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BOARD OF TRANSPORTATION MEETING

September 1-2, 2021

Chairman Fox stated that the Wednesday, September 1, 2021, and the Thursday, September 2, 2021, meetings are remote meetings and are being held in such way due to the current status of the COVID-19 pandemic. Chairman Fox stated that since the meeting is being fully conducted using Microsoft Teams the following protocol will be used:

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions.
- ensuring that the meeting minutes reflect that the meeting is a remote meeting.
- recording when members join or leave the remote meeting.

The Chairman reminded members that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business are deemed a public record. As always, the meeting was properly noticed, and a live stream was provided for members of the public to access the meeting.

Wednesday September 1, 2021

All committee reports are located at the end of this document.

Members of the Road, Bridge and Ferry Naming Committee attended their meeting at 10:00am. Topics included reviewing the submitted application for Officer Donald Ray Tucker Bridge, Mayor Andy Evans Bridge, Senator Kay Hagan Highway, Sergeant Jeffrey W Greene Bridge. A committee overview is located at the end of this document.

Members of the Finance Committee attended their meeting at 10:30 a.m. Topics included the Financial and Spend Plan Update by Stephanie King, CFO.

Full Board Work Session

Chairman Fox welcomed members to the meeting and thanked members of the Board for being present to handle business brought before them.

Chairman Fox stated this meeting is considered a virtual meeting with members participating via Microsoft Teams.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the work session of the Board of Transportation to order at 12:45p.m. on Wednesday, September 1, 2021, with the following members present in the virtual meeting: Chairman Fox, Vice-Chairman Perkins, Overholt, Zimmer, Mitchell, Hunt, Mathis, Tillman, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Tarleton, Lail, Wells, McGrady and Cody.

Board member Jordan and Clarke joined shortly after the call to order.

Board Members Taft, and Moran were absent.

Chairman Fox left the meeting at 1:26pm.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

Jason Schronce, Strategic Prioritization Office Manager, provided an update on the Strategic Prioritization (SPOT) P6.0 Workgroup to the Board. (Mr. Schronce's presentation is located at the end of this document.)

Mr. Schronce shared he would like to provide an update about P6.0 and the workgroup meeting held last month. He said he would share things that were discussed and the progress made toward the goal of developing the 2024-2033 STIP. Mr. Schronce mentioned he has come to the

last couple of board meetings and talked about the progress we're making on determining how much funding is available for P6.0 projects, and that the department was going through an exercise of updating cost on 450 projects over a 1,000 estimates of our committed projects to make sure that we were in line and as close as possible to how much funding would be available for projects. This ultimately led to the decision to halt the P6.0 process which was agreed upon at the last board meeting.

Mr. Schronce mentioned he would show an update where the department is on the next two slides. He mentioned to members of the Board that the slides should be very familiar. He stated, the first slide shows the committed and non-committed projects. This is every project that's currently in the STIP and how much over programmed each one of the twenty-two STI categories are currently. Mr. Schronce shared as of today we are 99% done with that exercise. He mentioned more importantly, if you will, are the committed projects and the current slide is what ultimately led to the decision to halt P.60 moving forward and working with the workgroup to determine a solution for developing the next STIP.

Mr. Schronce stated we are a little under \$3B over statewide and a little over \$3B if you total up all the regions and about \$800M from each of the divisions. He shared as presented previously, a few divisions are on that threshold of being at or above or under available funds. He shared all the buckets are close and wouldn't really allow us to add new projects next cycle. He mentioned the next slide he would like to show is new to the board and answers a question received throughout the process, if we do not change any of the inputs or try to solve this issue that we're currently working from, when would money be available in each of the categories? The cost shown today doesn't account for additional cost increases or revenue adjustments to our revenue or inflation adjustments to our revenue, either positively or negatively with the infrastructure bill and other things from the federal level, he said. When would each category have at least one year of revenue available to program new projects?

Mr. Schronce shared if we went into P7.0 with those constraints and data as of today, only about half of the divisions would have funds for new projects even if we ran P7.0 scoring. He directed member's attention to a diagram and stated you're looking at P8.0 prioritization, P9.0, and two or three STIPS from now to when most categories would have available funds to program new projects. Mr. Schronce stated when they met with the workgroup this past month one of the overall goals, was they would like to run P7.0 in a normal fashion and be able to fund new projects in all categories. He emphasized this was where the hard decisions are going to

have to be made about reducing the number of projects in each category in order to get us to that threshold.

Mr. Schronce updated about the workgroup meeting that was held on August 16, 2021. He shared the workgroup had a long list of discussions. They had an overall goal discussion that led to what he just mentioned that the members would like to find a solution that would allow for new projects in P7.0. As a workgroup, they received an update from the department about the federal infrastructure bill and received the same inflation slides members of the Board had viewed previously.

He shared they spent some time talking about the timeline of the next twelve to eighteen months and how we get to developing and releasing the draft 2033-2024 STIP. Mr. Schronce stated the majority of the time was allotted to what we're calling the "held harmless" projects. He shared this is a new term the board may not be familiar because it is a new working term. He stated the idea is that these are the committed projects that need to stay on schedule. They are committed to being delivered on time and on schedule, and these will be the first projects to get included in the next 2024-2033 STIP. Mr. Schronce stated they discussed what type of criteria should make up the "held harmless" list. He said the idea that we're looking to move forward with is to include projects that have grant funding, projects that we've already purchased right-away for, and projects that have a construction letting date between now and fiscal year 2026.

Mr. Schronce stated the workgroup spent time talking about the process to evaluate the remaining committed projects. He stated this will help figure which ones would also end up making the next STIP. He shared the key takeaways that they heard is there was general agreement that the next STIP will consist of a subset of those existing committed projects that are currently in the 2020-2029 STIP.

We did hear concerns from some members about how we remain competitive in grant discretionary spending. The new infrastructure bill being proposed at the federal level has more funding tied to grants and the discretionary funding. He shared the STI as a whole is not overly set up to address this, so we will want to continue the conversation and try to find appropriate solutions. He acknowledged there was some talk about needing direction on inflation sooner so that we can look at future revenue estimates. The process would be developed to look at committed projects in a more quantitative approach and aligns with the theme of the STI law, but it also remains flexible enough so that our local partners can give us guidance and go through a public engagement process.

Mr. Schronce presented the modified schedule that was shared with the workgroup and members of the Board. He mentioned the main thing started at line item five. He added this is working with our workgroup members between now and the end of the year to determine the "held harmless" project list, develop the methodology process on evaluating committed projects, and lay out what coordination is needed beyond that to develop the STIP. He shared line item six goes into the coordination between the MPO's, RPO's and Divisions. He shared that with help from the STIP unit and SPOT office over the beginning of 2022 they will be able to develop the STIP and look at those projects and figure out which ones need to be included. Mr. Schronce clarified that red dots are monthly updates to the Board to ensure the Board is kept informed and take any comments take back to the workgroup. Afterwards they will go through a process of programming the STIP and then the draft will be released to the board for vote. Next the MPO 's will take action to make sure their MTIPs align with the STIP. Next it would go back to the Board of Transportation for consideration of adoption around summer of 2023. Finally, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) will need to consider the STIP in fall of 2023.

At that time, the meeting was turned back over to Chairman Fox for discussion. Chairman Fox stated he would first start by saying the team accomplished a lot since the last meeting. Chairman Fox mentioned Mr. Schronce and his team are going in the right direction in which the Board would like to see them go in working with local communities. He mentioned the workgroup and other stakeholders that are involved will need to figure out the right solution. Chairman Fox stated he would like to shorten that timeframe for the 2024-2033 STIP. He stated people are looking at the department and are questioning what we are going to be able to build and fund in the next ten years. He asked if we needed the workgroup to meet more often or if we need to create a subcommittee of the Board to work with the workgroup to address issues. Chairman Fox stated he was happy to take whatever actions that we need to take in order to move this along. He shared he felt that he wasn't the only person that is made uncomfortable by the uncertainty in this process. He mentioned to Mr. Schronce he was probably at the top of the list of being uncomfortable with the uncertainty, but I know all of our local partners and our industry partners who were going to rely on to build these projects. Chairman Fox shared the sooner we can get some certainty back into our STIP on what it is going to look like, the better off everybody will be. Chairman Fox stated he would give Mr. Schronce a second to respond to that if you could.

Mr. Schronce shared that was great feedback and will definitely take that to the workgroup. He mentioned there's been some conversations internally that, the sooner we can release the STIP the better. Mr. Schronce stated if we need to address that at the next meeting we can. Mr.

Hopkins stated one of the problems we have now is we don't have all the information we need. While even though it would be a good idea to shorten the timeframe, we need to make sure that we know where we're going on the inflation conversation that came up during the Board's Finance Committee today. And it would also be good to know the revenue, assuming the infrastructure bill and the reauthorization bill passes at the federal level. All those things would influence us, and it gives us more time to fine tune the estimates that were recently completed.

Mr. Hopkins shared they have tasked all the divisions to go back and sharpen their pencils and look for opportunities to either reduce scope, adjust projects, whatever it may be, to improve that overall cost picture, and that takes time too. So even though Mr. Schronce is showing the calendar for the whole overall process, there's a lot of moving parts within that where we need information. Chairman Fox thanked Mr. Hopkins for this update. He shared he knows it's easy for him to sit and say go faster and he's not the one out actually having to get everything together. Chairman Fox clarified by saying, I wanted to let you guys know if you need resources to get this done faster, please talk to me and the Secretary because I think it is one of the major priorities of this Board to figure this out. Chairman Fox stated if we need to move some resources, get some additional resources for you, if the Board needs work harder, or if the Board needs to meet more often on this, then to please let me know. He emphasized the point by stating, don't let the Board's monthly meeting schedule hold anything up.

Chairman Fox stated Board members Rosenburgh and Lail had their hands up. Chairman Fox stated he would start with Board member Rosenburgh. Board member Rosenburgh stated the Chairman Fox made an excellent point about a subcommittee. He stated as he and the Chairman discussed, the communities are waiting for us to get the answers. He shared any schedule that goes another eighteen months is really going to impact the communities. Board member Rosenburgh stated, I think there's a lot to do here. I think this is probably the most important thing we will do as a Board, knowing that we don't have enough resources to build what our state would like us to build. I think to create a subcommittee is a wonderful idea to delve into this to work with the workgroup so we can speed this stuff and help them. He further provided if we engage earlier, it would be more productive. He shared he would support the Chairman in creating a subcommittee and would support a motion if needed. Chairman Fox thanked Board member Rosenburgh and stated he didn't think the Board would need a motion yet. Chairman Fox stated it is certainly the purview of the Chair to create subcommittees and he would consult with the Vice Chair as well as the Secretary and determine on how to move forward on that. Chairman Fox called Board member Lail next. Board member Lail stated he recognized that this is sort of an iterative process, but one question around this this idea of "hold harmless" could we end up with a situation where at the end of September we've got projects that have higher scores, but might not hit the list? Would that present a problem with that STI legislation? Chairman Fox stated he would start with the answer and Mr. Joey Hopkins, Deputy Chief of Planning may be able to come in with a little more technical detail. Chairman Fox stated the process itself does not necessarily automatically mean that the highest ranked projects get built first. For example, the highest ranked project may not be ready to be built as quickly because it doesn't have all the environmental permits, or the right-a-way is not as far along. So that's sort of the some of the soft side within the framework of the prioritization, the points and trying to get as close as possible to following the scores while understanding the reality of construction schedules. Mr. Joey Hopkins, Deputy Chief of Planning, stated the Chairman did a great job in explaining that to Board member Lail. He stated that's where he was going to start, but he was also going to give a little bit of background on part of the intent of the "hold harmless". He mentioned at the end of the day, we're tasked with delivering projects and we work with a multitude of different groups. He shared contractors, and suppliers will help do that, but one thing we don't want to do going through this process is we don't want to jeopardize any future delivery. He mentioned one of the main tenants behind the "hold harmless" list as we move forward through the first few years of the next STIP is that we communicate to the contract industry and to the material suppliers that we're committed to delivering the program so they can plan for that too. We don't want to get to a point when the draft STIP comes out in the final STIP in the year to follow that, we turned the whole thing on its head and we've had to restart programing and restart project development. We want to make sure that we've got projects in the hopper that we can continue to move forward with.

We are going to do everything we can to follow the intent of the STI law. Board member Lail thanked Mr. Hopkins and ask if the STICR committee would still be getting involved? Mr. Hopkins stated the short answer would be yes.

Chairman Fox stated he was thankful Board member Lail brought that up again because he thinks that is something that's a part of the solution of not only how we handle the issue of what this STIP looks like but also it is the Board's responsibility on setting policy going forward. He stated we want to work with the stakeholders of the workgroup to determine the appropriate relief valve. For example, does the current STICR policy have it right or does it need to be tweaked? Or does there need to be some other mechanism that everyone thinks is a good solution to the inevitable? Chairman Fox asked for other questions or comments for discussion on this topic. There were no further responses from any member. Chairman Fox thanked Mr. Schronce and Mr. Hopkins. (A copy of the presentation is provided at the end of this document)

Johanna Reese, Deputy Secretary provided a legislative update to the Board. Ms. Reese shared some updates on both the state and the federal level. She stated in the State Capitol, the budget is in conference discussions and all indications are they are going slower than everyone would like. She mentioned we thought we may see the conference budget roll out next week but that's looking less likely now. She shared there was some frustration all around on that, but the house did release its budget since the last Board meeting. She stated it contained most of what was in the Senate budget. It did add the content of several bills, and for DOT purposes to it, the two main bills that we are following include House 650 and House 165 but there were a number of other things added to it. Some of the new items in the House Bill that affects DOT is it increases the number of Board of Transportation members from two to three from each highway division. She clarified, this isn't increasing the total number of Transportation members but increasing the number that you can have from each highway division. The Budget reorganization piece that was in the Senate was also included in the House, but one difference is that it eliminates the field codes that the department uses, and this is something that we have opposed. The concern on that is how we track what we spend on some federal projects and on disaster projects on disaster work. This is language that was in the earlier version of the Senate budget, and we pushed back on it and got it changed. It appeared in the final version of the House budget, so we're working on that piece in conference also. The House budget transferred \$500M from the General Fund to the Highway Fund and split that up half and half in each fiscal year and appropriated that to several places. Specifically, \$87M in earmarks to transportation projects, and then \$99M on grants in aid to local governments. She shared this will be some pass-through money from DOT to local governments. It directed a \$140M to pothole patching, \$30M to bringing subdivision roads up to state standards, so that could be added to the state system and then increased general maintenance reserve \$76M in the first fiscal biennium year and that's a non-recurring amount and then a \$57M recurring amount out in the second year of the biennium.

Ms. Reese shared House 650 is one the bills that the content was added to the House budget, but that has passed, so we expect in the conference budget that language would come out. It is on the Governor 's desk for signature. This is the DMV Omnibus Bill. It is not an agency bill, but we did work fairly closely with the bill sponsor on several pieces of it and a couple of the changes since in the final version. She stated when they spoke last month was it did extend the date for teen drivers to have a permit for only six months instead of twelve months. That deadline was the end of this calendar year, and that's been extended another year to the end of

next calendar year and that's to help a number of teens who were delayed in getting their permits because of the pandemic. It will help them move ahead and get their driver licenses.

Ms. Reese shared there was language in the original version that transferred a number of the DMV hearings from DMV to the Office of Administrative Hearings, and they requested that be turned into a study and there are many be good reasons to do that, but it's a lot more complex than it seems on the surface. It did get turned into a study with the Office of Administrative Hearings. She shared House Bill 165 which is the agency bill has not moved in a while and likely will not move until the budget passes. She shared she was not sure if the language is current, but the version of the House budget will remain in the conference budget, or they will choose to move the bill itself. She stated as a reminder, a few of the items in the bill is it increases the number of public private partnerships that the department and the Turnpike authority can enter into it. The bill will make some revisions to the highway maintenance program, and it authorizes a number of DMV services to be electronic as opposed to paper. She stated they also hope to use that as a vehicle for some needs that have popped up that always happens during sessions

Moving on from the state to the federal level in Congress, the House has set itself a deadline of September 27th, 2021, to pass the infrastructure bill, and if that happens it will make funding available for the coming federal fiscal year starting on October 1st, 2021.

Ms. Reese shared North Carolina is estimating their portion in that Bill would be about little over \$10B. The House was able to pass the Senate budget resolution. This was partly because of the setting of the deadline of September 27th, 2021, to pass the infrastructure bill. There were some members who wanted to pass the infrastructure bill first, but that was a compromise is to set a deadline for the infrastructure bill, which meant they moved along with the overall budget resolution. The current schedule has got the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee working on debating on budget reconciliation on September 14, 2021. There's a schedule for each of the committees to do their debate, and in that committee there's \$41B that's directed to Transportation. The total amount is \$60M in that committee and about \$41B of that is directed towards Transportation, and this \$41B cannot be spent on anything that is already in the infrastructure bill, so they're working on a new double dipping. Ms. Reese stated that was her end of her report and she would be happy to take any questions. Chairman Fox thanked Ms. Reese for keeping up with it all the updated news and sharing it with the Board. He mentioned he knew there is not only a lot going on in Raleigh, but there's also a ton going on in

Washington, DC as well. Chairman Fox asked for questions or comments for Ms. Reese. There were no further responses from any member.

At 1:26pm Chairman Fox stated he would be leaving and turning the meeting over to Vice-Chair Perkins. He shared he had a conflict but wanted to remind members while they are listening to Mr. Hopkins presentation how important it is to attend the MPO and RPO meetings. He stated to members they are the voice of the department. He reminded members attendance is recorded for all Board meetings and MPO and RPO meetings.

Joey Hopkins, Deputy Chief of Planning provided a presentation on Board Role in Planning Organizations. He stated this was born out of a few different conversations between the department and the Board over the last few months. He supported Chairman Fox's comments about attendance at the meetings are very important. He shared the Board members are the department's voice but also a conduit between the MPO's and RPO's, Board, and the department. There is also conduit back to the department so we can better understand their desires and goals. Mr. Hopkins shared some of the MPO's and RPO 's have written into their bylaws, certain attendance requirements to be a voting member. He stated as an example, DCHC MPO has a rule. He stressed that attendance rules are in place to avoid members choosing to attend only when something important to their organization is on the table and/or a vote. Mr. Hopkins encouraged all members to dig into those bylaws. He shared the second part is there needs to continue to be a lot of conversation, especially as we talk about estimates and having to adjust the STIP. It is important people have an understanding of how difficult it's going to be as we move forward. It is incredibly important we continue working with the local governments and helping them understand the situation we're in and the steps that have to be taken to make the STIP balanced.

Mr. Hopkins shared he would be talking about the background on MPO's and RPO's and how they came to be, Board members role in it, and also Board members role in STI and prioritization. Mr. Hopkins shared a map that showed the geographical makeup of all the MPO's and RPO 's across the state as compared to the geographical makeup of our fourteen divisions. He mentioned there are 19 MPO 's and 18 RPO's, one division has three MPO's (Division 12) and one division has 3 RPO's (Division 1). Mr. Hopkins stated other divisions have anywhere from three MPO's or RPO's combined up to six MPO's and RPO 's, and many of the boundaries don't exactly coincide with NCDOT division boundaries. He shared some Board members,

depending on their responsibilities may have voting rights of up to six MPO's and RPO's and some may only have three depending on how things are divided out.

Mr. Hopkins shared an MPO is defined in federal law, and it's also recognized in General Statute and is an area that's defined by U.S. Census urban area. This is where you have over fifty thousand in population, and you also have some basic density like a thousand persons per square mile in that population area. He mentioned if an MPO area has a population greater than two hundred thousand, you're considered a Transportation management area. He shared those are MPO's that get federal funding directly to them through the department. He mentioned the department must make sure that they spend those federal funds like they're supposed to be spent. Since they do get that money directly and typically that's block grant funding and TAP or transportation alternatives funding. These funds are not subject to STI rules but are still accounted for through the division tier. He stated the governor of each state has the responsibility and authority to designate the MPO boundaries. In the state of North Carolina and that have been designated to our Secretary. He shared an RPO is defined in North Carolina General Statute and is a voluntary organization that plan transportation systems. They do advise us on rural transportation policy. He stated an RPO area is three to fifteen counties and have the same population requirements, at least fifty thousand. He shared you can't be in an MPO area and an RPO area together. The law defines that the RPO area has to be contiguous. Except there's an exception if the areas in the RPO touched the same MPO, they do not have to be contiguous.

Mr. Hopkins stated the RPO makeup is the county must be a member of the RPO or the portion of the county that's not in the MPO boundary, but not all municipalities in that area must be in an RPO. He shared we have roughly eight towns in the state that aren't members of the RPO and in those areas they typically defer to the county to make those local transportation decisions. He shared it's not that the small towns or cities don't want to be a member, but it's typically because they don't have the staff. They also don't have the funding to be able to participate in an RPO, but they're still interested in what the RPO does and how it can impact transportation planning.

Mr. Hopkins stated he wanted to go back to MPO's. He shared an MPO is tasked with carrying out a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process in cooperation with the state DOT. He shared this is really the foundational direction that requires us as a state DOT and MPO to work together. The Federal Highway Administration and our MPO partners often talk about the three C process, and that's where we basically cooperate to develop the different plans and programs in that RPO boundary. He shared the Unified Planning

Work program is an annual statement of work for the MPO's. It identifies planning priorities and activities and the timeframe on who's going to perform the work and where the funds come from. The Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP), Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), and Prioritization pertains to project rankings, submittal, local input point, methodology, local input, and point assignment. He shared interesting enough in the STI law we are directed to use the workgroup to develop improvements to prioritization and the local input point definition in the STI law defines rankings identified by division engineers, MPO's, and RPO's. He mentioned some of the other duties and is they have to carry out a proactive public involvement process.

Mr. Hopkins stated going back to the RPO. He shared an RPO assists in developing the comprehensive transportation plans or CTP 's. They provide a forum for public participation and transportation planning. They have all the same responsibilities as an MPO under the state law for STI and they're the conduit back to the local governments and local citizens for transportation related information.

Mr. Hopkins stated the diagram he was showing represents how the comprehensive transportation plan, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), and ultimately the STIP, are all kind of built off each other. He shared both the CTP and MTP represent a community consensus on the future of transportation system. They are mutually adopted and there is legal document between the state and the local area. The CTP's are defined under the state General Statute and the MTP's are defined under the U.S. code. He shared the two big differences in these two plans are the CTP is not fiscally constrained, so it's not tied to specific funding, and it looks further into the future, thirty plus years. It's a needs list or a wish list on things we would like to have happen or will not happen based on what we think it's going to be that far in the future. The MTP, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, is fiscally constrained, and what that means is you can make reasonable assumptions on what revenues would be in the future. State revenues, federal revenues, local revenues, and even private funding. He stated both of the plans are the basis of our future transportation improvements and the TIP and the STIP has to be consistent with those plans, and I say for the most part there may be some minor improvements or operational improvements in the STIP that aren't part of the MTP or CTP, but any major TIP project has to be in those plans before it can be in the STIP.

Mr. Hopkins stated as a Board member, you represent DOT on the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) or MPO Board. You act as a liaison between the MPO, RPO, and the department. You share our needs and priorities, provide any policy guidance from a DOT perspective to the MPO, RPO and you also provide guidance in advance, on the prioritization

process. He shared sometimes there's a lot of questions and confusion at the local level because they deal with so many different things other than transportation.

Mr. Hopkins shared during an MPO and RPO meeting, the Board member represents the department as a voting member responsible for approving the following CTP, MTP, and the project priority list used for prioritization submittal. The Metropolitan Transportation Improvement program is the local version of the STIP. The STIP covers the whole state, the MTIP covers the specific region you're talking about, and it is a requirement under federal law that the first four years of each one of these documents match. We have a ten-year STIP program. The feds only recognize and approve the first four years, and it is a requirement that the first four years of our STIP match the first four years in all the MTIP across the state.

More specifically, Mr. Hopkins shared detailed information on how the members of the Board are involved with prioritization. He shared as a member of the Board on the SPOT process, you know the expectation is that you provide guidance to the MPO's and RPO's to ensure that mandates are followed. Ultimately, the Board approves the scoring criteria, measures and weights based on or at least started with the workgroup 's recommendations. Then members help educate partners and stakeholders. He stated members participate in both the project submittal process and local inputs points procedure as an MPO member.

He shared members are part of helping to develop the draft project priority list that is submitted for prioritization; projects that would potentially be scored and considered for future funding. It's expected that we all promote the public outreach for the draft list of projects. All of this is in coordination with your divisions, division engineers, and ultimately as a MPO and RPO Board. They approve the project submittal list for all the transportation modes.

Mr. Hopkins stated typically any revisions to the methodology would come from the Transportation Coordinating Committees. They would submit that to the MPO and RPO Board for consideration and approval. Then you would think about local input point assignments. Public outreach for that methodology and assignment of points and coordination with the divisions on those assignments and priorities. He mentioned ultimately the STI law for the regional tier funding and the division tier funding, the more the divisions and MPO's and RPO's work together, the better chance you have of getting projects funded. If an MPO and a division both supported project and are willing to put the local points on it at the division tier, that's up to thirty additional points plus whatever quantitative score that project may have got in at the regional tier and up to an additional thirty points plus whatever quantitative points that project gets at the division tier.

He shared the Board members role is to release the draft STIP. He mentioned the tentative goal now is December next year but that subject to change. Board members will adopt the final STIP after the public outreach and coordination with the MPO's. Members will see different scope or description changes, cost increases, schedule changes across fiscal years as board agenda "item N". He shared the edits that are more than just administrative changes, show up as "item N" and it is a two-month process. The first month you see it for information purposes, and the second month you're asked to vote to approve the changes.

Mr. Hopkins stated other items in the agenda such as "item K" and "item M", are where you may see a lot of projects with amounts less than that \$2.5M and typically that you would see that during project initiation, or we may be setting up a small amount of funding just to get a project started or closeout. If you're covering some minor charges or just zeroing out the financial end of it. He shared with members if they look through the agenda you can see projects that don't meet that \$2.5M threshold and those are some of the reasons why. Mr. Hopkins stated that concludes his presentation and he would take any questions.

Vice-Chair Perkins thanked Mr. Hopkins for his very comprehensive overview. Vice-Chair Perkins asked for questions or comments for Mr. Hopkins? There were no further responses from any member.

Vice-Chair Perkins stated he would like to summarize this by saying that it's critically important for all the Board members to attend their MPO and RPO meetings. He shared Board member Mathis, Board member Rosenburgh and himself gave a presentation to their MPO's. He shared all were extremely appreciative of the fact that they had a heads up on where we were going in terms of the reviews and the impacts of the 450 projects and how much they were over budget for the coming several years. He mentioned it's extremely important to keep them ahead and give them a head up as much as possible so they can be able to make some really cogent decisions.

Vice-Chair Perkins shared the Governance team sent out save the dates for the holiday dinner schedule for later this year. He stated if any members have not received it then please let the Governance office know so they can resend them. Vice-Chair Perkins stated how excited he was be able to have the Board's annual holiday dinner again this year. He announced we will be returning to Margaux's, which is the venue the Board used in 2019. He mentioned transportation to and from will be provided.

Vice-Chair Perkins stated Chris Moore, Board Secretary, is still collecting contributions to the coffee fund this month. He asked members to please write a check to NCDOT Coffee Fund in the amount of \$125 and provide to Ms. Moore. He shared in addition to celebratory or sympathy occasions, the coffee fund covers many costs throughout the year.

Adjournment

There being no further business of the Board, Vice Chair Perkins adjourned the work session meeting.

The full board work session adjourned.

Thursday September 2, 2021, Official Board Meeting

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the meeting of the Board of Transportation to order at 9:02 a.m. on Thursday, September 2, 2021.

Chairman Fox welcomed members to the meeting and thanked members of the Board for being present to handle business brought before them.

Chairman Fox stated that since the meeting is being fully conducted using Microsoft Teams the following protocol will be used:

- implementing a roll call voting system for all actions.
- ensuring that the meeting minutes reflect that the meeting is a remote meeting.
- recording when members join or leave the remote meeting.

The Chairman reminded members that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of the public business are deemed a public record. As always, the meeting was properly noticed, and a live stream was provided for members of the public to access the meeting.

Chairman Fox stated he would do a quick roll call to account for the members present in the room.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Lail, Overholt, Tarleton, Clarke, Cody, Wells, and McGrady were present.

Board Members Moran, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that particular item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox shared, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict.

"To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today.

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

Approval – August 4-5, 2021 Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from the August 4-5, 2021, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the August 4-5, 2021, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Lathrop and a second by Board Member Clarke.

Chairman Fox shared that he will now conduct a roll call for the vote on the action item. He explained to members that he will call each board member by name, he stated when you hear your name, please respond to the action item up for consideration by saying either yes (or" aye") if you approve or no if you are opposed to the item.

Chairman Fox, Vice-Chair Perkins, Zimmer, Mitchell, Jordan, Hunt, Mathis, Lathrop, Rosenburgh, Lail, Overholt, Tarleton, Clarke, Cody, Wells, and McGrady all stated yes or aye on the motion.

Board Members Moran, Taft, and Tillman were absent.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Boyette welcomed members of the Board, staff, and those listening to the livestream.

COVID-19

Secretary Boyette shared details related to COVID-19 with members of the Board. He shared the recent surge of COVID has led to an increase in safety protocols. Secretary Boyette stated as of August 23rd NCDOT employees, contractors and guests are required to wear face coverings, regardless of vaccination status, in any indoor area of a state government office or facility controlled by the Department of Transportation. He acknowledged this week marked the start of the new policy requiring workers to either show proof they are fully vaccinated or be tested at least once a week for COVID. The department will continue to follow guidance from our state health officials. Secretary Boyette shared he was pleased to have good participation during an internal COVID-19 virtual town hall hosted on August 11th. The event gave employees an opportunity to have their questions answered by a health expert. Secretary Boyette thanked Dr. Charlene Wong, Chief Health Policy Officer, at the NCDHHS, for serving as our featured expert and helping people get reliable information.

Tropical Strom Fred

Secretary Boyette shared recent updates on Tropical Strom Fred with the members of the Board. He shared Tropical Storm Fred had major impacts on the lives of many people in our western counties. Heavy rains caused significant flooding, washing out several roads and bridges. He shared the department had about 60 road closures with this event. Secretary Boyette stated as of the beginning of the month, preliminary damage estimates associated with this event were \$21.8 million for FEMA eligible routes and \$4.8 million for FWHA eligible routes. He shared the height of our response, we had more than 560 employees in the western counties and 91 providing supplemental aid from other parts of the state working to get roads back up and running. Secretary Boyette stated he took a site tour in Haywood County, and it was indeed one of the hardest hit areas. Secretary Boyette thanked the crews for their incredible response and teamwork as our eastern divisions sent crews to the west in support.

DBE Meetings

Secretary Boyette updated the Board on the department's disadvantaged business outreach efforts (DBE) meetings. He stated members may recall in June the department hosted disadvantaged business outreach meetings across the state. The in-person meetings brought more than 180 representatives from disadvantaged businesses. Staff talked with them about how they can do business with the department. The department advertised and awarded hundreds of contracts for all kinds of projects each year; the Secretary shared often many small

and disadvantaged businesses may not be aware that these contracts exist or how they can compete to work with NCDOT. Secretary Boyette stated the outreach meetings are one way we've been able to help people grow their businesses and work with the department. He shared there was great turnout at the first round of meetings, we plan to build on that success and continue hosting every quarter. Secretary Boyette shared the second round of outreach meetings are taking place this month. Half of the divisions will host outreach events on September 11th and the other half will host them on September 25th.

Litter Update

Secretary Boyette detailed the department's litter collection efforts with the Board. Secretary Boyette shared crews, contractors and volunteers have now surpassed 9 million pounds of litter picked up from roadsides. He stated it is anticipated that at some point this fall we will break the 2019 record of 10.5 million pounds collected. This is excellent news and really the result of a lot of great work and great partners. Secretary Boyette asked that everyone help keep this momentum going. Secretary Boyette stated the fall sweep this year will be held in September from the 11th through the 25th. For more information or to sign up, visit ncdot.gov/littersweep.

ATLAS Award

Secretary Boyette shared details related to the ATLAS award with the Board. He stated ATLAS, our innovative, GIS-based modeling system, recently garnered some national recognition. He shared ATLAS stands for Advancing Transportation through Linkages, Automation and Screening. It is a user-friendly system that essentially helps us track and store project data and documents and uses GIS and automation to better evaluate projects and ultimately improve our project delivery process. Secretary Boyette stated project Atlas was recognized last month with an Exemplary Systems in Government Award from the Urban and Regional Information Systems Association as a Distinguished Enterprise System. He mentioned this award is one of only two selected in the nation. Secretary congratulated the Environmental Analysis Unit and partners who have helped develop this tool that will help us streamline and expedite the development and delivery of our projects.

Tulloss Bridge

Secretary Boyette shared an update on the Gus Tulloss Bridge with the Board. He shared he had a great honor earlier in the month to recognize one of our own former board members Gus Tulloss. Secretary Boyette mentioned he drove down to Rocky Mount to dedicate

the Sunset Avenue bridge over Wesleyan Boulevard to Gus Tulloss. He shared Mr. Tulloss served on this Board since 2008 until last year. He stated we all know Mr. Tulloss for his commitment to improving transportation, for promoting collaboration and innovation and for helping communities. Secretary Boyette shared Mr. Tulloss was recently appointed to the Ports Board and the department will continue to work with him. Secretary Boyette stated as Chairman Fox said at the event, Mr. Tulloss is the model of the kind of person you want representing your community. His community and our entire state have been fortunate to have someone so engaged and passionate about serving others.

Personnel Updates

Secretary Boyette shared updates on the personnel changes throughout the department with the Board. Secretary Boyette shared Mary Morton, Inspector General's, last day with the department would be October 1st. Secretary Boyette thanked Ms. Morton for her service and her commitment to the Office of Inspector General. Secretary Boyette shared he has asked Lonnetta Raynor to step in as Interim Inspector General starting September 3rd.

Carolina Coastal Railway Co. (CLNA)

This Agreement is a Master Agreement (MA) which details the terms and conditions by which the Department and CLNA shall perform improvements upon roads and streets located within the operating right of way owned by CLNA. The projects may include, but not be limited to, improvements to railroad at grade crossings, or to roads and streets encroaching into the railroad right of way. Project costs to the Department shall be determined on a project-by-project basis. Due to a change in ownership, this Master Agreement will supersede the previously executed Agreement. There is no cost to the Department for this Agreement.

North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 9291 The Agency will establish a funding mechanism named the North Carolina Rare Plant Conservation Fund (NCRPCF) which accepts contributions to be used for the conservation and recovery of plant species impacted by transportation projects. There is no contribution amount or limit defined in this Agreement. Contribution amounts from the Department will be determined based on content included in the formal or informal consultation documents prepared with the USFWS for applicable projects upon execution of this Agreement and continuing through 2031. Having a funding mechanism in place will provide another option for conservation measures during consultation with USFWS, streamlining project delivery.

Division 1

Chesapeake & Albemarle Railroad (CA) Norfolk Southern Railway Co. (NS) Camden County Currituck County Pasquotank County 80000.1.4.112 This Addendum Number 3 to the CA Master Rail Freight Assistance Agreement covers rail improvements to the CA railway corridor. The project will include bridge modernization with culvert installation, crosstie upgrades, along with ballast and surfacing on the CA mainline. As a condition of the award of funds, NS and the Department will enter into a Contingent Interest Agreement and Instrument of Indebtedness (CIA) to secure lien on the project assets for five (5) years. CA will be responsible for construction of the project. The total estimated cost to the Department is \$550,000.

NCSPA will be responsible for the construction of the project. The total estimated cost to the Department is \$470,000.

This Addendum Number 2 to the NCSPA Master Rail Freight Assistance Agreement covers the construction of rail improvements to the WTRY railway corridor. The project will replace on-dock rail and repair asphalt on Berth 2 at the Port of Wilmington on the WTRY corridor. NCSPA will be responsible for construction of the project. At the request of the Municipality, the Department shall include provisions in the construction contract for the contractor to adjust and/or relocate municipally-owned water and sewer lines. The Municipality shall reimburse the Department the entire cost of said utility work. The estimated reimbursement from the Municipality is \$40,480.

Road Naming Committee – Committee Chair Fox provided a summary of the committee's meeting topics that included the committee approving three bridge naming and one highway honorary designation requests to bring forward to the full board in October. The Senator Kay Hagan Highway, Officer Donald Ray Tucker Bridge, Mayor Andy Evans Bridge, and Sergeant Jeffrey W Greene Bridge.

Finance Committee – Committee Chair Lathrop provided a summary of the committee's meeting topic that included the Financial and Spend Plan Update. Stephanie King gave the Financial and Spend Plan Update. She shared Tropical Storm Fred estimated over \$26M and the department has requested FEMA and FHWA participation. Stephanie shared the GARVEE was completed in August and the Bond face amount of \$306M was received with an excellent interest rate of 1.526%. Stephanie mentioned construction spending is lower than expected as contractors are facing state-wide labor and material shortages. The Integrated Mobility Division ROAP, SMAP and Lynx Blue Line Extension cannot be funded until a budget is passed. She also mentioned for Maintenance and Operations, a large portion of the Mobility Modernization (\$39.9M) and Secondary Construction (\$8.5M) programs cannot be funded until a budget is passed. She shared July Revenues were within 1%, or \$5M, of forecast and expenditures were 22%, or \$128M, below forecast. The cash balance for July was \$2B and cash continues to hover around that amount. Stephanie shared in July of this year, \$61M was transfer from the Highway Fund to the Emergency Reserve in accordance with Session Law 2019-251.

Other Business

Chairman Fox reminded members of the next Board meeting is scheduled for October 6-7, 2021.

There being no further business of the Board, Chairman Fox accepted a motion from Board Member Lathrop, seconded by Board Member Cody to adjourn the meeting.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

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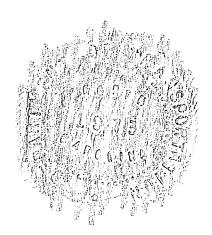

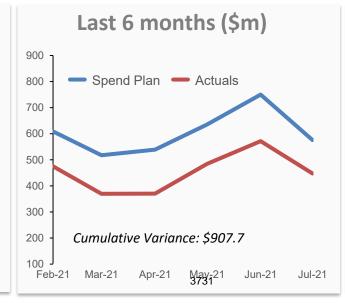




Revenue Commentary

- For the first month of Fiscal Year 2022 revenues are trending to plan, with some weakness in fuel tax revenue offset by licensing fees and strong motor vehicle sales
- Over the past six months total revenues have closely tracked total budget, with few COVIDrelated impacts
- However, there may be negative impacts on revenues as a result of the Delta variant, though no adjustment of projections is currently contemplated, and the situation will continue to be assessed





Expense Commentary

- Since the pause of construction spending in fiscal years 2020 and 2021, NCDOT's industry partners have been challenged to meet demand due to labor and material shortages as well as COVID impacts
- Management is currently engaging with its industry partners to understand their operational constraints which have hampered expenditures over the past several months
- Additional analysis is being performed to understand the drivers of the underspend, and if the Spend Plan will need to be adjusted

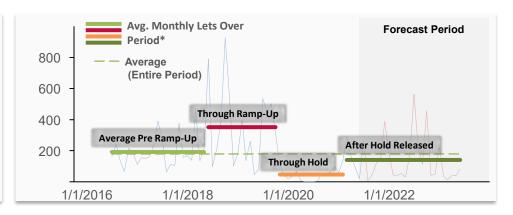




Total Projected Lets, FY22-23*

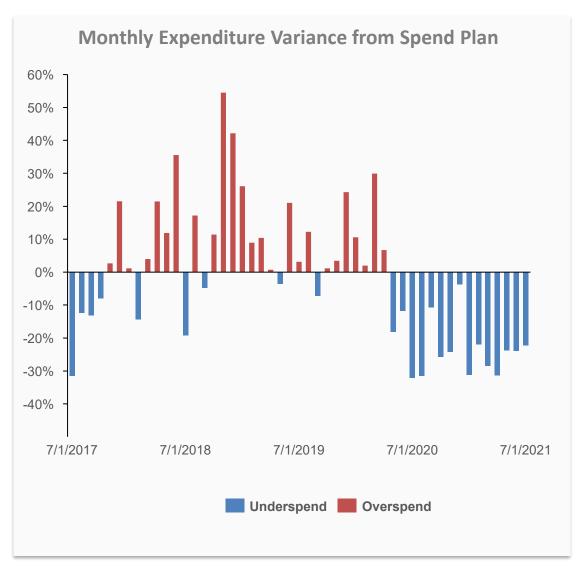

Commentary

- From May 2020 through July 2021 the Department's expenditures have been below its Spend Plan targets
- Approximately 18 months ago, the Department slowed the amount of contracts being let, which led NCDOT's industry partners to reduce staffing to match operations to a lower level of project activity
- In the past several months NCDOT has increased the number and dollar amount of contracts let, and the industry has struggled to keep pace with this level of activity given the aforementioned level of reductions
- The Industry's difficulty in supporting NCDOT's demands has been exacerbated by labor and material shortages*
- The Department is in the process of determining how these shortages will impact the Spend Plan going forward and the current modeling, relative to planned spend, does not consider reduced labor levels and material shortages

Detailed Report

Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$173.3 million in July 2020 to \$1,064.6 million in July 2021. An increase of \$891.3 million or 514.3%. This increase in cash was primarily due to increased motor fuel tax and license & fees revenues for the Highway Fund combined with decreased expenditures over the past year.
- **HF Revenues** Revenues decreased from \$270.3 million in July 2020 to \$207.5 million in July 2021. A decrease of \$62.8 million or 23.2%. This decrease was due to a \$59.8 million decrease in motor fuel tax revenues and a \$3.0 million decrease in license & fee revenues in July 2021 compared to July 2020. This decrease in revenues is due to DOT receiving approximately \$80M (split between HF and HTF) in 'catch up' revenues from DOR for amounts not collected in the late spring due to COVID in July of 2020, which caused July 2020 revenues to be inflated.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$260.6 million in July 2020 to \$951.0 million in July 2021. An increase of \$690.5 million or 265.0%. This increase in cash was primarily due to continued decreased expenditures and repayment of the advance from Highway Fund.
- HTF Revenues Revenues decreased from \$138.7 million in July 2020 to \$134.3 million in July 2021. A decrease of \$4.4 million or 3.2%. This decrease was due to a \$11.9 million decrease in motor fuel tax revenue that was somewhat offset by a \$7.0 million increase in highway use tax revenue and a \$0.5 million increase in fees revenue in July 2021 compared to July 2020. This decrease in revenues is due to DOT receiving approximately \$80M (split between HF and HTF) in 'catch up' revenues from DOR for amounts not collected in the late spring due to COVID in July of 2020, which caused July 2020 revenues to be inflated.

Key monthly action:

• On July 9, 2021, a \$100 million transfer was made from the Highway Fund to the Highway Trust Fund to repay the advance made on September 13, 2018, for \$100M made in accordance with N.C.G.S § 147-86.15. The outstanding balance of the advance after this payment was \$500.3 million.

Spend Plan Analysis - Revenue

Total Revenues, \$481 million, were 1% below the spend plan forecast, or \$5 million, but were 24%, or \$154.9 million, less than revenues for SFY 2021. This decrease in revenues is due to DOT receiving approximately \$80M (split between HF and HTF) in 'catch up' revenues from DOR for amounts not collected in the late spring due to COVID in July of 2020, which caused July 2020 revenues to be inflated.

- State Revenue, \$342 million, was 0.28%, or \$0.96 million, above forecasted revenue. Strong vehicle sales produced Highway Use Tax revenues 14.9% over projections. Motor fuel consumption was 4.8% lower than projected, leading to 4.8% lower motor fuel tax revenue. Minor DMV revenue loss from staggered registration and driver license revenues was offset by stronger than expected IRP revenues, leading to a loss of 1.8% over forecast.
- Federal Revenue, \$67 million, was 10%, or \$6 million, above the forecasted amount.
- Other Revenue, \$16.3 million, was 2%, or \$0.3 million, more than the forecasted amount. Major line items in this category are Federal Transit funding (\$3.3 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$4.4 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$932k), Non-System Street Reimbursement (\$5.3 million), Damage Claims (\$1.3 million), GHSP (\$678k), and LOGO Fees (\$291k).
- GARVEE Reimbursement, \$8 million, was 67%, or \$15 million, below the forecasted revenue.
- Build NC Reimbursement, \$49 million, was 27%, or \$10 million, above the forecasted revenue. The Department has received \$501 million of 2020 Build NC reimbursements from the trustee through July.

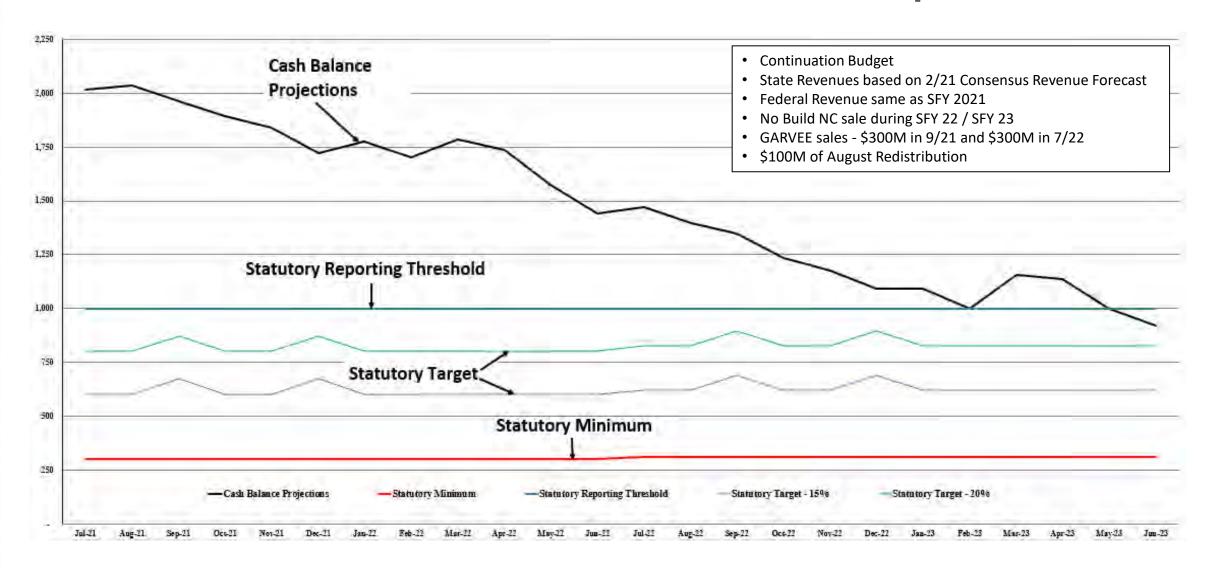

Spend Plan Analysis - Expenditures

Total Expenditures (\$448 million) were 22%, or \$128 million, below the spend plan forecast and 9%, or \$36 million, below the previous year totals.

- Total Construction Expenditures (\$210 million) were 29%, or \$85 million, below spend plan forecast. SFY 2021 expenditures were 17%, or \$44 million, less than SFY 2021 construction expenditures.
- Maintenance Expenditures for SFY 2022 (\$118 million) were 28% below the spend plan forecast, or \$46 million. SFY 2022 expenditures were 15%, or \$15 million, more than SFY 2021 maintenance expenditures.
- Total Modal Expenditures (\$25 million) were 40%, or \$17 million, below the spend plan forecast, but were 27%, or \$9 million, less than the previous SFY.
- Other Expenditures \$61 million was transferred from Reserves to the Emergency Reserve per SL2019-251.

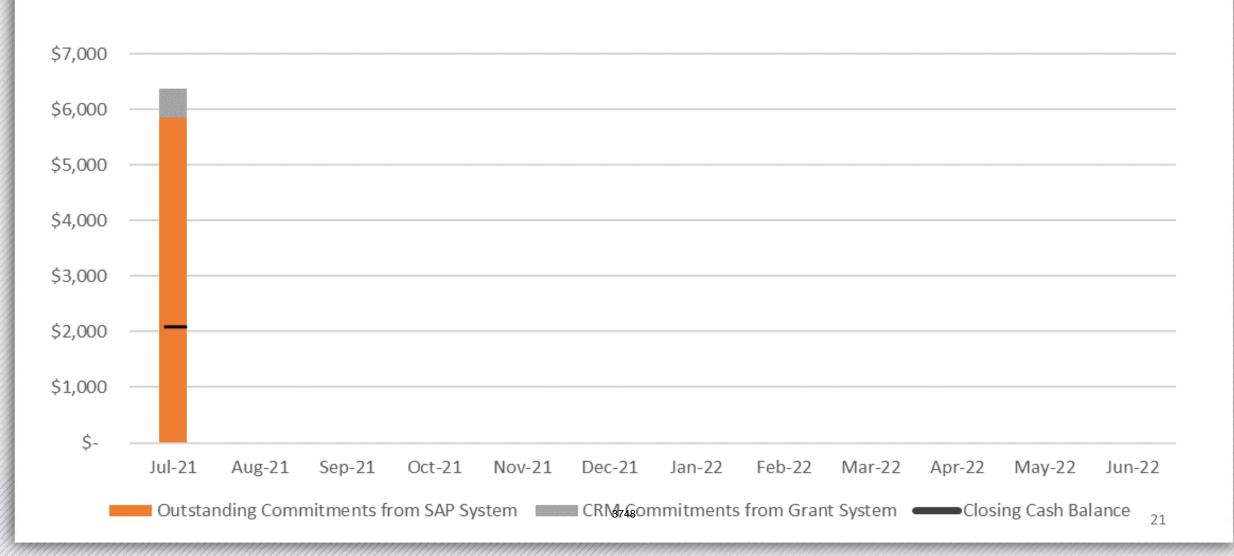




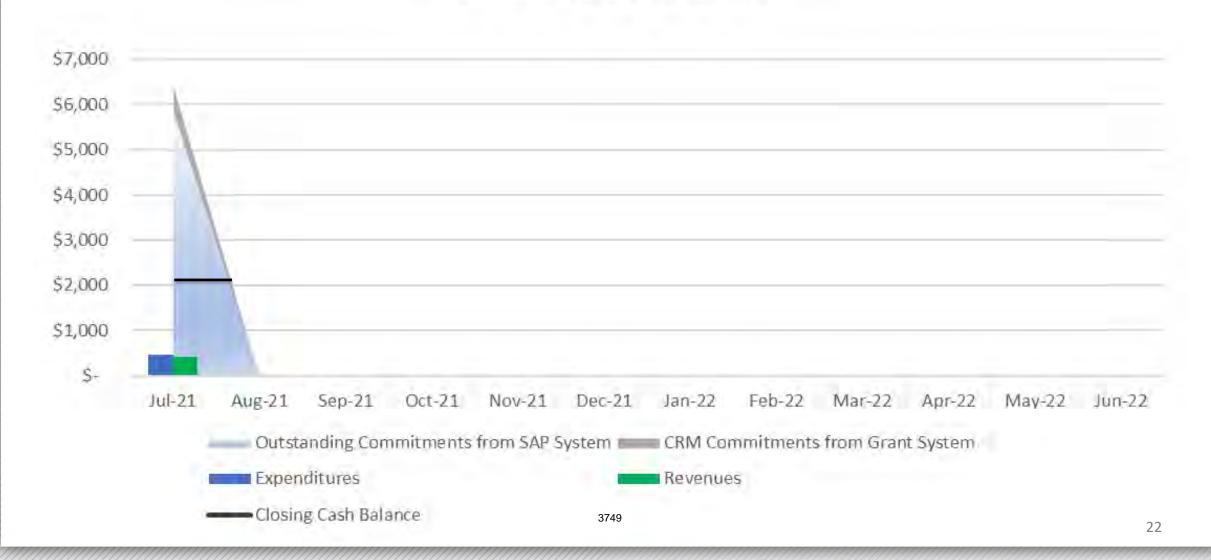
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by Month



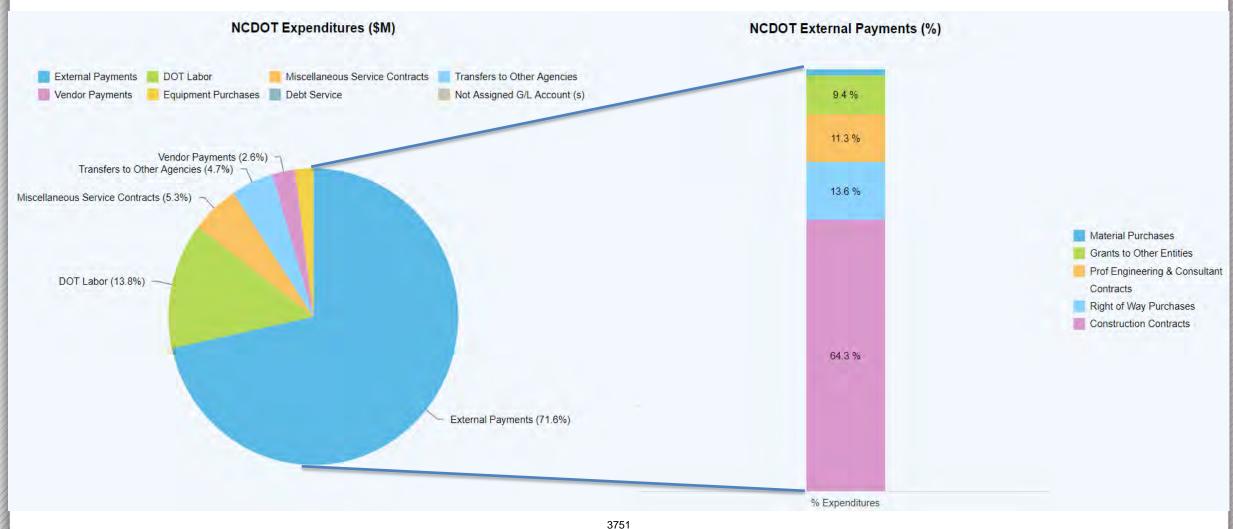
Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

July 2021 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For July 2021, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$1.92 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$603 million and \$803 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for July was \$2.0 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$301 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

- GARVEE Expenditures, Build NC Expenditures, TIP and STI -21% Variance (-\$57M). Construction projects are progressing slower than projected. Factors contributing to this are labor shortages and material availability (long lead times).
- Division of Mitigation Services (Formerly EEP) -185% Variance (-\$27M) and Strategic Transportation Initiative (STI) 16% Variance (\$10M).
 \$12.5M of expenses related to Mitigation Services has been transferred to STI WBS elements. The process has changed based on a work group analysis.

Maintenance & Operations -28% \$46M

- Spend Targets are based on an entire FY using the Continuation Budget. While
 detailed monthly spends are challenging to predict, all spending is monitored.
 Plans are being made for revised spend targets in anticipation of the approved
 certified budget, but projects cannot move forward until a Spend Plan
 Amendment is approved.
- Department Contract Programs (Contract Resurfacing, Pavement Preservation, Bridge Program) are forecast by a statistical modeling tool based on active projects. Programs are monitored and adjustments will be proposed as part of the quarterly amendment process.
- Labor shortages are having an impact on project spends. Some contractors are operating at 75% of normal levels because of difficulties hiring staff.

Modal Divisions – Spend Plans were built on the assumption of a certified budget

- Integrated Mobility Division -29% (-\$6M) Reduced expenditures due to delayed adoption of the state budget, delayed delivery of new vehicles due to COVID challenges and the slower than expected ramp back up of public transit given the Delta variant.
- Ferry Division -33% (-\$2M) Given proposed budget changes encapsulated in S105, the Division has restricted spending awaiting final budget approval.

Modal Divisions (continued) – Spend Plans were built on the assumption of a certified budget

- Rail Division -16% (-\$1M) Variance is related to federal spending. State spending is over forecast by \$320k.
- Aviation Division -60% (-\$4M) Airport construction projects are experiencing supply chain challenges.

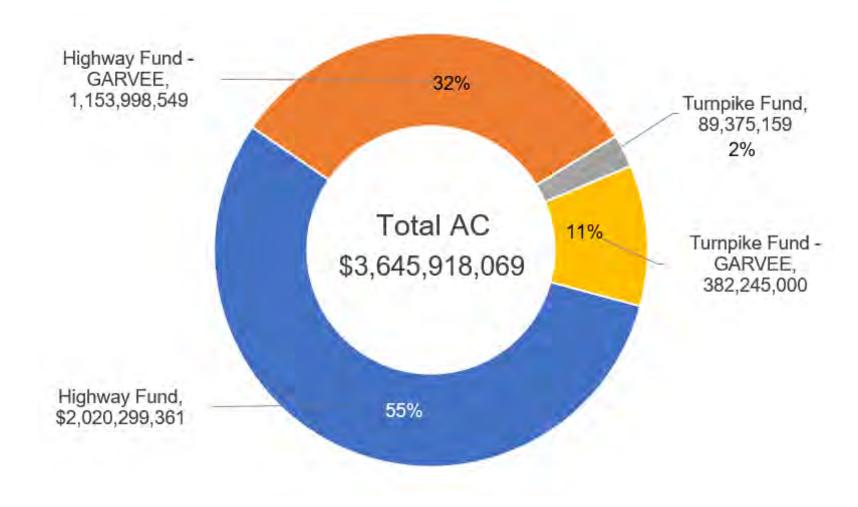

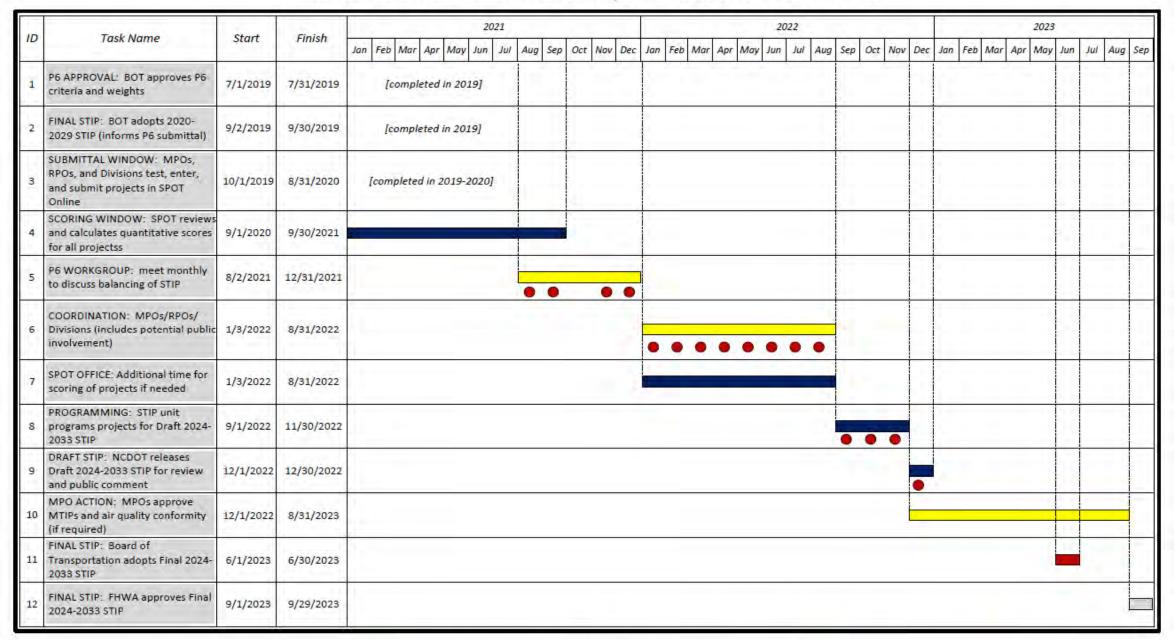

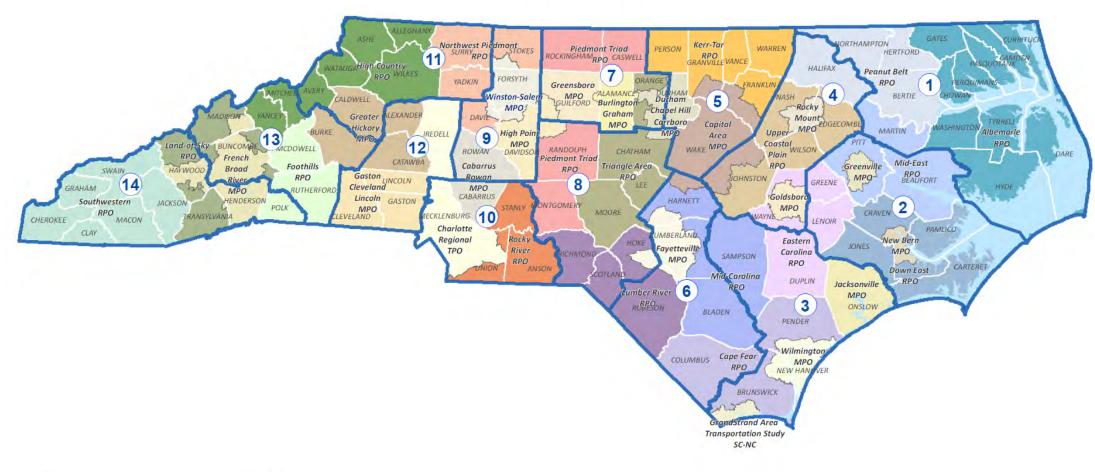

What is an MPO?

- Defined in federal law and recognized in NC General Statute 136-200, as: "An agency that is designated or redesignated by a memorandum of understanding as a Metropolitan Planning Organization in accordance with 23 U.S.C. §134"
- Defined by US Census for all urban areas over 50,000 in population
 - 50,000+ population: MPO
 - 200,000+ population: TMA (Transportation Management Area)
- Includes the central city and other areas that meet density criteria
- Planning area may be expanded beyond Census-defined "Urbanized Area Boundary (UZA)," but not be contracted
- Designated by NCDOT Secretary of Transportation on behalf of Governor

What is an RPO?

- An RPO, as defined in NC General Statue 136-210, is: "A voluntary organization of local officials formed through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to work cooperatively with the Department of Transportation to plan rural transportation systems and to advise the Department on rural transportation policy"
- According to NC General Statute 136-211 (b), an RPO shall include representatives:
 - From areas in three (3) to fifteen (15) counties, or
 - Have a population of at least 50,000.
 - Areas in an MPO shall not be in an RPO
 - The county must be a member of the RPO but not all municipalities in a proposed RPO must join the organization

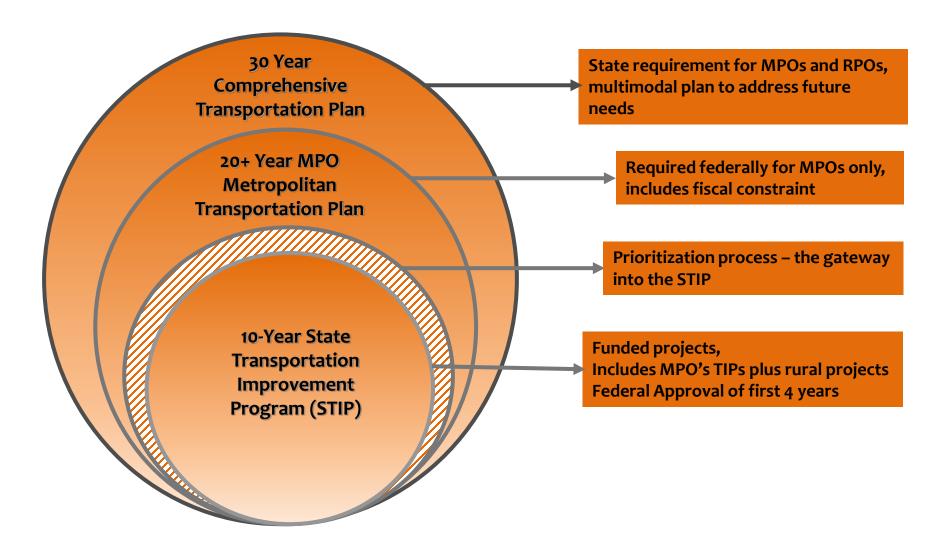
What are the Duties & Responsibilities an MPO?

- Carry out a Continuing, Cooperative and Comprehensive (3C) transportation planning process in cooperation with the State DOT and transit operators
- Cooperatively develop, update, and approve:
 - (Unified) Planning Work Program ((U)PWP)
 - Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) / Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP)
 - Prioritization Project Submittal
 - Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
 - Air Quality Conformity (if applicable)
- Determine responsibilities in concert with the State DOT and transit operators
- Carry out a proactive Public Involvement Process (PIP)

What are the Duties & Responsibilities of an RPO?

- Assist the Department in developing Comprehensive Transportation Plans (CTP)
- Provide a forum for public participation in the transportation planning and development process
- Develop and prioritize projects through prioritization based on Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) law for inclusion in the STIP
- Provide transportation related information to local governments and others

What is a disparity Study?

A disparity study is an objective research tool that determines whether a governmental agency has actively or passively discriminated against certain groups due to their race or gender.

Discrimination, which may be the current affects of past discrimination, is determined through quantitative (statistical) and qualitative (anecdotal) evidence, as well as an examination of current policies and procedures. The findings of the disparity study will result in recommendations by the study team to remedy any discrimination or disparities found. The recommendations, if accepted, are intended to be implemented as policy.

It should be noted that some of the data sources utilized for availability did not delineate whether Asian American owned firms were Subcontinent Asians, therefore those firms were all included in the Asian American owned firm category. This means the availability of Subcontinent Asian American owned firms could be understated which could account for their overutilization. If all Asian-American owned firms were counted together, there would be a statistically significant underutilization.





Disparity was examined using alternative availability methods (NCDOT prequalified firms, Hoovers/Dun & Bradstreet, and on smaller projects (<\$500,000 and <\$1 million) list approach).

With some exceptions, disparity was found using different availability measures.





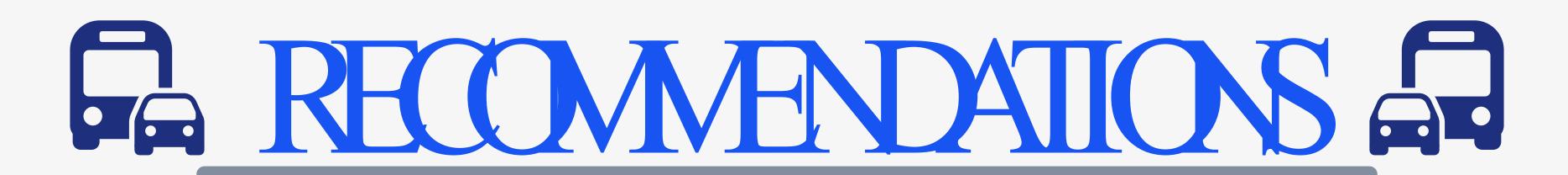


A regression analysis found that disparities by race, ethnicity, or gender status of the firm owners remained after controlling for capacity and other race and gender-neutral factors.

This statistical evidence found support in the anecdotal evidence of the experiences of firms in NCDOT's marketplace.

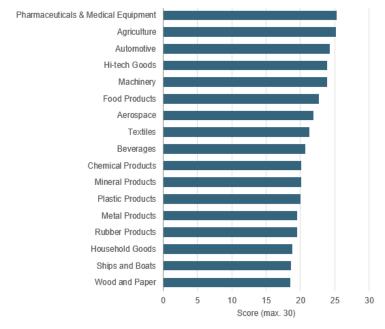

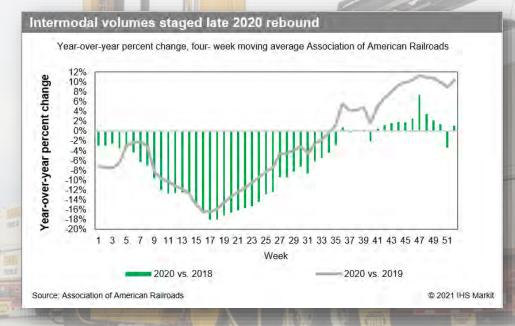
Supply Chain Sensitivity Index Selected Manufacturing Industries 2019

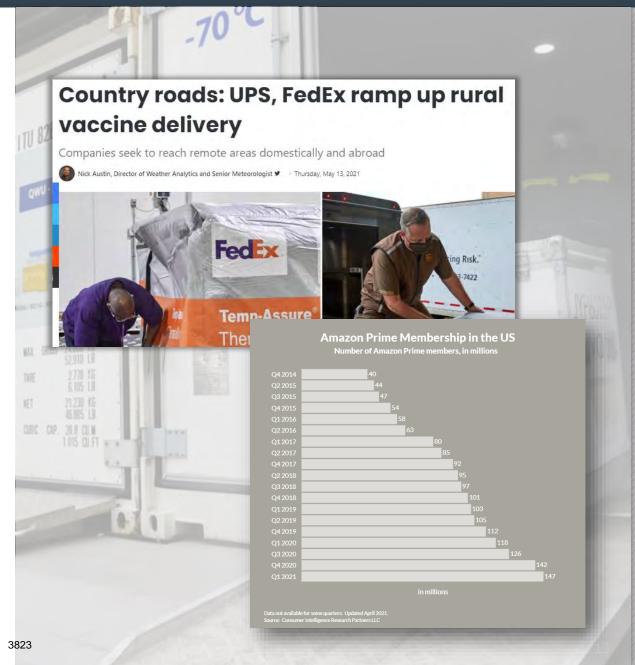

US ecommerce penetration

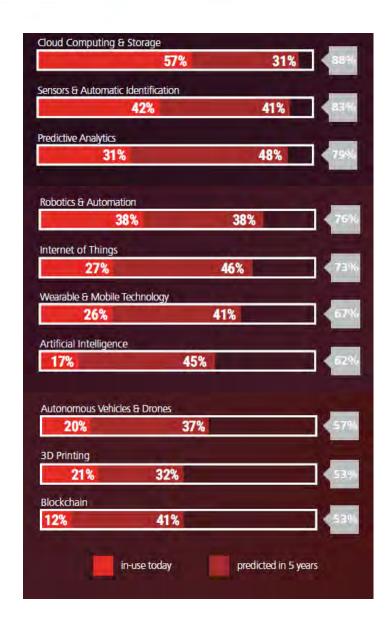

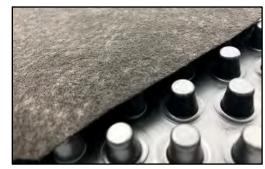
