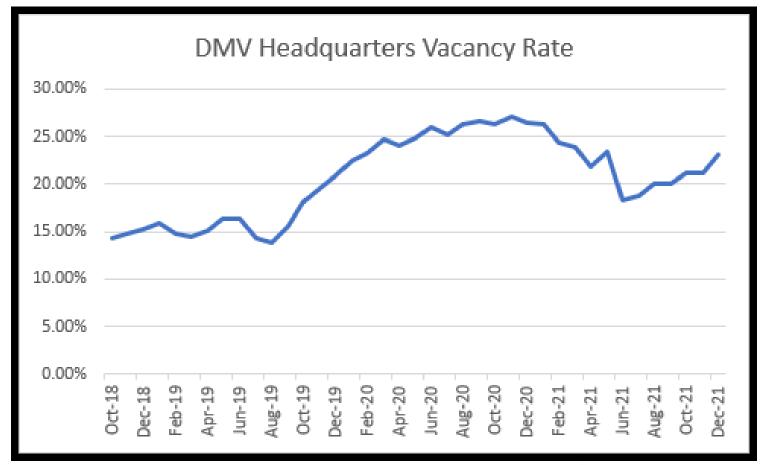

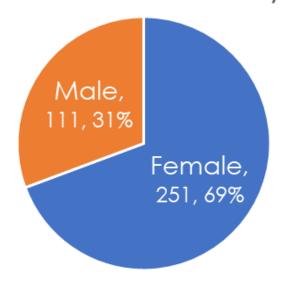

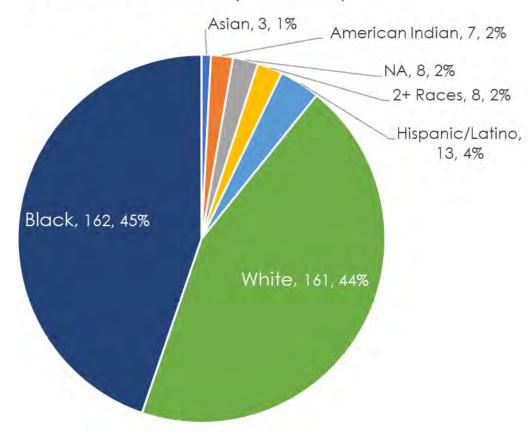

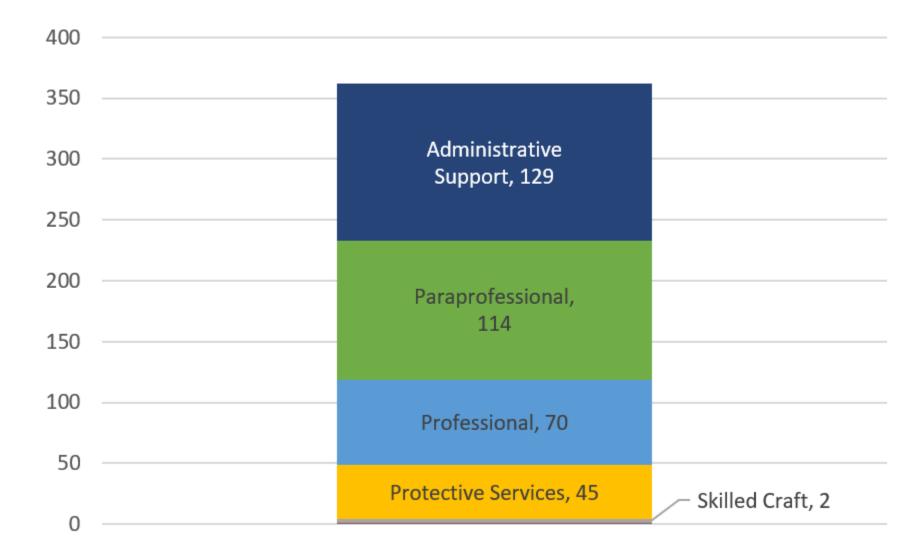
2021 DMV Hires by Gender



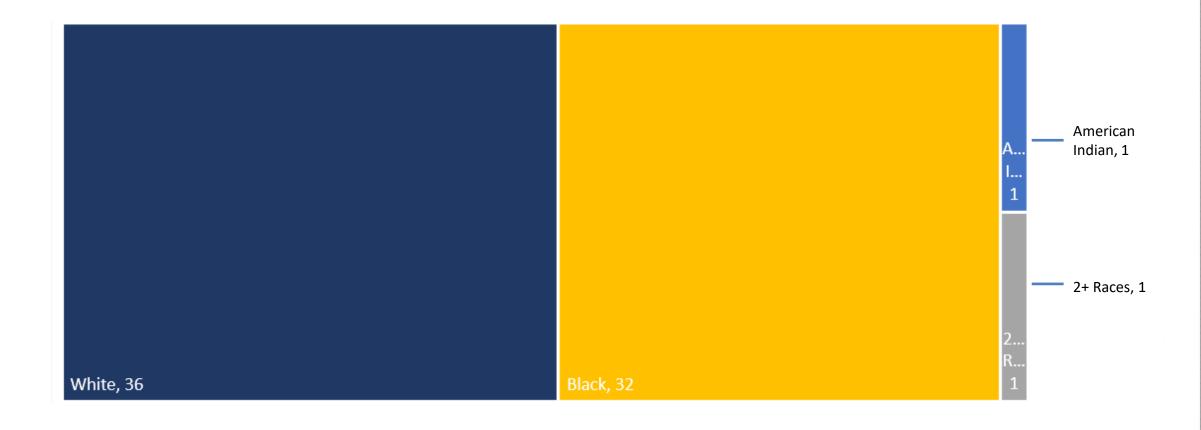
2021 DMV Hires by Ethnicity



2021 DMV Hires by EEO Category



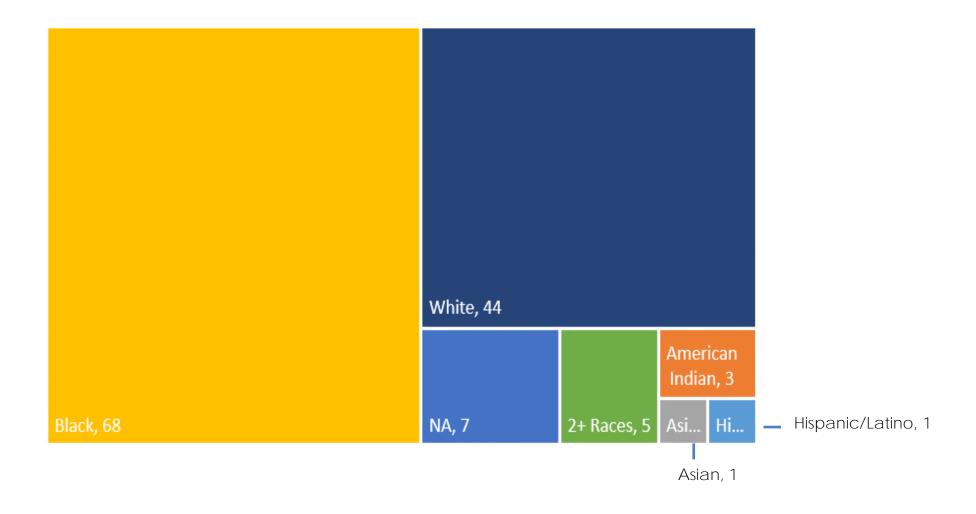

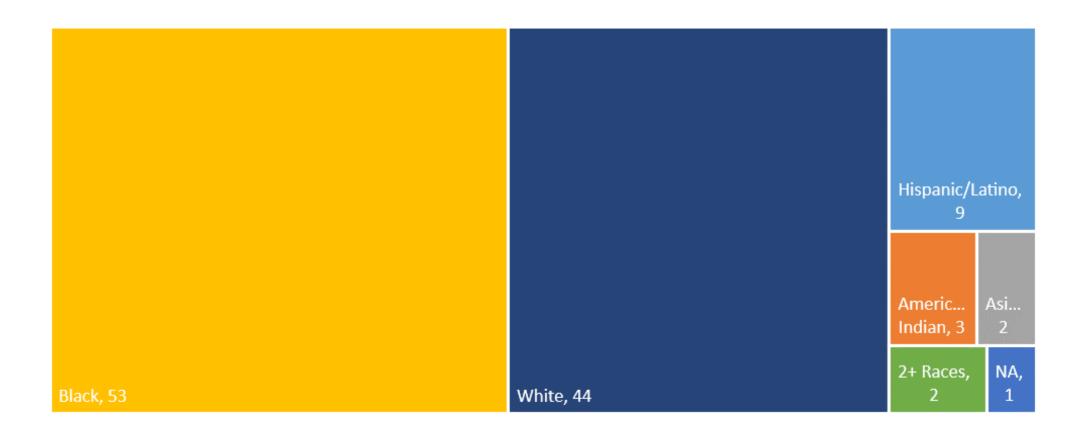

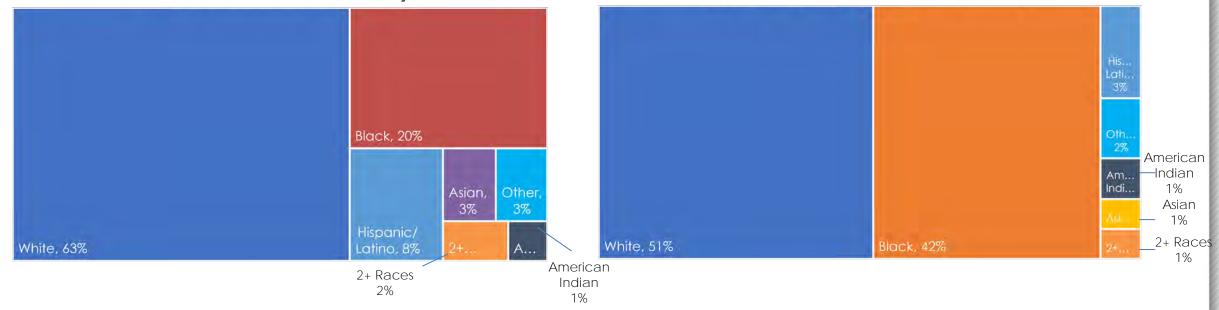

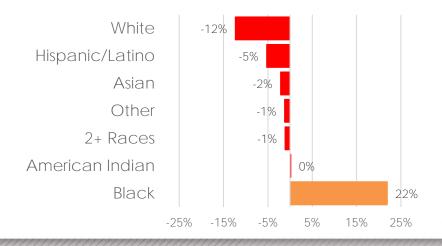

DMV vs. NC Workforce Ethnicity



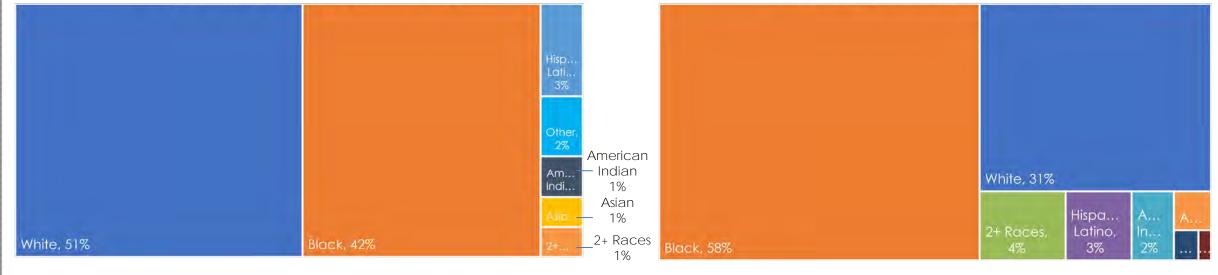

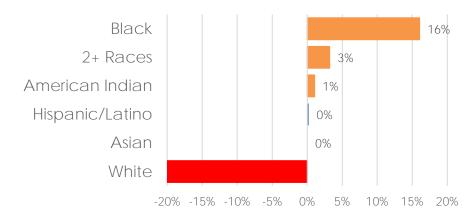
How Does the DMV Workforce Compare to Its Applicant Pool?

DMV Workforce vs DMV Applicants by Ethnicity



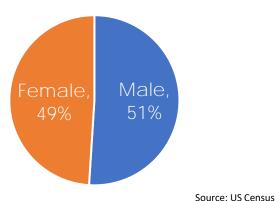

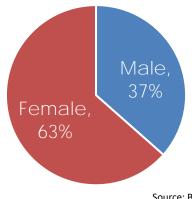


How Do DMV Workforce Genders Compare to the NC Workforce and DMV **Applicants?**

NC Workforce by Gender

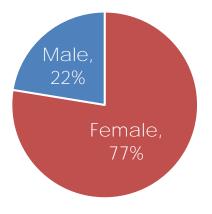

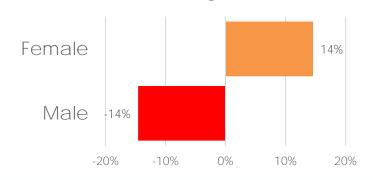

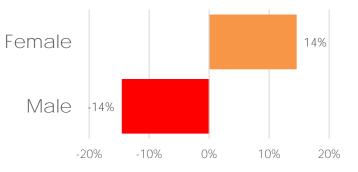




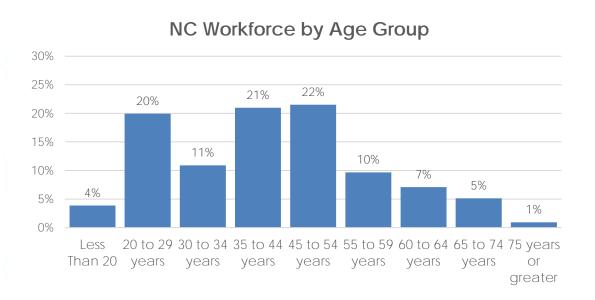
DMV Workforce vs NC Workforce by Gender

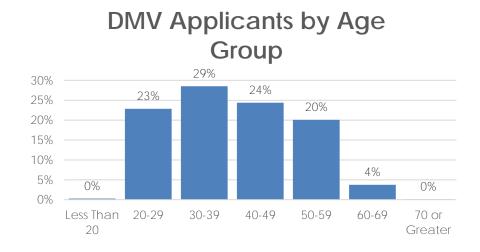


DMV Workforce vs DMV Applicants by Gender



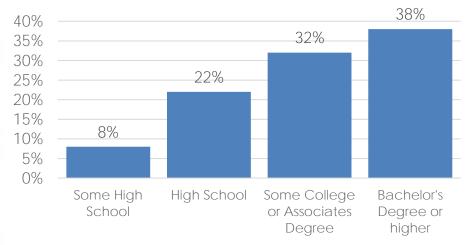
How Does the Age of DMV Applicants Compare to the NC Workforce?



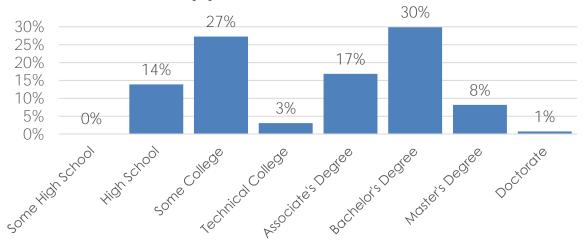


How Does the DMV Applicants' Education Level Compare to the NC Workforce?

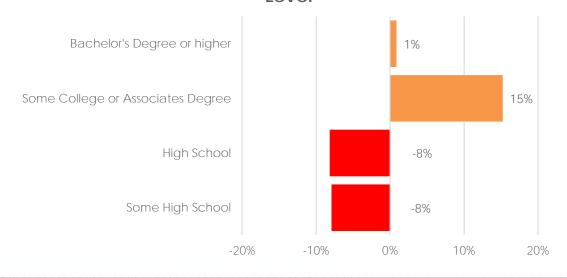




DMV Applicants Education Level



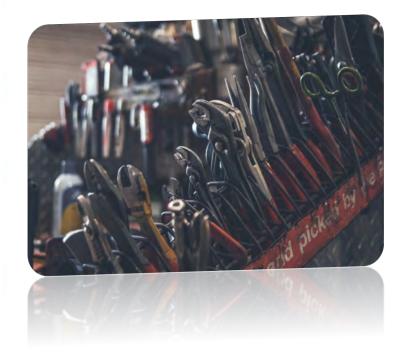
NC Workforce Vs NCDMV Applicants Education Level

March 14, 2019

Establishing the Task Force on Connecting North Carolina

Promoting Expansion of Access to High-Speed Internet

Removing Barriers to Broadband Infrastructure Installation

North Carolina General Statute § 136-18(46)

(2019)

Background

Law provides

Ability to enter into partnership agreements with private entities to finance, by contracts, revenues of facilities, and other financing methods authorized by law, the cost of acquiring, constructing, equipping, maintaining, and operating communications infrastructure supporting transportation infrastructure on the Interstate System.

Ability to plan, design, develop, acquire, construct, equip, maintain, and operate communications infrastructure supporting transportation infrastructure within the State of North Carolina.

Requires a competitive process

Information

Per law, communications infrastructure supporting transportation infrastructure means

fiber optic trunk lines, microcell towers or other broadband or data transmission facilities located within the right-of-way of the interstate or primary highway system that is owned, and utilized completely or partly, by the Department for traffic management, highway safety, vehicle technology integration, and other functions of the Department.

Action

An agreement entered into under this subdivision requires the concurrence of the Board of Transportation. Report to JLTOC regarding contract details 60 days prior to signing.

The Role of Controlled Access ROWs for Broadband



Broadband connectivity is reliant on an end-to-end network which generally includes a long distance "middle mile" or "backbone" component that is connected to a shorter distance "last-mile" component to serve customers.



In rural areas, there is often a shortage of both middle-mile and last mile networks. The installation of middle mile networks can provide a catalyst for the deployment of last mile networks, and bridge rural connectivity gaps.



Controlled access ROWs may be attractive to developers as they could present a significant opportunity to install a backbone over long distances without having to navigate the complexities of multiple land purchases and/or easements. Last-mile networks are then built laterally to connect small towns to the backbone provided by the ROW. However, there is a cost to the State and NCDOT associated with these types of encroachments. Historically, until NCGS 136-18(46), the Department did not have the authority to allow this access (2019).



In addition to bridging rural connectivity gaps, controlled access ROW backbone networks could provide NCDOT with broadband connectivity for the deployment of ITS devices and communication with autonomous and connected vehicles.



As demonstrated with the I-95/US-70/US-74 Project, in exchange for providing ROW, NCDOT can share in the commercialization potential of the network and use this to offset its O&M and capital costs.

NCDOT could further leverage its controlled access ROW to bridge rural connectivity gaps and fulfill its own broadband requirements.

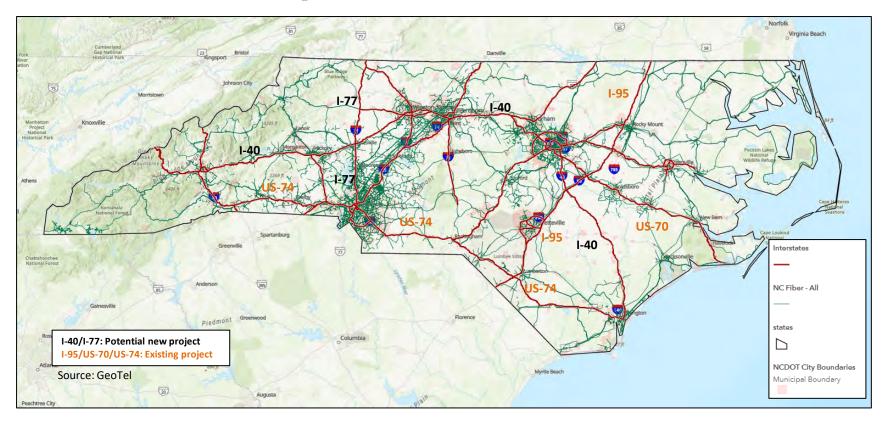

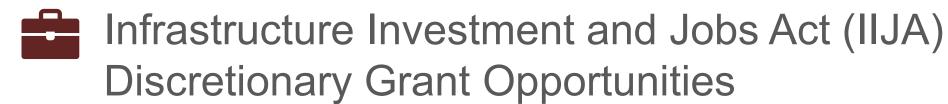

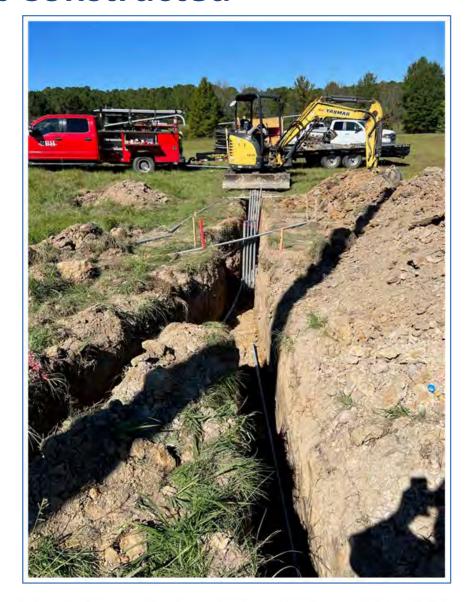

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Chairman Lathrop stated the meeting was in person and remote being conducted on Microsoft Teams. He reminded members that all chats, instant messages, texts, or other written communications between members of the Board regarding the transaction of public business during the remote meeting was public record. He called the meeting to order at 10:45 am, took a roll call and declared a quorum. Chairman Lathrop read the non-conflict/ethics statement and asked if there were

Chairman Lathrop stated the meeting minutes were distributed prior to the meeting, and if there are no additions or corrections, the Chair would accept a motion that the minutes from the November 3, 2021, meeting be approved as submitted.
ACTIONS TAKEN	Chair Lathrop asked for a motion to approve the November 3, 2021, meeting minutes. Board member Rosenburgh made the motion to approve the minutes and Board member Mathis provided the second. Chair Lathrop asked for a voice vote, and the November 3, 2021, minutes were approved unanimously.
2. Financial Update – Stephanie King,	CFO
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King began by reporting on The Fast Five. First was an update on federal and state legislation. She stated the biennium state budget was approved and Financial Management was busy getting the funds certified and ready to use on projects. On the federal side another continuing resolution was passed to extend federal funding through February 18 th and that gives the Department the ability to bill federal dollars for expenditures. In addition, the 5-year transportation bill, Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Have not received official notices of NC funding yet, but by mandate the federal funding figures are required to be provided within 30 days (estimated around December 15 th).
	Second area highlighted was the Spend Plan Amendment. Mrs. King reported the recently approved state budget was a part of the Amendment. She noted Michelle



Overby would give a presentation later in the committee meeting on the Amendment and the Department was asking for consideration of approval from the Board. She reported the Office of State Budget and Management did approve the Amendment on December 7, 2021. She noted the Amendment reduces SFY 2022 expenditures by \$265m, primarily in Construction and Contract Resurfacing, based on labor market and commodity issues. Also, SFY 2022 revenues increase by \$277m. The projected cash balance forecast would increase by \$542m.

The third area highlighted as Powell Bill. Mrs. King reported the second payment of SFY 2022 Powell Bill is based on the approved state budget. The total payment will be \$87.7m to be distributed to 509 Municipalities prior to January 1, 2022. The previous payment in September was \$71.6m, which was based on the continuation budget.

The fourth area highlighted was Build NC. Mrs. King reported the General Assembly approved a technical correction to the budget bill that will allow the Department to issue Build NC bonds in the fiscal year. Management was evaluating projects with a potential for a spring 2022 sale. She noted the Department will bring more information to the Board, most likely in February 2022.

The fifth area highlighted was Spend Plan Audit Response. Mrs. King reported the Department is addressing issued raised in the audit and are using Ernst & Young and SAS in developing measures, improve forecasting at the project level, and reporting on project variances.

Mrs. King then reported on Revenues. For the month of October, the revenue variance was -2.7%, but still within an acceptable range. She noted that in the prior two months there was some overcorrecting from the Department of Revenue that made the numbers look a bit escalated. In addition, federal revenue was lagging because the lack of additional obligation authority limited the Department billing the federal government. Even with those issues the year-to-date revenue variance was 2.6% above forecast.

Mrs. King next reported on Expenses. For the month of October expenses were 16.1%, or \$92.4m, less than forecast and for fiscal year to date expenses were 19.4%, or \$465.5m, lower than forecast. These variances lead to the need for the Spend Plan Amendment. She also reiterated the Department was working with 3rd party advisors to help better define project level variances.

Mrs. King reported the cash balance was over \$2.1 billion, the average monthly spend was \$557 million and cash on hand was 116 days. Open commitments (projects already let) were \$6.39 billion, and the vast majority was construction projects. The cash as a percentage of open commitments was 33%. The Department started 18 new projects in October with bid amounts of \$46.4 million and 62 projects were accepted or closed out.

Mrs. King noted some additional new reporting slide formats in the Detailed Report. The slides denote monthly and year to date views of actuals, variance to spend plan, spend makeup, and commentary. She asked for additional feedback on the new reporting formats and for anyone to contact her if they wanted the older formats to still be included in the slide decks that are posted and distributed.

3. Current Operations Appropriations Act of 2021 - Kim Padfield, Controller

Ms. Padfield began by reporting Session Law 2021-180 was signed into law on November 18, 2021. The budget must be certified by December 15, 2021, which she explained means the numbers are entered in the state budget system and NCDOT accounting system, reconciled and approved by OSBM. The Highway Fund estimated revenue for SFY 2022 is \$2.6264 billion and for SFY 2023 is \$2.6034 billion. The Highway Trust Fund estimated revenue for SFY 2022 is \$1.552 billion and for SFY 2023 is \$1.7283 billion. Both SFY 2022 and 2023 budgets show increases over their base budgets with SFY 2022 and 2023 at \$161m and \$314m over base, respectively.

Ms. Padfield then highlighted five areas. First was the impact on state employees. She noted employees would receive a salary increase of 2.5% in SFY 2022 and an additional 2.5% in SFY 2023. The amount employees would have received from July – December 2021 will be paid in the form of a bonus in a January check. She also explained the Department would receive funds from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund created in SL 2021-25 for Premium Pay Bonuses in the amount of \$17.5 million. Those bonuses would be distributed in the December 21 paycheck. She noted the budget bill also eliminated 193 vacant positions that have been open for 4 years or more.

The second area highlighted was DMV Service. Ms. Padfield noted the Department would receive \$3 million of funds from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund created in SL 2021-25 to add extended hours to DMV offices. The budget also provides \$2.3 million for salary adjustments at DMV to address recruitment and retention needs.

The third area highlighted was Construction. Ms. Padfield noted that due to decreased revenue projections from previous fiscal years, SFY 2022 STI construction funding has been decreased by \$104.8 million. FY23 funding has been increased by \$71.5 million.

The fourth area highlighted was Highway Fund. Ms. Padfield explained Highway Fund availability was increased by \$69.8 million from projected proceeds from short-term vehicle leases in FY 2022 and \$74.6m in SFY Highway Fund 2023. G.S.105-187.9(a) was rewritten to remove the cap of \$10 million.

The fifth area highlighted was Maintenance & Operations. Ms. Padfield noted the Contingency budget line item will increase by \$50 million in SFY 2022 only. In addition, General Maintenance Reserve will increase by \$70.1 million in SFY 2022 and \$110.8 million in SFY 2023. Contract Resurfacing will increase by \$50 million in each fiscal year.

Ms. Padfield explained the Department had asked for technical corrections on some items in the budget. She reported that Session Law 2021-189 (signed into law on December 6, 2021) provided clarification on Build NC and the language regarding the \$2B maximum cash balance allowed for the issuance of Build NC

	bonds. She noted discussions were still ongoing regarding Ferry Operations and Highway Fund availability.	
	The remainder of the slides are an appendix giving a three-year historical look at budget and the two-year forecast budget. The two-year forecast budget is being compared to SFY 2019 due to the volatility of COVID impacts to revenues and expenditures in SFY 2020 and SFY 2021. She requested Board members to contact her with any questions regarding the attached data.

4. Federal Legislation Update - Burt Ta	asaico, PE, Director of Strategic Initiatives	
	Mr. Tasaico began by reporting that the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was also being called the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.	
	He reviewed terminology related to federal aid funding. He explained that the authorization bill is the higher level of funding that the legislation provides and is not the level that the Department programs projects. Obligation authority, which is lower than the authorization amount, is the actual dollar amount that the Department programs. He cautioned that the infrastructure bill contains new components that the Department has not seen before in a federal transportation bill.	
	Mr. Tasaico reported on key parts of the IIJA. It was effective November 15, 2021 and is Public Law 117-58. It is the first bill with two components, traditional surface transportation reauthorization and infrastructure legislation. He reported the bill is approximately \$1 trillion from 2022 through 2026. The law includes a transfer of \$118 billion from the U.S. General Fund to make the financing plan work.	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Tasaico detailed the Revenue Provisions within IIJA. Congress authorized Federal Highway Trust Fund expenditures through 10/1/2026 and collection of tax receipts until 9/30/2028. In addition, there will be a transfer of \$90 billion to the Highway Account and \$28 billion to the Mass Transit Account.	
	Mr. Tasaico showed a graph detailing the forward view of the Federal Highway Trust Fund without and with the \$118 billion General Fund transfer. He noted that in FFY 2021 there was a transfer from the General Fund to keep the Trust Fund solvent. The Trust Fund would run negative without transfers.	
	Mr. Tasaico explained how the funding relates to prior transportation funding bills. The Reauthorization portion (\$477 million) relates to roads and bridges, public transit, railroad, and road safety. The new Transportation portion (\$284 million) relates to roads and bridges, railroads, airports, ports, public transit, and electric vehicles. The new Utilities portion (\$264 million) relates to power, broadband, water, resiliency, and environmental remediation.	
	Mr. Tasaico noted that the infrastructure bill includes many federal agencies, and an in-house preliminary review estimates \$230 billion in grants. The funding is available to a range of recipients, which could be over 60,000 eligible recipients	



	nationwide. The concern is not all recipients will be knowledgeable of the rules and regulations related to federal grants.
	Mr. Tasaico presented the federal outlook and broke it down into the immediate (less than one year), new term (five year), and midterm (greater than five years
5. Spend Plan Amendment 1 Addendu	m - Michelle Overby, Director Cash Management & Forecasting
	Ms. Overby began by reviewing the Proposed Spend Plan Amendment. She explained that the Department is asking for a reduction in spend plan expenditure targets of \$265 million in comparison to the Spend Plan approved on July 1, 2021. She noted some economic impacts driving the reduction request. These include external partners were experiencing workforce and supply chain issues resulting is lower than previously anticipated cash payouts and DOT business areas have requested overall reductions for SFY 2022 Spending based on current forecast trends. Other factors she noted include the State Budget for SFY 2022-23 (SL 2021-180) passed on 11/18/21 and is reflected in the Spend Plan to the extent that cash is forecast to be spent through June 2022, Federal Transportation legislation passed, but not reflected in the Spend Plan because guidance has not been received on the NC share, and Build NC legislation did receive a technical correction that would allow for a bond issuance in SFY 2022, but it is currently not reflected in this Spend Plan.
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Ms. Overby reported the Spend Plan Amendment is the same as presented to the Finance Committee in November with two exceptions. She noted that with the passage of the state budget the Department was requesting an in General Maintenance Reserve and Roadside Environmental to match the new budget appropriations.
	Ms. Overby next presented graphs showing the cash balance projections for the Original Spend Plan approved in July 2021 and the Proposed Spend Plan Amendment 1.
	Ms. Overby explained how the Original Spend Plan compared to the Previously Proposed Spend Plan Amendment 1 and to the Current Proposed Spend Plan Amendment 1, which includes new budget amounts. The Total Revenues for Current Proposed Spend Plan Amendment 1 is \$277 million more than the Original Plan. The Total Expenditures for the Current Proposed Spend Plan Amendment is \$265 million less than the Original Plan. The net change in cash for the Amendment is \$542 million more than the Original Plan.

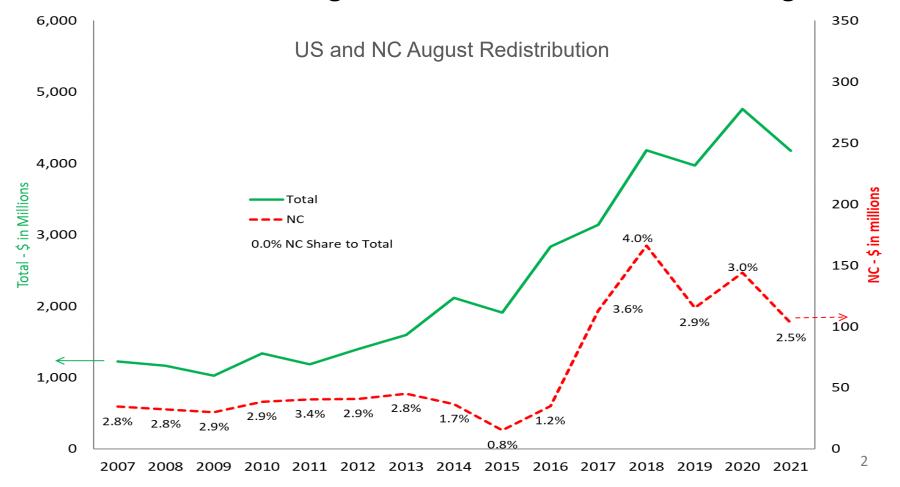

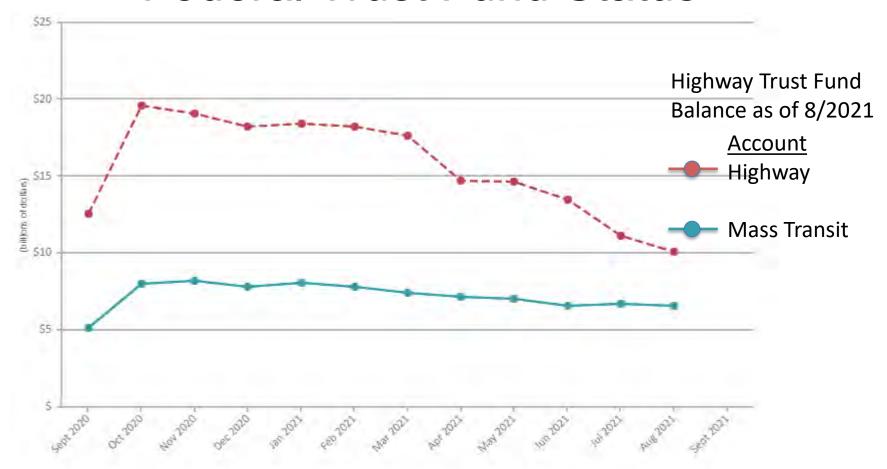

Favorable Interest Rates

Interest rates continue to remain low based on historical standards. Municipal bond inflows remain strong and MMD/UST ratios are favorable.



Projected Diminishing Cash Balance

Cash Model projects cash to peak in early 2022, followed by a drawdown into 2023. Cash is currently elevated because expenditures have fallen short of projections due to labor and material shortages. As the labor market stabilizes and supply chain issues begin to ease, expenditures should accelerate.



Legal Compliance

The proposed project list is favorable for accelerating the timeline of compliance with S.L. 2018-16 Section 2.3 and Section 2.4, ensuring an equitable distribution of bond proceeds to Divisions and Regions across the state over the duration of the Program. Analysis continues to identify NCDOT's debt capacity in future years.

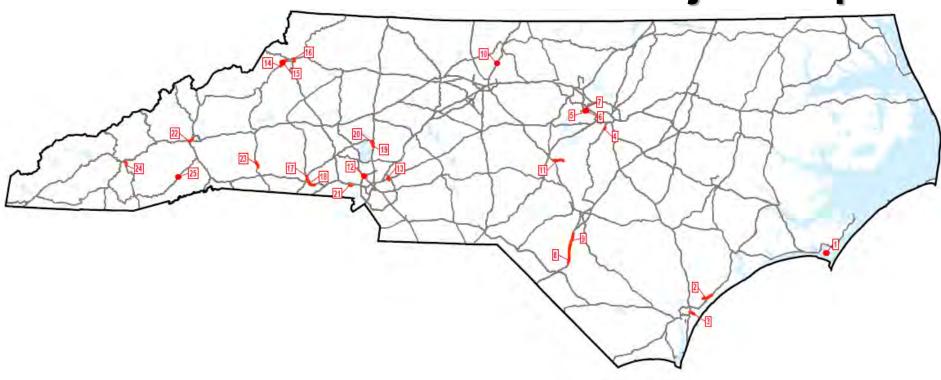

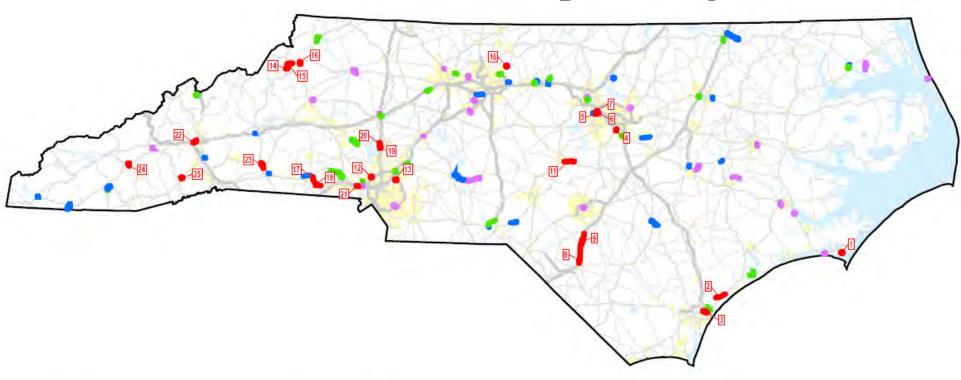

History of the Powell Bill Program

- NC G.S. 136-41, Law passed in 1951
- The goal was to provide financial assistance to municipalities for municipally-maintained streets
- State Senator Junius K. Powell, an attorney & former Mayor of Whiteville, led the signatures on the bill, hence the name of the "Powell Bill" Program
- First Powell Bill funds were distributed in the Fall of 1951 (\$4.5 million among 386 participating municipalities)

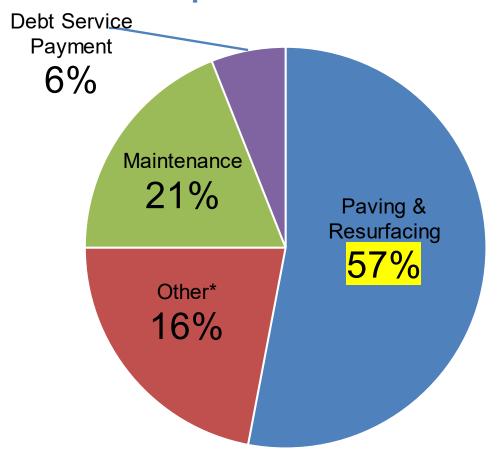

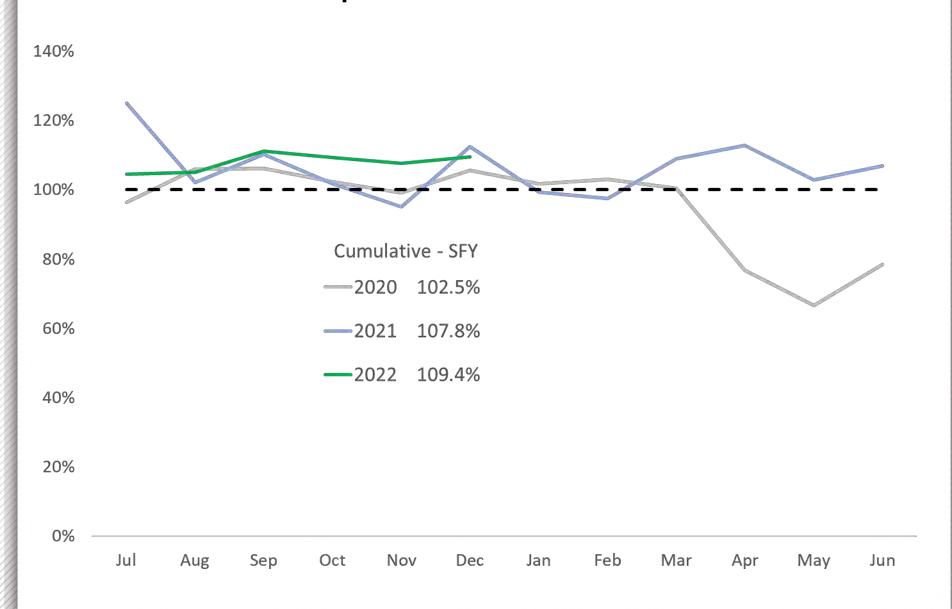




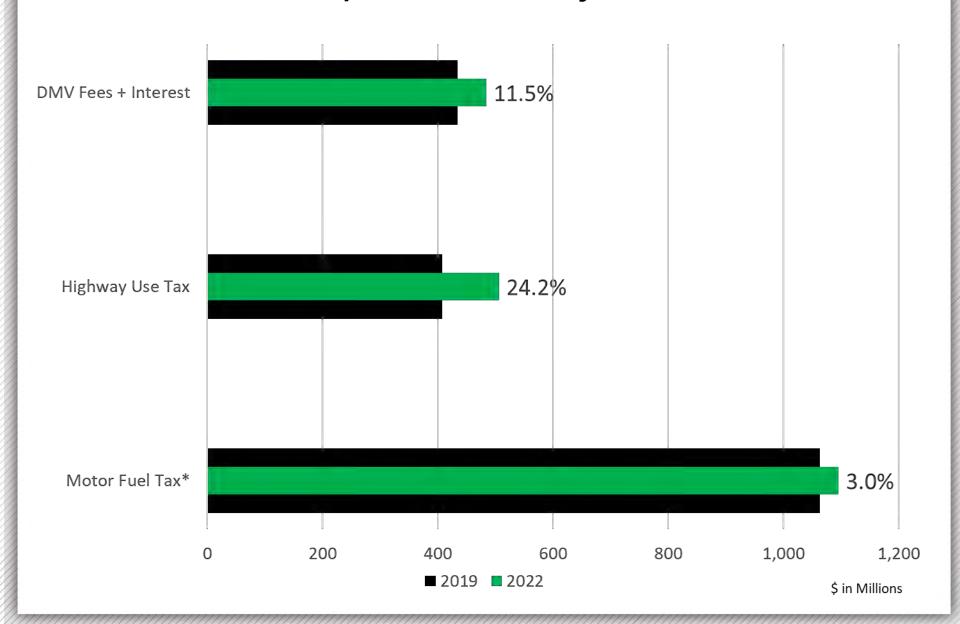


SFY 2022 Mid-year Revenue Update February 2, 2022

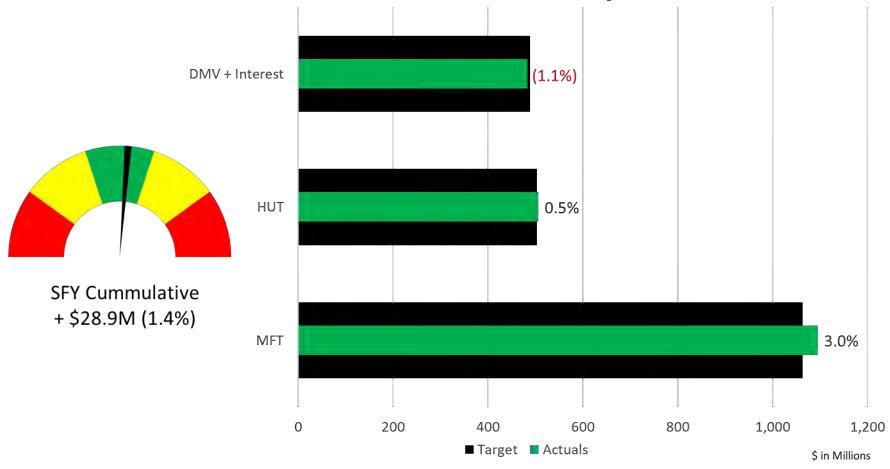
SFY 2019 Comparisons – Total State Revenue

Strategies for vegetation management include mechanical, herbicides, and biological. Mechanical strategies include mowing, long arm mowing, string trimming, and brush and tree chipping. Herbicide strategies include turf, brush and tree, invasive weed control and aquatic weed control. Biological strategies include wildflower beds, landscape plantings and low growing turf. Expenditure levels for vegetation management this calendar year is greater than last year's expenditures in all categories.

Ms. McGraw discussed FEMA and FHWA requirements to meet reimbursement thresholds. NCDOT has made concerted efforts over the past six months to recover reimbursements from FEMA and has successfully recovered \$42.6M during that time from FEMA and billed an additional \$55M.
	Tropical Storm Fred that hit the western NCDOT divisions August 16-18, to date has caused over \$32M in damages with over 400 damage sites. These numbers are likely to change as repairs are made and costs are updated. Eleven counties in Divisions 11, 13, and 14 were part of the Presidential declaration of emergency related to Tropical Storm Fred.
	Currently, NCDOT has 9 open events with FEMA. FEMA reimbursements take 2-5 years on average to obtain reimbursements.

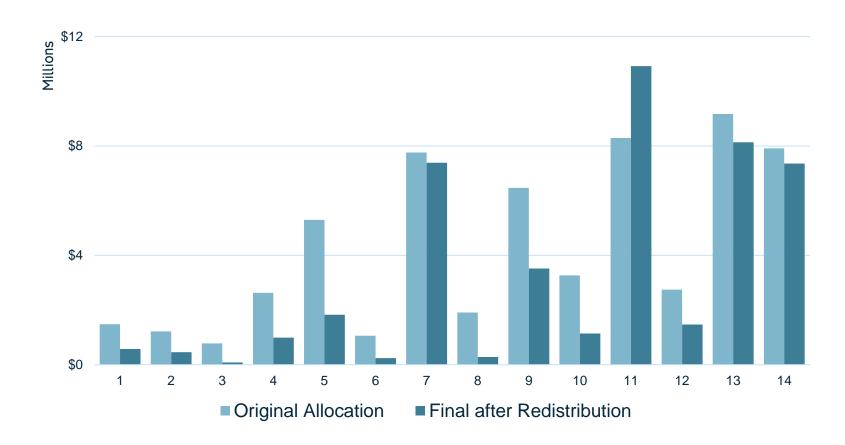




Division Allocations based on 5-year average expenditures for Snow & Ice activities

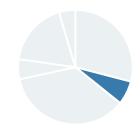

Total Investment by Division (FY 2018-2023)

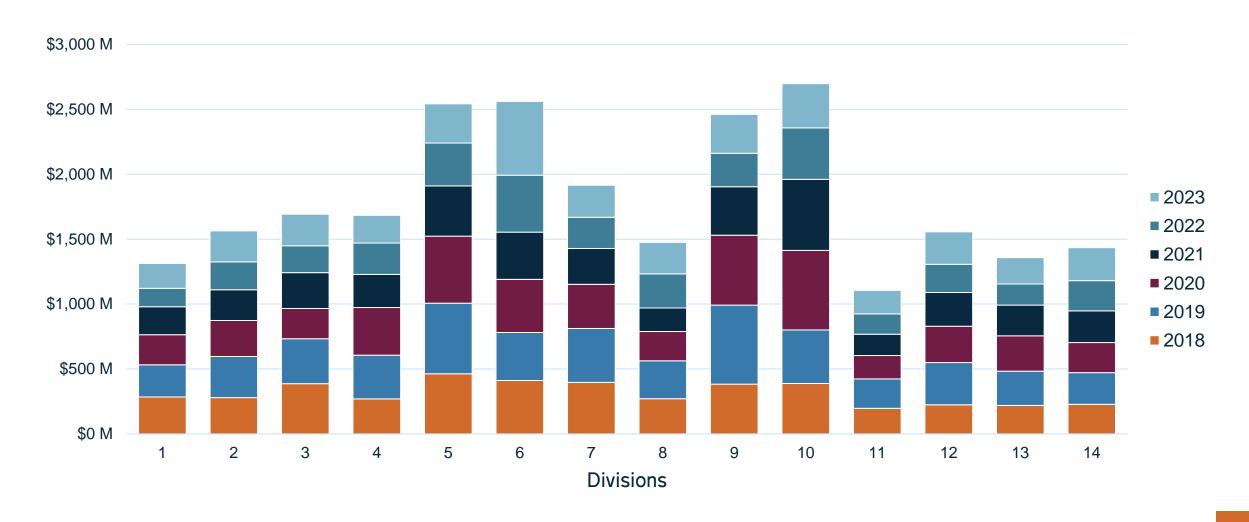
Total Spend by Division (FY 2018 – 2021)

A week out from the arrival of Hurricane Florence in the Carolinas in September 2018, state officials knew they wanted to use drones to help deal with the flooded aftermath,

butthey didn't want to create chaos in the air NCDOT has about 20 drone pilots with varying degrees of experience. Other state agencies have their own drones, including police and firefighters, and private support was also going to be called in from partners including Dronescape. North State Engineering, PrecisionHawk and SM&E. Then there was coordination with the National Guard, FEMA and the Federal Avistion Administration.

The major thing for us was coordination," says Darshan Divakaran, the UAS program engineer at the North Carolina Department of Transportation's aviation division.

Divakaran's office became what he calls the "UAS champion," a sort of air boss coordinating the efforts of all these disparate players.

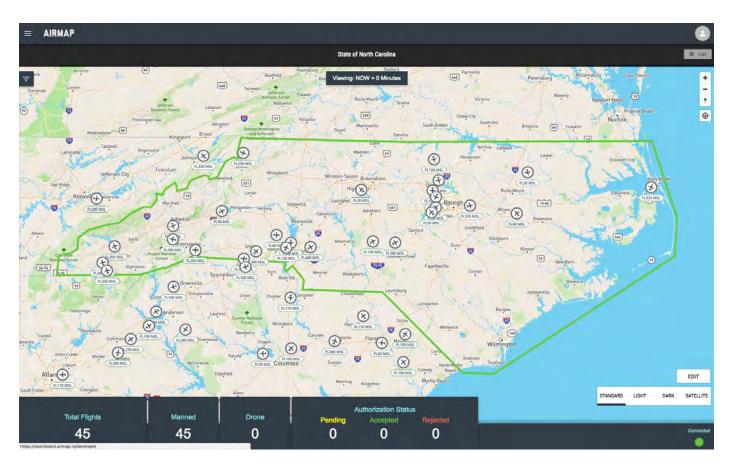

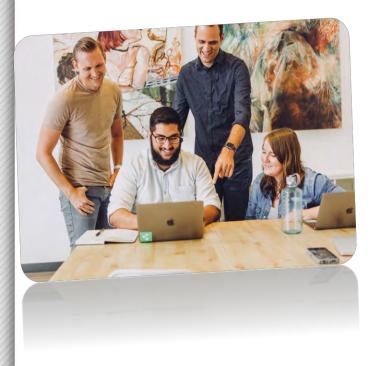
A Position Becomes Vacant

- A Mission Critical Memo to post and fill the position is submitted.
- Executive Management reviews request to post and fill.
- If approved, a Unit HR Representative is notified, and recruitment begins.



Job Posting

- Central HR receives requisition via NeoGov and creates job posting that is online for at least 5 business days.
- Positions historically difficult to fill or reposted may receive Enhanced Recruitment, which provides access to:
 - 850+ Social Media Groups with 12M+ potential candidates
 - 600+ Job Boards
 - 450+ Colleges & Universities including all 114 HBCU/MSIs & U.S. Top 100 Engineering Programs
 - 17,000+ Direct Connections in Transportation Industry
 - Employment Security Commission website
 - Targeted recruitment by NCDOT Talent Management



Screening Applications

- Applications are received via NeoGov and screened within 3 business days of the job posting closing.
- In order to qualify for position, applicants must meet education and experience requirements established by OSHR.
 - Applicants who do not meet the requirements, or possess the knowledge, skills and abilities, are sent an email notification that they do not meet the qualification standards.
 - Applicants who demonstrate they possess all posted knowledge, skills, and abilities are sent to hiring manager.
- Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities
 - Criteria an applicant must demonstrate beyond education and experience requirements to successfully perform job duties.
 - Established by the hiring manager in coordination with Central HR.



Interviews Are Conducted

- Hiring manager reviews applications and selects candidates to interview.
- After interviews are conducted and a candidate is chosen, the manager or Unit HR Representative completes the hiring package and submits the recommended applicant and salary in NeoGov.
- The hiring package goes through a series of approvals in NeoGov. This approval chain varies depending on internal processes. EEO reviews every package.
- Once each approval level is completed, the hiring package is automatically sent to Central HR in NeoGov.



Hiring Package

- The content needed for the hiring package:
 - HR Action Form
 - Candidate Selection Form
 - Job Application
 - Salary Qualification Worksheet
 - Equity Report
 - Relative Form
 - Annual Notification Placement Form (EEO Form)
 - Job Posting
 - Referred List
 - Education Verification Form



Central HR Reviews Hiring Package

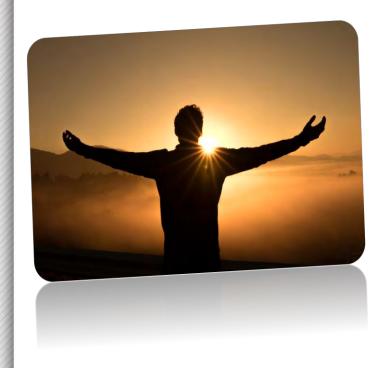
- Once Central HR Receives hiring package, all documentation is checked for accuracy and to ensure content meets OSHR policies. This is completed within 2 days.
- This package is submitted to a Central HR Supervisor for approval. The supervisor checks the subordinate's work and will either reject it for corrections or approve.
 This is completed within 2 days.
- The hiring package is then submitted to the HR Director's office for approval.



Hiring Package Review

Continued

- Once approval is received, Central HR notifies the Unit HR Representative of approval via email.
- Hiring packages that are salary exceptions or packages for which NCDOT does not have delegation must be submitted to OSHR before an approval is given.
 - An example of a package NCDOT does not have delegation for is an Engineering Supervisor III or higher.
- Any hiring package that is considered a salary exception is submitted to OSHR for review.
- These hiring packages are typically reviewed and approved by OSHR within 3 days. Once approval is received, Central HR notifies the Unit HR Representative of the approved salary.



Position Offer

- Once the hiring manager receives approval to offer the position, they contact the applicant and offer the position.
- Once the applicant accepts the position, an orientation date is established for new hires or applicants transferring from another agency.
- Upon reporting to work, the on-boarding process is completed for the applicant.
- All other applicants who were sent to the manager for consideration are notified they were not selected for the position.
