SUMMARY: There are a total of 31 agreements for approval by the Board of Transportation.

#### Statewide

Federal Railroad Administration (FRA)

This agreement between the Department and the FRA covers the acquisition of approximately 55 miles of the CSX Transportation "S-Line" rail corridor between Raleigh and Ridgeway, NC. On December 15, 2021, the Department received notification of a \$47,551,484 award as a result of a FY20 CRISI FRA Grant application. This acquisition is to be conducted by the Department in collaboration with CSXT. The estimated cost to the Department is \$11,887,871.

North Carolina Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (NCDNCR) 11180 This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the NCDOT and NCDNCR transfers the responsibility for ordering of the North Carolina Highway Historical Markers from NCDOT to NCDNCR per Session Law 2021-180 §41.56. NCDOT is required to transfer the amount specified by the NC General Assembly (\$100,000.00 for FY2022) annually from NCDOT highway maintenance funds to NCDNCR for the purchase any historical markers. NCDOT is still responsible for the installation of the historical markers.

#### **Division 1**

Town of Hertford Perquimans County 80110 11087 The Project consists of relocation and preservation of the historic 1928 swing span truss from US 17 Business to Missing Mill Park. Preservation includes removal, containment and disposal of lead paint and repainting truss the original color. The Department will perform the work. The Municipality shall reimburse the Department an estimated \$800,000.

North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission Northampton County 36249.4452 1000013315 The Project consists of conditioning the stone base and paving a section of roadway and parking lot of Odom Boat Landing off Bryantown Road in Northampton County. The Department will perform the work. The estimated total reimbursement to the Department is \$95,000.

#### **Division 3**

City of Wilmington New Hanover County 2023CPT.03.13.10651 11092 This project consists of streetscape improvements implemented by the Municipality on US 17 (Dawson and Wooster Streets) between SR 1217 (17th St) to US 421 (3rd St). 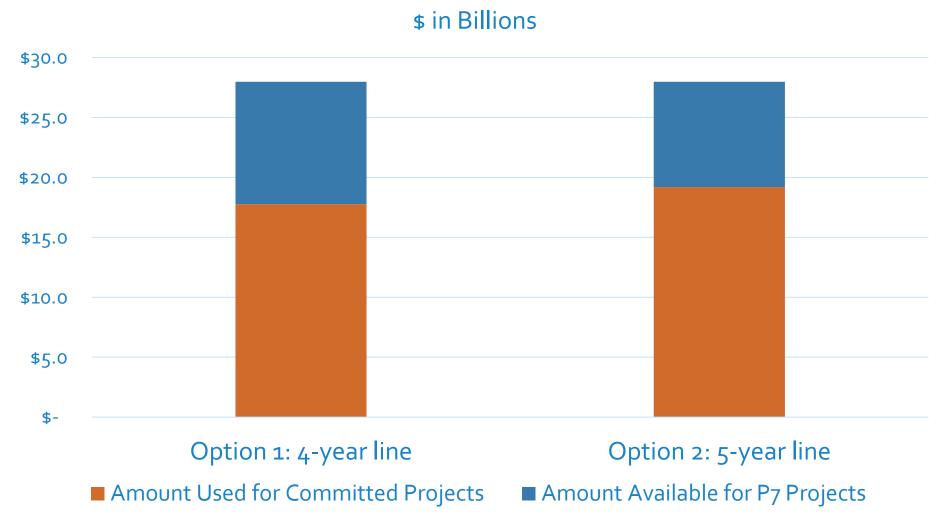

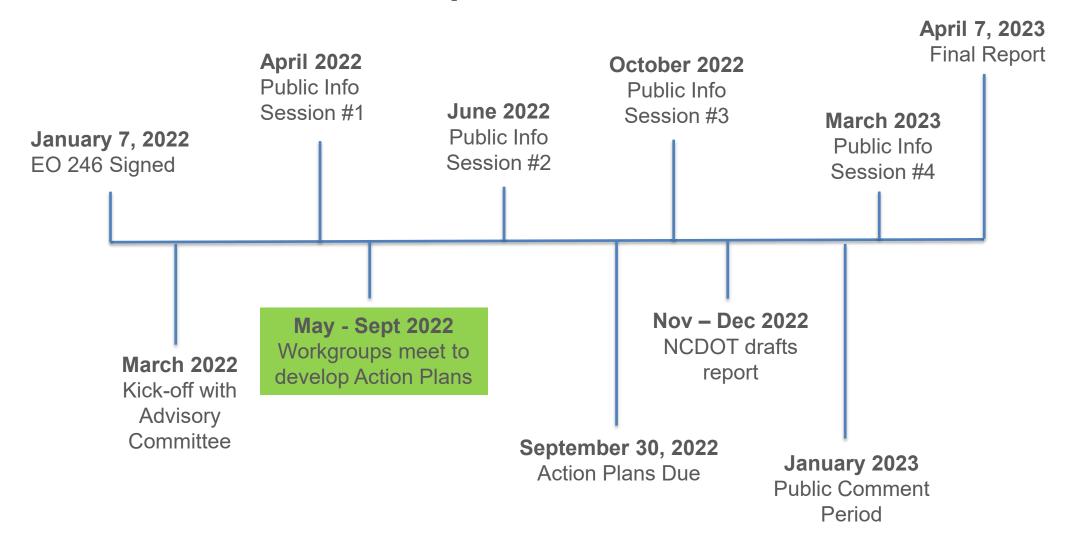

### Summary of HMIP Legislation

- Session Law 2014 -100, Section 34.11 (a,b): the North Carolina General Assembly established the Highway Maintenance Improvement Program (HMIP)
- Session Law 2017 -57: to support the need for a more holistic approach to maintenance, the Highway (Pavements), Bridge and Routine Maintenance Improvement Programs were merged and are now managed under a single "Highway Maintenance Improvement Program", effective January 1, 2020
- Program mandated in G.S. 136-44.3A
- 5-year schedule for highway pavement, bridge and routine maintenance activities.
- Based on the previous FY funding allocations

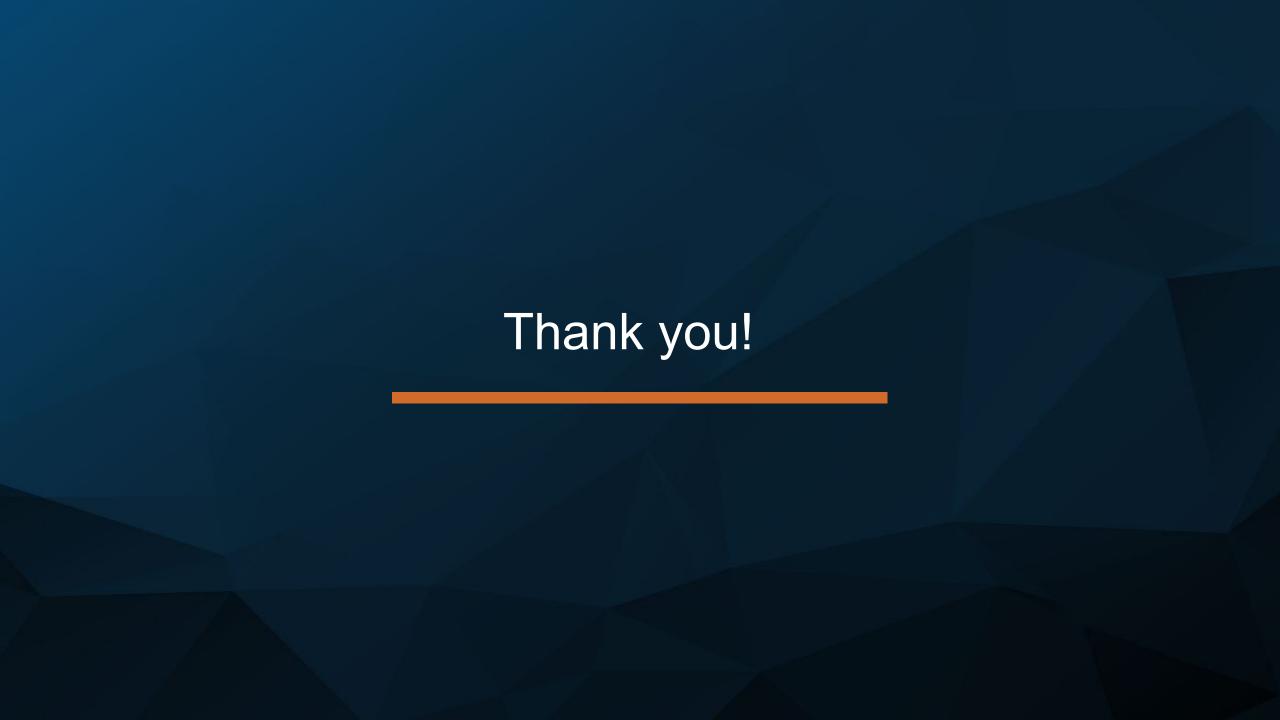

The TLG-1412 Portable Traffic Signal Set is manufactured by Ver-Mac out of Houston, Texas. It is currently under evaluation and listed on the Approved Products List (APL) as NP21-8990. 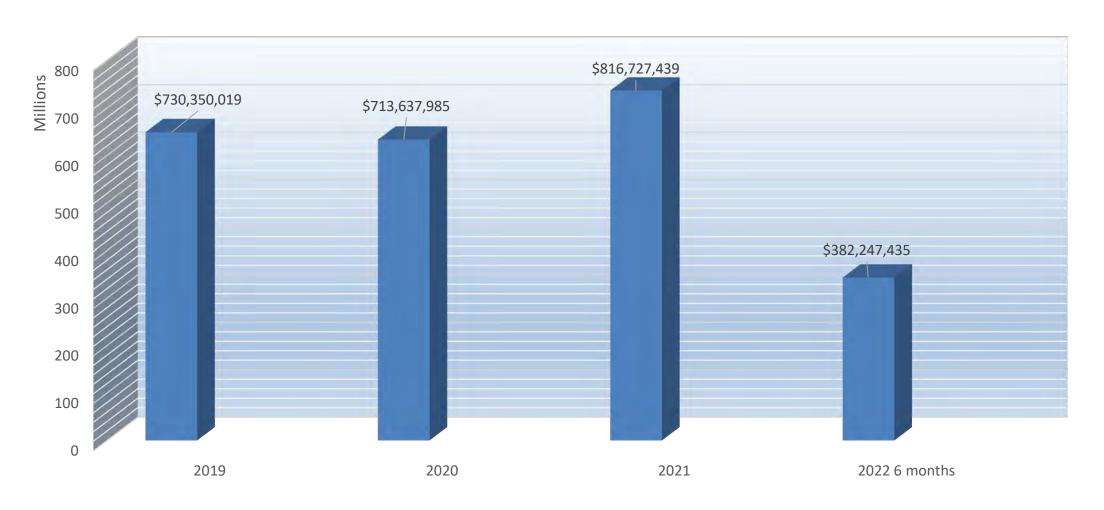

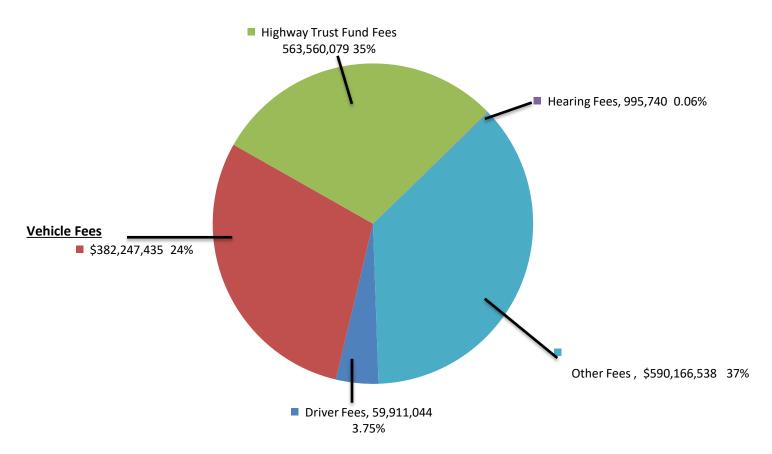
### **HEARING FEES**

2. Financial Update – Stephanic	e King, CFO
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. King started off by stating that the Department is planning for our year-end, we have a short session at the General Assembly, and we anticipate revenues being higher for the next fiscal year. The Department is working on the expansion budget request, this involves working with our various business units and discussing their needs for the next fiscal year. Although it is the second year of the biennium, we have a continuation budget. After feedback form the business units, we will meet with Secretary Boyette and provide information to the State Budget Office (March 23rd) for consideration.
	Mrs. King then discussed Federal funding updates. NCDOT is still operating under the continuing resolution that was going to last until March 11th. To date, NC has



received \$377.8M of obligation authority. We are still constrained on what we can bill Federal Highway. In the last continuing resolution (CR) we did not receive any new obligation authority (OA), due to some type of appropriations bill in the works. There is some movement in what Congress plans to do with the Omnibus Spending Bill. Mrs. King sat in on the 'Funding and Finance Committee' where they discussed a possible additional obligational redistribution in August. Once we get a true OA, the fiscal team will work on billing out that money for our construction projects, in turn getting us in good shape to get additional distribution.

Mrs. King then discussed the technical correction to the spend plan including Build NC approved by the State Treasurer last week. The Counsel of State will take a vote on April 5th. If approved, we can move forward with the financing calendar leading up to the projected closing date of May 19th.

The last budget bill earmarked certain projects at the Department of Commerce. We received \$190M for the following projects: \$15M Buncombe Co interchange; \$135M Randolph Co battery plant site, roadwork and wetland mitigation; \$35M Piedmont-Triad airport roadwork; and \$5M AeroX directed grant for urban advanced air mobility system.

Revenues - State revenues are higher than projected in the spend plan. Our Highway Use Taxes are still coming in slightly greater than anticipated. The Commerce money increased 'Other' Revenues. HF revenues came in at \$40M higher.

FYTD expenditures are under by \$124M (3.5%). However, in comparison to last year we are spending more in all expenses. We are still working on pinpointing the causes of underspending. As of now we see some of the material and labor market issues appear to be improving. As we head into spring season of heavy activity, we will gain more insight.

Cash is still over \$2B. Cash on hand is at 116 days. Our open commitments have increased to \$7,231M as we have entered into more contracts, 75% of which are in construction. We accepted 24 new projects in January.

Mrs. King then pointed out that when we see that 75% of our payout is in construction it tells us we need to make sure both of our funds stay healthy. The finance team has been working with the new SAS model and EY to provide a better picture of our cash. The market volatility is adjusted using the new short-term covid fix from SAS. A year from now we see where we will be with cash given these indicators. Our HF's projected cash will be 46% less and our HTF's cash will be 49% less. Thus, we are looking at exhausting \$1B in cash in the next year. The General Assembly wants us to keep our cash between 15%-20% (\$627M-\$836M) of our appropriations. Based on all the factors in play we expect to be around \$1B in June 2023. We are continuing to use the resources available to ensure there are no surprises and ensure both our funds stay healthy.

Mrs. King then asked the board to provide any feedback so that the finance team can continue to provide helpful and insightful information.

3. Revenue Update/ IIJA Update - Burt Tasaico, PE Director of Strategic Initiatives		
	Mr. Tasaico will focus on the federal aid. He pointed out the IIJA transfer from the Federal GF was made in December and the Federal Highway Trust Fund is now healthy.	
	A quick recap of what we know with IIJA. We received some apportionment notices, but nothing for ferry yet. In FFY 2021 we received apportionments of \$1,141M vs \$1,381M in FFY 2022. There are two new programs: Carbon Reduction Program and PROTECT Formula program.	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Tasaico then showed a graph comparing the authorization portion vs what is coming out of the general fund. Another graph was displayed to show the Obligation Authority Comparison. NCDOT uses the Obligation Authority in the Cash Model and the STIP calculation. As of now we have estimated the obligation authority; once the OMNIBUS bill gets published, we hope to have an actual number to report within 2 months.	
	The House is looking to vote on all the central programs in the bill before it goes to the Senate. The House is aware that the Senate may not act by the Friday deadline, soit is also approving another continuing resolution through March 15 <sup>th</sup> . In case the Senate does not approve the Omnibus bill by Friday, there is a continuing resolution that will continue to provide funding for all federal agencies.	
	We did not receive notice from FHWA on additional continuing resolutions which is what gives us billing authority and allows for repayment from the federal government. In conclusion, we are still waiting to get final IIJA numbers.	
	Mr. Tasaico then went on to discuss Crude Oil and Consumption. He showed a graph giving a breakdown of types of crude oil uses and what influences prices (current conditions, consumer demand expectations, supply and inventories, and geopolitical events).

	Michelle Overby started off with discussing the SAS updates.

The transition has allowed us to streamline and enhance the forecasting capabilities. Ms. Overby highlighted the 5 differences to the new forecasting process: Project Identification, Project Grouping and Classification, Awarded, Not Billing, General Enhancements and Supplemental Agreement/Duration, and COVID effects.	
	Project Identification. Under the old system forecasts were made at the lowest TIP level. Under the new system, we are able to use a combination of TIP and WBS data from multiple HiCAMS tables and the unawarded project data from our comprehensive project list. Forecasts are made at the WBS level to properly

	Awarded, Not Billing. In the old system all the projects had to be in an access data file to be included in the forecast. That process was eliminated due to the automation of this process. Now, all contract level attributes come in directly from HiCAMS.	
	Project Grouping and Classification. Under the old system, all future projects were classified as conventional (STIP C-Let) and then identified as design build after the project award. There were also a lot of exclusions that staff had to keep up with. Under the new system, all future projects can be identified based on letting type from the CPL model (Design Build, STIP C-Let, STIP D-Let, Safety C-Let, Safety D-Let projects). The new system also identifies HF Maintenance projects administered through HICAMS (CR,PP,BP,BPR) through Funds Application in SAF and models them accordingly. Prevents double counting since its by WBS. In addition, the new system can identify GARVEE, Build NC, INFRA, and BUILD/RAISE Grant projects using Bond/Grant indicators.	
	identify project funding. One HiCAMS project can be associated to several WBS elements. We can assign the appropriations designation to each WBS within a contract – allowing us to break out the type of projects. For example, in the past we would have one contract with multiple projects, they were lumped together and designated as one type. Now with the new system, we can break them out.	

#### **DISCUSSION SUMMARY**

Spend Plan Amendment #2

Ms. Overby started off by mentioning the changes to Amendment #2 since the last meeting. One of the main changes since the last meeting is we received approval on March 2nd for the Build NC Bond issuance. We received \$190M in economic development. Business areas put in requests for changes. This month we are seeking approval for the Spend Plan Amendment #2. OSBM approved this amendment on February 25th, 2022. The Federal Transportation legislation was passed but it is not reflected in the Spend Plan as we are waiting on guidance for the NC share. The new SAS forecasting methodology for construction projects incorporating short term COVID effects is reflected in Spend Plan Amendment #2. We continue to work with SAS on long term solutions.

NCDOT is seeking to increase total expenditures by \$441 million. The revenue outlook has increased by \$520 million between Amendment 1 and Amendment 2.



	This change is primarily driven by additional funds appropriated by the state legislature and a proposed Build NC sale in June 2022. Total expenditures increased by \$441 million due to increases in Construction & Mode expenditures. Construction expenditures are driven largely by the Build NC bond sale. Mode expenditures increased due to additional appropriations. Overall net change to cash increased by \$126 million as a result of increased revenue guidance. Ending Cash decreased by \$102 million from Amendment 1.
	As a result of the proposed Spend Plan Amendment # 2, NCDOT is seeking to increase total expenditures by \$478 million for SFY 23.
	The revenue outlook has increased by \$153 million due to GARVEE/BuildNC reimbursements. The GARVEE reimbursement increases is as a result of additional proceeds from the last sale. Total expenditures increased by \$478 million primarily due to larger construction expenditures as well as increased maintenance guidance. Under the new forecasting methodology SAS accounts for expenses at the project and work order level. Overall net change to cash increased by \$326 million as a result of increased revenue guidance. Ending Cash for Amendment 2 has decreased by \$428 million from Amendment 1.
	The ending cash balance for SFY23 has decreased by \$350 million from Amendment 1 to Amendment 2. Amendment 2 had a SFY22 ending cash balance of \$1,736 million and a SFY23 ending cash balance of \$1,131. Per the chart Ms. Overby displayed you will see that Amendment 2 ending cash balances are now in between the original spend plan and Amendment 1.
	Ms. Overby then touched on the detailed slides and noted that there is nothing in the details that was not discussed in the overview. She then opened the floor for any questions.

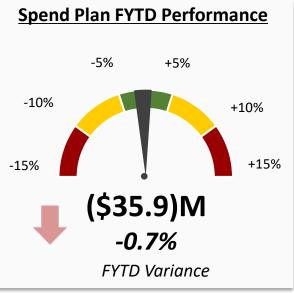
#### The Fast Five

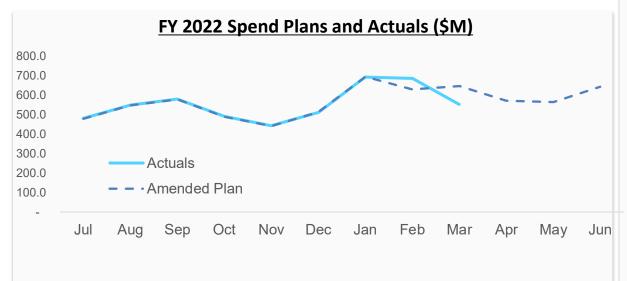


- Revenues align with forecast. Expenditures fall short of projections by 6.7% for the year. Lower expenditures than planned in all categories, though 20% higher than this time last year.
- Continued labor and supply issues.
- SAS working on forecast adjustments to reflect market conditions more accurately.
- Limited Obligation Build NC Bonds for \$300m are progressing within the financing timeline.
- Preliminary Official Statement was posted April 27<sup>th</sup> with strong market ratings.
- Pricing May 5<sup>th</sup>
- Financial Close May 19<sup>th</sup>
- Draft Spend Plan has been developed for FY23 and FY24 based on inputs from business units.
- Review period in May with consideration for approval at the June Board Meeting and by Office of State Budget.
- Consensus Revenue is anticipated for release May 6<sup>th</sup>. Draft will be updated and shared with approval parties in May.
- Advisors continue to work on the Spend Plan Governance Document and the Spend Plan Audit Response
- Drafts of the documents will be distributed to the Board once completed.
- Onsite visit for additional work this week.
- Fiscal worked with OSBM, DIT, with input from DHHS and DPS on the legislative requirement to make the Ferry Division an administrative budget. Initially no clear system related solution was defined for operational and data requirement needs.
- Utilizing advisors to look at solutions that would enable the fleet to meet legislative requirement and manage ferry operations.

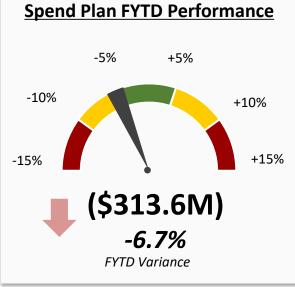


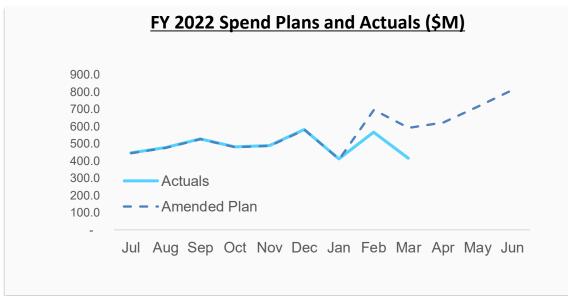
#### **Revenue Commentary**

- Overall negative monthly variance is primarily due to not receiving FHWA Federal Aid obligational authority timely this year. In April, the agency has billed over \$94m.
- Monthly Build NC Revenues (-\$19.5M) were lower due to a slow down of reimbursements from lower expenses being incurred.
- Other Revenue variance is primarily due to projecting Aviation Grants in March and receiving the full amount in February.

#### **Expense Commentary**

- Underspending occurred across all units.
- Large monthly variance is primarily due to underspending in Construction caused by GARVEE (\$40.8M) and Build NC (\$16.4M) projects being unable to expend as much as projected in March.
- Actively conversing with industry partners to better understand labor and material issues.
- FYTD expenditures have increased 20.2% from the prior year.

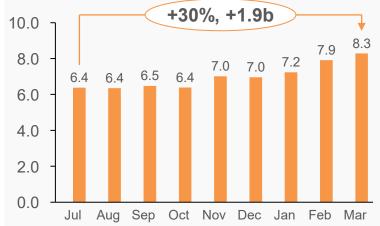
## SFY22: Increase in Open Commitments and Cash

Aug Sep Oct Nov Dec Jan Feb Mar





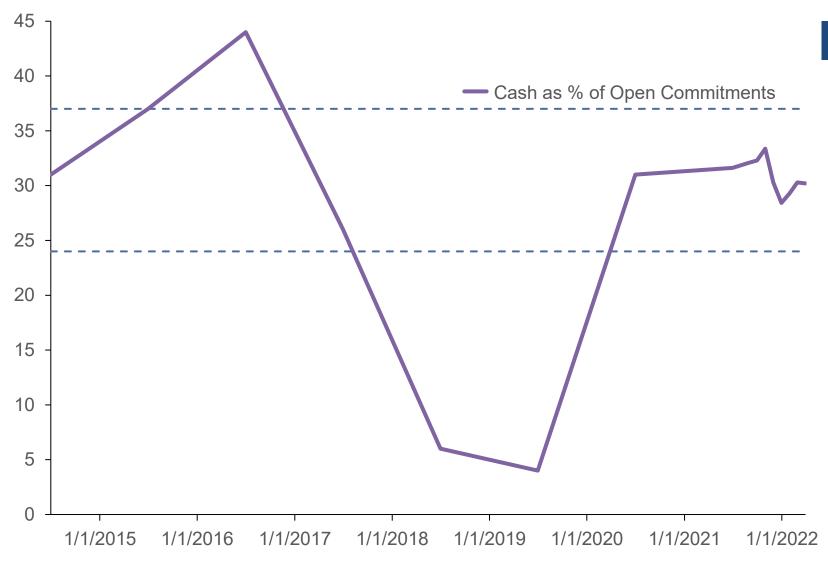

Because both cash and open commitments have increased, Cash as a % of Open Commitments has remained stable

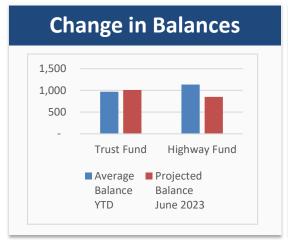

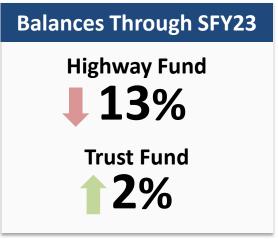


#### **Staying On Track**

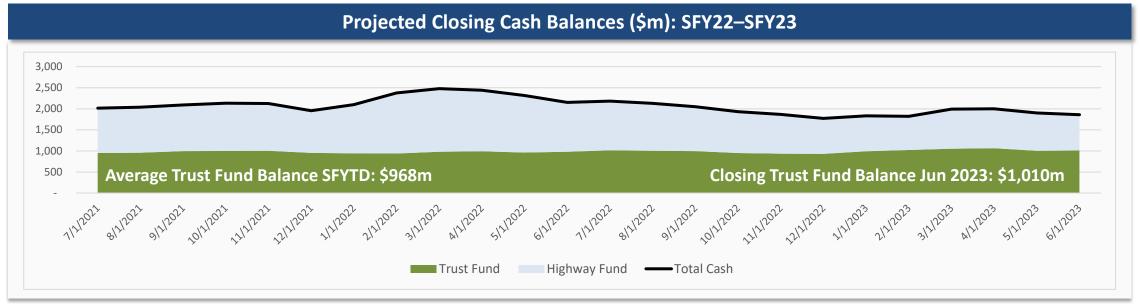
- The ratio of Cash to Open Commitments is an excellent metric to measure NCDOT's preparedness to meet is cash obligations as they arise
- From 2016 through 2019,
   NCDOT's Cash to Open
   Commitment ratio shifted with high volatility, mirroring actual cash levels during that time
- It may be helpful to establish boundaries for optimal ratio levels in order to inform decisions to commit additional dollars to future projects

# Cash – Highway Fund v Trust Fund





- HF balances moved from a projected decrease of 38% in February to 13% in March.
- TF is projected to slightly increase by 2% through June 2023.
- The SFY 2022 Build NC proceeds impacts the increased TF.
- The application of economic factors in the Adjustments model reduces the Build NC projected payouts.
- Additional causes to changes can be attributed to the continuous refinement of project forecasting using SAS for Build NC and USDOT Discretionary Grant projects.



# Detailed Report

# Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$894.6 million in March 2021 to \$1,495.5 million in March 2022. An increase of \$600.9 million or 67.2%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures during FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- **HF Revenues & Expenses** Revenues increased from \$219.6 million in March 2021 to \$247.5 million in March 2022. An increase of \$27.9 million or 12.7%. This increase was due to a \$14.0 million increase in motor fuel tax revenues, a \$3.5 million increase in highway use tax lease revenues (new alternate highway use tax on short-term vehicle rentals), and a \$10.5 million increase in license & fee revenues in March 2022 compared to March 2021. Expenses (current accounts) increased by \$0.3 million or 1.9% in March 2022 compared to March 2021.
- **HF YTD** March 2022 YTD revenues exceeded March 2021 YTD revenues by \$201.9 million, and March 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) were less than March 2021 YTD by \$28.6 million.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$673.6 million in March 2021 to \$982.2 million in March 2022. An increase of \$308.6 million or 45.8%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures in FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- HTF Revenues & Expenses Revenues increased from \$134.8 million in March 2021 to \$152.1 million in March 2022. An increase of \$17.4 million or 12.9%. This increase was due to a \$13.1 million increase in motor fuel tax revenue, a \$5.8 million increase in highway use tax revenue, and a \$1.5 million decrease in fees revenue in March 2022 compared to March 2021. Expenses (current accounts) increased by \$0.5M million or 3.5% in March 2022 compared to March 2021.
- **HTF YTD** March 2022 YTD revenues exceeded March 2021 YTD revenues by \$78.0 million, and March 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) exceeded March 2021 YTD expenses (current accounts) by \$15.0 million.

#### **Key monthly action:**

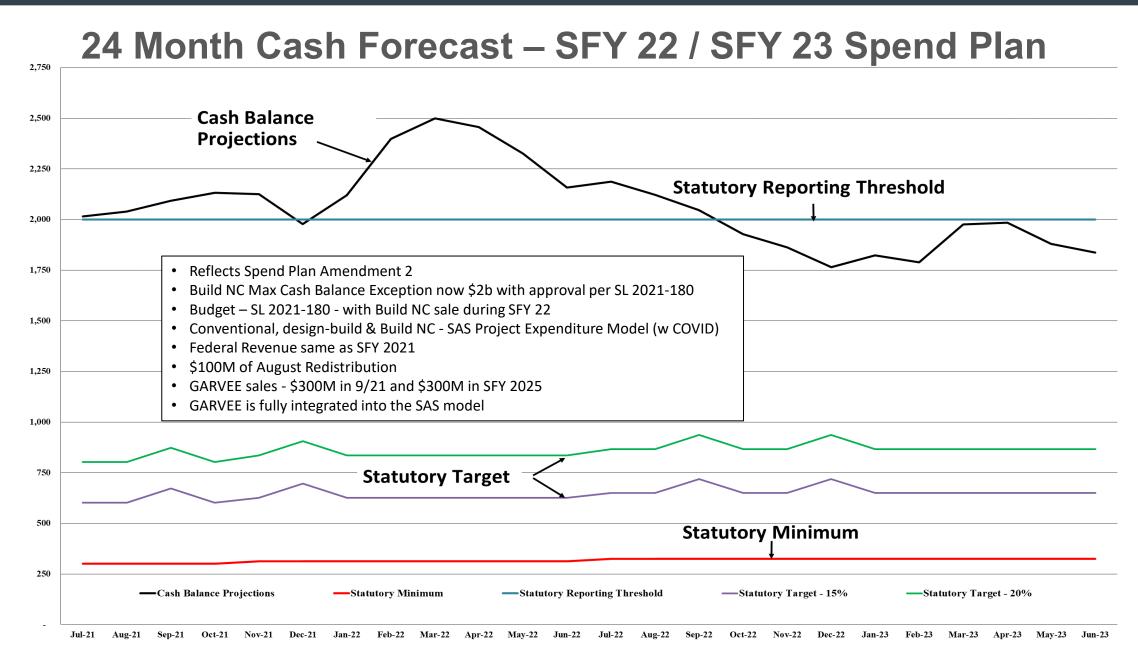
On March 15, DOT repaid \$40M of the Highway Trust Fund loan to the Highway Fund. This repaid a portion of the loan made on October 11, 2018, for \$100M. The outstanding balance of the loans after this payment will be \$340,300,000.

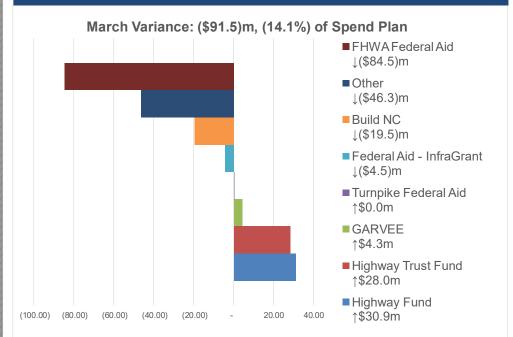

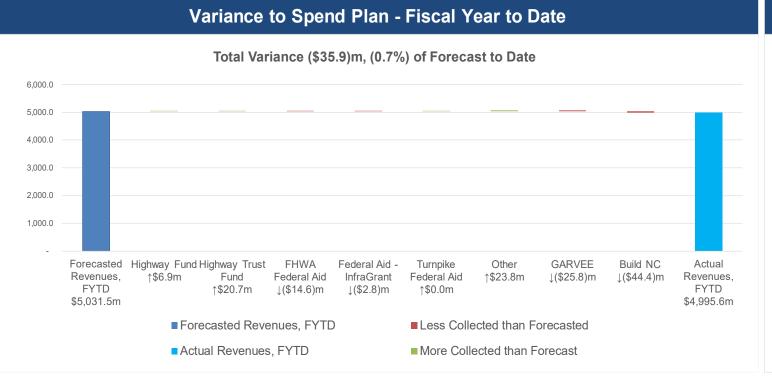
#### **Variance to Spend Plan - Month of Mar**

- Other Revenue variance is largely due to projected receipts for Aviation Grants of \$38.4M in March that were received in February.
- GARVEE is fully integrated into the SAS model. This will change the forecasting due to different methodologies in the system.

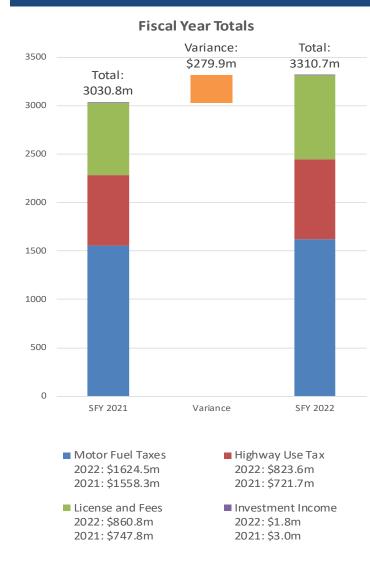

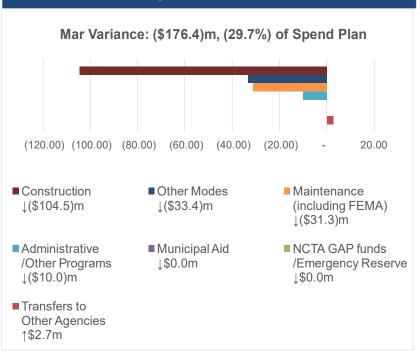

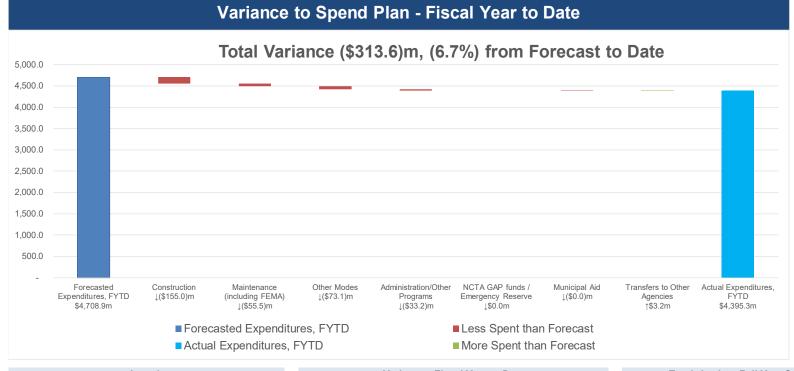

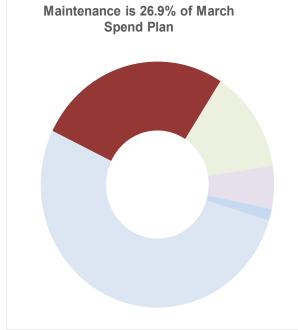
## Maintenance Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$M)

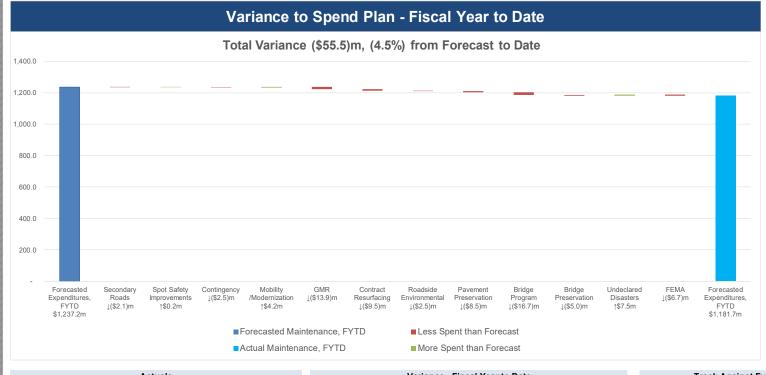

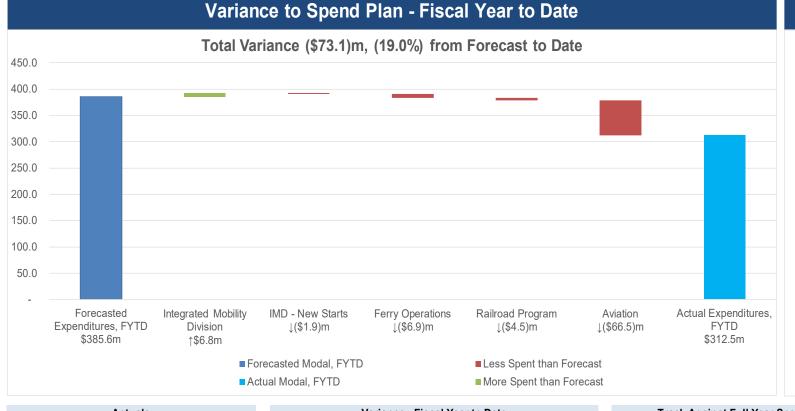

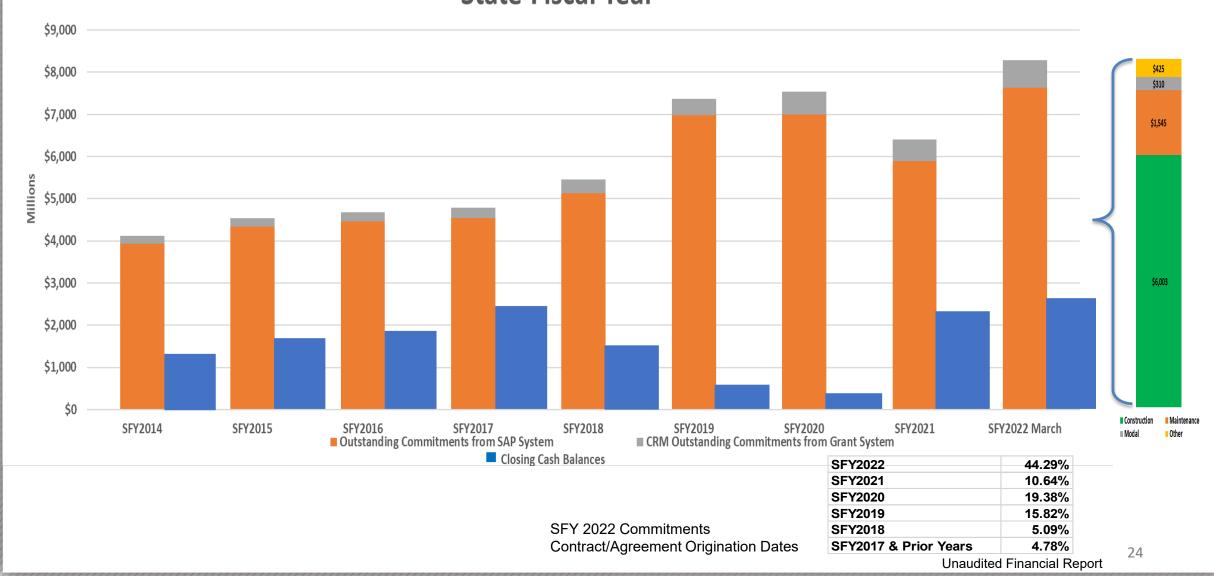
## Modal Expenditure Summary and Variances – FYTD (\$M)



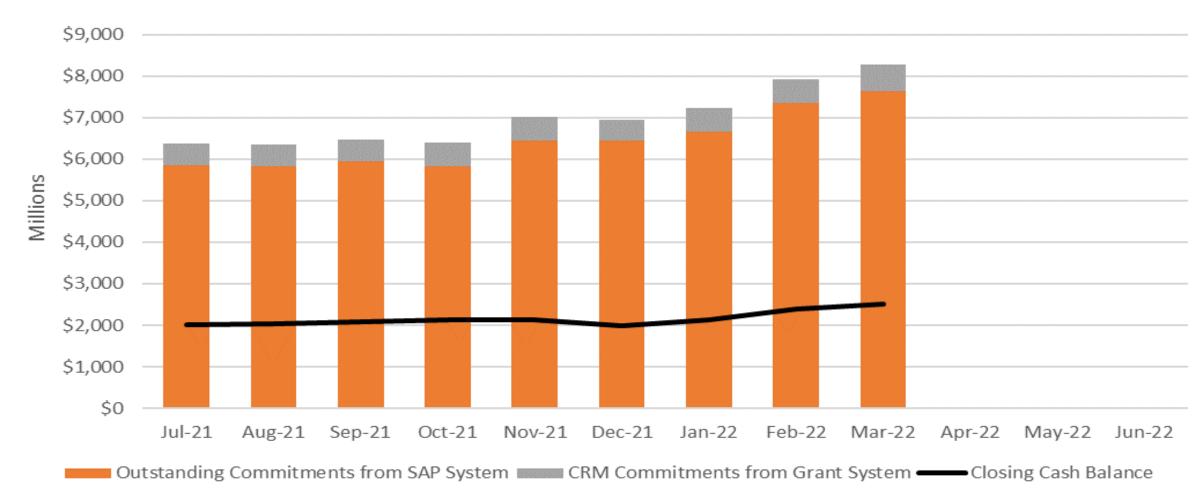

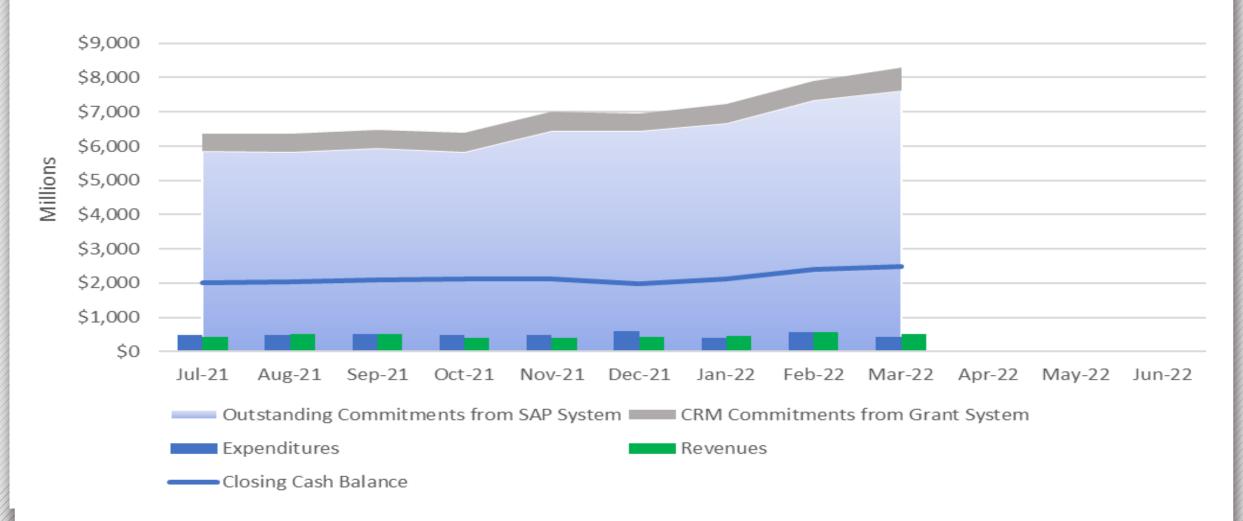
# NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

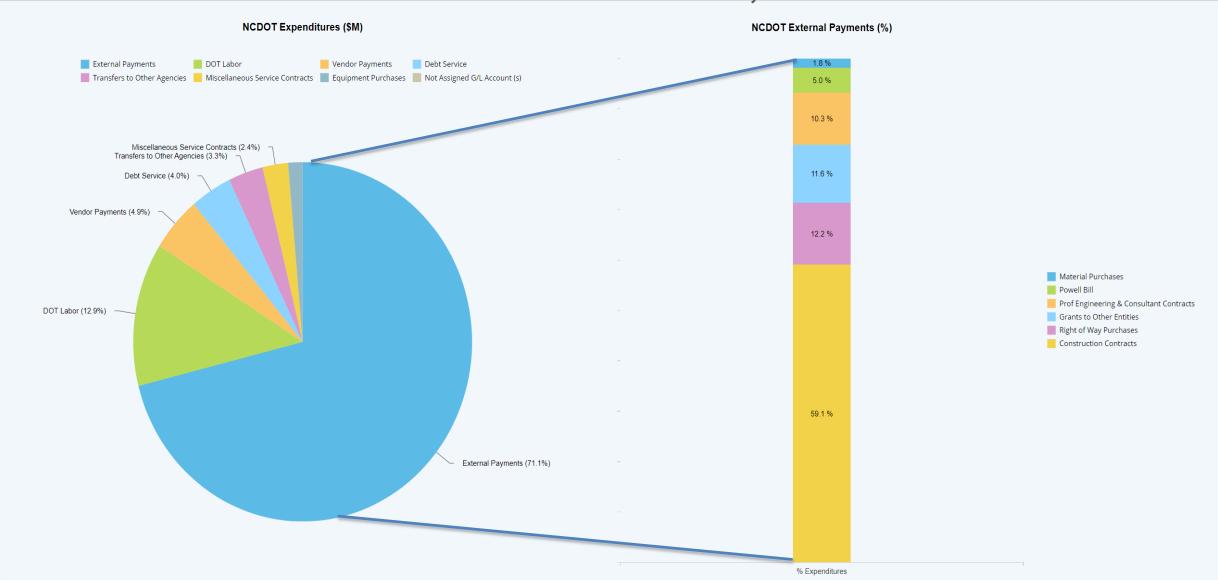


# Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

#### March 2022 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For March 2022, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.39 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$627 million and \$836 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for March was \$2.477 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$313 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

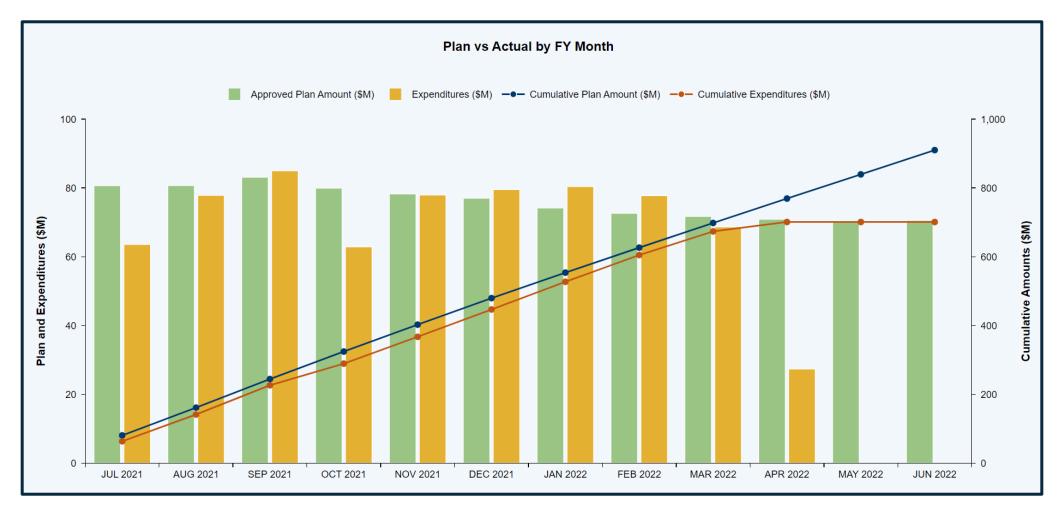

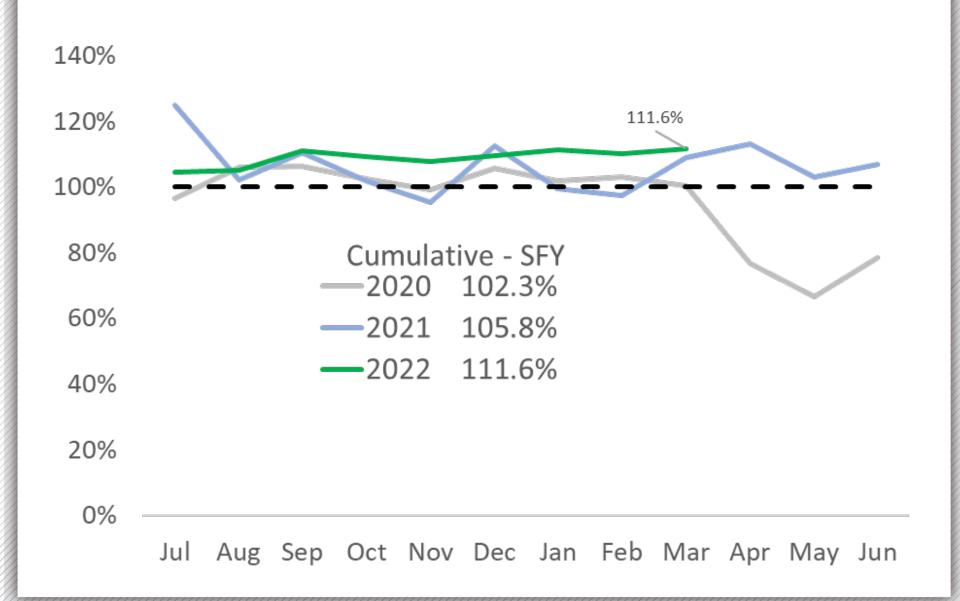

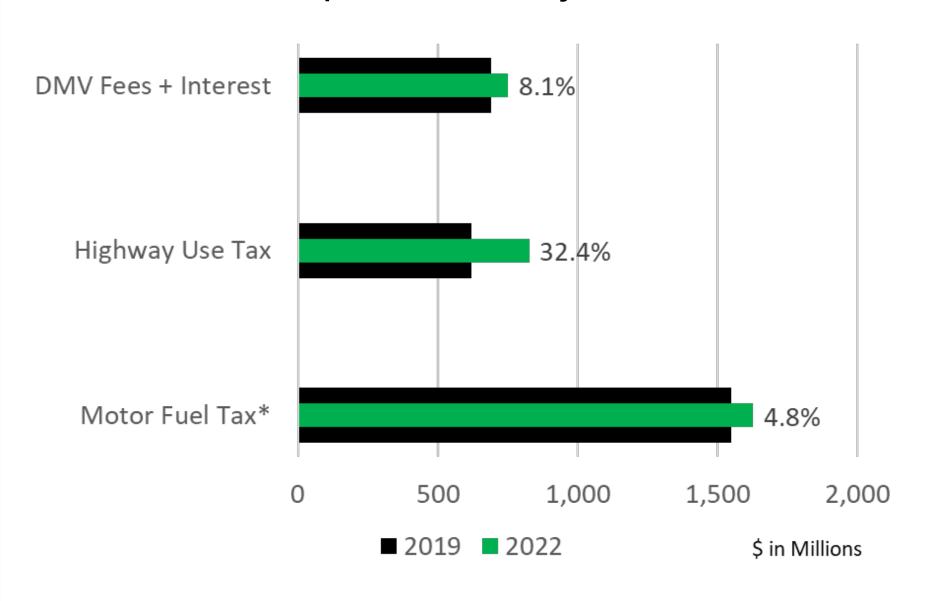

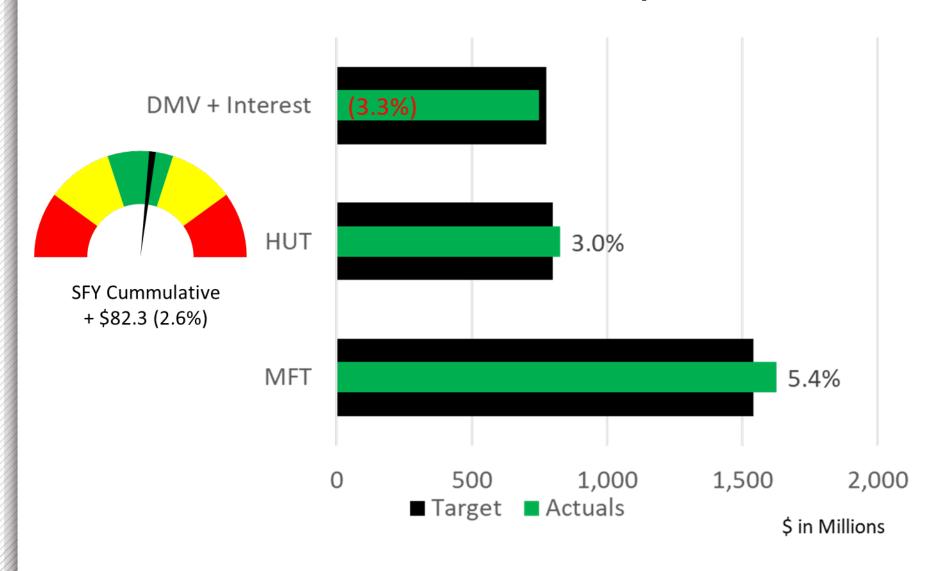
# SFY 2019 Comparisons – Total State Revenue



# SFY 2019 Comparison – Major State Revenue

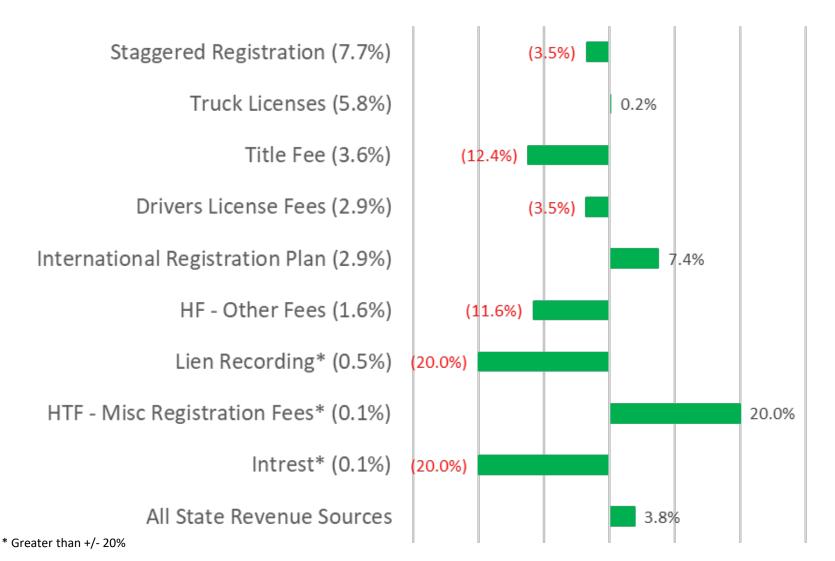

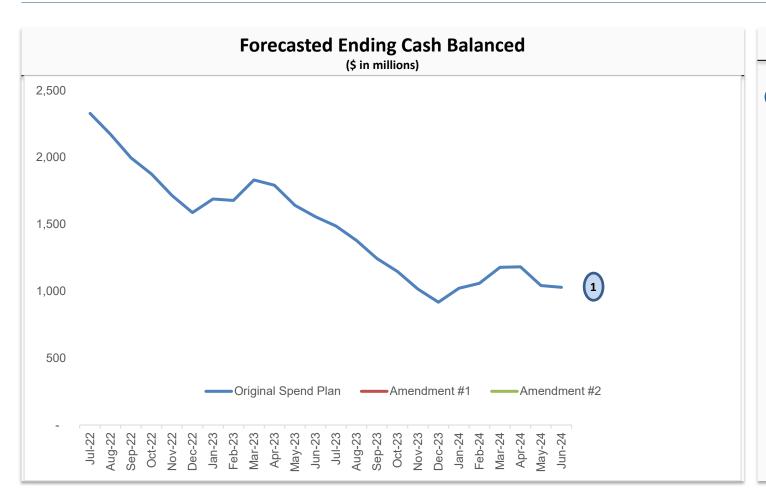

The designs and costs are scored. Based on the teams' technical scores, a single team is awarded the contract. The firm is then responsible for completing final design, pre-construction, and construction.

	Construction Manager / General Contractor (CM/GC). Under this method, the Department advertises and awards a contract to a Construction Management firm early in the process – before design and before pre-construction. NCDOT then

# **Road Categories**

### State Maintained Roads

- Primary and secondary
- Includes paved and unpaved roads

### Municipal Roads

Maintained by municipalities

### Non-system Roads

- Privately maintained
- No government entity responsible for maintenance

## Adding a road to the secondary system

- N.C.G.S. 136-44.10 requires the Board of Transportation to adopt uniform standards and criteria for adding roads to the secondary road system
- Specific requirements are set out in 19A NCAC 02C.0103
  - > Property owners must petition for addition: SR-1 Form
  - Pavement specifications
  - Publicly designated right-of-way
  - Other right-of-way and utility requirements
  - Occupied residence and lot minimums
  - Erosion control and drainage structures
  - No obstructions
  - > Road is in an acceptable state of maintenance prior to addition
- NCDOT Subdivision Roads Minimum Construction Standards

# What is an Orphan Road?

"Orphan Roads"
roads dedicated to
the public, designed
to city or NCDOT
standards, but not
successfully added to
either system

- Specific type of non-system road
- Also called "unadopted roads"
- > Platted and recorded as public
- Intent was for the road to be publicly maintained
- Never added to a public system
- No government entity is responsible for the maintenance of orphan roads

## Two Types of Orphan Roads

### **Annexation-related**

- Subdivision roads designed to <u>municipal</u> standards
- Located in extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ)
- Intended to be annexed and maintained by municipality
- Never annexed

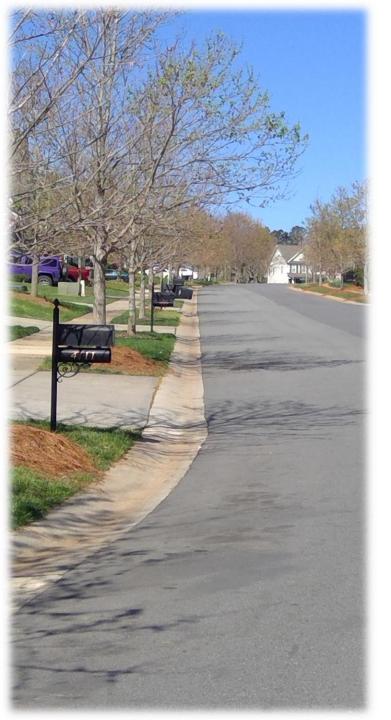
### **Developer-related**

- Rural subdivision roads designed to NCDOT standards
- Outside of municipal boundaries
- Intended to be added to state system
- > Never added



## Orphan Roads: Annexation-related

- Subdivision roads designed to municipal standards
- Located in municipal extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ)
- Intended to be annexed and then maintained by municipality
- Never annexed
  - Annexation laws changed in 2011-12
  - Roads do not meet minimum state construction standards



## Orphan Roads: Annexation-related

### Potential solutions for existing roads

- Property owners petition for voluntary annexation
- Property owners formalize a road maintenance agreement and assume responsibility for road maintenance
- Property owners pay for and oversee road improvements themselves, and then petition to add the road to state system
- Some counties <u>may</u> offer financing to bring roads up to state standards.
   Property owners repay the costs over a number of years (N.C.G.S 153A-205)

#### Prevention strategies for new roads

- Voluntary annexation during development
- > Build ETJ roads to state standards



## Orphan Roads: Developer-related

- Rural subdivision roads designed to NCDOT standards
- Located in county jurisdictions
- Intended to be added to the state system and maintained by DOT
- Never added
  - Not constructed to state standards
  - It took several years to meet minimum home density requirements and the road fell into disrepair
  - Developer bankruptcy, failure to petition for road addition

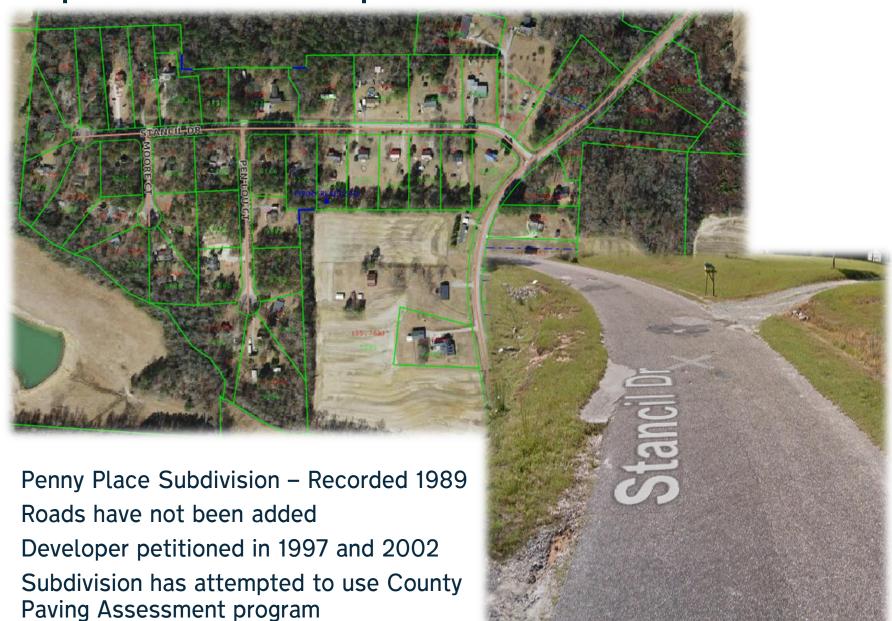
### Potential solutions for existing roads

- Property owners formalize a road maintenance agreement and assume responsibility for road maintenance
- Property owners formalize a cost-share agreement, pay for and oversee road improvements themselves, and then petition to add the road to state system
- Some counties <u>may</u> offer financing for improvements needed to bring roads up to state standards. Property owners are then assessed and repay the costs over a number of years (N.C.G.S 153A-205)

## Orphan Roads: Developer-related

### Prevention strategies for new roads

- Investigate strategies to increase developer accountability
- Local governments implement proactive strategies including annual inspections that encourage developers to petition roads for public maintenance
- Expand county programs to finance road improvements (N.C.G.S 153A-205) and extend repayment periods
- Clarify road maintenance disclosure statements on real estate transaction documents to provide more consumer protection

- Privately Maintained
- Desiring State Maintenance







# Other Non-system Roads: Privately Maintained

- Roads successfully maintained by property owners and/or HOA
- Subdivision streets designated as private during development
- Rural roads and easements with no dedicated public right-of-way

# Other Non-system Roads: Desiring State Maintenance

- Subdivision streets with publicly designated right-of-way, not originally intended for State Maintenance
- Driveways and roads serving multiple property owners

# Other Non-system Roads: Desiring State Maintenance

### Other property owners <u>may</u> desire addition to the statemaintenance system

- No road maintenance agreement in place
- No one will fix the road if it washes out or needs repairs
- > Public safety concerns: school buses and emergency vehicles
- Costs of maintenance is overly burdensome
- Costs to fix roads to DOT standards can escalate over the years
- > Pre- 1975 / Post- 1975

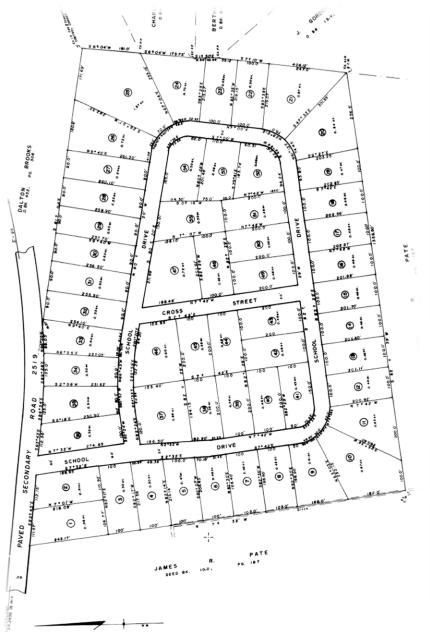
# Pre-1975 roads and other roads not designed or built to state standards

- All roads must meet minimum state standards before being added to the state system
- > Pre-1975 roads can be added if they meet unpaved standards
  - Property owners must dedicate right-of-way free of charge
  - At least five occupied residences per mile
  - Roads < 1 mile must have at least five occupied residences</p>
  - > Road serves more than one property owner
  - Pre-1975 roads can be added to the state system if they meet minimum unpaved standards

### Post-1975 Roads

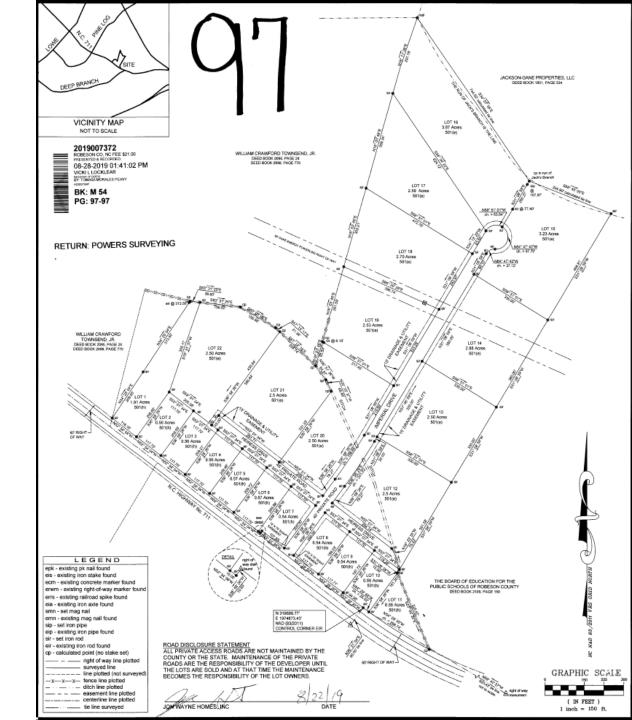
- All roads must meet minimum state standards before being added to the state system
- > Post-1975 roads can be added if they meet paved standards
- October 1, 1975 (N.C.G.S. 136-102.6)
  - Post-1975: subdivision roads must be platted and recorded with the Register of Deeds before lots can be sold
  - > Property owner must designate the road as either public or private
  - If platted and recorded as public, the road shall be designed to meet NCDOT standards
  - This includes NCDOT right-of-way and pavement requirements
- Prevention: Counties strengthen local planning ordinances

## Gov Ops Research: Orphan Roads

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 120-71 and 120-76, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations (Gov Ops) has been tasked with conducting a program evaluation on the topic of "orphan roads."

Their evaluation has led to two research questions:

- 1. What is/are the best solution/s to remedy the existing orphan roads?
- 2. What solution(s) can be created or implemented to prevent the creation of new orphan roads?

Gov Ops' priority is identifying ways to halt the creation of new orphan roads. An initial meeting was held between Gov Ops and the NCDOT on March 28th. Gov Ops anticipates releasing their findings later this spring.
