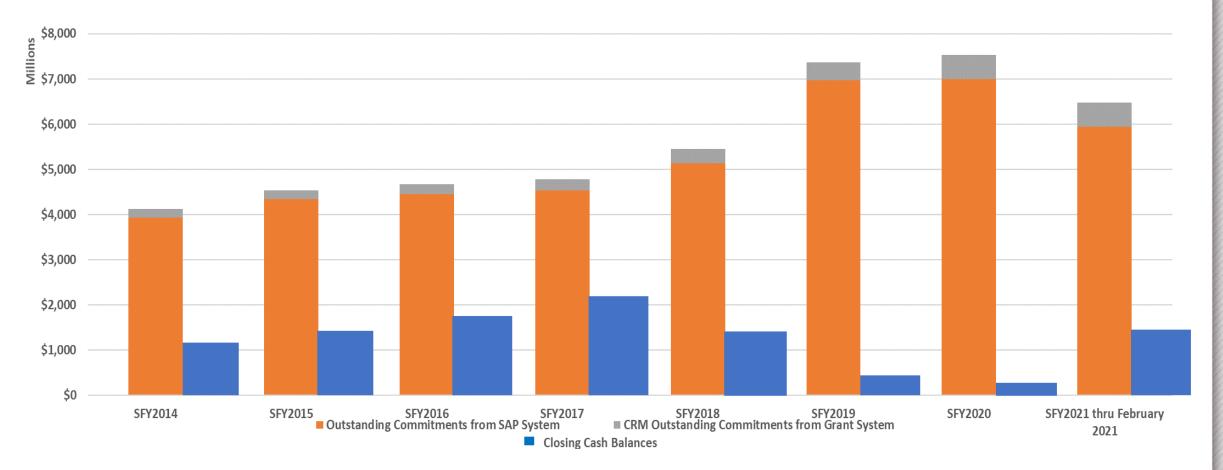

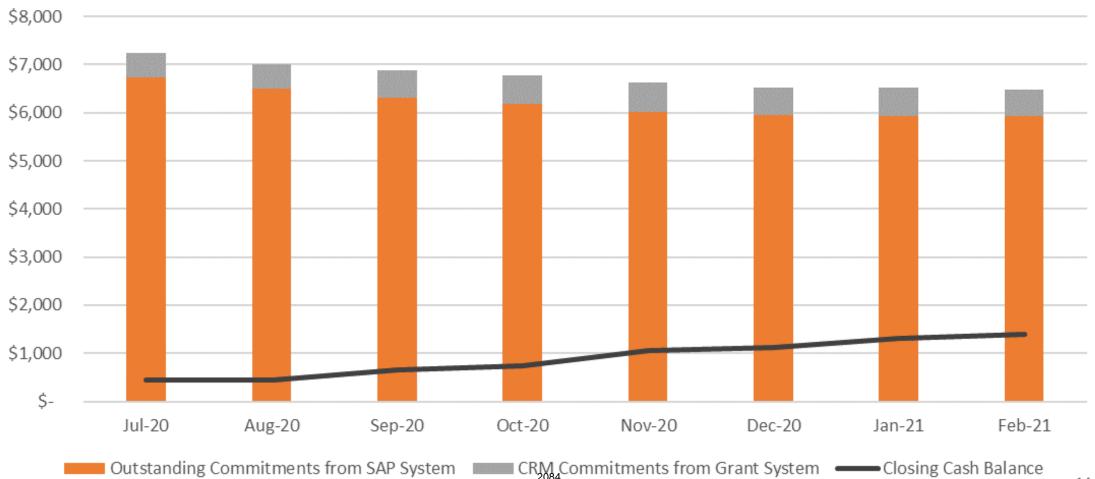


NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

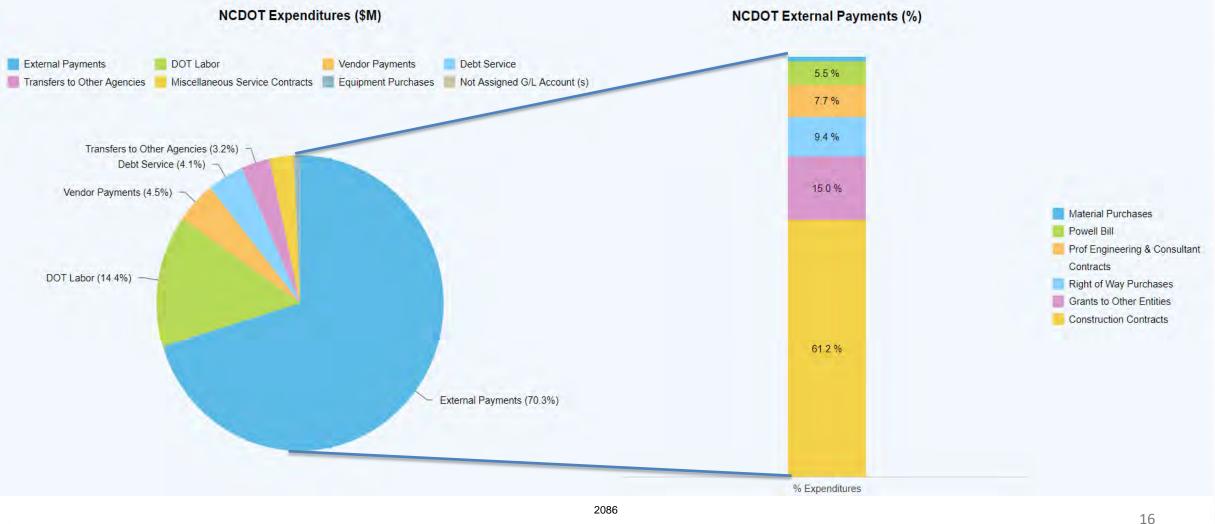

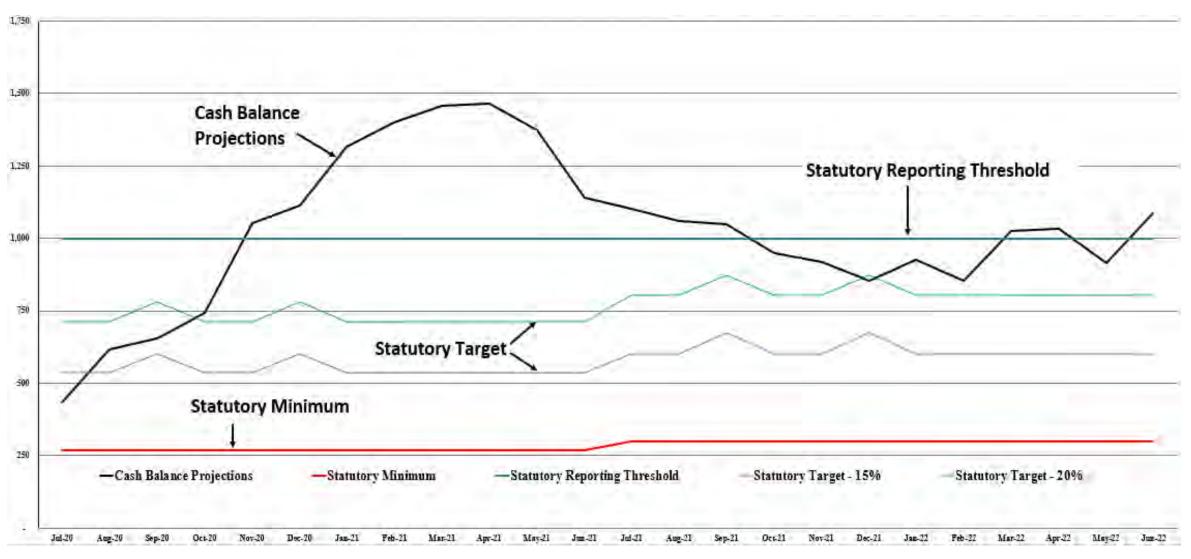
- Section 2.1 of Session Law 2019-251 requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For February 2021, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$1.2 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for January was \$1.4 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under G.S. 143C-6-11.

Spend Plan Variance

- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -3% Variance (-\$45M). Project lettings were delayed during budget restrictions.
- Division of Mitigation Services (Formerly EEP) 21% Variance (\$5M). Payments totaling over \$16.5M were disbursed to the NC Department of Environmental Quality Division of Mitigation Services (DMS) in February for compensatory mitigation to offset NCDOT construction impacts. These funds cover administration, restoration, long term monitoring and planning for DMS's SFY 2021 third and fourth quarters.

Spend Plan Variance

- Maintenance and Operations -7% Variance (-\$49M). Spend Plan Amendment #2 issued a realignment of expected cash outflows for SFY 2021. Contract Resurfacing and Bridge Program payouts are expected to increase in the fourth quarter of SFY 2021 into SFY 2022.
 - Undeclared Disasters -24% (-\$7M). Snow and ice response is the primary driver of expenditures. Ideal scenario would be to experience actuals below established targets for the fiscal year. This would allow a potential redistribution of un-used spending authority for other maintenance needs across the state.
- Railroad Program -26% (-\$8M). Many rail projects, including the Freight Rail and Rail Crossing Safety Improvement (FRRCSI) program, were previously on hold and are now being advanced. A FRRCSI solicitation is available to railroads for additional projects to support rail freight growth. These are anticipated to be awarded by May.

COVID Impacts on NCTA Systems

- Revenues on NCTA's systems have been negatively impacted by COVID and resulting social distancing measures such as an increased percentage of the population working from home
- While realized revenue impacts have not impacted operations of the existing systems, they do stress financial metrics/requirements tied to the outstanding debt on the system and proposed debt for future system expansion
- NCTA is subject to requirements to:
 - Maintain certain financial metrics; and
 - Disclose updated financial metrics to both the investor community and TIFIA periodically

- The updated Traffic and Revenue forecast for the Triangle Expressway projects COVID impacts will reduce revenues by a total of \$586 million through 2058
- The present value loss of the revenues is calculated to be \$334.3M

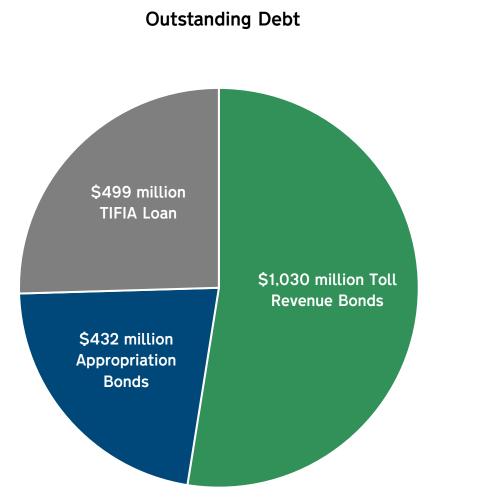

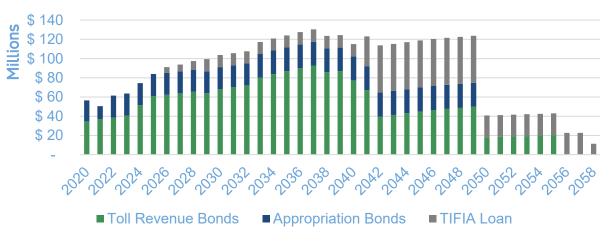

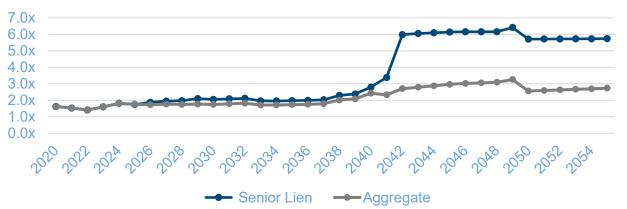
Triangle Expressway System Outstanding Debt



Annual Net Debt Service







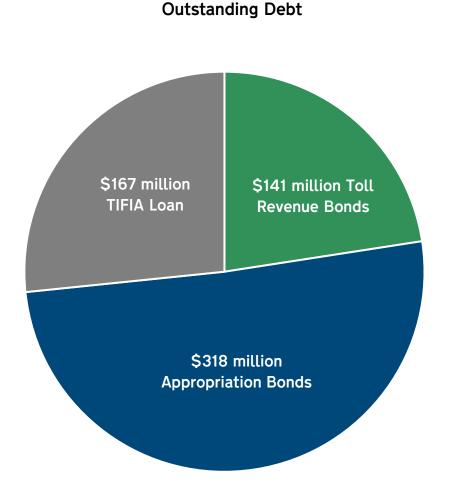

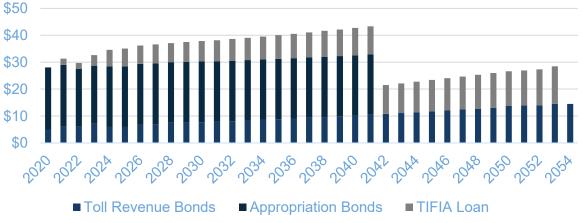

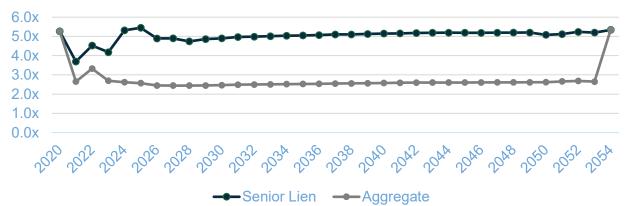
Monroe Expressway Outstanding Debt

Debt Service Coverage



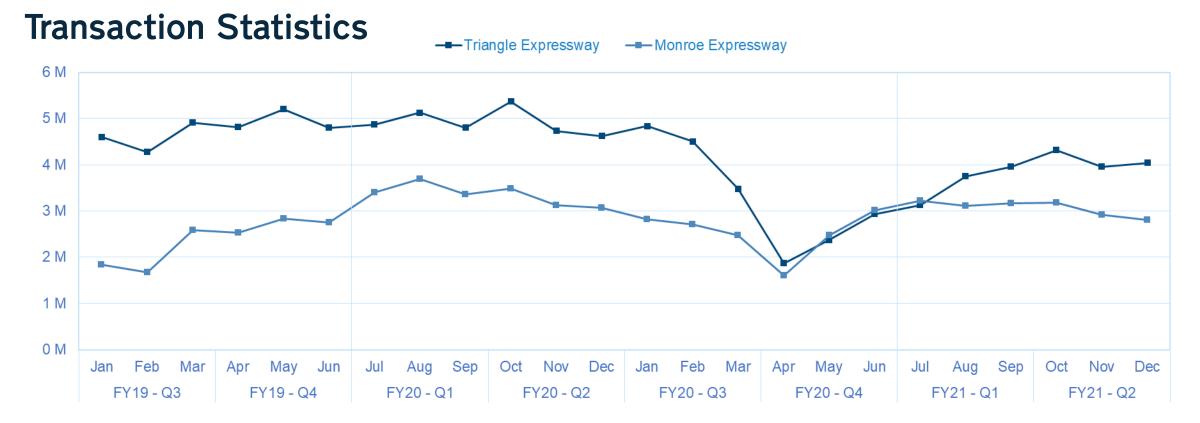

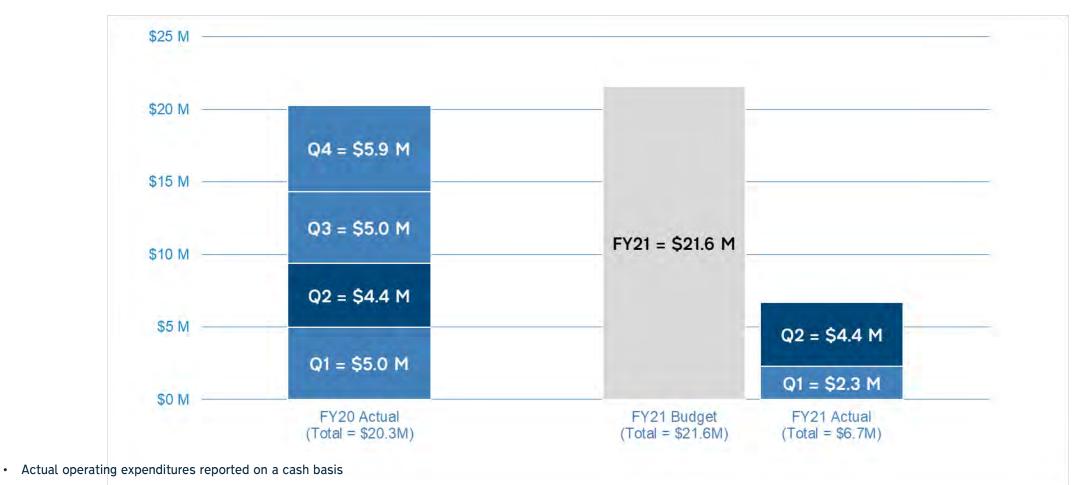

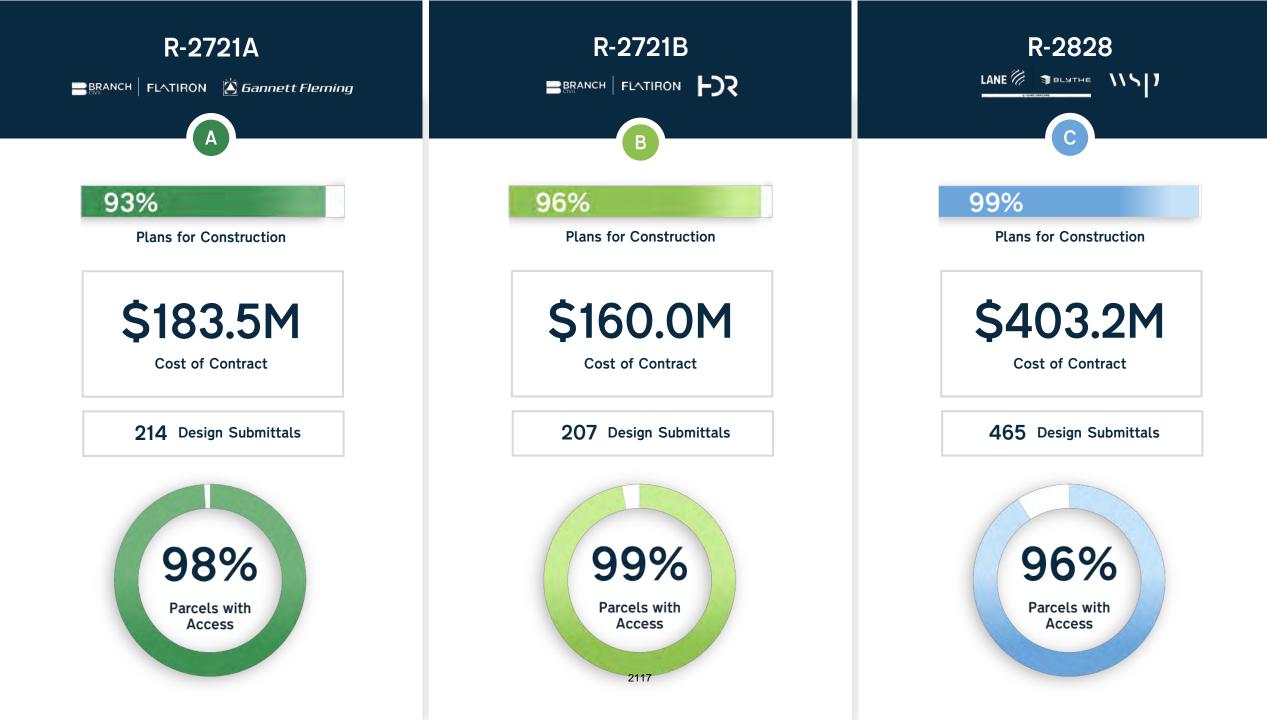

Plan of Finance Cost Tracking

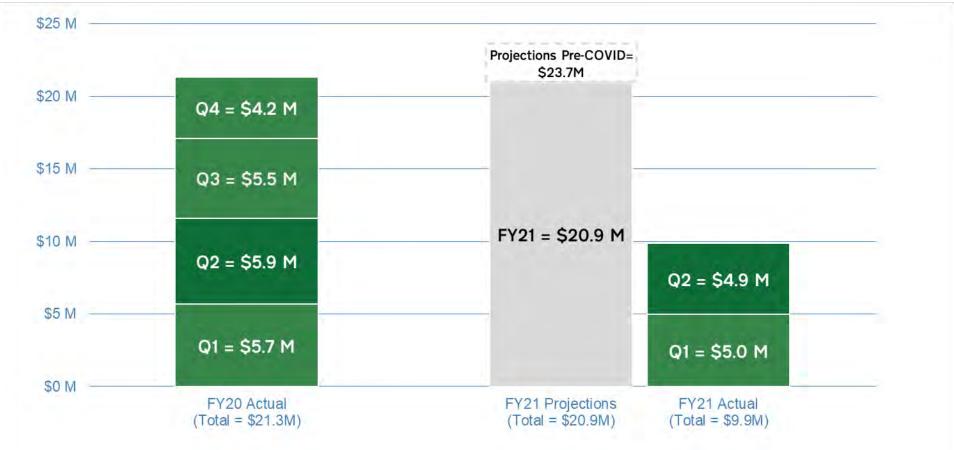

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The Nantahala Byway offers a variety of visual experiences ranging from views of the Nantahala River and the agricultural bottom lands to the backdrop of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The Nantahala Gorge is the heart of the byway, and the Cherokee once referred to it as the "Land of the Midday Sun" for its deep valley and steep walls. The gorge is known for its world-class whitewater rafting, and between mid-March and mid-November, you'll find whitewater enthusiasts enjoying the river with rafts, kayaks, and canoes. The byway occasionally provides glimpses of the Great Smoky Mountain Railroad, which snakes through the gorge paralleling US 74. The railroad offers visitors a different perspective of the gorge and operates daily from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m.

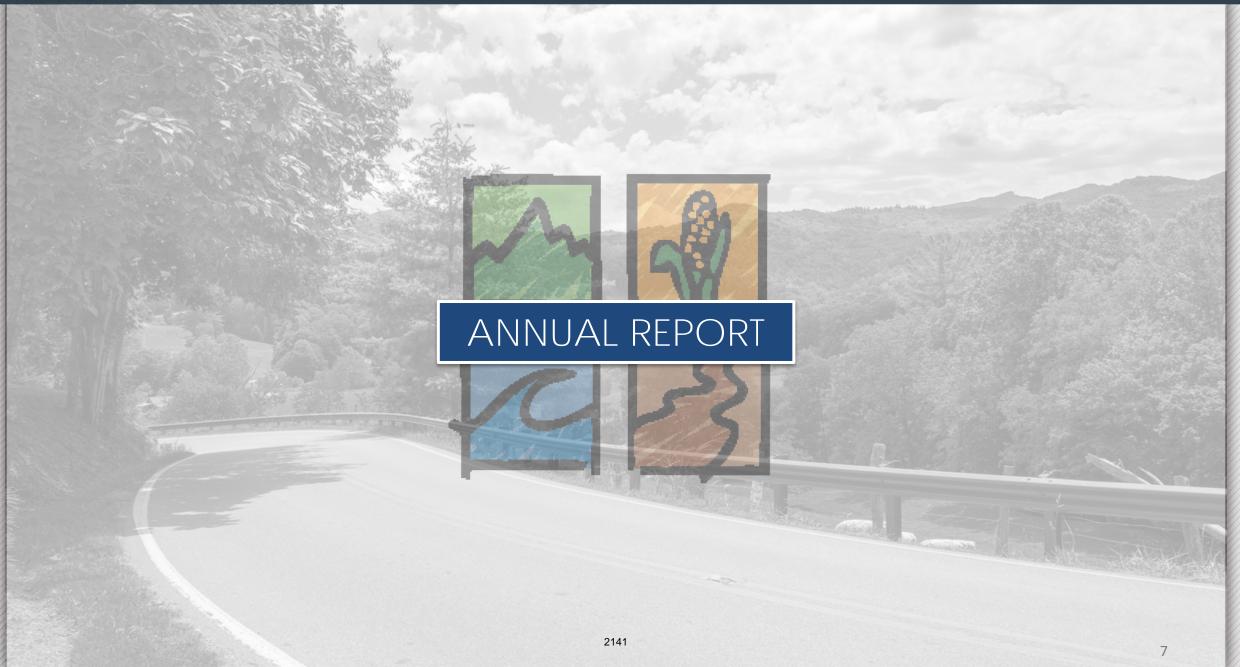

CTION ITEM #1: McAuley Byway OSa Road Sceni

Description:

McAuley Road is located in Mecklenburg County, one of the fastest growing urban areas in the United States. It offers motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists an opportunity to see what Mecklenburg County looked in the past. It is a typical 19th century landscape with a dirt road, one lane wooden bridge, open farmland, and woodlands. Traveling along the road, visitors see hills, mixed forests, pastures, grazing livestock, meadows, and historical farm structures. Ramah Creek meanders through the protected lands and can be seen from the one lane bridge. A great variety of wildlife including deer, coyotes, turkeys, birds of prey, and an extensive list of birds can frequently be seen crossing the road and in areas surrounding the road. The road is historically significant and is designated by the Charlotte Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission as one of the last vestiges of rural vistas that dominated Mecklenburg County until the middle of the 20th century. Catawba Lands Conservancy permanently protects 775 acres of the area surrounding the road through voluntary conservation easements assuring a large natural preserve of native flora and fauna.

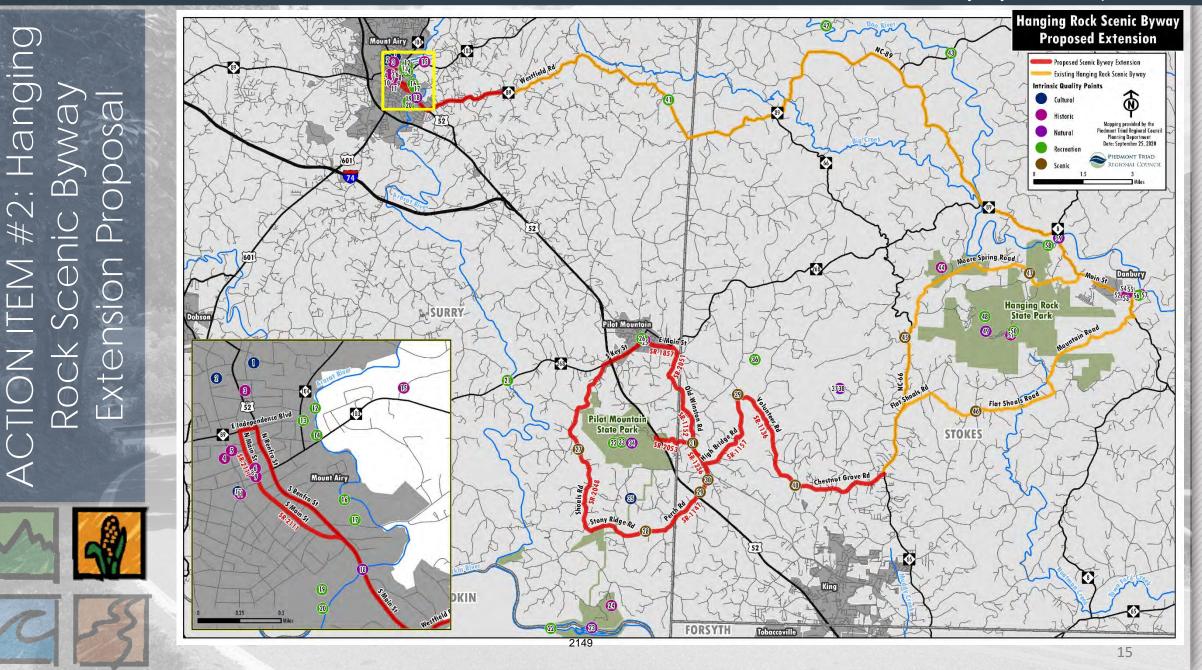

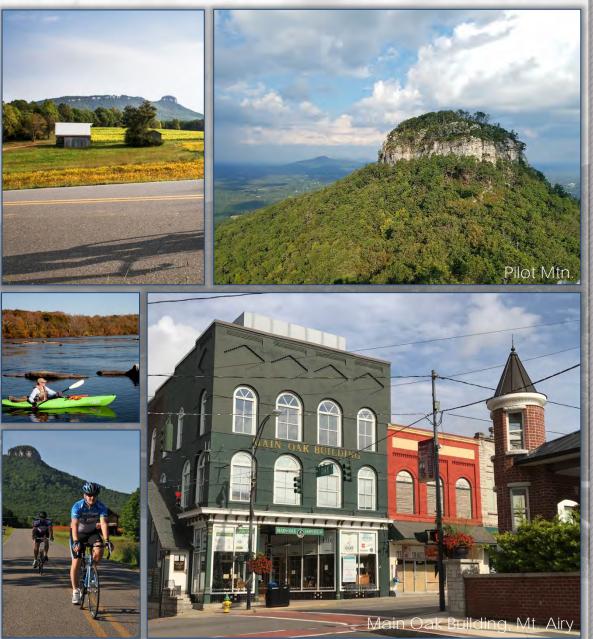
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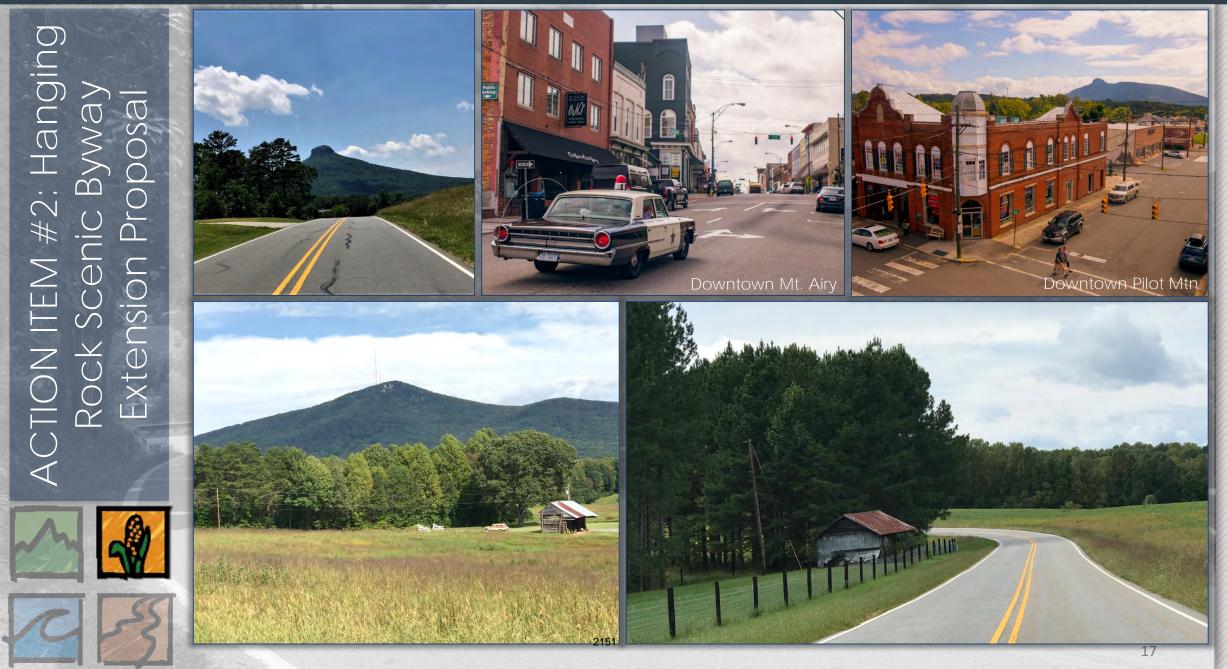


Description:

The proposed extension to Hanging Rock Scenic Byway connects the recreational resources of the entire Sauratown Mountain range, as well as additional cultural and historic resources that help define this unique region of the northwest Piedmont. The extension will help travelers discover the ancient Sauratown Mountains as the connection between iconic Pilot Mountain and the quartzite cliffs of Hanging Rock. The unique geography of the Sauratown Mountains, rising up to 2,500 feet above the surrounding terrain, creates a distinctive and scenic outdoor recreation paradise. The proposed extension will add the Town of Pilot Mountain and City of Mount Airy to the byway corridor. Mount Airy is a popular destination for travelers seeking to experience the nostalgia associated with the beloved 1960s sitcom The Andy Griffith Show, but both communities possess significant historic resources, a strong sense of place, and excel at providing authentic experiences to visitors. The views adjacent to the route offer a memorable visual experience of the North Carolina Piedmont through pastoral vistas of small farms, barns, livestock, and historic homes. The long-range views are dominated by the forested ridges and quartzite cliffs of the Sauratown Mountains, including Pilot Mountain's iconic Big Pinnacle which is visible from almost any point on the route and is one of the most iconic images in North Carolina. The overall character of the expanded corridor connects the visitor to the one-ofa-kind natural and scenic resources of the Sauratown Mountains that make this byway an exceptional 2150 outdoor recreation destination.

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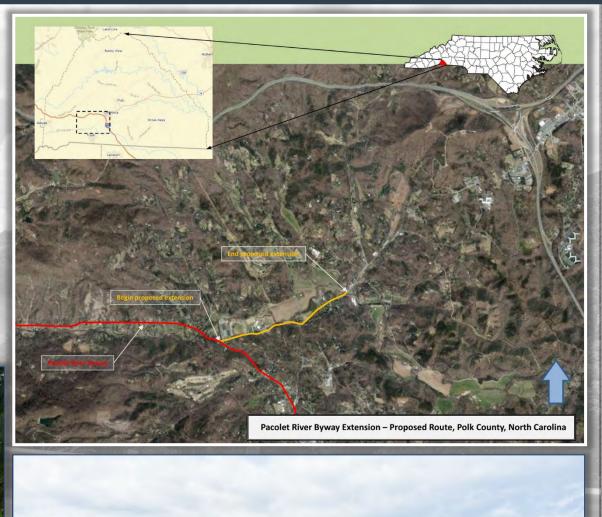

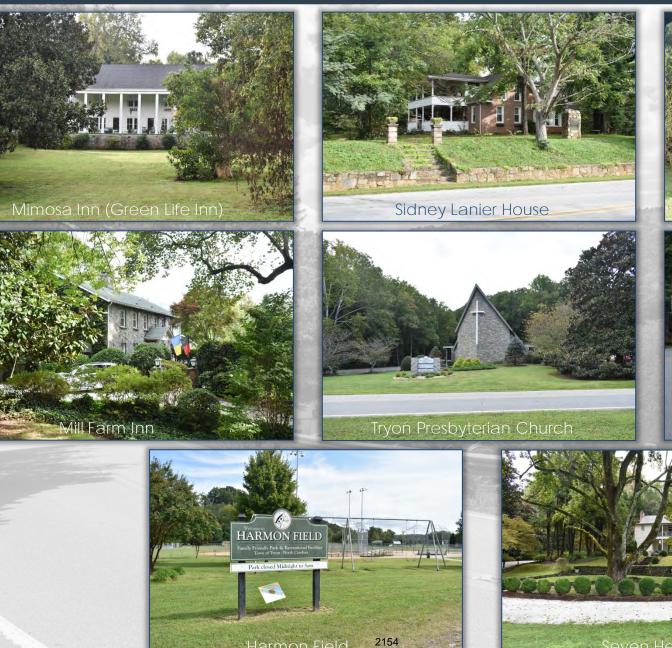
The proposed scenic byway extension illustrates the rural character of southern Polk County as it passes through the broad valley of the Pacolet River and expands upon the attributes of the Pacolet River Scenic Byway by introducing additional cultural, historical, and scenic qualities. The gently rolling topography of the county is on view as the byway extension skirts the edge of the river valley. The hillsides surrounding the proposed route are typically wooded, but open pasture and agricultural fields fill the foreground with distant views of the mountains that form the northern and western border of Polk County. The proposed out-and back route begins and ends by Harmon Field, a 36-acre park lying on the banks of the Pacolet River that has served as recreational grounds since 1928.

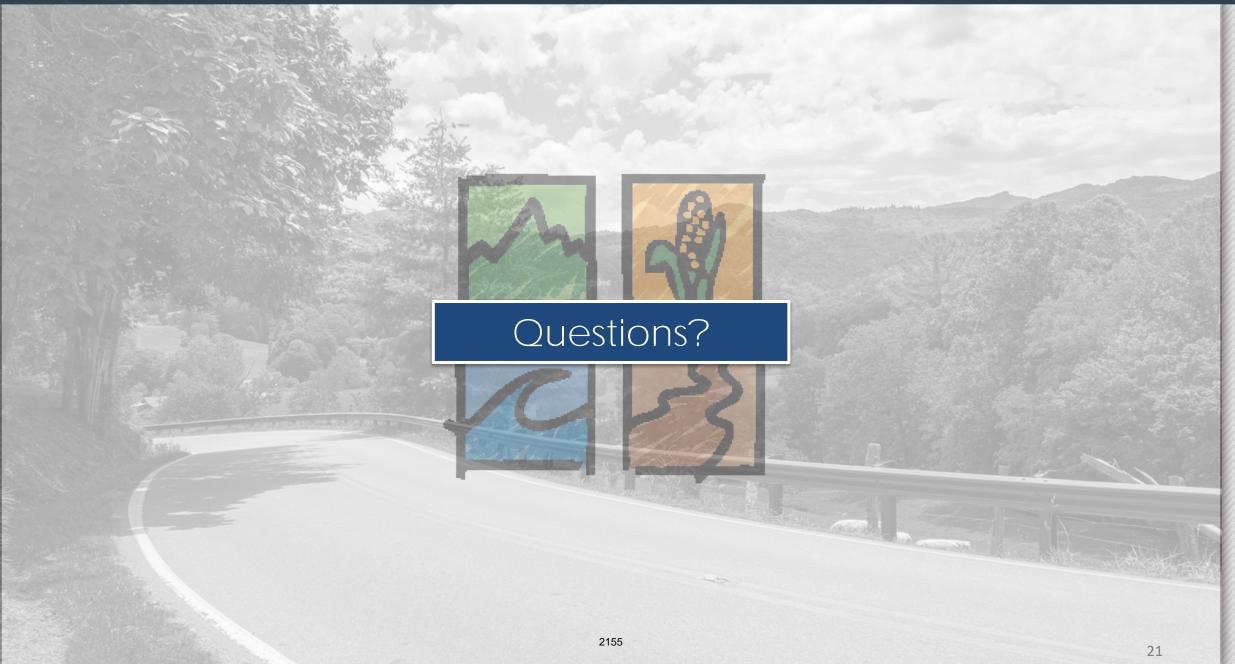

WHEREAS, Tyler A. Herndon was born in Charlotte, N.C. and moved to Kings Mountain in 1998; and

WHEREAS, Herndon attended Kings Mountain High School, graduated from Cleveland Community College and then earned a Criminal Justice Degree from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte; and

WHEREAS, Officer Herndon began his law enforcement career with the Mount Holly Police Department in January 2019; and

WHEREAS, Officer Herndon formed a strong bond with his co-workers and with people in the community he served; and

WHEREAS, Officer Herndon distinguished himself by acts of kindness and community service, reflecting well on Mount Holly and projecting a positive image of the Mount Holly Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Officer Herndon was tragically killed in the line of duty responding to a breaking and entering call on December 11, 2020, and

WHEREAS, the Mount Holly City Council respectfully requests the North Carolina Department of Transportation to designate a road in memory of Officer Tyler A. Herndon as a way to honor and memorialize his contributions to the citizens of Mount Holly and the State of North Carolina.
