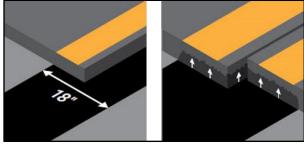

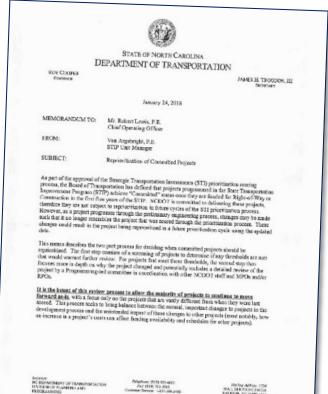

2. Financial Update – Kim Padfield	, NCDOT Controller					
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Ms. Padfield reported on financial key items of note: GARVEE bond issuance planned for close in September (\$300M sale with Council of State on August 3 rd); Planning for \$300M Build NC issuance in October pending legislative change (Senate Bill 105 does include a cash balance exception for FY22 only); Received confidential draft of Spend Plan Development and Monitoring Audit and have met with the State Auditor's Office to discuss; The SFY 22/SFY 23 Spend Plan that had been presented last month has been revised to use the Continuation Budget; and in May there was a \$95M cash transfer made from the Highway Fund to the Highway Trust Fund and there was another \$90M transfer in June. The outstanding balance was \$600.3M. She estimated a payment of \$200M or more next fiscal year. She reported the closing cash balance for May was \$1.98B. The Highway Fund balance increase was a result of increase in motor fuel tax revenue, license and fees revenue and a decrease in expenditures. The Trust Fund balance increase was a result of a decrease in expenditures and a repayment of the advance.					



	Spend Plan Revenues through May were very close to projections and Spend Plan Expenditures were 88% of Spend Plan projections to date and 77% of the yearly spend plan with one month to report. She reported the outstanding commitments and noted the Department is now paying commitments that spans multiple years. She noted revenues have outpaced expenditures during the year and during May those amounts were closer as the Department was paying the seasonal commitments. Ms. Padfield reported at the close of May financials Advance Construction Amounts and Unreimbursed Expenditures are within limits set in the Advance Construction Policy

3. FY22/FY23 Spend Plan – Michel	le Overby, Funds Administration Manager
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Ms. Overby reported the SFY22/SFY23 Spend Plan presented during the June Board meeting was based on the Governor's Recommended Budget. After conversations with OSBM, a change was made to the proposed Spend Plan to base it on the continuation budget. She expects to present a revised Spend Plan when the Biennium Budget is passed and ratified. Ms. Overby noted the Spend Plan State Revenue is based on the February 2021 Consensus Revenue Forecast and Federal Revenue is being held constant at the current year funding level. Also, this Spend Plan includes no Build NC Bond Proceeds for SFY 22 nor for SFY 23. In addition, it includes a reduction in Operations and Maintenance (Continuation Budget is \$73M less than Governor's Budget for SFY22), and a reduction in several Modal Divisions. The GARVEE Bond issuance is included and assumes a \$300M sale in September 2021 and another \$300M sale in July 2022. Another change she noted was a reduction in Preliminary Engineering expenditures in SFY 2023, which was reduced from \$350M to \$270M. She noted the Right of Way amount remained unchanged, and the Capital Budget was more in the Continuation Budget than the Governor's Budget. Ms. Overby reported that in July 2021, the Department is required to transfer an additional \$61M to the Emergency Reserve Fund to meet the \$125M requirement set in legislation.
ACTIONS TAKEN	Chair Lathrop asked for a motion to make a recommendation from the Finance Committee for the full Board to consider the updated Spend Plan.
	Board member Clarke made the motion to recommend the SFY22/SFY23 Spend Plan for consideration by the full Board and Board member Mathis provided the second.

Cost Estimate Escalation – Joey Eastern Region Manager	Hopkins, PE, Deputy Chief Engineer of Planning and Leigh Wing, PE, STIP
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Hopkins reported the presentation would include steps the Department has taken to develop better and more timely estimates. He noted that Mrs. Wing would show a snapshot of where DOT would be during the next STIP cycle (2024 – 2033 STIP). They will also suggest some next step as they work through the STIP development



with the Board and local partners. The charts show numbers for forecasting the STIP, using estimates and revenue forecast as was know at that time. Mr. Hopkins reminded the Board the STIP is a planning document and not a fiscal document. He noted there are factors not included, such as improved revenue forecasts, ongoing work of Value Engineering/Value Assessments, and ongoing work with SAS to develop a better process to program the STIP. The goal is to make the STIP more reliable.

Mrs. Wing began by explaining the presentation would be about the development of the next STIP, 2024-2033. She recapped the presentation from the prior Finance Committee meeting that included Initial Cost Estimates, Committed Projects and how project cost can increase over time. She then presented a background on the Summer 2020 STIP Reprogramming. She noted project cost increases received Sept 2019 – June 2020, along with reduced revenues and cash issues, were largely responsible for the Summer 2020 STIP Reprogramming because the STIP was no longer fiscally constrained. She noted it was a mid-cycle reprogramming and a new STIP was not developed. During the process the need to improve accuracy of NCDOT's cost estimation process was recognized.

Mrs. Wing reported on the Cost Estimation Improvement Process Workgroup, DOT staff group that would review the cost estimation process and make recommendations. She summarized their major findings that included finding deficiencies in the GIS-based Cost Estimation Tool, estimates not always updated regularly and consistently distributed, and a lack of central data-repository for estimates. Their goal was to create a consistent process, ensure estimates are updated on a regular basis and properly distributed to all parties, and creation of single data repository.

She reported on key activities underway that included all cost estimates are based on express designs, all cost estimates will be updated at a minimum of every 2 years, ensure appropriate contingencies are accounted for at all stages, creating a cost estimate application for storing and distribution, and institutionalizing Value Engineering/Value Assessments on all projects. She next reported that STICR (STI Committee for Reprioritization) review projects that meet cost thresholds (increased over 35% or \$25M for projects selected in P5.0+). The options available to STICR are project continues as is, modify project scope to reduce project cost, or reprioritize project in the next Prioritization Cycle. STICR has reviewed 39 projects that have been flagged.

Mrs. Wing next informed the Committee where they stand to date on the STIP Cost Review. In Summer 2020, NCDOT staff reviewed all STIP highway cost estimates and made recommendations on which projects needed updated estimates. There are 450+ project estimates being updated (over 1,000 estimates for ROW, utilities, and construction), and should be complete by Summer 2021. Division Engineers are approving all verified cost memos. She noted many more projects may be flagged for STICR after this process is complete.

She then presented the available funding and programming status for each funding bucket based on committed and non-committed projects during the next STIP timeframe – 2024-2033. She noted NCDOT is legislatively allowed to over program by 10% in the 10-year period in each funding bucket and the amounts shown in the chart already take that into account. The programming status presented was the



	amount beyond the 10% over program allowance for each bucket. She noted there are unknowns, such as federal revenues (potentially can increase) and the passage of a state budget. She and Mr. Hopkins will update the Committee on the numbers when the state budget has been approved and ratified. Also, she noted additional projects may go through STICR review, and Value Engineering and Value Assessments have not taken place on all projects yet. Mrs. Wing next presented the funding availability based only on committed projects. She also noted Planning & Programming has partnered with SAS to develop realistic cash flows for the STIP program. They will be continuing that project over the summer. Mrs. Wing next asked for Board Considerations and input into how to handle inflation for future STIP programs, the STI Prioritization Workgroup, and STICR guidelines.

Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$117.4million in June 2020 to \$1,201.2 million in June 2021. An increase of \$1,083.8 million or 922.9%. This increase in cash was primarily due to increased motor fuel tax and license & fees revenues for the Highway Fund combined with decreased expenditures.
- **HF Revenues** Revenues increased from \$155.5 million in June 2020 to \$231.6 million in June 2021. An increase of \$76.1 million or 49.0%. This increase was primarily due to a \$59.2 million increase in motor fuel tax revenues and a \$17.2 million increase in license & fee revenues in June 2021 compared to June 2020. This is due to pandemic impacts in 2020 and the change in motor fuel tax revenue distribution percentages between the HF and HTF.
- **HF** June 2021 YTD revenues were greater than June 2020 YTD revenues by \$432.5 million, and June 2021 YTD expenses were less than June YTD 2020 expenses by \$685.3 million.
- HTF Cash Cash balance increased from \$148.4 million in June 2020 to \$811.8 million in June 2021. An increase of \$663.4 million or 447.0%. This increase in cash was primarily due to continued decreased expenditures and repayment of the advance from Highway Fund.
- HTF Revenues Revenues increased from \$130.4 million in June 2020 to \$157.4 million in June 2021. An increase of \$27.0 million or 20.7%. This increase was due to a \$19.3 million increase in highway use tax revenue, a \$5.6 million increase in motor fuel tax revenue, and a \$2.2 million increase in fees revenue in June 2021 compared to June 2020.
- HTF June 2021 YTD revenues were greater than June 2020 YTD revenues by \$15.0 million, and June 2021 YTD expenses were less than June YTD 2020 expenses by \$181.0 million.

Key monthly action:

• On June 7, 2021, a \$90 million transfer was made from the Highway Fund to the Highway Trust Fund to repay the advance made on August 22, 2018, for \$50M and the advance made on September 7, 2018, for \$40M made in accordance with N.C.G.S § 147-86.15. The grand total transferred during SFY 2021 through June was \$390 million. The outstanding balance of the advance after this payment was \$600.3 million.

Spend Plan Analysis - Revenue

Total Revenues, \$6,740 million, were 0.73% above the spend plan forecast, or \$48.75 million, but were 19%, or \$1,071.6 million, more than revenues for SFY 2020.

- State Revenue, \$4,140 million, was 3%, or \$112 million, above forecasted revenue.
- Federal Revenue, \$1,421 million, was 0.6%, or \$9 million, below the forecasted amount.
- Other Revenue, \$190 million, was 21%, or \$49 million, below spend plan forecast. Major line items that have contributed to this shortfall include Federal Transit funding (received \$28 million or \$7 million less than forecast), Rail FRA funding (received \$0.65 million or \$34 million less than forecast), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (received \$39 million or \$72 million less than forecast), and Federal Aviation funding (received \$19.4 million or \$50 million less than forecast). Major line items that have covered some of this shortfall include Damage Claims (\$54.3 million), GHSP (\$12.9 million), Local & Property Owner Participation (\$25 million), and LOGO Annual Fees (\$5 million).
- GARVEE Reimbursement, \$296 million, was 3%, or \$8.6 million, above spend plan forecast.
- Build NC Reimbursement, \$596 million, was 0.6%, or \$3.4 million, below spend plan forecast. The Department has received \$451.9 million of 2020 Build NC reimbursements from the trustee through May.

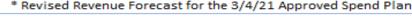

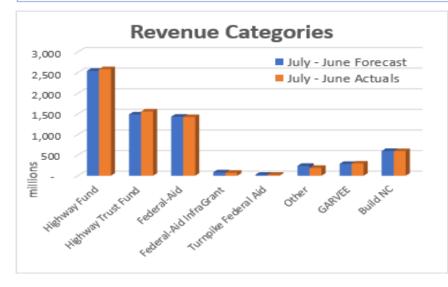
Total Expenditures (\$5,084 million) were 13%, or \$780 million, below the spend plan forecast and 16%, or \$942 million, below the previous year totals. This is a result of initiatives taken by the Department to reduce spending during the COVID pandemic and reengaging with industry partners as they ramp up operations to advance transportation projects.

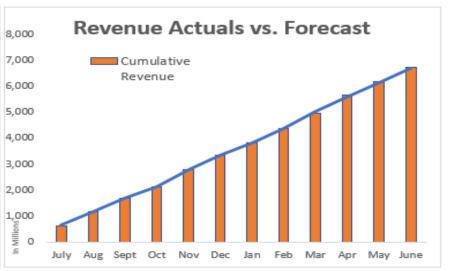
- Total Construction Expenditures (\$2,972 million) were 11%, or \$383 million, below spend plan forecast. SFY 2021 expenditures were 17%, or \$601 million, less than SFY 2020 construction expenditures.
- Maintenance Expenditures for SFY 2021 (\$1,142 million) were 14.6% below the spend plan forecast, or \$196 million. SFY 2021 expenditures were 17%, or \$240 million, less than SFY 2020 maintenance expenditures.
- Total Modal Expenditures (\$405.6 million) were 31%, or \$185 million, below the spend plan forecast, but were 26%, or \$85 million, more than the previous SFY.

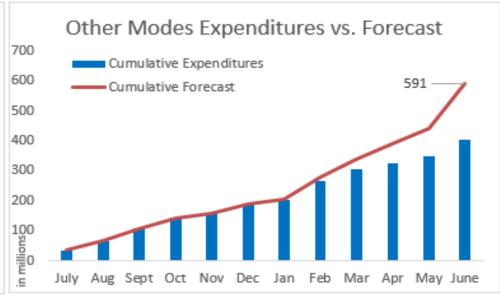

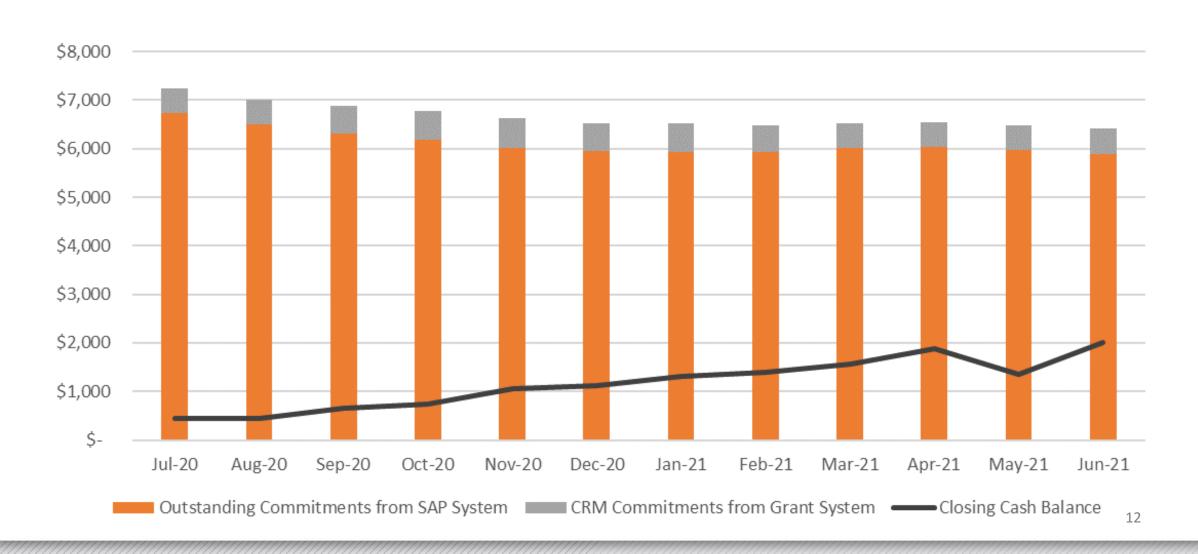

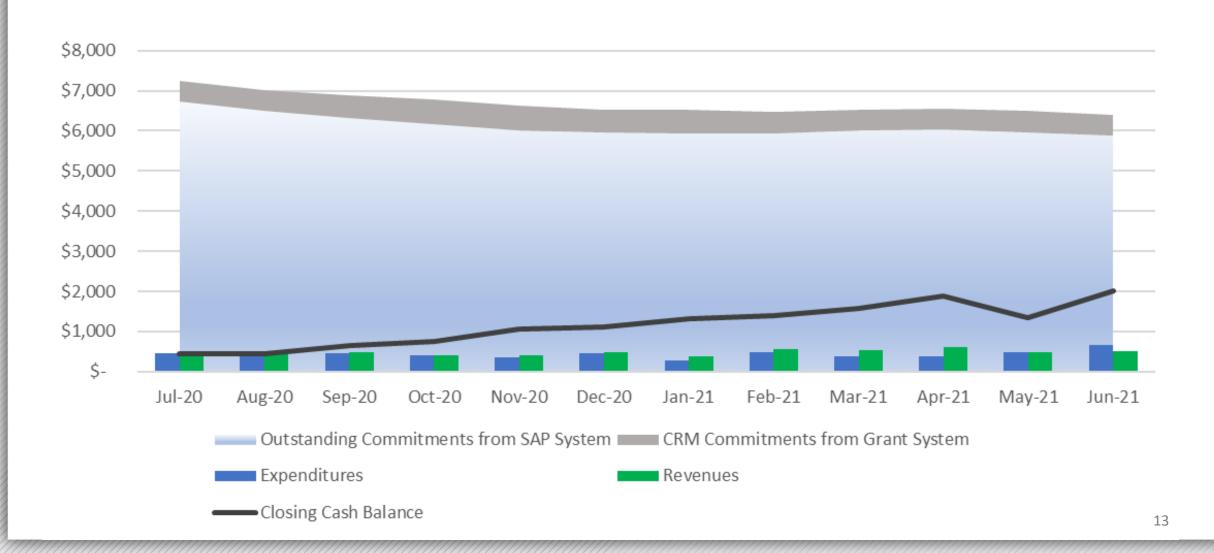
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

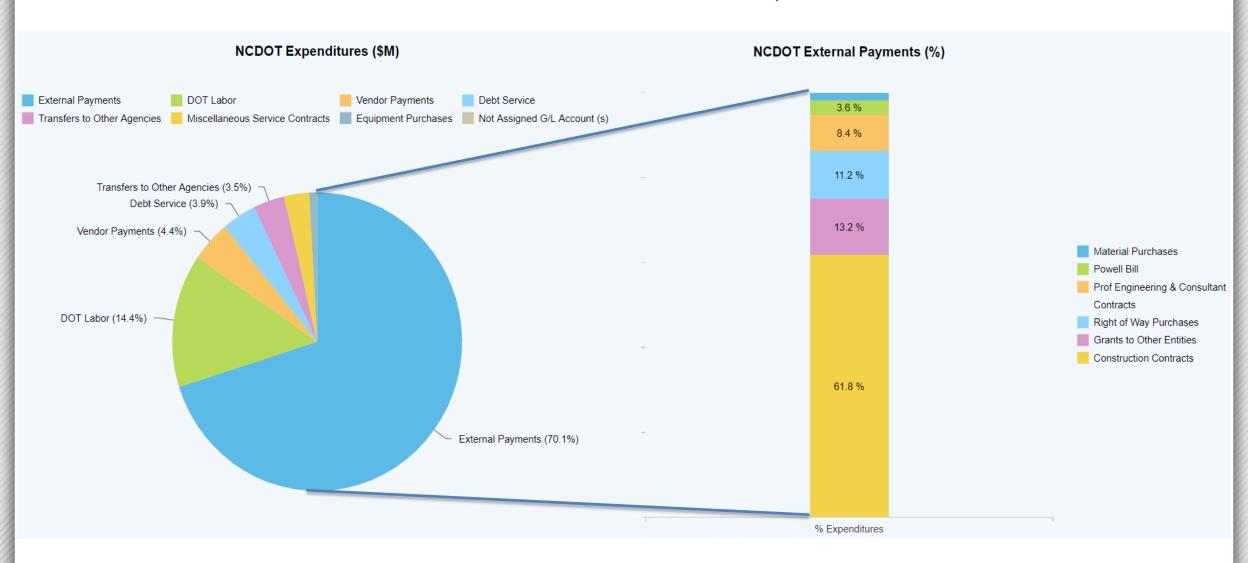


Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

June 2021 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For June 2021, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$1.90 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$535 million and \$713 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for June was \$2.0 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$267 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

Spend Plan Variance

- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -11% Variance (-\$316M). Project lettings were delayed during budget restrictions.
- Division of Mitigation Services (Formerly EEP) -101% Variance (-\$36M) and Strategic Transportation Initiative (STI) 22% Variance (\$193M). Expenses related to 2019 Mitigation Services has been transferred to STI WBS elements. The process has changed based on a work group analysis.

Spend Plan Variance

• Maintenance and Operations -15% Variance (-\$196M). Spend Plan Amendment #2 issued a realignment of expected cash outflows for SFY 2021. Payouts increased during the fourth quarter of SFY 2021, but some projected expenditures were moved into SFY 2022.

• Disaster Funding (FEMA) -61% Variance (-\$30M) and Undeclared Disasters -7% (-\$6M). Ideal scenario would be to experience actuals below established targets for the fiscal year. This would allow a potential redistribution of un-used spending authority for other maintenance needs across the state.

Spend Plan Variance

Modal Divisions – Includes both state and federal funding

- Integrated Mobility Division -44% Variance (-\$61M)
- Ferry Division -15% Variance (-\$9M)
- Rail Division -52% Variance (-\$58M)
- Aviation Division -23% Variance (-\$57M)

Focusing on only the state revenues and expenditures the rail and ferry divisions underspent their target by 14% each, IMD by 15% and aviation by 17%. Our underspend in state funds came primarily from the slow bounce back in transit and ferry ridership due to COVID lingering, lack of materials for construction projects due to supply chain challenges, difficulty filing our vacancies, the need to prioritize federal CARES spend down over state spend down, and our difficulty in ramping programs back up when given the green light midyear to turn them back on.

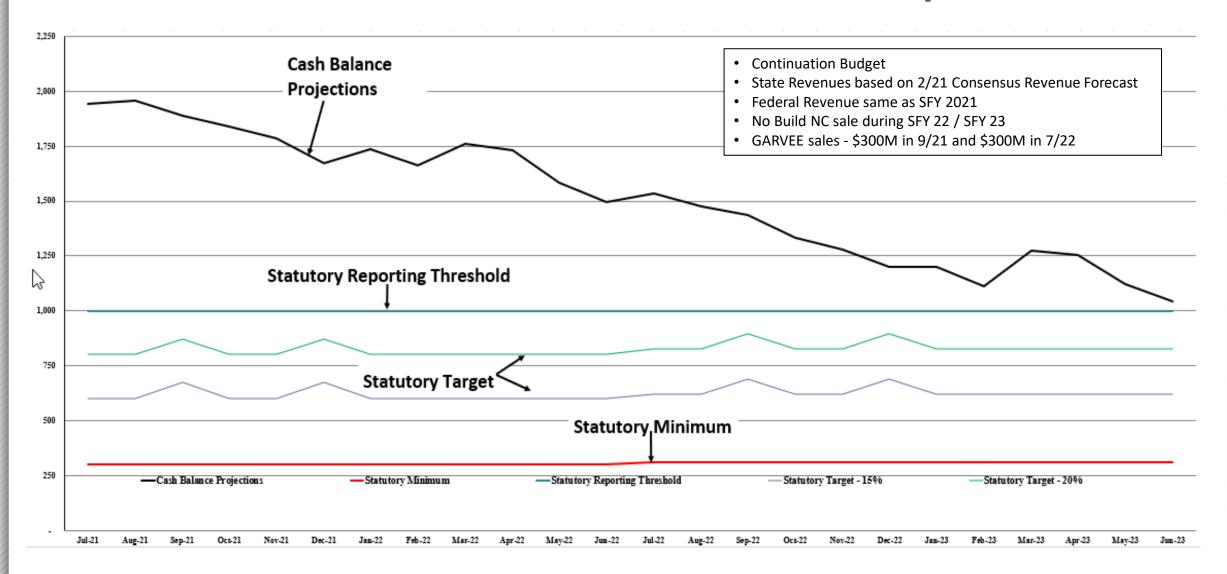

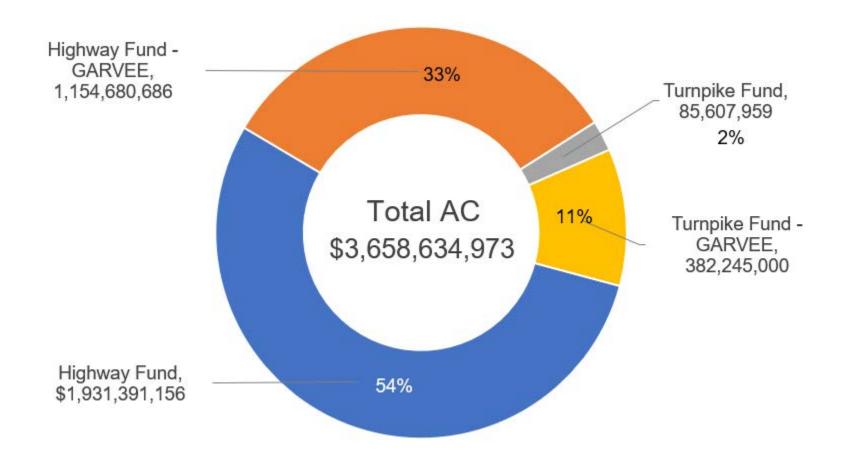

	Vehicles on North Carolina Highways, Dr. Joe Hummer, PE, State Traffic OT Transportation Mobility & Safety Division	
	Dr. Joe Hummer of the Department's Transportation Mobility and Safety Division provided a discussion about the future of autonomous vehicles on North Carolina Highways. He anticipates that the Department will not need special infrastructure to accommodate autonomous vehicles and that the vehicles will be adopted sooner than predicted, especially in urban areas. Autonomous vehicles will change how we use vehicles. They will be automated, electric, and utilized through subscription services.	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Safety is one of the biggest benefits of having autonomous vehicles. In the future, autonomous vehicles will become cheaper than human driving. People who will benefit from autonomous vehicles include older people, younger people, disabled people, and commuters.	
	There are challenges in knowing how to plan for autonomous vehicles such as empty vehicle trips, shifts in time-of-day travel, uncertain revenues, and trip generation rates. Autonomous vehicles will impact land use – such as parking garages, curb space and driveways. Planners will need to change their mindset regarding which roads to build or widen and the best management of our current roadway system.

	3. AAMVA Driverless Vehicle Guidance and Personal Delivery Devices, Mr. Kevin Lacy, PE, State Traffic Engineer, NCDOT Transportation Mobility & Safety Division		
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Kevin Lacy, State Traffic Engineer, provided a presentation about guidance that has been developed related to driverless vehicles by the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators. This guidance is developed for the states and is related to the vehicles, drivers and first responders. This information is rapidly changing – the first edition was published in 2018 and the third edition is currently being developed.		
	Mr. Lacy also discussed Personal Delivery Devices, which are self-driving devices that can deliver items without a person operating the device. These devices can operate on different levels. Those that operate on sidewalks should not operate at speeds higher than what a pedestrian would expect. Some of the vehicles can fully operate in the roadway. Per law, personal delivery devices shall yield the right-of-way to all humans and vehicles. They may not operate on a highway at a speed greater than 20 miles per hour. They also may not operate on a highway with a speed limit greater than 35 miles per hour.		
	Companies are continually researching and testing driverless vehicle operation. Continued growth in automated delivery services and personal delivery devices is anticipated.

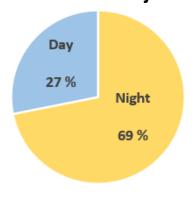

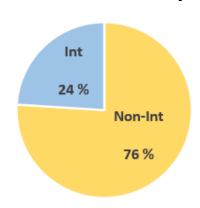

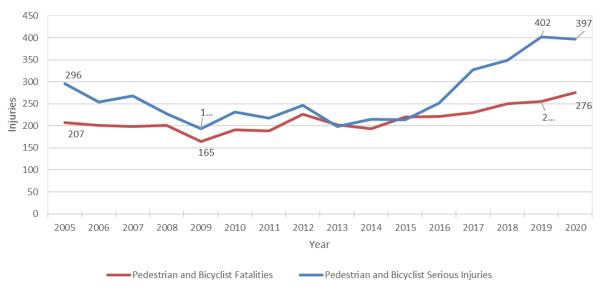

This service is a supplement to the traditional first come first serve vehicle ferry and offers a reservable service which lands in the heart of the village. Once on Ocracoke passengers are able to utilize the Hyde County operated free tram service to get around the village and visit shops and historic landmarks. Integrated Mobility Division — Kick-off of the S-Line Transit Oriented Development Planning Study. PROJECTS

Division of Aviation deploys comprehensive platform for managing drone fleet and data

The Division's Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program implemented an enterprise software platform called DroneDeploy in July that will help the Division manage NCDOT's drone fleet and pilots, and automate the processing of image data captured during drone operations. NCDOT units use drones for a growing number of operations, from monitoring construction projects to supporting emergency management services during natural disasters. The UAS Program procures and maintains NCDOT drones, trains pilots, maintains pilot credentials, performs complex missions for units and provides drone-captured images in the range of formats needed by engineers to manage construction projects and other operations. The DroneDeploy software supports each of those tasks. It automates the processing and reporting of images, minimizes training and processing time for operators. It is currently the only software compatible with both DJI and Skydio drones, which make up the bulk of the NCDOT fleet. It also live-streams data, critical for disaster response support.

North Carolina students wins three of nine top international art contest awards

North Carolina students took three of nine top awards in the 2021 International Young Artist Contest, hosted each year by the Fédération Aéronautique Internationale (FAI) to inspire young people to illustrate the importance of aviation through art. The three were among five N.C. winners of the 2021 National Aviation Art Contest, sponsored by the National Association of State Aviation Officials with the National Aeronautic Association, who emerged from the Division of Aviation's annual state competition. In the international competition, Amy Lee of Cary (age 17) won first place and Isabel Chang (age 15) of Cary won second place in the Senior Category. Anish Upadhyaya (age 13) of Cary won second place in the Intermediate Category.

Division of Aviation staff win top NCDOT employee awards

Aviation staff took three of seven top awards, as well as the overall award, in NCDOT's Stand for Values employee recognition program for representing and modeling NCDOT's seven core values. Two others won honorable mentions in two additional categories. Jamie Fuller, former airport project manager who recently took a Program Manager position with the Federal Aviation Administration, received the Stand for Values Diversity Award, which focuses on respecting others while drawing strength from diverse opinions, ideas and experiences. Fuller also received the Overall NCDOT Stand for Values Award, selected from the seven top core value award winners. Rachel Bingham, deputy director and aviation development manager, received the Stand for Values Integrity Award, which focuses on earning and maintaining trust through accountability, transparency and data-driven decisions. Amanda Conner, aviation business development manager won the Stand for Values Innovation Award for promoting the development and use of new and better solutions. Flight Operations Manager Thad Howell received an honorable mention for Safety, which focuses on providing a safe transportation network and work environment. Ashley Clowes Lowery, a senior airport project manager, received an honorable mention for Teamwork, for using diverse strengths and skills to collaborate to solve problems and serve communities.

BUDGET UPDATES

American Rescue Plan Relief Airport Grants

North Carolina airports will receive \$256 million from the Federal Aviation Administration in the third round of federal COVID relief grant funding, expected in November. The American Rescue Plan is providing \$8 billion in grants to U.S. airports to keep workers employed and construction projects going. Nearly \$254 million of N.C.'s share will go to commercial service airports; about \$2.5 million will go to the state's general aviation airports, in amounts ranging from \$148,000 to \$22,000 per airport, based on their service area's socioeconomic tier. Airports can use the grant funding to cover operational expenses, debt service payments, and costs related to combating the spread of pathogens at the airport. Commercial service airports can also use the money to provide rent relief to terminal retail and concession companies. The funding requires that those airports continue to employ at least 90 percent of their pre-pandemic workforce. As an FAA State Block Grant administrator, the Division of Aviation will distribute and manage the ARP grants to the state's general aviation airports, as it did for the first two federal COVID relief grants (CARES and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation). Commercial service airports will get their grants directly from FAA.

Division of Aviation Unmanned Aircraft Systems Program Manager Ben Spain named to FAA Rule-making Committee Ben Spain, manager of the Division of Aviation's Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program has been appointed to represent the National Association of State Aviation Officials on the Federal Aviation Administration's UAS Beyond Visual Line-of-Sight (BVLOS) Aviation Rulemaking Committee (ARC). The capability of UAS to fly without a pilot onboard and beyond the pilot's visual line-of-sight offers significant economic and societal benefits but presents unique challenges to the FAA's existing regulatory framework. The UAS BLVOS ARC, with members representing key industry, government and academic stakeholders, will recommend performance-based regulatory requirements that enable FAA to normalize safe, scalable, economically viable and environmentally advantageous UAS BVLOS operations in the National Air Space. North Carolina has been a leader in advancing UAS innovation as part of FAA's major national drone integration initiatives.

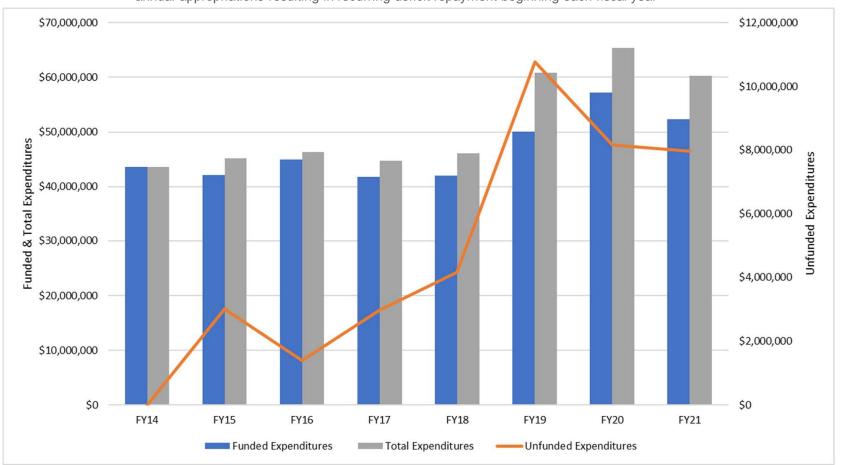

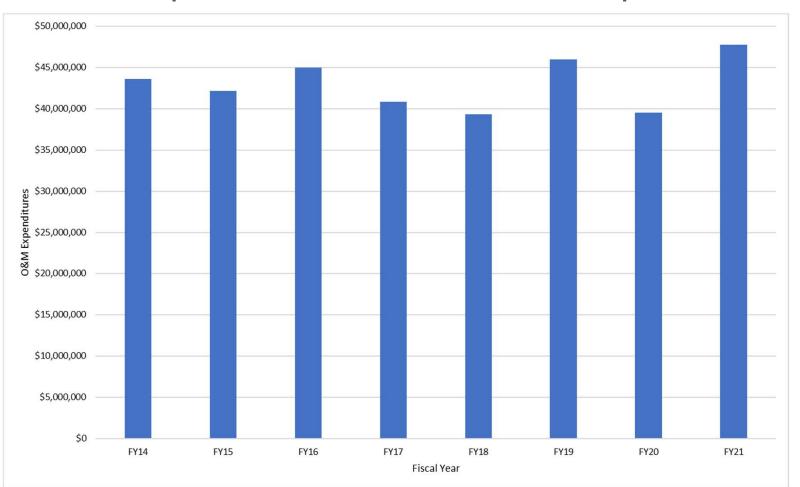

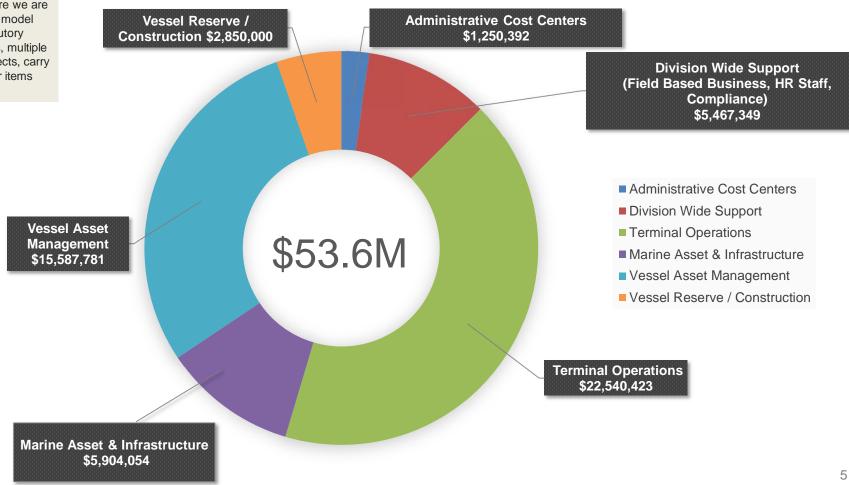
Historical Operations & Maintenance Expenditures

PROJECTS

Passenger Ferry Launch and Season 2021

- Passenger ferry was launched into the water on 11 May 2021 at the construction location in Swansboro, NC. The builder is working with the U.S. Coast Guard to finalize requirements for a Certificate of Inspection.
- The 2021 passenger ferry season started on 06/21/21. Sea Streak was again contracted to provide service between Hatteras and Ocracoke. This year's schedule includes three daily departures from each terminal for a total of six departures. The fare is \$5 each way or \$10 round trip with an additional \$1 charge for bicycles each way. Operators are following CDC and TSA COVID19 guidelines by requiring a face mask when in the indoor seating area.

Vessel construction projects

- Salvo- Dock and sea trials are slated for the end of July
- Avon- The contractor has committed to building a new hull (costs still to be determined). New steel is arriving on sit and being laid down after the contractor created a new jig for the hull. NCDOT has received initial comments from 3rd party review and will use these comments in the future. The current expected delivery is early 2022

Sloop's Channel

- The Ferry Division has received permits from Division of Coastal Management and Division of Water Resources. The US Army Corp of Engineers is still under a 30-day EPA review. All permits are expected by mid-July. Funding has not been identified for dredging activities.
- Due to the shoaling issues in Sloop's Channel the Ferry Division will be running a modified summer schedule beginning May 18. The schedule will expand from 52 to 60 daily departures instead of the 72 departures originally planned.

Nine-Foot Channel, Pamlico Sound

• The Ferry Division is implementing a feasibility study regarding the utilization of Nine-Foot Channel in lieu of Big Foot Slough for accessing Ocracoke at Silver Lake Harbor. It is believed to be a more stable route which will reduce service interruptions due to loss of navigability in Big Foot Slough.

Shoreside Infrastructure

- Ocracoke Comfort Center and Crew Dormitory damaged by Hurricane Dorian The NTP was issued two weeks ago and work has begun. It current estimate for completion is November 2021.
- Shipyard HVAC Refurbishments— This project has been awarded and is expected to begin in the next 7 10 days. Functional AC in the offices is expected to be in place by late July 2021. Full project completion expected by early September 2021.

Information Technology Projects

• Ferry Tracker is moving to testing phase. This program will provide a real-time map illustrating ferry movements and expected to link to the TIMS and DRIVE NC pages to illustrate route status which will prove very useful in times of emergency when route closure notifications are crucial.

Human Resources

• We currently have 415 on board with additional 90 temps and have 10 positions posted across the Division.

PROJECTS

- <u>CASSI Autonomous Shuttle</u> the CASSI Autonomous Shuttle completed its deployment at the Wright Brothers
 National Memorial last month. CASSI transported well over 3,000 passengers during the 3 months it was at the site.
 This was the first autonomous vehicle launched at a national park site in the country. It is remarkable to see the
 future of transportation technology showcased at the birthplace of flight. IMD is working with other municipalities on
 the next deployments of CASSI and will announce those locations soon.
- <u>Transportation to Vaccination Sites</u> In January, IMD and DHHS released \$2.5 Million in funding to North Carolina transit systems to provide trips to vaccination sites for those with transportation challenges. Communities throughout the state are implementing innovative solutions to respond to this pressing challenge. As of July 8, NC transit agencies reported traveling over 135,000 miles to provide nearly 17,000 trips to vaccine sites for nearly 11,000 people.
- Mobility for All Project in Northeast NC In June 2020, FTA awarded \$280,000 to NCDOT and the Inter-County Public Transportation Authority (ICPTA) for a pilot project in northeastern North Carolina to integrate an innovative trip scheduling software with NCCARE360 to improve healthcare access. The pilot covers five counties- Pasquotank, Perquimans, Camden, Chowan, and Currituck. ICPTA recently wrapped up software vendor procurement and selected Via, the same vendor providing a turnkey microtransit solution in Wilson. A key difference from Wilson's service model is that Via will install their software on ICPTA's existing vehicles, operated by ICPTA employees. In Wilson, Via provides the vehicles and independent contractor drivers. IMD anticipates similar outcomes to the Wilson project including shorter wait times and increased demand for public transit. However, given ICPTA's broad regional coverage over a five-county area, IMD is eager to see how the outcomes differ from Wilson's service which is restricted to Wilson city limits. This is a great opportunity to pilot on-demand microtransit in a very rural setting over a large geographic coverage area.
- Another Way to Get From Here to There Webinar Series In October 2020 IMD launched a new innovations webinar series, "Another Way to Get From Here to There." This series is an opportunity for IMD to showcase the projects, programs, and innovations they are working on, and to promote new technologies to a broad audience of state and local leaders. Recent events included a session in February about the Charlotte Gateway Station, discussion about transportation equity in April, and updates about the CASSI project in June. A transit technology showcase and update on the Wilson microtransit project is planned for August.

BUDGET UPDATES

- Processing of CARES Act eligible claims continues. FTA awarded an additional \$9.6 Million in CARES Funding
 for rural transit providers in March and an additional \$14 Million in CARES funding for intercity bus providers in
 April.
- IMD is collaborating with the North Carolina Public Transportation Authority (NCPTA) and a working group of transit systems to determine the optimal use of additional federal stimulus dollars for rural transit, provided in American Rescue Plan Act and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act.

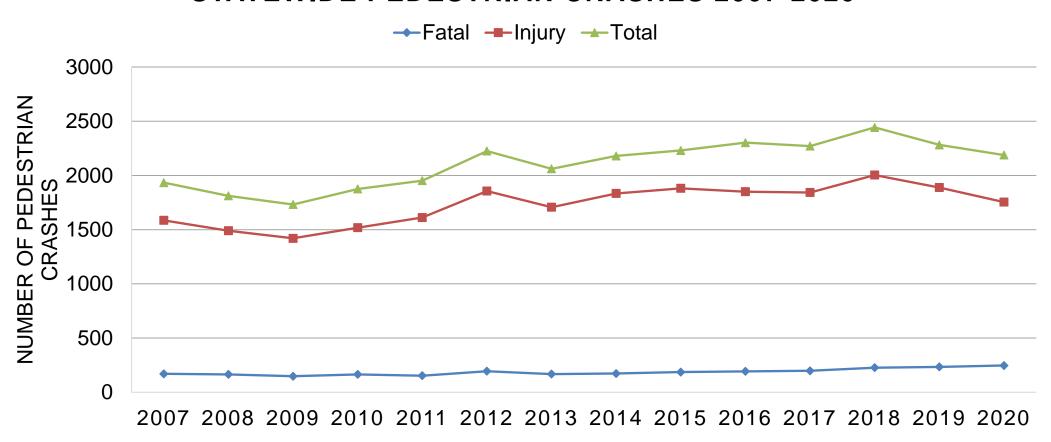

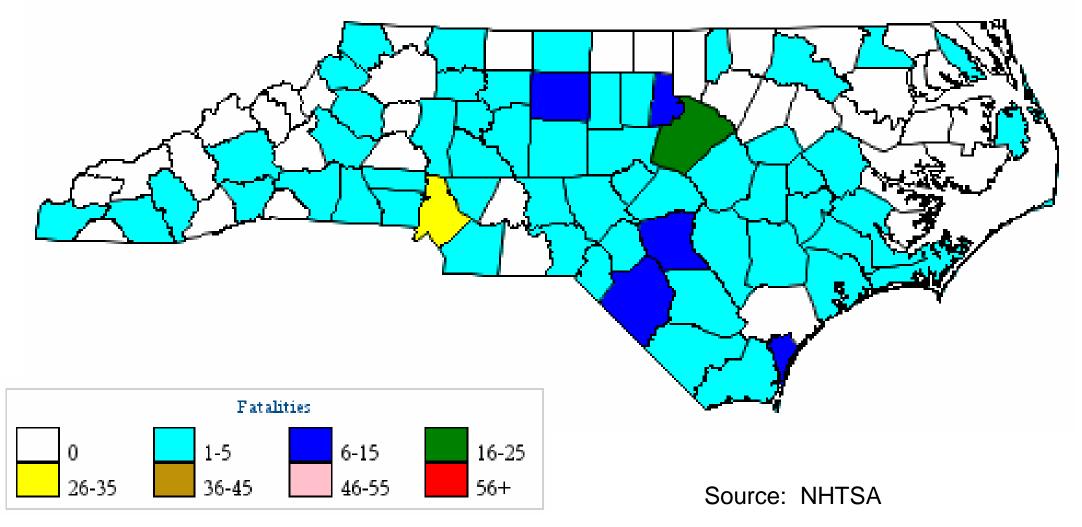

STATEWIDE PEDESTRIAN CRASHES 2007-2020

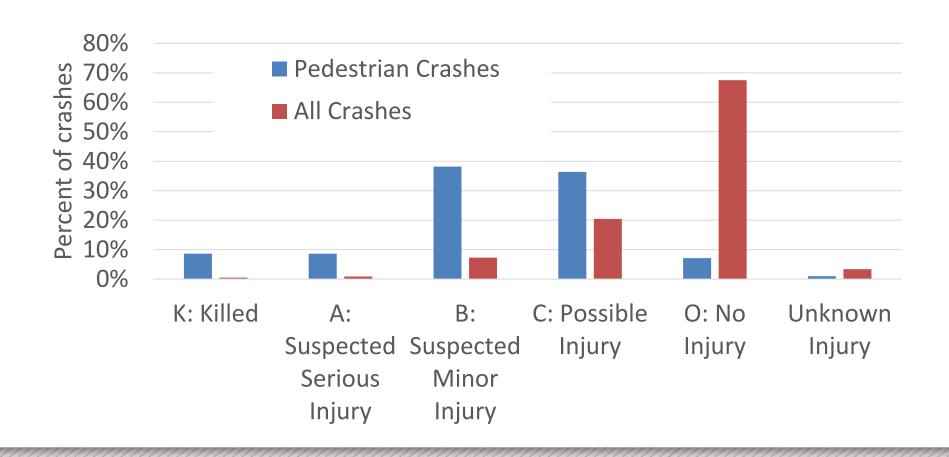


2019 Pedestrian Fatalities by County

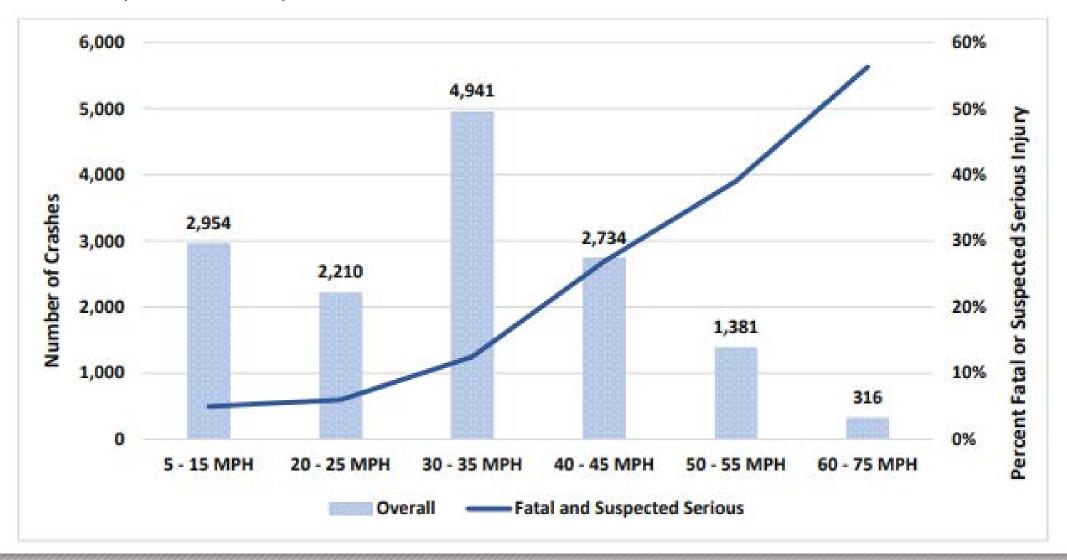

 Pedestrian crashes result in serious injuries and death much more often than an average crash.

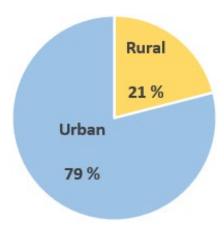


Pedestrian crashes and fatal and serious injuries by posted speed limited (2015-2019)

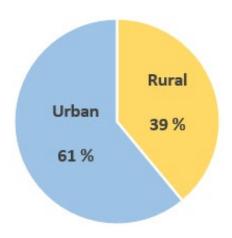


Pedestrian & Bike Crash Type Trends

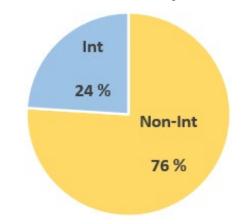
Pedestrian & Bike – All Crashes



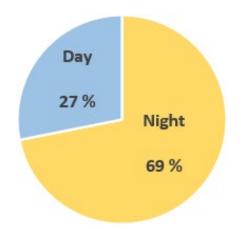
Pedestrian & Bike – Fatal and Serious Injuries

Ped/Bike - Day/Night — Fatal and Serious Injuries

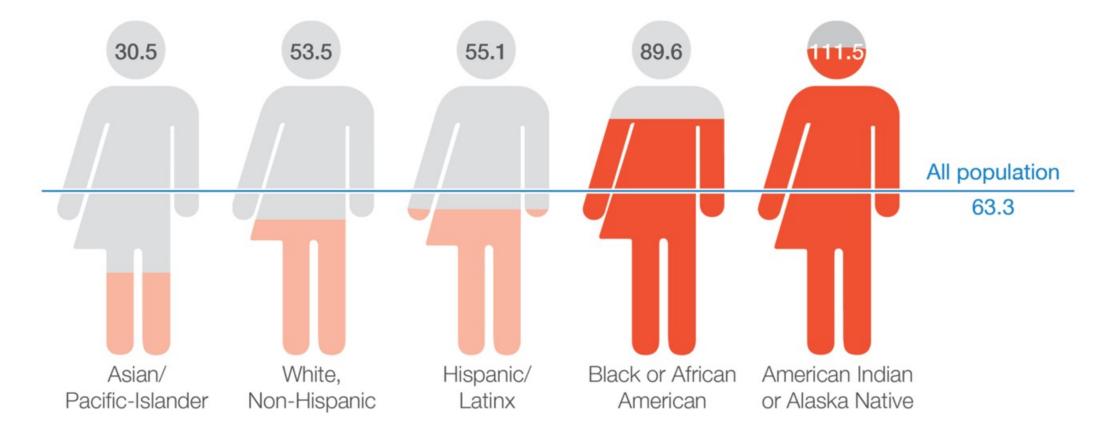

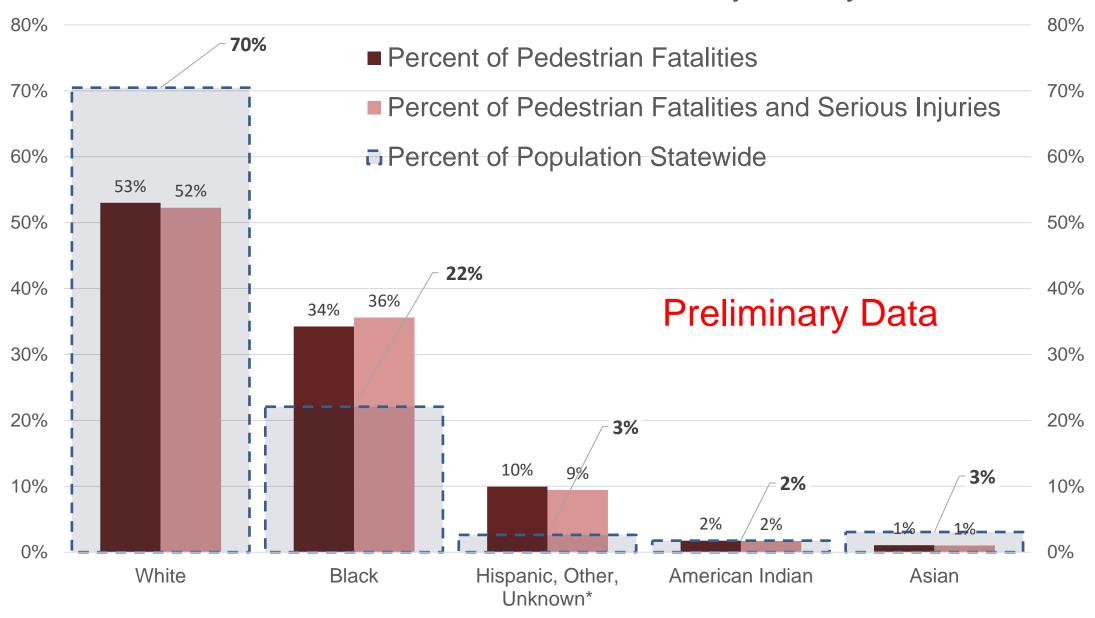

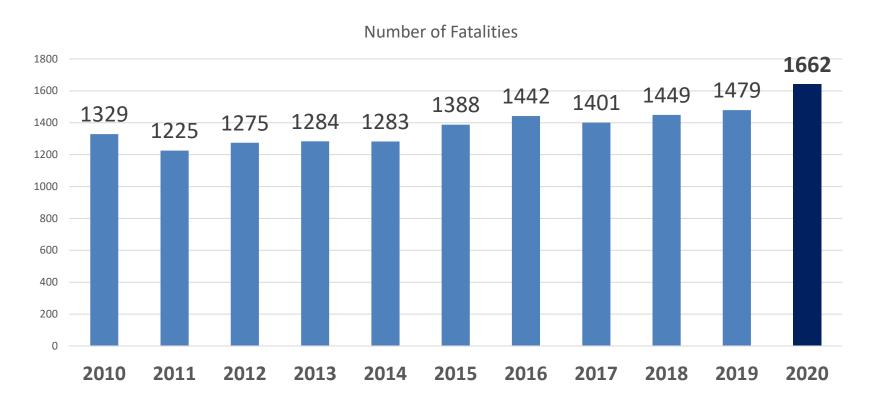


Pedestrian Fatalities and Serious Injuries by Race in NC



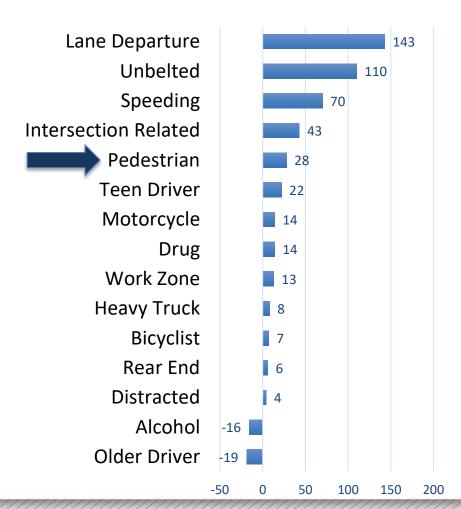

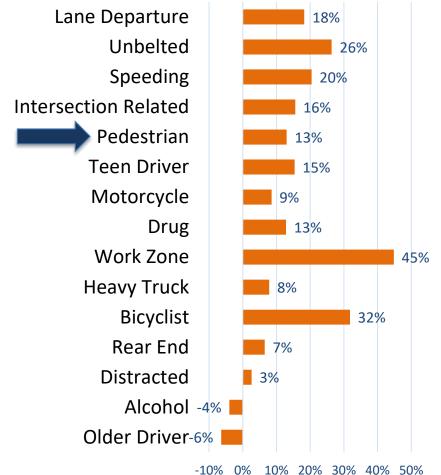


Fatalities by Crash Type

Change in frequency from "normal" (5 year average)



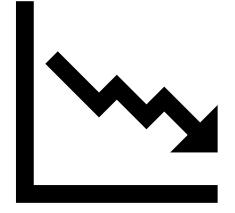
Change by percent from "normal" (5 year average)

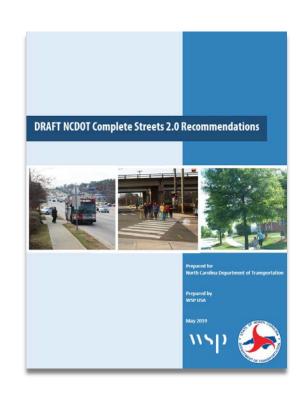

PROJECTS

Southeast Corridor (SEC)

NCDOT received an FY 20 Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) grant from the Federal Railroad Administration for the acquisition of the S-Line extending from Raleigh to Ridgeway, NC. FRA awarded \$47.5M to NCDOT, the largest award in the FY 20 program. The grant for acquisition of the corridor follows completion of the federal Environmental Impact Statement and Record of Decision for the route in 2017, positioning the S-line project for future federal funding opportunities. Virginia signed their transaction with CSX this year which includes the S-line down to NC. Acquisition process is ongoing and sets the stage for future incremental upgrades of the corridor that eventually will connect Raleigh to Petersburg as the missing link in support of the overall Southeast Corridor. Development of the corridor will connect communities, provide economic development opportunities, and provide significantly reduced passenger trip times for rail services extending from North Carolina to Virginia and the northeast.

Carolina Connector Intermodal (CCX)

Construction is targeted for completion by end of third quarter with opening of the facility in beginning of fourth quarter 2021.

CSX is finalizing their operations network changes associated with direct service between CCX and the Midwest including
destinations in Chicago, St. Louis, and connections to the western US. CSX indicates that the new facility will be the center of
domestic intermodal for CSX for the region and an important link to international markets. Marketing and development
coordination continues between CSX, Carolinas Gateway Partnership, NC Ports, and NCDOT.

Charlotte Gateway Station (CGS)

- Rail Division continues to lead the CGS Phase 1 including track, bridges, platforms, and concourse. Phase 1 completion is targeted for early 2023. Signal construction work has begun and track construction will begin over the next few months. All bridges are nearly complete.
- A developer team, Charlotte Gateway Partners, has been selected by the City for the Phase 2 that will build the station and surrounding large-scale, multi-story and multi-use development in Uptown Charlotte. Construction on Phase 2 is currently projected to begin in 2023.

New Rail Equipment Project - Piedmont Renewal and Investment in Modern Equipment (PRIME)

The PRIME (Piedmont Renewal and Investment in Modern Equipment) program, supported by \$157M in FRA grants, will replace and add capacity to the aging Piedmont service rail fleet. The project also makes improvements to the NCDOT Charlotte Rail Equipment Maintenance Facility that will allow the facility to be used as the future base of major maintenance operations for the new fleet. Rail Division is working with various stakeholders in the development of the program. An RFP is targeted to be released this summer to further the process to select an equipment vendor.
