Declaration of Quorum

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the full board meeting to order on Wednesday, January 8, 2025.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval – December 4-5, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from December 4-5, 2024, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the December 4-5, 2024, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Clarke and a second by Board Member Rosenburgh. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Hopkins started off by welcoming everyone to the Board of Transportation meeting. He said that he hoped everyone had a safe and happy holiday season.

Secretary Hopkins announced that we have just passed the 100-day mark since Hurricane Helene hit NC. Recovery continues with temporary bridge installations, slide and shoulder repairs, and road reconstruction work with a focus on major corridors and communities with limited access. As Tim Anderson, Division 13 Engineer, aptly put it in one of our recovery videos, we have a team that can move mountains. Our team has been put to the test and they continue to make progress. Our crews and contractors have now fully reopened more than 1,200 roads since Helene hit, with 78 having partial access. As of this morning, there are 184 roads still closed. Our communications team put together a video highlighting the progress made these past 100 days that was shared with the room. Anyone interested can follow our efforts to reopen roads on a dashboard created for this, it's linked on DriveNC.gov. We're continually grateful for the efforts of our staff, our contractors and many partners as we help Western North Carolina recover.

Secretary Hopkins extended his gratitude to our law enforcement partners for keeping us safe. They just completed their holiday Booze It & Lose It campaign which is when law enforcement

across the state increases patrols and checkpoints to promote safety and crack down on impaired driving. We thank these officers for their service always, but especially around the holiday season as they leave their loved ones to ensure our safety on the roads. While the campaign has concluded, our message to drivers never ends: obey the laws of the road – buckle up, focus on the road while driving, don't speed, and never drink and drive.

Secretary Hopkins continued the topic of road safety. He announced that last month we had an event dedicating the Tree of Life outside the State Capitol. The annual event commemorates those who died on NC roads each year. This tree lighting honored the 1,686 people killed in vehicle crashes on NC roads in 2023 and serves as a solemn reminder of the importance of being safe on the roads.

Secretary Hopkins announced that after five years, NC By Train brought back the Santa Train this holiday season. The train departed Raleigh for Greensboro and then made the return trip home last month, just in time for Santa to get back to the North Pole before Christmas. During the trip, children and families were able to make wonderful memories while meeting with Santa and Mrs. Claus. A very cool and popular offering by NC By Train and we're glad to see it return.

Secretary Hopkins also shared that WomenConnect took their holiday networking event to the tracks last month. Participants traveled by train from Raleigh to Greensboro for a day of networking, inspiration and holiday cheer. We're glad to see women across all our units connecting through this resource group that fosters personal and professional development. And we're grateful to NC By Train for coordinating both meaningful holiday events.

Secretary Hopkins had the privilege of joining military officials last month in signing a proclamation to consider future arrangements in which we would manage road maintenance and highway construction projects on U.S. Army posts and Marine Corps bases in the state. This agreement allows us to provide transportation support services to Army posts statewide over a 10-year period, while the federal government fully pays for these projects. This kind of partnership began in 2021 with Fort Liberty. Since then, we have delivered \$17M in road improvements on the Army installation, with \$15M more under contract.

Lastly, Secretary Hopkins shared an end-of-year video that showcases the Department's highlights from 2024. AS a disclaimer, he mentioned that some of the numbers in the video differ from the latest figures in the video from earlier – this is because these numbers are fluid and can change week to week. He thanked to the communications team for helping us look back on 2024 as we turn the page to all that 2025 has in store. He said that he is grateful to be

able to work with everyone in the board room and all of our team here at NCDOT, and he look forward to what this year brings.

A motion was made by Board Member Mathis and a second by Board Member Phillips to approve all projects for G, I, K, M, N, O, and R. Chairman Fox conducted a roll call vote of participating members, and the project items were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

Board Member Lathrop recused himself from voting on the following projects:

Item O – Pender County, R-3300B

This Project consists of construction of a multi-lane facility on NC 417 (Hampstead Bypass) from south of NC 210 to north of SR 1563 (Sloop Point Loop Road). At the request of the Church, additional work will include a right turn lane due to the Church's expansion. The Church shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost for the additional work. The estimated reimbursement from the Church is \$40,163.75.

Item O – Union County, M-0549L

This Reimbursement Agreement provides for preliminary engineering coordination and design review of plans for improvements to the intersection of (SR 1157 - Fletcher Broome Road) and (NC 75 - Waxhaw Highway) by adding a 4-way stop and turn lanes affecting CSX Crossing No. 638 866C on Fletcher Broome Road. The Crossing will need new rail safety devices/signs and surfacing work. This crossing improvement is necessary for a new development by the Developer. All Department costs to coordinate preliminary engineering review by CSX Transportation will be reimbursed at 100% by the Developer. There will be no cost to the Department for this Agreement.

• Item O - Cabarrus County, EB-5844

This Project consists of construction of sidewalk along Little Texas Road and Ruth Avenue from Dale Earnhardt Boulevard to Lane Street. This Supplemental Agreement is to increase funding for the Project. The Department shall participate in an additional amount not to exceed \$2,852,800 (80%) in TA funds. The Municipality will be responsible for providing \$713,200 (20%) as their local match and all costs that exceed the new total available funding of \$3,566,000.

Anson	Petition 4909 added Russell Horne Road (SR 1147), for an incorrect distance of 0.30 miles. According to documentation received just after the June 1962 approval, full right-of-way along the entire 0.25-mile length was not able to be secured. Therefore, the distance of addition is being corrected to 0.25 miles along the original alignment, which translates to a 0.23-mile length of maintenance along current alignment. This cooperative agreement between the Department and FRA covers FFY2021 Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements Program (CRISI) grant funds awarded to the Department for surveys and preliminary engineering for Raleigh to Richmond (R2R) Corridor Program improvements between Raleigh, North Carolina, and Richmond, Virginia. The Department was awarded approximately \$57.9 million in FFY2021 FRA CRISI competitive grant funding. Included as a match in this project is the construction of a grade separation of Rogers Road over the S-Line in Wake Forest, North Carolina, which is funded with State funds and programmed as STIP project number P-5707. Additional matching funds are provided by the Virginia Passenger Rail Authority and Amtrak.

Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) RAIL This cooperative agreement between the Department and the FRA covers Phases IA and II of the Raleigh to Richmond Innovating Rail Program, which will develop a new, initial phase of intercity passenger rail service between Raleigh and Wake Forest, along the S-Line. The project involves completion of final design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction activities to build additional parts of the Southeast Corridor, including new and upgraded track, grade separations, and closure of multiple at-grade crossings. The Department was awarded approximately \$1.09B FFY2022-FFY2026 FRA Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail (FSP) grant in 2023 for the project.

The new bridge will be approximately 3.2 miles in length, with a vertical clearance of 65 feet to accommodate the navigational channel, two 12-foot lanes with 8-foot shoulders, and bridge rail will be increased to a height suitable for bicycle and pedestrian traffic. The project will also install broadband fiber along US 64 from I-95 to NC 12. The USDOT has awarded a MEGA Grant to the Department in the amount of \$110,000,000. Michael Newsome, Driver Services Director

The information presented titled "DMV Driver Services Status Updates", centered around updates for the Driver License Offices and current personnel statistics.

- Citizen per Terminal (CPT)
 - o Citizen per Terminal (CPT): The transaction capacity of a single examiner,

- operating an issuing terminal annually. This is based on average transaction speed and time available to transact in a 260-day work year. The optimal CPT is 3,828 transactions per year.
- Driver License Offices are open 9 hours a day, 260 days a year and on average complete transactions in 23 minutes.
- DMV has the capacity to complete approximately 2,009,511 transactions per year from 538 issuing terminals.
- With NC having approximately 2,048,903 citizens, there is a deficit of 39,392 transactions not being served.

DMV Asks

- DMV has asked for 61 additional full-time employees to fill vacant workstations.
- DMV also asked for 3 new driver license offices and 24 additional employees to staff the new offices.
- Staffing, Retention, and Attendance
 - 2024 Average operating strength is 64.69% which accounts for vacancies as well as other leave types.
 - Average attendance without vacancy was 86%.
- 2. DMV License Plate Agency Status Updates

Judy Schmidinger, Vehicle Services Program Analyst II

Brief summary reference the License Plate Agencies status.

 - Lastly, this presentation highlighted the strategic growth of cold storage facilities around the Port of Wilmington to capitalize on existing cold chain market opportunities in North Carolina.

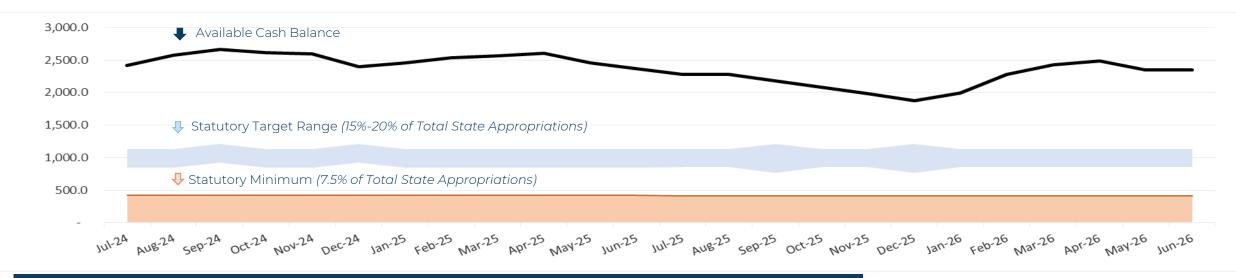

Revenues and Other Receipts Commentary

- November revenues and other receipts are 10.3% or \$62.9M above forecast largely due to FHWA and Turnpike federal aid receipts and partly due to License and Fees. Lower than anticipated sales tax revenue and Infra Grant receipts offset the higher receipts for the month of November
- Federal Aid Infra Grant was below forecast by \$28.6M due to a delay in the Alligator River Bridge project.
- FYTD revenues and other receipts are 3.4% or \$106.3M above forecast.
- HF and HTF revenues show YOY growth;7.4% and 2.6%, respectively.

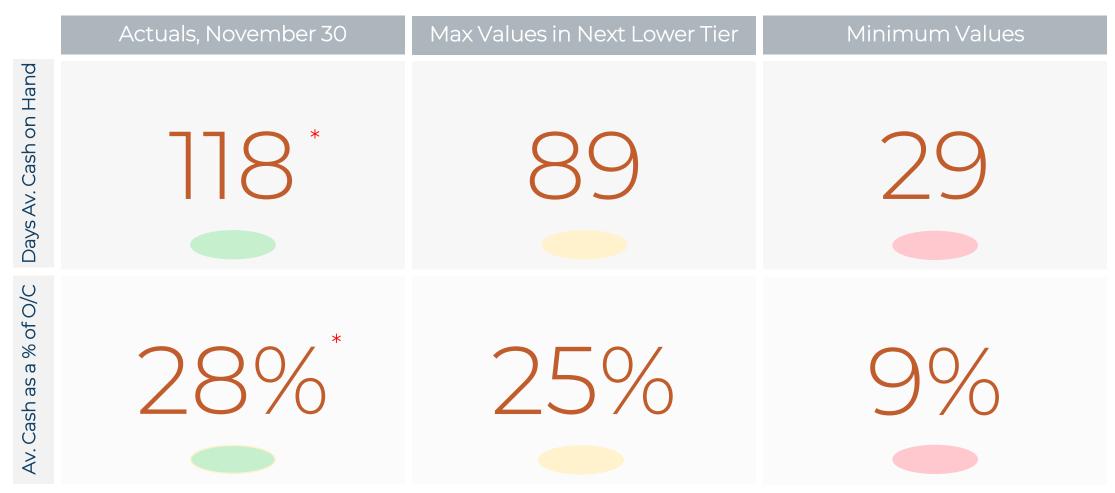

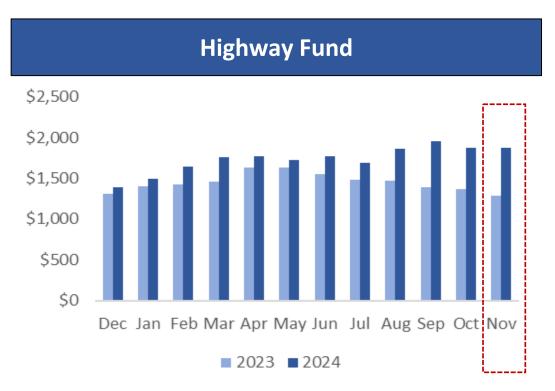

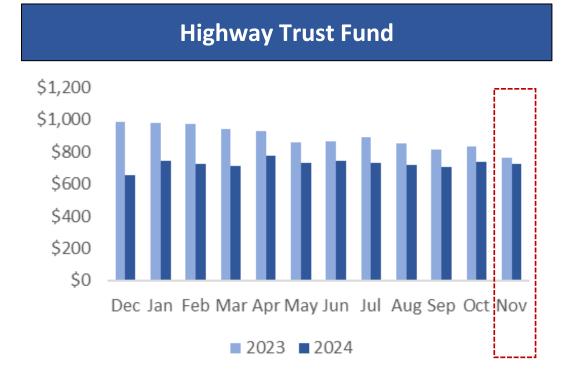

HF cash balance increased by \$578.6M or 44.9% from November 2023 to November 2024.

 Overall cash increase can be partially attributable to transfers from the Transportation Reserve, with the most recent transfer in August of \$100M for GMR. Additionally, on average revenues exceeded expenditures over the past 12 months.

HTF cash balance decreased by \$36.6M or 4.8% from November 2023 to November 2024.

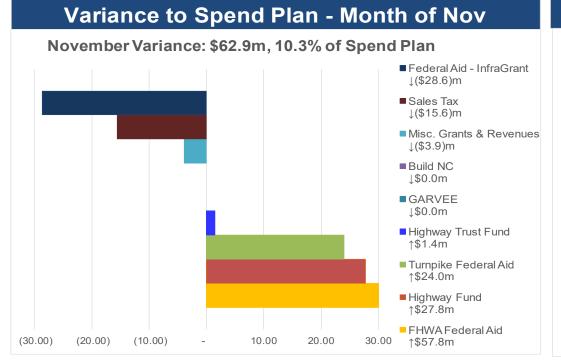

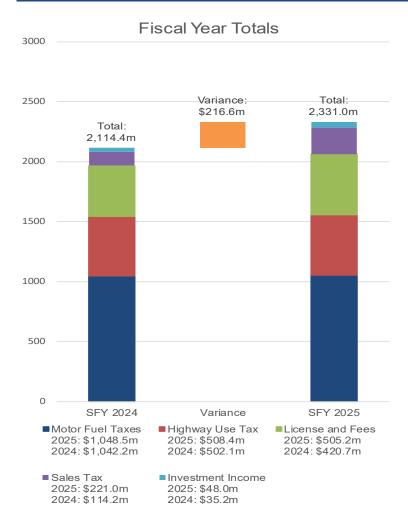

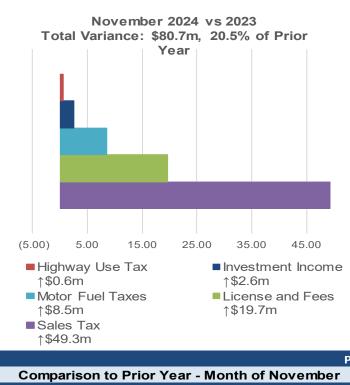
State Revenues by Source - Highway Fund & Trust Fund - Nov 2024(\$M)

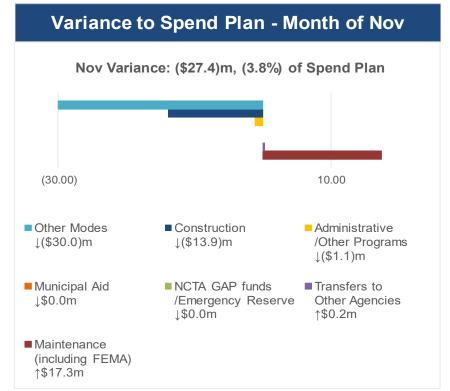

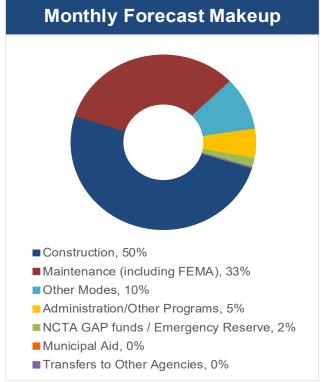

Overall Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

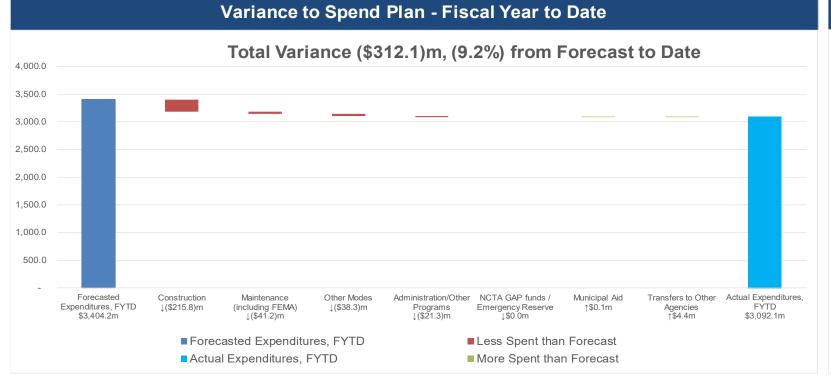

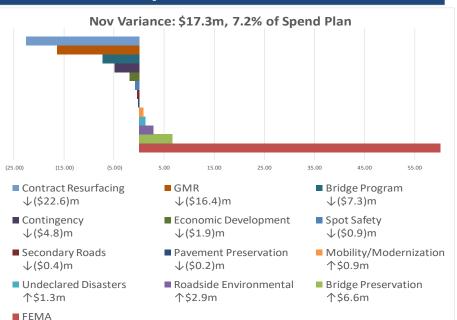

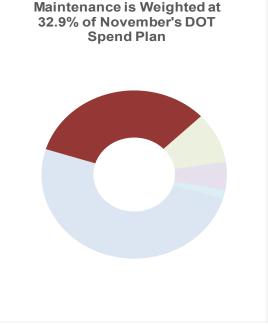

Variance to Spend Plan - Month of Nov



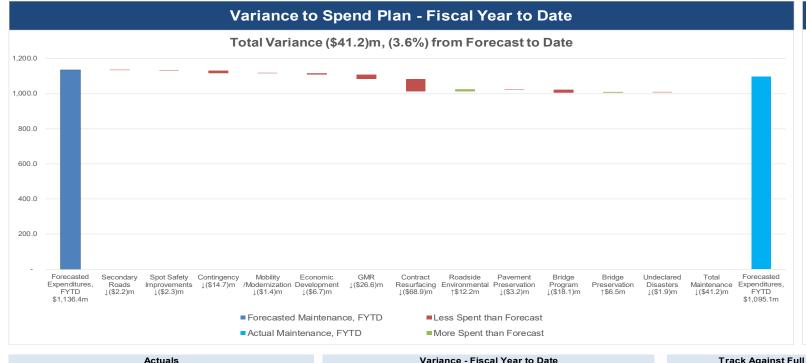

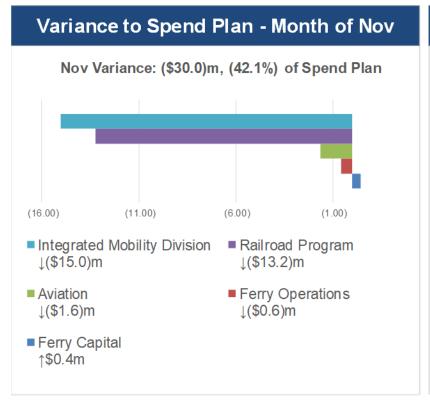
Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – FYTD (\$M)

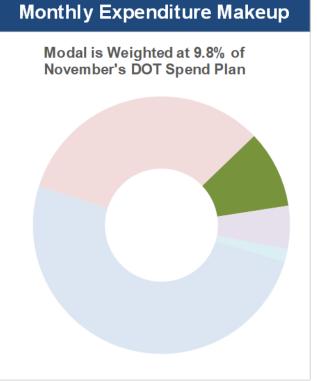

Modal Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

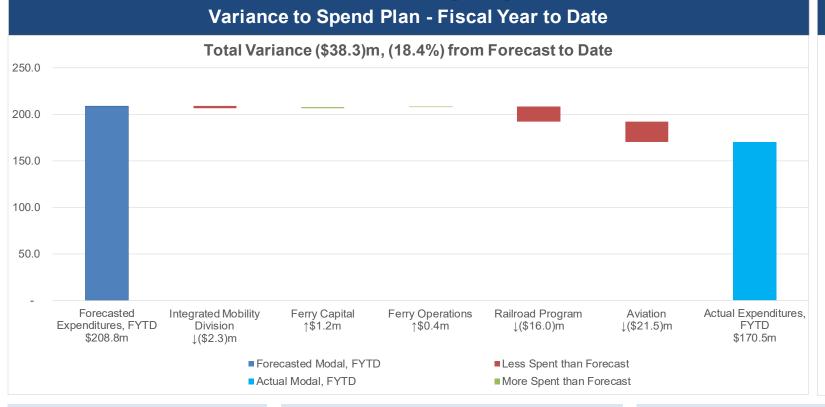

Modal Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – FYTD (\$M)



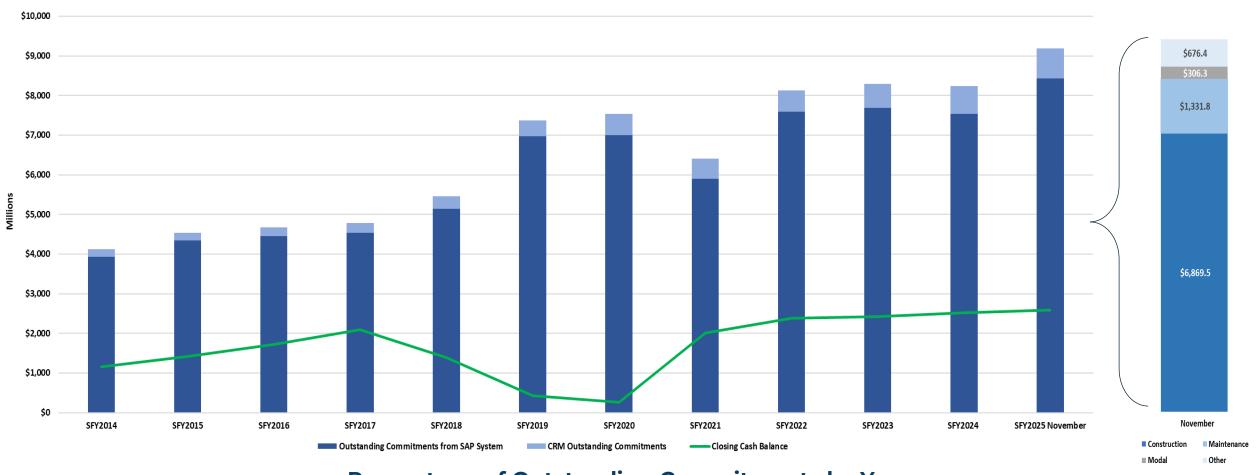

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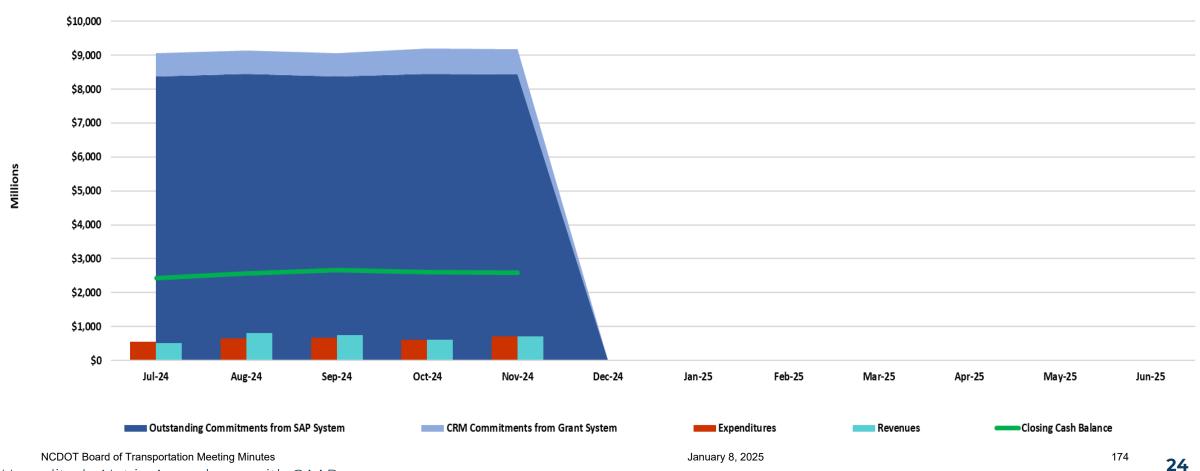
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Available Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year



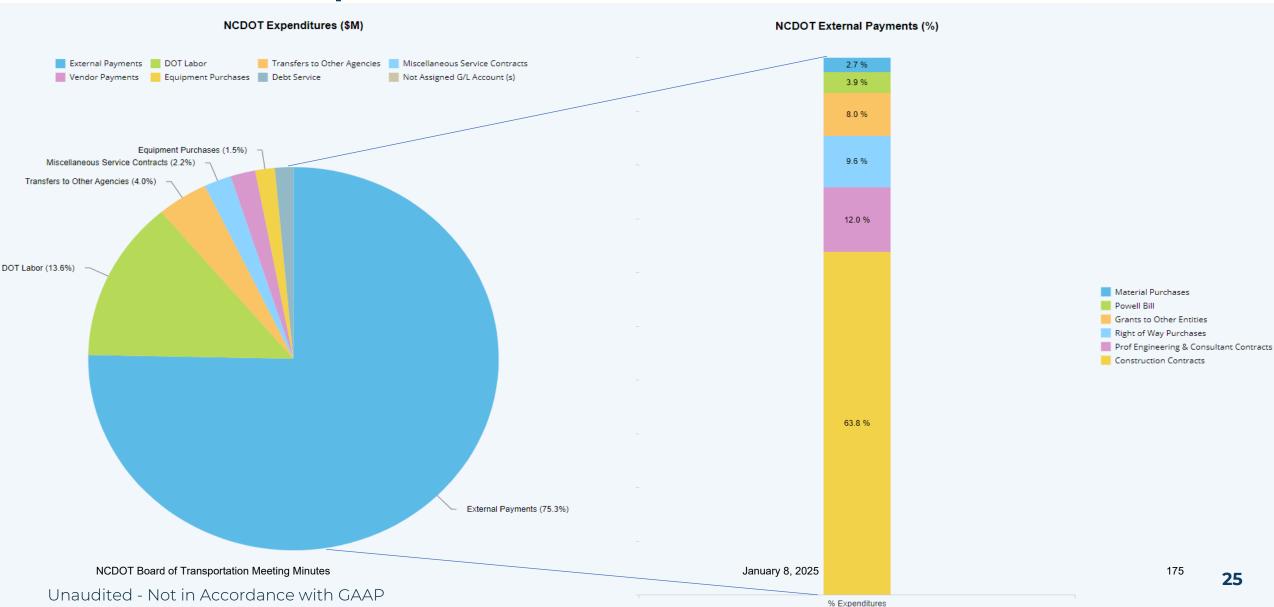

NCDOT Expenditures SFY2025 as of November 30, 2024



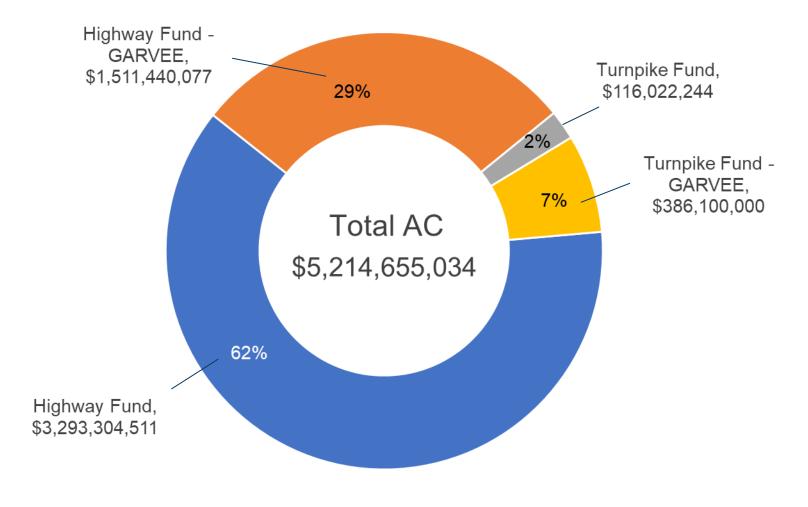

DMV Driver Services Status Updates

Definitions

Issuing Terminal: An assembly of computer hardware and applications used to issue a DMV credential.

Facilitator Station: Is a customer's first point of contact upon arrival. This examiner's primary tasks include but are not limited to, greeting customers indoor and/or outdoor, assessing purpose of visit, reviewing and verifying documents and managing the queueing (Q-Flow) process.

Workstation: A 'desk' or work area designated for an examiner, including both the Issuing Terminal and Facilitator Desk.

Citizen per Terminal (CPT): The transaction capacity of a single examiner, operating an issuing terminal annually. This is based on average transaction speed and time available to transact in a 260-day work year.

The optimal CPT is 3,828 transactions per year.

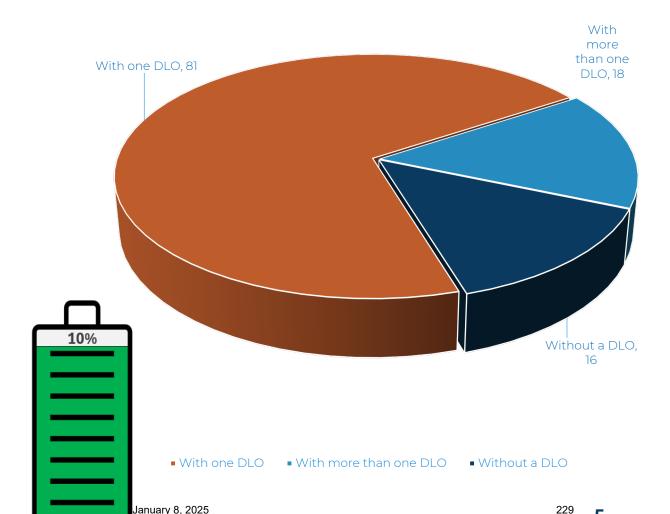
Citizens per Terminal Explained

- DLOs are open for 9 hours a day, roughly 260 days a year
- The average time to complete a transaction is 23 minutes
- DMV has the capacity to complete approx. **2,009,511 transactions per year** from 538 issuing terminals
- Historically, 20% of the 10,975,017 population visit a DLO annually
 - > Approx. 2,048,903 citizens
- [2,048,903 citizens] [2,009,511 potential transactions] = 39,392 transactions not served.
