#### **Full Board Work Session**

#### Wednesday, April 5, 2023

Chairman Fox welcomed the members of the Board to the meeting located in the Board Room.

#### Roll Call

Chairman Fox conducted a roll call of members with the following members present in the meeting: Chairman Fox, Vice Chair Perkins, Board Member Alcoke, Board Member Zimmer, Board Member Mitchell, Board Member Daughtry, Board Member Jordan, Board Member Hunt, Board Member Mathis, Board Member Molamphy, Board Member Lathrop, Board Member Rosenburgh, Board Member Phillips, Board Member Lail, Board Member Wells, Board Member Clarke, and Board Member McGrady.

The following members were present via teams: Board Member Moran and Board Member Cody.

#### **Declaration of Quorum**

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

#### Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the full board Work Session to order on Wednesday, April 6, 2023.

Chairman Fox also made the announcement that there would be a new Board Member next month. Former Senator Kathryn Harrington was appointed to replace former Board Member Senator Tillman. He mentioned that she will be a welcomed addition to the Board and that she has a great deal of transportation experience.

#### **Ethics Statement**

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

#### **Innovative Technology and Product Awareness**

Chairman Fox noted that a copy of this month's Innovative Technology and Product Awareness update was provided to members of the Board for review and posted on the Board's website for review.

#### **Division of Mitigation Services (DMS) Biennial Budget**

Chairman Fox noted that a copy of the Division of Mitigation Services Biennial Budget 2023 - 2025 was provided to members of the Board for review. He mentioned that this will be an action item next month. If a Board Member has any questions, they can be directed to the right person. He announced that Jamie Lancaster is the new Unit Head of the Environmental Analysis Unit, and that Jim Stanfill is the Deputy Director of NC Division Mitigation Services, NCSEQ.

#### **Legislative Update**

Chairman Fox welcomed Leigh Jackson, Legislative Affairs Director, to present a legislative update.

#### **Prioritization 7.0 (P7.0)**

Chairman Fox welcomed Brian Wert, Senior Transportation Engineer, to present an update on Prioritization 7.0 (P7.0).

#### Final 2024-2033 STIP

Chairman Fox welcomed Kevin Lacy, Director of Strategic Planning and Programming, to present on the final draft of the 2024-2033 STIP.

Chairman Fox mentioned that this will be back in front of the Board in June for final approval. Contact Kevin Lacy or the appropriate staff before then with any questions or concerns.

#### NC Clean Transportation

Chairman Fox clarified something that he said in the last meeting. He mentioned that the Board would need to approve the North Carolina Clean Transportation Plan, however; since this was an Executive Order, the Board would not be voting on this item. The North Carolina Department of Transportation staff have completed the Clean Transportation Plan and will present it to the Governor by Thursday, April 6, 2023.

Chairman Fox welcomed Kevin Lacy, Director of Strategic Planning and Programming, to update the Board on the plan's recommendations in greater detail.

#### **General Announcements**

Chairman Fox reminded members of the Board to complete their Statement of Economic Interests (SEI) that is due Monday, April 17, 2023.

#### **Committees**

Chairman Fox announced that afternoon committees would convene following the Work Session. The Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Committee will meet in the Board Room (Room 150). The Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations (EDIR) Committee will be held in the EIC. The Highway Committee will meet in the Board Room (Room 150). The Multi-Modal Committee will meet in the EIC.

#### **Declaration of Quorum**

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

#### Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the full board meeting to order on Thursday, April 6, 2023.

#### **Ethics Statement**

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

#### Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Boyette to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Approval – March 1-2, 2023, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from March 1-2, 2023, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the March 1-2, 2023, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Zimmer and a second by Board Member Mitchell. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

#### Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Board Member Valerie Jordan read the resolution for the North Carolina State University 2022 Women's Cross Country National Champions naming located in Division 5. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Jordan and a second by Board Member Clarke. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the Chief John D. Parrish Bridge naming located in Division 1. The reading was accepted as a motion by Chairman Fox and a second by Board Member Moran. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the Fireman Henry Smith Bridge naming located in Division 1. The reading was accepted as a motion by Chairman Fox and a second by Board Member Moran. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Valerie Jordan read the resolution for the Dr. Dock J. Jordan and Carrie Thomas Jordan Highway naming located in Division 5. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Jordan and a second by Board Member Mitchell. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

#### Wildflower Awards

Chairman Fox invited David Harris, State Roadside Environmental Engineer, and Linda McLendon, President of the Garden Club of North Carolina, up to the front to distribute the 2022 Wildflower Awards. Mrs. McLendon spoke a few words before David Harris called forward the winners in each category.

The second-place winner for the Daylily Award went to Division 13 located at I-240 West at Exit 8 in Buncombe County. The first-place winner for the Daylily Award went to Division 7 located at I-40 at Koury Blvd. in Guilford County. The second-place winner for the Eastern Region Award went to Division 2 located at I-587 at NC 43 in Pitt County. The first-place winner for the Eastern Region Award went to Division 4 located at I-95 at mile marker 111.5 in Wilson County. The second-place winner for the Central Region Award went to Division 7 located at US 220 in Rockingham County. The first-place winner for the Central Region Award went to Division 9 located at I-85 South at Exit 91 in Davidson County. The second-place winner for the Western Region Award went to Division 12 located at US 321 at High Shoals in Lincoln County. The first-place winner for the Western Region Award went to Division 11 located at US 421 in Wilkes County. The second-place winner for Best Overall went to Division 7. The first-place winner for Best Overall went to Division 9.

#### **Secretary's Remarks**

Secretary Boyette apologized for missing last month's Board meeting. He was attending ASHTO in Washington, D.C.

Secretary Boyette stated that March was a busy month. It started with Siemens Mobility in Lexington. He said that NCDOT has contributed around \$9 million to this project and that it is going to create about 500 jobs in Lexington it and is about a \$200 million investment in North Carolina.

Secretary Boyette then stated that later in the month, Alligator River Bridge was celebrated. This was a \$110 million federal grant that the department applied for and won. The grant application was named STERLING after Sterling Baker, our former Division 1 Engineer who passed away last year. STERLING stands for Strengthening Transportation Evacuation Resilient Lifeline by Improving the Network Grid.

Secretary Boyette announced that there was another launch of the CASSI program, which is an autonomous shuttle. This event took place in Bond Park in Cary and helped people understand what the future of Transportation looks like.

Secretary Boyette shared that there was another opportunity in March to discuss the Bus Rapid Transit. He said that there is an opportunity for the department to have additional funding for that line in Wake County running from Raleigh over to Garner. It is going to increase traffic so that people can get to and from jobs, healthcare, entertainment, etc.

Secretary Boyette stated that the department held the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual NCDOT Research and Innovation Summit last week. This is where the department can talk, show, and think about new innovations, such as the CASSI program.

Secretary Boyette announced that staff presented the NC Clean Transportation Plan to the Governor, in accordance with Executive Order 246.

Secretary Boyette announced that this week is North Carolina Work Zone Awareness Week. He stated that 171 people were killed in North Carolina work zones between 2018-2022. Each of these deaths are tragic but preventable. He asked everyone to please pay attention in the work zones, slow down, and watch where you are going. He encouraged everyone to put their phones down because nothing is more important than the people who are in those work zones. He held a moment of silence to honor the lives of those lost on North Carolina roadways. He then spoke about an event at the Northampton County Welcome Center that showcased our partnership with the State Highway Patrol. He drew everyone's attention to a picture of Anna Bradshaw, a Division 4 employee who was killed last summer after she was struck by a motorist while she was out on the roadway cleaning up debris from a fallen tree.

Secretary Boyette then asked for a video to be played on the safety topic of hard hats. He thanked Robin Barfield, Wade Bailey and all the Safety Engineers and Consultants in the Divisions for their efforts to make their work environment safer.

Secretary Boyette announced that the preparation for the 2024 NC Transportation Summit is already underway. He stated that there would be some changes to the itinerary. The next Summit will be held at the Koury Convention Center in Greensboro May 21-22, 2024.

Secretary Boyette announced that the Spring Litter Sweep will be from April 15-29, 2023. He mentioned that the department has already picked up 2.2 million pounds of trash this year. The department spends a lot of money on this, but our volunteers help reduce that cost with their efforts. He then thanked the volunteers, the maintenance staff, the contract staff, and everyone that works with the department to ensure that North Carolina is clean. Visit ncdot.gov/littersweep for more information.

Secretary Boyette then invited Stephanie King, Chief Financial Officer, to join him at the front. They presented the Brent Hamilton Excellence in Financial Management and Integrity Award to someone who embodies everything that this award stands for. This year's recipient has worked with NCDOT for over 25 years in various capacities. She has been in Business Officer and Accountant roles with the Modes, Auditor with the Office of the Inspector General, Accountant, Program Analyst and most recently the Spend Plan Manager with the Financial Management Division. As the Spend Plan Manager, she leads efforts with the Senior Leadership Team at NCDOT, the Office of State Budget and Management, the State Treasurer's Office, and our Board to produce a comprehensive spend plan. This process involves countless hours of planning, collaboration, problem solving and precise execution. She has helped define what this forecasting will look like for our department. She has the highest ethical standards and always wants to do the right thing. The Brent Hamilton Award winner for the 2022 Fiscal Year was awarded to Dorene Creech.

Lastly, Secretary Boyette presented the highest honor for state service on behalf of Governor Cooper. The Long Leaf Pine was awarded to Mr. Bobby Walston, Aviation Director. Mr. Walston has worked with the Department of Transportation for Thirty years. Under his watch with the Aviation Division, they have grown the transportation program for aviation by working with our local airports and launched a nation-leading unmanned air transportation program. Mr. Walston will be retiring in the coming weeks.

Thus far in Fiscal Year 2023 (FY2023), the Board has approved \$1,762,096,174 in highway maintenance allocations. An initial allocation of \$1,699,760,767 was approved on July 7, 2022 and three supplemental allocations, totaling \$62,335,407, have also been approved.

At this time, staff recommends allocating an additional \$16,175,688 for General Maintenance Reserve (Traditional GMR). The additional funds were made available after being approved for Legislative, Medical and Retirement increases. These funds will be distributed to the Divisions. Staff also recommends reducing Division Snow and Ice Operation funds by (\$25,009,501) and reallocating the funds to the Divisions as Traditional GMR. The recommended redistribution of funds from Emergency GMR to Traditional GMR is a result of mild winter weather and lower than anticipated snow and ice expenditures. This redistribution and transfer will allow the Divisions to better address the ongoing maintenance needs of the system.

Staff is also requesting approval to cashflow \$26,000,000 for Bridge Preservation. This cashflow request is project specific. The purpose of the recommended cashflow is to better align project funding with forecasted expenditures.

The allocation summary is detailed in Table 1 on Pages S2-3.

#### **Finance Committee**

- 1. Current Economic Conditions Dr. Michael Walden
  - The focus of policymakers has shifted from an emphasis on improving the GDP and unemployment rate to controlling the rate of inflation.
  - In the last two years inflation has been as high as 9% but has moderated recently to about 6%
  - The Federal Reserve has been working to reduce inflation using the two tools at its disposal: reducing the money supply and increasing the federal funds rate from 0 to approximately 5%.
  - The Federal Reserve's actions have a good chance of creating a "soft landing" for the economy slowing inflation without causing a severe recession. The federal funds rate will probably be increased twice in the next year and top out somewhere below 6%.
  - In the next two years there will likely be a minor contraction in the economy and a moderate rise in the unemployment rate (up to about 5%), with economic growth returning in 2024.
  - The economic trend most likely to impact NC is the continual shift of individuals in rural

communities to urban (and suburban) areas; investment in broadband & infrastructure may alter that trend.

#### 2. Financial Update - Stephanie King

- FYTD Revenues are 3.2% less than the forecast. FYTD expenditure is 10.4% less than forecast.
- Both the Governor's recommended budget and the House's budget have been released. We hope that the budget is ratified prior to or shortly after July 1.
- DOT continues to use the Hybrid Modeling approach this month.
- Draft spend plan will be presented at the May 3<sup>rd</sup> FC meeting for a vote for consideration in June.
- Spend Plan performance audit is underway, anticipating an April completion date.
- DOT was over the cash threshold for new Build NC bonds during the first 3 months of the year, so DOT has requested an exception to potentially issue bonds in early 2024.

#### 3. Consensus Revenue – Amna Cameron

- Statutory changes for revenues include the following: Annual adjustment of motor fuels tax rate, phase-in of sales tax proceeds, and Quadrennial adjustment to DMV fees.
- Certified State Revenues for FY23 are at \$4.7b; Estimated State Revenues for FY24 are \$5.2b
- MFT is \$2.3b in FY23 with projections to move to \$2.9b in FY34.
- HUT is \$1.2b in FY23 with projections to move to \$1.5b in FY34.
- DMV is \$1.0b in FY23 with projections to move to \$1.4b in FY34.
- Sales Tax is \$207m in FY23 with projections to move to \$857m in FY34.

#### 4. Toll Credit Program Implementation – Leigh Wing

- Toll Credits are a tool that provides flexibility on how DOT's can allocate its federal dollars.
- This is not additional federal funding or an increase in the amount of total spend authority.
- This tool can be used to reduce the number of projects it takes to utilize the already set amount of federal appropriations.
- Using toll credits, NCDOT can concentrate the same amount of federal dollars on fewer projects, making it easier to gather a group of projects that maximize redistribution requests.

#### **Highways Committee**

Mr. Kevin Lacy presented to the Highways Committee on the Interstate Designation Process. The major takeaways from Mr. Lacy's presentation are that ...

- It takes decades for a route to become an interstate.
- And the necessary upgrades are costly.

There are two pathways for a route to become an interstate: (1) Administrative, where NCDOT requests approval from FHWA and AASHTO, and (2) Congressional, which requires Congress to pass legislation designating the route as a high priority.

Under the administrative process:

- The route must be on the National Highway System (NHS)
- It must meet Interstate design standards.
- And it must meet Logical Addition Criteria, which ensures the route is a viable transportation route connecting principle metropolitan centers for national defense and economic development purposes.

Under the congressional process:

- The route must meet interstate design standards.
- It must be connected to an interstate on one end and to an NHS route at the other end.

The biggest difference between the two pathways is how the process starts. The two processes become very similar after approval. But the key point is that the Interstate designation process is lengthy. Mr. Lacy said the shortest timeframe he has seen was 10 years (which was for I-587). And the process of upgrading a route to meet Interstate criteria is expensive, often in the billions of dollars.

#### **Multi-Modal Committee**

Aviation Director Bobby Walston is retiring at the end of the month and Becca Gallas has been named Interim Aviation Director. During her 10-year career, Becca Gallas has served the department in a variety of capacities including in the Chief Engineer's Office and most recently in the Structures Management Unit in the Division of Highways. Becca has led several strategic statewide initiatives around financial transparency, workforce modernization, data governance and innovation implementation. During Becca's tenure as lead of the Department's innovation programs, NCDOT was awarded FHWA's State Transportation Innovation Council (STIC) Excellence Award, which recognizes states that have demonstrated success in fostering a strong culture for innovation within their transportation communities. Although her career has primarily been in Highways, Becca has collaborated with the Multimodal Transportation Divisions, including the Division of Aviation, on several projects, most recently the strategic plan for shared autonomous mobility. Becca is a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and a licensed Professional Engineer.

As we continue to monitor the Ferry Division current Fiscal Year cash spend as compared to actuals we are spending slightly ahead of where we had projected to be. At this time we are projecting a \$1.4m deficit much of which is due to fuel prices running higher than projected. The law was changed effective for this fiscal year that the Ferry Division can no longer spend more than appropriated. As such, we are delaying the typical schedule changes we do to accommodate the increasing traffic we experience this time of year as well as facility maintenance projects, vessel maintenance projects, and not bringing on the temporary seasonal help we would typically be hiring at this time.

The passenger ferry we built is getting ready for her second summer season launch. As you know, we started the passenger ferry route with a leased vessel in 2019 and the NCDOT Board of Transportation passed a resolution that allowed the Ferry Division to set a toll rate up to \$7.50 each way or \$15 round trip. This allowed us to start the rate low and then grow it based on ridership. The fare in 2019 was \$3.00 each way and our passenger survey found 78% saying the charge was just right and 21% saying it was too low. In 2020 we raised the fare to \$5.00 each way where it has remained. In the 2022 98% of passengers surveyed said the rate was just right or too low. We are raising the rate this season to \$7.50 each way. The Albemarle Commission RPO passed a resolution in 2018 that supported the Board setting the rate at \$7.50 each way. We are required to inform the RPO and the General Assembly of our rate increase 30 days before it takes effect which we are in the process of doing. Because the Board already adopted a resolution that allows us to raise it up to \$7.50 there is no Board action required.

The Federal Rail Administration's Federal State Partnership grant has been made available for application with \$4.4B available this round. Very few projects are as ready as the S line to complete in this round. We are submitting a grant application to construction Raleigh to Wake Forrest.

March was third best month ever in our history of running intercity passenger rail with over 47k riders. We broke records in Jan, Feb and now March which means we are on track for another record breaking year.

Our autonomous transit shuttle CASSI is up and running through a partnership with the Town of Cary at Bond Park. We have moved from our earlier shuttle to a newer technology and would encourage you to go see it if you have time. She runs at Cary's Bond Park weekdays from 10-4pm until June 2. She has four stops along her route and an interface with a traffic signal.

We had a presentation on Locally Administered Projects and the challenges with project delivery including how it negatively impacts the agency's August Redistribution. We need to get these

projects moving and each of you will be receiving a list of the Locally Administered Projects in your area and their status so you can inquire with the locals on what the challenge is and how you can help.

#### **Other Business/Closing Comments**

No other comments were shared.

#### **Next Meeting**

The next Board meeting will be held May 3-4, 2023, in Raleigh. The Board of Transportation will take a picture with the Governor on Wednesday, May 3<sup>rd</sup> in the morning.

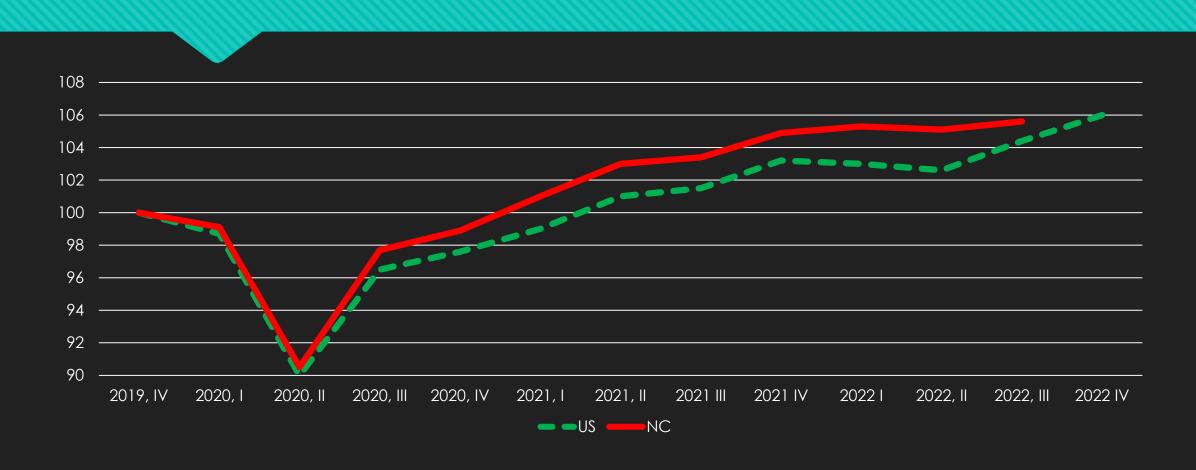

(QUARTERLY REAL GDP AS PERCENT OF 2019 IV REAL GDP)

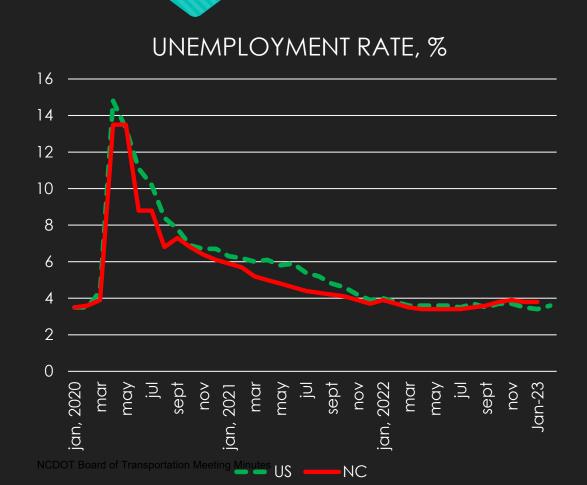

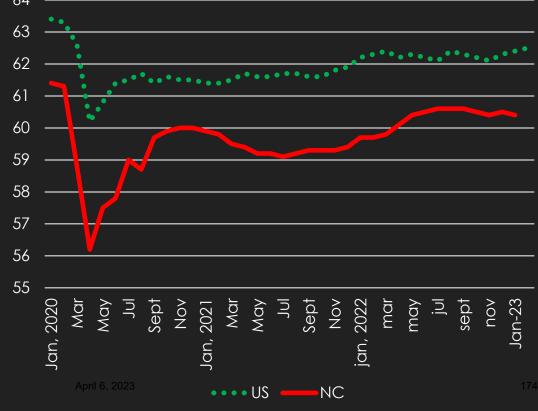

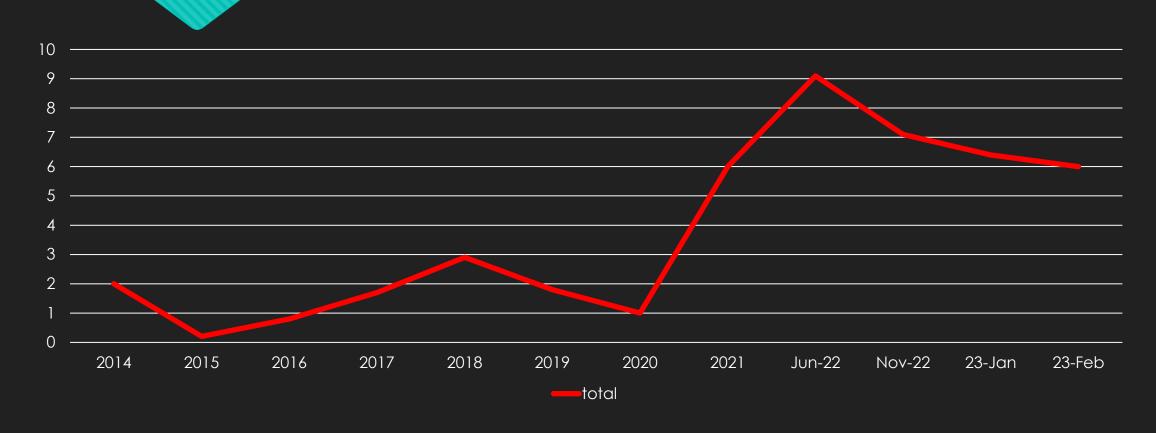

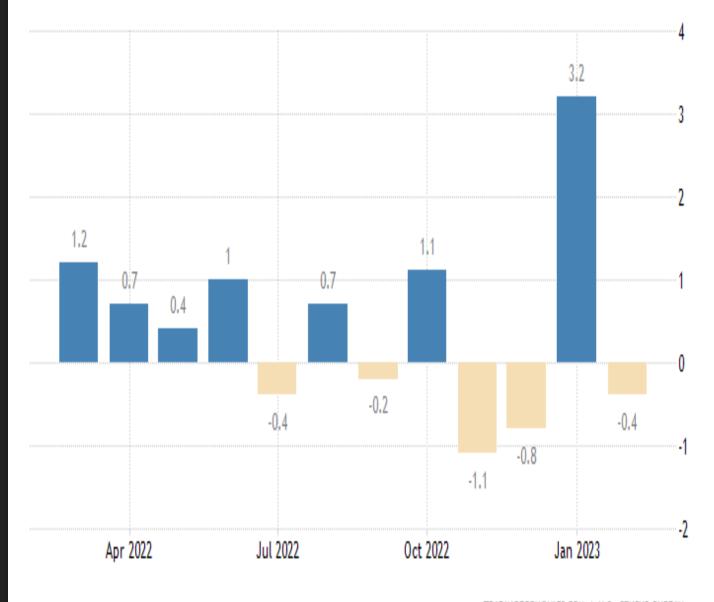

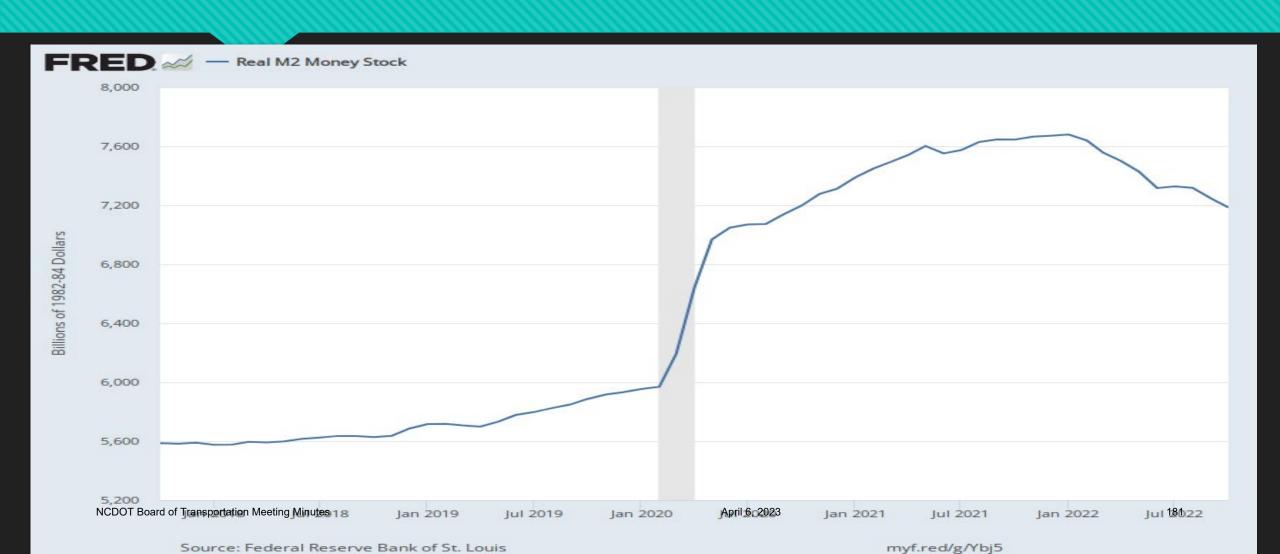
MONTH-OVER-MONTH CHANGE IN RETAIL SALES HAVE FALLEN IN 3 OUT OF LAST 4 MONTHS

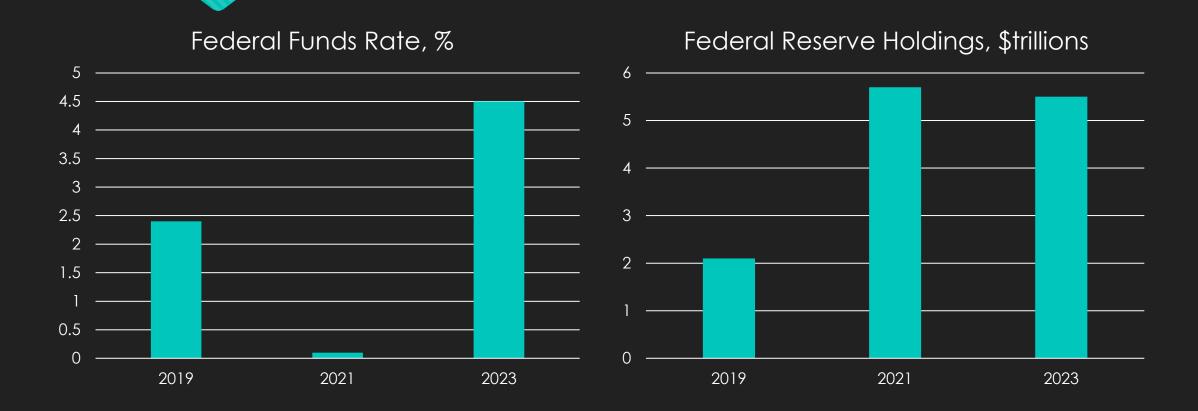

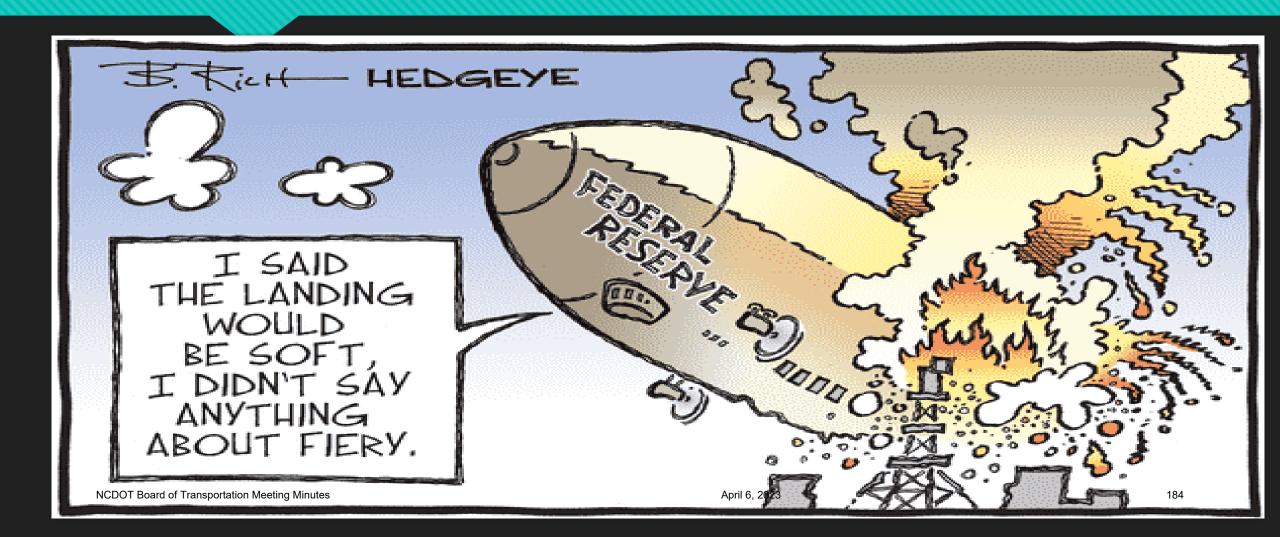

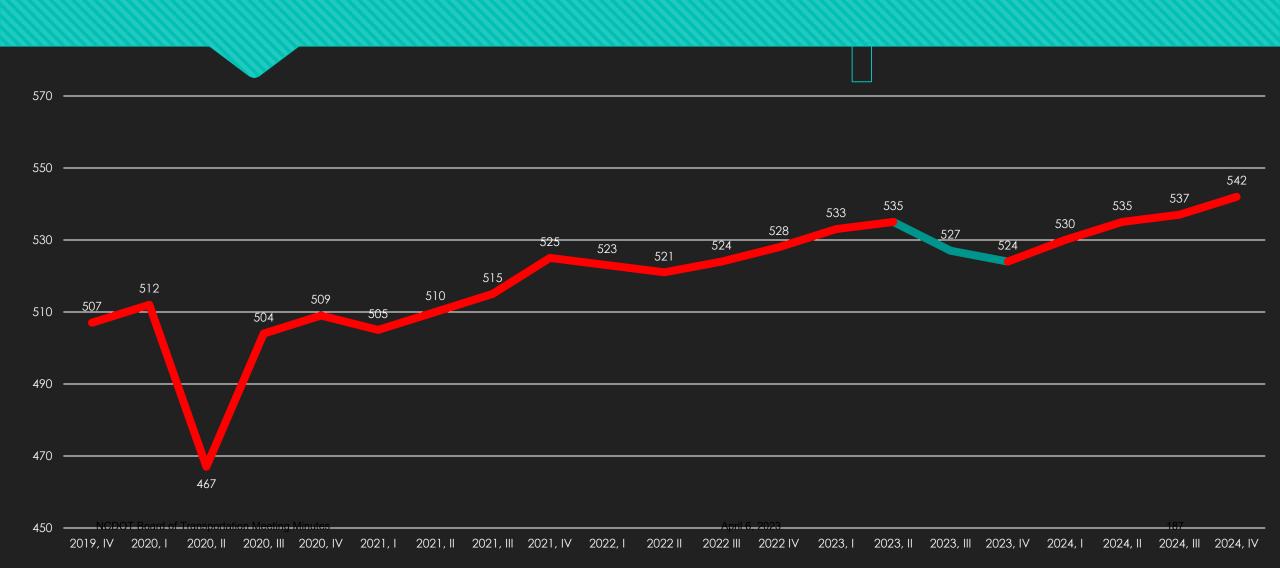

### **Executive Summary**

#### The Fast Five



#### Revenues



- Revenues are within -3.2% of the forecast for the year.
- DOT is making efforts to increase FHWA billings over the next 3-4 months by about \$5 million weekly.
- Transfers were made to the Turnpike Authority from the HF and HTF; totaling \$14.0M.
- Cash as a percentage of commitments in February 2023 is 28%; compared to 30% in February 2022.
- Per S&P as of 3/6/23 Real GDP growth for 2023 is forecasted to move from 0.7% to 1.0%; measured YOY.



#### **Expenditures**



- FYTD expenditures are 10.4 less than forecast but 19% higher as compared to SFY 22.
- Largest variances remain in Construction (\$310M) & Maintenance (\$209M) due to material and labor issues.
- Mobility & Modernization and Bridge Program showing the largest difference in Maintenance.



**Budget Update** 



- The Governor's recommended budget has been released; This includes our list of expansion requests.
- The House's version of the budget has been released. DOT met with various Committee members on expansion requests and other questions.
- We hope to start the negotiation process to reach a final version prior to July 1.



**Toll Credit Program** 



- NCDOT is implementing a FHWA allowable Toll Credit Program as a tool to fund certain projects, billing FHWA 100% of the cost.
- This is not more funding or revenue for the agency, but a programming tool that will offer flexibility.
- Focus will be to enhance the ability to request more August Redistribution.



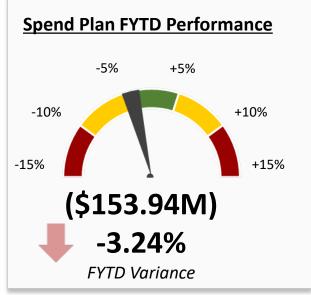

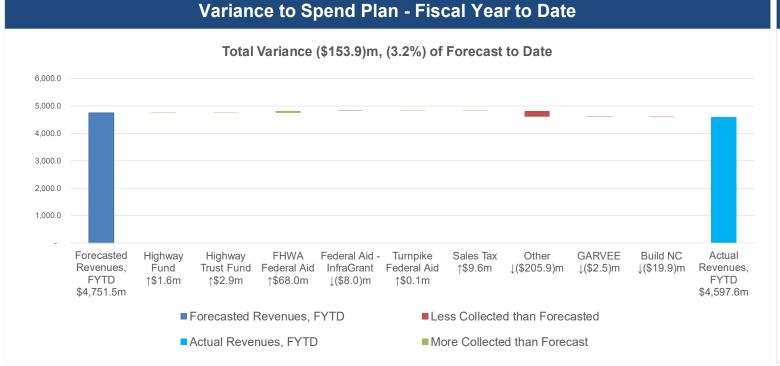

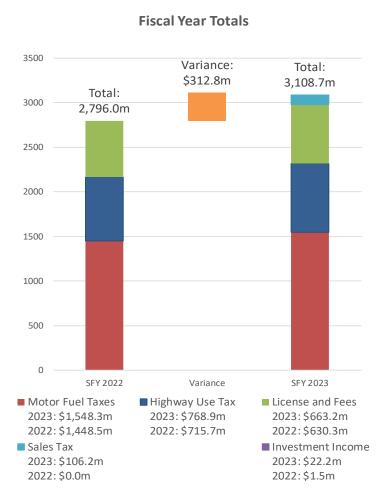

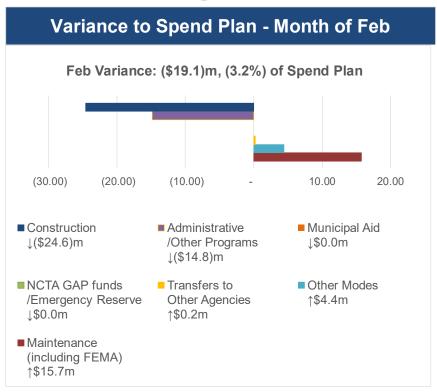

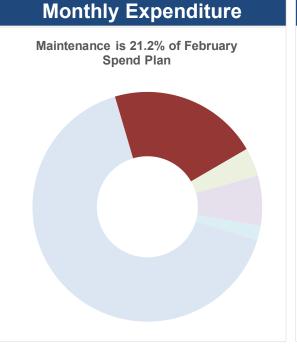

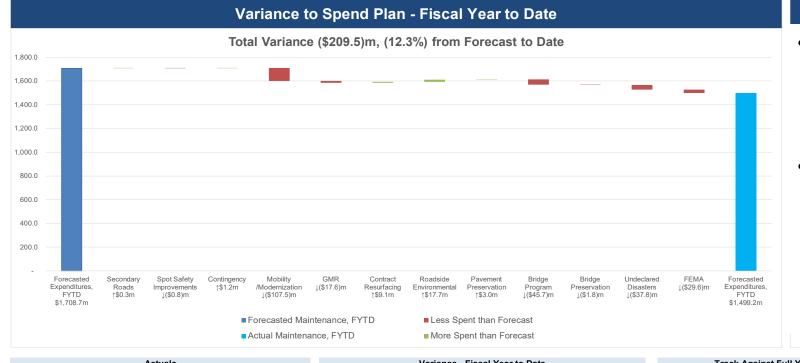

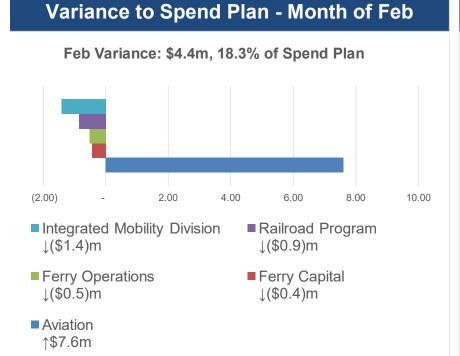

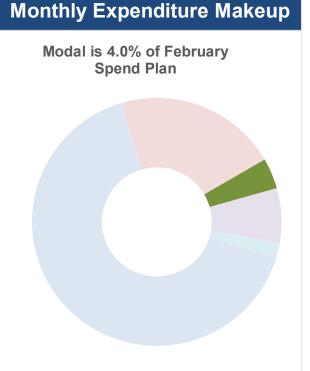

**Modal Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$M)** 

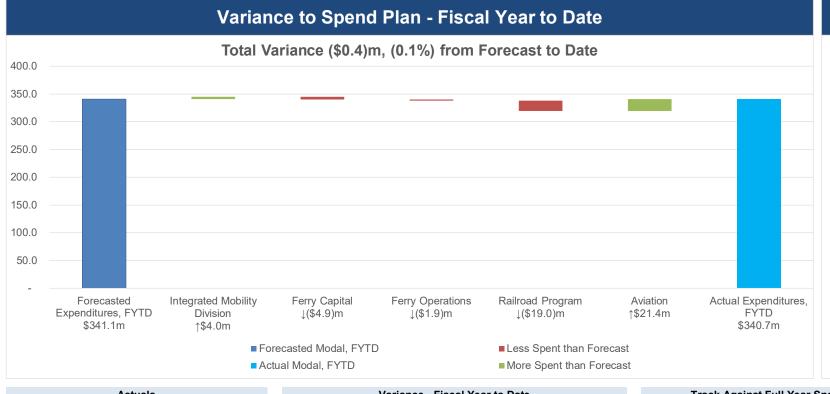

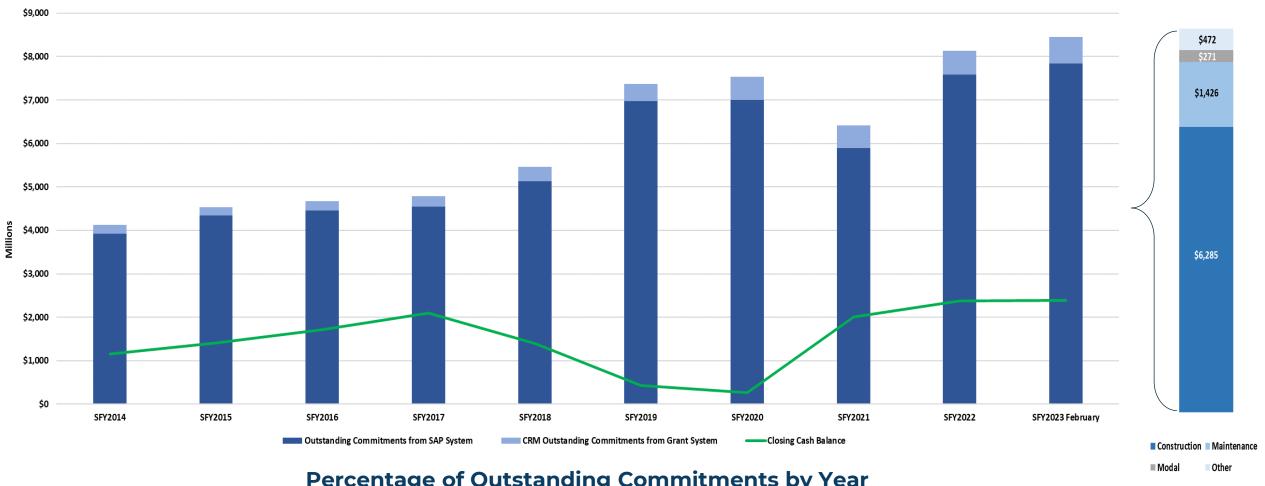

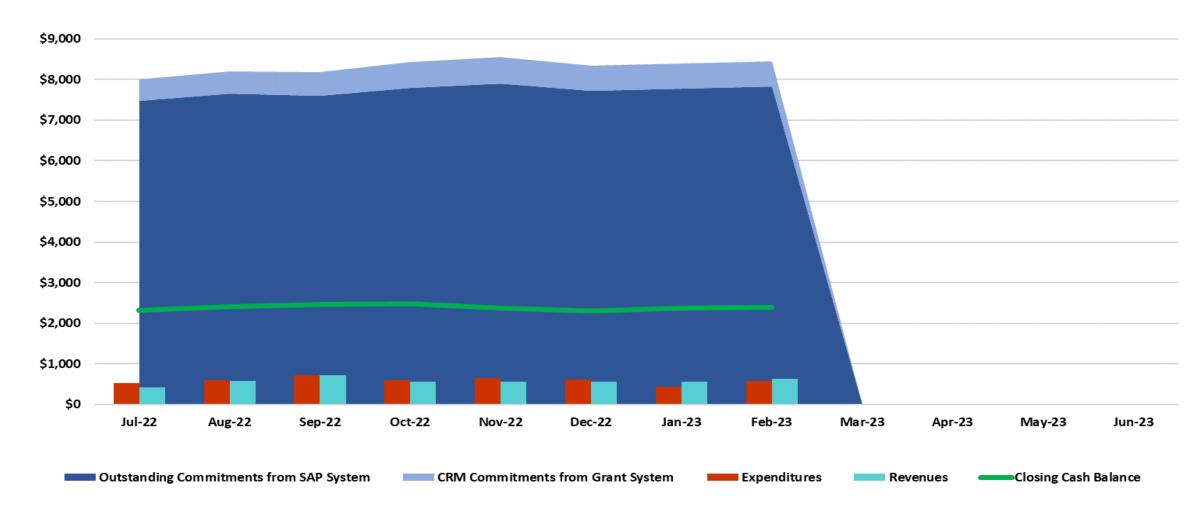
#### **NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year**

#### **NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by Month**



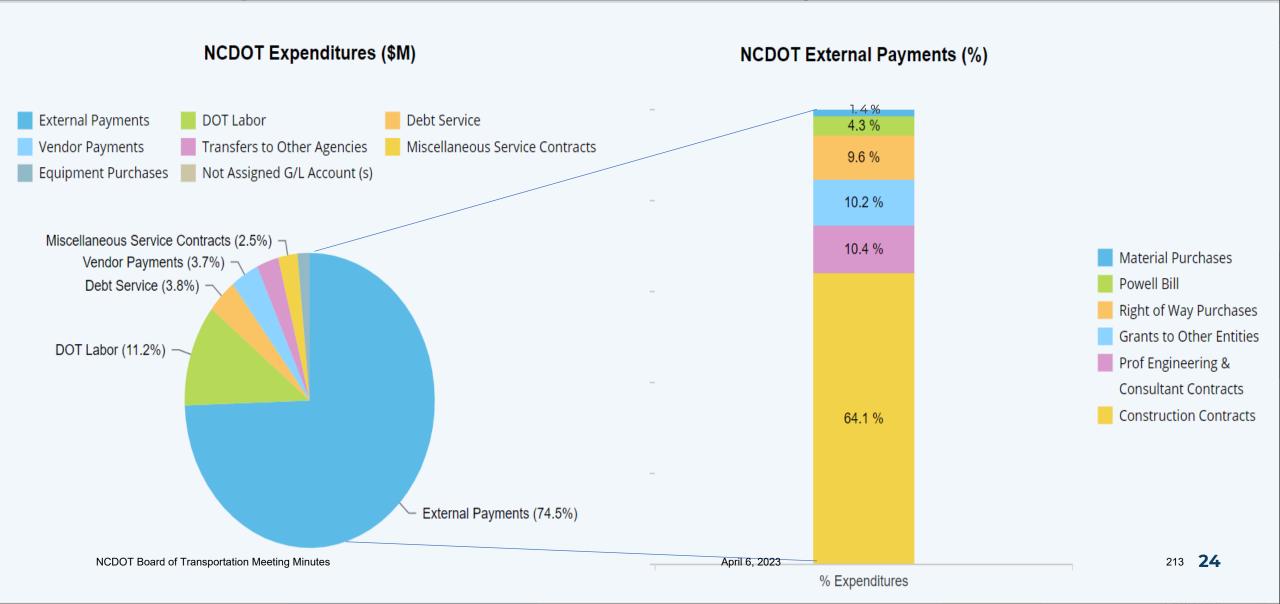

**Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee** 

#### February 2023 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For February 2023, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.33 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$716 million and \$955 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for February was \$2.39 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$358 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

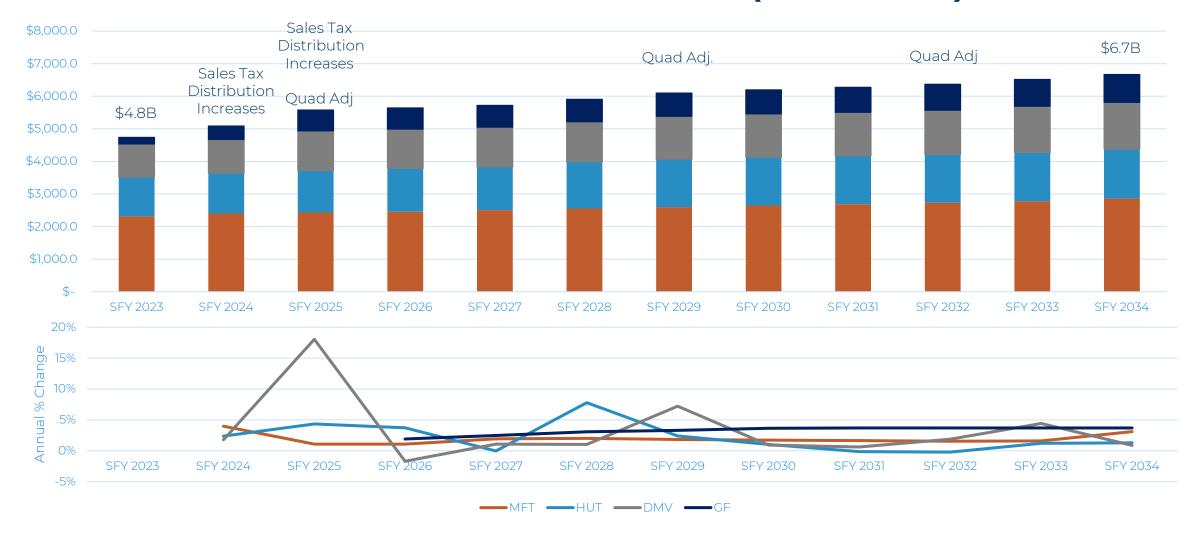

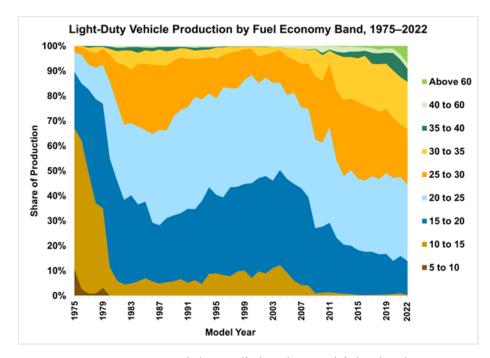

#### What Are Toll Credits?

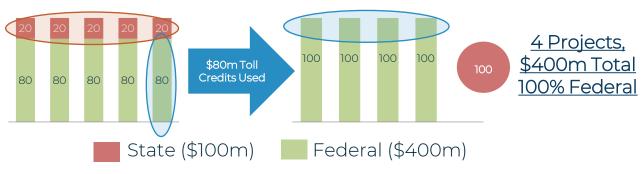
Toll Credits provide flexibility on how a Department of Transportation can allocate its federal dollars



#### **Toll Credits ARE:**

- A tool the Department can use to increase the federallyfunded share of eligible projects, beyond the normal 80%
- Toll credits = toll revenues used to construct transportation infrastructure
- Reduce the number of projects it takes to utilize a given amount of federal appropriations





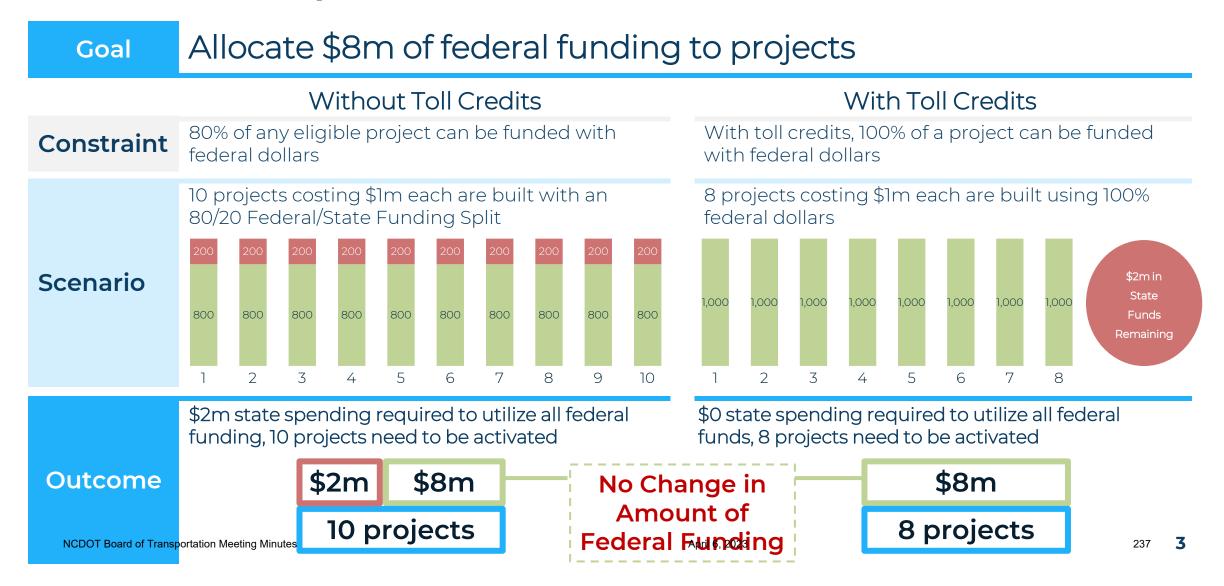


#### **Toll Credits are NOT:**

- Additional Federal funding
- An increase in the amount of total spend authority available to the Department

#### **How Are Toll Credits Obtained?**

Toll Credits are earned when the Department spends toll revenues on eligible projects



The Department earns toll credits when toll revenues are used to build. improve, or maintain highways, bridges, or tunnels that serve interstate commerce



A 'maintenance of effort' requirement exists, evaluating the state's non-federal transportation capital expenditures to ensure continuity of investment of state resources

The amount of toll credits earned is **dependent on the** federal vs non-federal funding split of a project's cost

### The Benefits of Using Toll Credits

Provide the Department with another tool to optimize use of available funding



- Provides opportunities to explore various scenarios to utilize toll credits to maximize benefits of both state and federal funding for DOT's capital program
- Toll credits can be used to concentrate the same amount of federal funds on fewer projects (funding up to 100% of a project instead of 80%)



#### **August Redistribution**

- Toll credits provide the Department with more flexibility in August redistribution requests
- Using toll credits, NCDOT can concentrate
  the same amount of federal dollars on fewer
  projects, making it easier to gather a group of
  projects that maximize redistribution requests

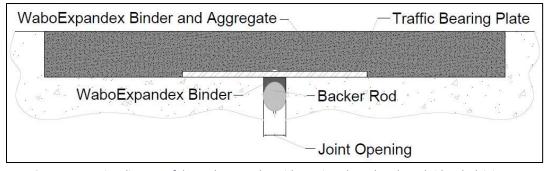

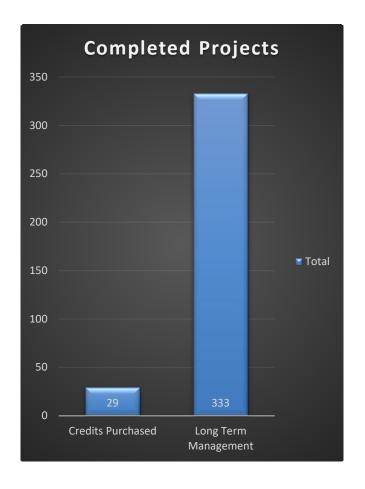


### NCDOT ILF Project Pipeline

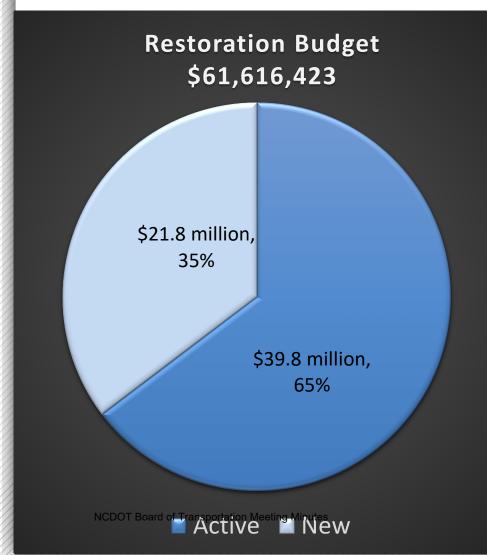

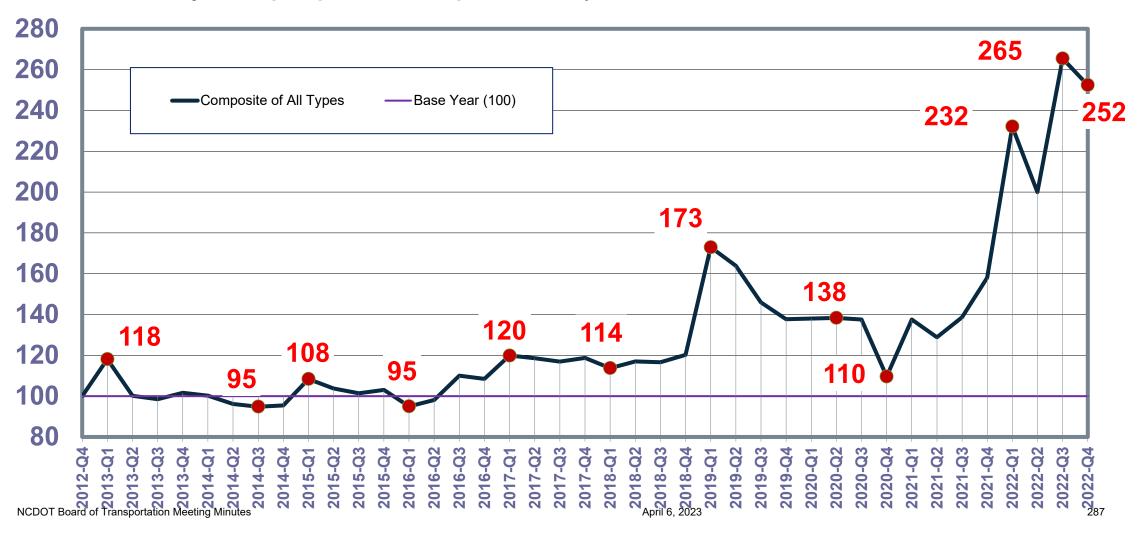

- Serve as a **conduit** between work groups and Interagency Task Force
- Continue to **identify** and **remove barriers** to clean transportation implementation and align statewide initiatives

#### **Supporting Strategy**

The new Clean Transportation Team will lead, support or partner in the remaining key recommendations as appropriate.



## Align statewide policy through a Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force

#### **State Action**

N.C. Dept of Transportation will convene a **Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force** comprised of representatives from the Governor's Office, N.C. Dept of Environmental Quality, N.C. Dept of Commerce, N.C. Dept of Health and Human Services, N.C. Dept of Administration and other organizations as appropriate, to:

- 1. Clarify **responsibilities**, **resources** and **coordination** needs to implement NCCTP strategies
- 2. Encourage agencies to align related policies
- 3. Remove barriers to implementation of the NCCTP recommendations

The task force will support the Clean Transportation Team's efforts to implement key recommendations, as appropriate, and will:

- Promote efforts to identify and support traditionally underserved communities and ensure their inclusion in clean transportation opportunities
- Continue **modernization of procurement procedures** and support state efforts to transition to ZEVs, such as the school bus replacement process and the N.C. Dept of Administration's efforts to **transition the state motor fleet to ZEVs**
- Review existing policies to identify potential conflicts and opportunities
- Anticipate emerging needs and recommend new policies to achieve statewide goals and equitable outcomes



## Increase equitable outcomes in transportation planning projects

#### **State Action**

N.C. Dept of Transportation and the Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force will work to **enhance existing environmental justice efforts** and **promote equitable outcomes** by doing the following:

- Involve environmental justice partners to inform implementation of the NCCTP
- Identify **equity metrics** to incorporate into projects and promote accountability. This includes metrics for 1) target population identification, 2) investment decision-making and 3) progress-tracking and 4) program impact assessment
- Track progress on CTP goals and objectives in coordination with the MPO and RPOs
- Partner and consult with CBOs, stakeholder groups, and appropriate experts when developing equity metrics

#### **Supporting Strategy**

Supporting partners will be asked to:

- Assist with creating **new** engagement and decision-making processes
- Partner with healthcare, economic development and workforce training institutions to align initiatives
- Work with communities to listen to and address concerns with NCCTP-related investments
- Explore the creation of zero-emission delivery zones



## Ensure access and affordability to clean transportation

#### **State Action**

NCDOT will develop policies and programs that promote access and affordability to clean transportation options and will prioritize infrastructure investments for traditionally underserved communities.

- Address Justice40\* targets and include access and affordability into federal procurement processes
- Incorporate access and affordability of charging and fueling infrastructure in ZEV infrastructure needs assessment
- Pursue competitive grant resources under the "Grants for Charging and Fueling Infrastructure" federal grant program
- Provide technical assistance and partnership to businesses and small fleet owners to assist the transition to zero-emission vehicles (ZEV)

#### **Supporting Strategy**

The Clean Transportation Team and NCCTP Work Groups will continue researching ways to:

- Create incentives and advantages for clean transportation projects proposed in traditionally underserved communities
- Deploy rebates, incentives or other support for traditionally underserved populations
- Provide technical support for local communities and employers to secure grants and funding to support clean transportation advancements

<sup>\*</sup>The Justice40 Initiative is a government-wide initiative to ensure 40% of program/project benefits reach traditionally underserved communities as determined by the Justice40 census tract



## Evaluate and update project prioritization programs

State Action

NCDOT will work with the agency's existing Strategic Prioritization Office (SPOT) work group to **refine the project evaluation process** to include opportunities identified in the NCCTP.

- Review best practices for how greenhouse gas (GHG) emission evaluations are used in prioritization processes
- Evaluate how Regional and Division prioritization processes can improve equity, VMT per capita reduction and climate and health impacts
- Research project evaluation and funding prioritization programs
- Research the Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) Law
  normalization process to evaluate the benefits and program delivery
  requirements of providing a higher percentage of funding for nonhighway projects that meet transportation needs and promote clean
  transportation strategies.
- Coordinate with MPOs and RPOs to align with NCCTP goals

**Supporting Strategy** 

The NCCTP work groups will continue researching the best ways to:

- Review land use policies to support multimodal travel modes
- Remove barriers to funding standalone multimodal projects



## Partner with utilities to promote clean transportation

#### **State Action**

The Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force will partner with **electric utilities** to promote **clean energy and clean transportation** options.

- Provide updates to N.C. Utilities Commission (NCUC) regarding implementation of NCCTP and facilitate ongoing coordination between NCUC and utilities
- Partner with electric utilities to encourage statewide access to—and funding for—clean energy and clean transportation infrastructure

#### **Supporting Strategy**

Create **best practices and updated policies** to facilitate, expedite, and standardize clean transportation and utility-related infrastructure:

- Develop a clearinghouse of best practices and resources
- Work with the energy sector to participate in strategy development and power requirements
- Work with the North Carolina Building Code Council to establish building codes that support deployment
- Expand existing utility programs that promote the growth of charging infrastructure
- Enhance **energy storing infrastructure** to support electrification
- Identify specific needs and opportunities to expand charging infrastructure for medium- and heavy-duty vehicles

# **Funding and Finance**

Financial resources (public and private), funding programs (e.g., TIP, grants, CIP), and financing tools that support equitable outcomes and implementation.



# Funding and Finance Activity



## Maximize existing funding to support clean transportation outcomes

#### **State Action**

N.C. Dept of Transportation and N.C. Dept of Environmental Quality will evaluate **current funding programs** to **maximize funding potential** to support the goals of Executive Orders 80, 246 and 271.

- Prioritize funding incentives and advantages for clean transportation projects
- Work with interagency task force and other stakeholders to notify traditionally underserved communities of funding opportunities
- Prioritize investments in electric vehicles (EVs) and supportive infrastructure for discretionary funding opportunities
- Explore investments in infrastructure for medium- and heavy-duty vehicles
- Incorporate strong requirements for workforce development and Justice40 into application process for federal programs

#### **Supporting Strategy**

 Provide technical assistance for traditionally underserved communities to navigate the funding application process and secure funding

# Funding and Finance Activity



## Evaluate new funding that advances clean transportation outcomes

#### **State Action**

N.C. Dept of Transportation and Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force will evaluate applicable federal funding opportunities under the **Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)** and **Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)** to further NCCTP strategies.

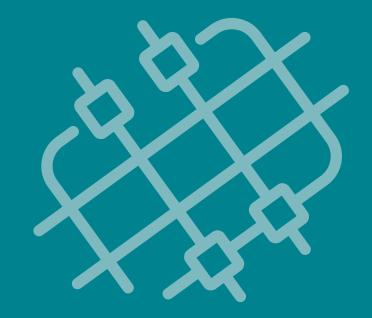
- Work with the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) and Governor's Office to track and pursue funding opportunities
- Prioritize and pursue funding opportunities
- Evaluate discretionary funding opportunities to advance priorities identified in the NCCTP
- Work with partners to provide technical support to small businesses, local governments and fleet owners

#### **Supporting Strategy**

- Partner with "green banks" and other financial institutions to support implementation of NCCTP priorities
- Identify effective funding strategies to promote small and disadvantaged business electrification
- Identify financial incentive options for leasing or buying new or used clean transportation technology and infrastructure
- Pursue financial policies that support removing high-emitting,
   older vehicles from the road
- Develop incentive programs for developments or projects that support the use of non-gas vehicle travel
- Provide technical support to local communities and employers to secure grants
- Identify funding for agencies to hire and retain employees to administer clean transportation and related funds

# Infrastructure

Capital investment resulting in the increased capacity and connectivity of our transportation system including EV charging, modernization of electric grid, active transportation and transit supportive infrastructure and equitable implementation.



# Infrastructure Activity

### Timeframe: Near- to Mid-Term

# Evaluate and deploy clean transportation infrastructure to support all types of fleet vehicles and applications

#### **State Action**

NCDOT is developing a zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) infrastructure needs assessment as part of Executive Order (E.O.) 271. This assessment will evaluate the charging and fueling needs to support the goals of E.O. 271 and the achievement of at least 1.25 million registered ZEVs in NC as called for in E.O. 246

- Evaluate the number, type, distribution, and cost of chargers and other fueling stations needed to achieve North Carolina's ZEV goals
- The assessment will strive to identify the greatest opportunities to expand the charging network in traditionally underserved communities
- Consider infrastructure needs of larger vehicles
- Invest in charging infrastructure for current and planned park and ride facilities

#### **Supporting Strategy**

- Consider infrastructure needs of residents in multi-unit dwellings and for consumers lacking off-street parking
- Create a process for continued statewide planning of clean vehicle charging and fueling infrastructure
- Fund, prioritize and support transition of school and transit bus fleets to clean transportation alternatives
  - Continue seeking funding opportunities to replace school buses with zero- to low-emission alternatives
  - NCDOT Integrated Mobility Unit will advocate for transit electrification and multimodal options

# Infrastructure Activity

Timeframe: Near- to Mid-Term

## Expand transportation demand management strategies

#### **State Action**

NCDOT should support and promote the transportation demand management programs outlined in the **vehicle miles traveled (VMT) reduction toolkit**, including:

- Expanding infrastructure for non-motorized mobility, rail and public transit
- Increasing access to broadband to facilitate working from home and other travel choices (including support from the NC Dig Once Policy)
- Implementing planned complete streets elements
- Incentivizing state employees for using VMT-reducing modes of travel

#### **Supporting Strategy**

 Improve quality of crash data and exposure data for rural and urban contexts

# Communication and Engagement

Methods to increase equitable engagement and empower public, private, and non-profit effectiveness as well as methods to directly engage and involve stakeholders, general public and traditionally underrepresented demographic cohorts.



# Communication and Engagement Activity



## Establish a coordinated clean transportation communication strategy

#### **State Action**

NCDOT and the Clean Transportation Interagency Task Force will seek dedicated funding opportunities to support a **coordinated communication strategy**. This strategy will include:

- Identifying resources, staff and partnerships to develop and implement an **education and awareness campaign**
- Developing tailored and accessible messaging for traditionally underserved communities
- Coordinating with each state agency to include clean transportation initiatives within their annual public involvement plans

#### **Supporting Strategy**

- Develop training materials to further educate and engage stakeholders
- Develop publicly available tools and dashboards that improve transparency and access to information
- Work with non-profit advocacy groups to connect clean transportation messaging and resources with a diversity of demographic cohorts
- Promote and provide outreach for electric vehicle (EV) demonstrations and promotional events

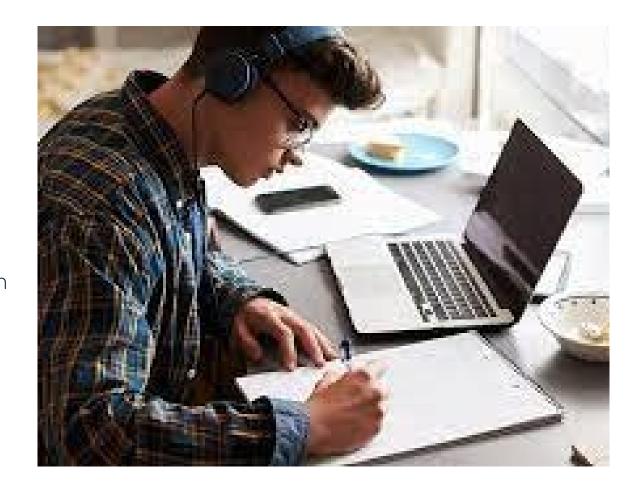

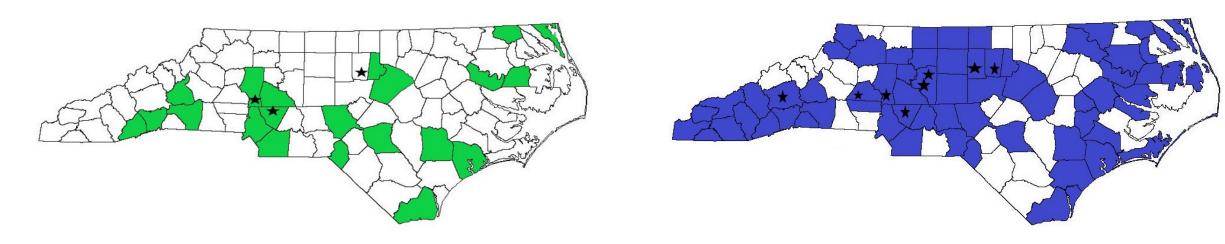

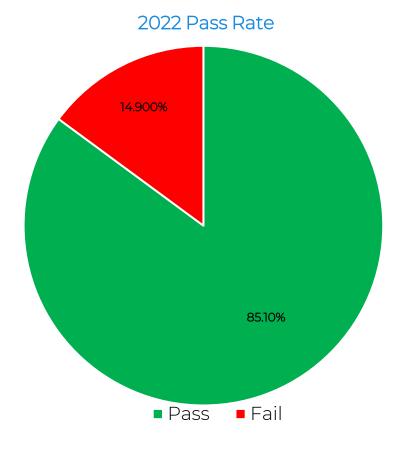

- ☐ Transitioned class to asynchronous with a launch of March 2023



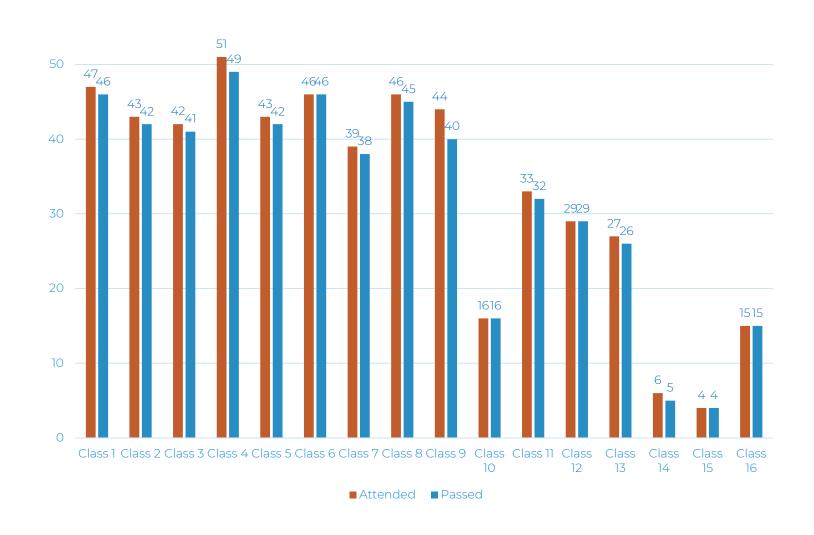

# **Remote Testing Initiative**

## Development

- ☐ Current CDL testing for School Bus drivers is administered in person via paper tests
  - ☐ Each student can test 3 times
- Extremely inefficient
  - More than 1700 testing sessions (2022)
  - □DEPS 2-4 hours per session
- Potential for human error
  - ☐ Hand graded, scores are keyed into SADLS
- Requirements for testing are set by FMCSA

- ☐ Other states (California) have received permission from FMCSA to administer CDL testing remotely
  - ■Working with FMCSA to ensure our program will meet their requirements
- Evaluating numerous third-party testers to understand our options for remote testing and how we can deploy it

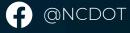

#### Model Limitations

 Requires a TREDIS, REMI, or a separate model to be developed for benefit cost analyses for transportation projects

#### RIMS II

#### • Model Advantages

- Capable of Economic Impact Assessment
- Affordable for analyses occurring in one region (\$275 to purchase multipliers in one region)
- Affordable for analyses pertaining to one sector (\$75 to purchase multipliers for each industry)

#### • Model Limitations

- Requires a TREDIS, REMI, or a separate model to be developed for benefit cost analyses
- Expensive for analyses that span multiple regions or industries

# **Economic Impacts**

#### Pratt and Whitney:

- Construct 1 Million square foot facility in Biltmore Park West
- Create 800 new jobs
  - o SUPPORTS 1,264 TOTAL DIRECT, INDIRECT, INDUCED JOBS
  - o \$74M IN NEW PAYROLL
  - o ANNUAL TAX IMPACTS: \$2.5M LOCAL |\$6.1M NC | \$23M US
- Invest \$650 million in real and business personal property
- Provide an average wage of \$68K annually (\$32.69 hourly).
- Aligns with Buncombe County 2025 Strategic Plan Goals for increasing average wages and total employment.

### **Regional Impacts**

- Based on Pratt and Whitney's job creation plans, 800 out of the 800 proposed jobs qualify for the jobs incentive in the Buncombe County Economic Development Incentive Policy (greater than \$20.90 per hour, or \$43,472 per year).

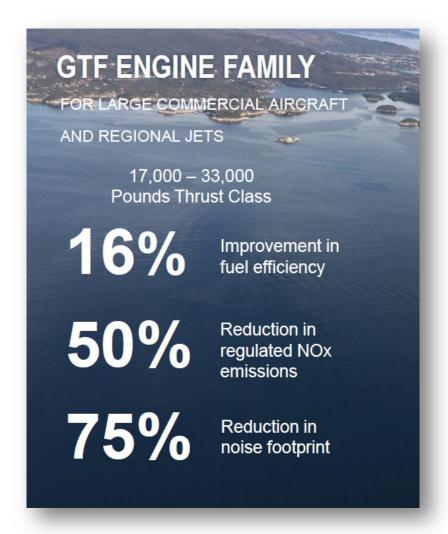

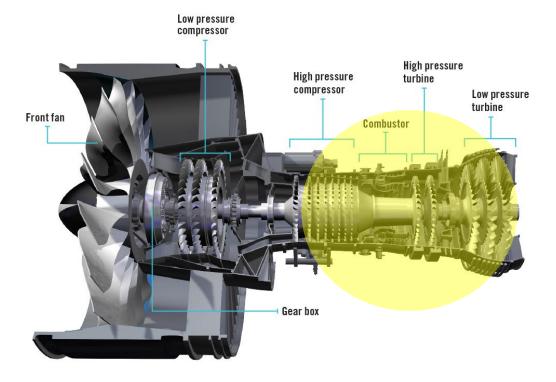
# Pratt and Whitney The Product

## **Geared Turbofan (GTF) Engine**



### **Pratt & Whitney geared turbofan**

A geared turbofan engine has a gearbox between the front fan and the shaft to the engine core, so that the speed of the front fan can be decoupled from the speed of the core. This way, the engine can safely drive a larger fan and push a larger volume of air, while the low-pressure compressor and turbine blades spin faster, boosting fuel efficiency.

  - There is a mountain between I-26 and the Site

  - No bridge to the site from NC 191 at the beginning of the project
- Bordered by the Historic Biltmore Estate on the East
- Bordered by the Blue Ridge Parkway
  - National Treasure
  - Significant Right of Way
  - View Shed Protection Standards
  - No Commercial Access Allowed
  - County Overlay District to control development in the vicinity of the parkway

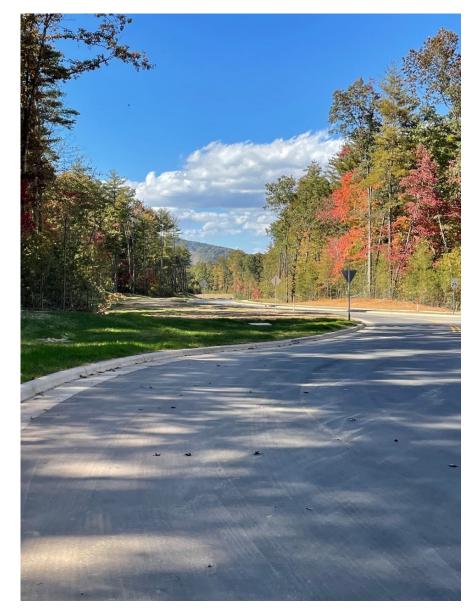
# **Connecting People Places and Products**

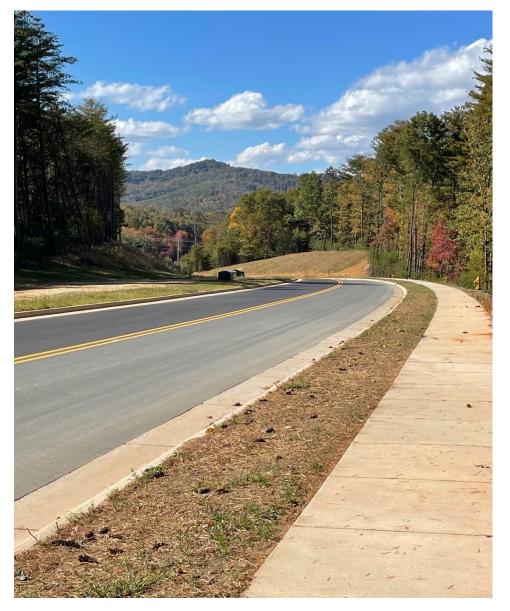
#### **Initial Site Access**

- Biltmore Farms constructed a bridge across the French Broad River and an access road to the site.
  - Golden Leaf Funds utilized for the bridge
  - Bridge constructed to accommodate a 4 lane roadway, pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure
- Bridge and roadway project began February 23, 2021
- Bridge and roadway were added to the State System during the March NCDOT Board Meeting.
- Total cost of the bridge was just under \$15M and the roadway portion was \$3.5M.

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# **NCDOT's Project**

#### **I-26 Access for the Site**

- NCDOT committed to constructing an interchange project to provide a much needed East/West connection from I-26 to NC 191 and access to the site.
- The project consists of constructing an interchange on I-26, and approximately 0.5 miles of secondary road and sidewalk to complete the connection to NC 191 and connect the Pratt Whitney site to I-26.
- Initial construction budget of \$30M.
- Timeline for delivery is Fall of 2025

## **I-26 Access Challenges**

- I-26 is currently being widened through this area.
- Bifurcated section of I-26 has very stringent environmental commitments as part of the permit for I-4700
- The Parkway Staff has a very focused mission and were included as part of the merger process.
- The only viable location for an interchange is mountainous, and initial reviews indicate substantial rock within the grading pattern.
- Material Cost Escalation
  - We have pulled in Appalachian Resource Commission funding and we are seeking Economic Development Administration funding to help offset some of the material escalation costs.
  - Regularly researching value engineering options to defray costs and keep the project on schedule.

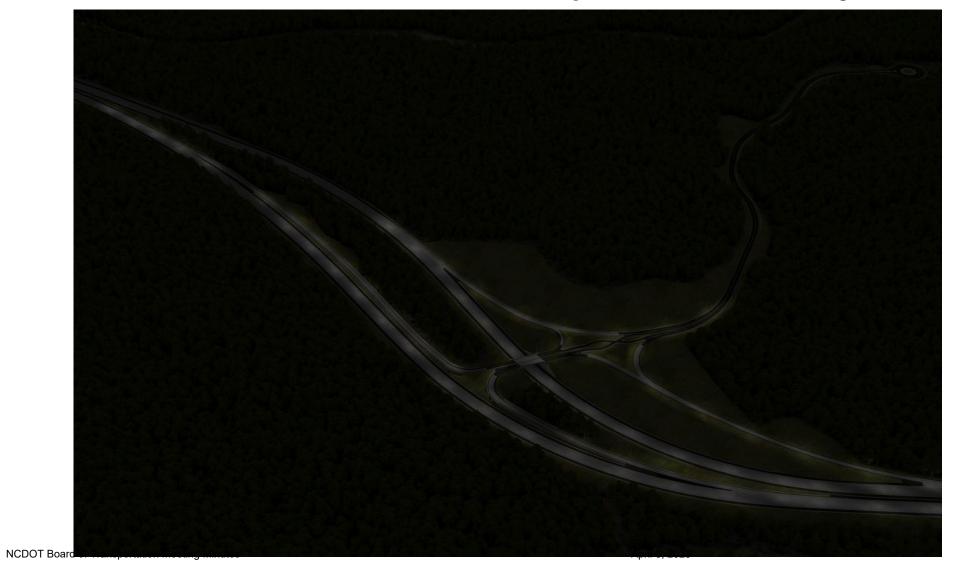

# **Design Options**

#### I-26 Access for the Site

• Several options were considered for the interchange design.







• Site constraints and recognition that the East side of the interstate will not develop (Historic Biltmore Estate) required a unique solution.



#### **Selection Benefits**

- Left lane entrance/exit on the westbound approach reduces the foot print of the project and keeps us within existing right of way beside the Biltmore Estate.
- NCDOT and FHWA collaborated on the left exits to ensure that the design met federal standards and the Interstate Access Request was approved.
- Diverging Diamond Interchange on the bridge reduces projected congestion and reduces the need for signalization to one intersection.
- Diverging Diamond design also increases the efficiency of the interchange.

#### **Current Status**

- We completed the merger process January 25, 2023.
  - The merger team was very diligent and completed merger in 18 months (typically 24 to 48 months).
    - Shout out to John Jamison, Unit Manager, Environmental Policy Unit, and his team with NCDOT and Donnie Brew, Preconstruction & Environment Engineer with FHWA.
    - Their work to keep all parties focused and at the table was instrumental in reducing merger time
- The design firm is working on 65% plans and focusing on strategic items on the project.
- An application for an individual permit for the project will be submitted by the end of the month, with anticipation of the permit by mid-summer.
- If the current plan for delivery is successful, It is anticipated the project will be completed by Fall of 2025.

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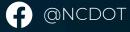

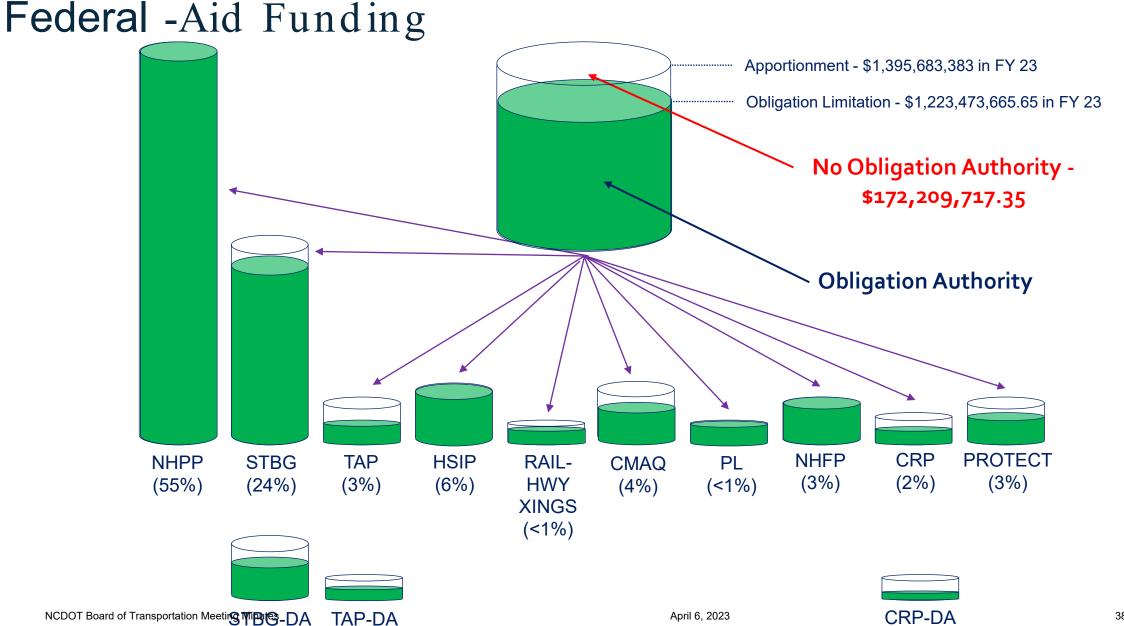

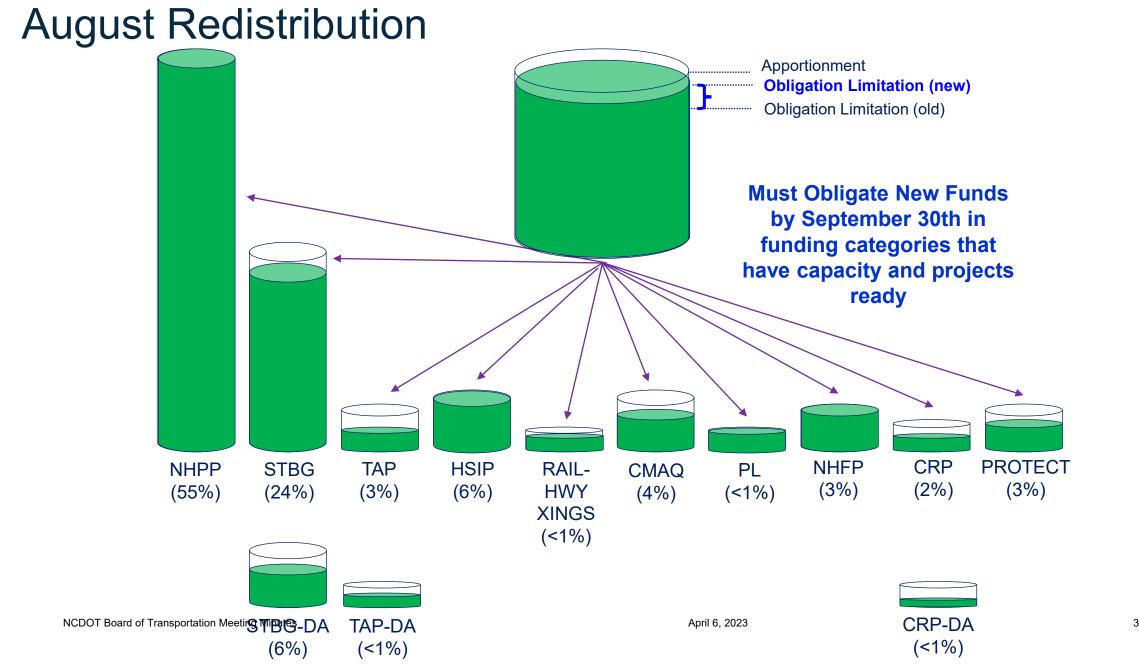
- Apportioned funds are available for 4 years. At the end of the 4
- FY 2017 \$4,067,845 of TAP funding lapsed
- After FY 2017, NCDOT began transferring unused TAP funds to prevent future lapses.
   \$47,962,999 has been transferred.
- IIJA modified transfer rules for TAP, making it difficult to transfer

#### Rescission

- Legislation enacted by Congress that cancels the availability of budget authority before
  it's set to expire (lapse)
- There was a 6/30/2017 rescission of \$2,458,105 of TAP funds
- There was a planned rescission in FY 2019 of \$7,569,000,000 nationwide (cancelled)

## **Locally Administered Projects**

#### **Agreements**

- Project is programmed into the STIP
- Local Government Agency (LGA) requests a Municipal Agreement
  - Identifies scope of work and amount of funding based on what is programmed in the STIP
  - Outlines all responsibilities for LGA and NCDOT for project delivery
  - Identifies those activities that are eligible for reimbursement of funds
  - Executed between the Municipality and NCDOT

\*\*\*No work can begin until an agreement is fully executed\*\*\*

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## **Locally Administered Projects**

#### **Project Delivery**

NCDOT, per our Stewardship and Oversight Agreement with FHWA, provides oversight to LGAs for Project Delivery, which includes review and approval of various steps:

- Procurement and contracting with Private Engineering Firms (PEF)
- Plan Review
- Environmental Documents
- Right of Way (ROW) Acquisition
- Utility Relocation / Railroad Coordination
- Contract Proposal and Estimate
- Bidding and Letting Construction Contract
- Construction Oversight
- Project Closeout
- Reimbursement of eligible costs

## **Locally Administered Projects**

#### **Funding Authorization**

Throughout the Project Delivery process, the LGA requests authorization of funds, based on the Municipal Agreement:

- Preliminary Engineering
  - may be authorized once the Agreement is executed
  - Reimburses costs of a PEF performing any part of pre-construction
- Right of Way / Utility
  - May be authorized once the environmental document is approved and ROW plans are complete
  - Reimburses costs of ROW Acquisition (including those services needed for appraisals and negotiation)
  - Reimburses costs of eligible utility relocation (generally above-ground utilities)
- Construction
  - May be authorized once the environmental document is approved, a final PS&E package (plans, specifications, and estimate) is approved, and we have ROW certification and Utility certification/RR Coordination on file.



#### **Locally Administered Projects**

#### **Current Policies and Procedures**

- NCDOT BOT policy (A.09.0101) requires the LGA to deliver all locally selected (MPO/RPO selected projects)
  and to provide the non-federal match
  - Requests for NCDOT to administer pre-construction and construction activities may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
  - Policy does not apply to projects prioritized and selected by the NCBOT, but our general operating
    policy is to treat those projects in the same way.

#### LPMO provides –

- Municipal Agreements and any supplemental agreements
- Technical assistance and oversight to the LGAs through the existing Handbook and various training sessions, primarily hosted by the planning organizations.
- Process documents and template letters for both LGAs and internal staff.
- A resource to internal staff on questions and guidance on appropriate oversight.

#### Division Project Managers provide –

- Technical requirements and review (plans, environmental, right of way, specifications, construction oversight, reimbursement of ROW and construction costs)
- Schedule management
- Close-out of project with FHWA NCDOT Board of Transportation Meeting Minutes



#### **ISSUES with LOCAL PROJECT DELIVERY**

Failure of LGAs to obligate funding in the year in which it is programmed.

#### Multiple reasons:

- Lack of budget to cover actual costs
- Unrealistic schedule (i.e., all phases programmed in one year)
- Lack of commitment by LGA in terms of priority and resources (staff turnover)
- General lack of knowledge of project delivery, which tends to slow everything down
- Other...

# Locally Administered Projects (LAP) Workgroup

Matt Clarke, PE Technical Services Director



#### **LAP Workgroup**

- Organized in December 2021 to address issues with Local Project Delivery
- Workgroup identified NCDOT staff, Planning Organizations, Local Governments, and FHWA as the key stakeholders
- Initial group was 11 but has expanded to about 23 members
- Organized three subcommittees
  - Selection, programming and funding
  - Project Development (pre-construction)
  - Project Delivery (construction and close-out)
- Extensive brainstorming of the variables affecting LAP and potential focus areas for improvement.
- Consensus of group was to first develop a survey that could be shared with a larger audience to gain a more comprehensive perspective on LAP issues.

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#### **LAP Workgroup**

- The Workgroup paused in November 2022
- Management suggested bringing on a consultant to assist with LPMO duties.
- It was determined that a PEF could provide dedicated staff to facilitate/expedite the LAP improvement initiative.
- In developing a scope of services, LPMO proposed the following programmatic tasks:
  - Complete data collection and processing and conduct targeted stakeholder meetings
  - Condense and outline improvement focus areas and begin developing deliverables
  - Update existing Local Programs Management Handbook
  - Develop guidance and training protocol for internal staff to ensure appropriate oversight of LAPs
- A consultant has been selected, we're finalizing a scope and we anticipate the firm to be under contract by late spring.

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#### **Moving Forward**

The LAP Program is complex with multiple phases, numerous variables in each phase, and varied partners at different levels of ability.

To improve as a whole, overall improvement is needed in the following:

- Improved screening, selection, estimating and scheduling of candidate projects
- Consistent training in each phase of LAP delivery (internal and external)
- Additional staff resources (Internal and external)
- Potentially protocols for de-programming projects that do not progress through the LAP process

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#### **Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)**

#### Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Overview

- Federal funding provided to states and MPOs to support design and construction of multimodal projects.
- Set-aside from the federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) program.
- Pre-determined set-asides and suballocations:
  - Recreational Trails Program
  - 41% for use any where in the state administered by NCDOT
  - 59% suballocated based on population MPOs administer funds for urbanized areas over 200,000 population

#### **TAP Funding Trends**

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) increased TAP funding levels by 60-70%
- Statewide TAP funding increased from \$22M to \$35M per year
- Average annual TAP obligations have been \$18.3M the past 6 years

2019	\$45,756,364
2020	\$(101,685)

#### **TAP Projects in NC**

- Projects selected through Strategic Prioritization that meet TAP eligibility criteria.
  - Typically bicycle and pedestrian improvement projects.
- ADA sidewalk curb ramp installation by Highway Divisions.
- MPOs administer independent selection processes to choose projects in urbanized areas.
- Projects selected by MPOs or through STI are typically locally administered and matched with local funds.

#### **TAP Project Delivery Issues**

- Low delivery rate compared to other programs.
- Key reasons for delivery issues include:
  - Local capacity to administer projects.
  - Changes in local leadership before project proceeds.
  - Local match constraints.
  - Inflation.

Of 69 projects selected in the P3 cycle of STI (2016) and programmed with TAP funds, only a few have been delivered.

Over half did not move forward and were deleted from the STIP.

#### Recent Efforts to Improve TAP Project Delivery

- The Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) surveyed local agencies and NCDOT Highway Divisions regarding all TAP projects for a status update and assessment of challenges.
- Projects were categorized based on delivery status and challenges impacting delivery.
- Acceleration plans are under development for each project.
- IMD retained consultant support to manage implementation of the acceleration plans.
- Creative solutions to accelerate fund obligation and delivery include
  - Increasing direct support from NCDOT to design and administer projects.
  - Flexing TAP funds from FHWA to FTA for projects near transit facilities.

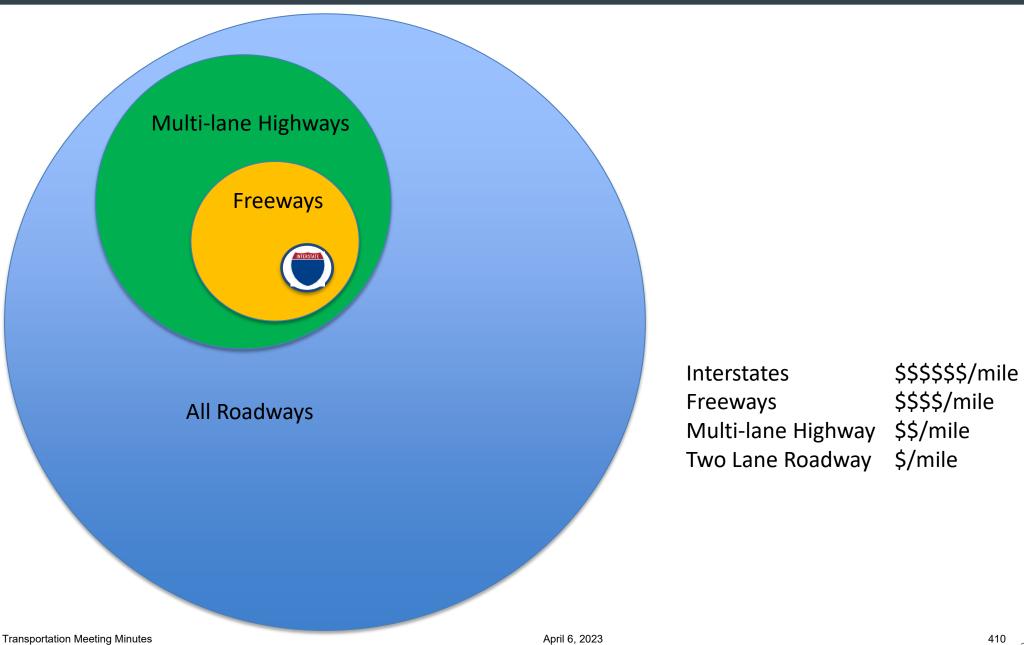

#### **Key Point**

• Interstates are freeways (or tollways) that have grade separated interchanges with limited access.

 Freeways also have interchanges and limited access but not all are built to interstate standards.

 There are many millions of dollars difference between Freeway standards and Interstate Standards.

Interstate Designation Timeline Expectations

All expectations of the process from start to finish should be DECADES

















#### Two Paths

- Administrative Process Interstate System Route Designation (23 USC 103 c 4 A and 23 CFR Part 470)
- Congressional Process Interstate Addition as a High Priority Corridor (Section 1105 (c) of ISTEA)

#### **Administrative Process**

- The NCDOT must coordinate and obtain a resolution from all local officials, County Commissions, and MPO's
- The NCDOT must request, through FHWA NC Division the addition to the Interstate system
- The route must be on the National Highway System (NHS)
- The route must meet Logical Addition Criteria
- The route must meet Interstate System design criteria
- The route number and addition must be approved by AASHTO(\*) and FHWA

#### Logical Addition Criteria

- The route is a viable transportation route –Interstate Travel, Connect principle metropolitan centers for national defense and economic development
- Route should not duplicate another Interstate
- Route directly serves:
  - a) Major traffic generators (urban area over 100,000)
  - b) Major government centers
  - c) Principle Industrial Centers
  - d) Major Military Complexes
  - e) Major transportation terminals
- Route connects
  - a) Interstate to Interstate route
  - b) Interstate route to International boarder
  - c) Interstate route to major traffic generator
- The route meets Interstate Design Criteria

#### Interstate Design Criteria

Control Access	Shoulder Width
Design Speed	Median Width
Minimum Number of Lanes	Recovery Area
Maximum Grade	Vertical Clearance
Minimum Lane Width	Horizontal Clearance

# What is the National Highway System (NHS)

The NHS includes the Interstate System as well as other roads important to nation's economy, defense and mobility

- Interstate
- Other Principal Arterials
- Strategic Highway Network (STRAHNET)- US strategic defense policy, defense access
- Major Strategic Highway Network Connectors Provide access between major military installations
- Intermodal Connectors
- NCD Hoad Strangoute additions also have a formal process

#### Interstate Corridors for North Carolina

#### **Administrative Route Examples**

- I-540 Northern section of Raleigh outer loop from I 40 to I 87
- I-140 From I 40 in New Hanover County to US 17 in Brunswick County
- I-587/Future I-587 US 264 from Zebulon (Future I-87) to Greenville
- I-285 US 52 from Lexington to Winston Salem
- I-485 Charlotte outer loop
- I-840 Northern part of Greensboro loop from I-40/1-73 to I-40/I-85/I-785
- I-885 Durham County Eastend Connector from I-40 to I-85

#### Congressional Process

- The United States Congress must designate route
- The NCDOT must request, through FHWA NC Division the addition of a high priority route to the Interstate System
- Approval for the addition of a high priority route to the Interstate System is left with the US Secretary of DOT
- The high priority route must meet Interstate System design standards
- Must be connected to an Interstate Route at one end and an NHS route at the other end.
- The route number must be approved by AASHTO

#### High Priority Corridors for North Carolina

#### **Congressional Route**

- I-73/74 through Winston Salem
- I-73- US 220 from VA State Line to NC 68 to I-40 to US 220 in Greensboro to US 1 Rockingham to SC Line
- I-74 I-77 in Surry County to US 52 to US 311 to US 220 to US 74 Rockingham to US 76 Whiteville to US 74/76 to SC Line
- I 87/ Future I 87 Raleigh-Norfolk Corridor; Raleigh, NC, to Norfolk VA
- I-785 / Future I-785 The Greensboro Corridor from Danville, VA to Greensboro, NC along US Route 29 (overlap with Route 29 Corridor)
- I-795 / Future I-795 US 117/ I-795 from US 70 in Goldsboro, to I-40 West of Faison
- I-42 / Future I-42 US 70 from I-40 Garner to Port at Morehead City
- Future I-685 US 421 corridor from Greensboro to I-95

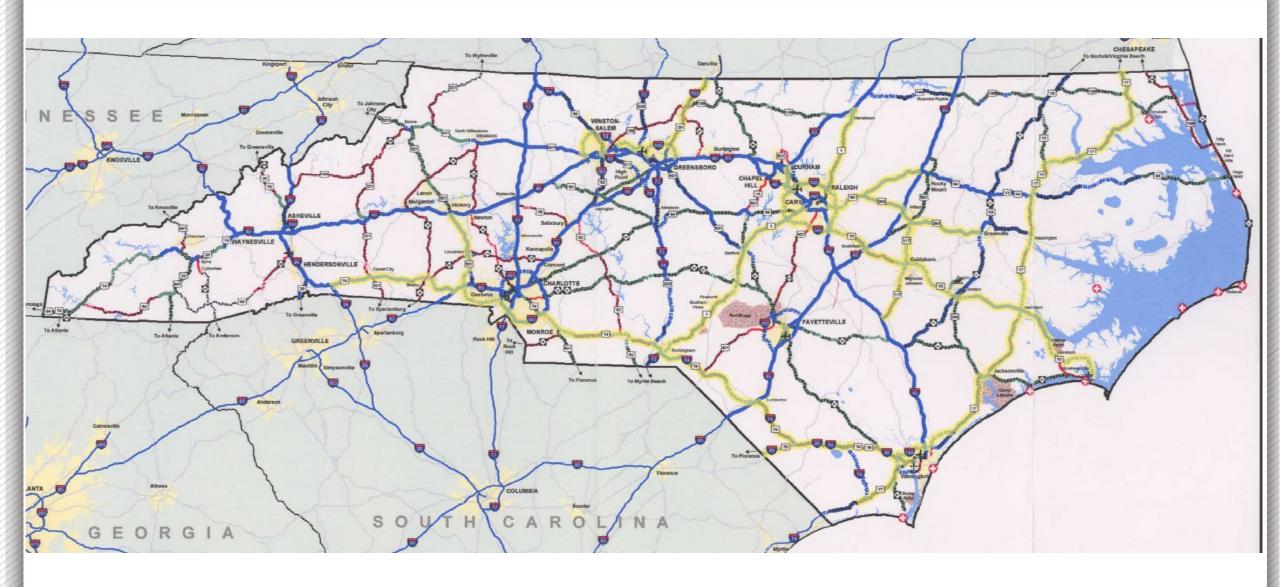


Figure from a 2004 study that the Traffic Engineering Branch completed looking at Conceptual Interstate Corridors.

# DR. DOCK J JORDAN AND CARRIE THOMAS JORDAN HIGHWAY

**WHEREAS,** Dock Jackson Jordan (1866-1943) served North Carolina Central University for more than 27 years as its first professor of history and founding chairman of the university's history department; and

WHEREAS, Jordan started the first "colored" summer schools in Durham County and taught English and government; and

**WHEREAS,** he previously served as dean at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, where he also directed the National Teachers Training School, conducting training workshops for black educators throughout the United States; and

**WHEREAS,** Jordan worked with W.E.B. Du Bois and Carter G. Woodson for the advancement of African-American education and served as president of Edward Waters University and Kittrell College; and

**WHEREAS,** Jordan stood against white supremacy at the turn of 20th century, in an era where lynching and terrorism of black people was common; his actions resulted in retribution from government officials and agencies; and

**WHEREAS,** Jordan was a lawyer who earned bachelor's, master's and law degrees from Allen University in Columbia, S.C.; later in life, he also earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Columbia University; and

WHEREAS, Jordan's wife, Carrie Thomas Jordan (1870-1968), served as supervisor of black public schools in Durham, N.C., between 1923 and 1926. Jordan discovered a system with inadequate facilities, and she raised funds through community rallies and food sales to construct 12 new schools for African-American children, including the Russell School, which is the only Rosenwald school still remaining in Durham; and

**WHEREAS**, though black children had been relegated to a curriculum which taught them cooking, farming and sewing, Carrie Thomas Jordan rewrote the curriculum, using textbooks from white schools to focus on spelling, geography and nature; and

**WHEREAS,** from 1923 until 1926, Jordan was a "Jeanes supervisor," mentoring and supporting rural schoolteachers in Durham, under the auspices of the Jeanes Foundation; and

**WHEREAS,** Jordan was a speaker in 1902 at the Negro Young People's Christian and Educational Congress in Atlanta, where she advocated for the establishment of vocational training courses in the South to help African-American youth improve their employment opportunities.; and

**WHEREAS**, the Jordans were distinguished by their commitment to political advocacy, social justice, civil rights, and service to mankind. Their life's work was impactful, historic and transformational; and

**WHEREAS,** that in appreciation for their distinguished service to the citizens of North Carolina and Durham the Durham City Council requests that a road be honorarily designated in their name.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation honorarily designates Fayetteville Street (SR 1118) from Lawson Street to Timothy Avenue in Durham as the *Dr. Dock J Jordan and Carrie Thomas Jordan Highway*.

That appropriate signs will be erected at a suitable time.
