Full Board Work Session

Wednesday, November 6, 2024

Chairman Fox welcomed members of the Board to the in-person meeting located in the Board Room and thanked members for being present to handle the business brought before them. Some of the members attended the Work Session via Microsoft Teams.

Declaration of Quorum

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the Full Board Work Session to order on Wednesday, November 6, 2024.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval - October 2, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from October 2, 2024, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the October 2, 2024, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Rosenburgh and a second by Board Member Daughtry. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Chairman Fox stated if there were no objections from the board, that all highway resolutions would be read and voted on after being read. There were no objections.

Board Member Melvin Mitchell read the resolution for the Commissioner Tony Braswell Bridge naming located in Division 4. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Mitchell and a second by Board Member Clarke. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Merrie Jo Alcoke read the resolution for the Patrolman Paul Williams Bridge naming located in Division 2.

Board Member Melvin Mitchell read the resolution for the Patrolman Isaac T. Moore Bridge naming located in Division4.

Board Member Melvin Mitchell read the resolution for Trooper A. J. Stocks. Bridge naming located in Division 4.

Board Member Grady Hunt read the resolution for the Patrolman J. H. Marshburn Bridge naming located in Division 6.

Chairman Mike Fox read the resolution for Patrolman Jack D. Templeton Bridge naming located in Division 7.

Board Member Tony Lathrop read the resolution for Officer Jackie L. Daniel Bridge naming located in Division 10.

Board Member Tony Lathrop read the resolution for the Trooper Joseph W. Oliver Bridge naming located in Division 10.

Board Member Rosenburgh read the resolution for the Patrolman A. B. Smart Bridge naming located in Division 12.

All eight readings were accepted as a motion by Board Member Rosenburgh and a second by Vice Chair Perkins. The motions passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox opened the floor for Board Members Dirk Cody, Chuck McGrady, Billy Clarke and Meagan Phillips an opportunity to share the impact and effects that Hurricane Helene had on their divisions (11, 13 & 14).

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to give his remarks.

Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Hopkins started off by sharing the good news of the approval to sell the Build Bonds for this fiscal year. He thanked Mark Newsome and his staff for coordinating these efforts with NC Treasurer Folwell to help get the Build Bonds approved.

Secretary Hopkins shared during this time of dealing with Hurricane Helene's impact, he had an opportunity to work alongside Governor Cooper. Secretary Hopkins said it was a pleasure to see Governor Cooper in action as his main concern was to connect with the needs of the people impacted by the storm in Western NC and their needs.

Secretary Hopkins continued to say he would like to thank our many crews and contractors for their continued work with Hurricane Helene repairs. The relationship with all state government: State Highway Patrol, Emergency Management, Public Safety and many other cabinet agencies was essential in helping within the first 30 days. Secretary Hopkins was thankful to the leadership team in Raleigh for their help. He also went on to thank the crews on the ground from Western NC, other parts of North Carolina and from different states for making the difference and need to be celebrated for their efforts.

Secretary Hopkins said there are over 1,000 roads that were previously closed due to the storm and have now been reopened. Secretary Hopkins

said there is still a way to go with nearly 300 roads still closed. It's going to be a longtime, but there needs to be a continuous focus on Western NC to rebuild.

Secretary Hopkins was grateful for the continuous efforts of everyone involved, as well as the patience of North Carolinians as we progress day by day.

Secretary Hopkins thanked the Communications department and Aurea Rodriguez Director of Governance for doing a great job in sharing the information. The one pagers that are being shared by all (including himself) have been beneficial in getting the message out about Western NC. Secretary Hopkins went on to share a video that conveyed the message.

Secretary Hopkins said the amount of work that had been done over the last 41 days was miraculous and he was confident that the right people are in charge to get the job done. Progress is being made daily, roads are being restored and residents are being given hope to heal. Keep the people of Western, NC and those helping with the recovery in your thoughts and prayers. There is a lot of work ahead that needs to be done as the video said, but great teams are working hard to restore access to damage sites and help the region heal.

Secretary Hopkins stated that municipalities have been reminded that they can use Powerbill funds to help cover transportation costs associated with Hurricane Helene recovery. Cities and towns typically use these State Street Aid to resurface local streets and make other needed transportation

improvements. NCDOT distributed half of this year's \$186 million in Powell Bill funds on Sept. 25, to 508 municipalities. Of this year's recipients, 134 municipalities are in the areas of Western North Carolina hit hardest by Helene. A complete list of towns, villages, and cities that qualify for and participate in the Powell Bill program can be found on the NCDOT website.

Secretary Hopkins acknowledged that late last month, Governor Cooper signed Executive Order 323 to ease requirements and fee collections for residents of Western North Carolina in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene. Secretary Hopkins went on to say as a result, the N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles will suspend the collection of various late fees, suspend certain requirements for both residents and businesses, and extend certain licenses for mechanics and businesses. Secretary Hopkins noted, if residents have already paid their fees or late fees that have been waived as outlined on our website, they will receive a full refund in four to six weeks. For a list of fees and late fees being waived, visit ncdot.gov/DMVHelene.

Secretary Hopkins gave a reminder about the ongoing technical training series. There are two more dates in the month of November, all focused on surveyors and haulers. One training session was held in Wilmington on November 6th. The other two dates are November 13th in Cary and November 20th in Statesville.

Secretary Hopkins added that two prequalification workshops were held in late October for firms interested in helping with Hurricane Helene recovery efforts. All six sessions were completely full for the two-day event in Asheville. He noted there is one more prequalification workshop scheduled

for November 14th in Rocky Mount. This event will be held at Nash Community College from 1-4 p.m.

Lastly, Secretary Hopkins shared that Alpesh Patel has rejoined our NCDOT team as the Transportation Planning Director. Alpesh Patel has nearly 29 years of leadership experience in public and private transportation, Alpesh brings a wealth of expertise in long-range planning, programming, policy development, and data analytics. In his new role, Alpesh will oversee our transportation planning initiatives, assist in leading efforts to enhance our strategic planning capabilities, and strengthen our client relationships. Congratulate Alpesh and welcome him back to our NCDOT team.

This policy, adopted in compliance with N.C. Gen. Stat.§ 143B-350(k), guides the actions of all members of the Board of Transportation and the Secretary of Transportation.

The undersigned Secretary of Transportation hereby extends these policies to apply to all officers and employees of the Department of Transportation.

This policy is designed to supplement and incorporate elements of but in no way supersedes the Ethics Act or other applicable laws and regulations.

Conflicts of Interest

Defined: A conflict of interest exists when the use of a board member's, officer's or employee's position, or any official action taken by the board member, officer, or employee, would result in financial benefit, direct or indirect, to the Board member, officer or employee, a member of the Board member's, officer's or employee's immediate family, or an individual with whom, or business with which, the Board member, officer, or employee is associated.

An appearance of a conflict of interest exists when a reasonable person would conclude from the circumstances that the Board member's, officer's or employee's ability to protect the public interest, or perform public duties, would be compromised by personal interest, even in the absence of an actual conflict of interest.

Disclosure and Recusal: Any member of the Board, officer, or employee of the NCDOT who identifies a conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest shall disclose the same in writing to the Board or through appropriate management channels to the Secretary of Transportation and shall not participate in any discussion, deliberation, vote, or other approval related to the conflict of interest. Specific instances in which conflicts of interest arise include, but are not limited to, the execution of contracts, the sale of real and personal property to the Department, secondary employment opportunities, and future employment opportunities. Specific prohibitions are listed below.

Contracts: Board members, officers, and employees are prohibited from drafting, negotiating, administering, accepting or approving any contract in which the Department is a party from which the Board member, officer, employee, or a family member thereof may personally benefit.

Sale of Property: Board members, officers, and employees and their family members are prohibited from the sale of real or personal property to the Department of Transportation.

Secondary Employment: No officer or employee shall accept employment or render services for any private or public interest when that employment or service conflicts with the discharge of his or her official duties or when that employment may tend to impair his or her objectivity or independence of judgement in the performance of such duties or induce them to disclose confidential or any information gained through their State duties.

Restrictions on Future Employment: Officers and employees may not accept any employment or contractual relationship with any business entity in connection with any contract that they participated in any of the following activities:

NC Department of Transportation Ethics Policy

- 1. Drafting the contract.
- 2. Defining the scope of the contract.
- 3. Selection of the business entity for services.
- 4. Negotiation of the cost of the contract.
- 5. Administration of the contract.

This section is not intended to prohibit employment with a business entity if the employment is on work other than the specific contract with which they were involved. An exception to this policy may be granted when approved by the Secretary of Transportation and the General Counsel.

Use of Information: No Board Member, officer, or employee shall, directly or indirectly, use, disclose, or allow the use of official information which was obtained through or in connection with his or her official duties and which has not been made available to the general public for the purpose of furthering the private interest or personal profit of any business entity or person, including the employee.

Gifts

Gifts Prohibited: Board members, officers and employees of the Department of Transportation are prohibited from soliciting or accepting, directly or indirectly, gifts from the following:

- 1. Lobbyists
- 2. Lobbyists Principals
- 3. Any individual or business entity that:
 - a. is doing or is seeking to do business of any kind with the Department;
 - b. is engaged in activities that are regulated or controlled by the Department; or
 - c. has financial interests that may be substantially and materially affected, in a manner distinguishable from the public generally, by the performance or non-performance of the Board member's, officer's, or employee's official duties.

Exceptions: exceptions to the gift ban enumerated in G.S. 138A-32(f) and (g) are hereby incorporated.

Under no circumstances may a board member, officer, and employee knowingly, directly or indirectly, ask, accept, demand, exact, solicit, seek, assign, receive, or agree to receive a gift for themselves, or for another person, in return for being influenced in the discharge of their official responsibilities and duties.

Charitable Solicitations

Board members, officers, and employees are prohibited from soliciting anything of monetary value from subordinate employees with the exception of generic written solicitations to all members of a class of subordinates or service as the honorary head of the State Employees Combined Campaign.

Administration of Ethics Policy:

Distribution and Education: The Ethics Policy shall be distributed to all new board members, officers, and employees, shall be covered during the required annual ethics training for board members, be included in biennial training for officers and employees, and shall be posted and available on the Department's website.

Consultation: Board members and officers shall consult with the Department's ethics liaison regarding any questions about the applicability or interpretation of the Ethics Policy. Employees shall consult with the Division of Human Resources staff with questions related to this policy.

Enforcement: Board members, officers, and employees who are subject to the Ethics Act and who violate the Ethics Policy may be subject to removal or termination by their appointing authority in accordance with G.S. § 138A-45. Officers and employees are not subject to the Ethics Act and who violate the Ethics Policy may be subject to discipline, up to and including termination of employment.

Multi-Modal Committee

The Multi-Modal committee heard one presentation.

1. Becca Gallas, Aviation Director, NCDOT Division of Aviation Helene Response

Becca discussed how the Division of Aviation worked with airports and partners to manage the unprecedented increase of air traffic into the western North Carolina in response to Helene. She spoke on how the Division coordinated to ensure safe air operations, the evolution of the communication strategy and how the Division supported other areas of NCDOT with aerial imaging of damaged infrastructure.

- Coordinating Air Operations Safety
 - During the first week of Helene response, aircraft from the National Guard, emergency management partners and private air drop groups surged into western North Carolina
 - Asheville, the largest airport in the region, experienced a 300% surge in operations (which are take offs and landings) to over 1,000 operations in a day at the peak.
 - Smaller airports that typically see less than 10 operations in a day handled hundreds of operations each a day during the first week of Helene, with the biggest jump being a 3400% increase at Jackson County Airport.
 - General Aviation airports faced unique challenges as most do not have air traffic control towers, have limited fuel capacity

- and apron space, and are often staffed with 1-3 staff or staffed by volunteers.
- The Division of Aviation worked in their role on the AirSERT (Air State Emergency Response Team) to negotiate and implement safety strategies that allowed all partners to operate in the region, without shutting down air access to private relief groups.
- In addition, for the first time, Division of Aviation utilized the Division of Highways model of staff mobilization to move staff from unaffected airports into western NC airports in order to support airports increased operations and relieve staff.

Evolving Communication Strategy

- Within the first two days of Helene response, the Division saw an unmet need to centralize and communicate out information from the diverse aviation partners in the region to ensure pilots had accurate and complete information to safely operate.
- The Division launched an campaign across it's social media channels and traditional media to share best practices for air drop groups, educate pilots on areas of high National Guard aircraft operations and sharing positive stories about the critical role airports and the aviation industry was playing in Helene response.
- The effort culminated in the launch of a dedicated Pilot Coordination page with up to date and complete information from across the FAA, National Guard, airports, and emergency management partners.

Aerial Imagery

- The Division of Aviation supports other areas of NCDOT in aerial imaging through both manned aircraft and drones.
- In Helene response, weather challenges and the magnitude of the impact area to be imaged resulted in the Division engaging in new partnerships with the Civil Air Patrol and NOAA in order to augment the Division's ability to provide robust aerial response.

- In total, the photogrammetry aircraft flew and imaged 1.6 million acres and drone crews captured another 6,000 images at site specific locations.
- The Division of Aviation is continuing to operate both drones and the photogrammetry aircraft in the region to provide images of recovery efforts.

Other Business/Closing Comments

Chairman Fox took a moment to remind everyone that the next meeting of the Board of Transportation will be December 4th - 5th in Raleigh at the Highway Building. The Governance Office will be sending out the hotel survey in the next week.

Chairman Fox noted that the 2025 Board meeting dates had been finalized. Also, 2025 travel trips are being considered. If you are interested in hosting a travel trip to your division please reach out to Aurea Rodriguez, Director of the Governance Office to prepare a proposal.

Chairman Fox reminded everyone that the holiday dinner is scheduled for December 4th and the cost is \$125 per person. If you plan to attend, please submit your payment to the Governance office as soon as possible. Also, the Coffee Fund needs to replenished. Please make your checks payable to the NCDOT Coffee Fund.

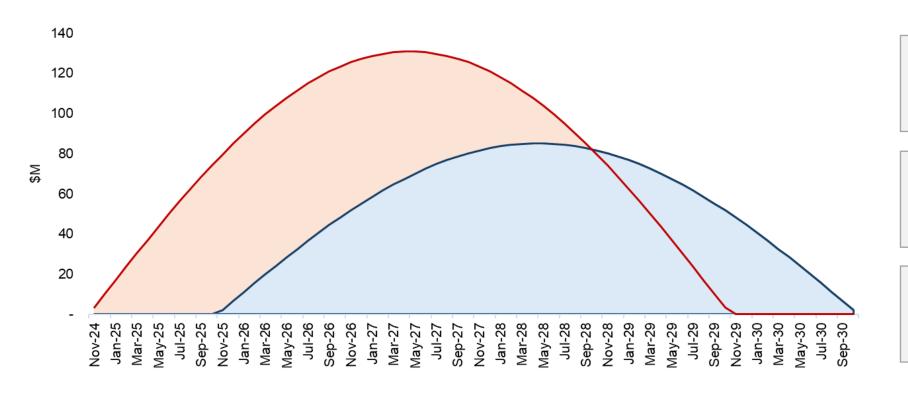








Hurricane Helene Recovery Dashboard | Monthly Forecast

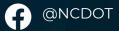

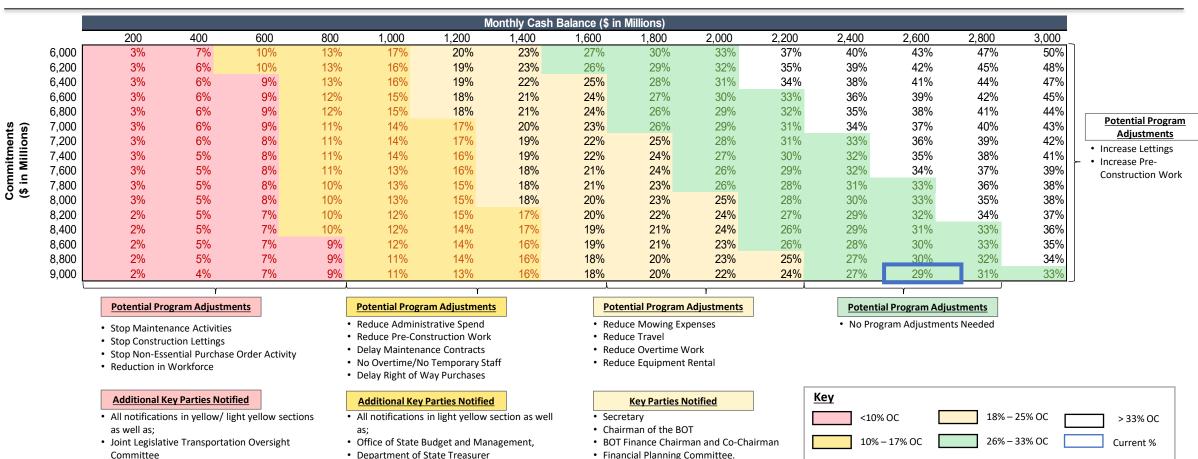

Monthly Ending Cash as a % of Commitments

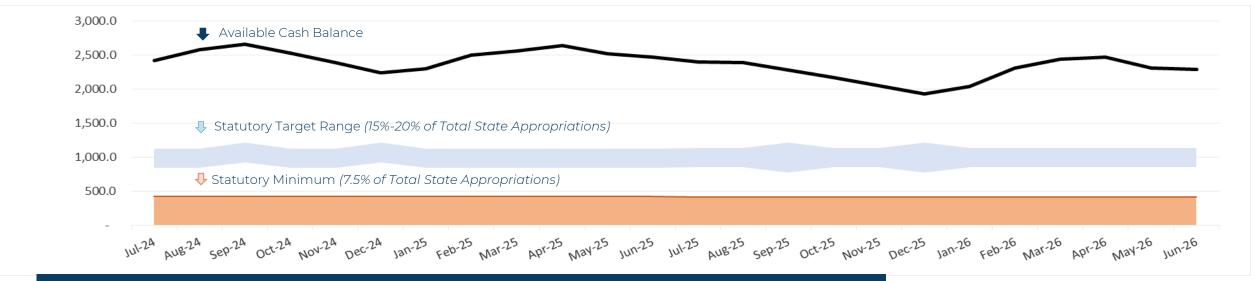

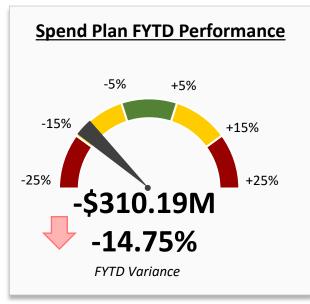


Revenues and Other Receipts Commentary

- September revenues and other receipts are 16.4% or \$101.3M above forecast in the Original Spend Plan; largely due to FHWA and Sales Tax receipts.
- License and Fees are forecasted to increase compared to prior year due to the quadrennial fee adjustment effective July 1st. NCDOT continues to assess revenue impacts due to hurricane Helene and the Executive Order in place.
- The Original Spend Plan is forecasting Sales Tax transfers on a quarterly basis; this will adjust to monthly in Spend Plan Amendment One.
- HF and HTF revenues show YOY growth;6.0% and 1.0%, respectively.

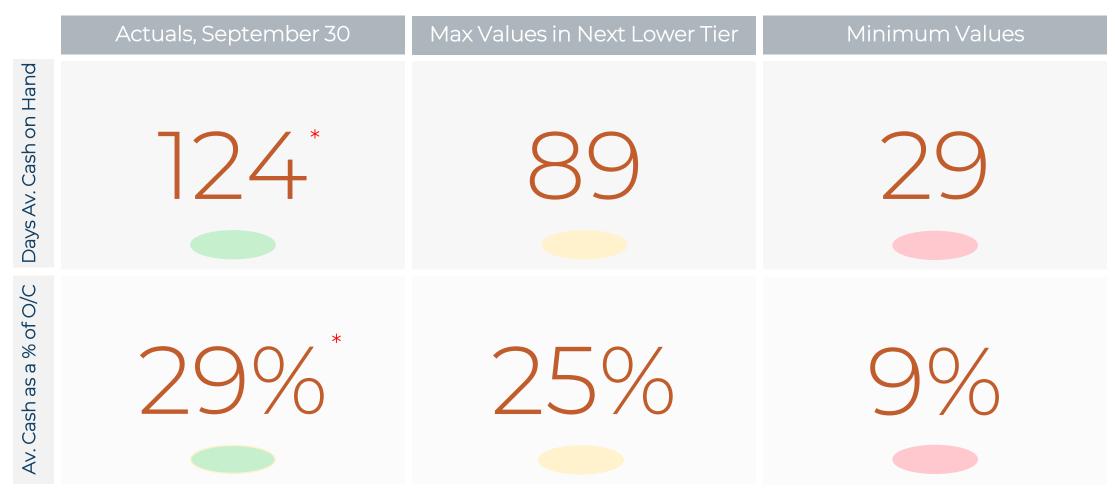

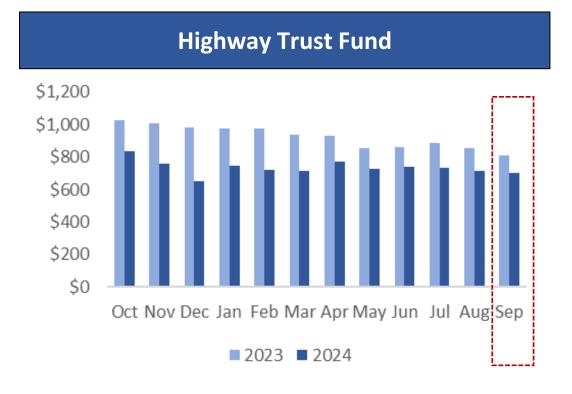

HTF cash balance decreased by \$108.9M or 13.4% from September 2023 to September 2024.

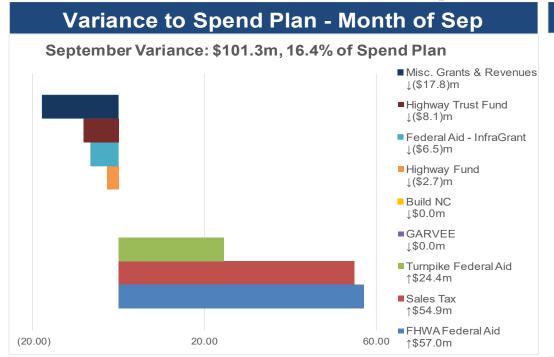

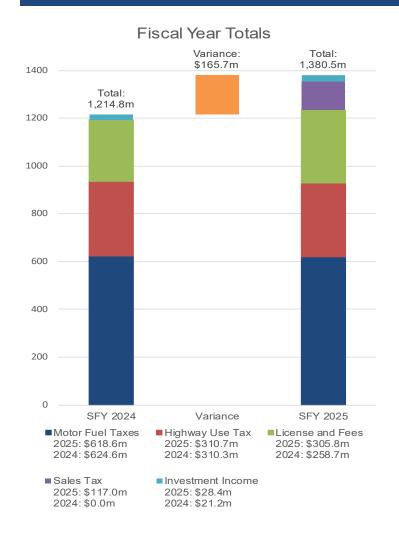

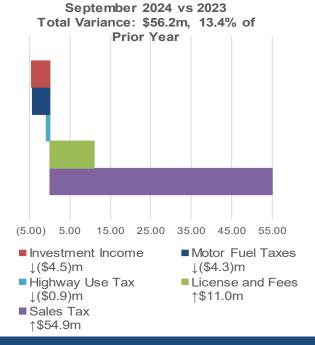

State Revenues by Source - Highway Fund & Trust Fund - Sep 2024(\$M)





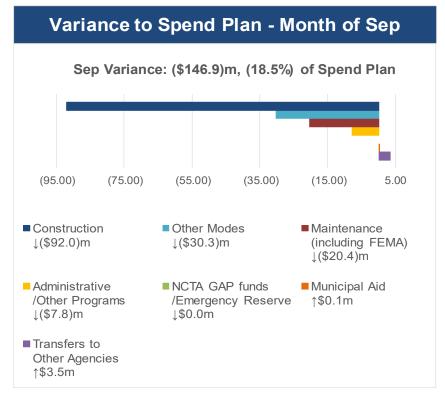

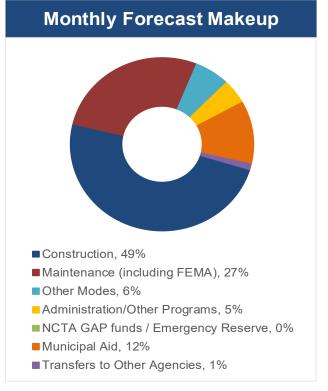

Overall Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

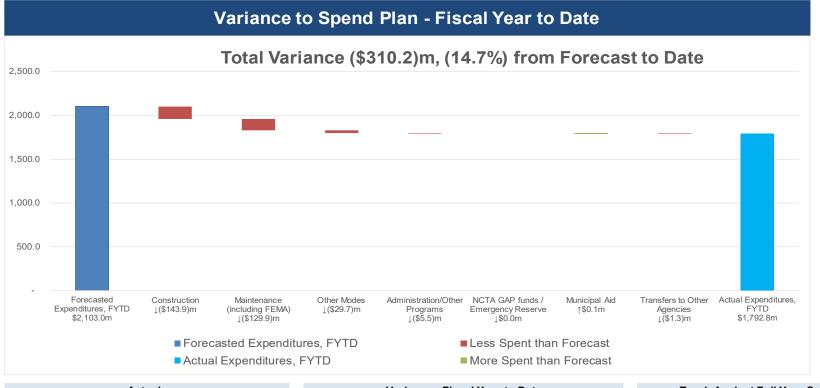

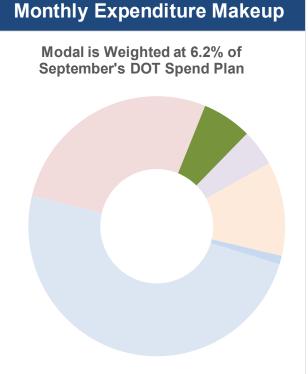

Modal Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)



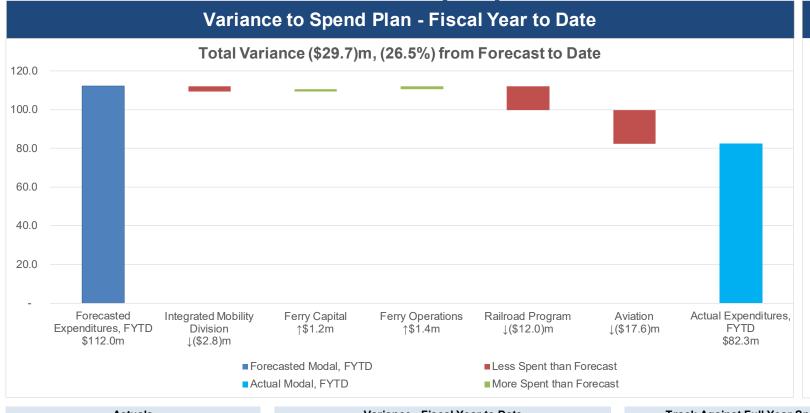

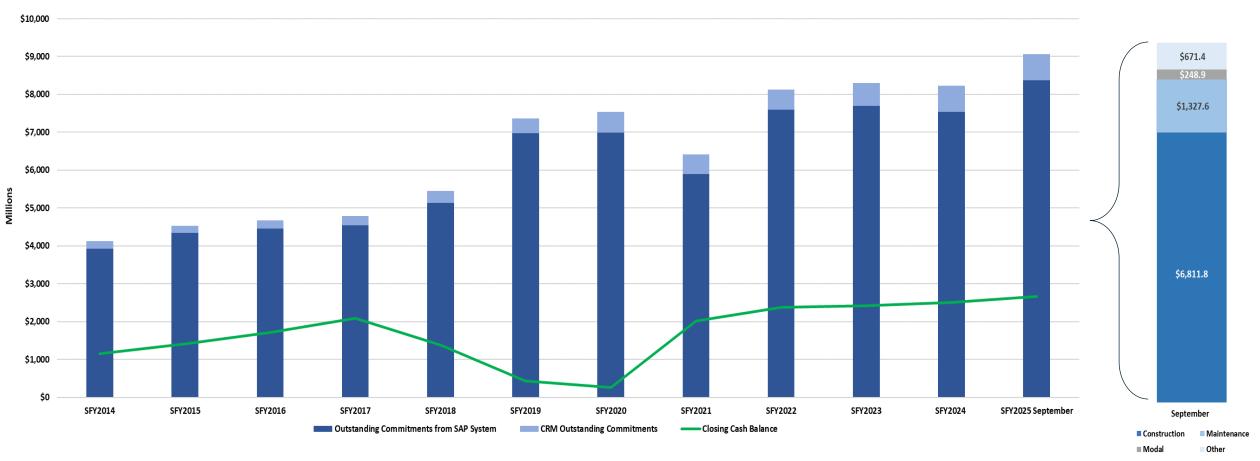
Modal Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – FYTD (\$M)

NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Available Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

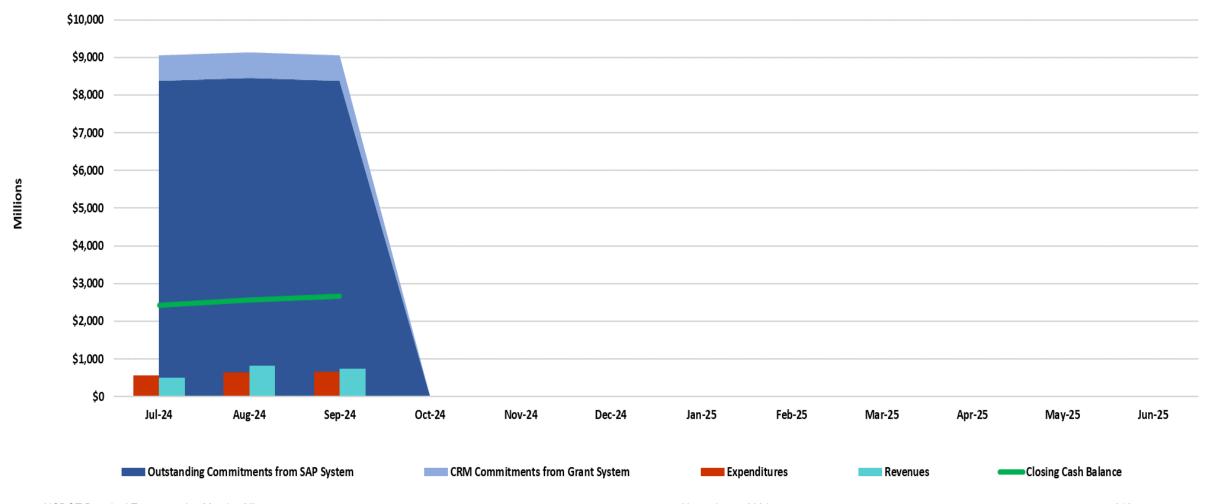

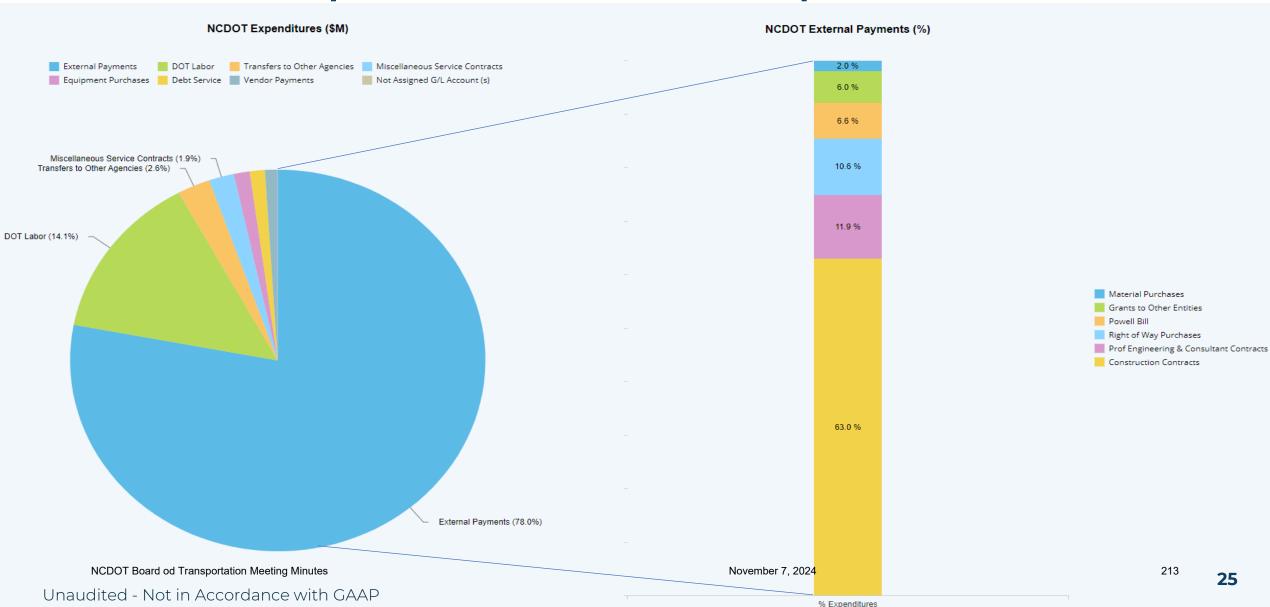

NCDOT Expenditures SFY2025 as of September 30, 2024



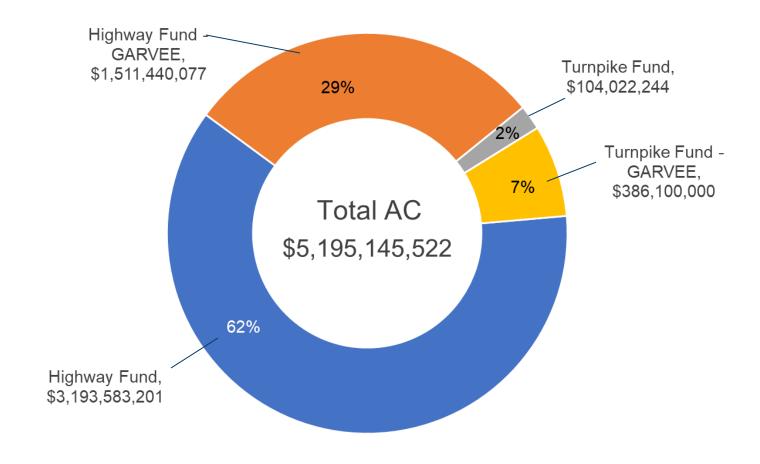

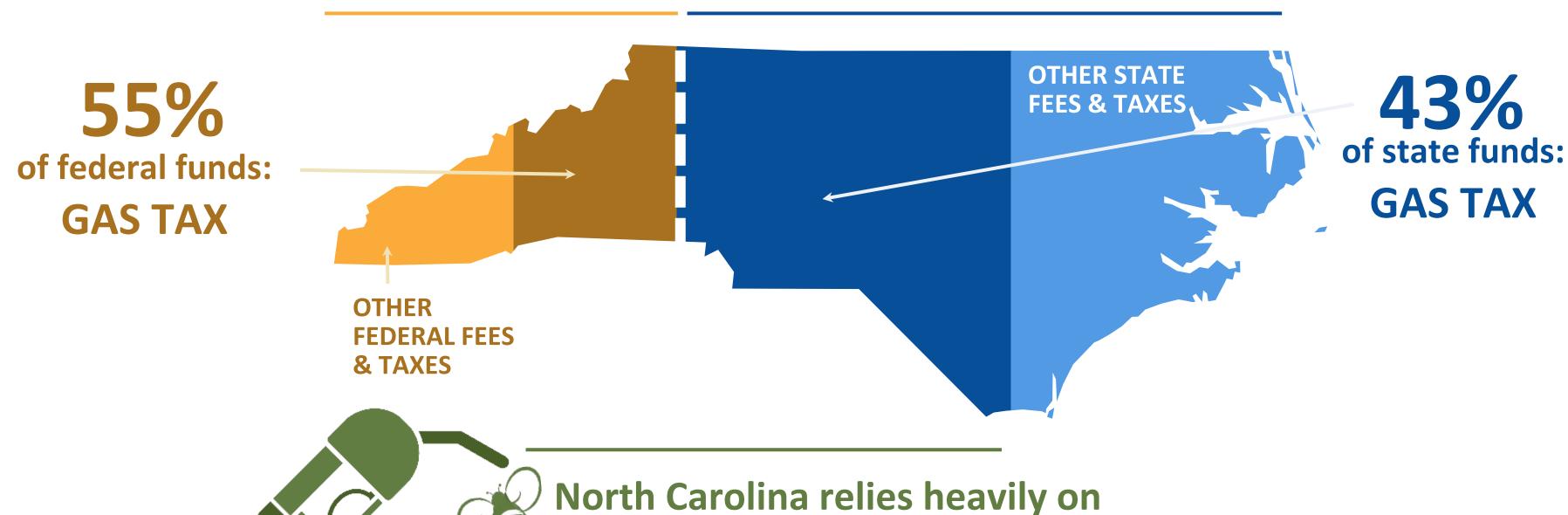

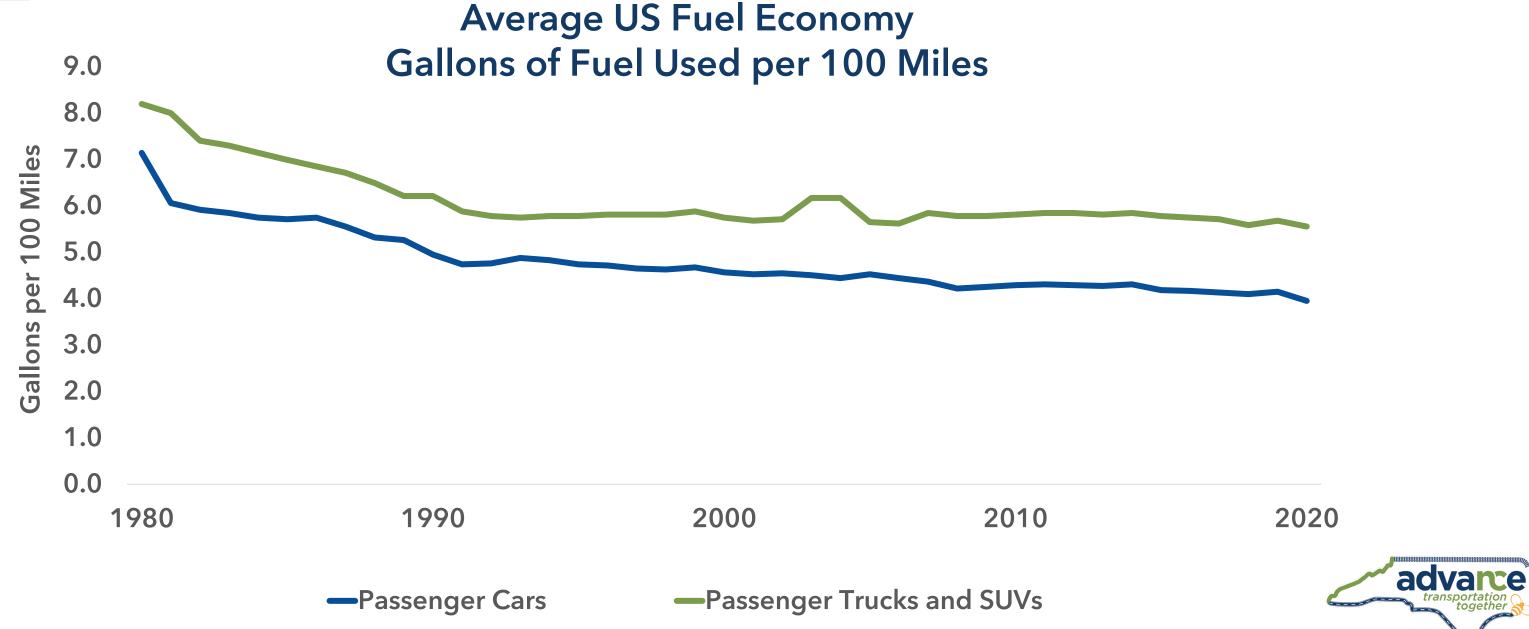

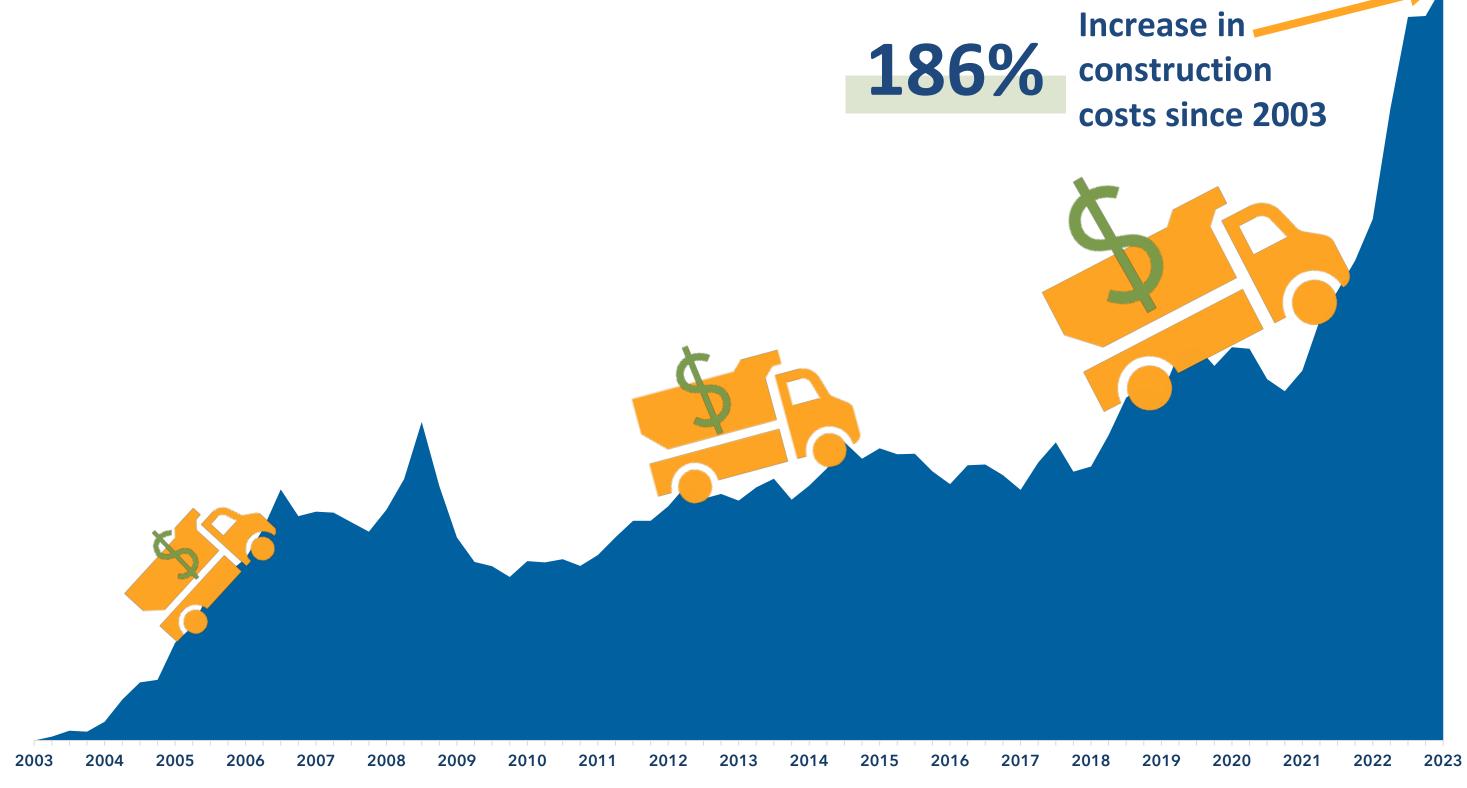

What is August Redistribution?

FHWA redistributes unused obligation authority (OA) from federal programs that won't use their OA for that federal fiscal year to states that can use it

- Occurs each summer
- Think of OA as permission to spend federal funding

Each July, NCDOT submits a request for add'l OA we can use by Sept. 30th

By Aug. 30th, FHWA notifies each state how much add'l OA they'll receive.

Key to a larger request is to obligate as much federal funding in each of the different federal funding categories as possible

• Biggest challenge is authorizing funds in categories with Locally Administered Projects

Where does additional Obligation Authority (new funding) go?

- Must be obligated by September 30th
- Subject to STI funding distribution
- Typically goes for expenses previously paid with state funds on federal projects that have been authorized using Advance Construction (AC)
- This "conversion" reimburses NCDOT with federal funds

FHWA Process for Computing August Redistribution

- Dictated by law
- Designed to give an advantage to states that have not done as well in previous rounds of August redistribution
- Guided by an initial "fair share" that is calculated for each state
- Initial "fair share" = state 's unobligated balance of apportioned contract authority
 nation 's unobligated balance of apportioned contract authority

• States that have done well in August redistribution in past years have lower unobligated balances because the additional obligation authority they received allowed them to obligate additional funds and drive down their unobligated balances.

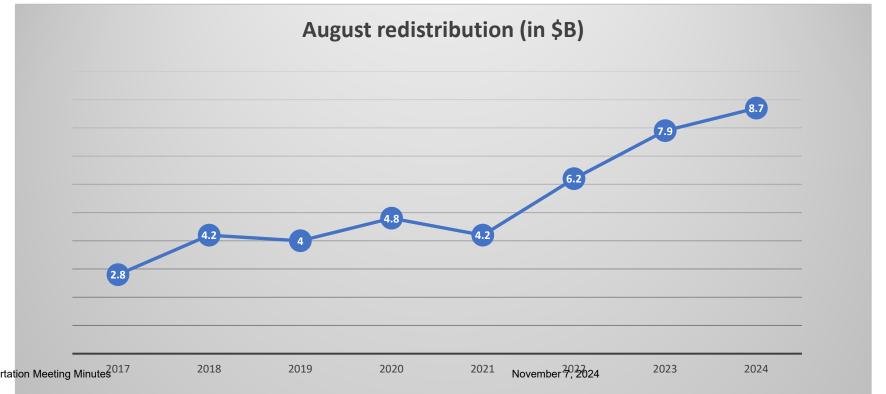
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The Future of August redistribution

Primary reason that August redistribution levels have grown so large is allocated programs (like grant funding) are slow-spending. As a result, these programs are returning large amounts of obligation authority each year



The Future of August redistribution

AASHTO has proposed a change to August redistribution that would lower August redistribution amounts in the future

- The Senate Appropriations Committee has included this proposal in their FY 2025 budget bill
- Proposal would assign 4-year obligation limitation to all allocated Highway Trust funds programs. Therefore, the obligation authority for slow-spending grant programs would no longer be redistributed if unused at the end of the year.
- US DOT estimates this change would gradually drop August redistribution amounts from the current \$8.7 B to \$2.5 B in FY 2027, while correspondingly increasing the amount of initial obligation authority distributed to the states at the beginning of the fiscal year.

Construction Delivery Methods

Design-Bid-Build (DBB)

- Description: Traditional method where the project is designed fully before bidding.
 - **Design Phase**: NCDOT completes design of the project.
 - Bidding Phase: Contractors bid on the completed design.
 - Construction Phase: The selected contractor constructs the project.

Design-Build (DB)

- Description: Integrates design and construction under one contract.
 - **Single Contract**: One entity is responsible for both design and construction.
 - Concurrent Phases: Design and construction phases can overlap.

Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC)

- Description: Two phases of contracting with contractor input through design development
 - Design Phase: Department procures designer
 - **Early Involvement**: CM/GC is involved during the design phase.
 - Advisory Role: Provides input on constructability, cost, schedule, etc...
 - **General Contracting**: Opportunity to move to construction management

Progressive Design-Build (PDB)

- Description: Integrates design and construction with preconstruction and construction phased contracts
- Process:
 - **Design Phase:** Designer is part of the PDB Team.
 - **Early Collaboration**: Design-builder engaged early, before design is complete.
 - **Progressive Phases**: Design and construction progress in phases.
 - Open Book: Cost and scope defined progressively.

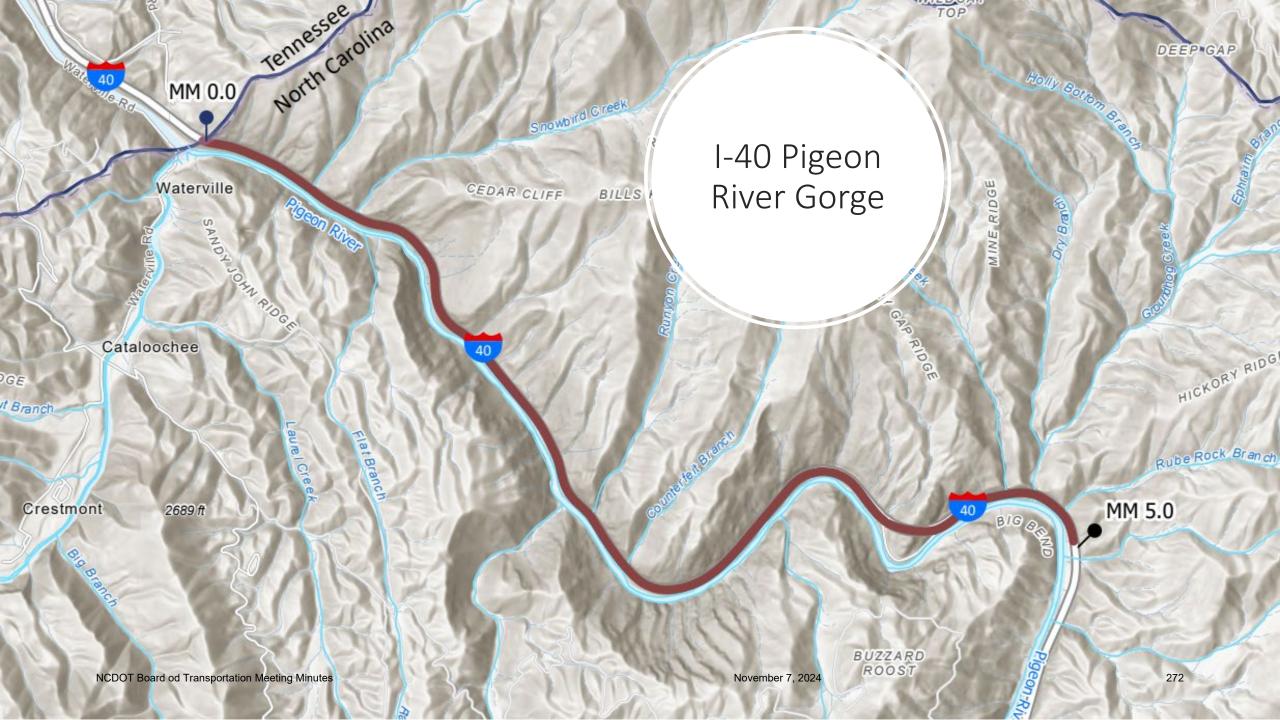

PROCUREMENT METHODS AUTHORIZED IN DISASTER AREAS

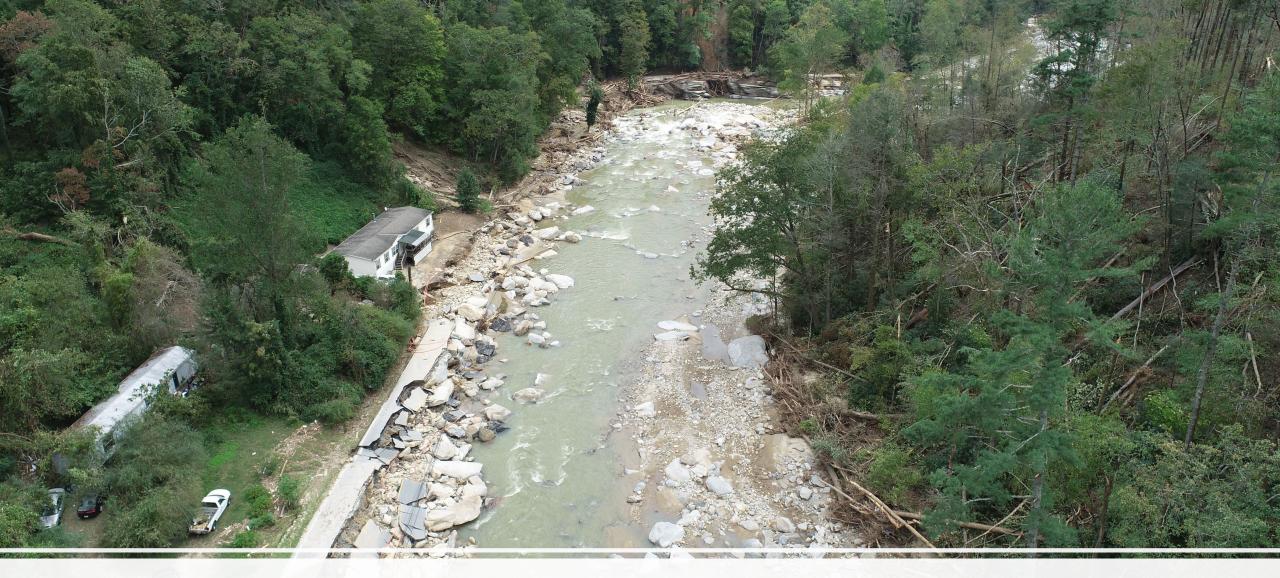

DMV License & Theft Bureau Updates

Helene Support Key Tasks

<u>Background.</u> The NC License and Theft Bureau has been providing law enforcement relief efforts in the western part of the state since the occurrence of Helene.

- License and Theft Bureau members have been tasked with assisting local law enforcement agencies
- On September 24, 2024, the State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated to provide twenty-four (24) hour coverage
- The License and Theft Bureau has provided staffing to respond to and coordinate emergency response efforts since the beginning of EOC operations.
- Since September 27, 2024, the License and Theft Bureau has deployed law enforcement personnel to assist with nineteen (19) operational areas of need

Operational Overview

Situation

- L&T currently has 25 members deployed and, in the field, assigned to 1 of 3 different missions.
- Of the 3 missions being supported by L&T, 2 require continual support.
- 20 members (10 each assignment) are rotated out every 5-days.
- Total of 121 officers have been deployed to WNC to assist with emergency operations.
- Of the 121 law enforcement officers deployed to WNC, 83 have deployed more than once.
- An additional 10 members have worked in rotation to provide 24hr coverage for EOC operations.

Future

 The Bureau anticipates sending 5 more members to support another law enforcement mission on/about November 1, 2024.

 - Meeting held with NCDOT Fiscal and State Treasurer's office for awareness and temporary measures put in place.
 - Banking issues are now minimal as banks reopened and were able to process the deposits in a timely manner.

- Marshall tentative opening first week of December.
- Bank closures and late deposits are minimal.
- Inventory delivery delayed due to road conditions.
- STARS conducting programming changes ISO Executive Order.
- Broadcast Message issued October 28, 2024, for LPAs to allow temporary process for relief until programming complete.

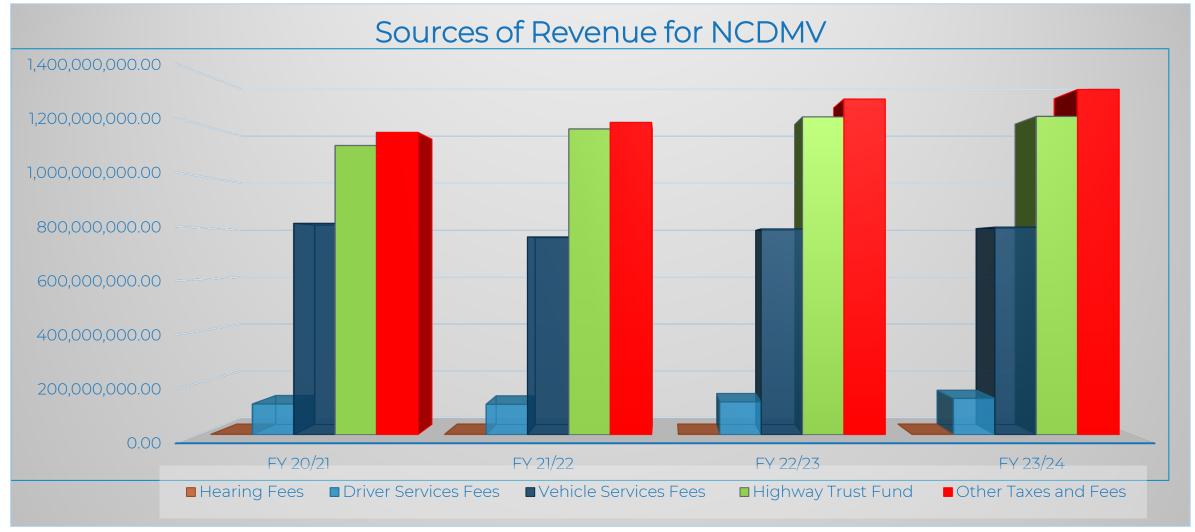

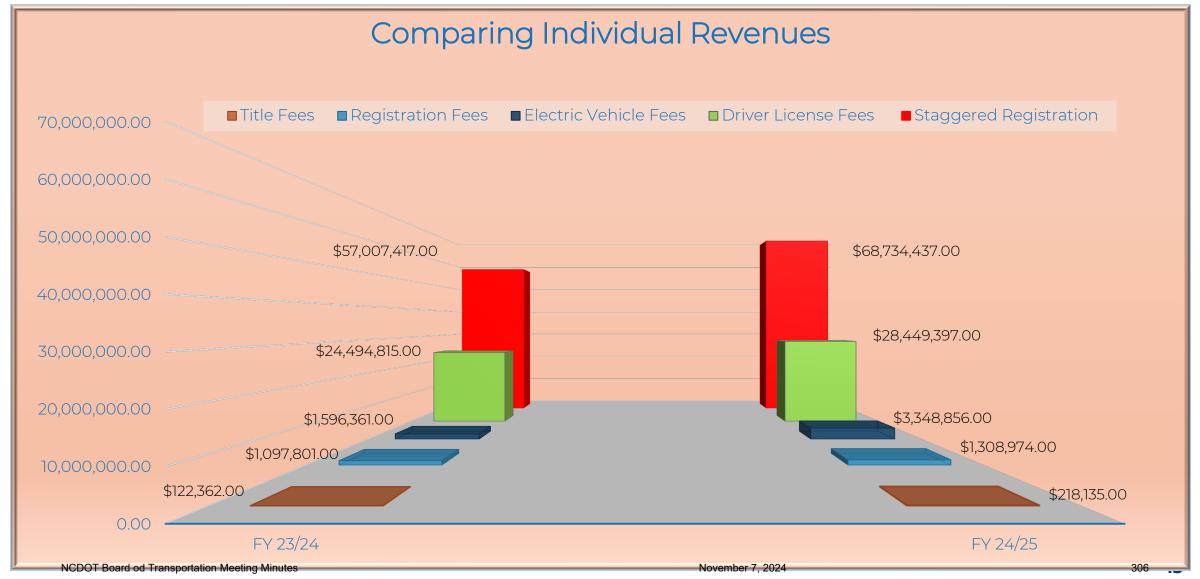

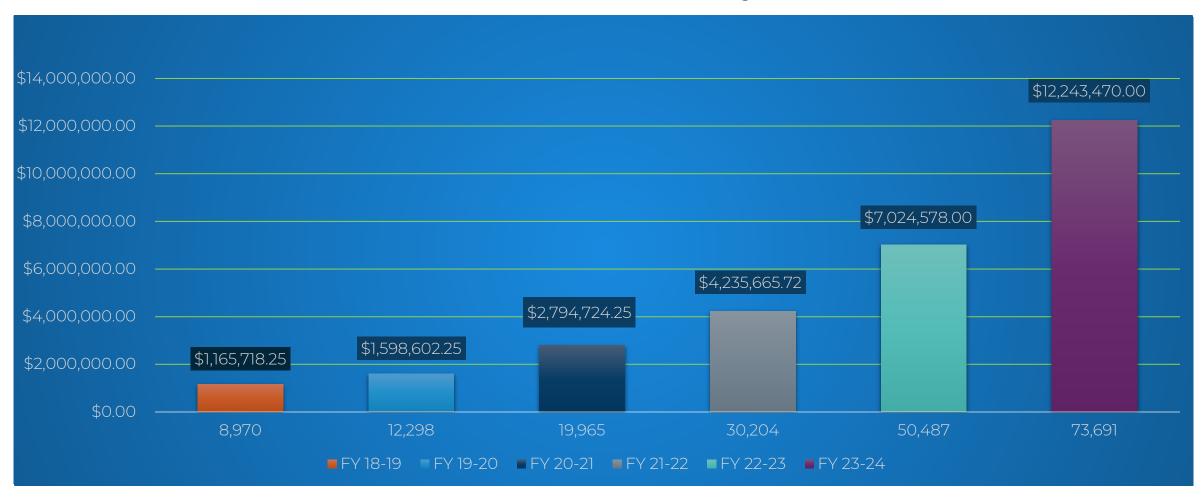

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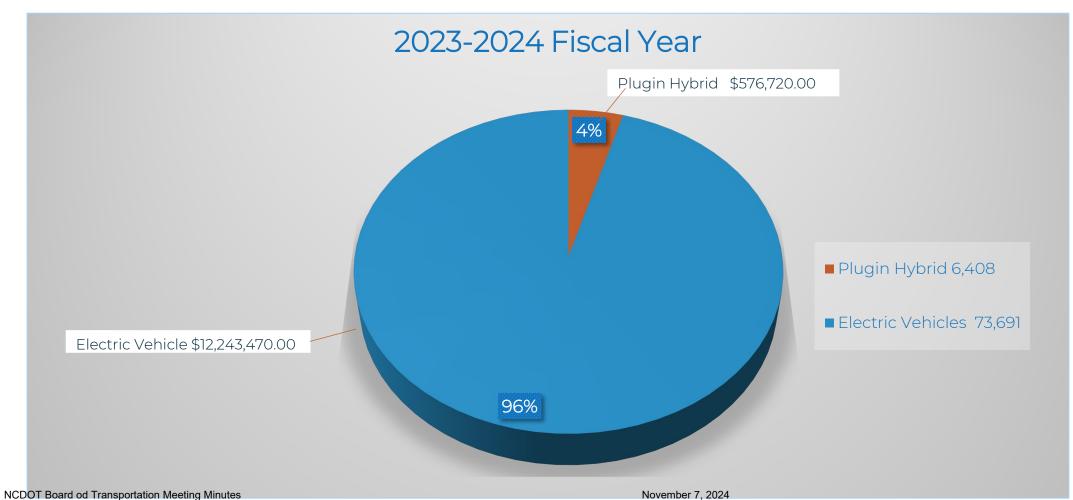
Electric Vehicle Fee Collected By Fiscal Years

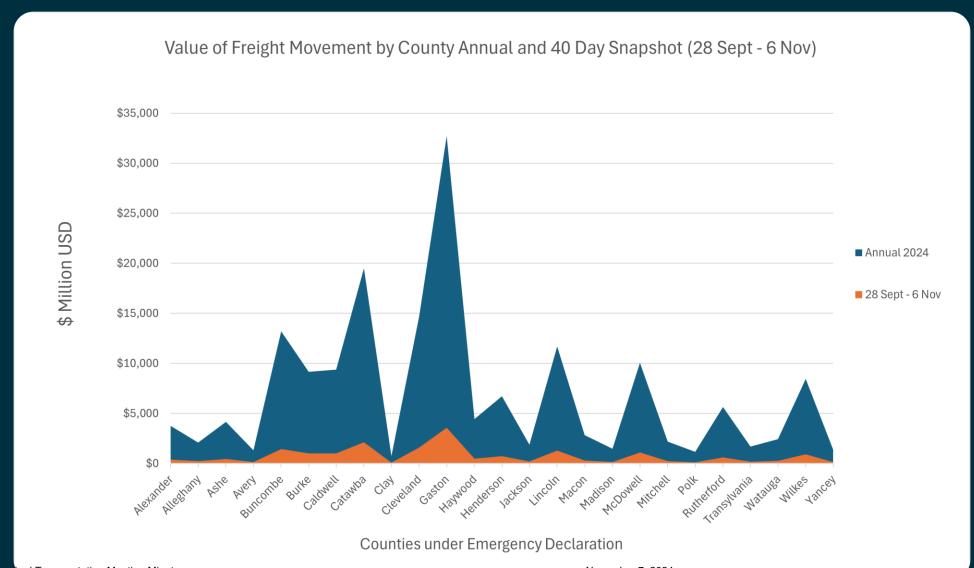

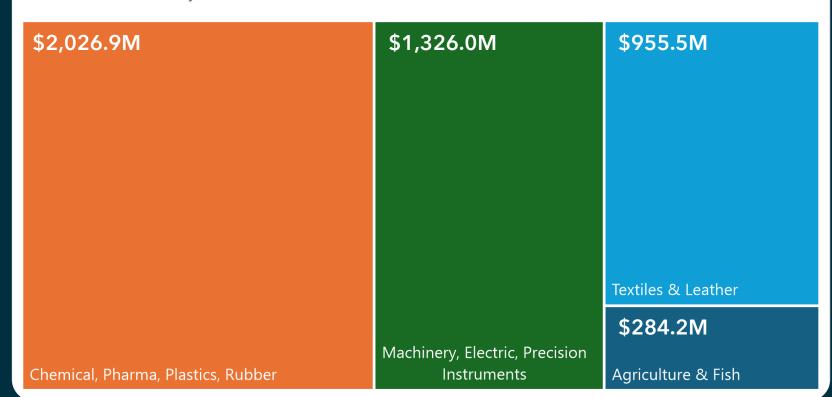

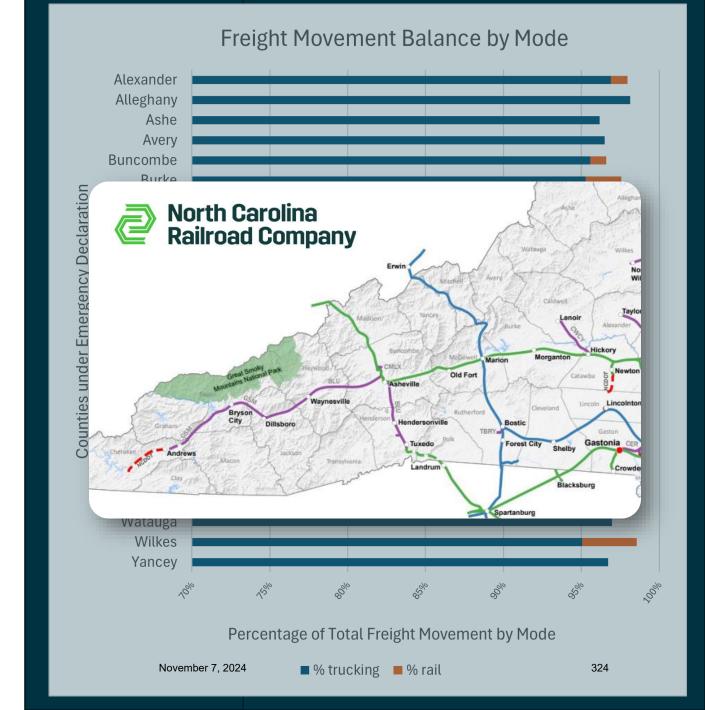

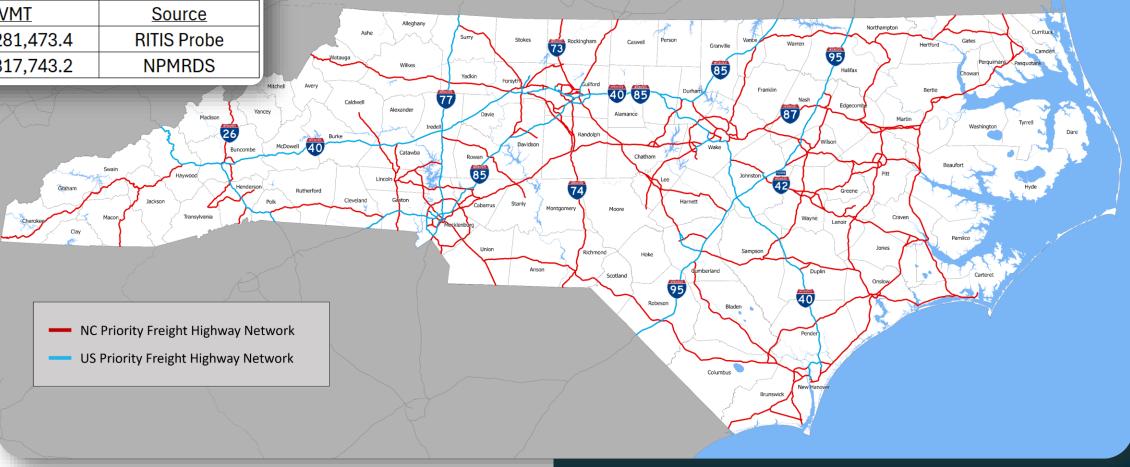

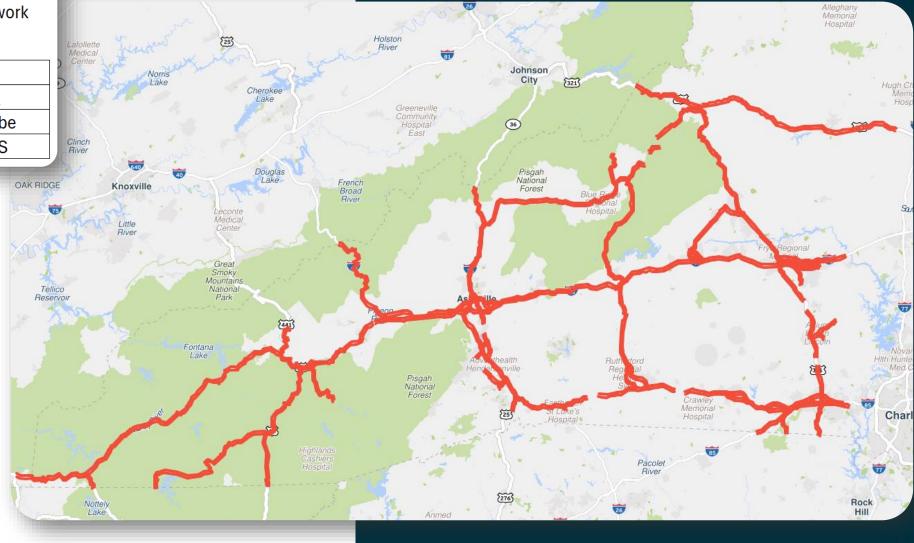

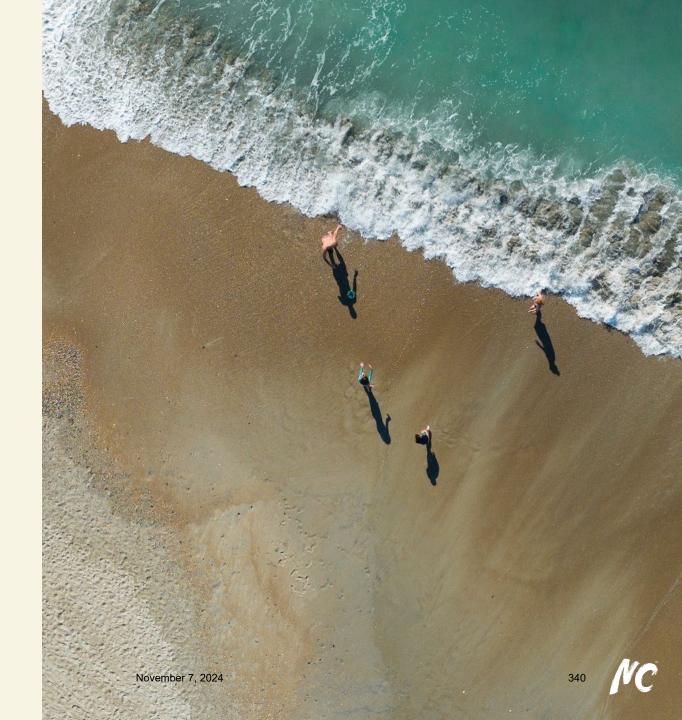

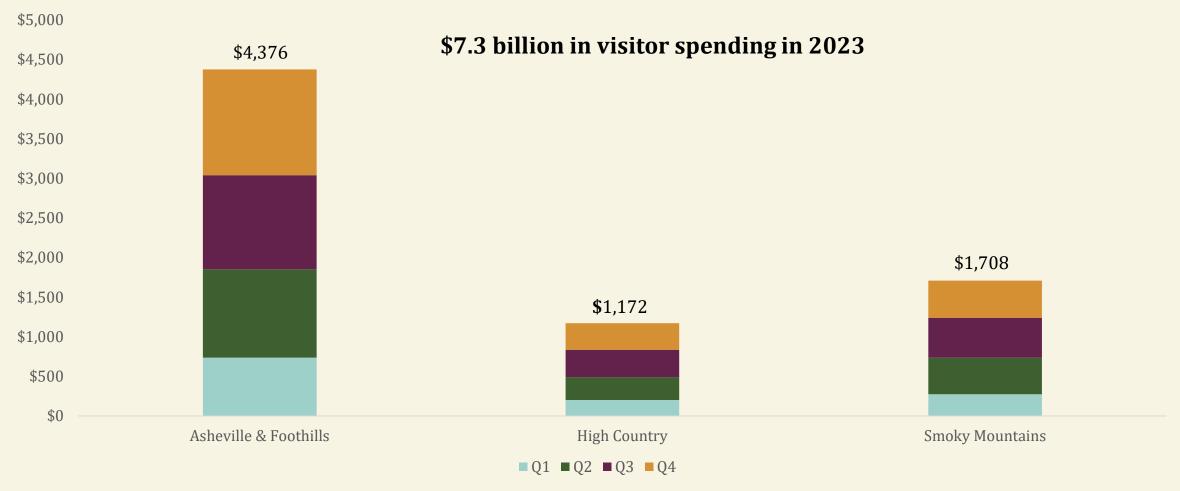


HISTORICAL VISITOR SPENDING IN NORTH CAROLINA

QUARTERLY SHARE OF VISITOR SPENDING

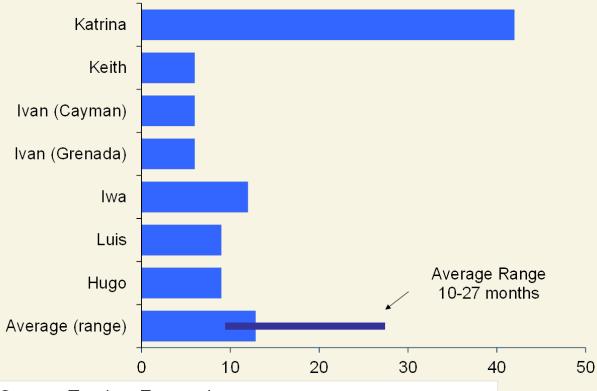

Months after initial disruption for visitor spending to return to baseline

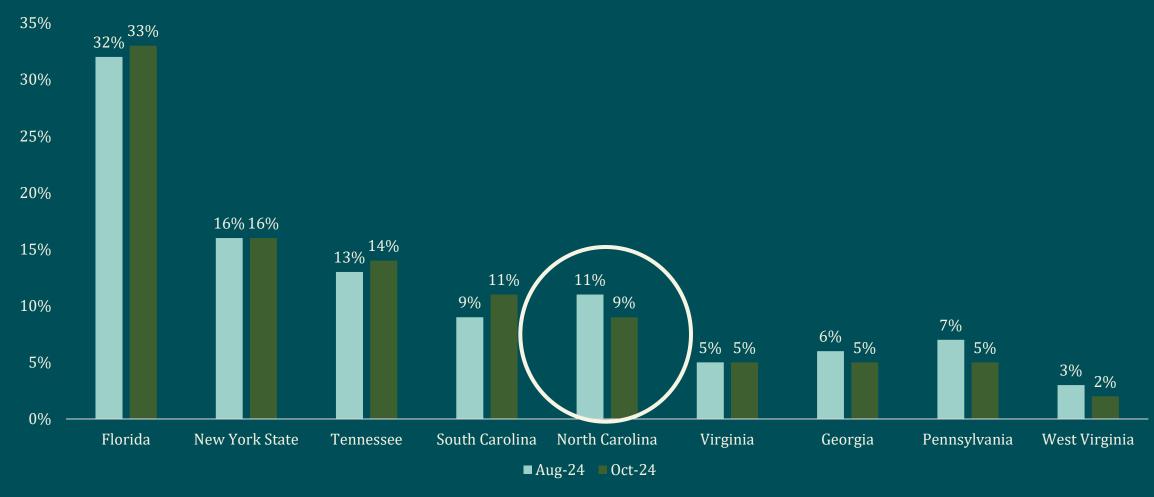

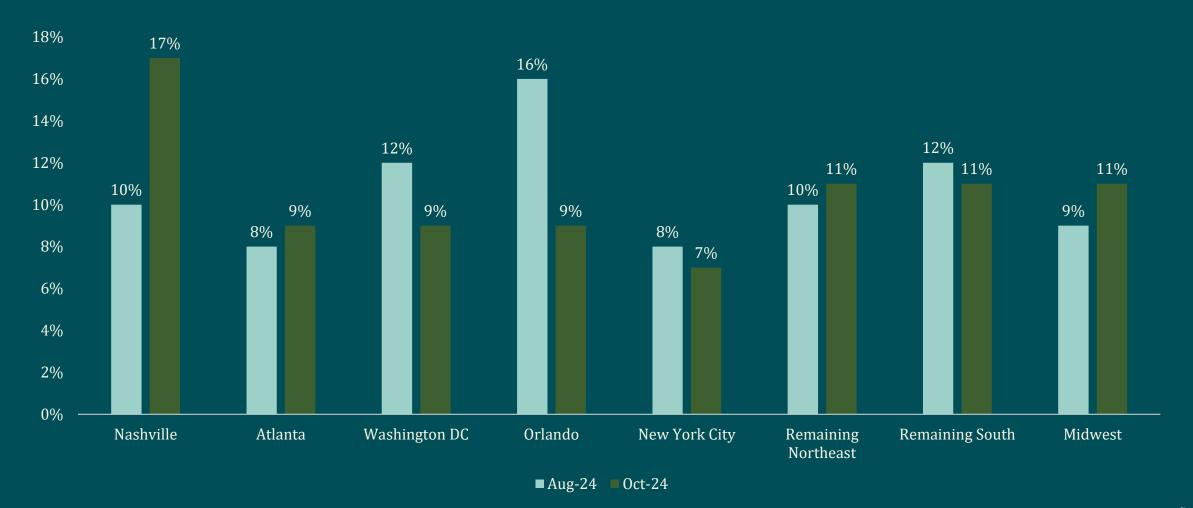

CHANGE IN PREFERRED DESTINATION



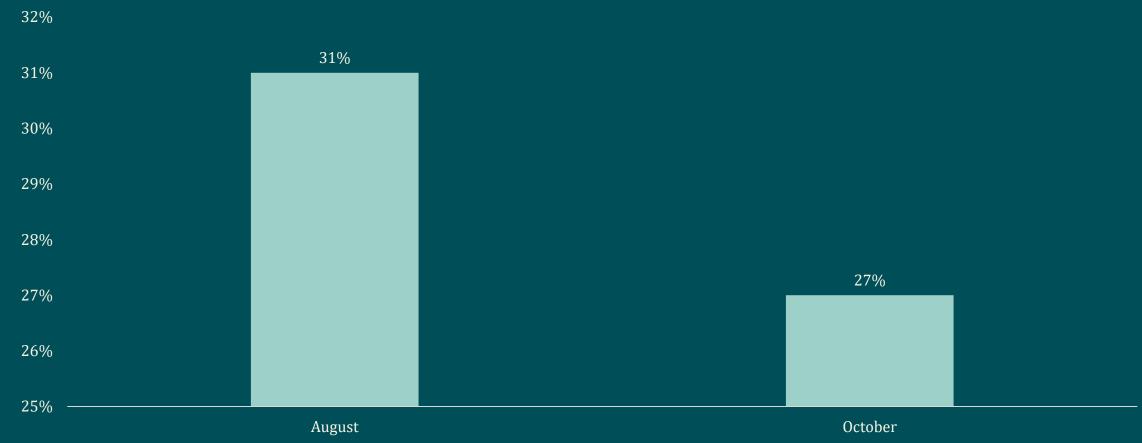


CHANGE IN PREFERRED DESTINATION BY MARKET



CHANGE IN LIKELIHOOD TO VISIT



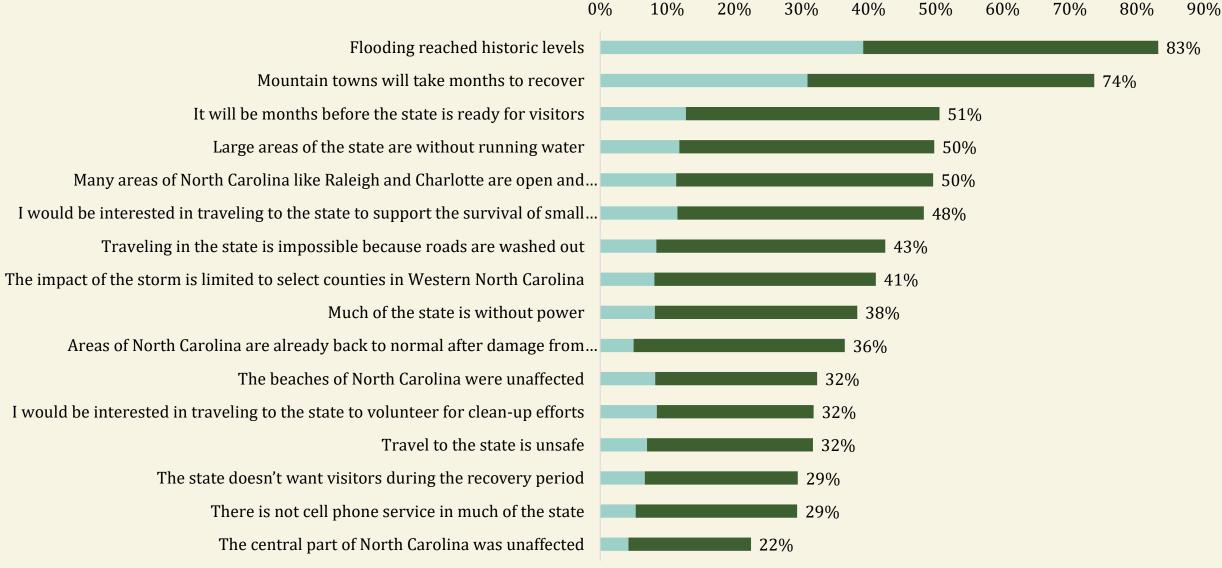




CHANGE IN LIKELIHOOD TO VISIT DESTINATION BY MARKET

Construction Inspection & Staffing

Staffing for Construction Projects

- NCDOT is responsible for inspection of work performed by contractors on construction projects statewide. On average, NCDOT has approximately 760 active construction projects, valued at ~ \$13B.
- The Division must staff projects taking into account following factors:
 - Size and Type of Project, including number of operations that will be ongoing daily throughout life of project
 - Complexity and Criticality of Operations
 - Time of work daytime/nighttime/both
 - Contractor start date
 - Length of project
 - Level of staff needed Engineers and Technicians (Levels I-V)



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Engineering Staff

Each Resident Engineer's Office consists of the following:

- Resident Engineer Critical decision maker on all projects and responsible for all personnel.
- <u>Assistant Resident Engineers (ARE)</u> assist the Resident Engineers with oversight of all projects.
- Office Technician Assist with entering and approving field documentation into contract admin systems
- Administrative Staff Generally 1-2 admin who assist with managing the office, assist with field documentation as needed



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Inspection Staff

Inspection staff are responsible for:

- Reviewing project for safety traffic control, trenching/shoring, fall protection, etc.
- Environmental Permit compliance inspections and documentation
- Material Tracking & Sampling- Concrete sampling, rebar, other materials as needed for certification. Build America, Buy America (BABA)
- Materials Testing Density testing (soil, ABC and asphalt)
- Review contractor's work to ensure conformance with the plans and specifications. Includes coordination of what operations will occur and where on the project.
- Documentation of daily operations who, what, when, where, how in "Inspector Daily Reports"
- Measurement and Tracking of Quantities for Payment NCDOT Board od Transportation Meeting Minutes



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Inspection Staffing Challenges

- Federal Aid Contract Compliance
- Managing Quality, Risks, and Dispute Resolution at the project level
- Workforce Development
 - Tiered inspection levels (Trainee, Level I Level V)
 - On the job training
 - Mentoring opportunities for entry level staff
- Contractor Scheduled Operations
 - Work durations and frequency not linear
 - Varies with project complexity
 - May include 24 hr shift work
 - Subcontractor operations
 - Highly weather dependent



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Staffing Methodology

Divisions can staff using the following options:

- NCDOT personnel currently staffed each office varies on how many NCDOT positions are currently filled
- <u>Consultant-</u>Construction Engineering and Inspection consultant (CEI) position that are brought on to fill an immediate need.







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Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) Guidelines

Guidelines have been developed to provide information on the administration of CEI contracts. The guidelines include information on:

- Procurement and Award of CEI services
- Administration of CFI services.
- Invoice requirements
- Inspection requirements equipment, materials, etc.

- Resurfacing Operations 1 technician per operation (paving, patching, utility adjustments, etc.)

 <u>Maintenance Paving Projects</u> utilize 2
 technicians where necessary
- Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Projects –
 1 technician per project
- <u>Larger TIP Projects</u> In-Depth Review of staffing for all projects and only cover critical operations with individual technicians (Paving, Class AA and A concrete pours, Embankment construction, ABC placement, etc.)

§ 26.25 What is the requirement for a liaison officer?

You must have a DBE liaison officer, who shall have direct, independent access to your Chief Executive Officer concerning DBE <u>program</u> matters. The liaison officer shall be responsible for implementing all aspects of your DBE <u>program</u>. You must also have adequate staff to administer the <u>program</u> in compliance with this part.



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DBE Final Rule Overview of Changes

- Updates personal net worth and program size thresholds for inflation;
- Modernizes rules for counting of material suppliers;
- Formalizes COVID-19 flexibilities;
- Adds new program elements to foster greater usage of DBEs and ACDBEs with concurrent, proactive monitoring and oversight;
- Updates certification provisions with less prescriptive rules that give certifiers flexibility when determining eligibility;
- and makes technical corrections that have led to substantive misinterpretations of the rules by recipients,
 program applicants, and participants.

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DBE Final Rule Changes: Certification Eligibility

Increases the Personal Net Worth (PNW) cap

New PNW Cap: \$2,047,000

Previous PNW Cap: \$1,320,000

Benefit: This rule change allows more firms to now qualify as a DBE and become certified.

Excludes retirement assets from the PNW calculation

Benefit: Business owners' retirement savings are no longer included in the personal net worth formula.

USDOT will regularly adjust the PNW cap in the future using Federal Reserve data.

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DBE Final Rule Changes: Certification Eligibility Social Disadvantage & Group Membership

Primary Changes

The basic principles of this process have been retained, but the requirements to determine social disadvantage and group membership have been eased by:

Rebutting the presumption of economic disadvantage.

Reworking Appendix E criteria for individualized determinations of social and economic disadvantage.

Benefits

Replaces ability to accumulate substantial wealth in favor of a "reasonable person" standard.

Provides less prescriptive rules so certifiers can more accurately make individualized determinations of social and economic disadvantage and applicants have more discretion about what evidence to provide.

DBE Final Rule Changes: Administrative Rules

Primary Changes

Removes the documents for the Uniform Report, Uniform Certification Application, and PNW Statement from the regulation for ease of future amendments by USDOT.

Reduces administrative requirements for smaller FTA recipients receiving planning or operating assistance.

Expands existing DBE directories to enable prime contractors to identify a DBE's location, lines of work (NAICS codes), and website.

Streamlines interstate certification.

Benefits

These changes will ease burdens and create more opportunities for DBE firms.

Improve the initial certification process and expedite the interstate certification process.

And, add flexibility to conserve certification agency resources.

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Other changes

- Changes that strengthens monitoring and prompt payment requirements.
- Updates rules for counting participation by DBE material suppliers and clarifies terminology.
- Amends ownership and control requirements for certification eligibility.
- Amends summary suspension rules.
- And more a total of 60 administrative changes to the DBE/ACDBE programs.

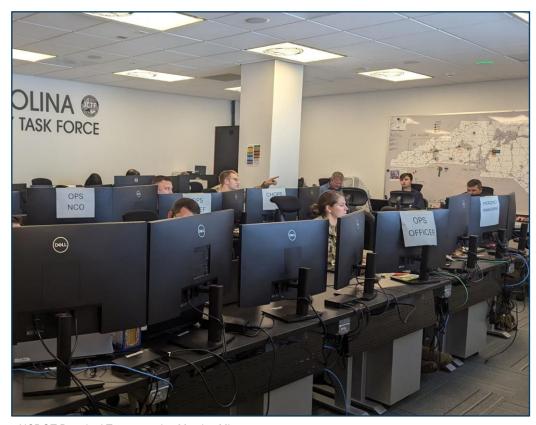

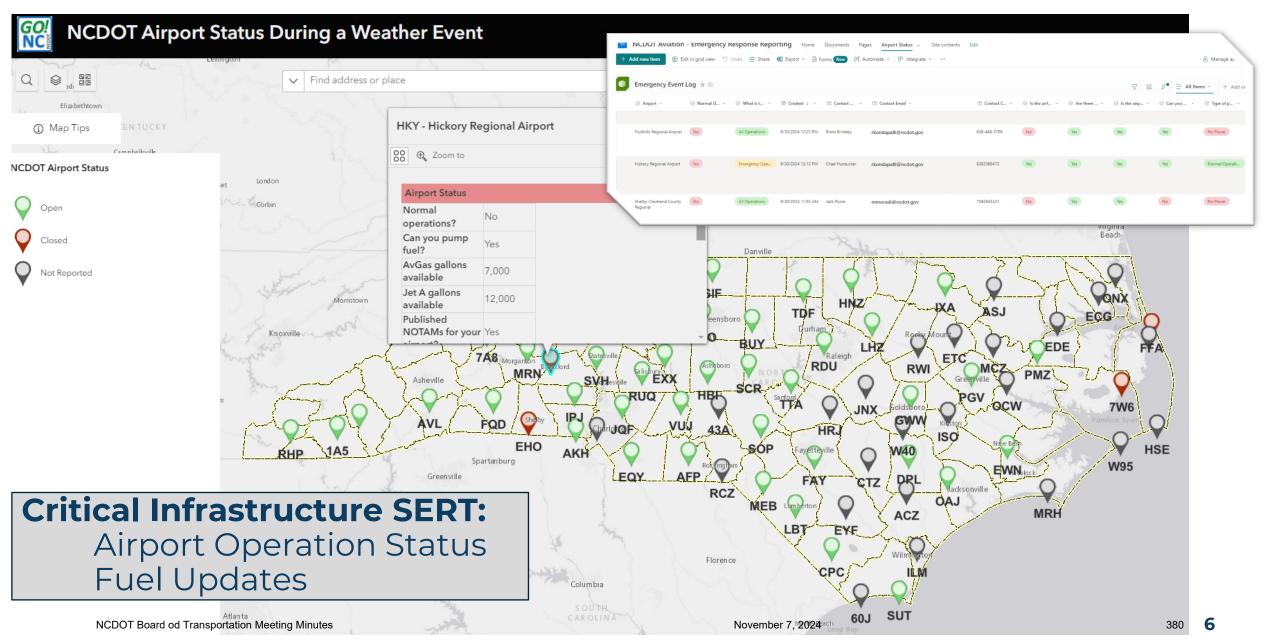
