The purpose of this amendment is to modify the agreement to combine NC FLAP DOT 276(1) with NC 63, and to shift the approved funding from preliminary engineering (PE) and construction (CN) to all preliminary engineering (PE). If there are remaining FLAP funds after the completion of preliminary engineering, the remaining FLAP funding may be used on additional project phases, including construction.

The Project consists of construction improvements at the intersections of US 64 and US 276 and US 64 and NC 280. 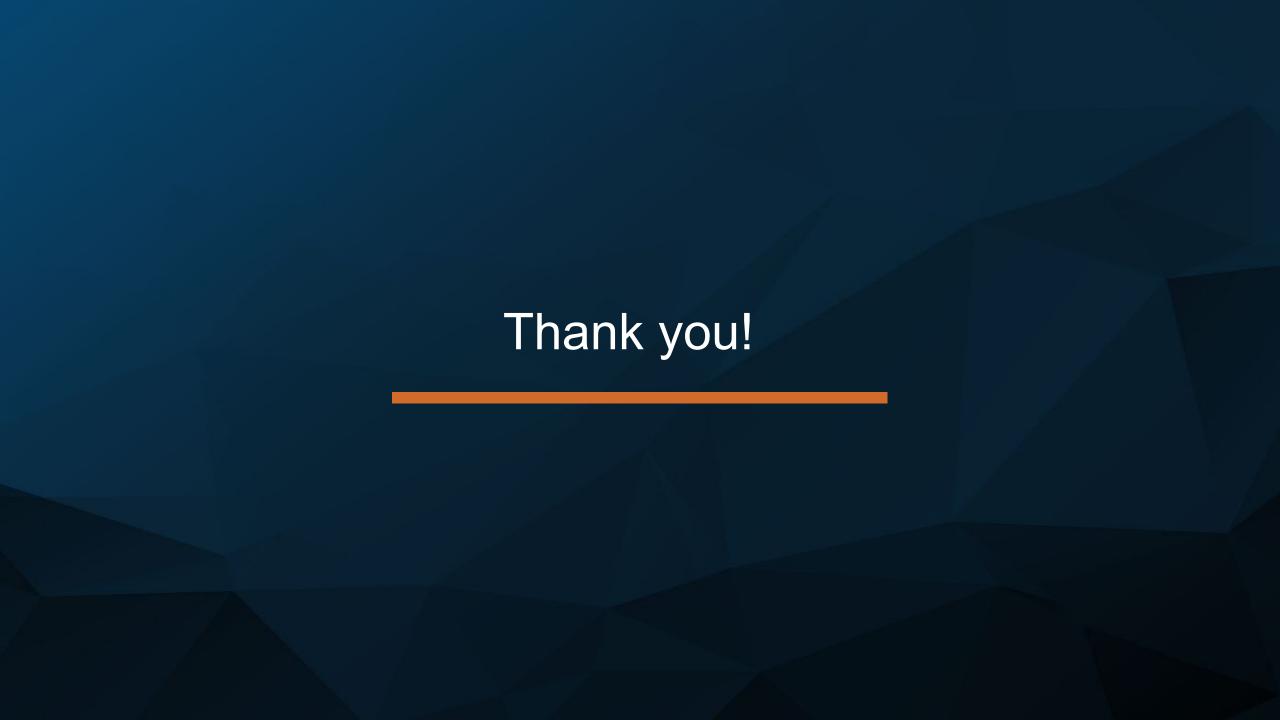

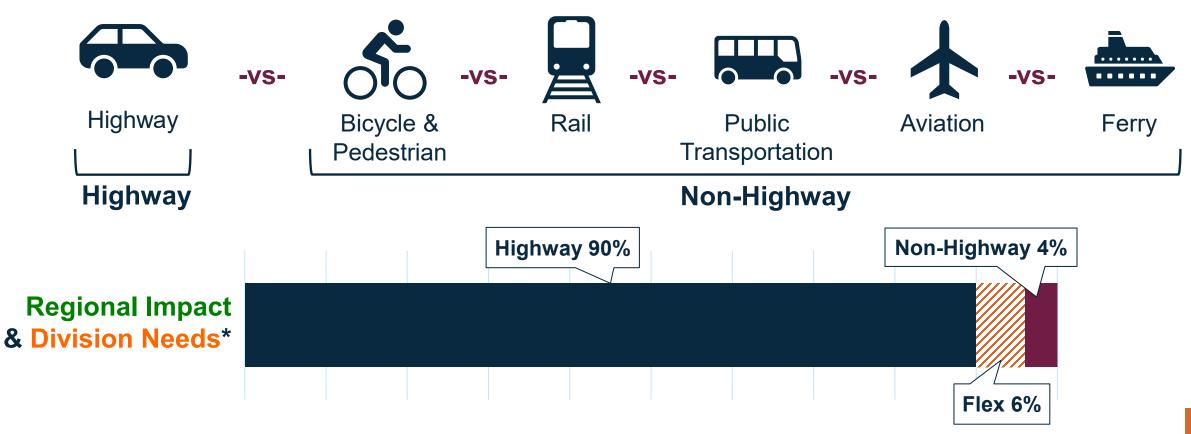

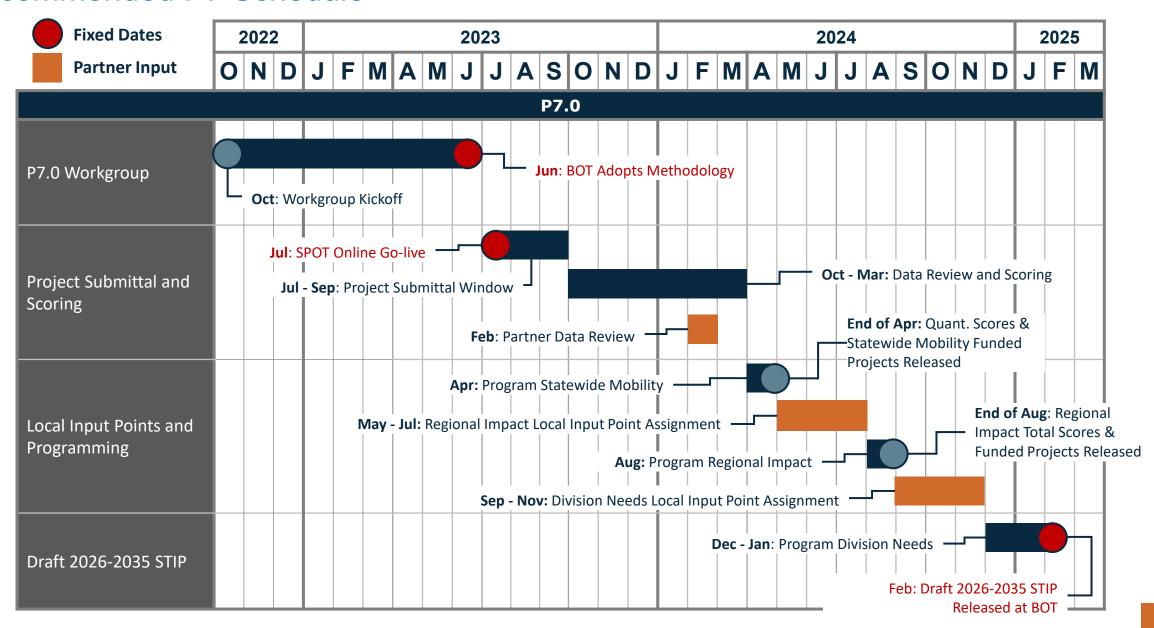

WHEREAS, Michael William Krzyzewski was born Feb. 13, 1947, in Chicago, attended St. Helen Catholic School and Archbishop Weber High School; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski began his basketball career when he enrolled at the U.S. Military Academy; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski graduated from the U.S. Military Academy in 1969, served as an officer in the U.S. Army from 1969 to 1974, and was discharged from active duty in 1974 with the rank of captain; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski served as the head coach of the Duke University men's basketball team from 1980 to 2022, and earned a reputation as one of the greatest basketball coaches of all time; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski, who became affectionately known as 'Coach K,' has distinguished himself and brought honor to North Carolina for his distinguished military service and his success and leadership as the head coach of Duke University's men's basketball team for 42 consecutive years; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski, while the head men's basketball coach for Duke University, won 1,129 games and five national championships; and

WHEREAS, Krzyzewski amassed 1,202 career wins as a head coach in men's college basketball, the most victories by a head coach in NCAA history; and

WHEREAS, Coach K served with distinction on over 21 different USA Basketball coaching staffs, helping the teams win more than 95% of their games; he also served as the head coach for the U.S. Olympic men's basketball team, becoming the only Olympic head coach to ever win three consecutive gold medals in the sport; and

WHEREAS, he has served as an executive-in-residence at Duke University's Fuqua School of Business since 2001 and helped found the Coach K Center on Leadership and Ethics, directly influencing the leadership development of more than 6,500 Master of Business Administration students and executives since 2004; and

WHEREAS, Coach K is committed to public service, locally and nationally, by serving on boards for the Duke University Children's Hospital, The V Foundation for Cancer Research, the National Association of Basketball Coaches Foundation and the CEO Roundtable on Cancer; and

WHEREAS, Coach K has further invested in the well-being of the Durham community through the founding and ongoing support of the Emily K Center, which now serves more than 2,000 students of various grade levels each year; and

WHEREAS, Coach K's motivating, transformative and powerful leadership inspired generations of athletes across the world, and his legacy and impact at Duke University will be recognized long after his retirement; and

2. Mr. Riley Beaman, Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program Manager with NCDOT, shared a presentation titled:

Prepare for Takeoff. Advancing Air Transportation's Next Frontier.

Mr. J. J. Eden, Executive Director of the North Carolina Turnpike Authority, introduced Mr. Riley Beaman, Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program Manager with NCDOT.

Mr. Riley Beaman shared a presentation with the Committee Members which showed the history and ongoing use of unmanned aircraft in the State of North Carolina. He presented the following topics to encompass an expanding department at NCDOT:

- The Opportunity
- North Carolina's Leadership Role.
- Government Drone Operations
- Commercial Drone Operations
- Expanding the Economy
- Next Steps

Mr. Beaman explained the three types of Unmanned/Uncrewed Air Transportation that NCDOT focuses on:

- Unmanned/uncrewed aircraft systems (UAS), or drones.
- Advanced air mobility 9AAM/Urban air mobility (UAM))
- Unmanned traffic management (UTM)

Beginning in 2012 NCDOT directed the Division of Aviation to prepare for emerging drone technology. This support has continued to 2023, with the NC General Assembly funding advanced air mobility in North Carolina. In 2016 North Carolina launched the nation's first (and still only) permitting system for UAS.

Mr. Beaman also discussed the current applications for drone use at NCDOT for Government purposes. Included were the establishment of a State Highway UAS program for collision reconstruction, drone support for emergency response teams during Hurricane Florence in 2018, surveys to inform environmental impact mitigation, herbicide spraying in environmentally sensitive areas, infrastructure assessment during natural disasters, traffic monitoring, controlled fires, and bridge inspections. Other uses that Mr. Beaman talked about were drone inspection of airport pavement maintenance, tethered drones on IMAP trucks, and usage by multiple state agencies. One of particular interest was the recent usage at the North Carolina Zoo to simulate free-range feeding of elephants.

Ms. Amanda Conner, Aviation Business Development Manager, presented information regarding the work of the Department of Aviation to foster the goal of future success with Commercial Users of UAS systems. In North Carolina UPS & Atrium Health used drones to deliver COVID-19 vaccines in Winston-Salem. Food

	deliveries are now operating in Durham, Fayetteville, Holly Springs, and Raeford under the first U.S. drone food delivery (which began in 2020). Unlimited route expansion by the FAA approval was granted in 2023. This will allow for the expansion of BVLOS (Beyond Visual Line of Sight) UAS & AAM systems in the future.
	After Mr. Beaman discussed the plan for these programs going forward, there was a questions and answer session with the Board Members regarding drone manufacturers, foreign and domestic, equipment and parts specifications.
	Mr. Beaman and Ms. Conner ended the presentation section by inviting the Committee Members to visit and tour their facilities at RDU Airport.

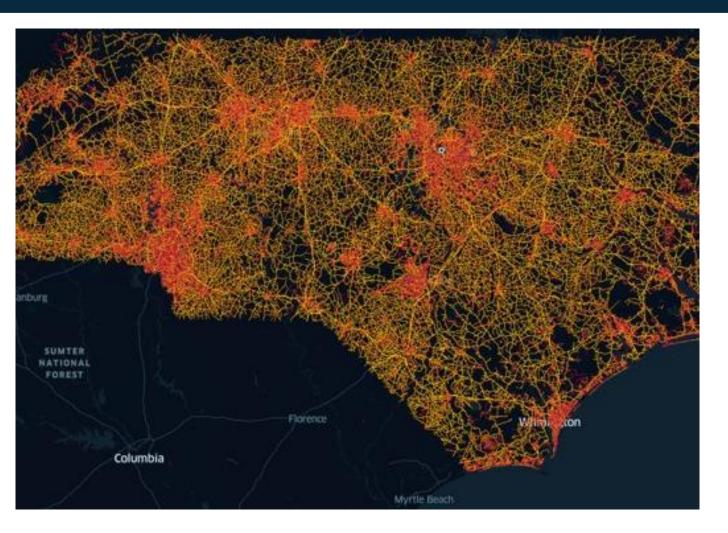

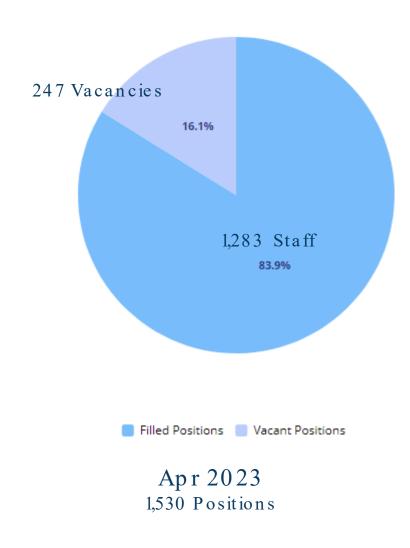

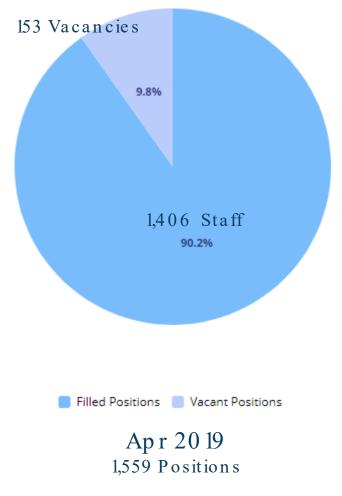
NCDOT Vacancies have grown over the past 4 years. (+437)



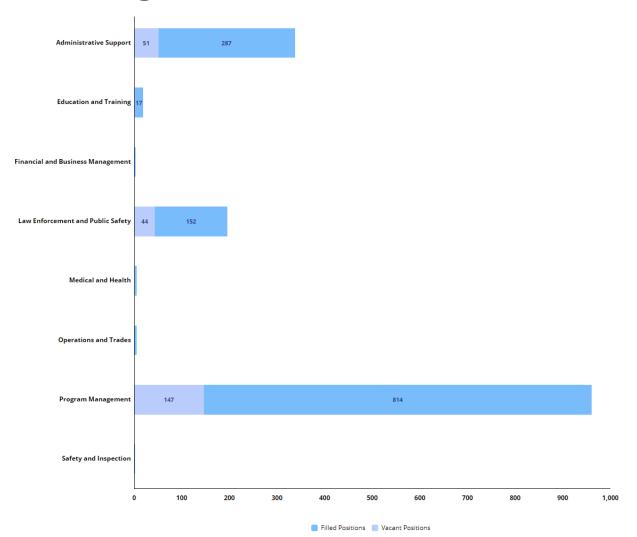


NCDMV Vacancies have grown over the past 4 years. (+94)



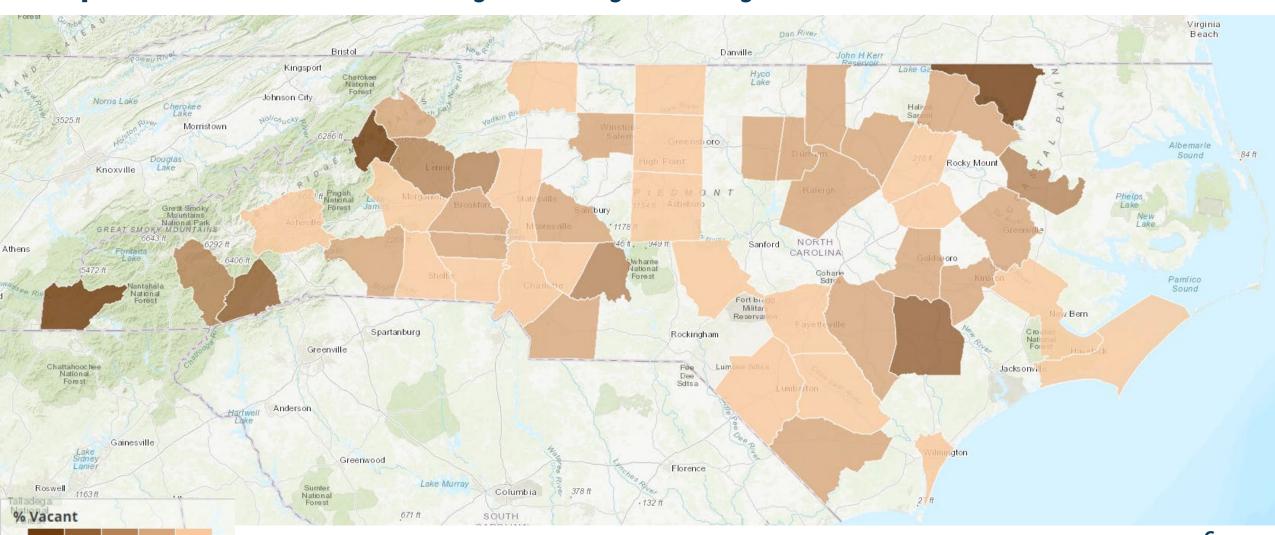

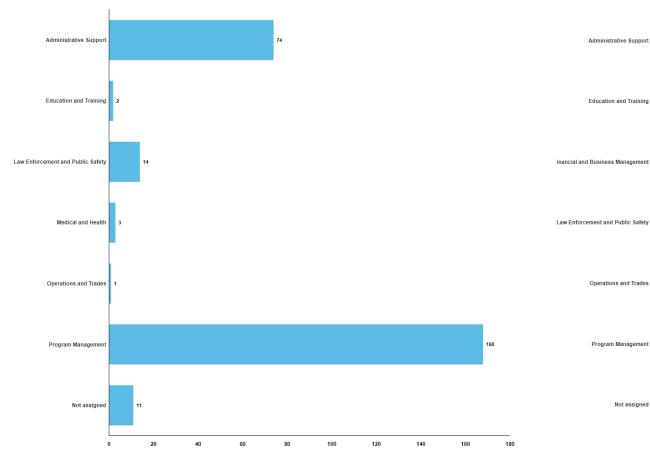

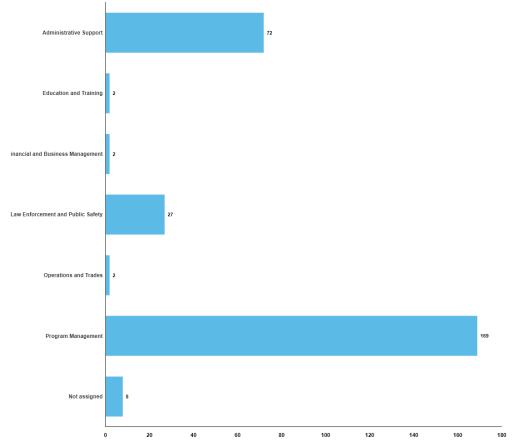

NCDMV Separations by Job Family 2023 Versus 2019



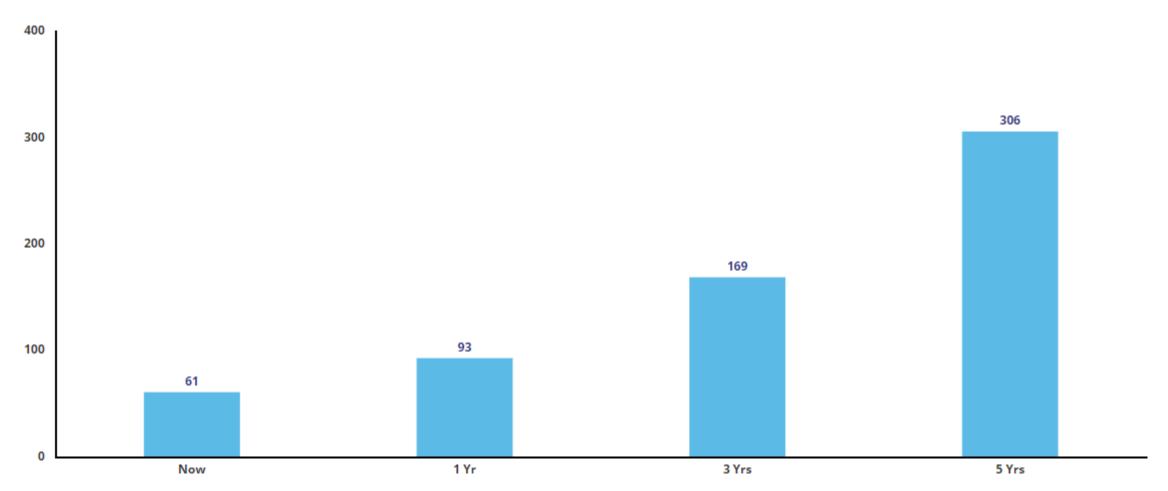

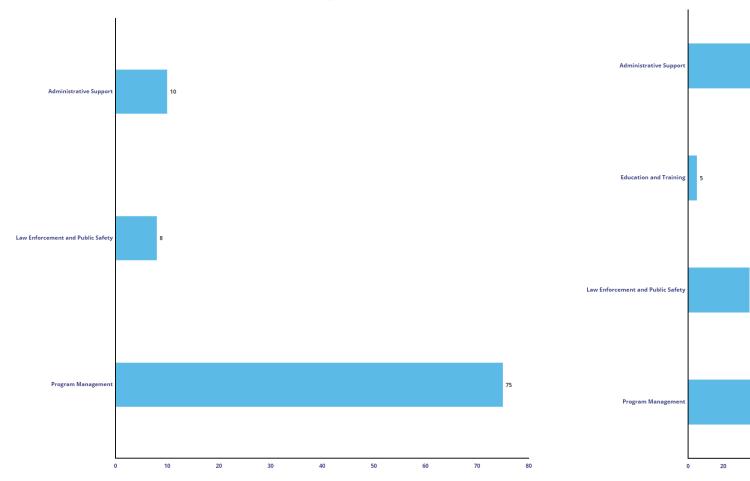

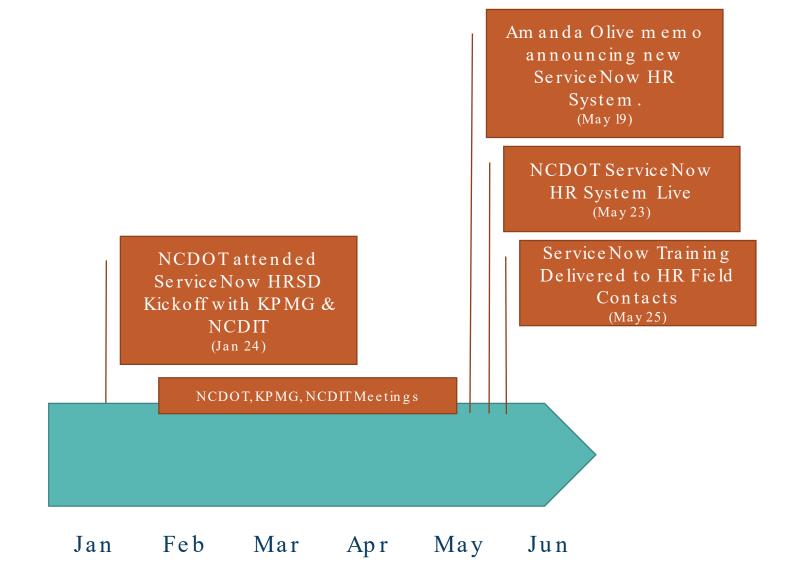

 - o ANNUAL TAX IMPACTS: \$2.5M LOCAL |\$6.1M NC | \$23M US
- Invest \$650 million in real and business personal property
- Provide an average wage of \$68K annually (\$32.69 hourly).
- Aligns with Buncombe County 2025 Strategic Plan Goals for increasing average wages and total employment.

Regional Impacts

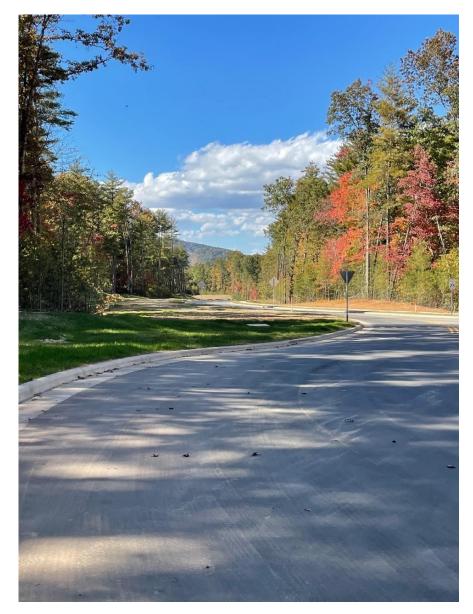


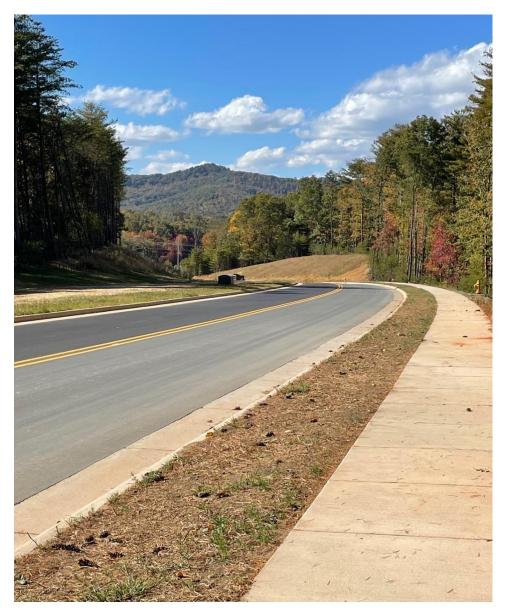
Connecting People Places and Products

Initial Site Access

- Biltmore Farms constructed a bridge across the French Broad River and an access road to the site.
 - Golden Leaf Funds utilized for the bridge
 - Bridge constructed to accommodate a 4 lane roadway, pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure
- Bridge and roadway project began February 23, 2021
- Bridge and roadway were added to the State System during the March NCDOT Board Meeting.
- Total cost of the bridge was just under \$15M and the roadway portion was \$3.5M.







NCDOT's Project

I-26 Access for the Site

- NCDOT committed to constructing an interchange project to provide a much needed East/West connection from I-26 to NC 191 and access to the site.
- The project consists of constructing an interchange on I-26, and approximately 0.5 miles of secondary road and sidewalk to complete the connection to NC 191 and connect the Pratt Whitney site to I-26.
- Initial construction budget of \$30M.
- Timeline for delivery is Fall of 2025

I-26 Access Challenges

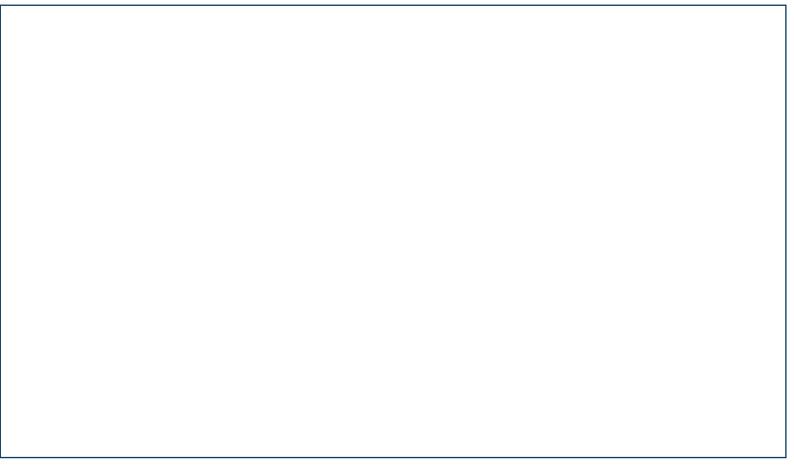
- I-26 is currently being widened through this area.
- Bifurcated section of I-26 has very stringent environmental commitments as part of the permit for I-4700
- The Parkway Staff has a very focused mission and were included as part of the merger process.
- The only viable location for an interchange is mountainous, and initial reviews indicate substantial rock within the grading pattern.
- Material Cost Escalation
 - o We have pulled in Appalachian Resource Commission funding and we are seeking Economic Development Administration funding to help offset some of the material escalation costs.
 - o Regularly researching value engineering options to defray costs and keep the project on schedule.

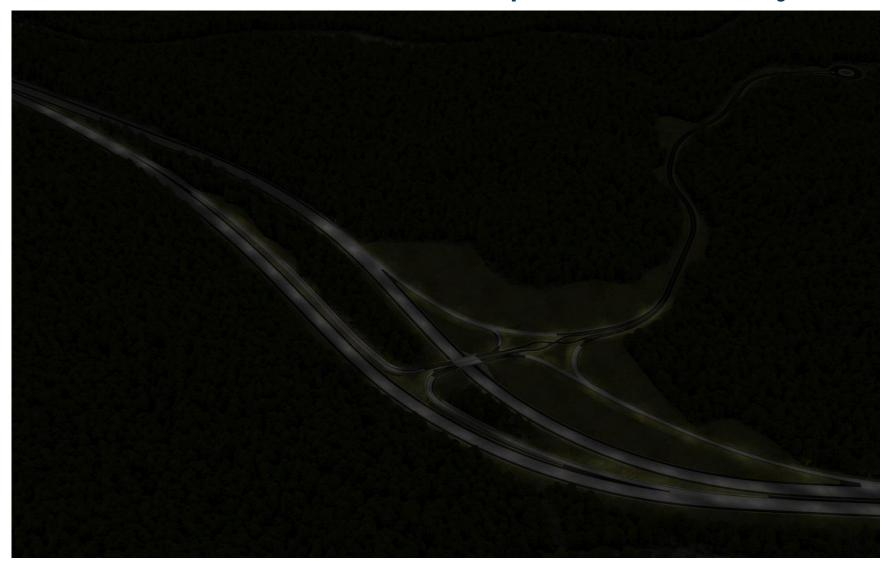

Design Options

I-26 Access for the Site

• Several options were considered for the interchange design.







• Site constraints and recognition that the East side of the interstate will not develop (Historic Biltmore Estate) required a unique solution.



Selection Benefits

- Left lane entrance/exit on the westbound approach reduces the foot print of the project and keeps us within existing right of way beside the Biltmore Estate.
- NCDOT and FHWA collaborated on the left exits to ensure that the design met federal standards and the Interstate Access Request was approved.
- Diverging Diamond Interchange on the bridge reduces projected congestion and reduces the need for signalization to one intersection.
- Diverging Diamond design also increases the efficiency of the interchange.

Current Status

- We completed the merger process January 25, 2023.
 - The merger team was very diligent and completed merger in 18 months (typically 24 to 48 months).
 - Shout out to John Jamison, Unit Manager, Environmental Policy Unit, and his team with NCDOT and Donnie Brew, Preconstruction & Environment Engineer with FHWA.
 - Their work to keep all parties focused and at the table was instrumental in reducing merger time
- The design firm is working on 65% plans and focusing on strategic items on the project.
- An application for an individual permit for the project will be submitted by the end of the month, with anticipation of the permit by mid-summer.
- If the current plan for delivery is successful, It is anticipated the project will be completed by Fall of 2025.

	Chair Lathrop called the meeting to order, conducted a roll call of members present, and declared a quorum was present.							
	Chair Lathrop read the non-conflict/ethics statement and asked if there were any known conflicts or appearances of conflicts of interest.							
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Chair Lathrop stated the meeting minutes were distributed prior to the meeting, and if there are no additions or corrections, the Chair would accept a motion that the minutes from the March 1, 2023, meeting be approved as submitted.							
	Chair Lathrop asked for a motion to approve the March 1, 2023, meeting minutes.							
ACTIONS TAKEN	Board member Rosenburgh made the motion to approve the minutes and Grady provided the second.							
	Chair Lathrop asked for a voice vote, and the March 1, 2023, minutes were approved unanimously.							
2. Current Economic Conditions –	Dr. Michael Walden Distinguished Professor Emeritus at NCSU							
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Dr. Walden started off by stating moderated inflation is partly due to improved supply chain, oil price reduction, decreased retail sales month over month, and Federal Reserve pulling money out of the economy. The Federal Reserve has also increased the federal funds rate from effectively 0 to approximately 5% to slow inflation and discourage excess spending.							
	The focus of policymakers has shifted – GDP and Unemployment have exceeded pre-pandemic levels, but Inflation has increased significantly, and policymakers are just now focused on this issue. Inflation was 1.5% pre-pandemic, and has been as high as 9%, though has decreased to 6% currently.							



This change was not as foreseeable because inflation did not skyrocket after the last recession.

Federal reserve actions have a good chance of creating a "soft landing" for the economy – slowing inflation without causing a recession. The Federal reserve is likely to raise the rate a couple more times in the next year, possibly up to 6%.

Employment has slowed. In the next 2 years we will more likely see a minor reduction in the GDP and a moderate rise in unemployment (up to 5%). Hence, there will possibly be a minor recession. However, we will probably be back to seeing growth in 2024.

North Carolina – The economy in NC is dynamic. Most growth has been in urban areas. Rural areas have been left out of the state's growth. The introduction of high-speed internet may spark a renaissance in the smaller towns and rural areas by supporting remote work or mostly remote work options.

Dr. Walden then concluded his presentation.

3. FINANCIAL UPDATE - STEPHANIE KING, CFO

Mrs. King started discussing the revenues. Revenues are within -3.2% of the forecast for the year. DOT is making efforts to increase FHWA billings over the next 3-4 months by about \$5 million weekly. Cash as a percentage of commitments in February 2023 is 28% compared to 30% in February 2022. Per S&P as of 3/6/23 – Real GDP growth for 2023 is forecasted to move from 0.7% to 1.0%; measured YOY.

FYTD expenditures are 10.4% less than forecast but 19% higher as compared to SFY 22. Largest variances remain in Construction (\$310M) & Maintenance (\$209M) due to material and labor issues.

Mobility & Modernization and Bridge Program showing the largest difference in Maintenance.

DISCUSSION SUMMARY

Budget Update. The Governor's Budget has been released; This includes our list of expansion requests. The House's version of the budget has been released. DOT met with various Committee members on expansion requests and other questions. We are hopeful that there will be a ratified budget prior to 7/1.

Toll Credits. NCDOT is implementing a FHWA allowable Toll Credit Program as a tool to fund certain projects, billing FHWA 100% of the cost. This is not more funding or revenue for the agency, but a programming tool that will offer flexibility. Focus will be to enhance the ability to request more August Redistribution.



	Mrs. King then went over some general updates. DOT continues to use the Hybrid Modeling approach this month. Draft spend plan will be presented at the May 3 rd FC meeting for a vote for consideration in June. Spend Plan performance audit is underway, anticipating an April completion date. The Finance division is working to hire an economist to join the team.

4. CONSENSUS REVENUE – AMNA CAN SUPPORT	MERON, DEPUTY DIRECTOR - OFFICE OF STRATEGIC INITIATIVES & PROGRAM					
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mrs. Cameron presented the consensus revenue. The statutory changes for revenues include the following: Annual adjustment of motor fuels tax rate, phase-in of sales tax proceeds, and Quadrennial adjustment to DMV fees. Certified State Revenues for FY23 are \$4.7b; Estimated State Revenues for FY24 are \$5.2b. MFT is \$2.3b in FY23 with projections to move to \$2.9b in FY34. The biggest impact in slowing MFT revenues is increased fuel efficiency. HUT is \$1.2b in FY23 with projections to move to \$1.5b in FY34. Negative impacts on HUT are that new vehicle transactions are down and used vehicle sales are stagnant. DMV is \$1.0b in FY23 with projections to move to \$1.4b in FY34. Sales Tax is \$207m in FY23 with projections to move to \$857m in FY34. Some negative impacts to DMV revenues are aging population and a decline in car ownership due to advances in transit, population shift to urban areas, and increase in ride-hailing, ride-sharing, and subscription services.

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Leigh Wing discussed the toll credit program implementation. Toll Credits are a tool that provides flexibility on how State DOT's can allocate their federal dollars. It was pointed out that these are not additional Federal funding or an increase in the amount of total spend authority. This tool can be used to reduce the number of projects it takes to utilize the already set number of federal appropriations. Using toll credits, NCDOT can concentrate the same amount of federal dollars on fewer projects, making it easier to gather a group of projects that maximize redistribution requests.

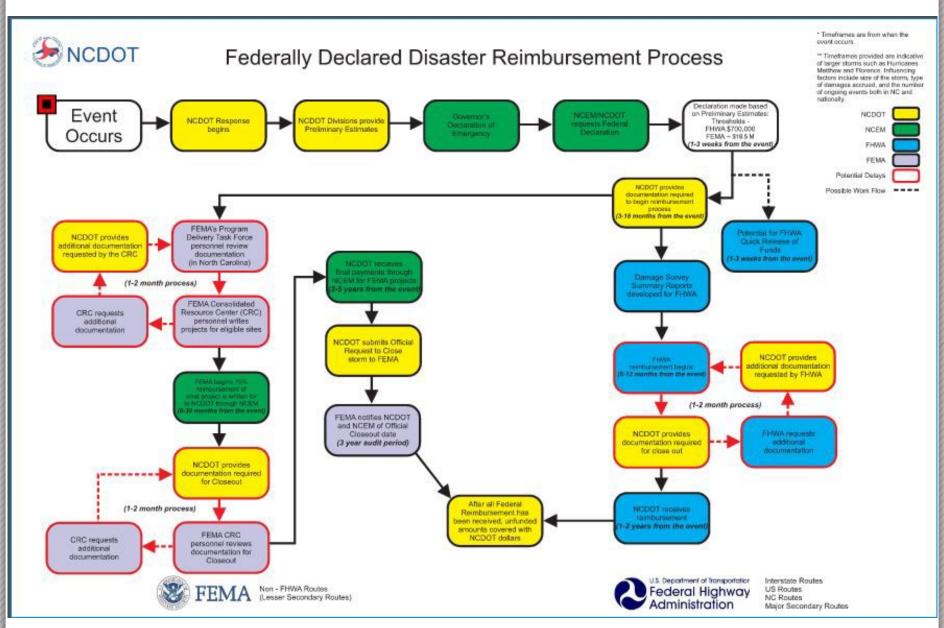

Executive Summary

The Fast Five



Revenues



- Revenues are within -5.8% of the forecast for the year.
- HF and HTF revenues are largely in line with forecast with a variance of 3.1% and 8.3%, respectively.
- Cash as a percentage of commitments in March 2023 is 28%; compared to 30% in March 2022.
- FHWA Federal Aid variance of -\$195.4 is mostly due to receiving GARVEE debt service reimbursement (\$129.3M) in February but forecasted for March.



Expenditures



- FYTD expenditures are 8.9% less than forecast but 21.1% higher as compared to SFY 22.
- Largest variances are in Construction (\$238.0M) & Maintenance (\$193.5M) due to material and labor issues.
- Mobility & Modernization, Undeclared disaster and Bridge Program show the largest variance in Maintenance.



FY24-25 Spend Plan



- The Draft FY 24-25 Spend Plan is based on the FY23 base budget, deducting any non-recurring items. Once the biennial budget is passed, Spend Plan Amendment 1 will be formulated.
- Seeking legislative action in order to issue Build NC in 2024.
- Consensus revenue forecast will be taking place in May for any needed adjustments prior to budget passage. Indications are that there will not be vast changes from February's analysis.



Benchmarking Financial Health



- Agency has worked with Ernst & Young to better benchmark parameters for financial and operational health.
- Extends actions beyond cash as the primary indicator to include days of cash on hand and percentage of cash over commitments.
- Actions will include recommendations to advance work efforts and quickly address necessary warning signs.

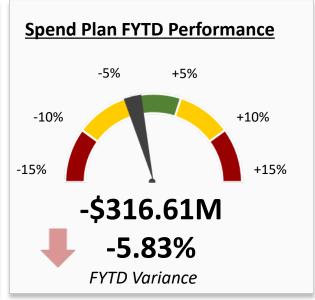


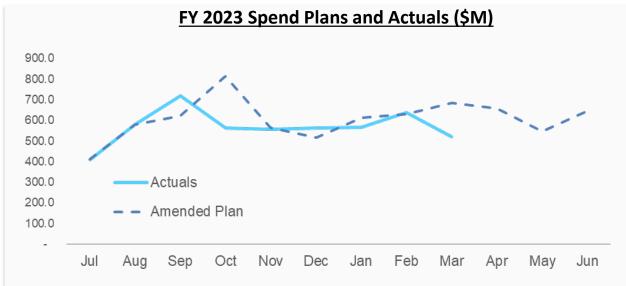
General Updates

- Fitch rating agency review affirmed NC's GARVEE Program as A+ with a stable outlook.
- FY22 Performance Audit is complete; released on 4/27/2023.
- Quarterly Revenue Updates will be presented to the BOT Finance Committee to include leading indicators. Economist and others will be working to refine the information in the months ahead.
- Efforts continue with SAS, Ernst & Young, OSBM, and DOT on the long-term forecasting tool. Hybrid approach was used in the March update.

Revenue Commentary

- Motor Fuel Taxes, Highway Use, DMV Fees, and Sales taxes are closely in alignment with the spend plan forecast.
- FYTD revenues have a negative variance of 5.8% primarily due to Federal Revenues.
- FHWA Federal Aid variance of -\$195.4 is largely due to receiving GARVEE debt service reimbursement of \$129.3M in February when forecasted for March, creating a variance due to timing.
- In addition, DOT is making efforts to increase FHWA billings over the next 3-4 months by about \$5 million weekly.

Expense Commentary

- Overall negative FYTD variance to spend plan is -8.9% or \$-521.0M; attributable to Construction and Maintenance.
- Positive monthly variance to spend plan is
 4.5%; Expenditures are in line with forecast due to construction picking up.
- FYTD overall Construction and Maintenance expenditures continue to fall behind forecast due to labor and material shortages.
- Overall expenditures are up YOY, increasing by 21.1%

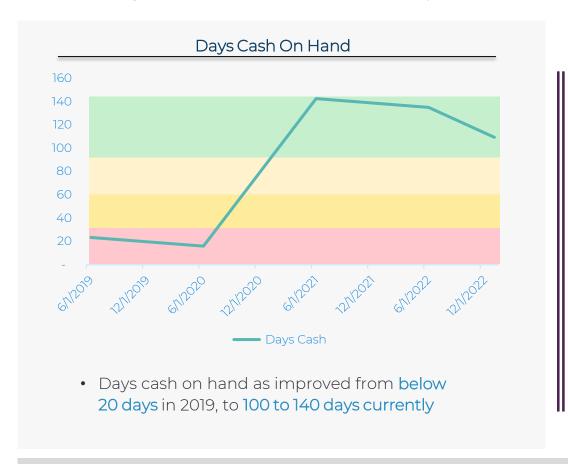

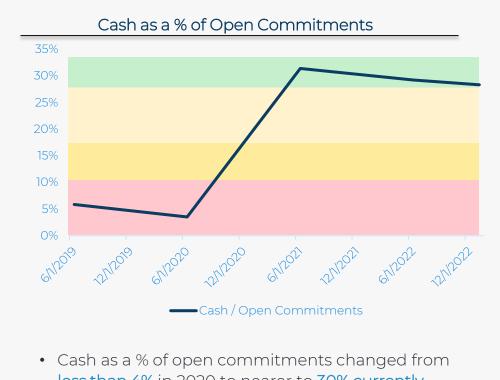

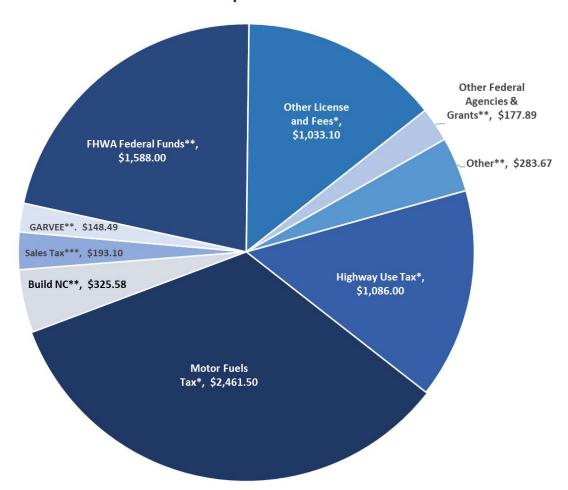

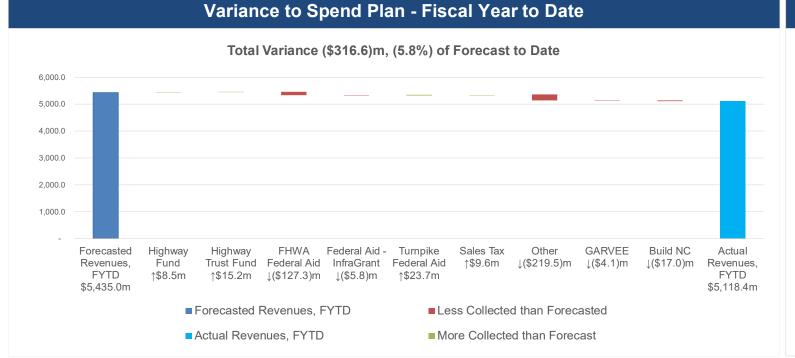

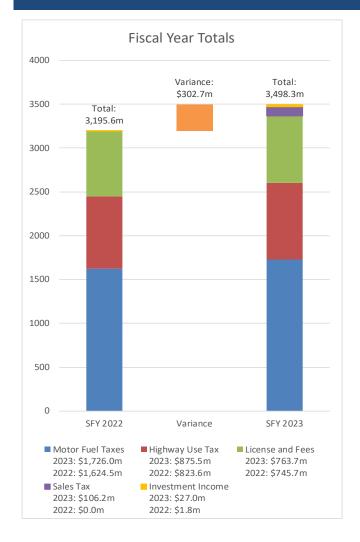

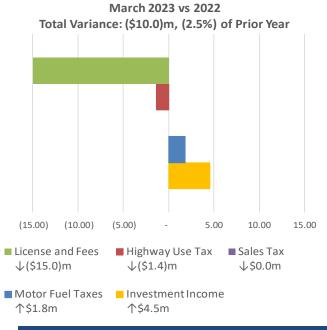

FYTD YoY Variance



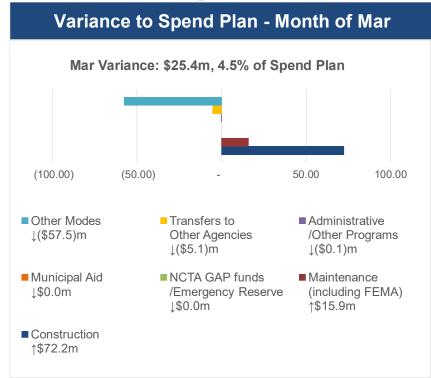

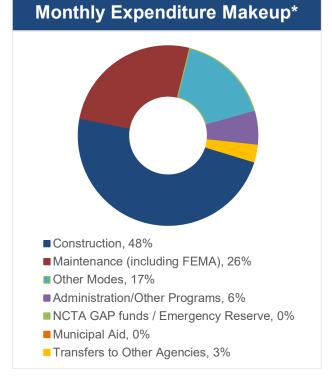

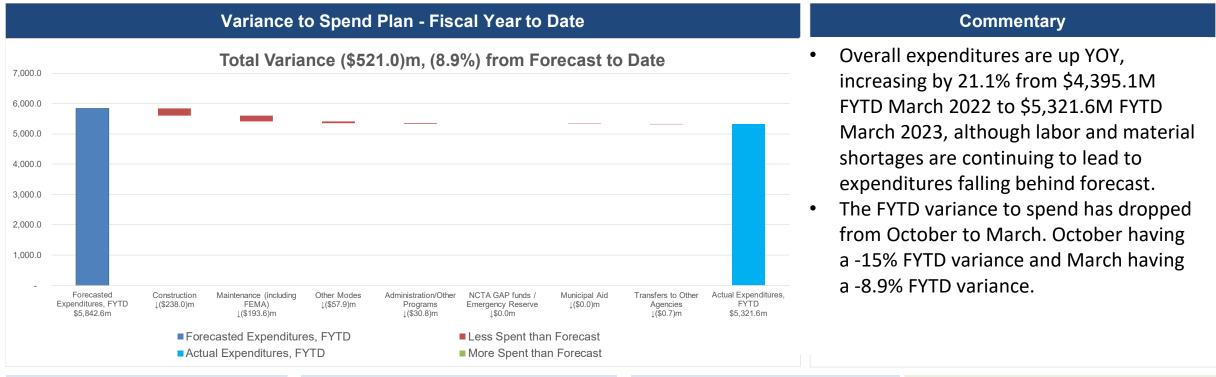

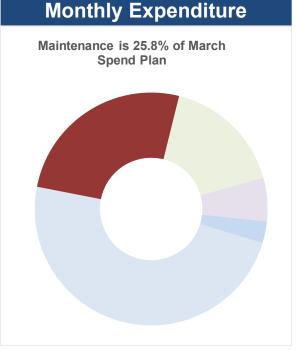

Maintenance Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$M)

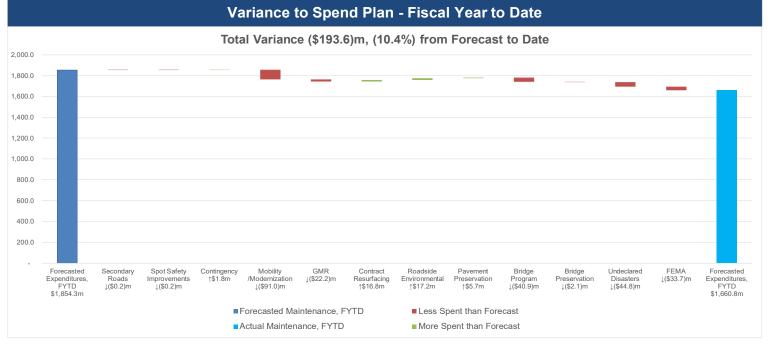

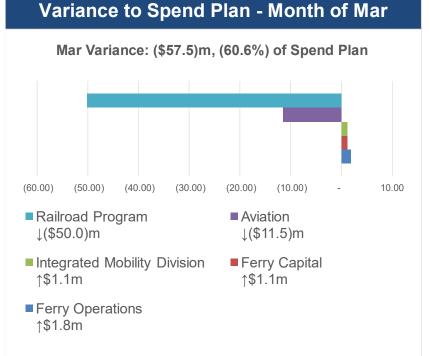


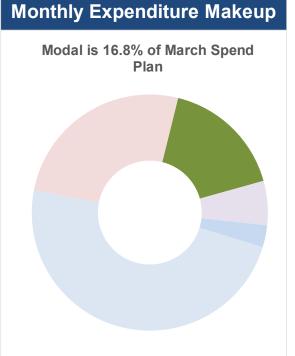

Modal Expenditure Variances – Monthly (\$M)



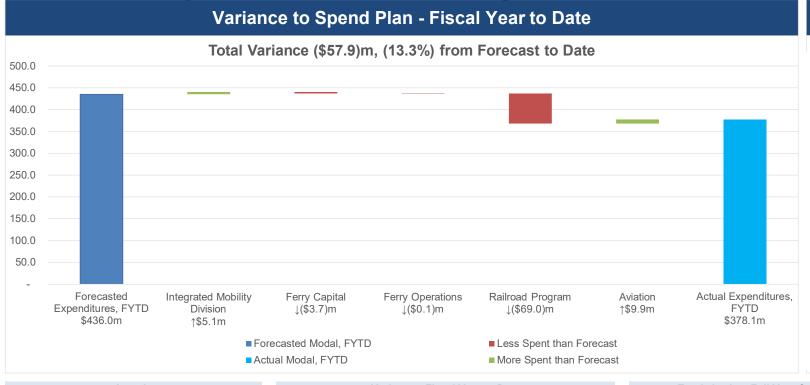

Modal Expenditure Summary and Variances – FYTD (\$M)



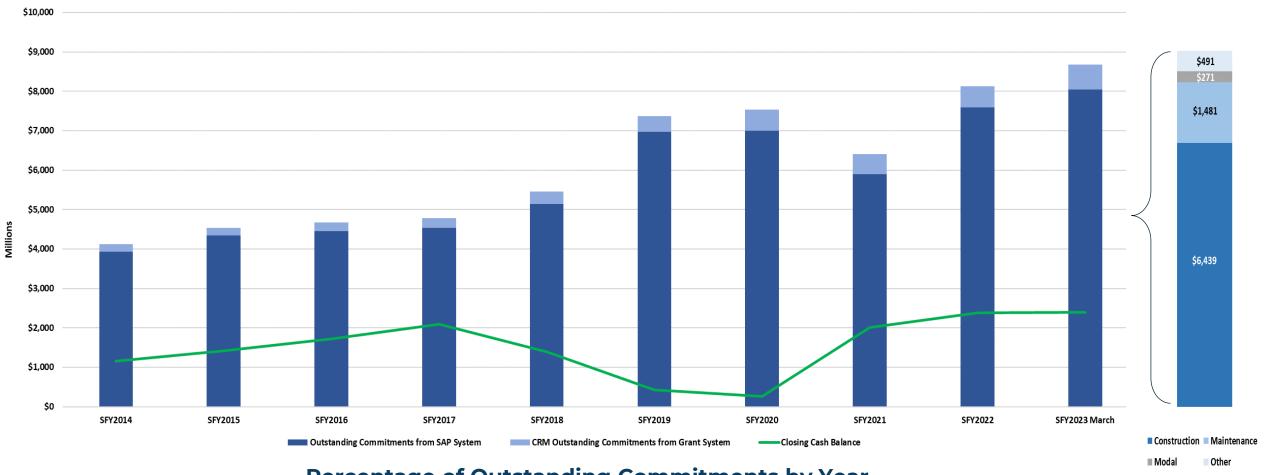

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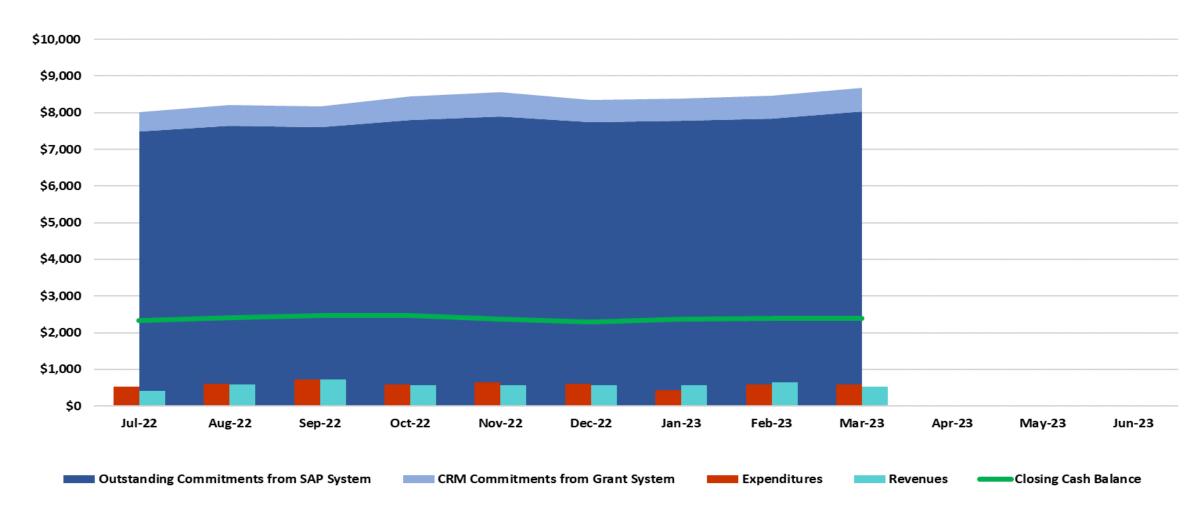
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by Month



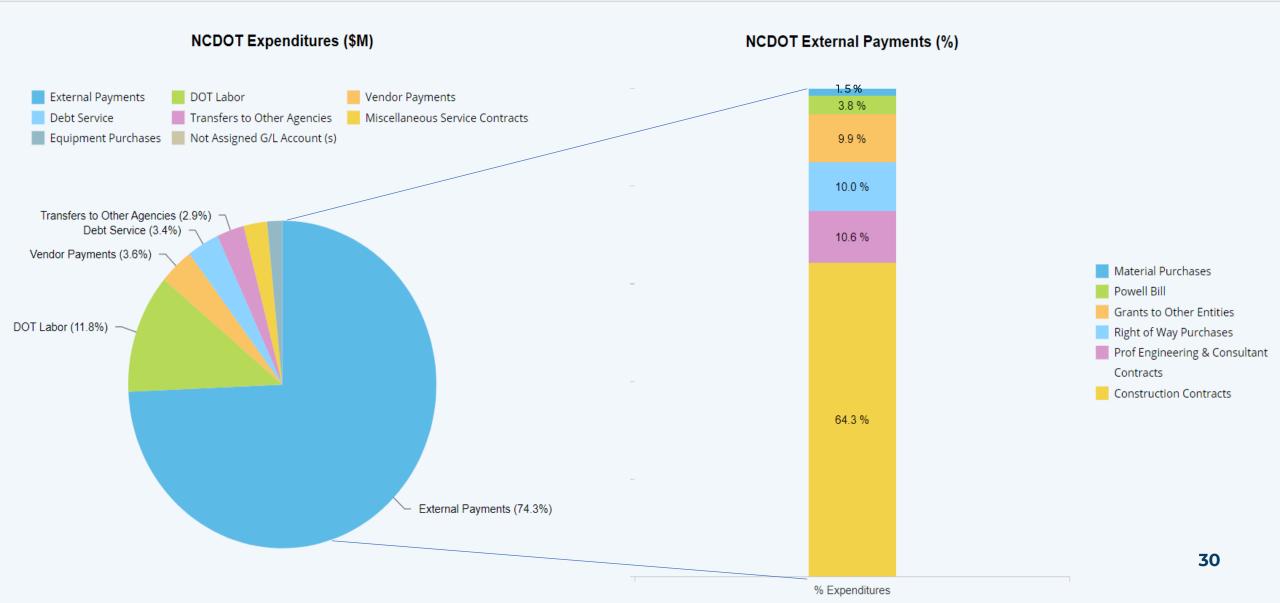
Cash Reporting

Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee

March 2023 – Reporting Required

- N.C.G.S 143C-6-11(m) requires DOT to report each month when the department's combined average daily cash balance for the month is outside of the statutory target range.
- For March 2023, the **combined average daily cash balance** of the Highway Fund and the Highway Trust Fund was \$2.36 billion.
- The cash target amounts representing 15% and 20% of the total appropriations for the current fiscal year are \$716 million and \$955 million, respectively.
- The closing cash balance for March was \$2.40 billion which is above the target range and above the minimum cash balance requirement of \$358 million under N.C.G.S. 143C-6-11.

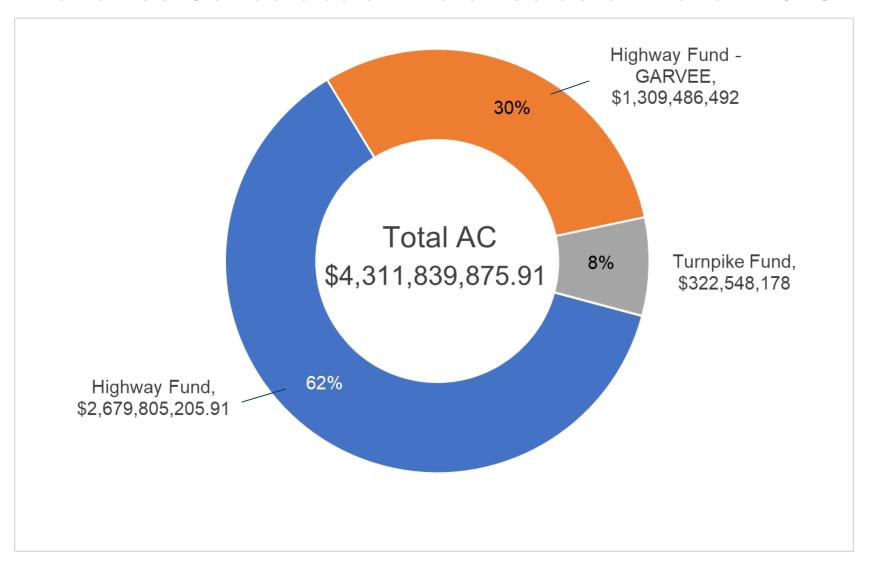

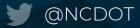

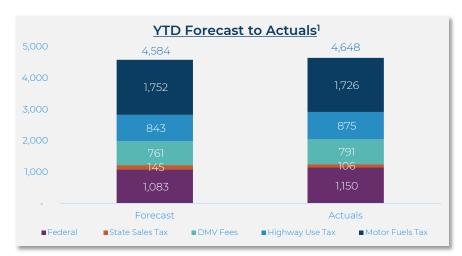

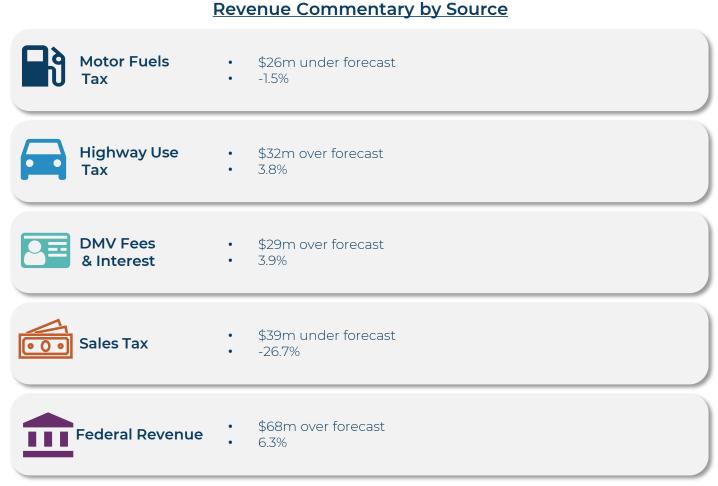

Overall Revenue Performance Snapshot – Fiscal YTD

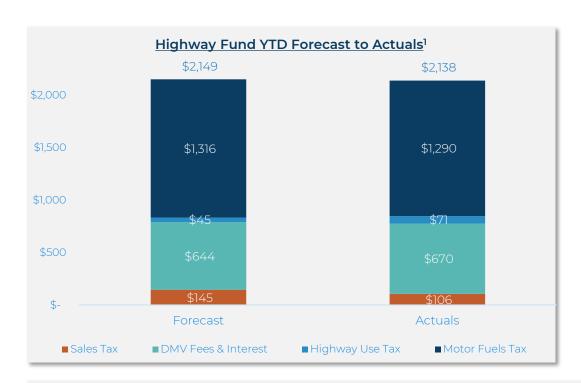

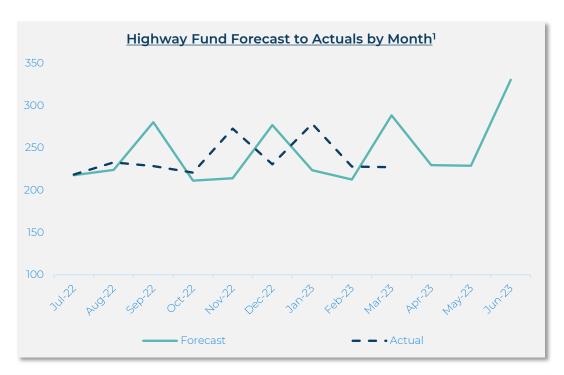






Highway Fund Revenue Performance Snapshot – Fiscal YTD

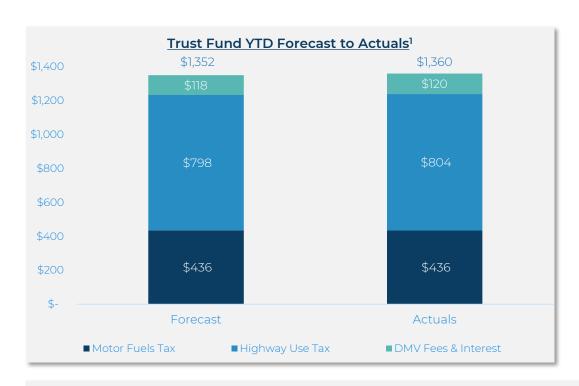


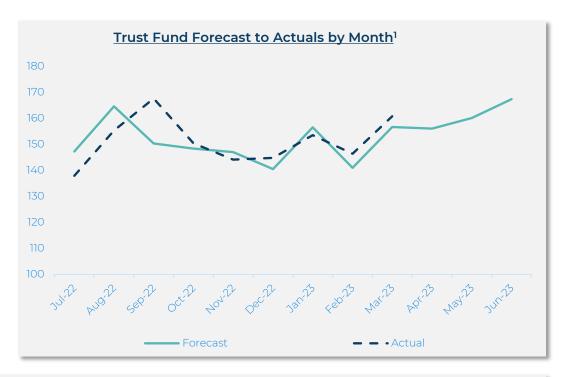


Highway Fund Revenue Commentary

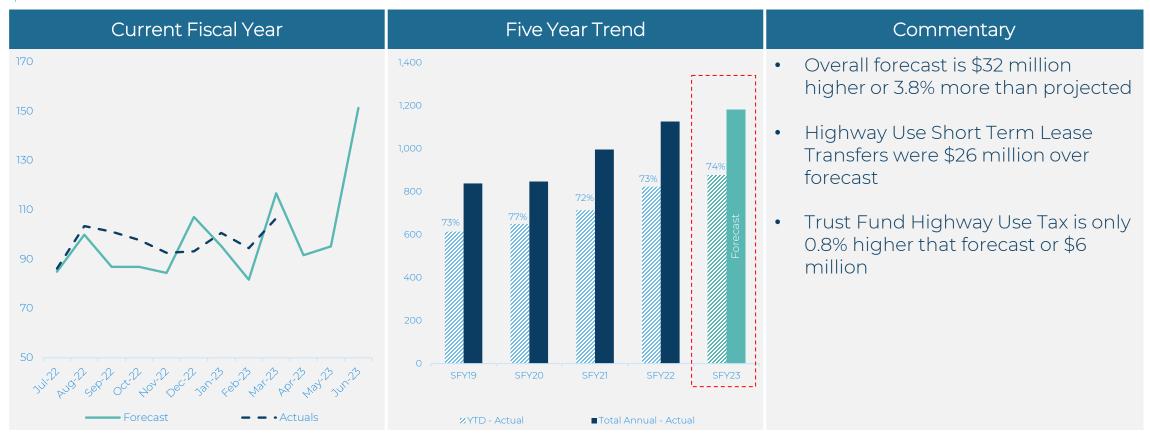

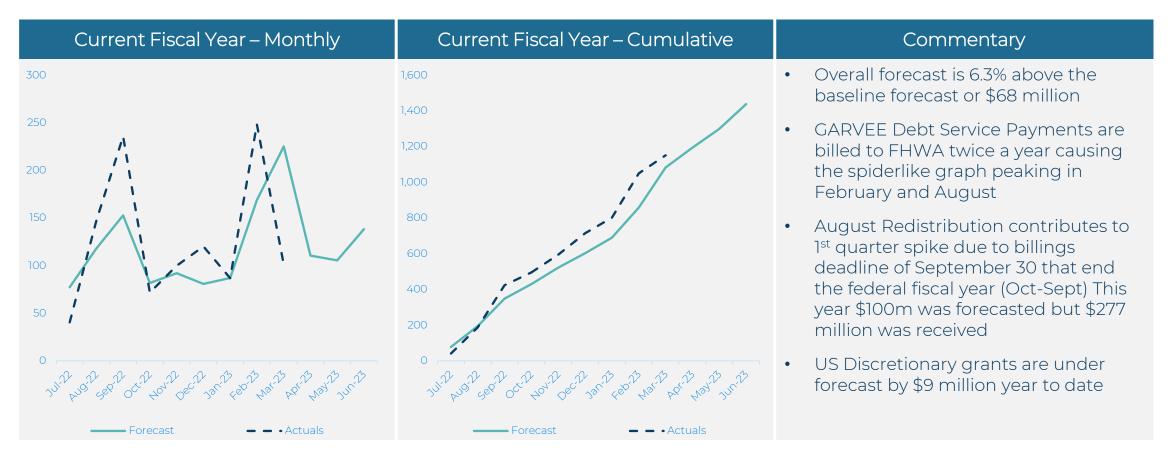

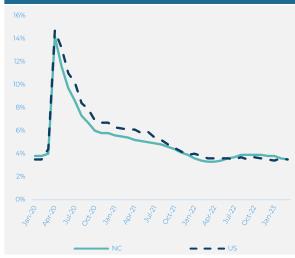

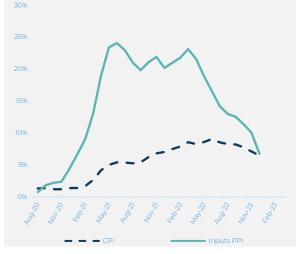

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	The Office of State Human Resources (OSHR) provided state agencies the ability to grant bonuses for hard-to-fill and retain positions. This initiative aids in the employment for critical positions with labor market shortages affecting business needs and impairing delivery of essential services.
	Agencies may develop programs to provide bonuses for hard-to-fill occupations. Roles must have: 1) Turnover rates significantly higher than acceptable, and/or 2) Retention rates significantly lower than acceptable, and/or 3) Vacancy rates significantly higher than acceptable. To be eligible, employees must: be permanent employees, not be on probation, or leave of absence; not have received a sign-on bonus in the past 24 months from a NC agency for their job classification; and have an overall performance evaluation of at least meets expectations.
	NCDOT identified 17 roles eligible for bonuses based on OSHR rules: Accountant I, Accounting Technician II, Administrative Specialist II, Bridge Inspector II, Driver License Examiner I, Electronics Technician III, Engineer I, Ferry Chief Engineer, Marine Mechanic, Nurse Consultant I, Program Analyst I, Program Coordinator I,

	Program Coordinator II, Program Coordinator III, Real Property Agent I, Transportation Worker I, and Vehicle/Equipment Repair Technician I. Bonuses ranged from \$1,000 to \$2,000. 65 NCDMV Headquarters Staff were given a \$1,500 bonus for the move from Raleigh to Rocky Mount. NCDMV HQ move bonuses totaled \$97,500. Over \$2.6M in DMV and role-based bonuses: 2,090 total employees. 96% of bonuses were role-based and DMV HQ move bonuses were 4%. Potential bonuses that were not paid: 65 employees in eligible roles did not receive the bonus due to performance ineligibility; 52 employees in eligible roles		
	did not receive the bonus due to being on leave of absence; 33 employees declined the bonus; and 6 employees in eligible roles did not receive the bonus due to retirement.

OJT 2022-23 Accomplishments

- We had a record of 309 prime contractor employees enrolled into the OJT program as trainees in CY2022.
- This was due to a new formula and methodology that included division-let contracts resulting in a goal of 319. The goal for CY2023 is 219 due to the three-year running average calculations.
 - 34 contractors participating in the OJT compliance program for 2023.
 - o 78 new enrollments as of March 30, 2023 (Total active 194 including 2022 carry-overs).
 - 23 graduates to journeyman status (individuals would have completed their upgraded skills classification training program hours).
- We'll continue to enhance the SharePoint system for OJT, create a position, and hire a full-time permanent OJT program compliance coordinator.

OJT/SS 2023 Accomplishments

- NCDOT OCR's OJT/Supportive Services unit was invited by the FHWA Office of Innovation and Workforce Solutions to present our innovative uses of 504(e) funds during a national training webinar. Our Deputy Director joined State Transportation Agency representatives from Michigan and Nebraska on the panel.
- Worked with National Governor's Association Technical Assistance project: utilizing fund flexibility of IIJA for workforce development including pre- and registered apprenticeships and high school summer accelerator concept.
- Pilot transportation summer accelerator program being developed for select public school systems across N.C. Partners include NCDPI, NCBCE, Community colleges, local education agencies and NCWorks.

OJT/SS 2022-23 Accomplishments

- Awarded a \$1.3M Digital Equity Grant from NCDIT to provide devices and related training to hundreds of OJT and Business Opportunity and Workforce Development program participants.
- OJT/Supportive Services has recently applied to have the new Transportation Summer Accelerator program (with high school students) be included as an Every Day Counts-7 initiative NCDOT's Transportation and Innovation Council and FHWA
