Finance Committee

1. STIF Status – Dale Folwell

- As of January 31st, 2023, \$51.1B is currently being managed under the STIF with a current annualized net cash return of 2.67%.
- The STIF is made up of US Treasuries, US Agencies, and Repurchase Agreements.
- Returns will most likely increase as investments mature and funds are re-invested.
- Short-term funds are managed more conservatively.

2. Financial Update – Stephanie King

- FYTD Revenues are 3.9% less than forecast and expenditures are 11.3% less than forecast.
- Optimized FHWA billings will be realized in future periods due to receiving OA in February.
- DOT has transitioned to the Hybrid Modeling approach this month, which leverages the best information from the Short-Term and Long-Term forecasts. DOT continues to work with SAS to improve the "Long-Term" forecast.
- Biennial consensus revenue forecast for the Highway Fund and Trust Fund was released.
- Revised revenues align with the Apr 22 forecast. We anticipate overcollections of 0.4% among the two funds.
- HF & HTF revenues are projected to rise from: \$4.79B in FY23 to \$5.16B FY24 and \$5.64B in FY25.

3. OSBM Partnership – Nick Norboge

- OSBM is the primary fiscal advisor to the Governor of North Carolina
- Develops the Governor's \$25B budget; Meets with agencies to review state-funded programs.
- OSBM DOT Team provides budget development, budget execution, tracking federal funding opportunities, demographic and economic analysis, and DOT oversight.

4. Federal Pre-IIJA Apportionment – John Sullivan

- There is a contract authority (funding) discrepancy between two key Federal DOT systems in an amount of \$3.5B.
- This issue is prior to the Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act.

- Due to aggressively billing this older funding source via August redistribution, NC's impact is far less than many other States.
- NC's total share is \$75.7M with an allowance of \$3.8M to close projects and prevent lapsing federal dollars.
- Resolution could possibly include Congressional Action.

Advanced Technology (ATC) Committee

Call to Order at 1:55pm, (Committee Members) Zimmer (Chair), Wells (Vice Chair), Clarke, Cody, Lathrop, McGrady, and Phillips in attendance. All present members attended in-person. Absent Members: Molamphy and Moran.,

- November 2, 2022, meeting minutes were approved as distributed with a motion by Committee Member Cody, seconded by Committee Member Clarke.
- Executive Director J.J. Eden introduced the topic of Prepare for Takeoff: Advancing Air Transportation's Next Frontier.
- Riley Beaman, Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program Manager with NCDOT shared a presentation titled:
- Prepare for Takeoff: Advancing Air Transportation's Next Frontier.
- Amanda Conner, Aviation Business Development Manager, also shared some of the presentation information with the Committee Members.
- The meeting concluded with a brief open discussion of the presentation by all attending Committee Members.
- The meeting was adjourned at 2:43 PM with a motion by Committee Member Cody, seconded by Committee Member Clarke.

Workforce Committee

Chairman Grady Hunt called the March 1, 2023, Workforce Development Committee meeting to order, conducted a roll call of members present, and declared a quorum was present. Chair Hunt read the non-conflict/ethics statement and asked if there were any known conflicts of interest. The November 2, 2022, minutes were unanimous approved by the Workforce Development Committee.

Presenter: Amanda Olive, Human Resources Director – NCDOT Bonus & Retention Program:

- The Office of State Human Resources (OSHR) provided state agencies the ability to grant bonuses for hard-to-fill and retain positions. Roles must have: 1) Turnover rates significantly higher than acceptable, and/or 2) Retention rates significantly lower than acceptable, and/or 3) Vacancy rates significantly higher than acceptable.
- To be eligible, employees must: be permanent employees, not be on probation, or leave of absence; not have received a sign-on bonus in the past 24 months from a NC agency for their job classification; and have an overall performance evaluation of at least meets expectations.

- NCDOT identified 17 roles eligible for bonuses based on OSHR rules. Bonuses ranged from \$1,000 to \$2,000.
- 65 NCDMV Headquarters Staff were given a \$1,500 bonus for the move from Raleigh to Rocky Mount. NCDMV HQ move bonuses totaled \$97,500.
- Over \$2.6M in DMV and role-based bonuses: 2,090 total employees. 96% of bonuses were role-based and DMV HQ move bonuses were 4%.
- Potential bonuses that were not paid: 65 employees in eligible roles did not receive the bonus due to performance ineligibility; 52 employees in eligible roles did not receive the bonus due to being on leave of absence; 33 employees declined the bonus; and 6 employees in eligible roles did not receive the bonus due to retirement.
- Discussion continued concerning retention, high school internship program, employee research groups, vacancy rate, and continued funding from the General Assembly for various programs.

Highway Committee

The Highways Committee heard two presentations on March 1, 2023.

Material Escalation Adjustments Update

The first presentation, titled Material Escalation Adjustments Update, was provided by Mr. Boyd Tharrington, Director of Field Support. Mr. Tharrington discussed the Department's time-limited cost escalation program.

The program provided a way for contractors and vendors to request material price adjustments on eligible contracts.

Background:

- Legislation: House Bill 103 was signed into law on July 11, 2022
- This legislation provided \$135 million to address the steep rise in material prices.
- NCDOT developed a document-driven process for claim submittals.
- A memorandum was sent to industry partners on July 12, 2022
- Distribution included prime contractors, subcontractors, and material suppliers.
- Requests for price adjustments had to be submitted by September 10, 2022

Contract Eligibility Requirements:

- Contracts had to be awarded on or before March 1, 2022
- Contract performance had to be ongoing (not complete), or the final estimate was not paid by this date.
- Materials had to be purchased after July 1, 2020
- Materials had to be permanently incorporated into the work
- Vendors had to provide documentation to show price quotes for materials, invoices for materials, and/or purchase order contracts
- Adjustments were for materials only not for labor, transportation charges, profit, markup etc.

Claim Totals:

- The Department received 457 material escalation requests.
- Total amount requested was roughly \$143 million
- Vendors had the opportunity to appeal the initial review decision
- The Department received 223 appeals
- In total, the Department approved over \$98 million for eligible materials
- The most common reason for not approving requests was lack of documentation or poor documentation.

Subcontractors:

- 166 subcontractors submitted requests.
- Approximately \$56 million of the approved claims were for subcontractors.
- 55 subcontractors were certified DBEs (Disadvantaged Business Enterprises)
- Approximately \$19 million (or 20%) of the total approved amount was for DBEs

Next Steps:

- Supplemental agreements or lump sum price adjustments will be executed on all contracts with approved requests
- Agreements will document dollar values approved for each subcontractor and/or material supplier to ensure funds are passed through appropriately
- These funds are starting to pay out now
- Unused funds (roughly \$35 million) will be transferred to General Maintenance Reserve (GMR) per legislation
- Discussion followed.

Roadside Environmental Unit: Beyond the Pavement

The second presentation, Roadside Environmental Unit: Beyond the Pavement, was provided by Mr. David Harris, State Roadside Environmental Engineer. Mr. Harris' presentation highlighted three Roadside activities: (1) Rest Areas, (2) Aesthetics and Landscape Design, and (3) Litter Management.

Rest Area System:

- Rest areas are considered part of the highway system
- NCDOT operates and maintains 59 rest area facilities across the state
- 9 of the facilities are also North Carolina Welcome Centers
- Approximately 24.2 million visitors last year
- Facilities are inspected and monitored to rate the condition of the facilities.
- Condition rating is used to focus repairs and renovation efforts
- NCDOT also tracks operational history to determine functionality, such as facility capacity and truck parking.
- Fiscal Year 2022 rest area costs were \$16.5 million

Rest Area Challenges:

- Truck parking
- Contractor issues: labor shortages and material costs
- Increasing operational costs: growing populations and visitation
- Social issues
- Funding challenges, especially for renovations and construction

Aesthetics and Landscape Design:

- NCDOT Landscape policy and Aesthetics guidance manuals were discussed.
- Most projects are eligible for landscaping funds = 1% of construction costs
- Requires approval from the Chief Engineer
- Example landscape projects were highlighted
- Scenic by-ways were also reviewed: NC maintains 62 scenic by-ways

Litter Management:

- Litter management costs roughly \$22 million per year
- Various methods:
- Contracts: Correctional Enterprises and Contractors
- NCDOT Forces
- Adopt-A-Highway
- Sponsor-A-Highway
- Other volunteers
- Spring Litter Sweep is April 15-29, 2023
- Discussion followed.

Adjournment

Chairman Fox asked if there were any additional items for discussion. He stated hearing none he would accept a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made by Board Member McGrady and seconded by Board Member Daughtry. Chairman Fox stated the motion passed unanimously.

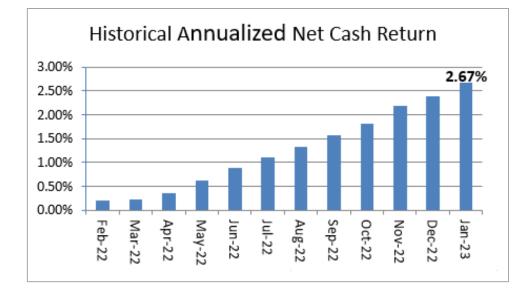

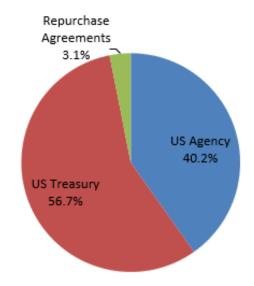




North Carolina Short Term Portfolio (STIF) January 31, 2023

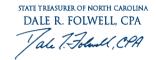

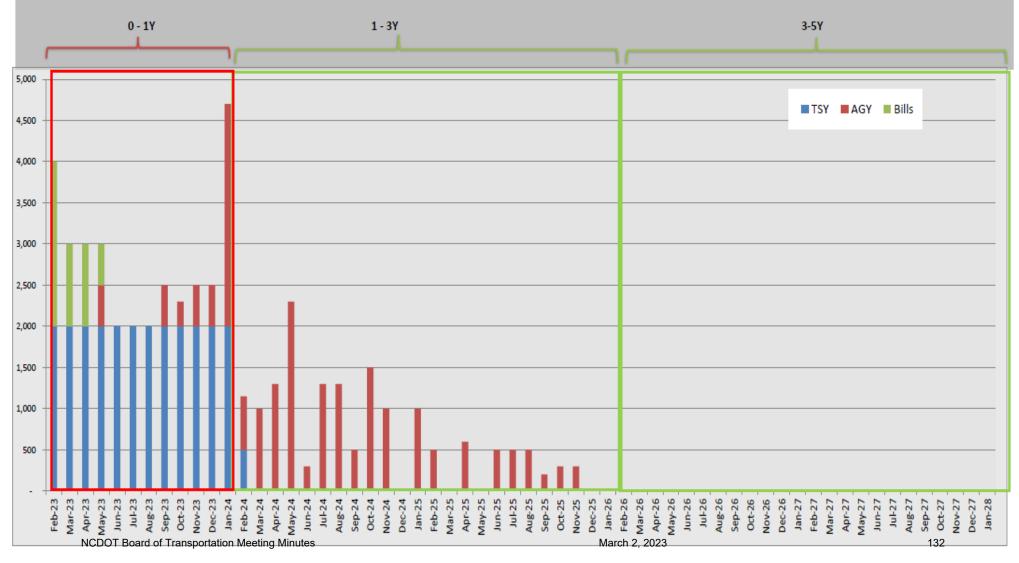

Short Term Portfolio (STIF) Maturity Profile as of 1/31/23

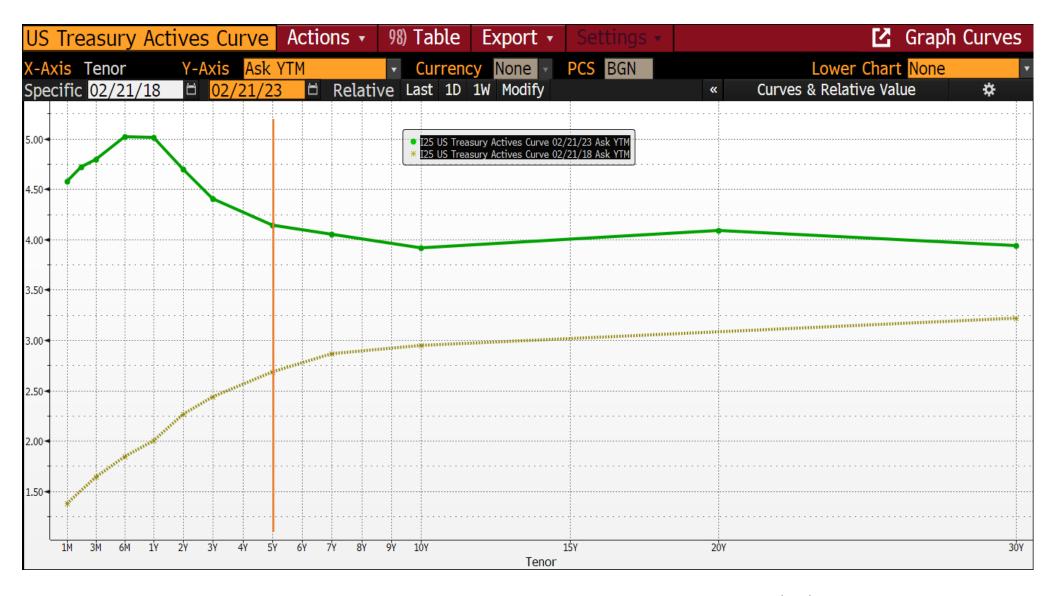

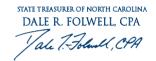


Inverted vs Typical Yield Curve

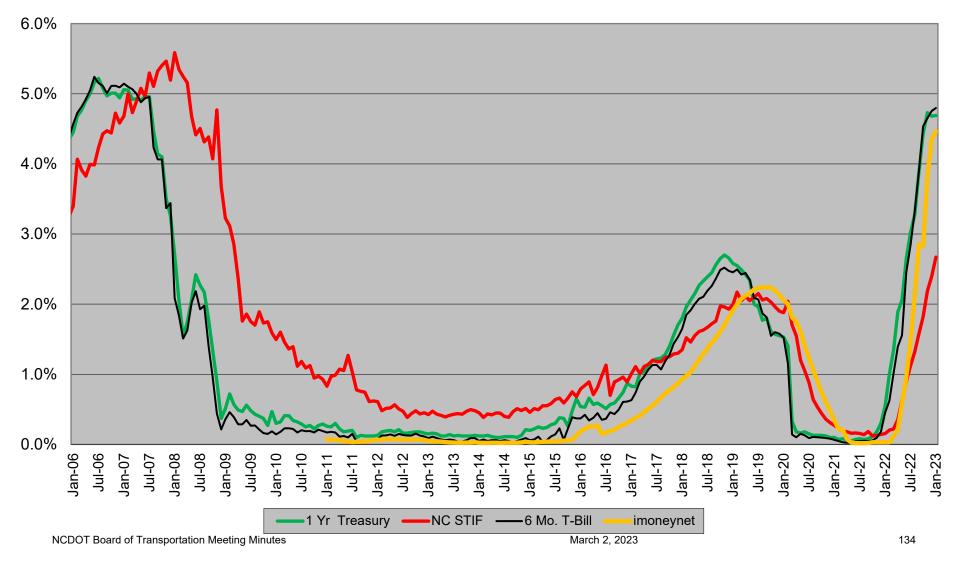


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Short Term Portfolio (STIF) Rate History \$51.1 Billion AUM as of 1/31/23

FHWA Financial Reconciliation Issue Notification

- There is a disconnect in Pre-Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) contract authority balances between two key Federal DOT financial management systems:
 - Delphi USDOT's accounting system of record and
 - FMIS Federal Highway Administration's grants management system
- USDOT and FHWA determined that balances of Pre- IIJA Contract Authority in FMIS are approximately \$3.5B greater than Delphi.
 - A contractor worked with FHWA to reconcile FMIS and Delphi; The discrepancy dates to FY 2005 and prior fiscal years.
 - FHWA was unable to identify the specific cause(s) of the funding discrepancy; reconciliation efforts continue
 - The two systems must be reconciled DOT and FHWA are reexamining financial transactions in 2004-2005
- FHWA has made some pre-IIJA funding available to States for limited purposes ensuring an adequate balance remains in Delphi.

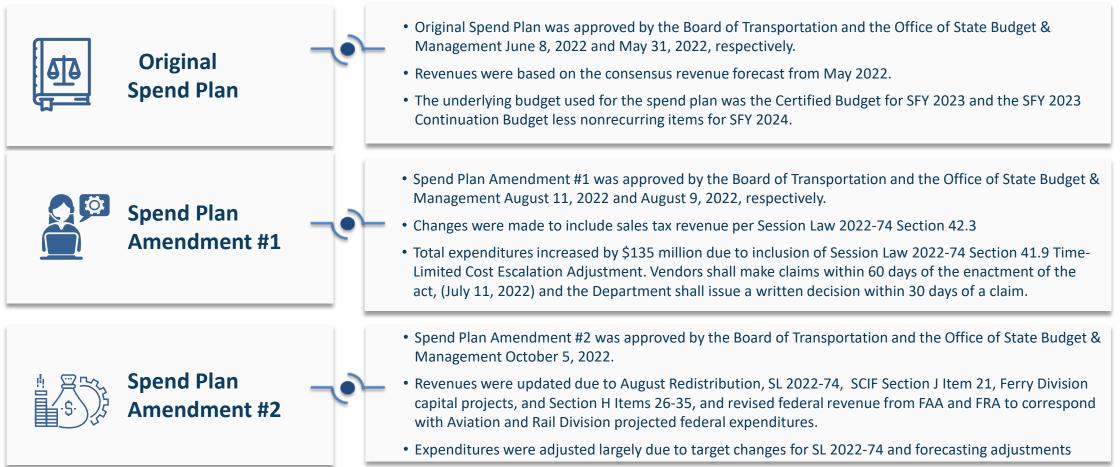
Impact to North Carolina for Pre IIJA Funding

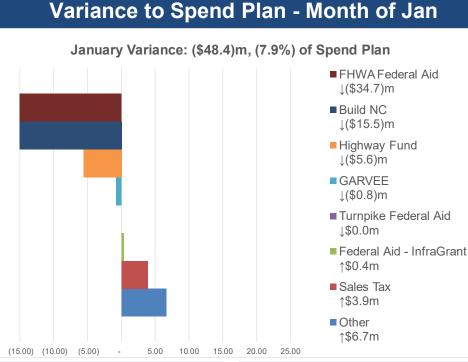

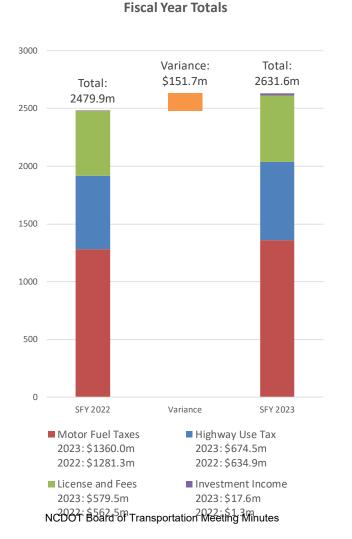

FYTD YoY Variance

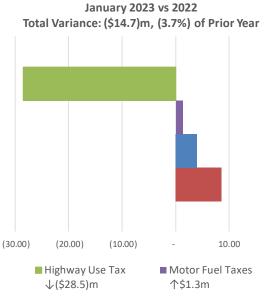

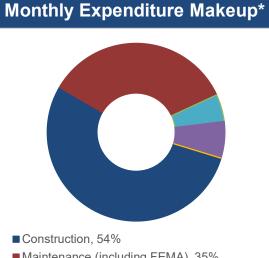

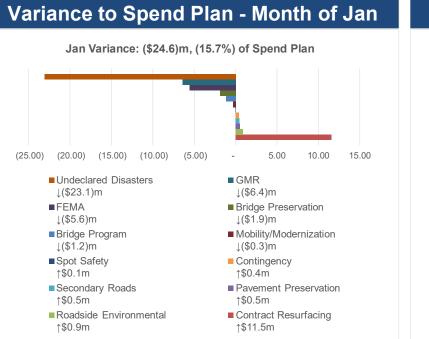

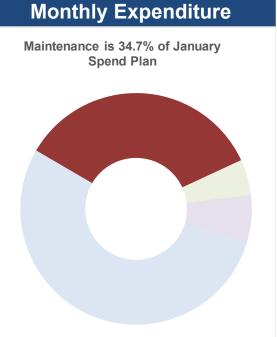

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Maintenance Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$M)



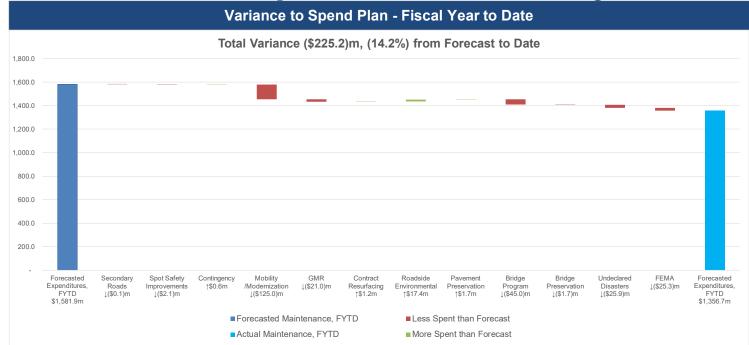

Maintenance Expenditure Summary and Variances – FYTD (\$M)

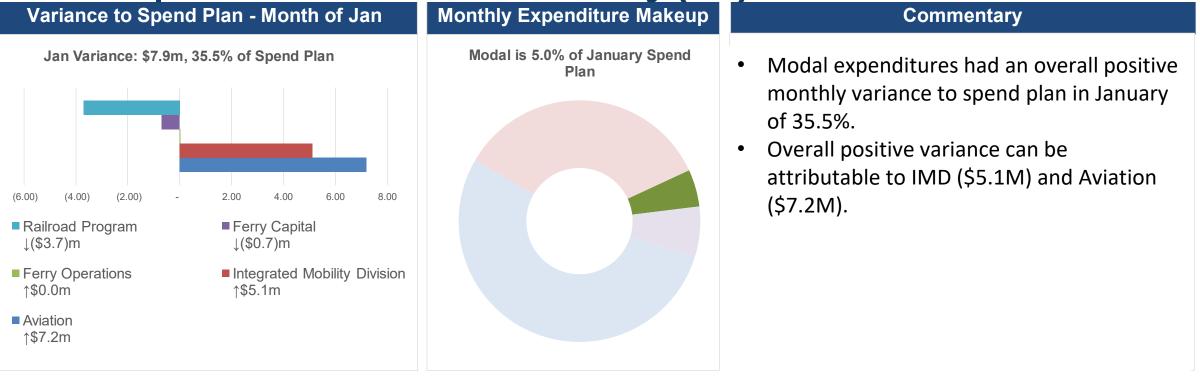

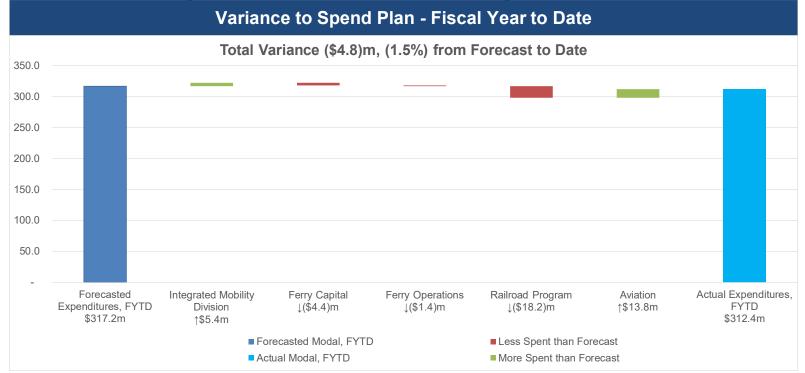

Modal Expenditure Summary and Variances – FYTD (\$M)



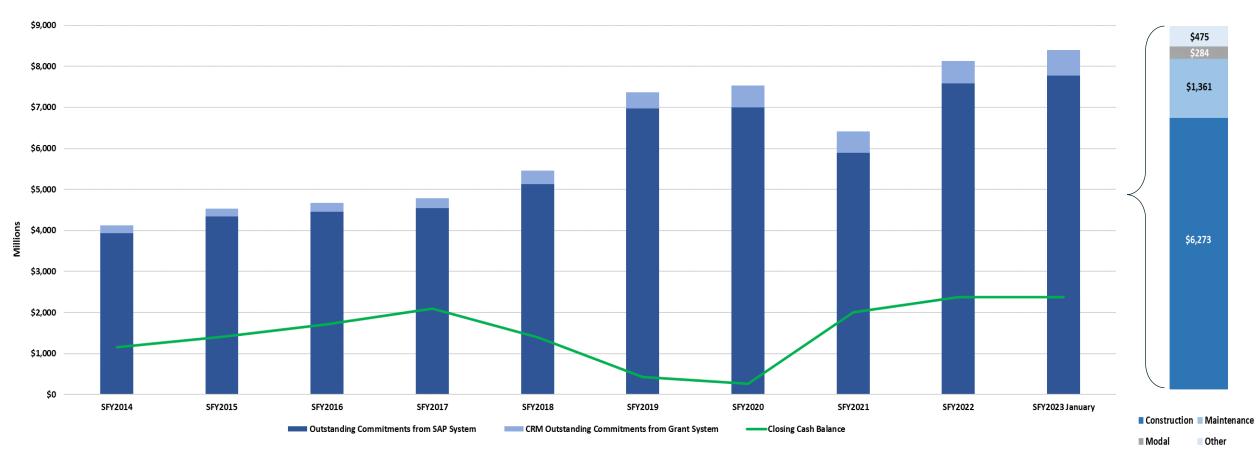

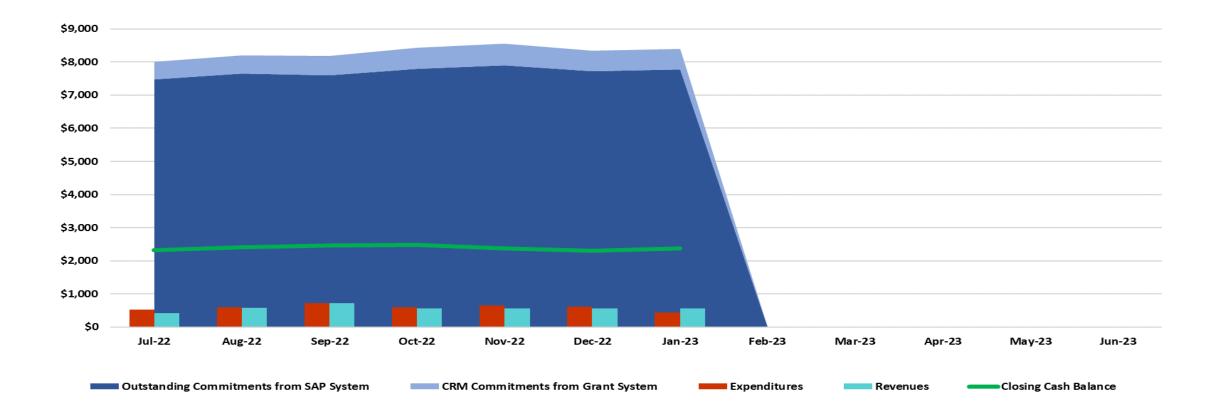
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by Month



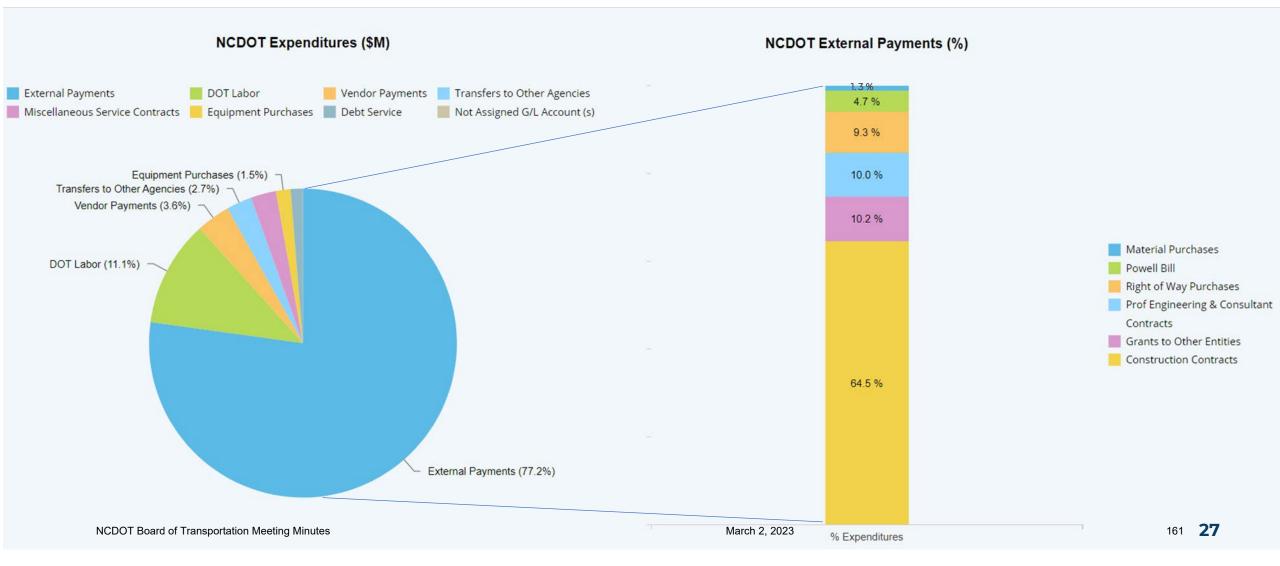

Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

January 2023 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For January 2023, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.24 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$716 million and \$955 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for January was \$2.38 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$358 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

Obligation of Pre-Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) Apportionments

March 1, 2023

PANSPORTAT

- There is a major disconnect in Pre-BIL Contract Authority balances between two key DOT financial management systems: DOT's accounting system of record (Delphi) and the Federal Highway Administration's grants management system (FMIS)
- Information in these two systems should match, but instead, DOT and FHWA have determined that balances of Pre-BIL Contract Authority in FMIS are approximately \$3.5B greater than Delphi
- **The discrepancy dates to FY 2005 and prior fiscal years** and after exhaustive efforts, the specific cause(s) of the funding discrepancy have not been identified
- **The two systems must be reconciled**. Over the next few months, DOT and FHWA are reexamining financial transactions in 2004-2005 to reaffirm FHWA's prior analysis
- In October, pre-BIL contract authority was not made available to the States. **FHWA made some of the pre-BIL funding available while the reconciliation plan is finalized**
- This issue does not impact the overall or state-by-state total highway spending allowed by law CDOT Board of Transportation Meeting Minutes

Contract Authority & Obligation Limitation



- Contract Authority is a special type of budget authority that allows FHWA to enter into obligations in advance of an appropriation
- Contract Authority has a Period of Availability of 4 years, unless specified otherwise in law, and provides the States with flexibility that helps them in planning long term-major highway construction projects
- Unlike funding that is provided by the Appropriations Committees, the annual amount of Contract Authority is established by the authorizing Committees in multi-year surface authorization acts (e.g., IIJA)
- At the beginning of each fiscal year, Contract Authority is distributed by a statutory formula to the States for apportioned programs
- The Appropriations Committees have their own tool for controlling spending. They establish an Obligation Limitation which sets a ceiling on how much Contract Authority can be obligated in a given time period -- generally annually for Federal-aid Highways

Use of Pre-BIL Apportioned Funding Subject to Formula Obligation Limitation

- States may de-obligate pre-BIL funds and re-obligate funding in same program code.
- States may obligate pre-BIL funding for

➢ Programs not continued by BIL, or

Funds set to lapse (expire) at the end of this fiscal year

- States should refrain from obligating pre-BIL funding for any program continued by BIL.
 - NC's amount \$75.7 million of the \$4.3 billion national total
 - If justified, may obligate 5% of \$75.7 million

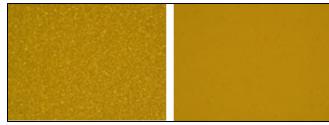

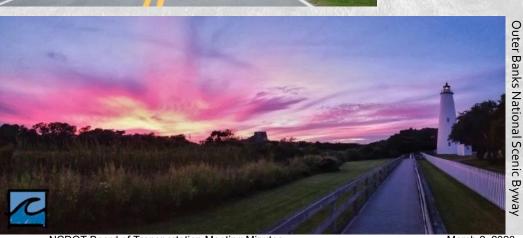
NC Scenic Byways Overview

Since it inception in 1990, the N.C. Department of Transportation has designated 62 scenic byways to give visitors and residents a chance to experience North Carolina's history, geography, and culture, while also raising awareness for the protection and preservation of these treasures. Byways are carefully selected to portray the diverse beauty and culture of the Tar Heel State and provide travelers with safe and interesting alternate travel routes. These byways are intended as an alternative to the faster-paced traffic and commercial areas found along our state's major highways and interstates. Following the byways, motorists will see some of North Carolina's most breathtaking scenery, from the Blue Ridge Mountains to the fertile plains of the Piedmont to the crystal blue shores of the coast. The routes vary in length from 1.5 to 173 miles and are clearly marked with highway signs with the Scenic Byways logo. North Carolina Scenic Byways are selected based on natural, cultural, and historic features along the route. Motorists will see little or no development along the routes that detracts from the natural character and quality of the byway.

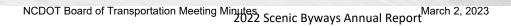

The following are just some of the tasks undertaken by the Byways program during 2022:

Funding:

Summer of 2021 - FHWA informs NC Byways that the main NC Byway grant/ funding source will expire. We requested and were granted a year extension.

August 1, 2022 - Original Byway grant expires

January 1, 2023 - No grant/funding directly for NC Scenic Byways program with the exception of a small donations account.

FHWA 2022 National Scenic Byways Program Grants and Technical Assistance:



- This grant opportunity will result in the distribution of up to \$22 million that are currently available. If additional funding is provided for the NSBP during FY 2022, FHWA intends to use those funds for projects selected to receive a grant under this NOFO. This notice identifies selection criteria, application requirements, and technical assistance during the grant

solicitation period for this one-time solicitation. The FHWA will distribute these funds, as described in this notice, on a competitive basis in a manner consistent with the selection criteria. For the 2022 NSBP grants, FHWA seeks projects that meet the statutory eligibility and advance one or more of the four goals: (1) Safety; (2) Equity and Accessibility; (3) Economic Strength; and (4) Climate and Sustainability.

- NC Scenic Byways worked with Programs Management and four byway groups (Dare Co., Surry Co., Blue Ridge Pkwy Assoc., & NPS) to prepare, organize, and submit five grant applications worth a combined total of \$6,678,809. Applications were submitted on June 14th, 2022.

- Application results have not been announced as of 2/2/2023

- \$20 million in additional funding has been appropriated for 2023 by the FHWA and National Scenic Byways Program. The FHWA plans to announce another NOFO in 2023.

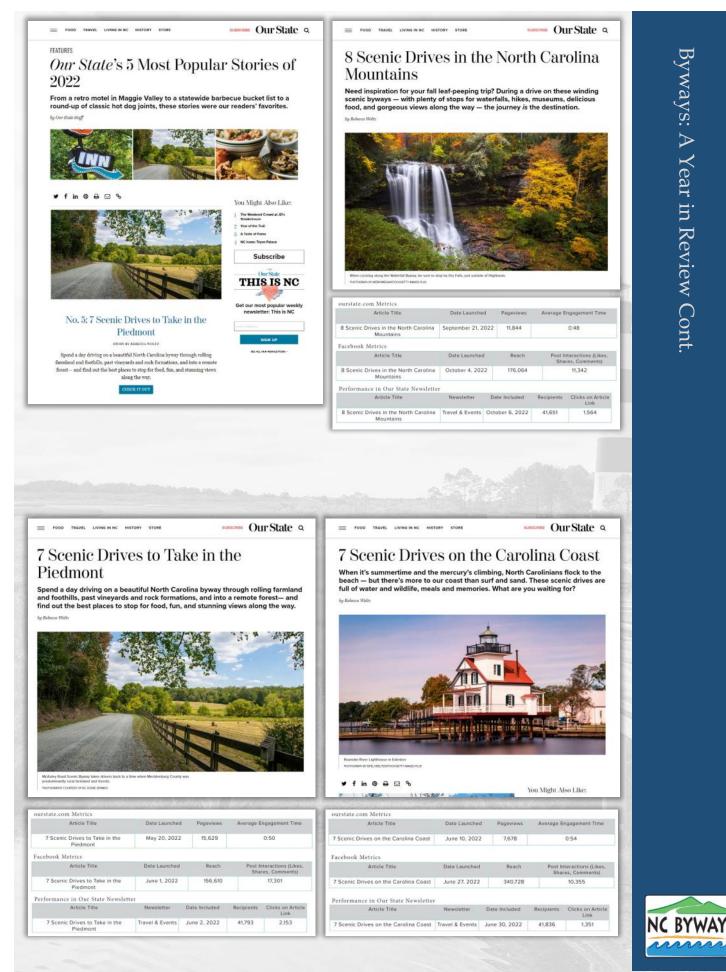

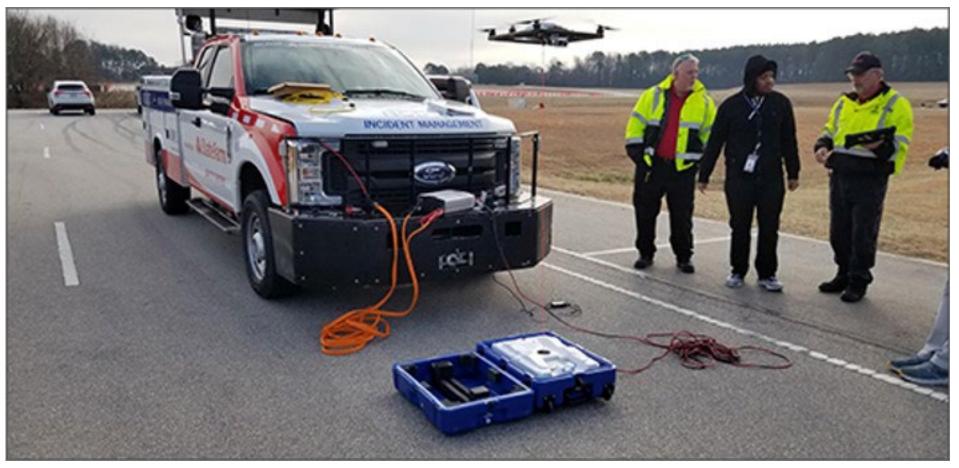

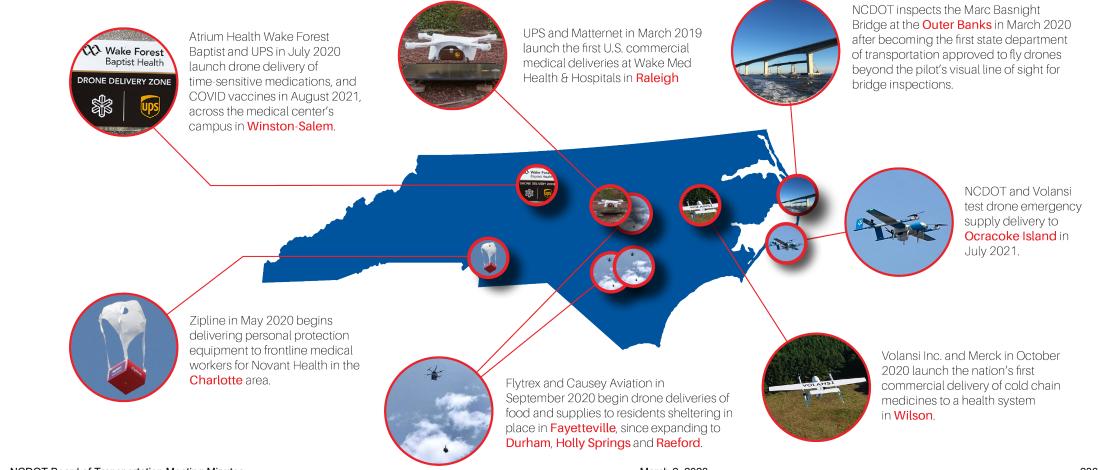

- The Office of State Human Resources (OSHR) provided state agencies the ability to grant bonuses for hard-to-fill & retain positions.
 - This initiative aids in the employment for critical positions with labor market shortages affecting business needs and impairing delivery of essential services.
- Agencies may develop programs to provide bonuses for hard-to-fill occupations. Roles must have:
 - 1. Turnover rates significantly higher than acceptable, and/or
 - 2. Retention rates significantly lower than acceptable, and/or
 - 3. Vacancy rates significantly higher than acceptable.
- To be eligible, employees must
 - Be permanent employees, not be on probation, or leave of absence.
 - Not have received a sign-on bonus in the past 24 months from an NC agency for their job classification.
 - Have an overall performance evaluation of at least" Meets Expectations."
- Bonuses are NOT tied to goals, productivity, quality/accuracy of work, or attendance.

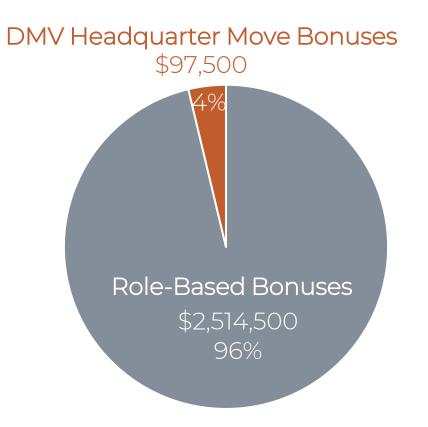

Background

Time-Limited Cost Escalation Adjustment legislation included in SL 2022-74(HB 103), Section 41.9(a) and signed into law July 11, 2022.

\$135 MIL appropriated to address precipitous rise in material prices.

Department developed process for claim submittals outlined in memorandum to Industry Partners on July 12th, 2022.

Distribution included all qualified prime contractors, subcontractors, and material suppliers.

All requests for price adjustments were to be submitted by **no later than close of business on September 10, 2022**.

Contract Eligibility Requirements

- Contracts awarded on or before March 1, 2022, where either contract performance was not completed, or the final estimate was not paid by this date.
- Material Requirements
 - Material must be purchased after July 1, 2020.
 - Material must have been or will be permanently incorporated into the work.
 - Required documentation to include price quotes, invoices for materials, or purchase order contracts.
 - Adjustments are for materials only and not for labor, transportation charges, profit, markup, etc.

Summary of Requests



- The Department received **457** material escalation requests on 457 unique projects.
- The total amount requested was \$143,859,311.92.
- The Department approved **<u>\$67,492,048.50</u>** for eligible materials upon first review.
- The Department provided a written decision to each Prime Contractor with the total amount approved as well as review comments relating to their submittal.

Appeals Process

- The Department provided opportunity to submit an appeal of the initial review decision.
- The Department received 223 appeals.
- The Department approved **<u>\$98,876,646.48</u>** following the review of appeal submittals.

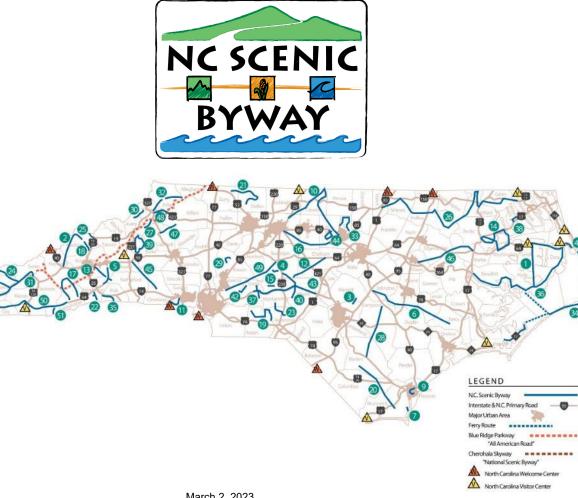
