#### **Full Board Work Session**

Chairman Fox welcomed members of the Board to the meeting and thanked members for being present to handle business brought before them.

#### Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the work session of the Board of Transportation to order at 1:19 PM on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, with the following members present for the meeting: Chairman Fox, Board Member Perkins, Board Member Moran, Board Member Overholt, Board Member Zimmer, Board Member Mitchell, Board Member Jordan, Board Member Hunt, Board Member Mathis (Virtual), Board Member Molamphy, Board Member Lathrop, Board Member Rosenburgh, Board Member Lail, Board Member Wells, Board Member Clarke, Board Member McGrady, and Board Member Cody.

Board Member Taft, Board Member Tillman, and Board Member Tarleton were absent.

## **DRAFT STIP Update**

Chairman Fox stated he knows all members have had an opportunity to meet with their Division Engineers and review the draft State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). He thanked staff and stated it is not easy to take these policies that we have worked on with the Work Group and work through the process until it comes to fruition in the form of a list is not easy.

He stated to members that they may recall agreeing to make a decision today. It is one of the last decisions in the process. The decision is on where to draw the line on projects subject to reprioritization whether that be four years or five years. He emphasized he is hopeful all have an opinion on that. He stated after Mr. Hopkins finishes his presentation, he will come back up and see if consensus may be identified and ideally a decision can be made today to

release the divisions, and the MPOs to start reviewing what is out there and determining whether they desire to make any swaps or not.

Chairman Fox asked Joey Hopkins, Chief Operating Officer, to come forward and provide members with an update.

Mr. Hopkins outlined the topics he planned to present:

- Review
- Draft STIP Development
- Project Prioritization Status
- Outreach
- Next Steps / Schedule
- Discussion

Mr. Hopkins reminded members of the overall goals of the Workgroup Discussions:

- Develop trustworthy and dependable STIP (fiscally constrained)
- Produce 2024-2033 STIP using current STIP project list with transparent process
- Have an opportunity to fund new projects in P7 scoring (all 22 categories)
- Ensure process is grounded in state/federal requirements

Mr. Hopkins reminded members that we are still overprogrammed in statewide, regional and division levels and provided a breakdown of the amount.

Mr. Hopkins reminded members of the progressive steps taken collectively as a Board along with the Work Group since spring/summer 2021.

- Summer/Spring 2021 Work Group meetings and Board updates began
- August 2021 Paused P6.0
- September 2021 March 2022 Ongoing work that included three specific decision points in the development of the draft STIP.
- April 2022 Draft STIP released
- May 2022 Today's ask is where to draw the line on projects subject to reprioritization.

Mr. Hopkins reminded members that the decision today on where to draw the line on projects subject to reprioritization will impact the amount of funding available for P7.0. Mr. Hopkins detailed the options discussed by the Work Group.

He emphasized that for the four-year line the earliest phase of work begins in 2027. The five-year line the earliest phase of work begins by 2028. The Work Group recommends the five-year line.

A few additional considerations Mr. Hopkins shared include:

- Funding availability for new projects in P7.0
- Federal Discretionary Grant opportunities need to be "Scheduled for Delivery"
- More complex projects may require additional time for project development

Mr. Hopkins detailed the dollar amounts related to the amount used from committed projects versus the amount available for P7.0 projects for both the four-year and five-year scenarios.

Mr. Hopkins review the outreach plans related to the draft STIP as well as the next steps listed below for the 2024-2033 STIP.

- Decision on Project Prioritization Status (4-year vs. 5-year line)
- STIP coordination meetings with MPO/RPOs as needed
- Project swaps due to STIP managers by September 30<sup>th</sup>
- Revised Draft STIP by December 2022
- Public Involvement
- Anticipated adoption of Final 2024-2033 STIP by BOT in Summer 2023

Chairman Fox thanked Mr. Hopkins for his presentation and asked for members' opinion on the four-year or five-year option.

Board member Mathis shared that she is for five years because it means more shovel ready projects. Board member Clarke stated he is relying on staff and the Work Group to make the recommendation to the Board, therefore, he supports the five year mark. Board member Moran stated he doesn't not support five years for division one and that he would support four-year approach for continuity. Board member Zimmer stated he supports four years as well for division three.

Chairman Fox stated that since there appears to be some differences, he would move the decision to a formal vote.

The majority of the Board approved the five-year line on projects subject to reprioritization.

# **Road Bridge and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations**

Board Member Cody presented a resolution for the JL Phillips Bridge in Division 14. The resolution was unanimously approved by the Board upon a motion made by Board Member Cody and seconded by Board Member Clarke.

# Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Boyette welcomed everyone back to the newly renovated Board Room and thanked everyone who assisted in the updates. Secretary Boyette also asked for continued thoughts and prayers for Board Member Tarleton.

The North Carolina Highway Patrol Honor Guard presented the colors in preparation for a special recognition for our DMV License and Theft Bureau followed by the Pledge of

Allegiance. The recognition for the first fallen officer in the history of the License and Theft Bureau, Robert J. Furmage Jr. A shadowbox was unveiled of Officer R. Furmage's uniform.

Secretary Boyette mentioned the Work Zone Safety Plaque which are on display in the main lobby. Work Zone awareness week was April 4 through April 8. The Work Zone Safety Plaque contains the names of the Division of Highways staff members who lost their lives in the line of work. Last year, more than 6,200 crashes occurred in North Carolina work zones, resulting in 29 deaths and more than 2,500 injuries.

The Secretary provided a Division 1 update on the passing of Division 1 Engineer, Sterling Baker and requested to keep the family in thoughts and prayers. He announced Winn Bridgers, Deputy Division Engineer would be taking over the Division 1 Engineer. Secretary Boyette mentioned the Employee Appreciation Recognition Week. Secretary thanked employees for their commitment and hard work.

Secretary Boyette closed his remarks with a tender video of NCDOT Employee, Daniel Perry of Division 3, and his recovery from COVID. Secretary Boyette welcomed Daniel Perry back to the NCDOT family.

# **Final Right of Way Plans**

Financial Update - Stephanie King

- Revenues align with forecast. Expenditures in all categories fall short of projections, total spend plan performance is -6.7% (\$313.6M) for the year. Continued labor and supply issues.
- Limited Obligation Build NC Bonds for \$300m are progressing within the financing timeline. POS was posted April 27th with strong market ratings. Pricing is May 5th and closing is May 19th.
- Draft Spend Plan developed for FY23 and FY24 based on inputs from business units.
- Closing cash balance increased by \$483 (24%). The HF cash balance is \$1,495M & HTF is \$982M.
- Open commitments increased by \$1.9B (30%); currently at \$8,283M.

- Presented a summary on the following:
  - Overall Structure of OIG: Staffing Levels several vacant positions have been filled.
     There are still six vacant positions. OIG Org Chart was presented. Each section of the IG's office was defined.
  - Current State of OIG we are in the rebuilding stages. First and foremost is filling current vacancies. A plan is being developed for corrections and moving forward.
  - Future State of OIG Internal Audit to become more Value Added. Discussion regarding adding highway division auditors: one auditor for every two division. Building rapport and having open dialog with internal and external staff and stakeholders. Periodic meetings with Barbara Baldwin (Internal Audit Council) for guidance. Attend internal and external training, workshops, meetings with other state agencies and professional organizations. Outsourcing may be utilized to assist in meeting obligations.

# **Highways Committee**

The Highways Committee heard one presentation on May 4, 2022.

Mr. Greg Burns, Eastern Deputy Chief Engineer, provided a presentation on Orphan Roads and other Non-System Roads. Mr. Burns began the presentation with an overview of road systems: (1) state-maintained roads, (2) municipal roads, and (3) non-system roads. Mr. Burns explained that non-system roads are privately maintained. No government entity is responsible for the maintenance of non-system roads.

Many non-system roads are successfully maintained by property owners or HOAs and do not desire state maintenance. However, other property owners want their roads to be added to the state system and maintained by NCDOT. Mr. Burns outlined the minimum requirements for adding roads to the state system, which are set out in North Carolina Administrative Code (19A NCAC 02C.0103).

"Orphan roads" are a specific type of non-system road.

DOT defines orphan roads as roads that are recorded as public, designed to city or NCDOT standards, but never added to either system. Following this definition, there are two types of orphan roads: (1) annexation-related and (2) developer-related.

Annexation-related orphan roads are located in extraterritorial jurisdictions (ETJ) of municipalities. They were designed to city standards (not state standards). The intent was for the subdivision to be annexed and the road maintained by the municipality. However, they were never annexed.

Developer-related orphan roads are located in counties (outside of municipal boundaries). They were designed to state standards. The intent was for the road to be added to the state system and maintained by NCDOT. Mr. Burns reviewed several examples of orphan roads. He detailed various reasons why orphan roads are not added to the system. He discussed potential solutions for existing orphan roads, as well as strategies to prevent new orphan roads from occurring.

Mr. Burns provided non-system road mileage and cost data and concluded the presentation by highlighting ongoing efforts with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations (Gov Ops) to address the topic of orphan roads.

# Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Committee

The committee approved two highway honorary designations:

Andrea L. Harris Highway – Interstate 85 between exit 220 (Flemingtown Road) to the Vance/Warren County line.

Lou Donaldson Boulevard – NC 740 through Badin from Kirk Road to Barnhardt Road.

The vetting process for honorary designations and namings was discussed. Staff continues to communicate to applicants that they should consider the Road and Bridge Naming application as an introduction to the Board of Transportation of their proposed honoree. Details of community service is required.

The committee was updated on upcoming events.

# Adjournment

Chairman Fox asked if there were any additional items for discussion. He stated hearing none he will accept a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made by Board NCDOT Board of Transportation Meeting Minutes

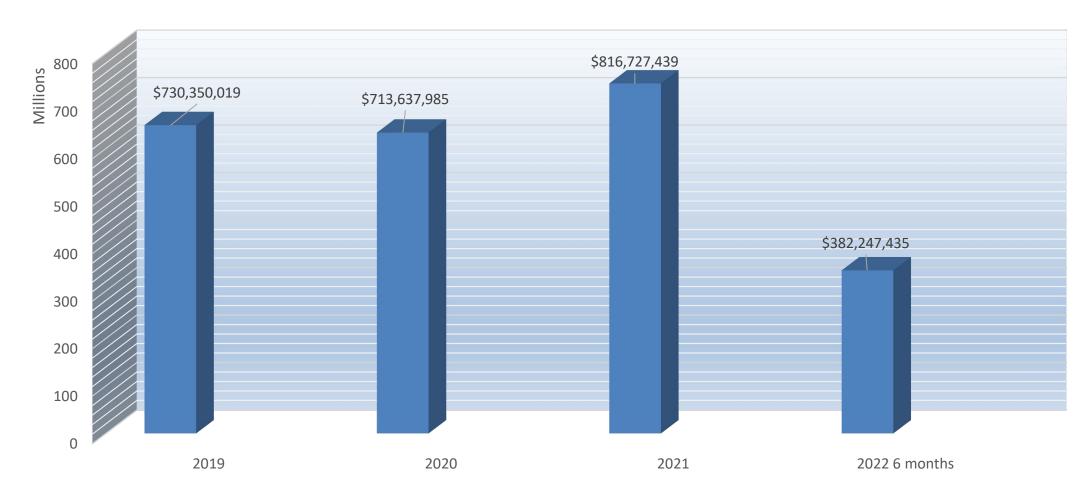

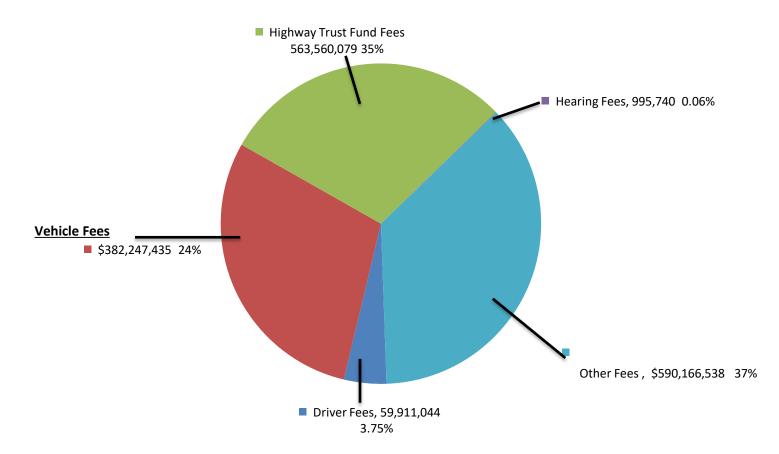

#### Summary of HMIP Legislation

- Session Law 2014 -100, Section 34.11 (a,b): the North Carolina General Assembly established the Highway Maintenance Improvement Program (HMIP)
- Session Law 2017 -57: to support the need for a more holistic approach to maintenance, the Highway (Pavements), Bridge and Routine Maintenance Improvement Programs were merged and are now managed under a single "Highway Maintenance Improvement Program", effective January 1, 2020
- Program mandated in G.S. 136-44.3A
- 5-year schedule for highway pavement, bridge and routine maintenance activities.
- Based on the previous FY funding allocations

#### HMIP - Pavements

- Method: Pavement Condition Survey used to generate recommendations; Division staff review and update
- Included Information:
  - Planned fiscal year for work to be completed
  - Specific roadways/roadway sections in each county
  - Type of improvement and estimated cost

- Builds on EO 80
- Addresses:
  - Reduction in emissions from transportation sources
  - Environmental Justice and Equity
  - Inventory of Greenhouse Gas Emissions
  - Directs DOT to develop a Clean Transportation Plan
  - Economic Development and Workforce Diversity
  - Public Health and Health Equity

# N.C. Executive Orders 80 and 246

# EO 80 (2018)

Reduce economy wide emissions by 40% below 2005 levels by 2025

Increase total number of registered ZEVs to at least 80,000 by 2025

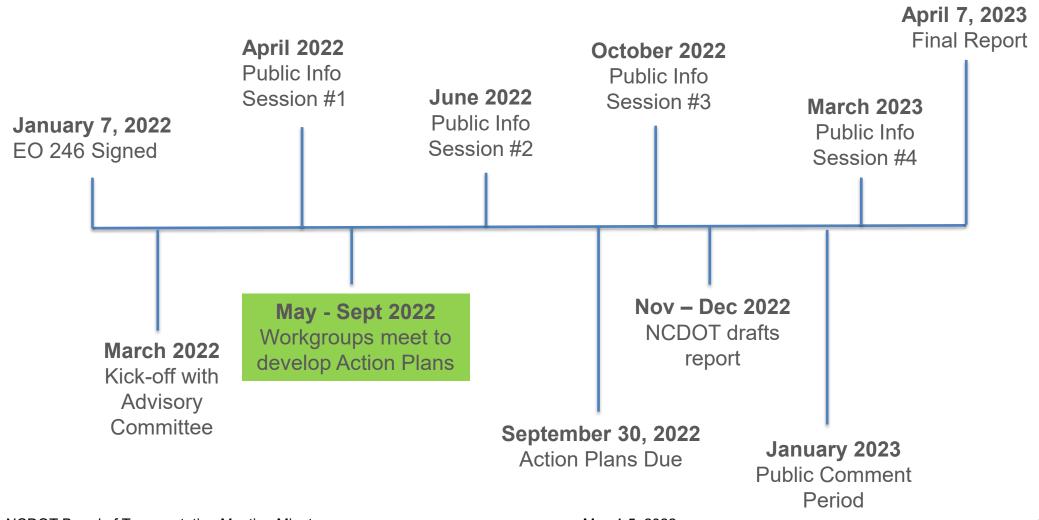
Reduce energy consumption in state-owned buildings by 40% below 2002-2003 levels

# EO 246 (2022)

Reduce economy wide emissions by **50%** below 2005 levels by **2030** 

Increase total number of registered ZEVs to at least 1.25 million by 2030

**50% of in-state sales** are zero emission by 2030

Only includes projects funded in 2020 -2029 STIP

All projects selected for funding using one of two approaches:

- 1. Delivery Projects programmed first
  - Currently scheduled for CON in FY 2026 or before, ROW underway or has federal grant
- 2. P3-P4-P5 Evaluation (Seniority Approach) programmed second

Once Draft 2024-2033 STIP is released, opportunity to swap projects

- Swaps must be agreed to by NCDOT and MPO/RPO(s)
- Cost of project(s) swapped in must be within 10% of cost of project(s) being swapped out

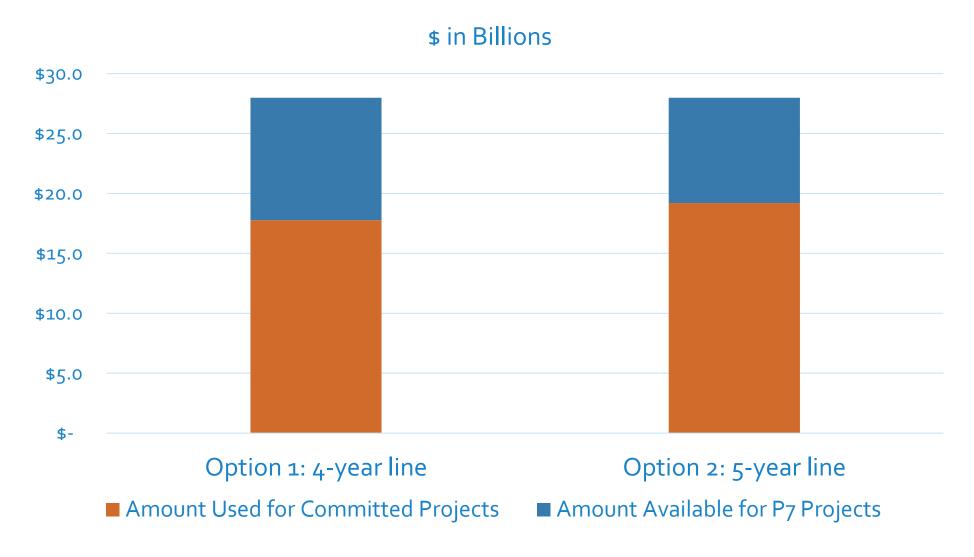

### PRODUCT INNOVATION – Trolley Mounted Portable Traffic Signal Set

The TLG-1412 Portable Traffic Signal Set is manufactured by Ver-Mac out of Houston, Texas. It is currently under evaluation and listed on the Approved Products List (APL) as NP21-8990. The Ver-Mac TLG-1412 is a battery powered, trolley mounted portable traffic signal set. Each trolley has a single signal head with 12" diameter lenses and has a telescopic mast that allows them to be raised to a height of 12 feet. These signal units use GPS time synchronization to ensure the timing of the signal pair is in unison. The units can be equipped with an optional "countdown" head, allowing the motorists to know the wait time until the next signal change. Additionally, the operator determines the distance between the two signals and the approximate vehicles' speed in the work zone; then, the onboard controller automatically calculates the signal duration. 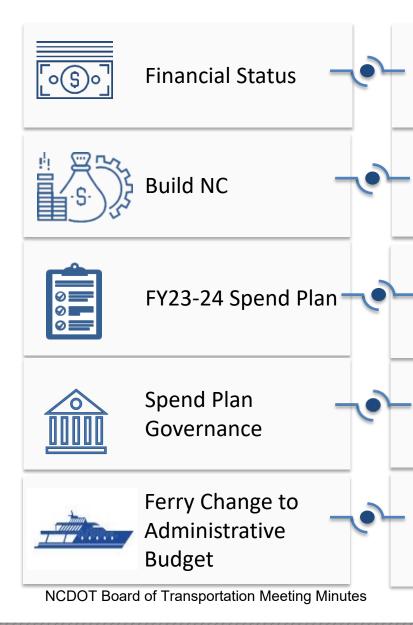

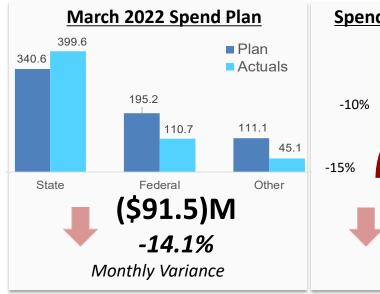
# **Executive Summary**

# The Fast Five

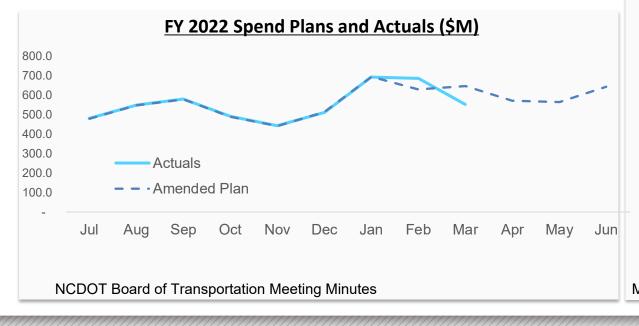


- Revenues align with forecast. Expenditures fall short of projections by 6.7% for the year. Lower expenditures than planned in all categories, though 20% higher than this time last year.
- Continued labor and supply issues.
- SAS working on forecast adjustments to reflect market conditions more accurately.
- Limited Obligation Build NC Bonds for \$300m are progressing within the financing timeline.
- Preliminary Official Statement was posted April 27<sup>th</sup> with strong market ratings.
- Pricing May 5th
- Financial Close May 19th
- Draft Spend Plan has been developed for FY23 and FY24 based on inputs from business units.
- Review period in May with consideration for approval at the June Board Meeting and by Office of State Budget.
- Consensus Revenue is anticipated for release May 6<sup>th</sup>. Draft will be updated and shared with approval parties in May.
- Advisors continue to work on the Spend Plan Governance Document and the Spend Plan Audit Response
- Drafts of the documents will be distributed to the Board once completed.
- Onsite visit for additional work this week.
- Fiscal worked with OSBM, DIT, with input from DHHS and DPS on the legislative requirement to make the Ferry Division an administrative budget. Initially no clear system related solution was defined for operational and data requirement needs.
- Utilizing advisors to look at solutions that would enable the fleet to meet legislative requirement and manage ferry operations.

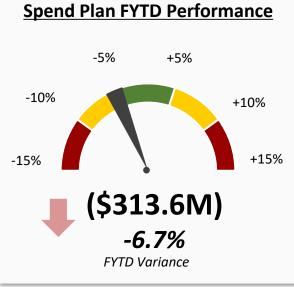
### **Revenue Commentary**

- Overall negative monthly variance is primarily due to not receiving FHWA Federal Aid obligational authority timely this year. In April, the agency has billed over \$94m.
- Monthly Build NC Revenues (-\$19.5M) were lower due to a slow down of reimbursements from lower expenses being incurred.
- Other Revenue variance is primarily due to projecting Aviation Grants in March and receiving the full amount in February.

### **Expense Commentary**

- Underspending occurred across all units.
- Large monthly variance is primarily due to underspending in Construction caused by GARVEE (\$40.8M) and Build NC (\$16.4M) projects being unable to expend as much as projected in March.

- FYTD expenditures have increased 20.2% from the prior year.

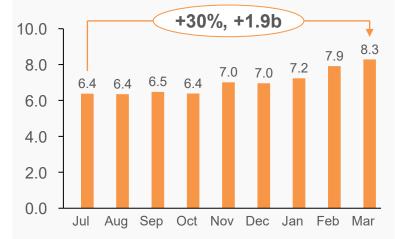

### **Open Commitments (\$b)**



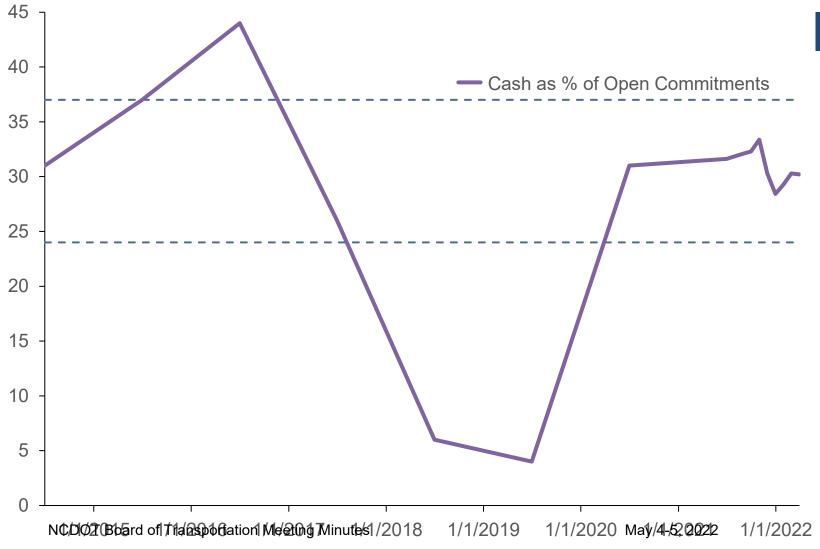

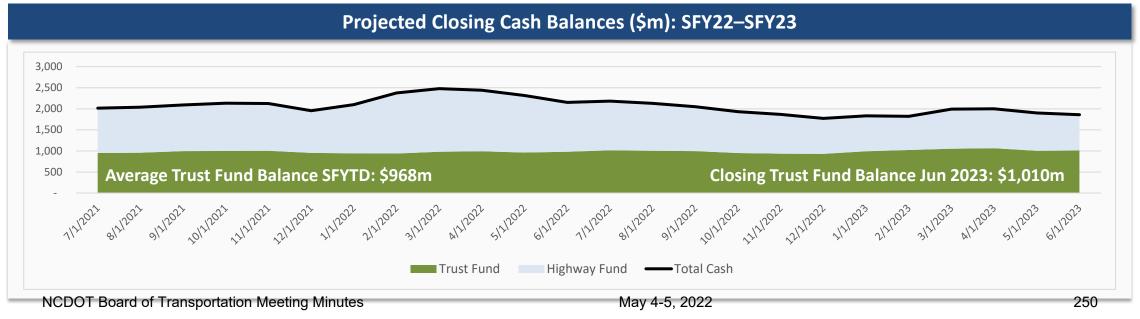
- The ratio of Cash to Open Commitments is an excellent metric to measure NCDOT's preparedness to meet is cash obligations as they arise
- From 2016 through 2019,
   NCDOT's Cash to Open
   Commitment ratio shifted with high volatility, mirroring actual cash levels during that time
- It may be helpful to establish boundaries for optimal ratio levels in order to inform decisions to commit additional dollars to future projects

# Cash – Highway Fund v Trust Fund





- HF balances moved from a projected decrease of 38% in February to 13% in March.
- TF is projected to slightly increase by 2% through June 2023.
- The SFY 2022 Build NC proceeds impacts the increased TF.
- The application of economic factors in the Adjustments model reduces the Build NC projected payouts.
- Additional causes to changes can be attributed to the continuous refinement of project forecasting using SAS for Build NC and USDOT Discretionary Grant projects.



# Detailed Report

# Financial Analysis

- **HF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$894.6 million in March 2021 to \$1,495.5 million in March 2022. An increase of \$600.9 million or 67.2%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures during FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- **HF Revenues & Expenses** Revenues increased from \$219.6 million in March 2021 to \$247.5 million in March 2022. An increase of \$27.9 million or 12.7%. This increase was due to a \$14.0 million increase in motor fuel tax revenues, a \$3.5 million increase in highway use tax lease revenues (new alternate highway use tax on short-term vehicle rentals), and a \$10.5 million increase in license & fee revenues in March 2022 compared to March 2021. Expenses (current accounts) increased by \$0.3 million or 1.9% in March 2022 compared to March 2021.
- **HF YTD** March 2022 YTD revenues exceeded March 2021 YTD revenues by \$201.9 million, and March 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) were less than March 2021 YTD by \$28.6 million.
- **HTF Cash** Cash balance increased from \$673.6 million in March 2021 to \$982.2 million in March 2022. An increase of \$308.6 million or 45.8%. This increase in cash was primarily due to decreased expenditures in FY 2021 due to the cash shortage in early FY 2021.
- HTF Revenues & Expenses Revenues increased from \$134.8 million in March 2021 to \$152.1 million in March 2022. An increase of \$17.4 million or 12.9%. This increase was due to a \$13.1 million increase in motor fuel tax revenue, a \$5.8 million increase in highway use tax revenue, and a \$1.5 million decrease in fees revenue in March 2022 compared to March 2021. Expenses (current accounts) increased by \$0.5M million or 3.5% in March 2022 compared to March 2021.
- **HTF YTD** March 2022 YTD revenues exceeded March 2021 YTD revenues by \$78.0 million, and March 2022 YTD expenses (current accounts) exceeded March 2021 YTD expenses (current accounts) by \$15.0 million.

#### **Key monthly action:**

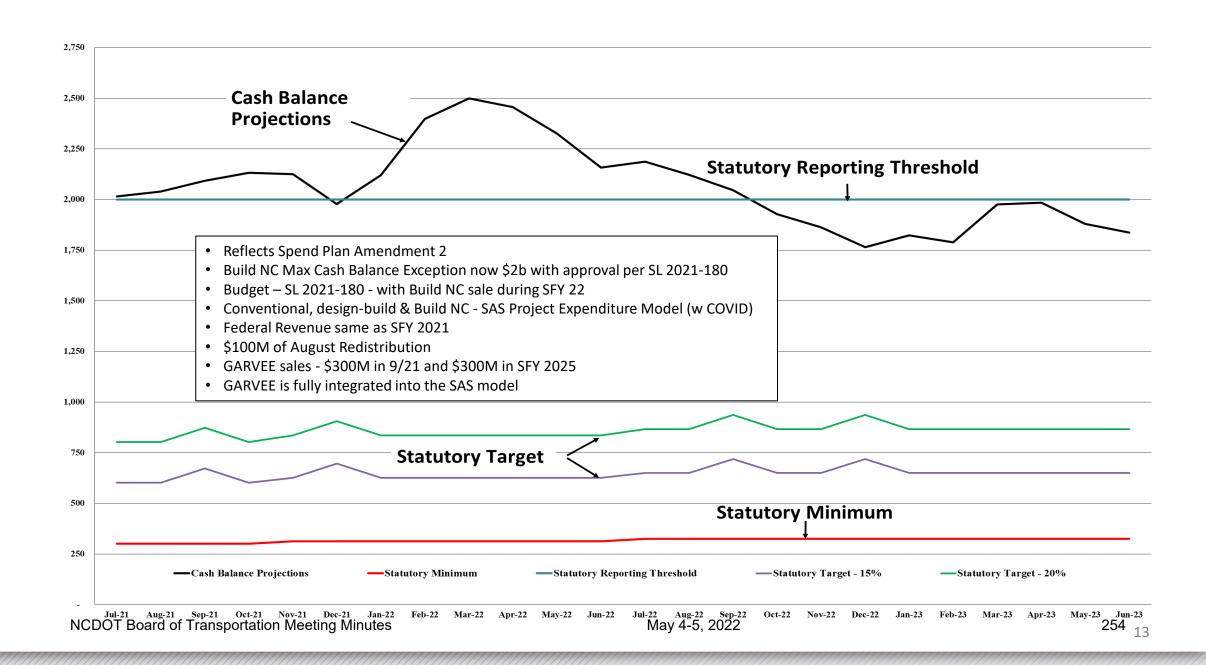
On March 15, DOT repaid \$40M of the Highway Trust Fund loan to the Highway Fund. This repaid a portion of the loan made on October 11, 2018, for \$100M. The outstanding balance of the loans after this payment will be \$340,300,000.

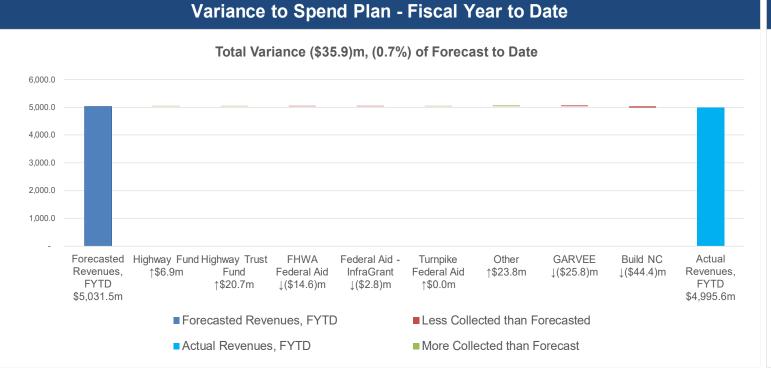

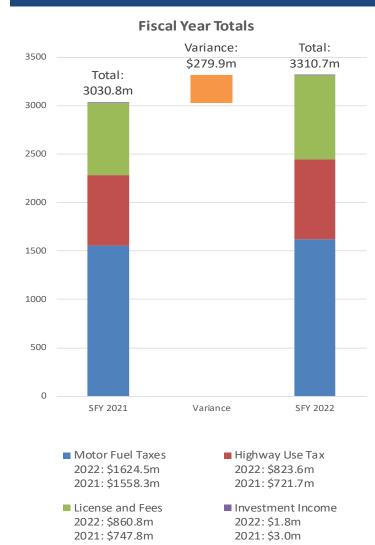

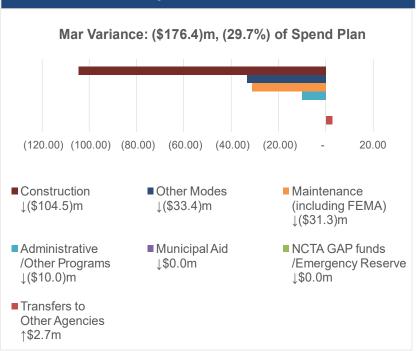

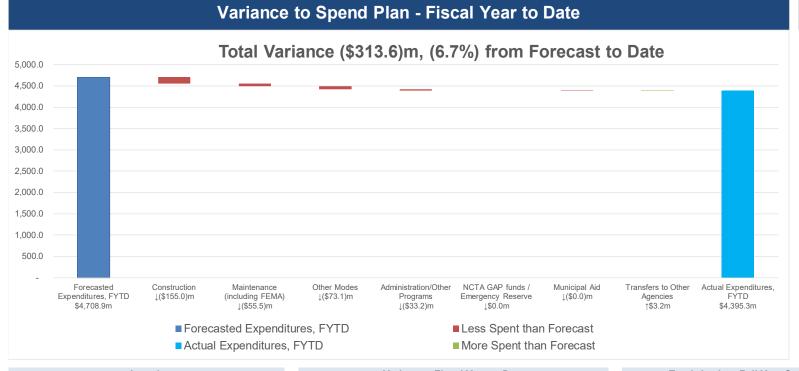

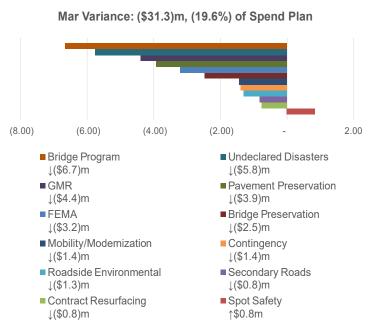

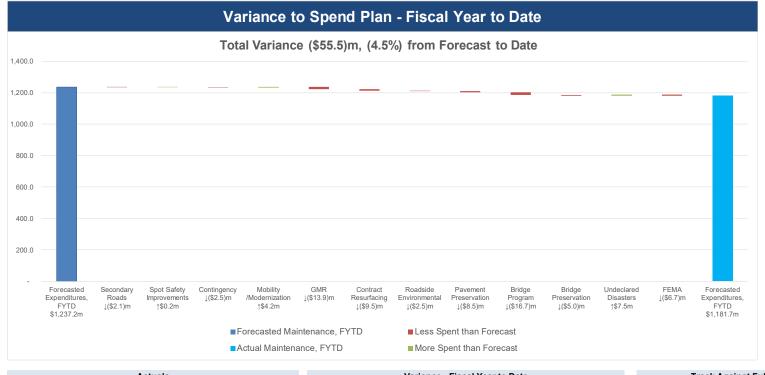

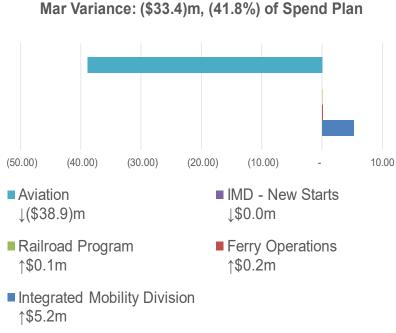

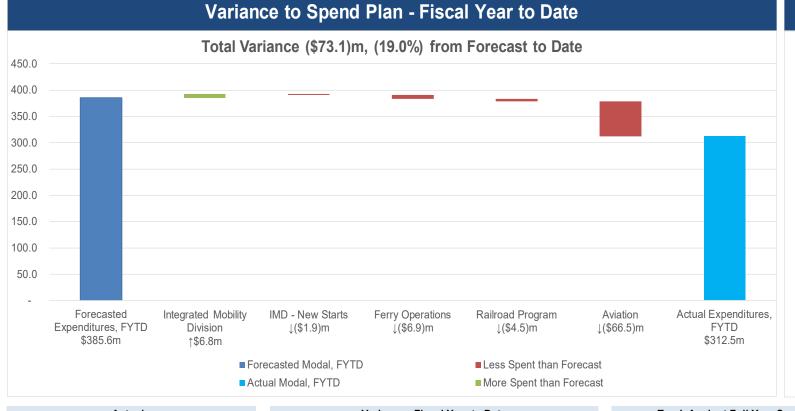

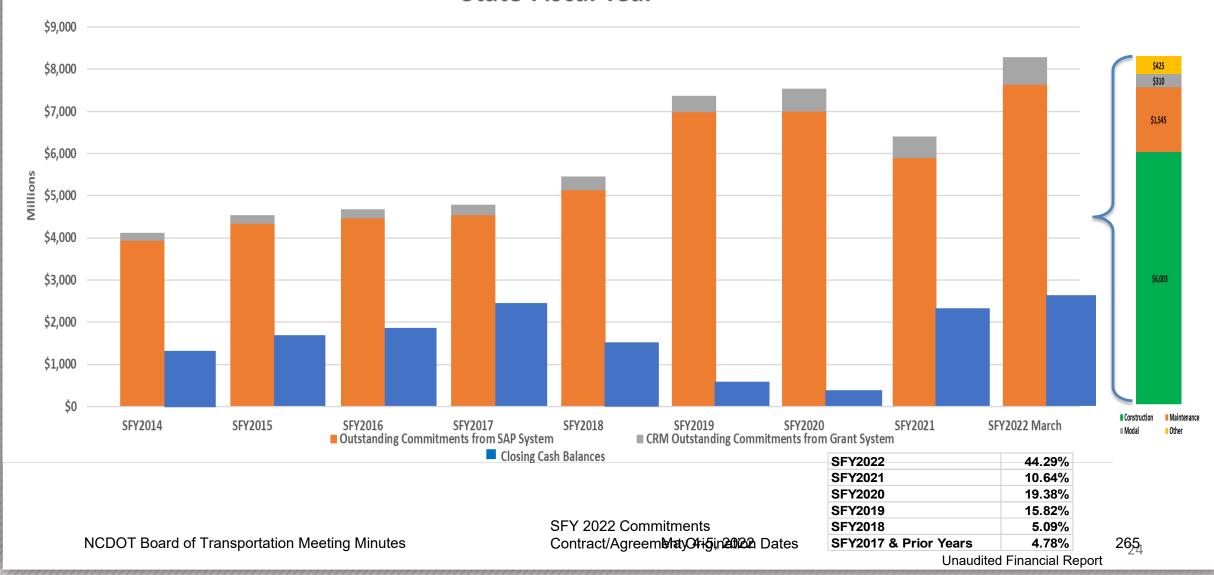

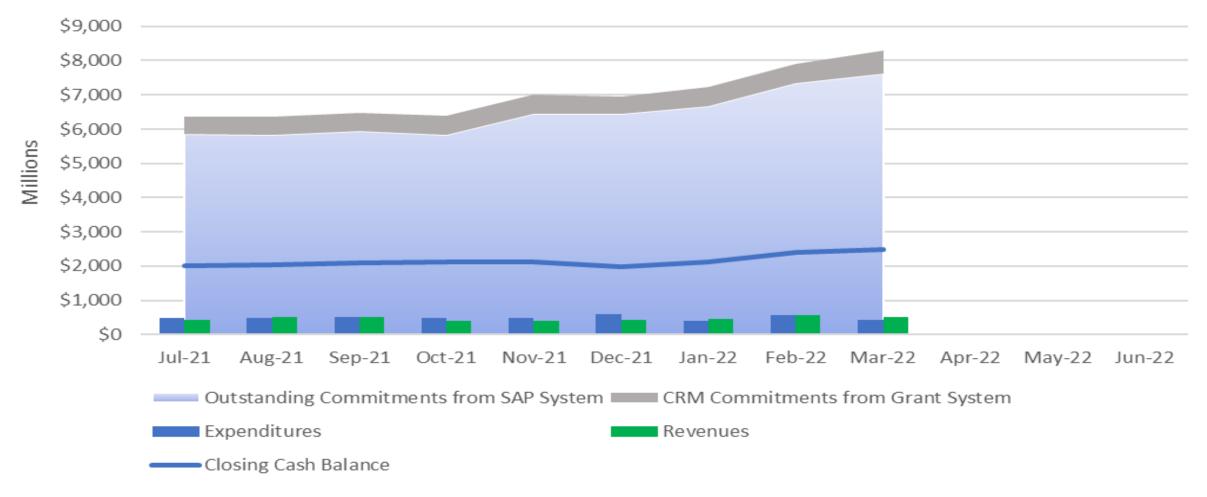
# NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

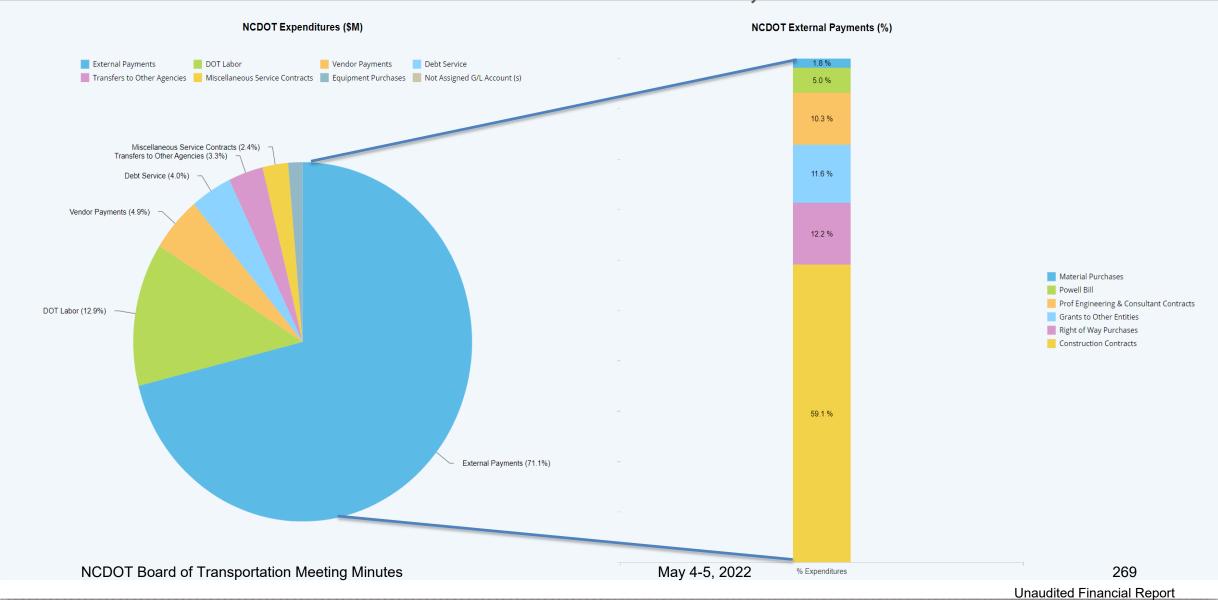


# Cash Reporting Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

### March 2022 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For March 2022, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.39 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$627 million and \$836 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for March was \$2.477 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$313 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

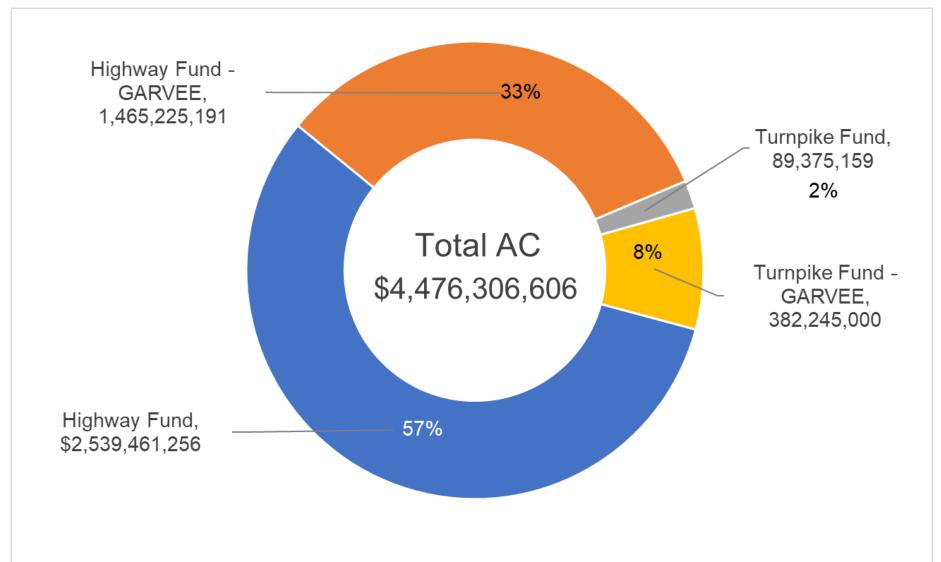

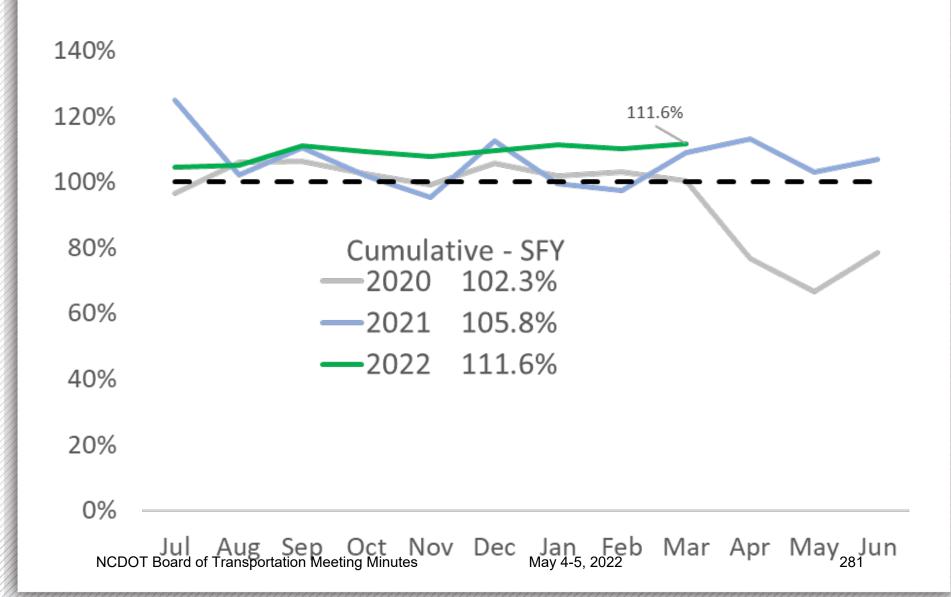




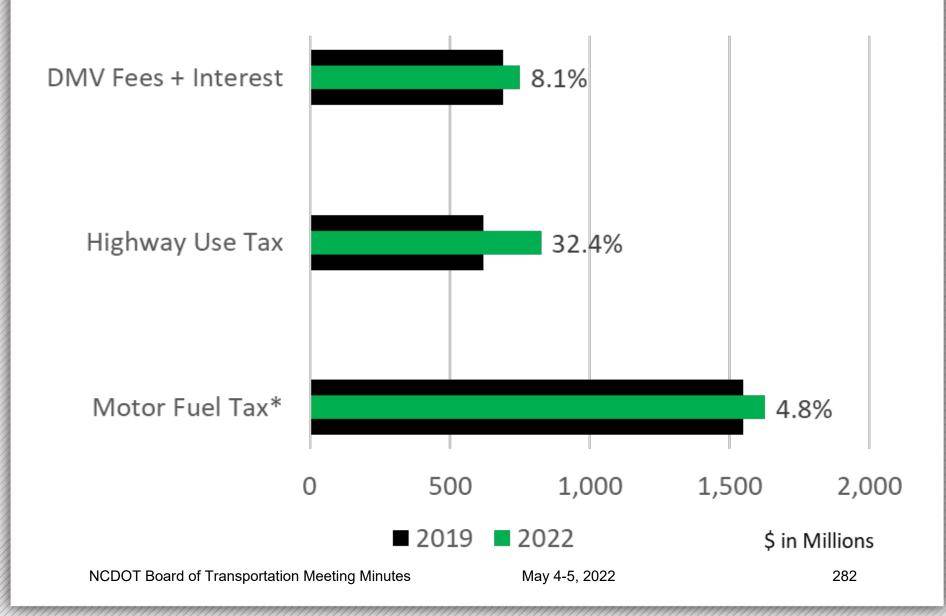


SFY 2022 - Third Quarter Revenue Update H. Tasaico

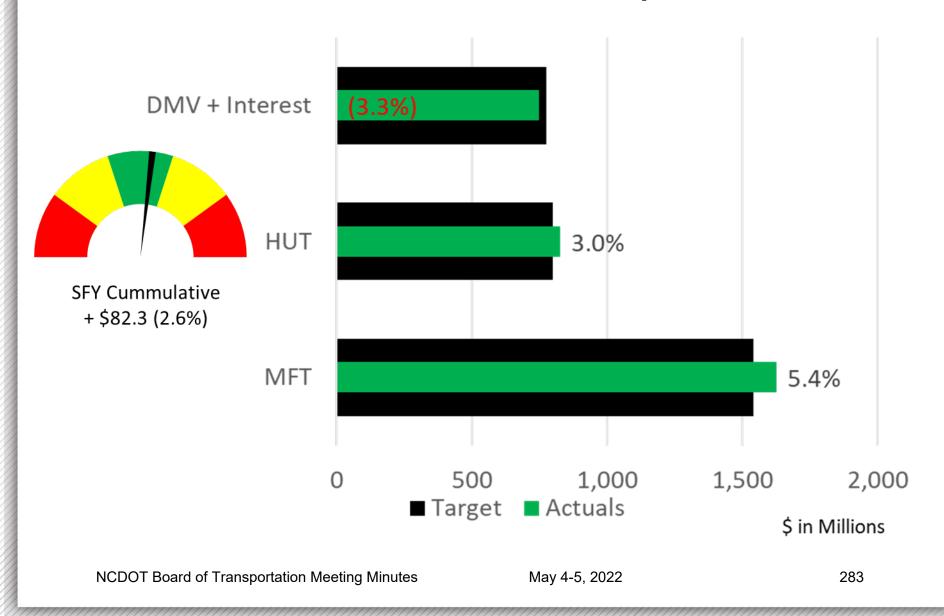
# SFY 2019 Comparisons – Total State Revenue



# SFY 2019 Comparison – Major State Revenue

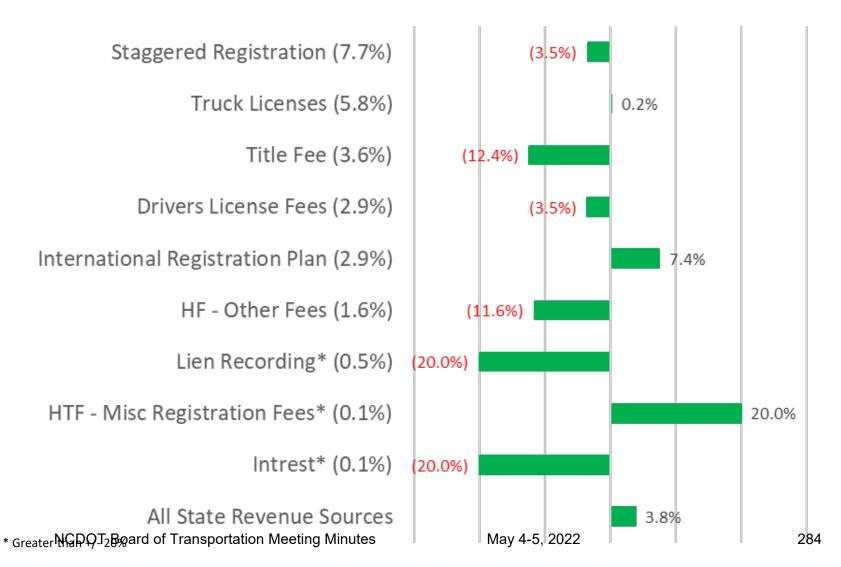


# SFY 2022 to date Comparisons

## **Road Categories**

#### State Maintained Roads

- Primary and secondary
- Includes paved and unpaved roads

### Municipal Roads

Maintained by municipalities

#### Non-system Roads

- Privately maintained
- No government entity responsible for maintenance

## Adding a road to the secondary system

- N.C.G.S. 136-44.10 requires the Board of Transportation to adopt uniform standards and criteria for adding roads to the secondary road system
- Specific requirements are set out in 19A NCAC 02C.0103
  - > Property owners must petition for addition: SR-1 Form
  - Pavement specifications
  - Publicly designated right-of-way
  - Other right-of-way and utility requirements
  - Occupied residence and lot minimums
  - Erosion control and drainage structures
  - No obstructions
  - > Road is in an acceptable state of maintenance prior to addition
- NCDOT Subdivision Roads Minimum Construction Standards

## What is an Orphan Road?

"Orphan Roads"
roads dedicated to
the public, designed
to city or NCDOT
standards, but not
successfully added to
either system

- Specific type of non-system road
- Also called "unadopted roads"
- > Platted and recorded as public
- Intent was for the road to be publicly maintained
- Never added to a public system
- No government entity is responsible for the maintenance of orphan roads

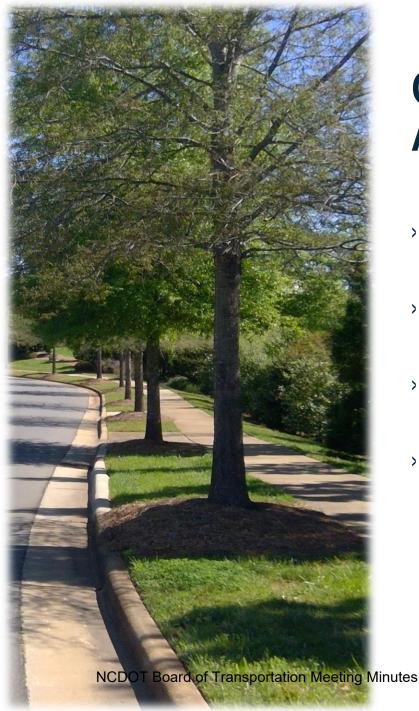
## Two Types of Orphan Roads

#### **Annexation-related**

- Subdivision roads designed to <u>municipal</u> standards
- Located in extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ)
- Intended to be annexed and maintained by municipality
- Never annexed

#### **Developer-related**

- Rural subdivision roads designed to NCDOT standards
- Outside of municipal boundaries
- Intended to be added to state system
- > Never added



### **Orphan Roads: Annexation-related**

- Subdivision roads designed to municipal standards
- Located in municipal extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ)
- Intended to be annexed and then maintained by municipality
- Never annexed
  - Annexation laws changed in 2011-12
  - Roads do not meet minimum state construction standards



### Orphan Roads: Annexation-related

#### Potential solutions for existing roads

- Property owners petition for voluntary annexation
- Property owners formalize a road maintenance agreement and assume responsibility for road maintenance
- Property owners pay for and oversee road improvements themselves, and then petition to add the road to state system
- Some counties <u>may</u> offer financing to bring roads up to state standards.
   Property owners repay the costs over a number of years (N.C.G.S 153A-205)

#### Prevention strategies for new roads

- Voluntary annexation during development
  - Build ETJ roads to state standards



## Orphan Roads: Developer-related

- Rural subdivision roads designed to NCDOT standards
- Located in county jurisdictions
- Intended to be added to the state system and maintained by DOT
- Never added
  - Not constructed to state standards
  - It took several years to meet minimum home density requirements and the road fell into disrepair
  - Developer bankruptcy, failure to petition for road addition



## Orphan Roads: Developer-related

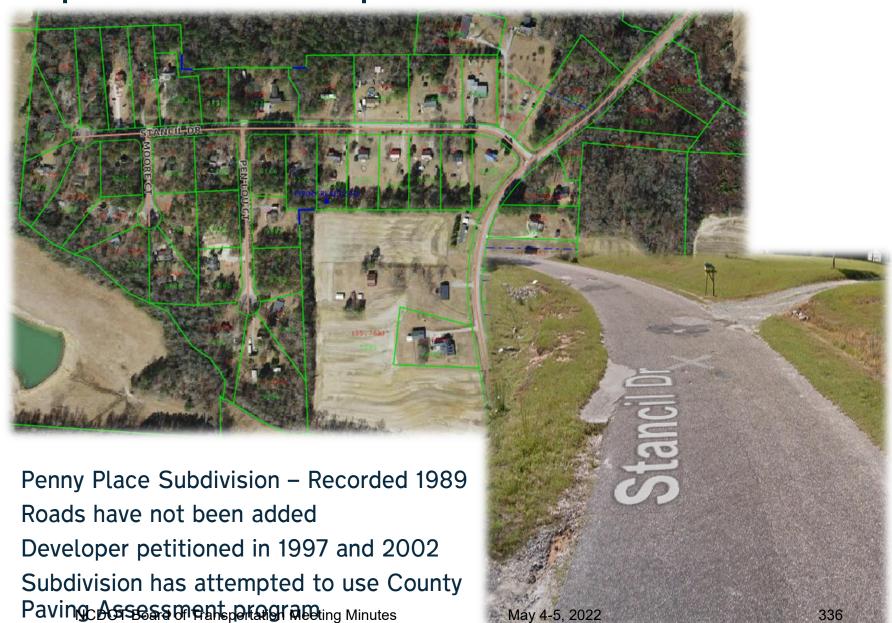
#### Potential solutions for existing roads

- Property owners formalize a road maintenance agreement and assume responsibility for road maintenance
- Property owners formalize a cost-share agreement, pay for and oversee road improvements themselves, and then petition to add the road to state system
- Some counties <u>may</u> offer financing for improvements needed to bring roads up to state standards. Property owners are then assessed and repay the costs over a number of years (N.C.G.S 153A-205)
- Example: Wake County Program

## Orphan Roads: Developer-related

#### Prevention strategies for new roads

- > Investigate strategies to increase developer accountability
- Local governments implement proactive strategies including annual inspections that encourage developers to petition roads for public maintenance
- Expand county programs to finance road improvements (N.C.G.S 153A-205) and extend repayment periods
- Clarify road maintenance disclosure statements on real estate transaction documents to provide more consumer protection

## Other Non-system Roads: Privately Maintained

- Roads successfully maintained by property owners and/or HOA
- Subdivision streets designated as private during development
- Rural roads and easements with no dedicated public right-of-way

# Other Non-system Roads: Desiring State Maintenance

- Subdivision streets with publicly designated right-of-way, not originally intended for State Maintenance
- Driveways and roads serving multiple property owners

# Other Non-system Roads: Desiring State Maintenance

#### Other property owners <u>may</u> desire addition to the statemaintenance system

- > No road maintenance agreement in place
- > No one will fix the road if it washes out or needs repairs
- Public safety concerns: school buses and emergency vehicles
- > Costs of maintenance is overly burdensome
- > Costs to fix roads to DOT standards can escalate over the years
- Pre- 1975 / Post- 1975

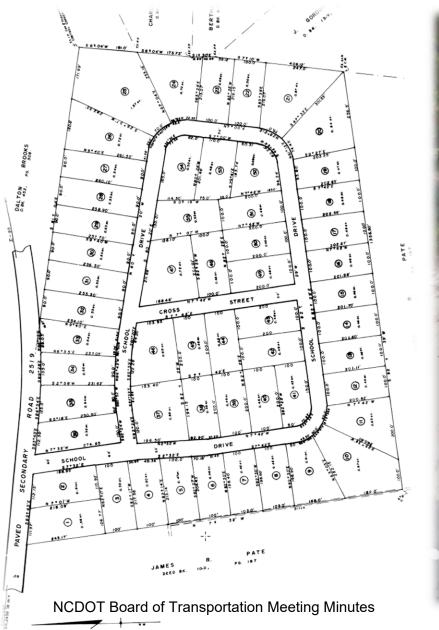
## Pre-1975 roads and other roads not designed or built to state standards

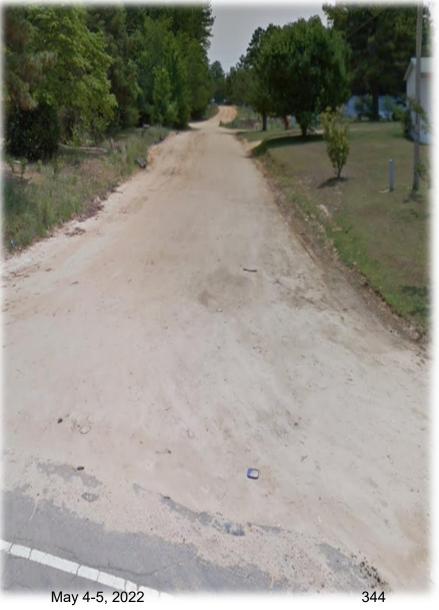
- All roads must meet minimum state standards before being added to the state system
- Pre-1975 roads can be added if they meet unpaved standards
  - Property owners must dedicate right-of-way free of charge
  - > At least five occupied residences per mile
  - Roads < 1 mile must have at least five occupied residences</p>
  - Road serves more than one property owner
  - Pre-1975 roads can be added to the state system if they meet minimum unpaved standards

### Post-1975 Roads

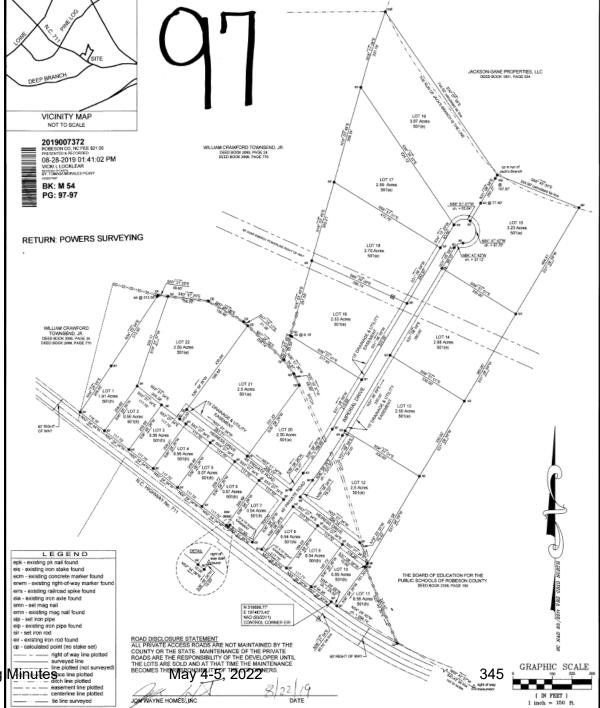
- All roads must meet minimum state standards before being added to the state system
- > Post-1975 roads can be added if they meet paved standards
- > October 1, 1975 (N.C.G.S. 136-102.6)
  - Post-1975: subdivision roads must be platted and recorded with the Register of Deeds before lots can be sold
  - Property owner must designate the road as either public or private
  - If platted and recorded as public, the road shall be designed to meet NCDOT standards
  - This includes NCDOT right-of-way and pavement requirements
- > Prevention: Counties strengthen local planning ordinances

## Gov Ops Research: Orphan Roads

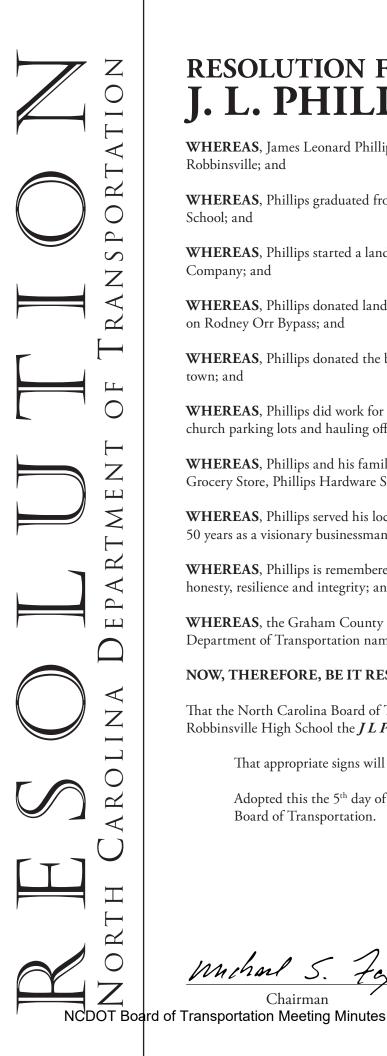
Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 120-71 and 120-76, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations (Gov Ops) has been tasked with conducting a program evaluation on the topic of "orphan roads."

Their evaluation has led to two research questions:

- 1. What is/are the best solution/s to remedy the existing orphan roads?
- 2. What solution(s) can be created or implemented to prevent the creation of new orphan roads?

Gov Ops' priority is identifying ways to halt the creation of new orphan roads. An initial meeting was held between Gov Ops and the NCDOT on March 28th. Gov Ops anticipates releasing their findings later this spring.
