Full Board Work Session

Tuesday, August 6, 2024

Chairman Fox welcomed members of the Board to the in-person meeting located in the Board Room and thanked members for being present to handle the business brought before them. Some of the members attended the Work Session via Microsoft Teams.

Roll Call

Chairman Fox conducted a roll call of members with the following members present in the meeting: Chairman Fox, Vice Chair Perkins, Board Member Alcoke, Board Member Daughtry, Board Member Hunt, Board Member Mathis, Board Member Molamphy, Board Member Rosenburgh, Board Member Lathrop, Board Member Phillips, Board Member Lail, Board Member Cody, and Board Member McGrady.

The following members were present via teams: Board Member Zimmer, Board Member Mitchell, and Board Member Jordan.

The following members were absent: Board Member Moran, Board Member Harrington and Board Member Clarke.

Declaration of Quorum

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the Full Board Work Session to order on Tuesday, August 6, 2024.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

Declaration of Quorum

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the full board meeting to order on Wednesday, August 7, 2024.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

SEI Evaluation Requirements

Chairman Fox mentioned that an email was sent by the Interim Board Secretary outlining the SEI evaluation requirements to all Board members who had an SEI evaluation completed this year. As required by the State Government Ethics Act, "when an actual or potential conflict of interest is cited by the State Board under G.S. 138A-24(e) with regard to a public servant sitting on a board, the conflict shall be recorded in the minutes of the applicable board and duly brought to the attention of the membership by the board's chair as often as necessary to remind all members of the conflict and to help ensure compliance with this Chapter." SEI evaluation statements are attached at the end of this document.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval – July 10, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from July 10, 2024, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the July 10, 2024, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Cody and a second by Board Member McGrady. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Economic Development Partnership of NC

Chairman Fox welcomed Chris Chung, Chief Executive Officer, Economic Development Partnership of NC to the Board meeting and opened the floor for him to do a presentation on the interaction and partnership between

Economic Development Partnership of NC and the NC Department of Transportation.

Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the North Carolina State University 2023 Women's Cross Country National Champions naming located in Division 5. The reading was accepted as a motion by Chairman Fox and a second by Vice Chair Perkins. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated if there were no objections from the board, that all highway resolutions would be read and voted on after being read. There were no objections.

Board Member Meagan Phillips read the resolution for the Patrolman Ralph W. Arnold Bridge naming located in Division 4.

Board Member Grady Hunt read the resolution for the Patrolman Henry T. Timberlake Bridge naming located in Division 6.

Board Member Grady Hunt read the resolution for the Officer Bobby J. Furmage, Jr. Bridge naming located in Division 6.

Board Member Grady Hunt read the resolution for the Officer Franklin D. Perritte Bridge naming located in Division 6.

Vice Chairman Perkins read the resolution for the Patrolman W. J. Smith Jr. Bridge naming located in Division 2.

All five readings were accepted as a motion by Board Member Hunt and a second by Board Member Phillips. The motions passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Pat Molamphy read the resolution for the Carl Lamm Highway naming located in Division 4. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Molamphy and a second by Vice Chairman Perkins. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Tony Lathrop read the resolution for the Ed Underwood Highway naming located in Division 10. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Lathrop and a second by Board Member Phillips. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the Commissioner Eddie C. Bridges Highway naming located in Division 7. The reading was accepted as a motion by Chairman Fox and a second by Vice Chairman Perkins. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to give his remarks.

Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Hopkins began by acknowledging the Board for getting the Road Bridge Ferry Naming's approval, and emphasized how important these dedications were to the families. He thanked Chris Chung from the Economic Development Partnership of NC for coming today and the continued relationship with NCDOT. He then extended a big thank you to everyone who helped organize the tour of the license plate manufacturing facility at the Correction Enterprises yesterday.

Secretary Hopkins thanked the amazing staff across the state, as well as the partners who have helped prepare for the state's first major storm of the season, Tropical Storm Debby. He shared that the storm was being actively monitored. More than 2,200 employees across our 14 Highway Divisions have helped ensure thousands of signs, trucks and other equipment are ready and they are actively working in response to the storm. Secretary Hopkins stated outside of this, there is a continual resiliency to improve the transportation infrastructure across the state. Tornados and wind gusts are expected from Tropical Storm Debby. Division crews have worked to get ahead of flooding. In case of flooding, detours for road closures have been planned and there will be a check for damage to get roads open quickly. The Division is ready to shift personnel and able to bring in contract partners if needed. He urged everyone to stay off the roads; and if you must go out and encounter a road covered in water or a "road closed" sign, remember to "turn around, don't drown". He also urged everyone to not drive past barricades, and to be safe. Real time travel conditions can be monitored for North Carolina roads at DriveNC.gov. There has been constant communication with modal divisions - Aviation, Ferries, Ports and Rail – and the Division of Motor Vehicles are also following the storm closely and prepared to make any adjustments to services as needed. We will provide updates throughout the course of the storm. Please be patient and please stay safe out there.

Secretary Hopkins said most were aware, but there was more great news on the discretionary grant front last month. The Governor and Secretary Hopkins joined Board Member Zimmer, Deputy Engineer Chimes, Division 3 staff and federal and local officials in Wilmington to celebrate the

announcement of a \$242M grant funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Loan (BIL) to support the project to replace the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge. This 3000-foot-long bridge was built in 1969 and carries U.S. 17/U.S. 76 /U.S. 421 over the Cape Fear River and connects Brunswick and New Hanover counties. Wilmington and the surrounding area are growing and a new bridge with greater capacity will serve this region well into the future.

Secretary Hopkins gave an update on the NC Quick Pass. A number of changes were made to meet the needs of customers. There is now a new NC Only account which is now available for customers to save 35% on tolls without the need for a transponder. In addition, NC Quick Pass has reduced the required pre-paid balance for new accounts from \$20 to \$10 for the first two vehicles added to the account. Also, the minimum balance requirements on NC Quick Pass accounts will now be evaluated monthly instead of quarterly to help keep customers' accounts in good shape.

Secretary Hopkins gave a reminder about upcoming dates for some of our educational and training programs. For our Technical Training Series, we have events on August 8, 2024, in Durham and August 22, 2024, in Wilkesboro covering the topic of Work Zone Traffic Control. This pilot program offers various courses to small highway construction contractors interested in working on NCDOT projects. There is also an upcoming prequalification educational session set for August 15, 2024, in Castle Hayne. Any firms interested in working on our highway construction projects are required to become prequalified and these sessions are aimed at helping prepare firms to do business with NCDOT. Interested firms can

find more information about this session and others on tap for this year by searching the connect.ncdot.gov site for "prequalification campaign."

Secretary Hopkins reminded everyone about the department's customer service survey taking place now. This statewide survey is conducted annually to measure how citizens feel about services provided. Results provide useful insights that can be used to improve customer satisfaction and track progress over time. The survey is available now through October 15, 2024, and can be accessed via the link on the screen and from the NCDOT website and social media platforms.

Secretary Hopkins mentioned the Governor's School Supply Drive that is taking place and there's still time to donate. He stated, we're encouraging staff across the state to donate school supplies in support of public schools, students and teachers. The supply drive deadline is August 16, 2024, and this year, NCDOT's donations will go to benefit Alleghany County Schools. Also, in the Transportation Building, there is a donation station in the front lobby. Cash donations can be given to Tanner from Communications. Donations can also be accepted at State Employees' Credit Union locations across the state.

Secretary Hopkins gave a personnel update and announced that Brennon Fuqua has accepted the position of Director of the Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) at NCDOT. Brennon brings a wealth of expertise and a unique background. Brennon graduated from NCSU in 2011 and began his career on the private side before working with the City of Raleigh. He joined IMD in April of 2023, focusing on the implementation of innovative multimodal transportation programs statewide and was appointed Interim

Director of IMD last October. Now we want to congratulate Brennon on becoming Director of IMD.

In closing, Secretary Hopkins spoke to safety being NCDOT's No. 1 priority. There are a lot of employees working to make that priority a reality, and that includes Kelly Wells. Secretary Hopkins shared her story on what she has done not only for the department, but for all North Carolinians during National Traffic Awareness Month. She has definitely made it safer.

Board Member Lathrop recused himself from voting on the following projects:

Item O – Mecklenburg County, BL-0083

This Project consists of the construction of a sidewalk from Nevin Road to Rumple Road and N. Graham Street to Roman Road; the construction of a multi-use path from Merlane Drive to N. Tryon Street; the construction of a mobility hubs at Mallard Creek (Derita), Merlane Drive and Sugar Creek Light Rail Train Station; and the installation of Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons at Sofley Road. The Municipality is responsible for all phases of the Project. The Department shall reimburse 55% of approved eligible costs from the TAPDA funds allocated, not to exceed \$2,425,000. The Municipality will be responsible for providing the 45% non-federal match (\$1,985,000) and all costs that exceed the total available funding off \$4,410,000.

Item O – Mecklenburg County, HL-0137

This This Project consists of the installation of right turn lanes on northbound and southbound Sugar Creek Road at the WT Harris Boulevard intersection. The Municipality is responsible for all phases of the Project. The Department will reimburse 70% of approved eligible costs from the STBG-DA funding allocated, not to exceed \$1,337,991.

The Municipality shall be responsible for providing the 30% non-federal match (\$573,425) and all costs that exceed the total available funding off \$1,911,416.

• Item O – Mecklenburg County, HL-0152

This Project consists of the installation ITS infrastructure including fiber optic cable in conduit or aerial attachments to poles, traffic cameras, and communication equipment. The Municipality is responsible for all phases of the Project. The Department will reimburse 80% of approved eligible costs from the Carbon Reduction Program funding allocated, not to exceed \$3,917,562. The Municipality will be responsible for providing the 20% non-federal match (\$979,391) and all costs that exceed the total available funding off \$4,896,953.



Significant mitigation amounts were accepted by the WRP and paid by the NCDOT before sufficient data was available related to the actual cost of mitigation and agreements were put in place for cost recovery that would not exceed the actual cost of producing the mitigation. NCDMS and the NCDOT Environmental Analysis Unit (NCDOT-EAU) have reconciled 98 mitigation projects which account for the majority of the mitigation credits (84.6% of the stream credits and 85.8% of the wetland credits) utilized toward these requirements. Both NCDMS and NCDOT-EAU have agreed to end the process of reconciling individual mitigation projects in favor of a final lump sum payment based on NCDMS' calculations to complete all of the remaining projects.

A. Improved Understanding of Dynamically Stable Channels with Mobile Bed and Erodible Banks with Application to Stream Restoration. Restoration of streams with mobile sand-beds is increasingly being implemented with little understanding of sediment mobility and transport. In the sand-bed streams and rivers of the NC Coastal Plain, sediment (sand and silt) is eroded and transported in response to flood discharge; lack of understanding sediment dynamics has resulted and will continue to result in negative impacts of stream supported functions. Understanding sediment dynamics over a range of discharges in these sand-bed systems is critical to designing successful flood mitigation projects.

B. Ecohydrogeomorphically informed egg-laying habitat restoration: using ecology, hydraulics, and geomorphology to improve stream restoration. Aquatic habitat is a primary goal in stream mitigation to support aquatic lifecycles. An important and often overlooked habitat for macro invertebrates is oviposition habitat. DMS supported research to evaluate oviposition and macroinvertibrate abundance and diversity in mitigation sites. Among the findings, researchers found that freguent movement of ovipoition habitat had a negative impact on benthos populations. This work will address oviposition stabilty with respect to stream restoration with the intent to incorporate the results into future stream designs.

1. Revenue Update: Amna Cameron, Deputy Director - SIPS

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- Gasoline prices remain stable with consumption at a high.
- Vehicle sales and vehicle pricing remain stagnate YOY.
- DMV revenues are largely on target; Title fees show the most growth primarily due to an increase in vehicle purchasing price.
- Retail sales grew slower than anticipated. In SFY 2024 consumers purchased fewer household goods, however they are paying more.

2. Financial Update: Mark Newsome, CFO

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- As of June 30, 2024, days of cash on hand was 119.4 and cash as a percentage of open commitments was 30.5%.
- Total revenues and other receipts were 2.2% below forecast FYTD. Total overall expenditures and other disbursements were 7.1% below forecast FYTD.
- The Annual Comprehensive Financial Report process is underway at DOT.

DMV Committee

The DMV Committee heard one presentation.

DMV Updates: School Bus Staffing & Update on Technology: Cam Coburn - Assistant Director of Training & Development, Terry Fuller – School Bus & Traffic Safety Manager, Wayne Goodwin – DMV Commissioner

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- Five-year patterns:
 - School bus classroom theory, road and range driver training, and testing results.
 - Totals of new drivers trained
 - o Current drivers renewed as required by law
- Virtual Classroom Theory Review

- o Implemented in 2021
- 200-person maximum enrollment per class (250 maximum for Summer 2024 classes)
- o 4,400 potential 'full' class slots for the 2023-2024 year
- Federal Entry Level Driver Training
 - Implemented February 2022 by Federal Department of Transportation
 - Set new classroom theory and road and range training standards for CDL applicants
 - Increased time for driver training to minimum of three days and a fourth day of testing (up from two days with a third day for testing)
- Kiosk Update
 - Now offer vehicle renewals, print stickers, and pay property taxes.
 - Phase 2 will allow special/personalize plates to be ordered, renew disability placard, pay administrative hearing fees.

Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations (EDIR) CommitteeThe EDIR committee heard one presentation.

North Carolina Global Transpark (GTP) Update: Preston Hunter - Executive Director

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

Unite the economic development efforts of Lenoir, Wayne, Greene counties, and the Global TransPark- Developed in 1991, with Kinston being the chosen landscape based on its affiliation and proximity to Hwy 70 (Wilmington and Morehead City). It was the nucleus for building to have the same standards as a full-service airport. In order to help support the North Carolina Global Transpark (GTP) build, a few of the existing services were the 1) FAA tower, 2) ARC services (firefighters services) and 3) no heavy traffic as the commercial airports bring. This includes access to air, rail, and highways. However, there are some challenges that will need to be worked

through that include connections to major interstates such as access to I-42.

- Represent the strengths of Eastern North Carolina- Some of the planning is to create a learning environment for aviation by building a new state-of-the-art training facility at the Kinston Regional Jetport; Highlights for this project are:
 - \$25 million estimated cost
 - o 13,000 sqft hangar
 - o 50,000 sqft classroom and training space
 - Construction to start July-August 2024
- Market the region's assets, people, quality of life, and military bases— There are already existing tenants that help support this effort. Spirit AeroSystems, who already have a large presence, fly Exclusive,
 Draken International, and Fleet Readiness Center-East (FRC East).
- Creating jobs and promote capital investment is part of the planning, economic and workforce development as well attracting other businesses and military support.
- Update: at the next board meeting, there is a request to provide an update on Vinfast and Toyota

Highways Committee

The Highways committee heard two presentations.

1. Modular Vortex Roundabout: Archer Wright

• Highlights of the presentation and discussion included: Introduction of the new product used for traffic patterns on day one. This roundabout is located in Burlington off Longpine Rd. Division 7 had received several complaints from citizens which brought about the updates. The findings were not conducive, therefore an all- way stop control was installed as interim treatment to address citizen request while additional treatments were considered. The creation of the new roundabout was created on a napkin sketch to support the creation of the new roundabout. The initial concept of concrete islands became cost prohibitive

- (>\$600K) due to drainage needs. Example images of the product with anchors were provided. This implementation helped with traffic control. A video showed the finished product and flow of traffic.
- Construction substantially completed within 5 days, fully complete within 2 weeks.
- Roundabout kit repurposed an estimated 345,000 recycled milk jugs and the expected cost was around \$200,000.
- 2. Maintenance Initiative- Advancing our Transportation Ecosystems

 Maintenance Intelligence System (ArTEMIS): Randy Finger and Patt

 Talvanna
 - Highlights of the presentation and discussion included: What does it cost to own and operate 81,000 miles? Opportunities to enhance service delivery and Focus on Total Cost of Ownership,
 - Initiatives are to improve asset management capabilities and to better preserve our transportation system. One of the initiatives of the presentation included "Doing the right amount of work, at the right time, to deliver the right service level, at the right cost for the most impact: Having good data, a driven approach and to be cost effective are key in this initiative. A diagram of the assets and cost were provided to support this project. There will need to be a continuous effort in the collection of data to improve the initiative. Some of those efforts are drainage feature, mobile data, location of data and more granular changes.
 - Data used to develop Total Cost of Ownership (TCO) Model In order to begin developing this model the approach, validation and accuracy are key. Based on that research there are three main costs of Ownership": Assets, Cost and multiplying the needs and service. The current technology has been used over the years with Google based and satellite images. Global images triangulate the need to build confidence over time. All models help the quality control.
 - Informs maintenance investment needs in MOPAR (G.S. 136-44.3) has been used for forecasting. Upcoming legislation with the MOPAR report comes out in December along with other reports this fall, and this will provide what can be done. This will also provide the network growth and first take of the data found.

 Updates at next meeting; Discussion on Utilities use and how other states do it.

Multi-Modal Committee

The Multi-Modal committee heard four presentations.

- Jason S. Myers Passenger Rail Expansion Corridor Identification Program
 - An explanation of the Corridor ID program, which is the tool for North Carolina to expand our successes on the Raleigh to Charlotte corridor to the rest of the state.
- 2. Brennon Fuqua, IMD Director: NCDOT Trails Feasibility Study Program
- 3. Pamer McIntyre: Piedmont Land Conservancy
- 4. Aaron Bland City of Brevard and Chris Todd Henderson County:
 Ecusta Trail Update:
 - IMD and our community partners gave a brief presentation on the state of trails in North Carolina. IMD showed how paved trails can be built in NC. Palmer McIntyre provided an update on the Great Trails State Coalition and representatives from the City of Brevard and Henderson County described how the development of partnerships led to the winning formula for funding the Ecusta Trail and provided an update on the project.

Other Business/Closing Comments

Chairman Fox reminded everyone that the next meeting of the Board of Transportation will be September 3rd - 5th in Division 9. The Governance team will be sending out hotel confirmations and a comprehensive itinerary in the next few weeks.

Governance Updates

Chairman Fox introduced two new Governance Staff members that have joined the team. Crystal Flowers who will be the Interim Board Secretary while Marilyn is on maternity leave and Erica Roebuck – Administrative Assistant for the Governance Office.

Lastly, Chairman Fox announced that Marilyn McHilse had her twins on Friday, August 2nd. The baby boy is named Elijah James and he weighed 6lbs 1 oz. The baby girl is Adeline Marie and she weighed 5lbs 11ozs. Both babies and mom are healthy and doing well.

Adjournment

Chairman Fox asked if there were any additional items for discussion. He stated hearing none he would accept a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made by Board Member Cody and seconded by Vice Chair Perkins. Chairman Fox stated the motion passed unanimously.






Forecast to Actuals: Motor Fuels Tax

Forecast to Actuals: Highway Use Tax




Forecast





Forecast to Actuals: Sales Tax





Forecast to Actuals: Interest Income



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




Images of inlet placement instructions (left) and a FryeFlow filter bag (above) from the manufacturer's catalog.

Central Let Projects

- Central letting occurs monthly on third Tuesday of the month
- Centrally let projects can be of any dollar value (NCGS 136-28.1)
- Contract Standards and Development Unit handles the Central letting
- Project Types Highway, Bridge, Resurfacing, Preservation, Railroad, Ferry
- Centrally Let projects represent 20% of total lettings but 80% of dollars
- Approximately 100-150 projects are let annually for a typical year

Division Let Projects

- Division lettings occur throughout the month, with each Division having two lettings per month
- Divisions let projects limited to \$5 million or less (NCGS 136-28.1)
- Lettings handled at the Division
- Project Types Highway, Bridge, Resurfacing, Preservation, MaintenanceCentrally Let projects represent 80% of total lettings but 20% of dollars
- Approximately 350-400 projects are let annually for a typical year
- SBE Contracts are developed and let at Division

Construction Delivery Methods

Design-Bid-Build (DBB)

- Description: Traditional method where the project is designed fully before bidding.
 - **Design Phase**: NCDOT completes design of the project.
 - **Bidding Phase**: Contractors bid on the completed design.
 - Construction Phase: The selected contractor constructs the project.

Design-Build (DB)

- Description: Integrates design and construction under one contract.
 - **Single Contract**: One entity is responsible for both design and construction.
 - Concurrent Phases: Design and construction phases can overlap.


Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC)

- Description: Two phases of contracting with contractor input through design development
 - Design Phase: Department procures designer
 - **Early Involvement**: CM/GC is involved during the design phase.
 - Advisory Role: Provides input on constructability, cost, schedule, etc...
 - **General Contracting**: Opportunity to move to construction management

Progressive Design-Build (PDB)

- Description: Integrates design and construction with preconstruction and construction phased contracts
- Process:
 - **Design Phase:** Designer is part of the PDB Team.
 - **Early Collaboration**: Design-builder engaged early, before design is complete.
 - **Progressive Phases**: Design and construction progress in phases.
 - Open Book: Cost and scope defined progressively.

Procurement Processes by Delivery Method



Design-Bid-Build Procurement Process

Prior to Advertisement

- Review Bid Package: Plans, proposals, and quantities are thoroughly reviewed for accuracy
- Estimating: Engineer's estimate is generated and becomes the basis for which bids are compared
- Contract Times: Contract durations are established by committee using established procedures
- Disadvantaged Business Enterprises(DBE): DBE goals are established for the project and approved by committee
- Funding: State and/or Federal funding authorization is obtained

Advertisement and Bidding

- Advertisement: NCDOT advertises the project, inviting contractors to bid. Advertisements are published on
 official NCDOT websites and email distributed to prime and subcontractors. Advertised 4 weeks prior to
 letting for most projects. Eight weeks advertisements may be needed based on project.
- **Bidder Prequalifcation**: Contractors must be prequalified to bid on project as well as sign up on the Interested Parties List for the project on the NCDOT website
- Bid Preparation: Contractors prepare and submit their bids, including cost estimates and required documentation


Bid Evaluation

- Bid Opening: NCDOT publicly opens the bids at a specified time and place, recording all received bids
- Bid Evaluation: NCDOT evaluates the bids focusing on the lowest responsive bid
- Bid Selection: Bid review committee reviews makes recommendation to award project

Award and Contract Execution

- Award: Delegation of Award letter signed by the Secretary of Transportation
- Required Documentation: Contractor submits payment and performance bonds along with other required forms
- Execution: Upon receipt of required documents from the Contractor, the contract is executed

Design-Build Procurement Process

Project Identification and Planning

- **Project Identification**: NCDOT identifies the need for a project and determines that the Design-Build method is appropriate
- Initial Planning: Preliminary planning and environmental studies are conducted to define the project scope and requirements

Request for Qualifications (RFQ)

- Issuance of RFQ: NCDOT issues an RFQ to solicit Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) from interested design-build teams
- **SOQ Submission**: Design-build teams submit their qualifications, including experience, capabilities, and past performance
- **Evaluation of SOQs**: NCDOT evaluates the submitted SOQs based on pre-defined criteria to shortlist the most qualified teams

Request for Proposals (RFP)

- **Issuance of RFP**: NCDOT issues an RFP to the shortlisted teams, detailing project requirements, scope, and evaluation criteria
- **Proposal Preparation**: Shortlisted teams prepare and submit detailed technical and financial proposals, including design concepts, project schedules, and cost estimates
- Pre-Proposal Meetings: NCDOT may hold pre-proposal meetings to provide clarifications and address questions from the teams

Proposal Evaluation and Selection

- Evaluation of Proposals: NCDOT Technical Review Committee evaluates the proposals based on technical and financial criteria, including design quality, project approach, schedule, and cost
- Interviews and Presentations: Proposing teams may be invited for interviews and presentations to further demonstrate their approach and capabilities
- **Best Value Selection**: NCDOT selects the design-build team that offers the best value using both the technical score of the proposal as well as the bid amount of the project

Award and Contract Execution

- Award: Delegation of Award letter signed by the Secretary of Transportation
- Required Documentation: Contractor submits payment and performance bonds along with other required forms
- Execution: Upon receipt of required documents from the Contractor, the contract is executed

CMGC Procurement Process

Design Procurement and Independent Cost Estimation(ICE)

 Design firm and ICE is procured by the Department following current prequalification and procurement policies

CMGC Procurement

- Prequalification solicitation is advertised though a Request for Letters of Interest(RFLOI)
- Two to Five firms are shortlisted based on responses to RFLOI
- The shortlisted proposers eligible to respond to the CM/GC Request for Qualifications(RFQ)
- Qualified CMGC proposers are ranked based on response to RFQ
- Selection is based on quality without a price component
- CMGC Fixed Markup Percentage submitted by the proposer is opened

Preconstruction Phase(Construction Manager)

- Proposer enters professional services contract for preconstruction activities
- Activities may include design review, risk identification, innovation management, regulatory reviews, cost estimating, quantity verification, cost control, and constructability reviews.

Construction(General Contractor)

- Contractor, Department, and Independent Cost Estimator price construction work
- If Department and Contractor reach agreement on price, a contract is executed following standard practice. If no agreement, Department can off-ramp.
- Construction can be phased in 7as plans develop through series of "work packages"

Progressive Design Build Procurement Process

Independent Cost Estimation(ICE)

 ICE is procured by the Department following current prequalification and procurement policies

PDB Team Procurement

- Prequalification solicitation is advertised though a Request for Letters of Interest(RFLOI)
- Two to Five PDB teams are shortlisted based on responses to RFLOI
- The shortlisted proposers eligible to respond to the PDB Request for Qualifications(RFQ)
- Qualified proposers are ranked based on response to RFQ
- PDB Fixed Markup Percentage proposed by the proposer is opened

Preconstruction Phase

- Winning proposer enters professional services contract for preconstruction activities with activities performed on cost plus basis
- Activities may include design development, constructability reviews, shaping of scope, take-off quantities, cost estimate development, value analysis, schedule development, third party coordination, soliciting subcontractor quotes, acquiring R/W parcels, utility coordination, and rail coordination

Construction

- At design stage identified in professional services contract, the PDB team prepares a construction cost proposal for construction of project
- Proposal includes lump sum cost to complete final design
- Subject to successful negotiation with Department, a contracted is awarded following standard processing lift polygoneans are processed in the processed of the pro




Classroom Theory Performance 2018-19 to 2023-Current




Fleet Readiness Center-East (FRC East)






FRA Project Lifecycle Stages and Corresponding FRA Funding Programs





² This represents the estimated final payment associated with NCDOT payments into the Wetlands Restoration Program (WRP) for mitigation associated with multiple TIPs that were constructed between 1999 and 2008. Significant mitigation amounts were accepted by the WRP and paid by the NCDOT before sufficient data was available related to the actual cost of mitigation and agreements were put in place for cost recovery that would not exceed the actual cost of producing the mitigation. NCDMS and the NCDOT Environmental Analysis Unit (NCDOT-EAU) have reconciled 98 mitigation projects which account for the majority of the mitigation credits (84.6% of the stream credits and 85.8% of the wetland credits) utilized toward these requirements. Both NCDMS and NCDOT-EAU have agreed to end the process of reconciling individual mitigation projects in favor of a final lump sum payment based on NCDMS' calculations to complete all of the remaining projects.

A. Improved Understanding of Dynamically Stable Channels with Mobile Bed and Erodible Banks with Application to Stream Restoration. Restoration of streams with mobile sand-beds is increasingly being implemented with little understanding of sediment mobility and transport. In the sand-bed streams and rivers of the NC Coastal Plain, sediment (sand and silt) is eroded and transported in response to flood discharge; lack of understanding sediment dynamics has resulted and will continue to result in negative impacts of stream supported functions. Understanding sediment dynamics over a range of discharges in these sand-bed systems is critical to designing successful flood mitigation projects.

B. Ecohydrogeomorphically informed egg-laying habitat restoration: using ecology, hydraulics, and geomorphology to improve stream restoration. Aquatic habitat is a primary goal in stream mitigation to support aquatic lifecycles. An important and often overlooked habitat for macro invertebrates is oviposition habitat. DMS supported research to evaluate oviposition and macroinvertibrate abundance and diversity in mitigation sites. Among the findings, researchers found that freguent movement of ovipoition habitat had a negative impact on benthos populations. This work will address oviposition stabilty with respect to stream restoration with the intent to incorporate the results into future stream designs.
