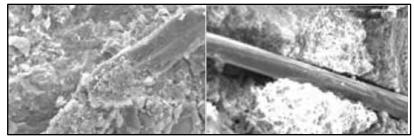

He called the meeting to order at 11:00 am, took a roll call and declared a quorum.

	Chairman Lathrop stated the meeting minutes were distributed prior to the meeting, and if there are no additions or corrections, the Chair would accept a motion that the minutes from the December 8, 2021, meeting be approved as submitted.

2. Financial Update – Stephanie King,	CFO	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King began by reporting on The Fast Five. First, she briefly discussed the Build NC Bonds and asked for the FC's consideration for BOT to vote this afternoon on a \$300M issuance. The rationale of the issuance is the favorable interest rates, project acceleration of the STIP, continued health of our trust fund cash, and acceleration of compliance with some of the attributes/requirements within the Build NC language itself. Currently, the State Treasurer 's office is assessing the timing of the issuance. Matt Lane will discuss this in further detail.	
	Mrs. King also discussed the Spend Plan Amendment 2. Within the Amendment is the Build NC, since the technical correction needed to do an issuance is now provided. In addition, some of the spend areas want to change their spend targets.	



These changes will increase the revenue and increase the overall spend. The Department will be asking the Board to consider this potentially for next month. This was also sent to the Office of State Budget for their consideration. Michelle Overby will discuss this amendment in detail.

The Department has revised the cash modeling approach through the partnership with SAS. Previously, the forecast was based on historic payout curves for the construction program. SAS is helping to better calibrate that forecast and implemented a short-term adjustment considering the pandemic conditions experienced. In addition, the Department is looking at a long-term forecasting methodology with SAS that would use more market rate factors for labor and materials. Based on the short-term programming implemented by SAS it was found that certain types of projects needed adjustments, and some did not. Projects that were over \$75m were impacted the most through the analytics that were done. Now with the short-term adjustment applied the Department is now within 1.9% of forecast to actuals. This new adjustment will better inform us of the cash impacts moving forward.

Mrs. King moved on to briefly discuss federal legislation. As mentioned in the last meeting, the 5-year Transportation Bill was passed. NCDOT received \$1.38 billion in appropriations as far as federal funding coming into DOT. The Department is still waiting for the administrative component to be able to access the money and is still operating on a continuing resolution through February 18th. The last continuing resolution received was for \$378m of Obligational Authority for this year. The Department will continue to look at the federal level for any updates on billing authority, this will impact some of the revenue that has come in the last couple of months. The infusion of cash into the National Highway Trust Fund has taken place from the General Fund thus the Federal Highway Trust Fund is currently solvent.

Mrs. King then brought up the Boards concerns on the Spend Plan Audit Response. She mentioned that the Department is continuing to work with SAS and E&Y to better forecast and compare the projects to the actuals. Also, the Department is implementing more project based forecasting this month instead of forecasting by programmatic types, getting forecast broken down to the projects themselves. The goal is to use this information and push it to the managers, to better manage their projects throughout the project lifecycle.

Mrs. King then discussed the revenues. The State revenues came in slightly higher than forecasted. The federal revenues have not reached expected goals for the last 2 months consecutively. However, expected revenues should be closer to what was forecasted when the federal funding and Obligational Authority is set. For our FY to date the Spend Plan revenues are within 2% of what was planned.

Mrs. King then discussed the expenditures. In December the expense projections were 4.7% below the actuals due to the maintenance and modal spending. As of December, the FYTD expenditure variance was -2.9% off from what was predicted. The monthly maintenance variance was primarily driven by contract resurfacing, general maintenance reserve and undeclared disasters.

The undeclared disasters will increase by \$30m due to the last 3 winter events that occurred in North Carolina (snow and ice removal). Mrs. King then mentioned that



	the Department did receive a FEMA payment, a large portion of which was for the March of 2014 winter storm.
	Mrs. King then went to discuss the cash position. The Department's Highway Fund is at \$1b and the Trust Fund is at \$956m. She also noted the Ferry Capital Special Fund was created. This is currently at \$22m. The last session law required that a Ferry Capital Special Fund be created to capture all revenue, toll revenue, advertising, concessions, and any revenue being generated in that division. This will be tracked by the routes.
	The average spend for the month of December was \$535m, 112.4 days of cash on hand. The open commitments (the liabilities on the books for the projects) are \$6.959m. Of this, 75% is from the construction program. Cash over open commitments is 28%. There are 18 new active projects that were let in December with the combined bid amounts at \$22.1m. There were 38 accepted completed projects at the end of December, which amounted to \$204.4m in final pays.
	Mrs. King lastly mentioned that in the packet some slides have been deleted from the old deck if there's something you would like to see let us know so we can address it.

3. Revenue Update - Burt Tasaico, PE	Director of Strategic Initiatives
	Mr. Tasaico provided a mid-year update of how the State transportation revenues are compared to the forecasts.
	Mr. Tasaico then showed how the Department is doing now compared to the SFY 2019 which was the last "normal" year (prior to the pandemic). In SFY2020 you will see there was a decline in state revenues. With 2019 as the base, to date, the revenues are 9.4% above where we were in 2019.
	Mr. Tasaico showed a comparison of the DMV fees, highway use tax and the motor fuel tax revenues compared 2019 vs 2022. All 3 sources combined are giving a higher percentage relative to where we were in 2019. Thus, FYTD the revenues are in good shape relative to where they were in prior years.
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Tasaico then presented a slide with the SFY 2022 to date 'target' vs 'actuals. He added that these reporting figures are slightly different from what Mrs. King presented as her numbers included federal aid revenues and other state revenues. In addition, her numbers are being compared to the Spend Plan. The numbers presented by Mr. Tasaico is a comparison to the actual forecast that the Office of State Budget and Management uses (same numbers reflected in the Governor's budget). Eventually the Spend Plan should be in sync once all the amendments are done.
	FYTD we are 1.4% or ~\$28.9m above where we said we would be in revenues.
	The DMV fees are a little bit behind. The DMV fees comprise of 3 different fees. Two of which are in the highway fund. The Vehicle inspection fee is behind in revenues and the main cause of the negative variance. Mr. Tasaico then stated his



	team is working on figuring out the cause. The variance is equivalent to 3 quarters of a percent of the total state revenue.
	Mr. Tasaico's team will look at where NCDOT stands in relation to the forecast, if adjustments are needed, and then work on updates for the biennium budget. which is needed for the carryover functions required.
	He stated that in late spring they will take 3 quarters of state fiscal year revenues and perform the 10-year revenue outlook. Things to keep an eye on are anything that may influence the short-term revenue forecasts (pandemic), geopolitical issues and how that will affect the consumer price index and the price of crude oil.

4. Build NC Bond Issuance - Matt Lane	e, Director of Finance
	Mr. Lane presented the NC Transportation Build NC Bonds, providing an overview of the Build. NC Bond program and presenting a proposal to move forward with a \$300m issuance in the current state fiscal year.
	Build NC is an important financing tool, ensuring that NCDOT can continue to deliver projects at both the regional and divisional tiers, improving infrastructure throughout the state.
	The Build NC Bond Act of 2018 became effective January 1st, 2019, since that time there have been 2 issuances one in 2019 and one in 2020 for a total amount of one billion dollars.
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Build NC bonds help accelerate the delivery of critical infrastructure at a low cost to the motoring public. The weighted average total interest costs for the prior two issuance is approximately 1.76% which is well below the current rate of inflation and below NCDOT 's mid-term planning inflation forecasts that the board recently adopted.
	Build NC bonds when issued on a regular cadence also helped build a stable and consistent capital program, which is advantageous for our partners, so that they can better anticipate future demand.
	NCDOT is proposing moving forward with a \$300m bond issuance in the current state fiscal year. The bond markets have been especially volatile in recent weeks, there are concerns around inflation, COVID variants, potential fed tightening, and geopolitical risks. But with that said, the recommendation is to move forward while rates remain near historic lows and there is still demand for high quality investment grade municipal debt. The 2019 and 2020 series bonds are AA+ rated.
	The Build NC bonds program was established by Senate bill 758. The conditions required prior to an issuance are:
	First, the total program is capped at \$3b through December 31st, 2028. Each individual issuance is capped at \$300m per fiscal year. To date, NCDOT has issued \$1b of bonds and it receives special legislative approval to issue \$700m of bonds in 2020. NCDOT would meet this compliance requirement.



Secondly, there's a maximum cash balance threshold test which was increased from 1 billion dollars to 2 billion dollars per session law 2021-180. However, per session law 2021-189 this threshold test has been waived altogether for any sales occurring prior to June 30th, 2022. Thus, NCDOT would not need to measure against this threshold if we were to sell in the current state fiscal year. NCDOT would meet this compliance requirement.

Thirdly, the act allows the debt Affordability Advisory Committee to establish a debt target, which has been set at a maximum debt service to revenue ratio of 6%. The actual ratio is expected to fall between 4% - 5% inclusive of the proposed issuance. NCDOT would meet this compliance requirement.

Finally, all issuances require a recommendation from the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer's office is currently assessing the timing of a potential issuance.

NCDOT has followed all procedural requirements required under the act. First contacting the State Treasurer 's office and the JLTO in April of 2021 to move forward guickly upon the passage of the state budget, which we now have.

There are a number of additional stipulations required under the legislation. Two of particular importance: First, funds must be split evenly between division need projects and regional impact projects over the course of the program. Funds allocated to divisions are done so equally among the divisions. Funds allocated to regions are done so, according to population estimates. Second, BOT must review and approve use of bonds. If BOT and additional parties' support this sale, it could possibly occur by June.

The supporting factors for moving forward with the issuance in the current state fiscal year are the favorable interest rate referenced earlier. For example, the cash model projects cash to peak in early 2022, followed by a draw down into 2023. Right now, expenditures have fallen short of projections due to labor and material shortages. As a labor market begins to stabilize and supply chain issues begin to ease we expect expenditures could re-accelerate.

Secondly, as mentioned there are requirements around how bond proceeds are to be allocated to divisions and regions. The proposed project list for this particular issuance is favorable for accelerating compliance with Senate bill 758 sections 2.3 and 2.4, ensuring an equitable distribution of bond proceeds to divisions and regions over the course of the program.

If the next issuance were to be pushed back considerably, there is no guarantee that a potential project list would be as favorable.

Finance is working closely with the planning and programming team over the coming months as the STIP is developed to match projects against expected bond proceeds from future issuances. There is additional analysis underway to identify NCDOT's full debt capacity in future years.

Mr. Lane then wanted to point out the estimated sources of uses which was prepared a few weeks prior to this meeting. This is just a frame of reference given NCDOT's potential credit rating and given a possible 5% coupon, we would expect to receive a healthy premium from an issuance.



	Mr. Lane also presented a project map for 2022 and the potential projects identified. There are 25 projects spread across 7 divisions in 6 regions. In addition, a map of historical projects that have been included in the 2019 and 2020 Build NC Issuances. The maps represent the statewide impact of the program itself,
ACTIONS TAKEN	A vote was taken to present this to the full Board to vote. Board member Clarke made a motion to present Build NC Bond Issuance for consideration by the full Board of Transportation. Board member Lail provided the second.

5. Spend Plan Amendment 1 Addendu	m - Michelle Overby, Director Cash Management & Forecasting
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Ms. Overby will discuss some of the changes that have happened since the Spend Plan Amendment 1. The Department is asking to seek BOT's approval to amend the 2022-23 Spend Plan, which will hopefully be voted on next month by both BOT and the Office of State Budget.
	Changes to the proposed Amendment 2: The Build NC Bond is reflected, as legislation received a technical correction to allow for a spring bond closing in 2022; The incremental federal transportation dollars from the IIJA are not included in this amendment; NCDOT business areas have requested certain changes; and the Department is utilizing new SAS forecasting methodologies for construction projects that incorporate the COVID effects that we have been seeing.
	Ms. Overby presented a slide showing the different business areas new submissions which will include a reduction of \$21m for the bridge program. A slight increase in Secondary Roads (\$3m) and Contingency (\$3m). Aviation (\$112m) and Ferry (\$21m) are both requesting increases. In total, the overall recommended change would be a \$118m increase in our targets.
	The Department is requesting a \$364m revenue change. There is a variance of \$18m in the State revenues per session law 2021-180. There is additional revenue for the Ferry Capital Fund, Aviation Aero Fund, and the Aviation State Capital and Infrastructure Fund as well as the Build NC bond proceeds.
	The overall Construction changes increased by \$113m than the approved plan. This is primarily due to the Build NC bond issuance and \$17.5m of equipment purchases. The overall Maintenance is \$15m less than the approved plan due to requested reductions on the Spend Plan targets.
	The overall Other Modes are \$134m more than the approved plan due to the Ferry and the Airports. This will include 18 new airports.
	The Other Expenditures has a variance of \$6m less than the approved plan due to the administration area. The Total Expenditures is \$226m more than the approved plan.



	For 2023, there is an overall increase in revenue of \$269m. This is primarily due to the Build NC issuance. Total construction increased by \$122m. Again, this is due to Build NC. There are no changes in Maintenance, Other Modes, or Other Expenditures for SFY 2023. The Total Expenditure change for SFY 2023 increased by \$122m.

6. Powell Bill – Majed Al-Ghandour, PE	Assistant Director of Planning and Programming
	Mr. Al-Ghandour discusses important items for the Powell Bill.
	The objective of the Powell Bill is to assist municipalities to maintain their local streets. The first distribution was in 1951 for \$4.5m there were 386 participating municipalities.
	Mr. Al-Ghandour noted the amount distributed from 2015 to 2022. The last Powell Bill amount was raised to \$154.9m and an additional amount of \$4.3m was provided for other municipal assistance.
	Allocation formula per NCGS 136.41.1(a) - Total funds available is split 75/25 then each amount is divided by total population or total mileage to get a rate per capital and per mile. Per Capital Rate = \$21.96 and Per Mile Rate: \$1,687.32
	The Largest recipient was Charlotte (\$13.6m). The smallest recipient was Falkland (\$1,116.00).
	In addition, they are required to o receive those expenditures and report back to the legislatures before October 1st on how they were used; the majority goes to paving and resurfacing.
	Finally, the Board Members receive 'Item P'; this shows when a town gives their streets to the states system or highway system, or its added to a local system.

## Detailed Report

## Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$751.9 million in January 2021 to \$1,155.8 million in January 2022. An increase of \$404.0 million or 53.7%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures during FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- **HF Revenues & Expenses** Revenues increased from \$201.3 million in January 2021 to \$267.3 million in January 2022. An increase of \$66.0 million or 32.8%. This increase was due to a \$25.6 million increase in motor fuel tax revenues, a \$45.7 million increase in highway use tax lease revenues (new alternate highway use tax on short-term vehicle rentals), and a \$5.3 million decrease in license & fee revenues in January 2022 compared to January 2021. Expenses (current accounts) decreased by \$5.4 million or 24.0% in January 2022 compared to January 2021.
- **HF YTD** January 2022 YTD revenues exceeded January 2021 YTD revenues by \$51.5 million, and January 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) were less than January YTD 2021 by \$5.1 million.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$563.9 million in January 2021 to \$941.9 million in January 2022. An increase of \$378.0 million or 67.0%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures in FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- HTF Revenues & Expenses Revenues increased from \$119.2 million in January 2021 to \$128.8 million in January 2022. An increase of \$9.6 million or 8.1%. This increase was due to a \$8.2 million increase in motor fuel tax revenue, a \$2.5 million increase in highway use tax revenue, and a \$1.1 million decrease in fees revenue in January 2022 compared to January 2021. Expenses (current accounts) decreased by \$0.2 million or 4.7% in January 2022 compared to January 2021.
- **HTF YTD** January 2022 YTD revenues exceeded January 2021 YTD revenues by \$56.3 million, and January 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) exceeded January YTD 2021 expenses (current accounts) by \$14.9 million.

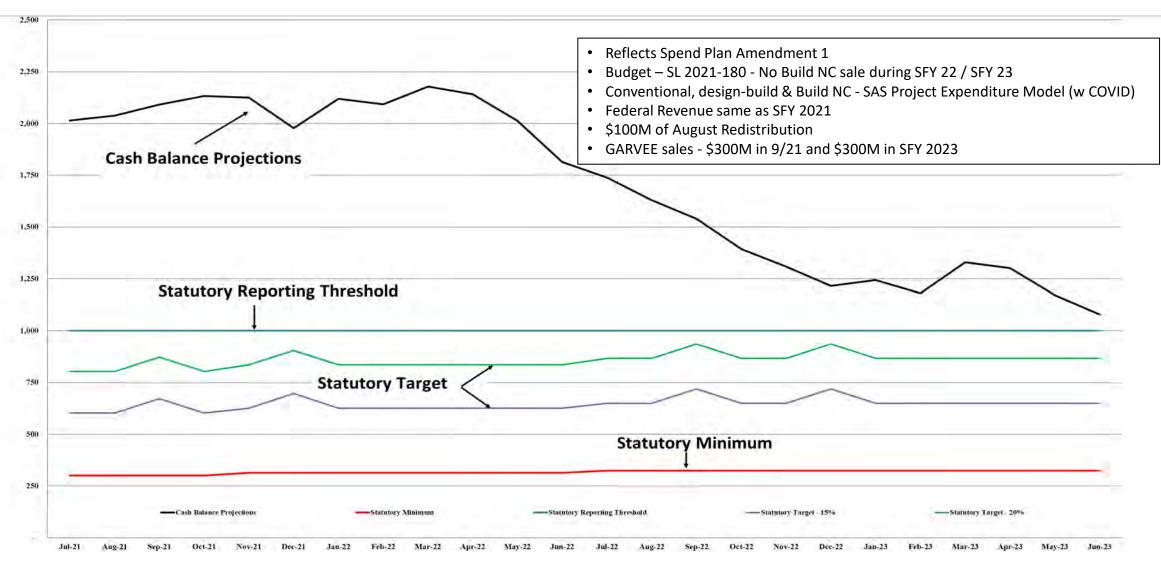

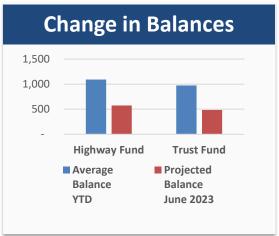

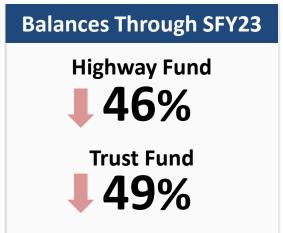

### 24 Month Cash Forecast – SFY 22 / SFY 23 Spend Plan

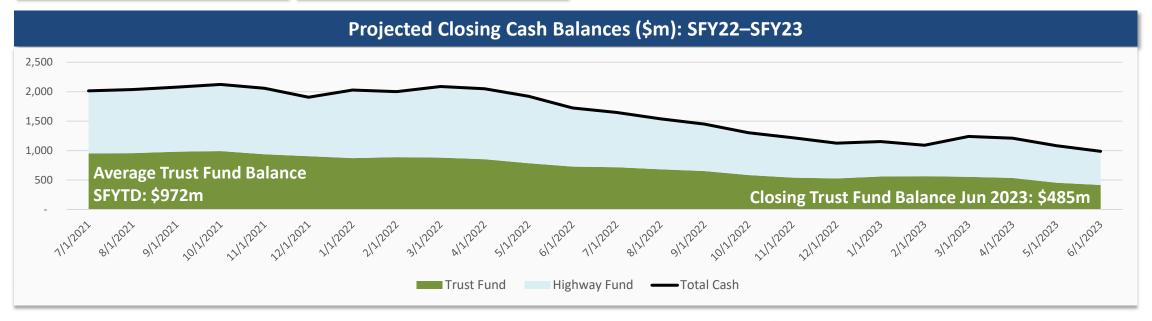


## Cash – Highway Fund v Trust Fund

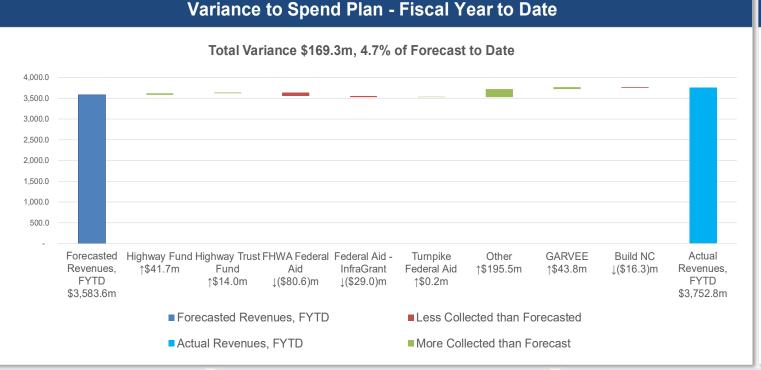

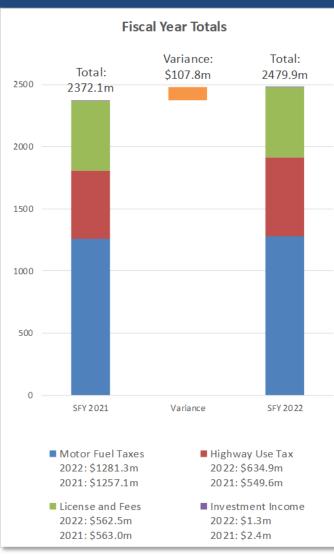

### Highway Fund & Trust Fund Details January 2022(\$m)





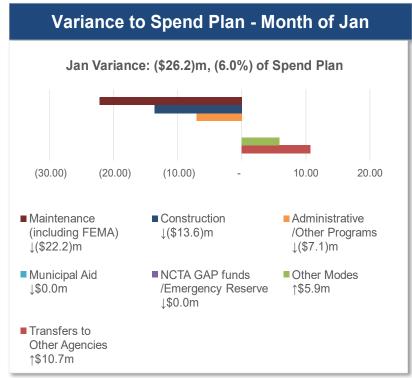

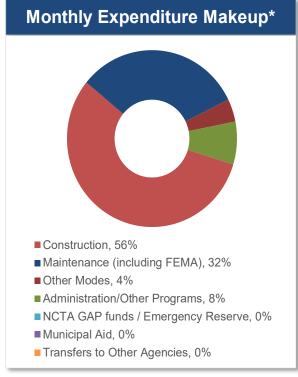

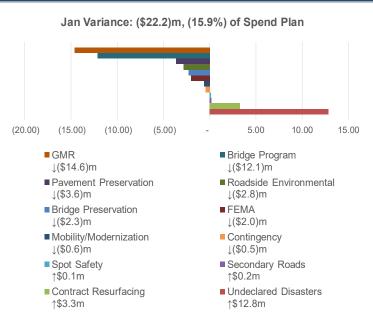

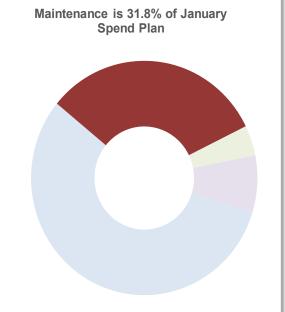

### **Variance to Spend Plan - Month of Jan**



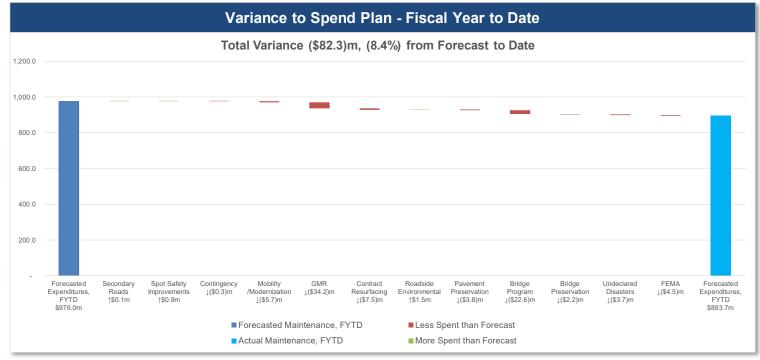

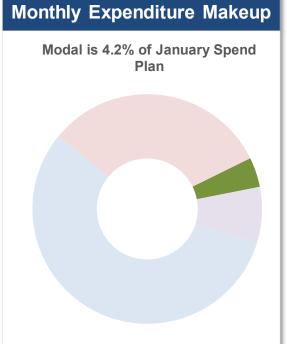

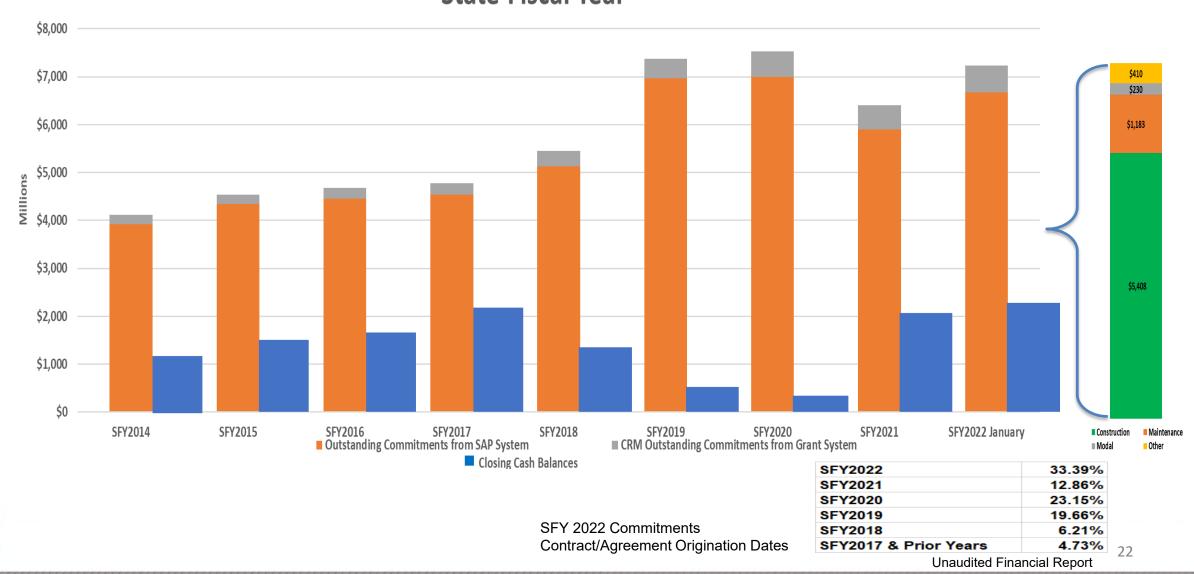

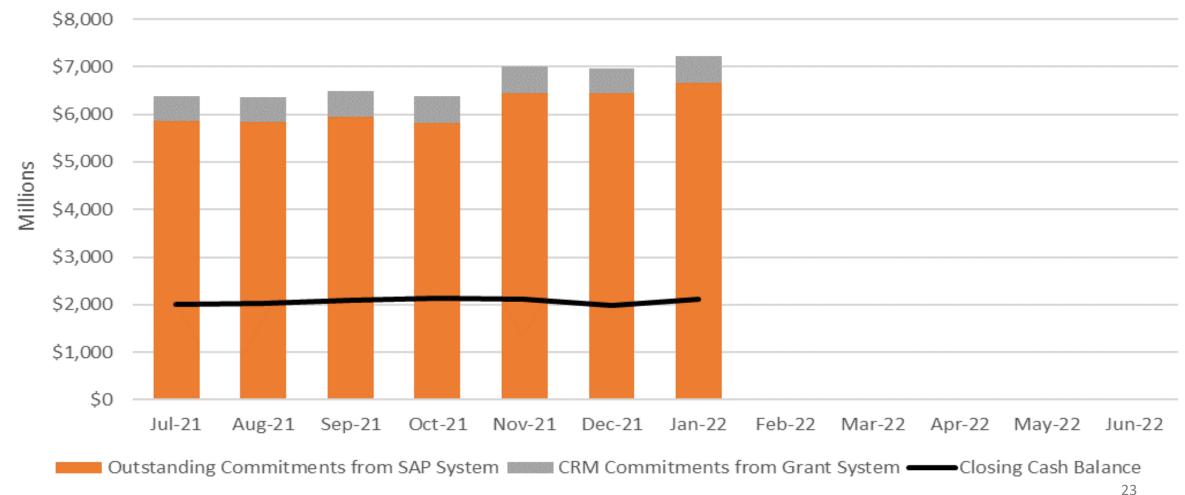

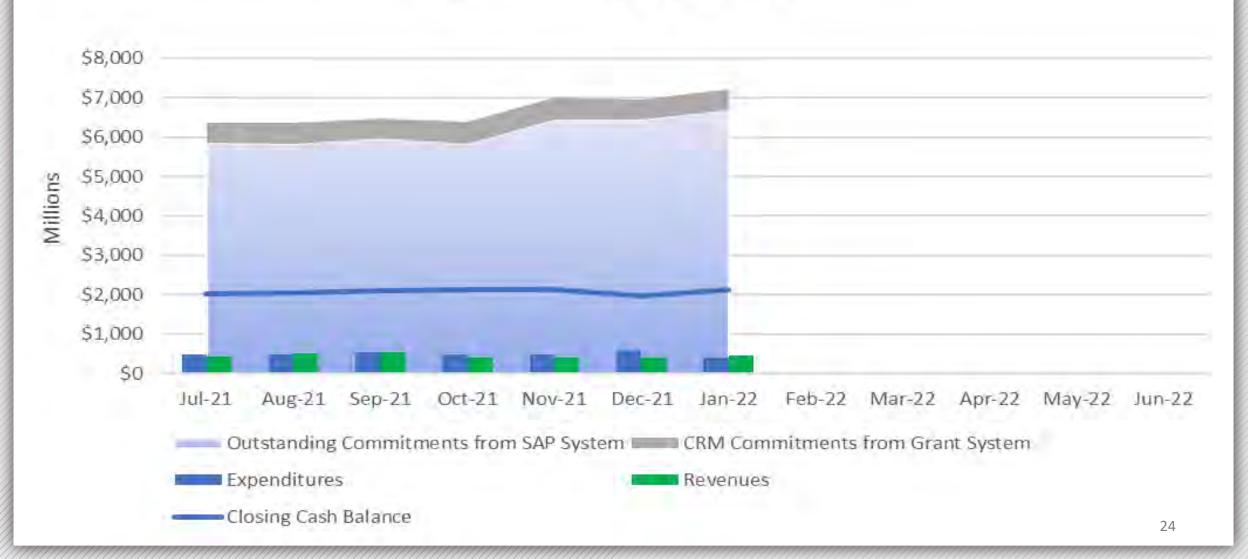
## NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

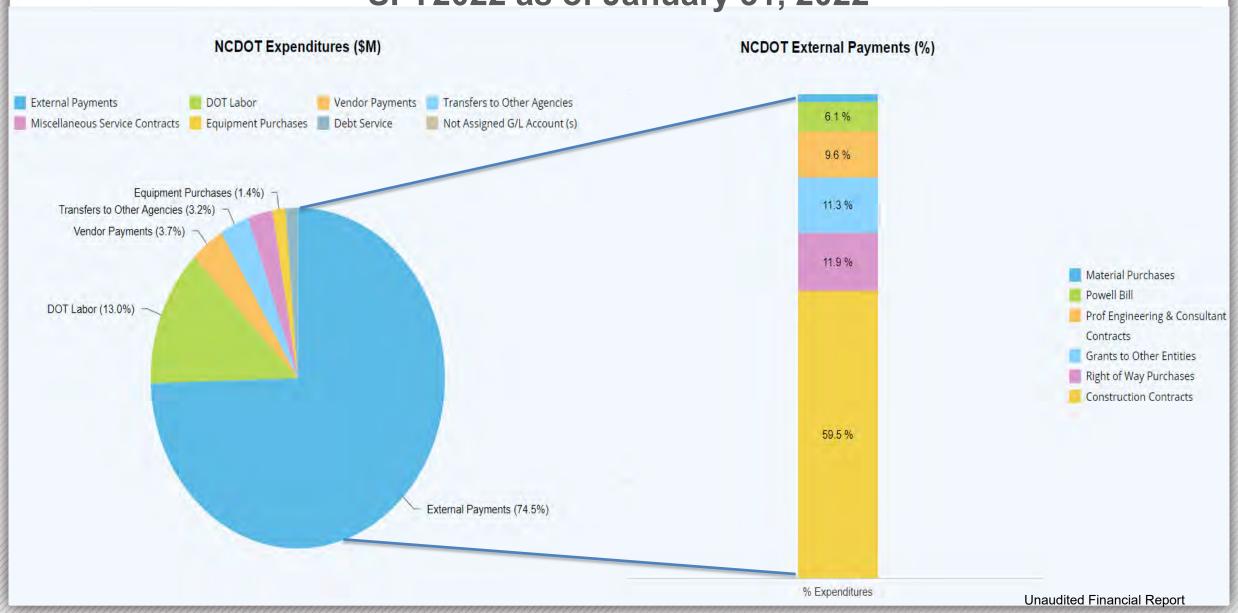


## Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

January 2022 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For January 2022, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.00 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$627 million and \$836 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for January was \$2.098 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$313 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

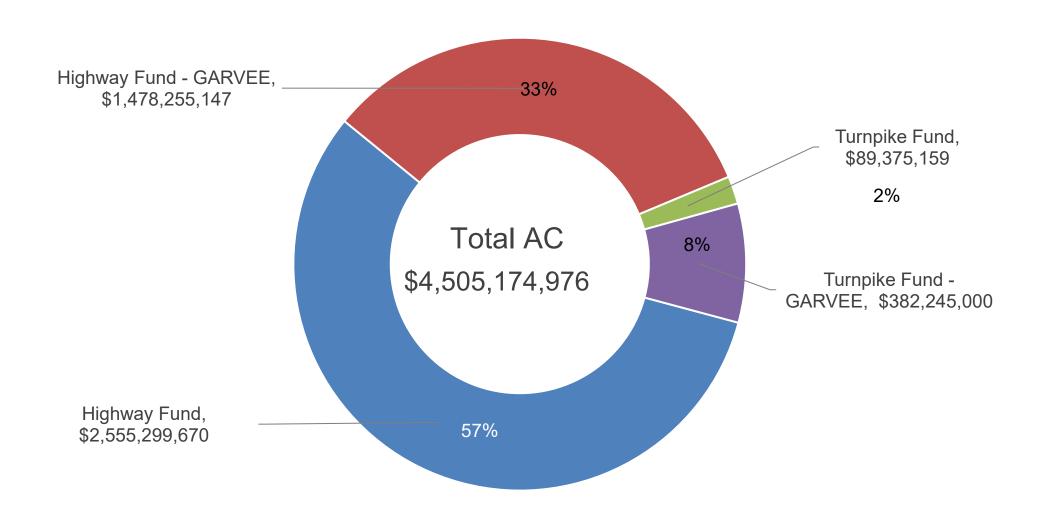

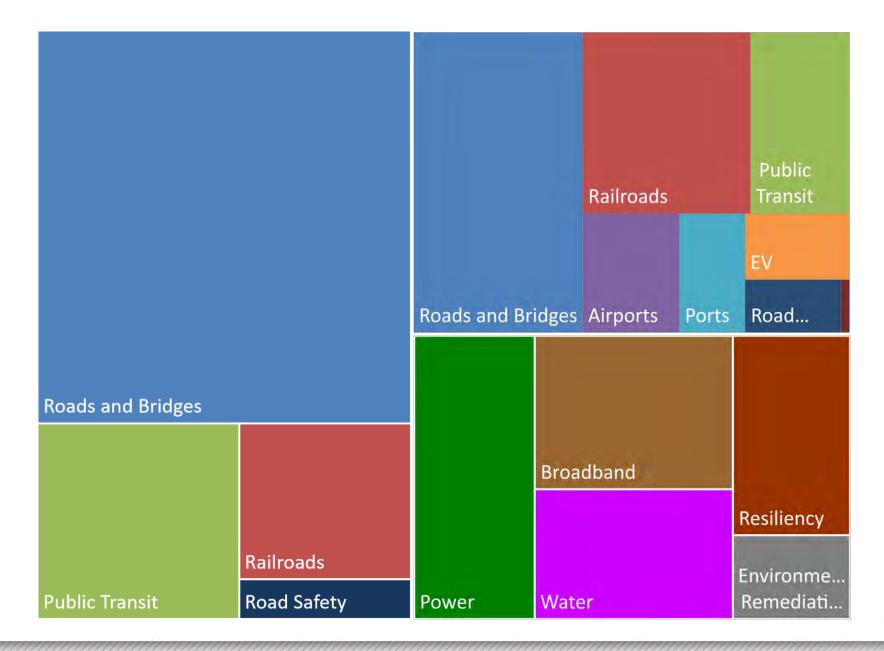

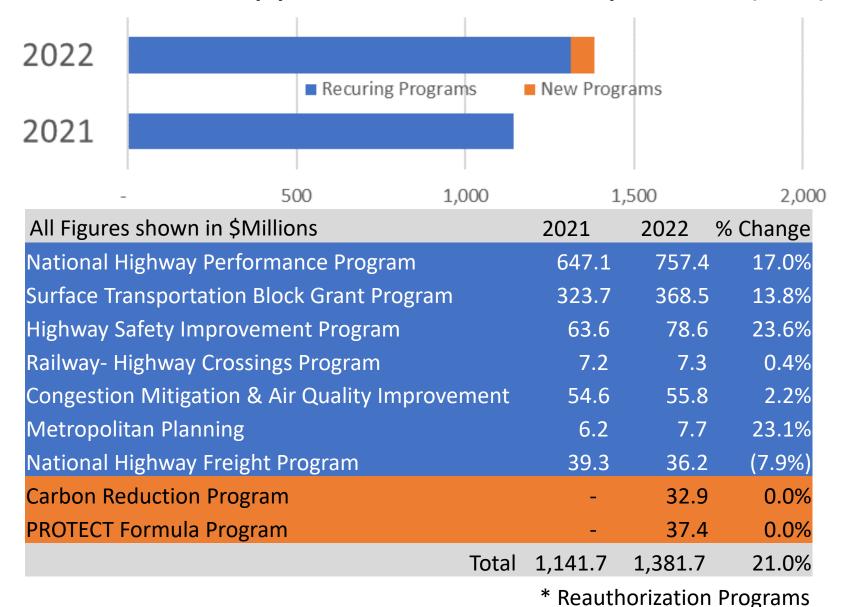

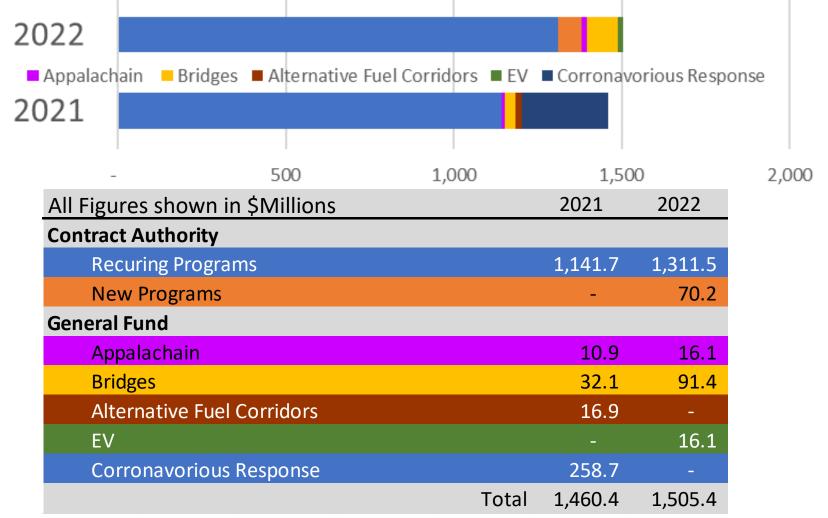

# FFY 2022 IIJA Apportionment\* Comparison (\$M)



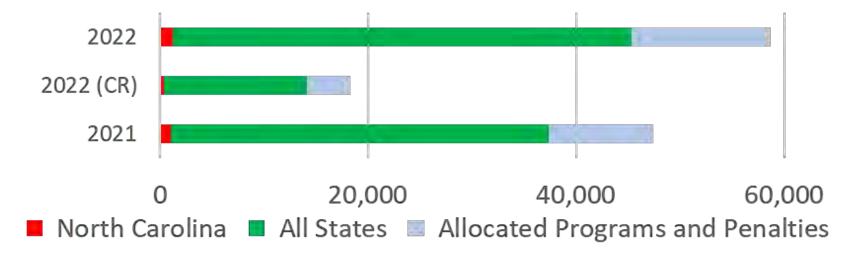
# FFY 2022 IIJA Apportionment\* Comparison (\$M)

# DBE (Disadvantaged Business Enterprises) Program

DBE is a legislatively mandated USDOT program that applies to federal-aid highway dollars expended on federally assisted contracts issued by USDOT recipients such as NCDOT.

# Objectives of the DBE Program and Certification

- ◆ Ensure nondiscrimination in transportation contracting (e.g., highways)
- ♦ Create a level playing field where DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts
- ♦ Ensure only firms that fully meet eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs
- ♦ Assist in development of firms to compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE program
- ♦ Certification is a tool to help a firm grow its business

#### What is a DBE?

DBEs (Disadvantaged Business Enterprises) are for-profit small businesses where *socially* and *economically* disadvantaged individuals **own at least 51 percent interest** and control and manage daily business operations.

<u>Socially Disadvantaged Groups</u>: African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific and Subcontinent Asian Americans, and women are presumed to be socially and economically disadvantaged.

<u>Economically Disadvantaged Requirement</u>: An <u>individual</u> must have a Personal Net Worth (PNW) that does not exceed 1.32 Million.

SBA (Small Business Administration) Size Standard Requirement (13 CFR Part 121): A <u>firm</u> must meet SBA size criteria and have average annual gross receipts (over the previous <u>five</u> years based on primary industry type of work) not to exceed \$23.98 Million.

DBE Statutory Cap Requirement (49 CFR 26.65 (b)): A *firm's* average annual gross receipts over the firm's previous three fiscal years does not exceed \$26.29 Million.

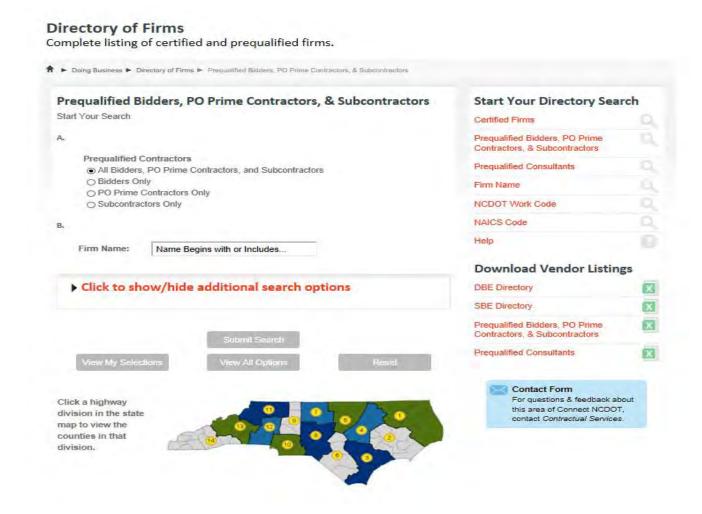

# MEETING CONTRACT GOAL

#### **DBE Contract Goals**

It is possible that a goal is not assigned on every contract:

(A) If the DBE goal is more than zero, the Contractor shall exercise all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure that DBEs participate in at least the percent of the contract as set forth above as the DBE goal.

(B) If the DBE goal is zero, the Contractor shall make an effort to recruit and use DBEs during the performance of the contract.

## **Achieving Contract Goals at Bid Time**

#### Two ways Contractors may comply with regulations:

1- Meet the goal by contracting to DBEs (No GFE Required)

2- GFE Required if prime contractor does not meet the DBE Goal

#### What is a Good Faith Effort (GFE)?

Defined under 49 CFR, Appendix A

#### **Good-Faith Efforts are:**

- ➤"...those that one could reasonably expect a bidder to take if the bidder were <u>actively and aggressively</u> trying to obtain DBE participation sufficient to meet the DBE contract goal."
- All necessary and reasonable steps the bidder took to achieve the goal which, by their scope, intensity, and appropriateness, could reasonably be expected to obtain sufficient DBE participation.

\*Mere pro forma efforts are not considered good faith efforts.

## **Examples of Good Faith Efforts (GFE)**

- ♦ Soliciting through minority outlets (The Institute, newspapers, Hispanic Contractors Association, Native American Organizations, etc.)
- ♦ Reviewing the job to determine what work can be carved out for subcontractors in order to meet the goal
- ♦ Providing working links for the plans and contacts for the division staff for the project
- ♦ Attending and participating in NCDOT-OCR Community Engagement Series or other outreach and networking efforts
- ♦ Other services a prime can provide to your subcontractors to encourage participation

# CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

#### **During Construction: Counting DBE Participation to Meet Goal**

What is a CUF? Per 49 CFR 26.55 A DBE performs a "commercially useful function" (CUF) when it is responsible for execution of the work of the contract by actually carrying out its responsibilities by actually performing, managing, and supervising the work involved... A DBE does not perform a CUF if its role is limited to that of an extra participant in a transaction, contract, or project through which funds are passed in order to obtain the appearance of DBE participation.

Meeting DBE Goals is a Contractual Requirement and Committed DBE Firms (listed in the back of the contract) must be utilized on the project.

In order for a prime contractor to receive credit towards the DBE goal, the DBE must perform a CUF (Commercially Useful Function).

CUF Monitoring by: NCDOT Project Inspectors and OCR Compliance Officers review DBEs for compliance with the CUF requirements for DBE participation credit.

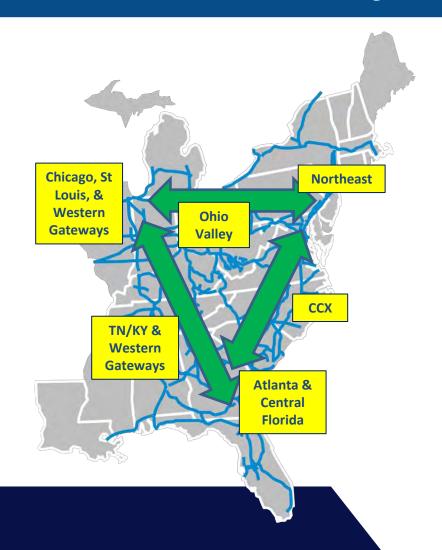


#### **CSX Intermodal Network Overview**

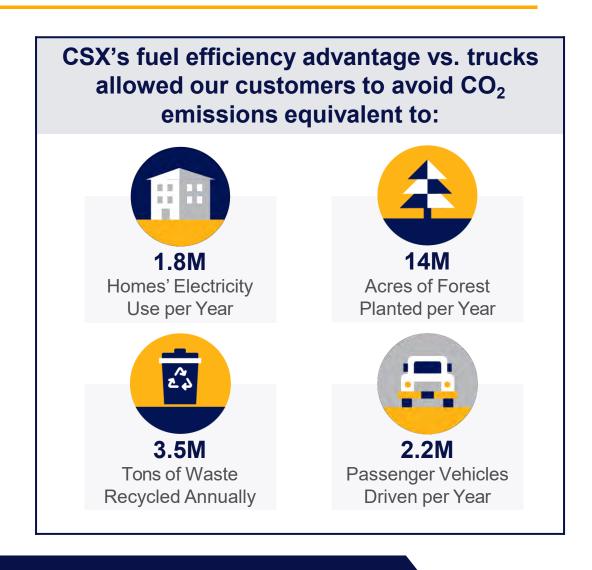

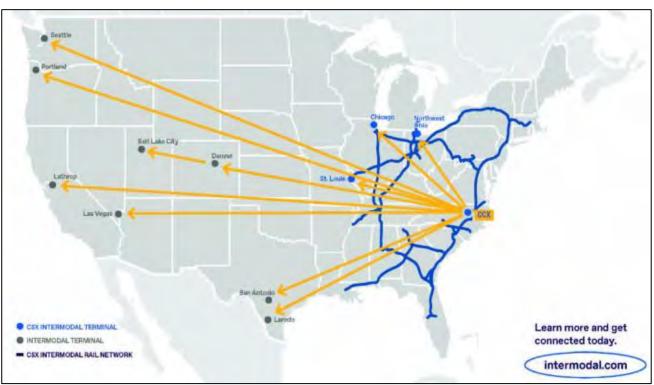






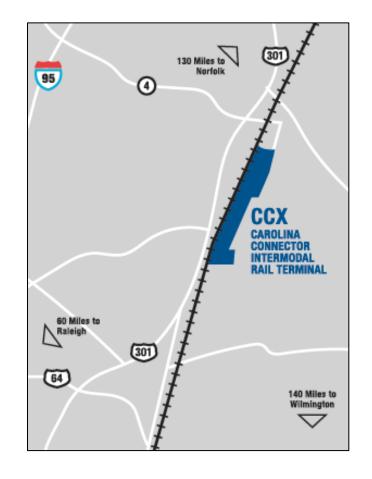

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## **TECHNICAL APPROACH**





### WHAT IS A DISPARITY STUDY?

A disparity study is an objective research tool that determines whether an inference of active or passive discrimination can be made with regard to a governmental agency's contracting or contracting in the agency's marketplace.

Discrimination, which may be the current affects of past discrimination, is determined through quantitative (statistical) and qualitative (anecdotal) evidence, as well as an examination of current policies and procedures. The findings of the disparity study will result in recommendations by the study team to remedy any discrimination or disparities found. The recommendations, if accepted, are intended to be implemented as policy.

# WHAT IS THE LEGAL BASIS FOR A DISPARITY STUDY?

It should be noted that some of the data sources utilized for availability did not delineate whether Asian American owned firms were Subcontinent Asians, therefore those firms were all included in the Asian American owned firm category. This means the availability of Subcontinent Asian American owned firms could be understated which could account for their overutilization. If all Asian-American owned firms were counted together, there would be a statistically significant underutilization.

## OVERALL FINDINGS

Disparity was examined using alternative availability methods (NCDOT prequalified firms, Hoovers/Dun & Bradstreet, and on smaller projects (<\$500,000 and <\$1 million)).

With some exceptions, disparity was found using different availability measures.



### **OVERALL FINDINGS**

A regression analysis found that disparities by race, ethnicity, or gender status of the firm owners remained after controlling for capacity and other race and gender-neutral factors.

This statistical evidence found support in the anecdotal evidence of the experiences of firms in NCDOT's marketplace.
