Upon recommendation of the Manager of the Right of Way Unit, the Board has been requested to authorize the acquisition of the following properties through negotiation or condemnation for purposes of highway construction in order to prevent undue hardship on property owners or to protect the right of way corridor from development prior to regular project approval. The Board finds such acquisitions to be necessary, and hereby authorizes the Right of Way Branch to acquire said properties either by negotiation or by condemnation through the Office of the Attorney General.

On November 18, 2021, the General Assembly ratified Senate Bill 105, the Current Operations Appropriations Act of 2021. The bill was enacted as Session Law 2021-180 on the same day. In accordance with the appropriations act, staff recommends allocating an additional \$164,391,451 for General Maintenance Reserve, Roadside Environmental, Contract Resurfacing, Pavement Preservation, Bridge Program, and Bridge Preservation.

Thus far, in Fiscal Year 2022, the Board has approved \$1,783,213,609 in maintenance funds. A partial allocation of \$1,087,731,212 was approved on July 1, 2021, and a supplemental allocation of \$406,787,935 was approved on October 7, 2021. On November 4, 2021, the Board approved a second supplemental allocation of \$288,694,462 for Contract Resurfacing and Pavement Preservation.

The additional allocation of \$164,391,451 will increase the total maintenance funds for Fiscal Year 2022 to \$1,947,605,060.

It is recommended that funds within each of the above program categories be allocated in accordance with the figures detailed in Table 1 on Page S-2.

General Maintenance Reserve Emergencies was established in Fiscal Year 2021 for funding non-declared emergency events.

The Board previously approved \$93,731,212 for General Maintenance Reserve Emergencies as part of the July 1, 2021 allocation. \$60,000,000 was allocated to the Divisions based on a prorata share of five-year average Snow & Ice expenditures. \$33,731,212 was allocated at the state-wide level to fund Snow & Ice equipment purchases and unanticipated non-declared emergency operations, excluding Snow & Ice operations.

WHEREAS, Dean Smith was born in Emporia, Kan., and graduated from the University of Kansas, where he won an NCAA men's basketball championship in 1952 as a player; and

WHEREAS, Smith was the father to Sandy, Sharon, Scott, Kristen and Kelly and was married to Dr. Linnea Smith; and

WHEREAS, Smith was an assistant coach at the U.S. Air Force Academy and became assistant coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1958; and

WHEREAS, Smith was named head coach of the UNC Tar Heels in 1961 and held that position for 36 seasons until he retired from coaching in 1997; and

WHEREAS, Smith was head coach of the 1976 United States Olympic Team, which won a gold medal in the Montreal Summer Games; and

WHEREAS, Smith led the Tar Heels to NCAA championships in 1982 and 1993; 13 ACC Tournament titles; 17 regular-season ACC championships; and an NIT championship; and

WHEREAS, Smith retired as the winningest men's basketball coach in NCAA history with 879 victories; and

WHEREAS, Smith is UNC's all-time winningest men's basketball coach and the Tar Heels' home arena is officially named the Dean E. Smith Student Activities Center; and

WHEREAS, Smith was named one of the seven greatest coaches of the 20th Century by ESPN in 2000, along with Red Auerbach (Boston Celtics), Bear Bryant (University of Alabama Crimson Tide football), George Halas (Chicago Bears), Vince Lombardi (Green Bay Packers), John McGraw (MLB's New York Giants) and John Wooden (UCLA Bruins men's basketball); and

WHEREAS, Smith was awarded the Arthur Ashe Award for Courage, Sports Illustrated Sportsman of the Year, UNC's Mentor Award for Lifetime Achievement and numerous other prestigious honors and awards, including eight-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and four-time National Coach of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Smith is a member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, the FIBA Hall of Fame, the College Basketball Hall of Fame, the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame and the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, the United States Basketball Writers Association of America created the Dean Smith Award to honor a collegiate basketball coach who embodies the spirit and standards of Smith to be an agent of change beyond sport, and to influence and impact athletes, the campus community, those in need and the community at large; and

WHEREAS, Smith was awarded a Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Barack Obama in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Chapel Hill Council wishes to express its appreciation for the public services given and contributions made by Smith by supporting an honorary designation of a section of Interstate 40 for him.

WHEREAS, Roy Williams grew up in Asheville, N.C., graduated from T. C. Roberson High School in 1968, earned a bachelor's degree in education in 1972 and a master's degree in teaching in 1973 from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; and

WHEREAS, Williams has been married to Wanda Williams (UNC '72) for 48 years, is the father of Scott and Kimberly, and grandfather of Aiden, Court, Kayson and Kenzie; and

WHEREAS, Williams was head coach at Owen High School in Swannanoa, N.C., from 1973-78, assistant men's basketball coach at UNC from 1978-88, head coach at the University of Kansas from 1988-2003 and head coach at UNC from 2003-21; and

WHEREAS, Williams is the only men's basketball coach in NCAA history with 400 wins at two schools; and

WHEREAS, Williams was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007 and is an inductee into the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame and the College Basketball Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Williams led UNC to NCAA championships in 2005, 2009 and 2017 and is the only men's basketball coach in NCAA history to win three national championships at his alma mater; and

WHEREAS, Williams retired from coaching in 2021 as the No. 1 all-time coach in NCAA history with wins over teams ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press poll; No. 2 in NCAA Tournament wins and games and No. 1 seeds; No. 2 in 30-win seasons; No. 3 in wins by a Division I coach; No. 4 in NCAA championships; No. 4 in Final Four appearances; No. 5 in regular-season conference championships; and No. 6 in winning percentage; and

WHEREAS, Williams won his 900th career game in fewer games and fewer seasons than any coach in NCAA men's basketball history; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill officially named the playing court at the Dean E. Smith Center as the Roy Williams Court; and

WHEREAS, Roy and Wanda Williams were generous donors to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill while he was head coach, contributing to such programs as the Carolina Covenant, the Chancellor's Science Scholars, cancer research and athletic scholarships; and

WHEREAS, the Chapel Hill Town Council wishes to express its appreciation for the public services given and contributions made by Roy Williams by supporting an honorary designation of the section of Interstate 40 for him.

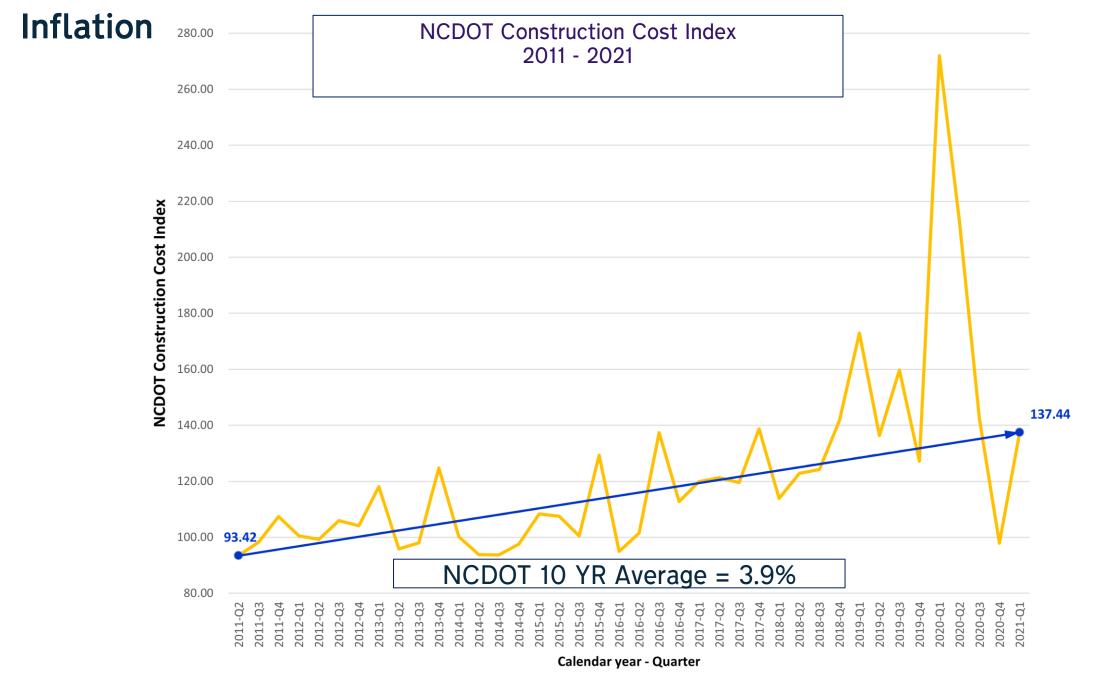

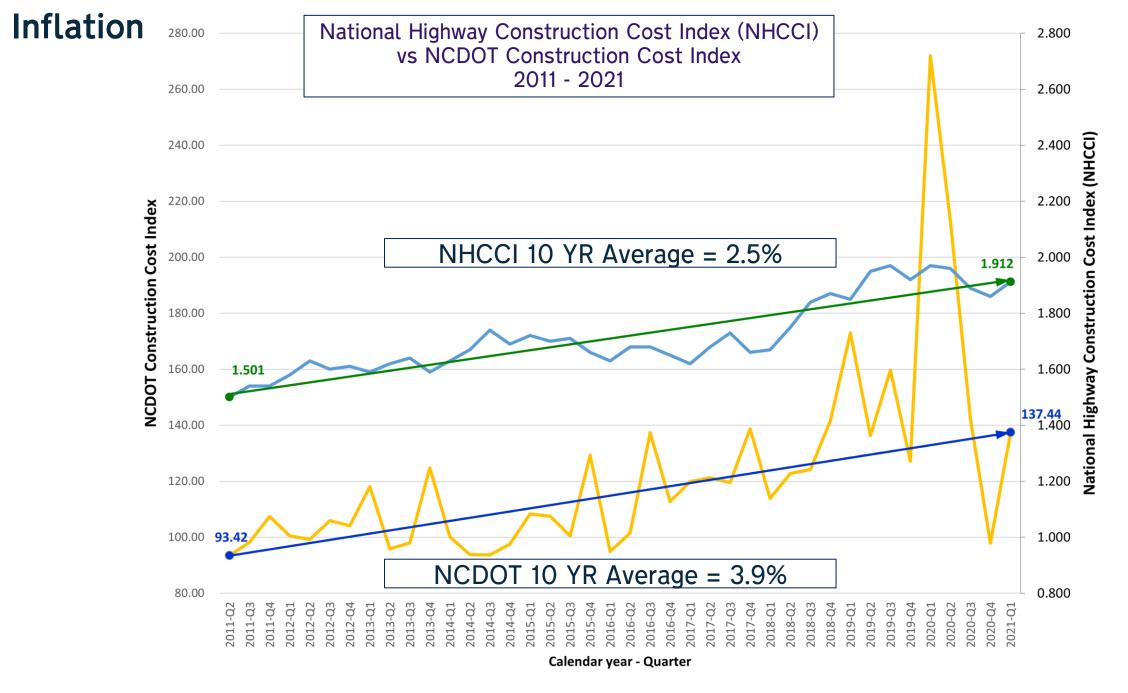

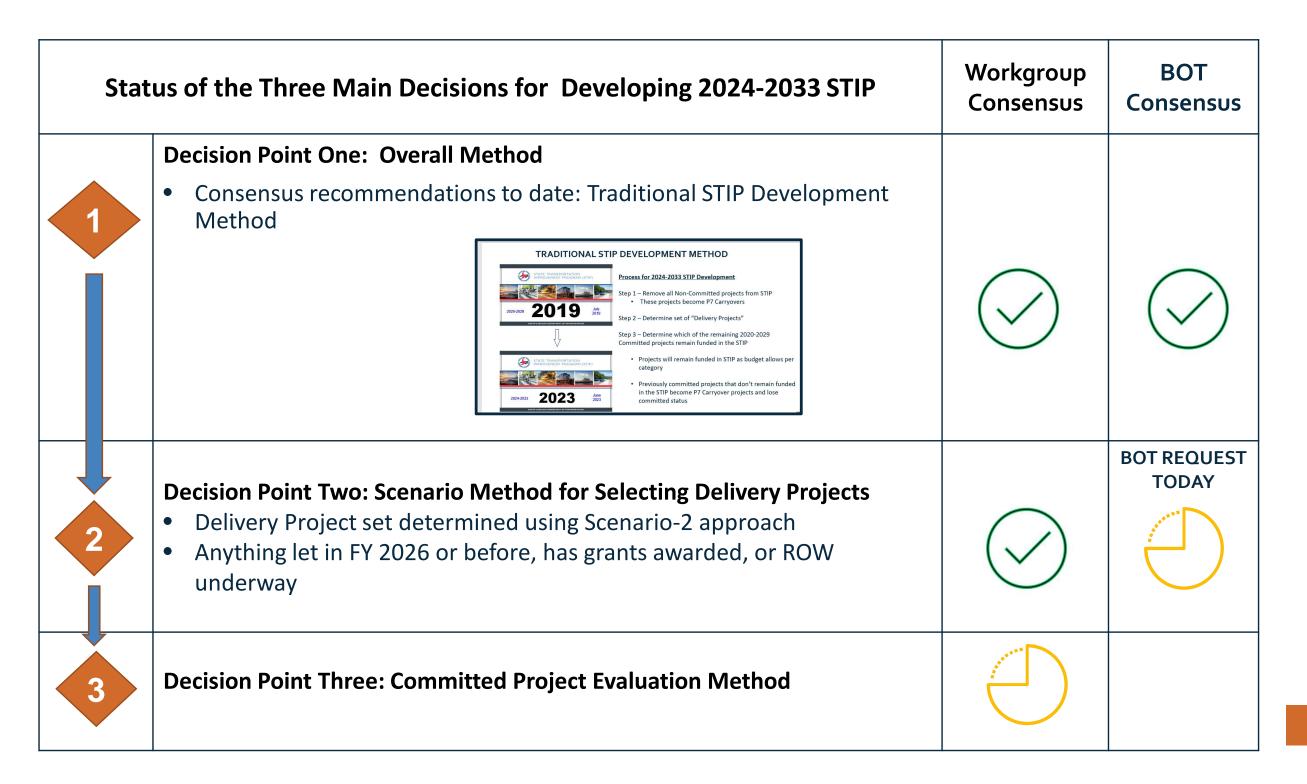

	Chairman Lathrop stated the meeting minutes were distributed prior to the meeting, and if there are no additions or corrections, the Chair would accept a motion that the minutes from the October 6, 2021, meeting be approved as submitted.
	Chair Lathrop asked for a motion to approve the October 6, 2021, meeting minutes.
ACTIONS TAKEN	Board member Zimmer made the motion to approve the minutes and Board member Taft provided the second.
	Chair Lathrop asked for a voice vote, and the October 6, 2021, minutes were approved unanimously.

2. Financial Update – Stephanie King, CFO

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King reported on The Fast Five. 1) Legislative - FHWA was not expected to implement cash management procedures as a result of external transfers into the Federal Highway Trust Fund and they will potentially readdress the issue in late spring/summer. Also, Congress passed legislation to extend surface transportation programs through December 3, 2021. Regarding the state budget, negotiations continue for passage of a State Certified Biennial Budget. Johanna Reese will provide more information in relation to the budget at the Board Working Session. 2) Advance Construction Report - DOT requested Mercator Advisors to prepare an analysis of DOT's Advance Construction Program. The Report was distributed to Board members last week. The key recommendation is to perform a FHWA Process Mapping exercise to identify key processes and decision points. DOT has requested FHWA to facilitate the exercise with a resource from their D.C. Office and planning is underway and hope to have a kickoff in

3. INTRODUCTION OF SPEND PLAN AMENDMENT 1 - Stephanie King, CFO				
ACTIONS TAKEN	NONE TAKEN			
	Mrs. King reported that even though a new budget had not been certified, an adjustment to the Spend Plan was being presented in November for consideration of a vote in December. Spend Plan targets would be decreased for areas that did not believe the cash would be needed in SFY 2022. She also reiterated the Continuation Budget did not allow over realized revenue from last year so there is some additional capacity that is needed in the Trust fund.			
	Mrs. King reported the closing cash balance at the end of September was \$2.092B. The Department started 27 new projects with bid amounts totaling \$306.2M and accepted 8 projects, with final payouts to the contractors of \$21.8M. With the project slowdown of the past couple of years, the amount to closeout projects will continue to be lower than normal.			
	Mrs. King reported that expenses continue to be less than forecast. She noted major drivers for this variance include the Modal (Aviation and Integrated Mobility) and Maintenance areas (Contract Resurfacing, Bridge Program, and Undeclared Disasters.) Overall monthly expenditures were up 14% from the prior year, which was largely driven by higher spending in Maintenance and Construction. She noted examples of economic factors, such as volatile commodity prices, supply chain impacts, material shortages, and labor availability that continue to impact DOT partners' ability to spend as projected.			
	Mrs. King reported that revenues continued to trend in line with the Approved Spend Plan. Overall state revenues were \$45M (13%) more in September than August and \$34M (3.2%) above the fiscal year to date Spend Plan. Motor Fuel Tax revenues came in greater September than in August by \$50M. NC Department of Revenue is investigating the increase and noted one factor as increased travel. The Highway Use Tax was \$1M more in September than August. In addition, uncertainty still surrounds extraneous factors which will require consistent monitoring.			
	November. Advance Construction presentations are scheduled for later in the Finance Committee Meeting. 3) Spend Plan Amendment - Board consideration on Spend Plan Amendment I is expected in early December. OSBM consideration of approval is underway. DOT is recommending a decrease in projected spending of \$263M for FY22 due to industry labor and material shortages and other adjustments. 4) Motor Fuel Tax - September Motor Fuel Tax revenues were higher than forecast. DOT is working with NC Department of Revenue to identify key variances and will report on findings. 5) Disaster Expenditures - SFY22 budget for snow, ice and undeclared disasters is \$93.7M based on 5-year historical average in this expense category. As of September 30, 2021, \$2.5m has been spent on undeclared disasters and \$125M has been set aside for natural disasters that require a Presidential declaration.			

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King introduced the SFY 2022 Spend Plan Amendment 1 for consideration of a vote in December. She reiterated there were market conditions that impacted cash spending of the Department. DOT business areas requested reductions for SFY 2022 spending based on current forecast trends. Those business areas include Contract Resurfacing, Pavement Preservation, Bridge Program, Bridge Preservation, Rail and

	Aviation. The total reduction in spend targets for these areas was \$263M as compared to the Original Spend Plan approved in July 2021. She noted the revised targets for Aviation and Rail reflect the revised forecast for the remainder of the fiscal year. Rail decreased their spending target from \$119M to \$106M, or \$13M. Aviation decreased their spending target from \$182M to \$145M, or \$37M. Business Unit Requests. For Maintenance/Operations spend targets were proposed to be reduce due to workforce and material supply chain issues being felt by the Department's external partners. The spend target for Contract Resurfacing is proposed to be decreased from \$631M to \$524M, or \$107M. For the Bridge Program a proposed reduction from \$330M to \$271M, or \$59M. For Pavement Preservation a proposed decrease from \$118M to \$83M, or \$35M. For Bridge Preservation Program a proposed decrease from \$84M to \$72M, or \$12M.
	Mrs. King summarized the changes between the Proposed Spend Plan Amendment and the Original Spend Plan approved in July 2021. Revenue for the proposed plan would be \$210M more than the approved plan, Construction expenditure forecasts would increase by \$23M based on revised project forecasts and variances in first quarter actuals compared to previous projections, Maintenance expenditures would be \$213M less than the approved spend plan based on requested reduction of program spend targets, Other Modes expenditures would be \$49M less than the approved plan based on requested reduction of program spend targets, and Other Expenditures would be \$12M less than the approved plan based on variances in first quarter actuals. She noted that spend targets will be adjusted again and presented for approval once a state budget is certified. The total expenditures for the proposed plan would be \$251M less than the approved plan and the net change in cash would be \$461M more.

4. ADVANCE CONSTRUCTION - Leigh Wing, PE, STIP Eastern Region Manager

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. Wing began with a review of the Advance Construction (AC) program. AC is an authorization technique that allows FHWA to authorize a project without obligating federal funds. FHWA approves a project as being eligible for federal funding but does not commit to funding the project. It is a technique and not a type of funds. She highlighted the advantages of using AC, which includes maintaining eligibility for future reimbursement without a commitment of current Budget Authority (BA) and Obligation Authority (OA), AC allows additional projects to be authorized; thereby accelerating project delivery and decreasing inflation costs, and AC allows the Department to utilize OA efficiently and helps the Department be more competitive nationally for August Redistribution (AR). She then compared traditional funding versus AC and provided an example of the two funding method types.
	Mrs. Wing reported on the Advance Construction Workgroup. She reminded the Board that Session Law 2020-91 required DOT to submit a report to the General Assembly about the use of AC. The AC Workgroup was formed in September 2020 to investigate AC usage and make any needed recommendations. The Workgroup developed the AC Policy, which was implemented in March 2021. The policy requires

	the Department to complete an analysis at the end of each Federal Fiscal Year on the current AC funding levels, the expected AC conversion for the next 2 FFYs, and the									
	expected new AC funding for the next 2 FFYs. Mrs. Wing reported on the two types of AC, GARVEE and non-GARVEE. GARVEE AC already has statutory limits in place and therefore the policy did not require any additional tests. The AC Policy addresses non-GARVEE AC, which requires 2 tests to ensure AC usage is monitored and used prudently. She noted federal funding used for GARVEE payments are subtracted prior to performing the tests so there is no double counting.									
	Mrs. Wing reported on the constraints for Non-GARVEE AC. The first constraint is to limit AC (by funding source) to 4 years of anticipated federal apportionments. The second constraint is to limit the amount of unreimbursed state funds (by funding source) on AC to 1 year of the anticipated federal apportionment. She reported the Department passed all tests for the year and provided the calculation example for the National Highway Performance Program. The tests are available on the AC Dashboard web site.									
5. Review of Advance Construction Use - Mercator Advisors, LLC - Bryan Grote and Max Inman										
	The Mercator team provided a high-level overview of their Review of AC Use Report. Mr. Inman began by describing the AC program and noted that the program has evolved over time legislatively to be a more useful tool for states. He informed the Board that all states use AC to some degree. He explained the difference in AC as compared to traditional federal funding. He also reiterated that AC is critically important to the states that issue GARVEE bonds.									
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Grote informed how the team evaluated risk. As states use AC for different reasons, they also have different tolerances for risk. He explained they evaluated the future federal funding risk and how reauthorization is less predictable in recent years. In addition, there is greater concerns about state and local matching of the larger federal funds, possibly more concerns about growing demands on construction labor and materials, and the solvency problem with the Federal Highway Trust Fund. They see future federal policy even less certain and funding levels even less predictable. He explained how this uncertainty is used to evaluate the risk and what the risk tolerance is for a state DOT.									
	Mr. Inman informed that NCDOT is the fourth largest user of AC amount the states. In their evaluation, they did not see any problems with the way the program has been managed and converting projects for reimbursements. He reiterated that there is no best practices for running an AC program. It depends on several things and is unique to each state. He explained that they did not make any recommendations for NCDOT to change their AC program, but there could be increased risk because of the uncertainty at the federal level.									
	Mr. Grote explained their recommendation is for the Department to ask FHWA to facilitate a process mapping workshop. There is a trade off between the benefits of flexibility of using AC with greater complexity and administration of the program.

	State should occasionally reevaluate the factors, especially with the federal funding uncertainty. The Report recommends there should be better documentation of procedures and responsibilities that would benefit the Department internally. He also stated there could be opportunities to streamline some of the processes. In addition, reassess the risk factors and maybe that would entail a new balance between flexibility and complexity.

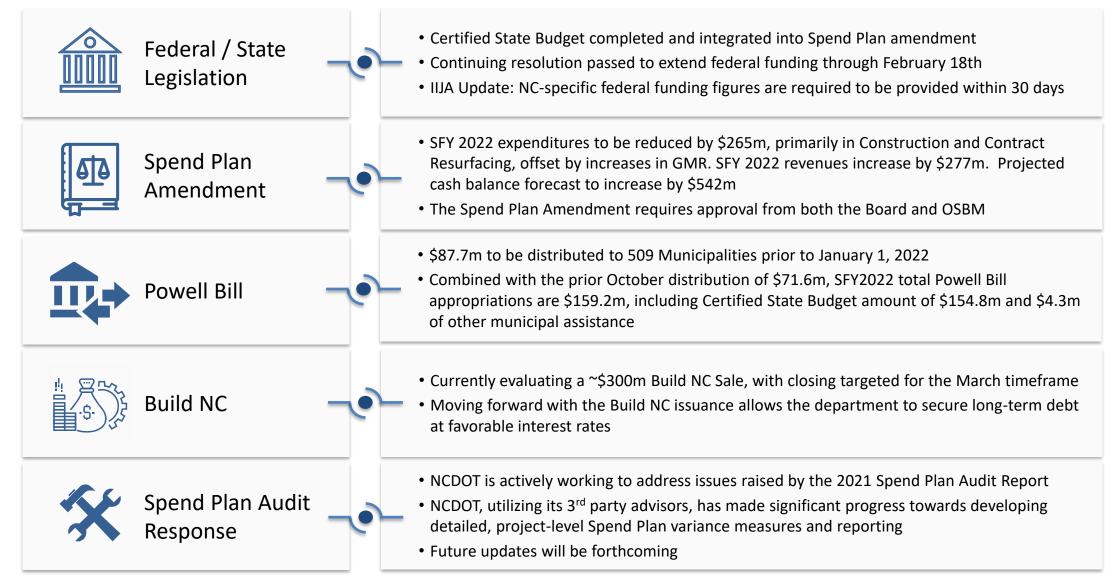

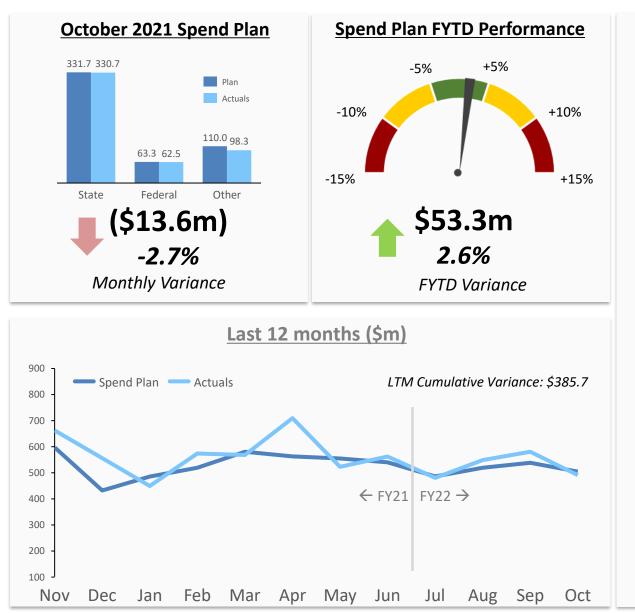

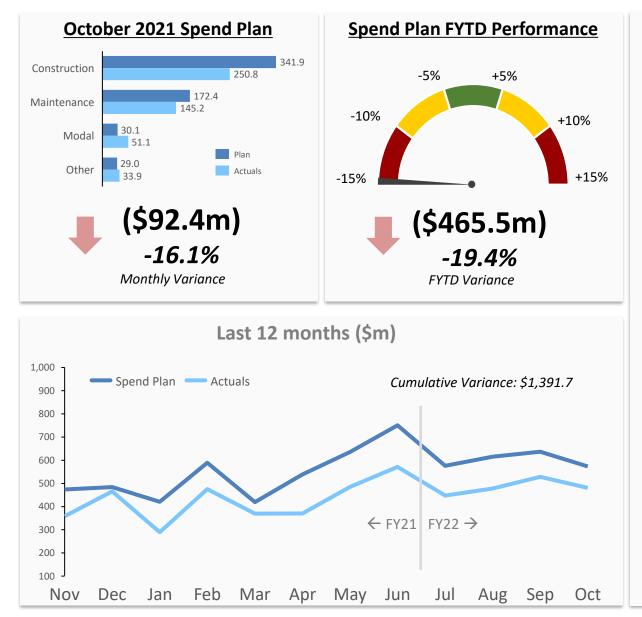

Revenue Commentary

- Revenues continue to align with Approved Spend Plan
- Minor negative variance has partially offset positive variances from months of August and September
- FYTD positive variances primary comprised of Highway Trust Fund, GARVEE, and FHWA Federal Aid, which are offset by negative variances in InfaGrant and Other Revenues
- The last 12 month variance of \$385.7m is 6.1% of total forecasted revenues for that period (Nov. 2020 – Oct. 2021, \$6.3b)
- A Spend Plan amendment has been submitted for approval, which will increase total SFY 2022 revenues by \$277m

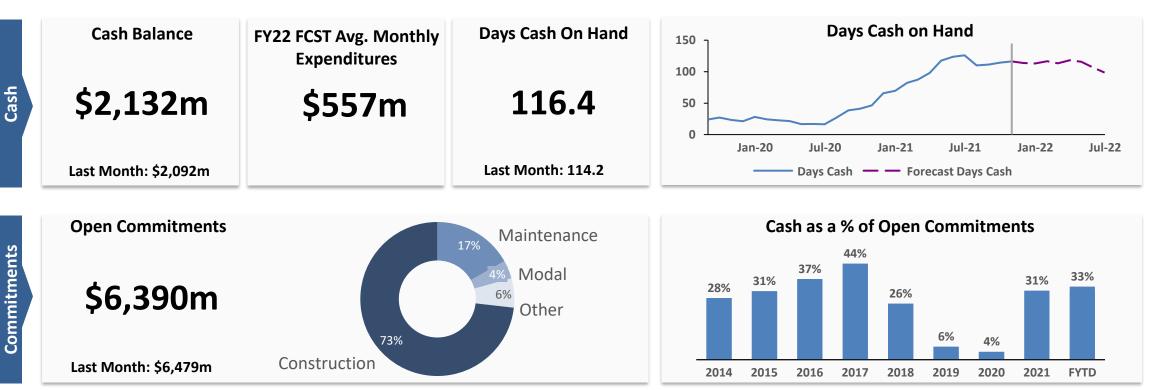

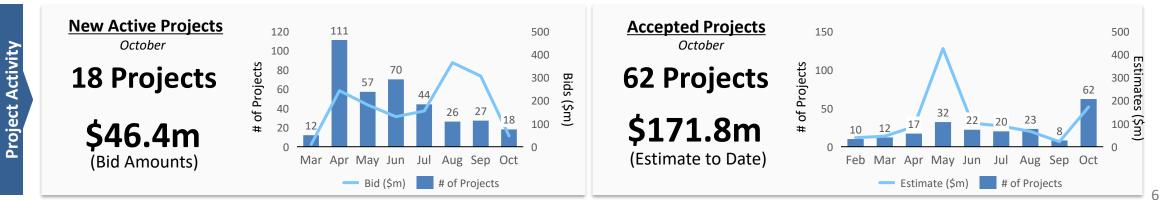


Expense Commentary

- Macro-economic constraints continue to limit the capacity of industry partners to execute on approved projects
- The Spend Plan amendment currently under consideration reduces total SFY 2022 forecast spending by \$265m
- Total monthly expenditures were 16.1% lower than Spend Plan - the lowest monthly variance to Spend Plan this fiscal year
- Modal spending slightly exceeded Spend Plan in the current month, offsetting prior month underspend. FYTD Modal variance is currently 29% below spend plan, due to similar constraints as noted above
- NCDOT is working with 3rd party advisors to develop detailed, project-level variance insights

Detailed Report

Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$430.6 million in October 2020 to \$1,131.4 million in October 2021. An increase of \$700.8 million or 162.7%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures over the past year due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- **HF Revenues & Expenses** Revenues increased from \$201.8 million in October 2020 to \$204.1 million in October 2021. An increase of \$2.3 million or 1.1%. This increase was due to a \$1.2 million increase in motor fuel tax revenues and a \$1.2 million increase in license & fee revenues in October 2021 compared to October 2020. Expenses (current accounts) increased from \$36.0 million in October 2020 to \$54.3 million in October 2021. An increase of \$18.3 million or 51.0%.
- **HF** October 2021 YTD revenues were less than October 2020 YTD revenues by \$34.1 million, and October 2021 YTD expenses (current accounts) were less than October YTD 2020 expenses (current accounts) by \$31.4 million.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$311.8 million in October 2020 to \$1,001.1 million in October 2021. An increase of \$689.2 million or 221.0%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures over the past year due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- **HTF Revenues & Expenses** Revenues increased from \$122.5 million in October 2020 to \$126.6 million in October 2021. An increase of \$4.1 million or 3.3%. This increase was due to a \$2.1 million increase in motor fuel tax revenue, a \$2.7 million increase in highway use tax revenue, and a \$0.7 million decrease in fees revenue in October 2021 compared to October 2020. Expenses (current accounts) increased by \$3.7 million in October 2021 compared to October 2020.
- **HTF** October 2021 YTD revenues were greater than October 2020 YTD revenues by \$26.7 million, and October 2021 YTD expenses (current accounts) were greater than October YTD 2020 expenses (current accounts) by \$3.3 million.

Key monthly action:

In October, federal reimbursements were limited, and no federal grant reimbursements were received during the month for Integrated Mobility, Rail, or Aviation. On October 28, DOT made an Integrated Mobility Division grant payment of \$24 million to the City of Charlotte as part of the Charlotte Lynx Blue Line extension.

Spend Plan Analysis - Revenue

Total Revenues, \$2,101.9 million, were 2.6% above the Spend Plan forecast, or \$53.3 million, but were 2%, or \$32.2 million, less than revenues for SFY 2021. This yearly difference in revenues is due to DOT receiving approximately \$80 million (split between HF and HTF) in 'catch up' revenues from DOR for amounts not collected in the late spring due to COVID in July of 2020, which caused July 2020 revenues to be inflated.

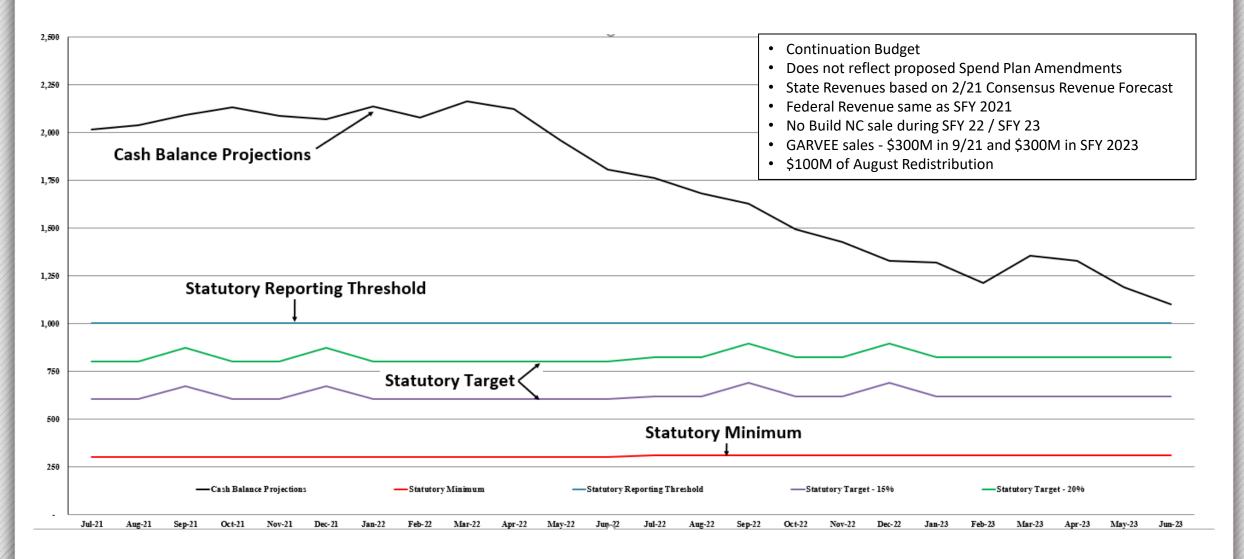
- State Revenue, \$1,403.6 million, was 2.4%, or \$32.7 million, above forecasted revenue.
- Federal Revenue, \$384.6 million, was 10.6%, or \$36.9 million, above the forecasted amount. The FHWA Obligational Authority and Apportionments were not loaded in the FHWA system until October 21, so the billing period was limited during the month.
- Other Revenue, \$53 million, was 17.2%, or \$11 million, less than the forecasted amount. Major line items in this category are Federal Transit funding (\$14.7 million), Federal Transit CARES Act funding (\$22.8 million), Federal Aviation funding (\$1.8 million), Damage Claims (\$4.1 million), GHSP (\$3.6 million), Local Participation (\$1.8 million), and LOGO Fees (\$2.7 million). No grant reimbursements or CARES payments were received during the month from FTA, FAA, or FRA.
- GARVEE Reimbursement, \$115 million, was 14.8%, or \$14.8 million, above the forecasted revenue.
- Build NC Reimbursement, \$140 million, was 0.7%, or \$1 million, above the forecasted revenue. The Department has received \$591.76 million of 2020 Build NC reimbursements from the trustee through October.

Spend Plan Analysis - Expenditures

Total Expenditures (\$1,935 million) were 19%, or \$465.5 million, below the spend plan forecast and 14%, or \$236.8 million, more the previous year totals.

- Total Construction Expenditures (\$1,005.6 million) were 21%, or \$268 million, below spend plan forecast. SFY 2022 expenditures were 0%, or \$4.7 million, more than SFY 2021 construction expenditures.
- Maintenance Expenditures for SFY 2022 (\$545 million) were 20.5% below the spend plan forecast, or \$140 million. SFY 2022 expenditures were 52%, or \$185.8 million, more than SFY 2021 maintenance expenditures.
- Total Modal Expenditures (\$120.9 million) were 29%, or \$50 million, below the spend plan forecast, and were 15%, or \$21.2 million, less than the previous SFY.

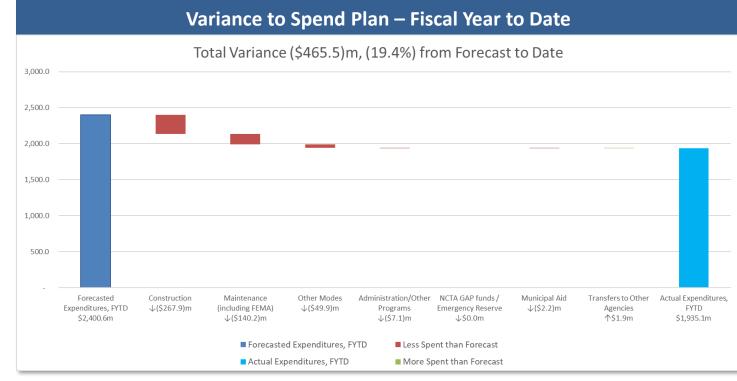
Overall Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$m)

Overall Expenditure Summary and Variances – Fiscal YTD (\$m)



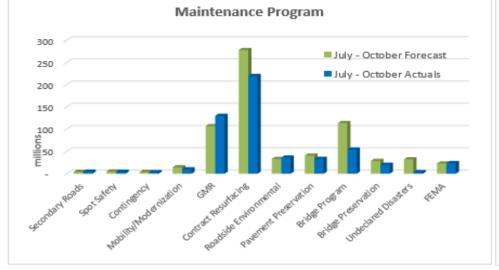

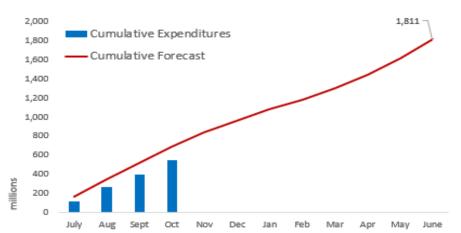

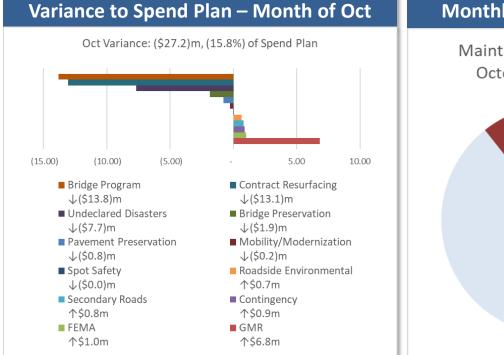




Maintenance Expenditures vs. Forecast

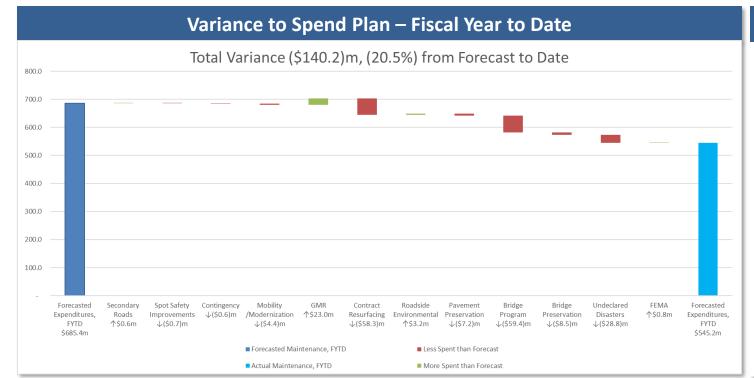

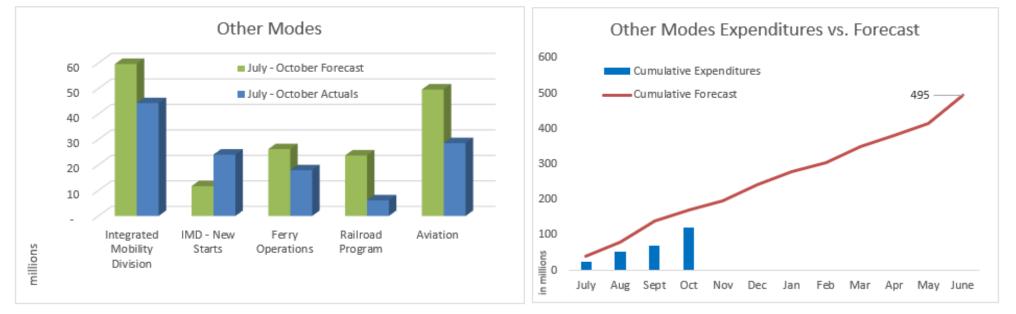

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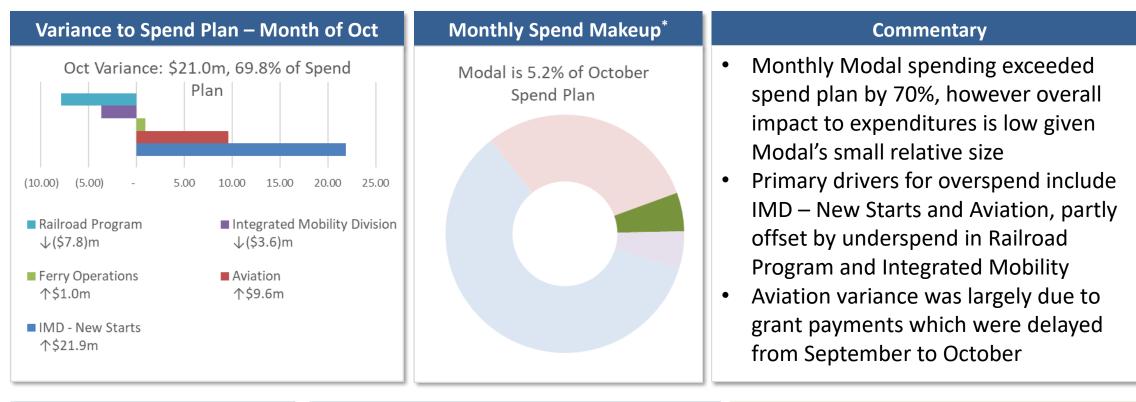

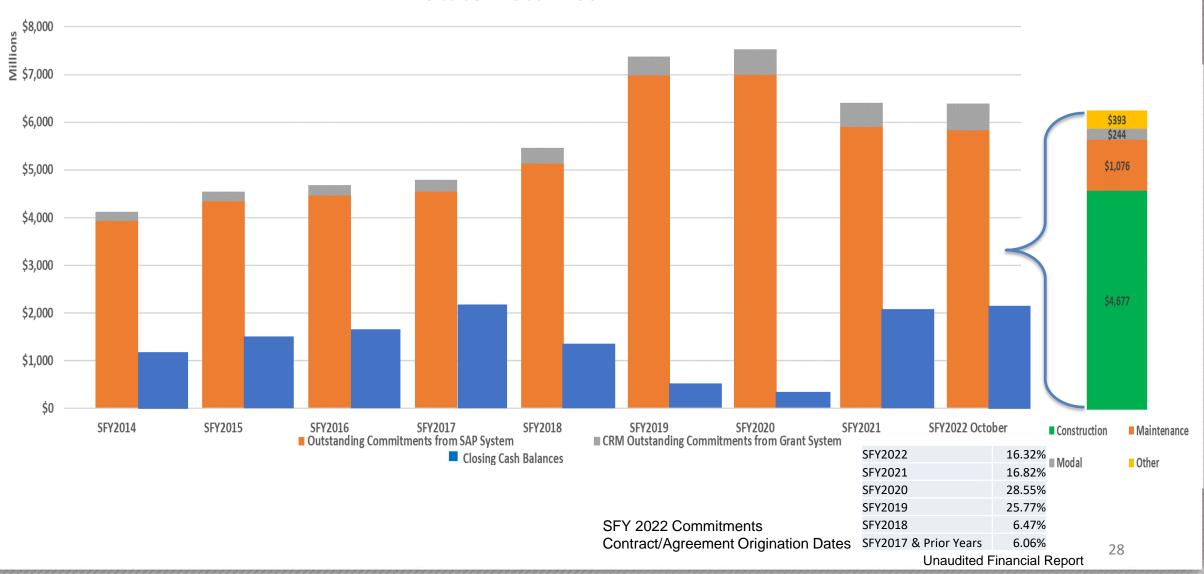

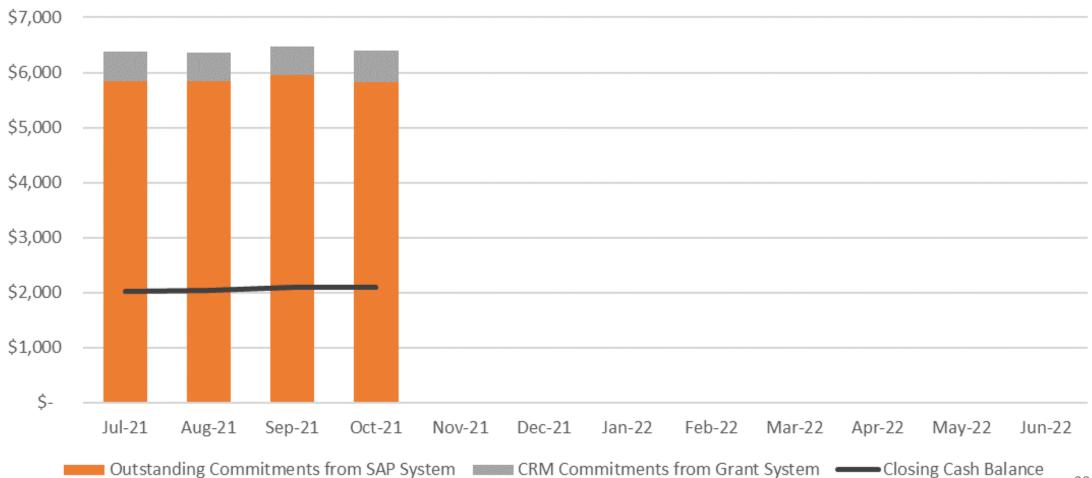

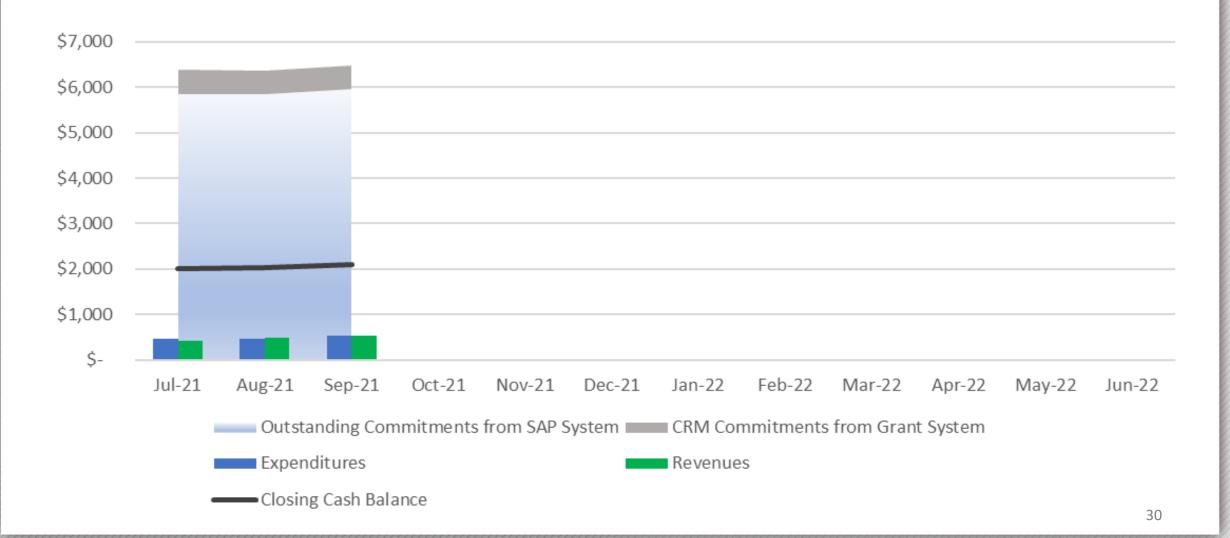
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

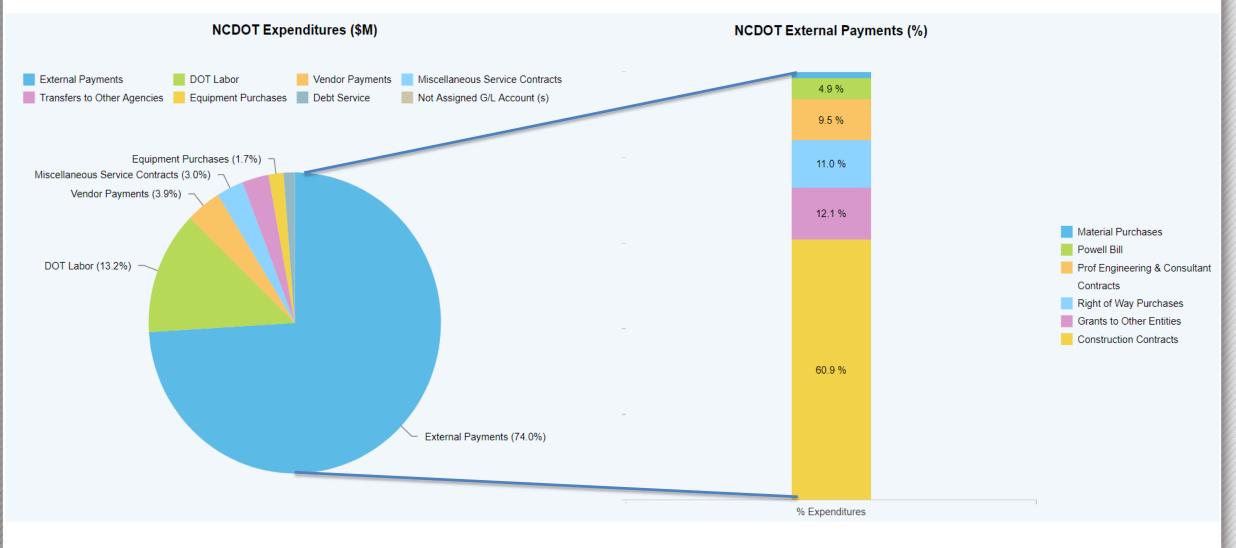

Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

October 2021 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For October 2021, the **average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.00 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$603 million and \$803 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for October was \$2.13 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$301 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

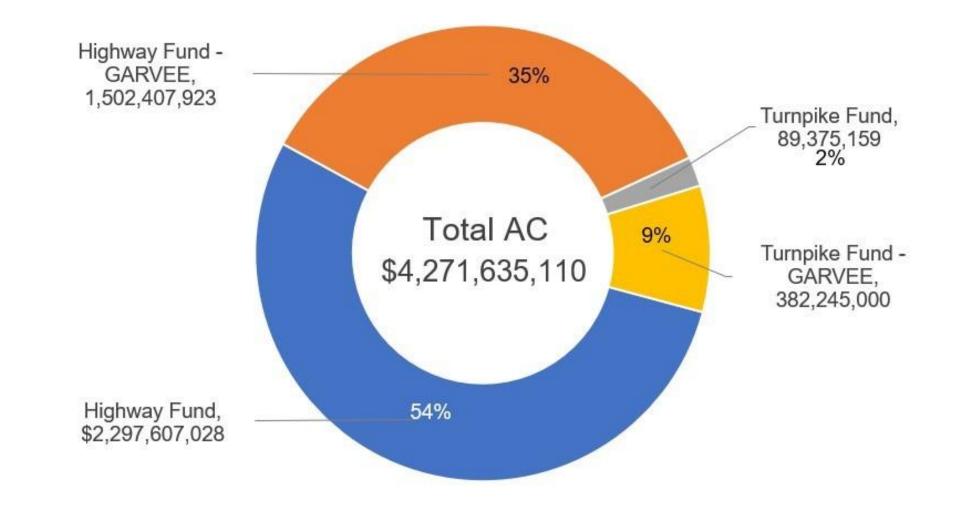

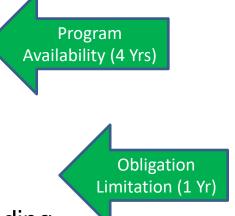

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Federal Aid Overview

- Tied to specific systems
 ➤ 25% of NC mileage eligible
- Matching requirements (20%)

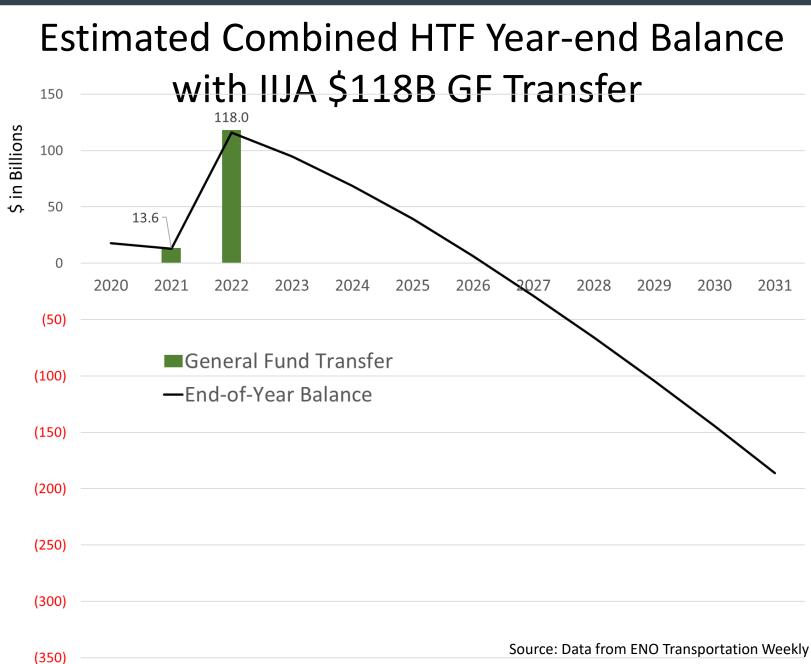

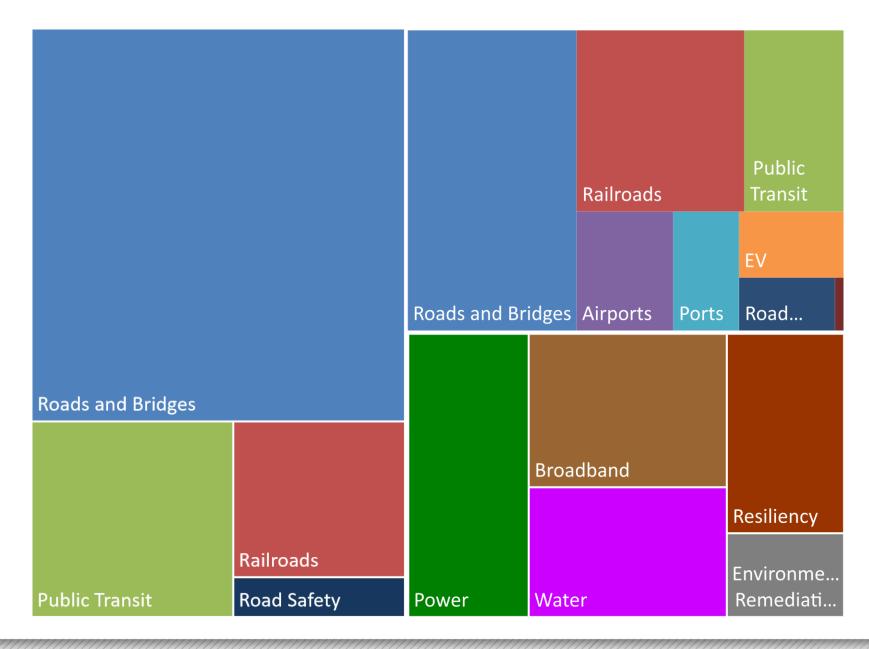

Economic Impacts Driving a Reduction to the FY22 Spend Plan

- External Partners are experiencing workforce and supply chain issues resulting is lower than previously anticipated cash payouts.
- DOT business areas have requested overall reductions for SFY 2022 Spending (Slide 3) based on current forecast trends.
- DOT is seeking approval to amend the DOT FY22-23 Spend Plan in December 2021 from the Office of State Budget and BOT.
- Other Factors to Highlight in the Cash Model
 - State Budget for SFY 2022-23 (SL 2021-180) passed on 11/18/21 and is reflected in the Spend Plan to the extent we feel the cash will be spent through June 2022.
 - Federal Transportation legislation has passed in Washington, DC but not reflected in the Spend Plan because we are waiting for guidance on the NC share.
 - Build NC legislation did receive a technical correction that would allow for a Spring bond issuance but it is currently not reflected in this Spend Plan.

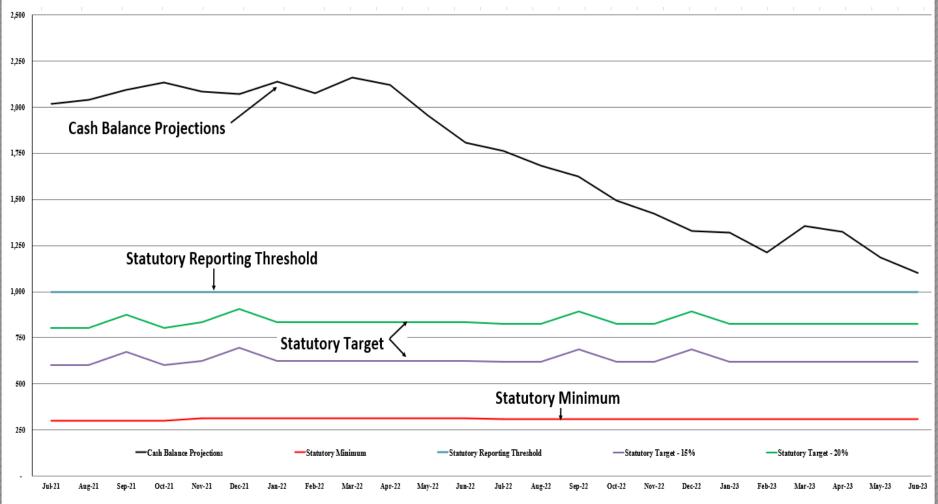

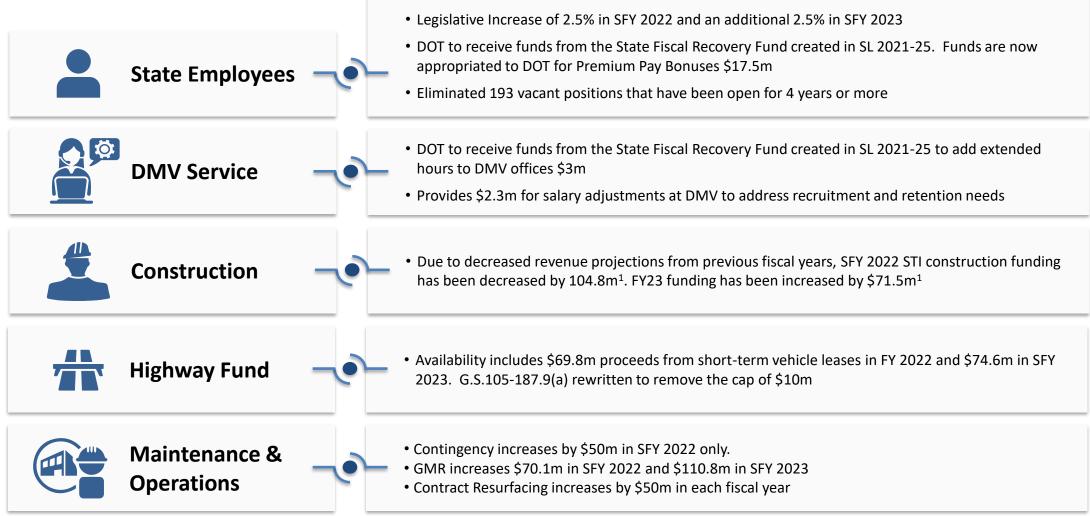

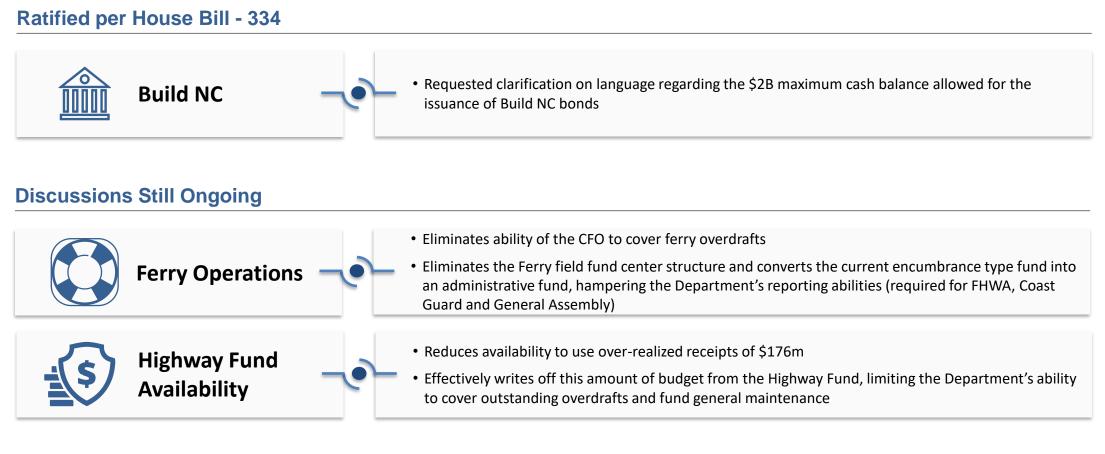

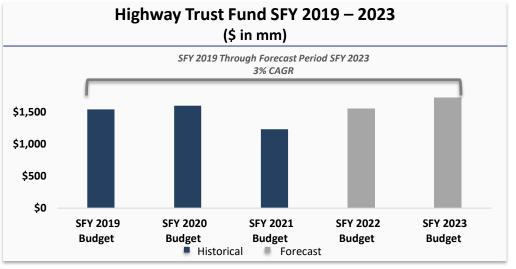
Certified State Budget

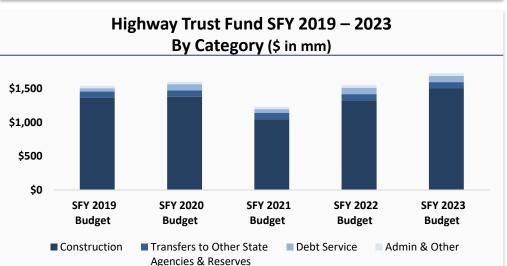

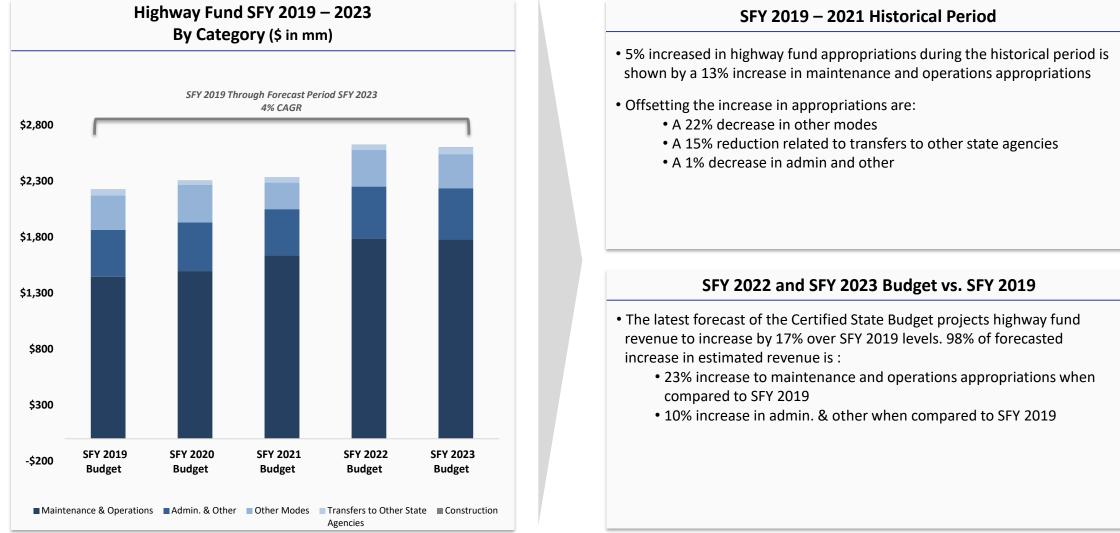

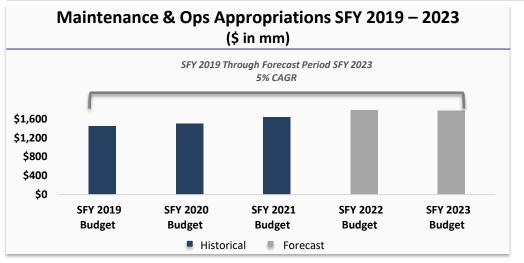

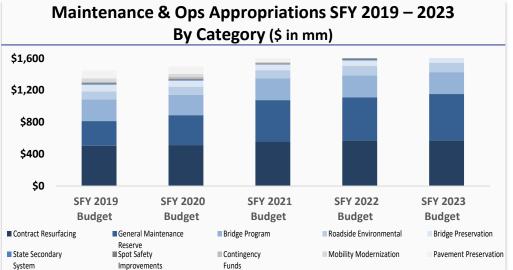

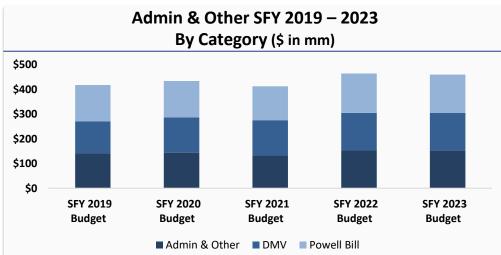

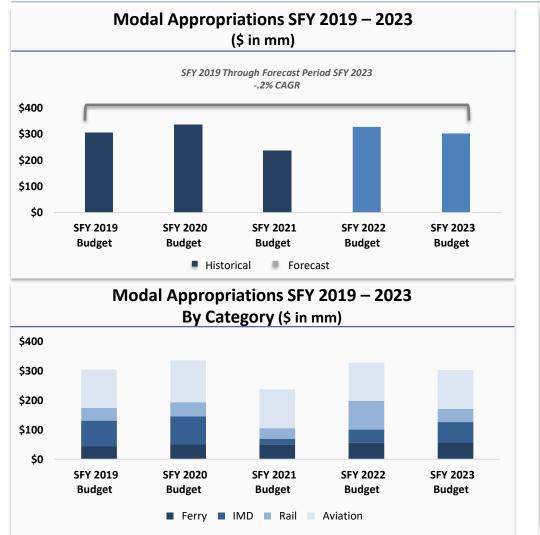
SFY 2019 – 2021 Historical Period

- 1% decrease in admin & other during the historical period ending in SFY 2021 is driven by:
 - 6% reductions to admin and other resulting from no capital improvement funds being awarded in SFY 2021
 - 7% reductions to Powell Bill
- Offset by a 11% increase in DMV which were appropriated for the relocation of HQ, increase in compensation and transaction rates for License Plate Agencies

- The latest forecast of the Certified State Budget, projects admin & other to increase by 10% over SFY 2019 levels. Increased appropriations are distributed across all three major line items:
 - 19% increase in DMV when compared to SFY 2019
 - 7% increase in admin and other when compared to SFY 2019
 - 5% increase in Powell Bill when compared to SFY 2019
 - \$4.3m of funds in SFY 2022 directed to City of Fayetteville for road and safety improvements

Highway Fund - Other Modal Appropriations

Other modal has averaged \$293m in appropriations since SFY 2019. By SFY 2023 the forecasted budget, decreases \$3m as compared to SFY 2019 (-.2% CAGR)



SFY 2019 – 2021 Historical Period

- The 22% decrease in other modal appropriations during the historical period is a result of:
 - 78% decrease in IMD appropriations resulting from SFY 2021 elimination of ROAP and SMAP payments for the year
 - 17% reduction in rail appropriations resulting from SFY 2021 reduction in Freight Rail & Rail Crossing Safety Improvement (FRRCSI)
- Offset by 13% increase in Ferry and a 1% increase in Aviation over the historical period
 - Aviation decreased by (\$10.7m) between SFY 2020 and 2021 due to reductions in Commercial and General Aviation Funds

- The latest forecast of the Certified State Budget, reduces modal by 1% over SFY 2019 levels. The decrease in appropriations is shown by:
 - 20% decrease in IMD when compared to SFY 2019
 - Offset by a 27% increase in Ferry when compared to SFY 2019

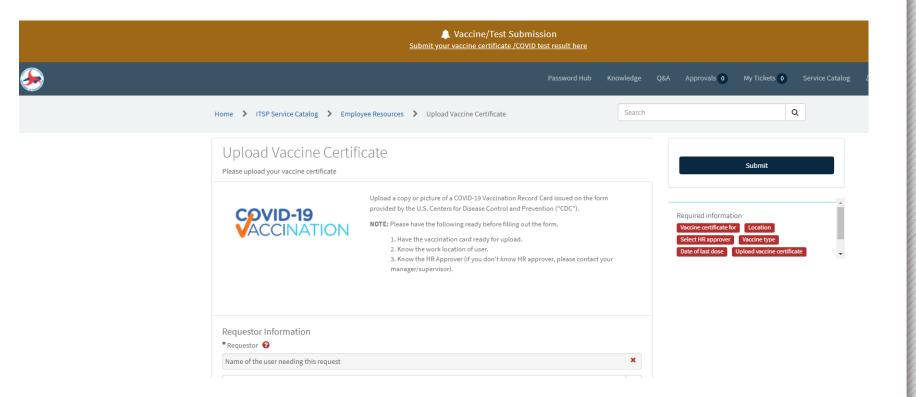

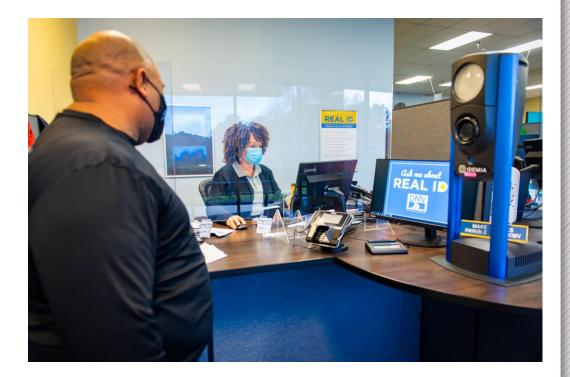
Lessons Learned
