### Full Board Work Session

### Wednesday, February 5, 2025

Chairman Fox welcomed the members of the Board to the meeting located in the Board Room.

### Roll Call

Chairman Fox conducted a roll call of members with the following members present in the meeting: Chairman Fox, Board Member Moran, Board Member Alcoke, Board Member Mitchell, Board Member Jordan, Board Member Hunt, Board Member Mathis, Board Member Molamphy, Board Member Lathrop, Board Member Phillips, Board Member Lail, Board Member Cody, and Board Member McGrady.

The following members were absent: Vice Chair Perkins, Board Member Zimmer, Board Member Daughtry, and Board Member Clarke.

### **Declaration of Quorum**

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

### Call to Order

### **Declaration of Quorum**

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

### **Call to Order**

Chairman Fox called the full board meeting to order on Thursday, February 6, 2025.

### **Ethics Statement**

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. S. §143B-350, it is the duty of every Board member to avoid both conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

### **Pledge of Allegiance**

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### Approval – January 7-8, 2025, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from January 7-8, 2025, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the January 7-8, 2025, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Board Member Cody and a second by Board Member McGrady. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

### **Secretary of Commerce Presentation**

Chairman Fox welcomed Secretary of Commerce, Lee Lilley, to give his remarks.

### Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Board Member Allen Moran read the resolution for the Deputy Paul Futrell Bridge naming located in Division 1. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Moran and a second by Board Member Mitchell. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Valerie Jordan read the resolution for the Deputy Ned P. Byrd Bridge naming located in Division 5. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Jordan and a second by Board Member Cody. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the North Carolina Tar Heels 2024 Soccer National Champions naming located in Division 7. The reading was accepted as a motion by Chairman Fox and a second by Board Member Alcoke. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

### Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Hopkins started off by welcoming everyone to the Board of Transportation meeting. The first item of business was discussion of winter weather. Our state experienced two winter storms last month, with the second sending rare amounts of measurable snow to our eastern counties. Areas down east saw anywhere from two to eight inches of snow prompting days of preparation before the event, and many days of clearing roadways afterwards. He thanked all of the crew's working day and night to clear our roads during and after the storm, as well as help from other divisions not as affected. It's a pretty wild situation we found ourselves in, to have crews from the west assist with snow in the east, and crews from the east assist with a hurricane in the west – all in just a few months' time. Our western division crews were glad at the opportunity to return the favor to their eastern counterparts. It's great to see the department's comradery and teamwork in action.

Secretary Hopkins then spoke about the Hurricane Helene recovery efforts. There are over 9,300 damaged sites, including 818 bridges and 870 pipes and large culverts. Our crews and contractors have completed permanent replacement of 8 of the bridges and expect roughly 139 more that need replacement. There have also been completed repairs on nearly 200 of the bridges that just need repairs and 700 of the pipe in large culvert repairs. We are now reporting 172 road closures, 34 of these being on primary routes, and 84 roads only have partial access. We do have 54 of the 172 just closed to truck traffic as we continue to try to deal with the truckers that are going on routes that they shouldn't be on in our mountainous counties. Anyone interested can follow our efforts to reopen roads on a dashboard created for this, it's linked on DriveNC.gov. The Secretary mentioned how proud of the work and dedication from all the folks that have been involved in this progress and can't stress enough how grateful we are for the efforts from our staff, our contractors and many partners as we help Western North Carolina recover. Our Comms team got permission to use Eric Church's song "Carolina" to produce a music video on our recovery, which he played for those in the room.

Secretary Hopkins highlighted some of the programs offered through our Office of Historically Black Colleges and Universities Outreach, in honor of Black History Month. This office has several programs and initiatives to help young professionals as they transition from college into their eventual careers in transportation fields like engineering, logistics and urban planning. We sat down with a pair of current HBCU Fellows and a former HBCU Intern who now works for us here in Division 5, and asked them to share their personal journeys and significant role the HBCU program has played in their educational and professional growth. He then shared that video with those in the room.

Secretary Hopkins congratulated NC By Train on another year of record ridership. This means we have broken ridership records for 3 years in a row now. In 2024, NC By Train carried over 720,000 passengers. That's a 12% increase from the previous year and a 55% increase since 2019. Ridership has been boosted by the addition of a fifth round-trip train frequency between Raleigh and Charlotte as well as the recent special event trains providing service to new locations. We look forward to what 2025 has in store for NC By Train.

Secretary Hopkins shared some exciting news out of Division 8 as the new Rockingham Bypass opened last week. The 7.2-mile route is designated as U.S. 220/Future Interstate 73/74 and began construction in 2019. We thank the Division 8 staff, our crews and the contract crews for their hard work in bringing this future interstate to life.

Lastly, Secretary Hopkins mentioned that the Ferry Division hosted a couple of career events over the past week – the first two in a series of five of these events. The Division is actively looking to hire temporary and full-time positions at all experience levels, from general utility worker to experienced boat captains. The remaining three events this month will be in various locations in the eastern part of our state to find qualified applicants to staff our ferries, terminals, and shipyard. You can see more information on those events here on the screen or by checking our Ferry accounts on social media.

### Action – Project Items

Chairman Fox asked members of the Board to announce any recusals to the action items within the presented project items. Recusals made by members of the Board on project items are noted below.

Chairman Fox reminded any member of the board that made a recusal to email the completed recusal form to Marilyn McHilse, Board Secretary. He also mentioned that board members sign and email or return the Ethics Declaration.

Chairman Fox invited a motion to approve the project items as presented. A motion was made by Board Member Moran and a second by Board Member Mitchell to approve all projects for G, I, K, M, N, O, P, R, and S. Chairman Fox conducted a roll call vote of participating members, and the project items were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

### Recusals

Board Member Lathrop recused himself from voting on the following projects:

### • Item O – Wake County, R-5705B

This Project consists of design and construction of a reduced conflict intersection (RCI) in the median of the NC 55 Bypass at approximately -L- STA 480+45. The Department shall be responsible for all work. At the request of the Developer, the Department shall include in its contract the design and construction of one left turn lane in the median (southbound), construction of monolithic concrete islands, and installation of the pavement section, pavement markings, pavement markers, and signs. Also, the proposed entrances will be constructed to the right-of-way line for the NC 55 Bypass. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the actual cost of the work. The estimated reimbursement from the

Developer is \$111,500. This agenda item supersedes the item that was approved by the BOT on February 1, 2024.

### • Item O – New Hanover County, 36249.4964

This Project consists of a review and inspection of a traffic signal installation at the intersection of SR 1002 (Holly Shelter Road) and I-40 Eastbound Ramps related to the Blue Bay Townhomes (Castle Hayne Residential) development. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost of the Department's review and inspection of the signals. The estimated reimbursement is \$5,000.

### • Item O – New Hanover County, 36249.4976

This Project consists of a review and inspection of a traffic signal upgrade at the intersections at SR 1336 (Sidbury Road) and SR 2181 (Dairy Farm Road), SR 1336 (Sidbury Road) and Site Access 1, and SR 1336 (Sidbury Road) and SR 2202 (Edna Buck Road) / Sidbury Station Site Driveway 2, signal modification at US 117 / NC 132 (N. College Road) and SR 1318 (Blue Clay Road) [03-0392], and signal coordination work required along SR 1336 (Sidbury Road) to be performed by NCDOT related to the Sidbury 187 development. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost of the Department's review and inspection of the signals. The estimated reimbursement is \$25,000.

### • Item O – Wake County, 36249.4968

This Project consists of review and inspection of a traffic signal installation and intersection changes at the intersections of Rolesville Road at Robertson Pond Road, Puryear Road at Rolesville Road, and Rolesville Road at Davistown Road. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost of the Department's review and inspection of the signals. The estimated reimbursement is \$21,000.

### • Item O – Wake County, 36249.4972

This Project consists of review and inspection of a traffic signal installation at the intersection of SR 2504 (Wendell Falls Parkway) at Clarion Drive / Zoso Avenue, Wendell, NC. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost of the Department's review and inspection of the signals. The estimated reimbursement is \$7,000.

### • Item O – Cabarrus County, 36249.4961

This Project consists of review and inspection of a traffic signal installation at the intersection at SR 2894 (Bruton Smith Boulevard) and John Q Hammons Drive NW in Concord. The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the cost of the Department's review and inspection of the signals. The estimated reimbursement is \$6,000.

Thus far in Fiscal Year 2025 the Board has approved \$2,387,993,362 in highway maintenance allocations. An initial maintenance allocation totaling \$2,215,993,362 was approved on July 10, 2024. Supplemental allocations were approved September 5, 2024, in the amount \$50,000,000 and October 3, 2024, in the amount of \$122,000,000.

At this time, staff recommends allocating \$81,969,751 from previous years credit reserves to Traditional GMR. Of that total, \$6,000,000 will be distributed to Asset and Maintenance Operations and \$75,969,751 will be distributed to Emergencies.

Staff is also recommending approval to cashflow \$180,469,915 for Bridge Program and \$4,961,900 for Bridge Preservation. This cashflow request is project specific. The purpose of the recommended cashflow is to better align project funding with forecasted expenditures.

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## SCHEDULE I(a) – TRADITIONAL GENERAL MAINTENANCE RESERVE

Staff recommends allocating an additional \$81,969,751 from previous years' credit reserve, to Traditional General Maintenance Reserve (Traditional GMR). As previously mentioned, \$6,000,000 of the total additional funds will be allocated to Asset Maintenance and Operations with the remaining \$75,969,751 being distributed to Emergencies. \$20,00,000 of the Emergency funds will be directed to Hurricane Helene to be applied as State Match for the initial \$100M Quick Release received from FHWA. The remaining \$55,969,751 will be applied to previous declared events with no pending reimbursement from our federal partners.

This recommendation increases the Traditional General Maintenance Reserve allocation to \$1,126,477,674.

#### Mark Newsome, CFO

Monthly updates on NCDOT's financial status impacted by storm recovery efforts.

- Hurricane Helene Recovery Financial Overview as of Jan. 31, 2025
  - The Department incurred \$355M in storm related expenditures.
  - The Department received \$48M in FEMA receipts and \$27M in FHWA receipts.
- Initial Forecast Model
  - This forecast is based on initial estimates and will be updated in the next couple of weeks.
- 3. Advance Construction

Teresa Robinson, STIP Western Region Manager

Yearly review on NCDOT's Advance Construction program and statutory requirements.

- Advance Construction (AC) allows FHWA to authorize a project without obligating federal funds
  - Maintains eligibility for future reimbursement without a commitment of current Budget Authority (BA) and Obligation Authority (OA).
  - Effective use of AC requires a stable federal program and availability of state funds to pay project bills until reimbursement.
- The STIP Unit analyzes the current AC fund levels, expected conversions, and new AC funding
  - AC policy requires two threshold tests for NHPP, STBP, and HSIP funds; Threshold tests for FFY 2025 and FFY 2026 passed.

#### **Highways Committee**

The Highways Committee received an update on how NCDOT handles Utility coordination and the Helene Bridge Strategy

1. How NCDOT Handles Utility Coordination

Keith Garry, State Utilities Manager

The Mission of the Utilities Unit is to: Facilitate and manage the relocation, adjustment, removal, and addition of utilities and non-utilities along NCDOT highways and rights of way while maintaining the integrity of the highway system and ensuring the safety of its users.

- Introduction to Utility Coordination and Relocation Efforts within NCDOT
  - The Utility Unit is one of 10 units in NCDOT Technical Services. This unit supports division staff, NC Turnpike, and other agencies.
  - In the project delivery process, there are 12 activities that indicate utility coordination.

Key Practices

- Utility Easements NCDOT is allowed to purchase utility easements for qualifying utility companies.
- Utility Relocation Construction NCDOT performs relocation design services for utilities and incorporates the relocation construction into highway contracts.
- NCDOT has several project relocation initiatives including tree clearing in advance of utility relocation. NCDOT nurtures relationships with utility partners.
- 2. Helene Bridge Strategy

Adam Cole, PE - Western Region Field Operations Project Engineer Aaron Earwood, PE - State Bridge Construction Engineer

Kristy Alford, PE - Eastern Region Field Operations Project Engineer

The Highways Committee received a status update on the Helene Bridge Strategy including inspection, response and the initial estimates from the storm recovery efforts.

- Initial Response
  - Inspection- There were nine NCDOT forces and 25 contracted inspection teams.
  - Estimate 930 structures impacted, 147 likely need replacing, 785 likely need repairs. The initial estimate was \$206M.

#### • Temporary Measures

- Examples of emergency repairs were shared.
- Bridge approach washout repairs included the use of guardian bags.
- Examples of temporary pipes and repairs were shared.
- Temporary bridges allowed more flow during repairs. Contractors used materials to assist with rebuilding the bridges. Temporary pedestrian access scaffolding was used to assist residents.
- Types of Temporary Bridges Include
  - 300 series Acrow modular bridge) which was first used at Baxter Medical IV facility. NCDOT received the temporary bridge from Florida DOT.
  - The 700 series Acrow bridge

- Rail cars were initially used by the City of Asheville to support travel. We then decided to utilize these as well. We purchased several cars to use as temporary bridges.
- Current Estimates (1/16/2025) 828 bridges were damaged and about 148 need to be replaced. There were about 72 major culverts and pipes damaged and of those 13 required replacements.
- Bridge Replacement Delivery Methods
  - Timber bridge replacements
  - Emergency Express Design-Build
  - Design-Bid-Build
  - Progressive Design-Build
  - Internal acceleration efforts Shortlisting of Design-Build teams, preordering of materials, alternative delivery, and bridge maintenance teams
  - Replacement work completed 1/16/2025
  - 7 emergency Express Design-Build projects have been awarded.
  - 9 Design-Bid-Build projects awarded
  - 1 progressive Design-Build project
  - 12 timber bridges completed
  - 180 bridges repaired
  - 37 culverts permanently repaired

#### **Multi-Modal Committee**

The Multi-Modal Committee heard two presentations.

1. S-Line Mobility Hub Updates

Brennon Fuqua, IMD Division Director

 The presentation provided an update on the progress of the S-Line Mobility Hub projects in the seven communities along the rail corridor. It highlighted what makes each site unique and gave insight into what comes next for each of the communities.

#### 2. Corridor ID Update

Jason Orthner, Rail Division Director

 Rail Division Director Jason Orthner provided an update on the S-line and Corridor Identification and Development (CID) programs. The Rail Division continues to progress the S-line Preliminary Engineering effort between Raleigh and Richmond in coordination with Virginia. Also, advancing the development of the initial construction segment between Raleigh and Wake Forest with service targeted for 2030. With NC By Train ridership continuing at record levels, the CID program is advancing seven corridors across the state through a three-step program of development. Service development planning for many corridors will advance later this year in coordination with communities and the freight railroads.

#### Advanced Technology Committee

The committee received a report from Nick Short, Interim Director for the NCDOT Aviation Division.

1. Drone Best Practices and Hurricane Helene Response

Nick Short, Interim Director, Division of Aviation

Nick provided an overview of Drone Best Practices and Hurricane Helene Response:

- UAS Aerial Imagery Response
- GIS Dashboard
- Success Stories
- The Future
- Open discussion
  - Nick and the board discussed the idea of supplementing Aviation's work with crowd-sourced drone footage and images, as well as a question about who owns the images and photos Aviation captures.

#### Workforce Committee

The Workforce Development Committee heard one presentation.

1. NCDOT Training Programs Update

Reba Clemmons, Training and Development Manager

Gave an overview and update of the NCDOT training programs and initiatives.

- New Leadership Training for Managers and Supervisors:
  - A three-day seminar with foundational information that covers essential topics of Safety and Responsibility, Employee Relations, Worker's Compensation, NC Value Individual Performance (NCVIP), FMLA, Budget, Classification and Compensation, Payroll, Hiring and Retention, Drug Testing and Recognizing a Troubled Employee facilitated by our Employee Relations partner MYgroup.
- Training and Development Classes and Metrics:
  - Most requested classes have a 97% instructor satisfaction, 95% content satisfaction, and 95% course recommendation. To date, we have successfully trained over 3,000 employees in courses, both virtually and in person. Our data indicates a strong preference for virtual learning, when there is an option of attending one or the other, by approximately 78% opting for virtual attendance.
  - OSHR Adjunct Training: We have increased the accessibility of leadership training for our employees by offering more classes and offering them at various locations across the state. This year alone, we have successfully trained over 600 employees in these classes.
- Training and Development Strategic Initiatives:
  - Created 9 new classes that align with employee needs and to modernize our existing curriculum based on feedback and emerging trends.
    - Soft Skills for Success
    - Managing Multiple Priorities
    - Team Building and Collaboration
    - Mastering Communications Styles
    - Developing Emotional Intelligence
    - Adaptability and Resilience Training
    - Acknowledging the Value of Others
    - Problem Solving and Decision Making

- Recognizing the Troubled Employee (MYgroup).
- The Developing Emotional Intelligence class is currently the most requested. The brand-new De-escalation and Customer Service class is quickly gaining popularity.
- Another initiative we are working on is a revamped Pathways Leadership Development Program that will take the place of the previous Legacy Leadership Program. The vendor, MagicMakers Group, is working with us to develop the program. It will have 5 levels of leadership development. The pilot will begin in March, with levels 3 and 4. Some of the goals in creating the new program include:
  - Provide leaders with resources to address workplace challenges
  - Teach strategies to build bonds and partnerships between leaders and their teams
  - Equip leaders with skills to build and maintain high performing teams
  - Leverage best practices to drive innovation and enhance NCDOT's performance at all levels
- Learning Management System (LMS):
  - Training and Development provides LMS support by:
    - Answering staff inquiries
    - Assigning training for managers and supervisors (assigned about 3,000)
    - Managing transcripts records
    - Managing training rosters
    - Scheduling training in LMS
    - Building and uploading new training in LMS
  - $\circ~$  Last year, Training and Development assisted almost 4,000 employees with LMS requests.

#### **Other Business/Closing Comments**

Chairman Fox announced that we will be meeting back in the Highway Building for the March Board meeting.

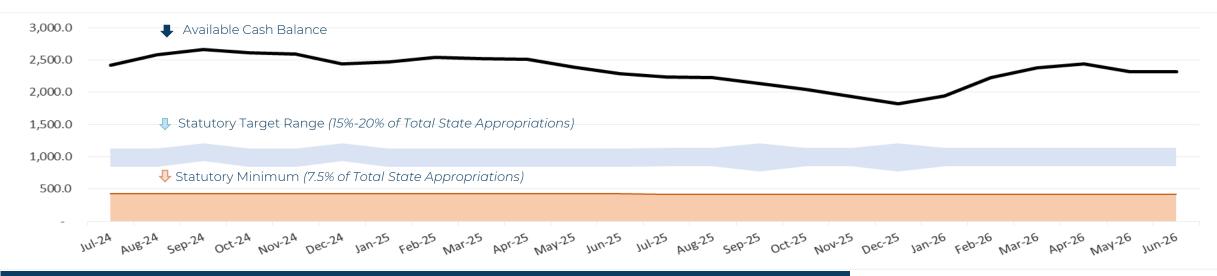

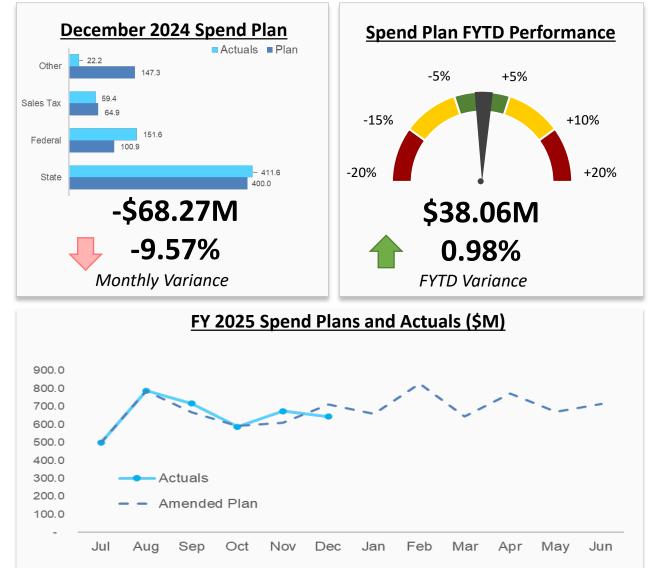

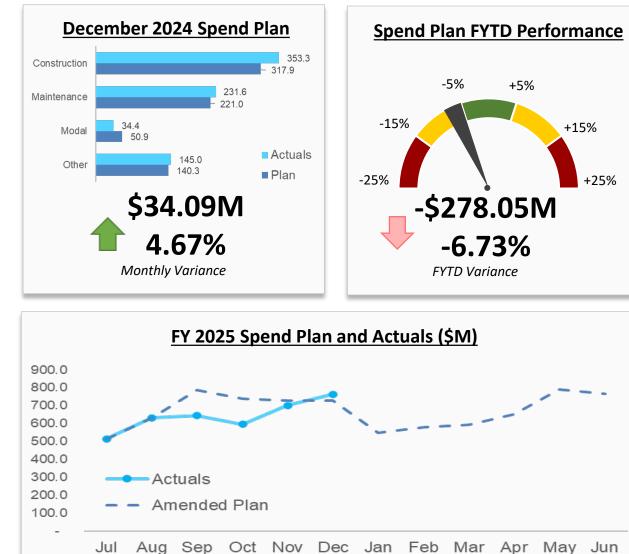


#### **Revenues and Other Receipts Commentary**

- December revenues and other receipts are
   9.6% or \$68.3M below forecast due to
   forecasting Build NC receipts. The Build NC
   2025 Bond sale is currently scheduled to
   close in May.
- December Federal Aid was above forecast by 50.2% or \$50.7M; this includes \$48.2M of FEMA receipts for Hurricane Helene.
- Federal Aid Infra Grant was below forecast by \$14.4M mostly due to a delay in the Alligator River Bridge project and the US 74/SR 1168 project.
- FYTD revenues and other receipts are 1.0% or \$38.1M above forecast.
- HF and HTF revenues show YOY growth;
   8.5% and 4.1%, respectively.

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# **Expenditures and Other Disbursements**



#### **Expenditures and Other Disbursements Commentary**

- December expenditures and other disbursements were 4.7% or \$34.1M above monthly forecast largely due to Construction and Maintenance.
- December Construction was 11.1% or \$35.4M above forecast largely due to STIP Construction (which includes FHWA disaster expenditures).
- December Maintenance was 4.8% or \$10.6M above forecast due to FEMA.
- December Modal expenditures were 32.5% or \$16.5M below forecast primarily due to delayed disbursements from the NC Airport Improvement Program Grant (NCAIP).

# HF cash balance increased by \$366.3M or 26.3% from December 2023 to December 2024.

 Overall cash increase can be partially attributable to transfers from the Transportation Reserve, with the most recent transfer in August of \$100M for GMR. Additionally, on average revenues exceeded expenditures over the past 12 months.

# Highway Trust Fund

# HTF cash balance increased by \$23.9M or 3.7% from December 2023 to December 2024.

On average construction and other expenditures exceeded revenues over the past 12 months. Starting in SFY 2025, sales tax revenue transfers are monthly instead of quarterly with an increase in distribution from 3% to 4.5%.

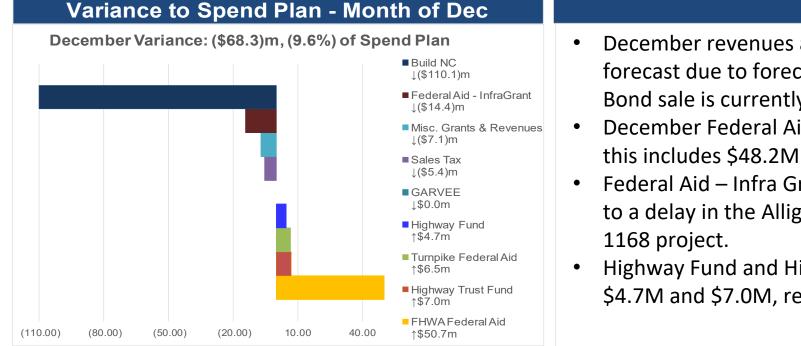

#### Commentary

- December revenues and other receipts are 9.6% or \$68.3M below forecast due to forecasting Build NC receipts. The Build NC 2025 Bond sale is currently scheduled to close in May.
- December Federal Aid was above forecast by 50.2% or \$50.7M; this includes \$48.2M of FEMA receipts for Hurricane Helene.
- Federal Aid Infra Grant was below forecast by \$14.4M mostly due to a delay in the Alligator River Bridge project and the US 74/SR 1168 project.
- Highway Fund and Highway Trust fund were above forecast by \$4.7M and \$7.0M, respectively.

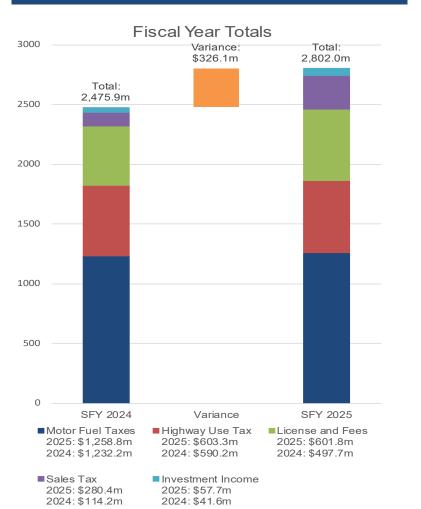

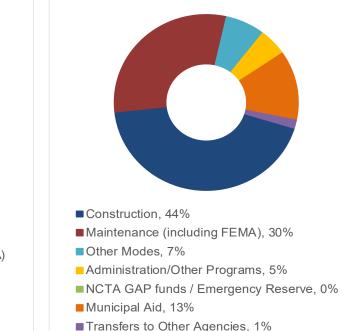

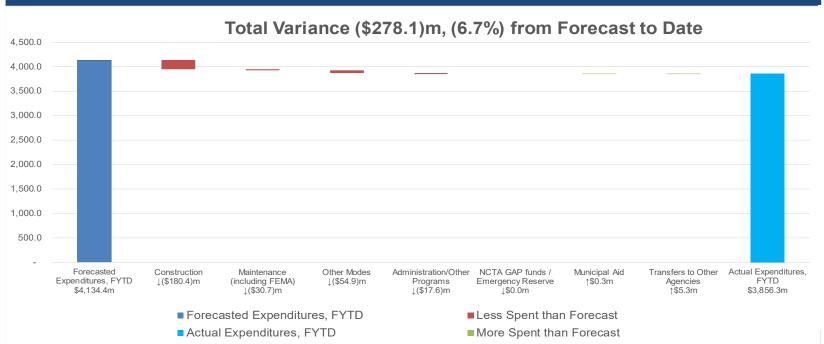

Variance to Spend Plan - Fiscal Year to Date



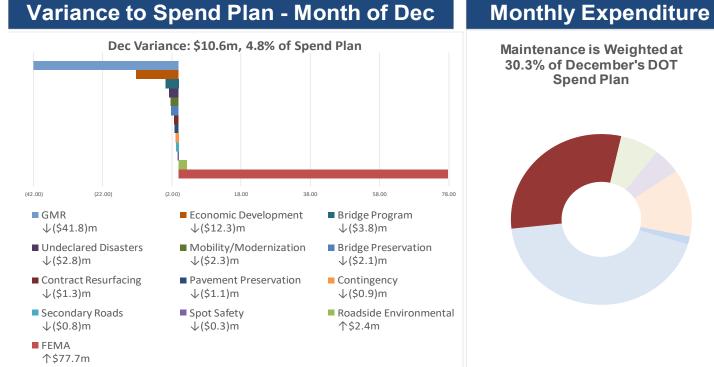

#### Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements – Actuals vs Forecast– Monthly (\$M)



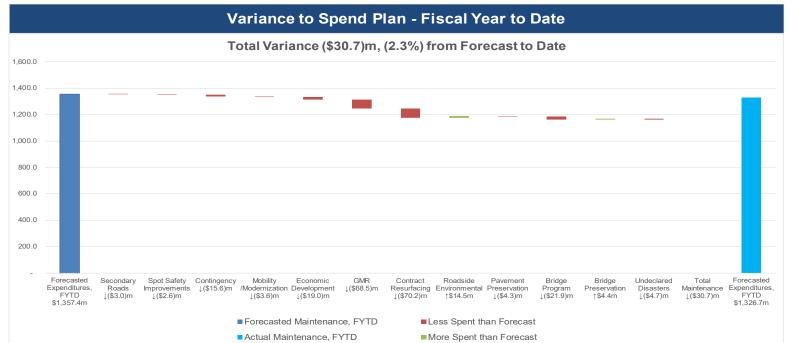

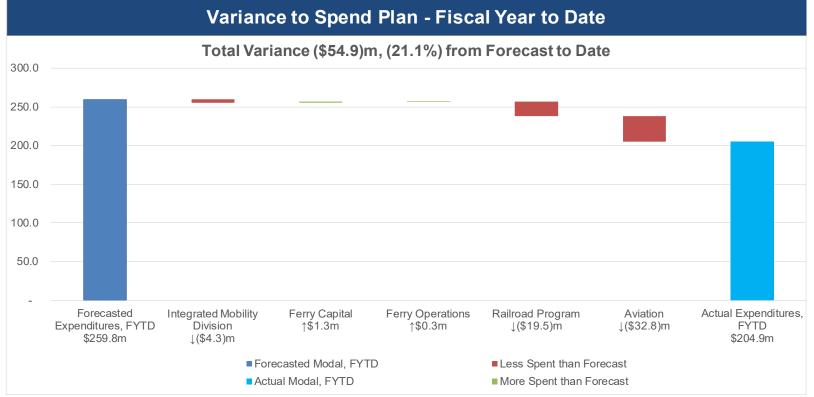

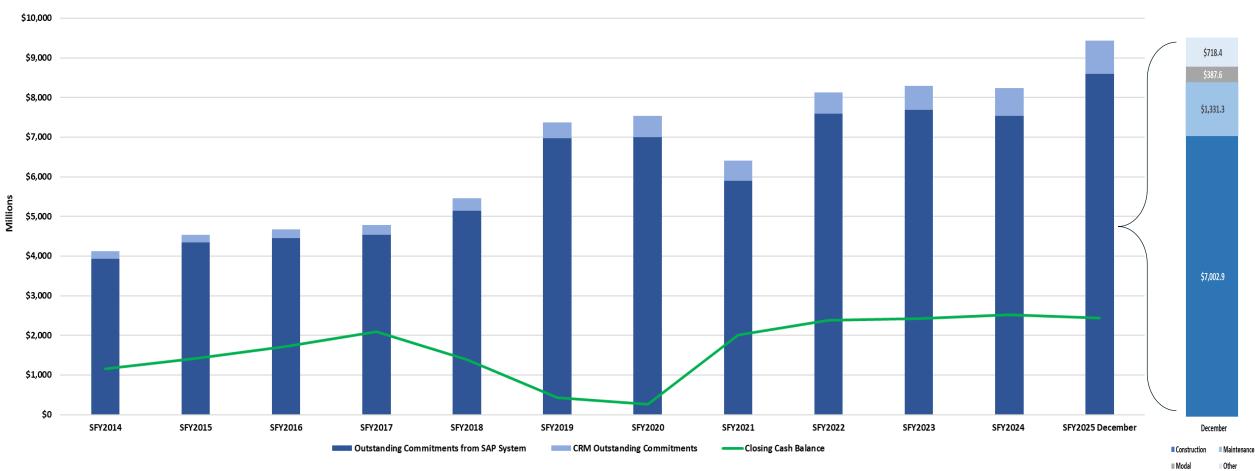

#### NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Available Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year

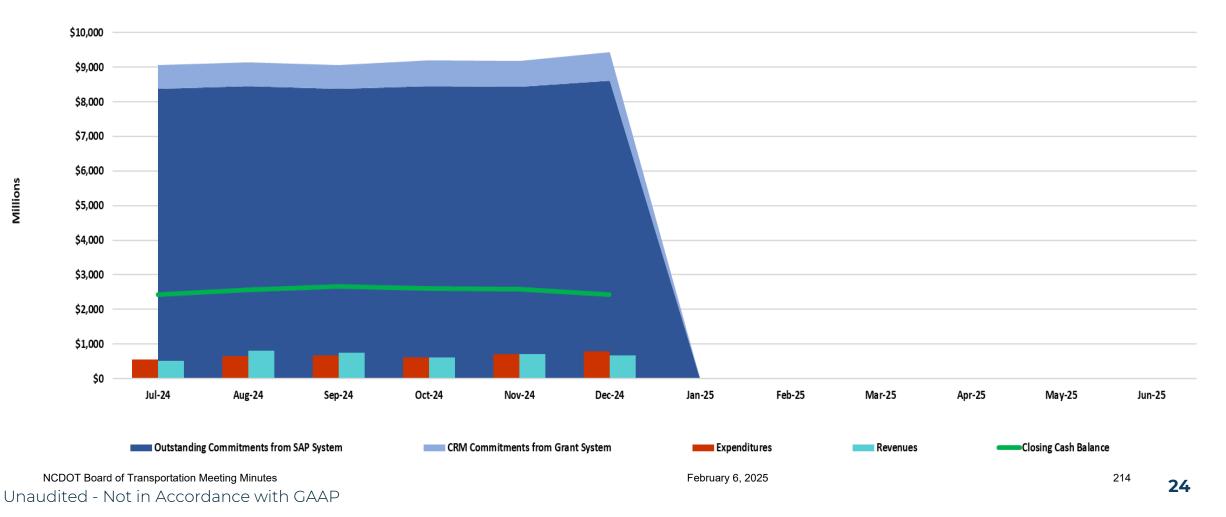

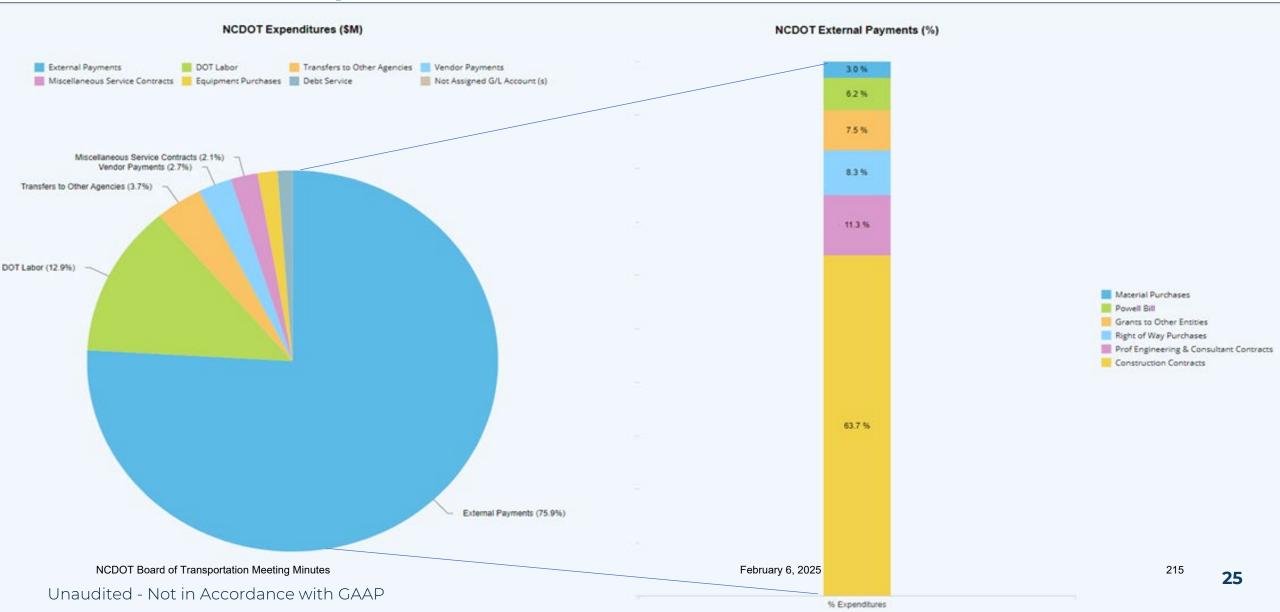

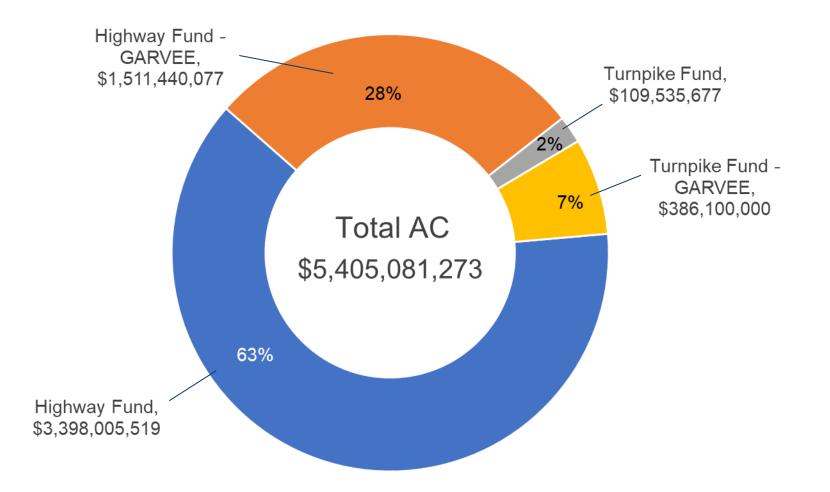

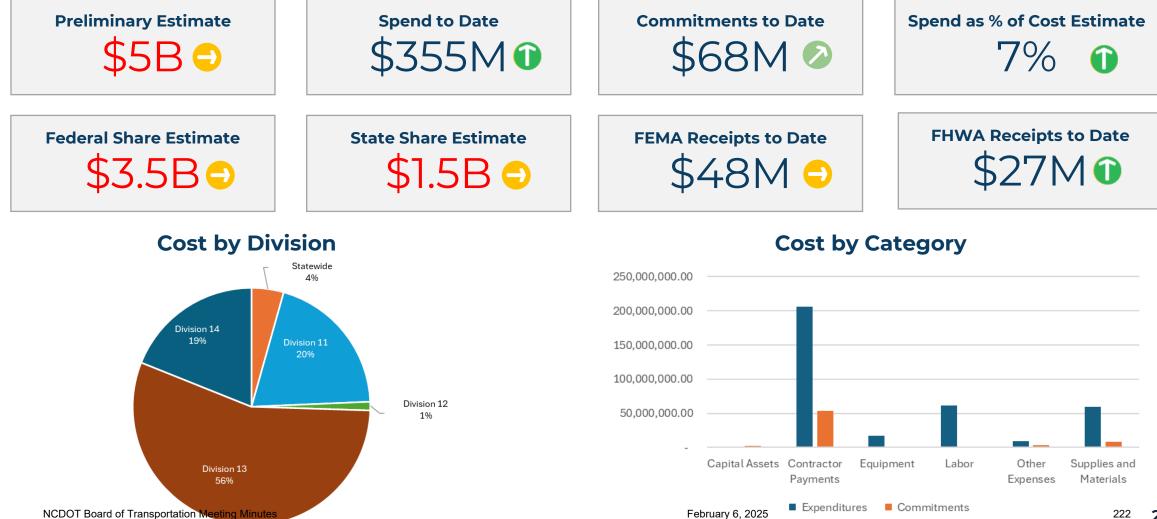

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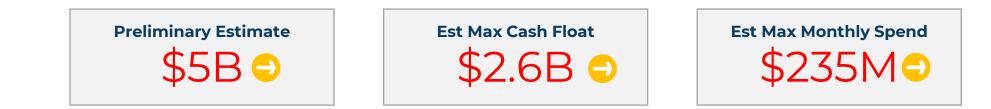


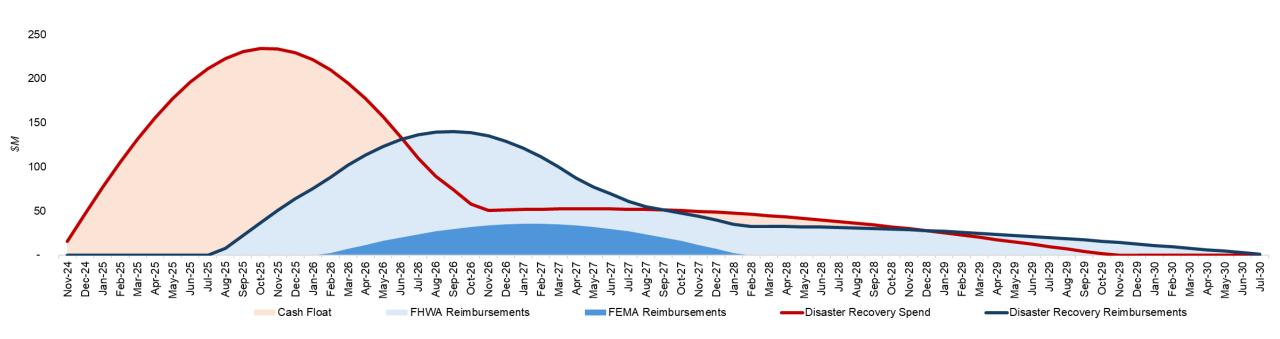
## Hurricane Helene Recovery | Financial Overview (January 31, 2025)





### Hurricane Helene Recovery | Initial Forecast Model (Nov. 12, 2024)





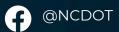

# Advance Construction (AC)

Definition:

• An authorization technique that allows FHWA to authorize a project without obligating federal funds. FHWA approves a project as being eligible for federal funding, but does not commit to funding the project.

Advantage:

• Maintains eligibility for future reimbursement without a commitment of current Budget Authority (BA) and Obligation Authority (OA)

Effective use of AC requires:

- Availability of state funds to pay project bills until reimbursement
- A stable federal program

# Traditional Funding vs. Advance Construction

#### **Traditional Funding**

• Uses full Obligation Authority (OA) and Budget Authority (BA) when authorizing funds

For example, \$10M Federal Construction Authorization/Obligation

- \$8M (80%) in Federal Funds obligated immediately in year 1
- \$2M (20%) remaining covered with State Match

#### **Advance Construction**

• Obligates funding over several years rather than at the beginning of a project

For example, \$10M Federal Construction Authorization/Obligation

- \$8M (80%) in Federal Funds authorized but not fully obligated until expenditures occur
  - Convert and Obligate \$2M in year 2
  - Convert and Obligate \$4M in year 3
  - Convert and Obligate \$2M in year 4
- \$2M (20%) remaining covered with State Match

Advance Construction Workgroup

Session Law 2020 -91 required DOT to submit a report to the General Assembly about the use of AC at NCDOT

Workgroup was formed September 2020 to investigate AC usage and make any needed recommendations

- Implemented AC Policy including oversight March 2021
- At end of each Federal Fiscal Year (FFY), analysis is completed on:
  - Current AC funding levels
  - Expected AC conversion for next 2 FFY's
  - Expected new AC funding for next 2 FFY's

# AC Control and Monitoring

Two types of AC are considered separately:

- GARVEE: NC General Assembly has statutory limits in place and therefore the policy did not require any additional tests.
- Non-GARVEE AC: AC policy requires 2 tests to ensure AC usage is monitored and used prudently. (Federal funding used for GARVEE payments is subtracted prior to performing tests)

# Constraints for GARVEE AC

First Constraint: The greater of the two following tests

- Outstanding principal cannot exceed authorized federal funds in the prior FFY
- Maximum annual principal and interest does not exceed 20% of expected average annual federal revenue shown for the seven-year period in the most recently adopted S TIP

Second Constraint: The amount of revenues for the FFY of issuance and previous FFY shall be at least 300 percent of the maximum annual payments for all bonds.

# Constraints for Non -GARVEE AC

First Constraint: Limit AC (by funding source) to 4 years of anticipated federal apportionments

Second Constraint: Limit amount of unreimbursed state funds (by funding source) on AC to 1 year of anticipated federal apportionment

# First Constraint Test FFY 2025 National Highway Performance Program (NHPP) Example

First, calculate limit for threshold:

- FFY 2025 Apportionment = \$803.8M
- Amount of NHPP needed for GARVEE payment = \$115.5M
- Net FFY 2025 NHPP apportionment = \$803.8M \$115.5M = \$688.3M
- Limit on NHPP AC = \$688.3M x 4 = \$2,753M

Next, calculate projected AC balance at end of FFY 2025:

- AC balance at end of FFY 2024\* = \$1,975.9M
- Projected obligations in FFY 2025 = \$0.7M
- Projected new AC in FFY 2025 = \$445.9M
- Projected AC conversion in FFY 2025 (Net apportionment projected obligations) = \$688.3M – \$0.7M = \$687.6M
- Projected AC balance at end of FFY 2025 (AC balance at end of FFY 2024 + new AC AC conversions) = \$1,975.9M + \$445.9M \$687.6M = \$1,734M
- \$1,734M is under the 4 -year limit of \$2,753M, we pass first test

# Second Constraint Test FFY 2025 NHPP Example

- Net FFY 2025 NHPP apportionment = \$688.3M
- Current amount of unreimbursed NHPP AC expenditures\* = \$110M
- Since \$110M < \$688.3M, we pass the second test

Note: This test needs to be done in real time, so we have done the calculation for the end of FFY 2024. We also check periodically throughout the year.

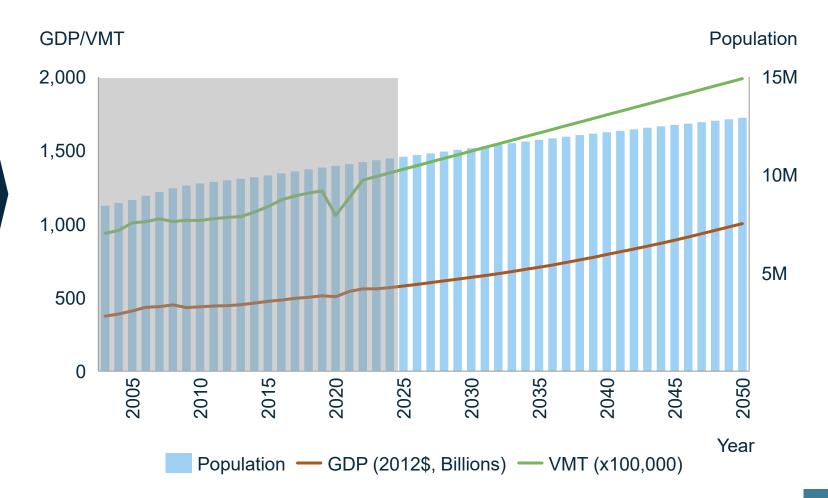

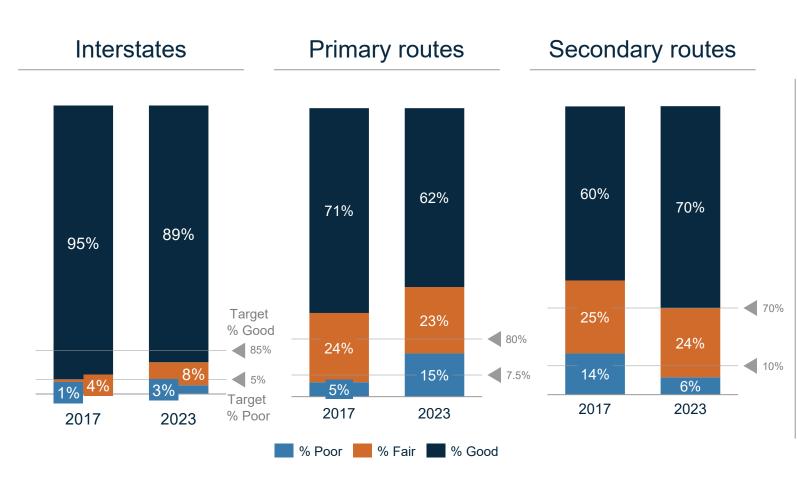

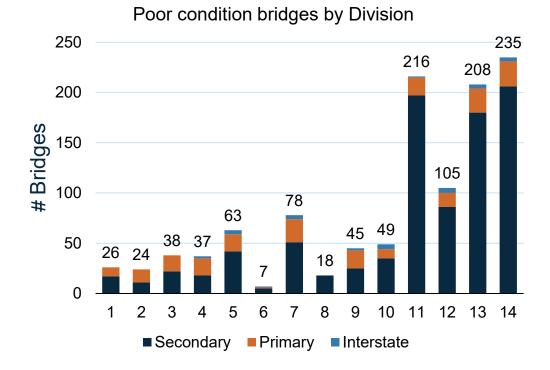

Location of bridges in poor condition



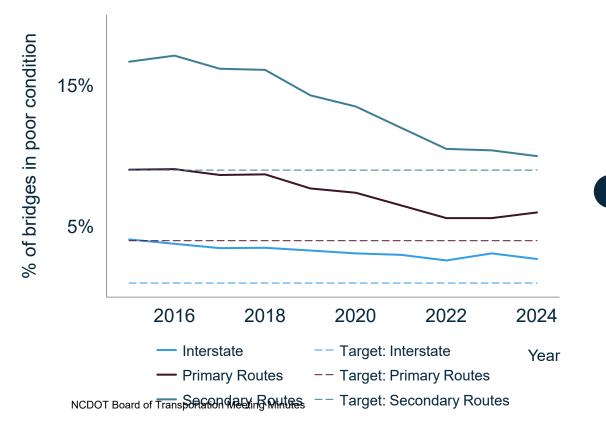

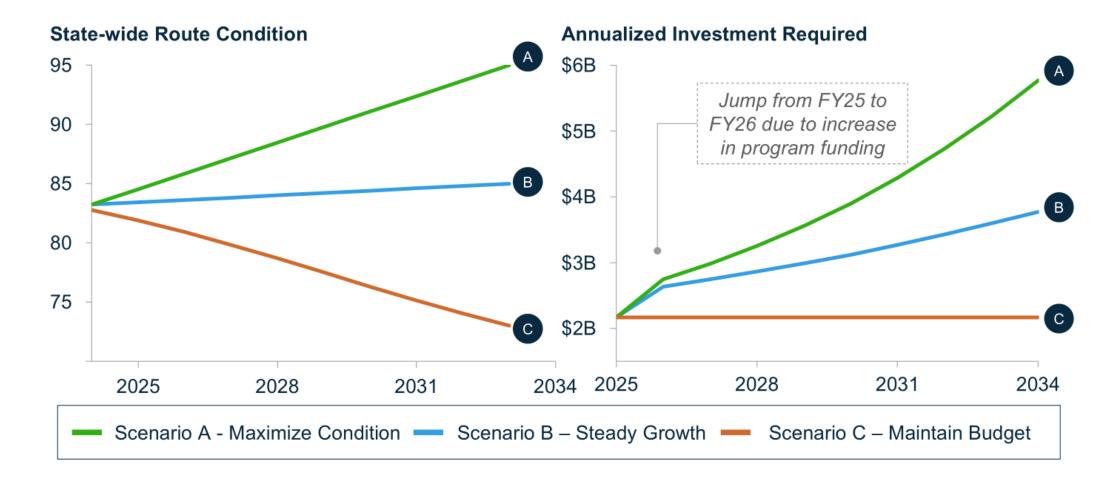

- Rail car bridges have proven to be a cost effective and timely solution to restore traffic after bridge washouts
- Innovative Bridge Company has teamed up with local contractors to install more than 25 rail car bridges as of January 21, 2025, with 6 more planned or under construction.

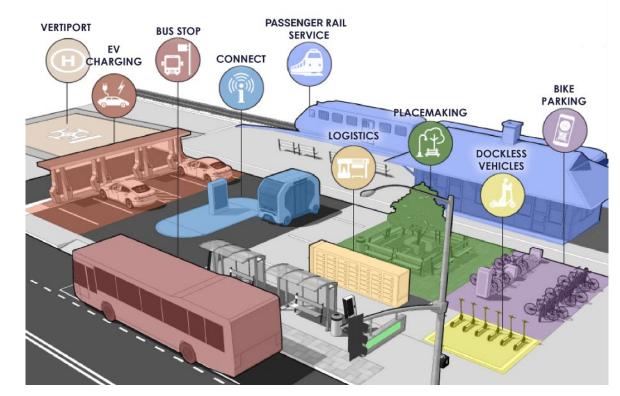


# What is a Mobility Hub?

Mobility hubs are a place of connectivity with regional and local multimodal transportation options, offering integrated facilities, amenities, technologies, and services.

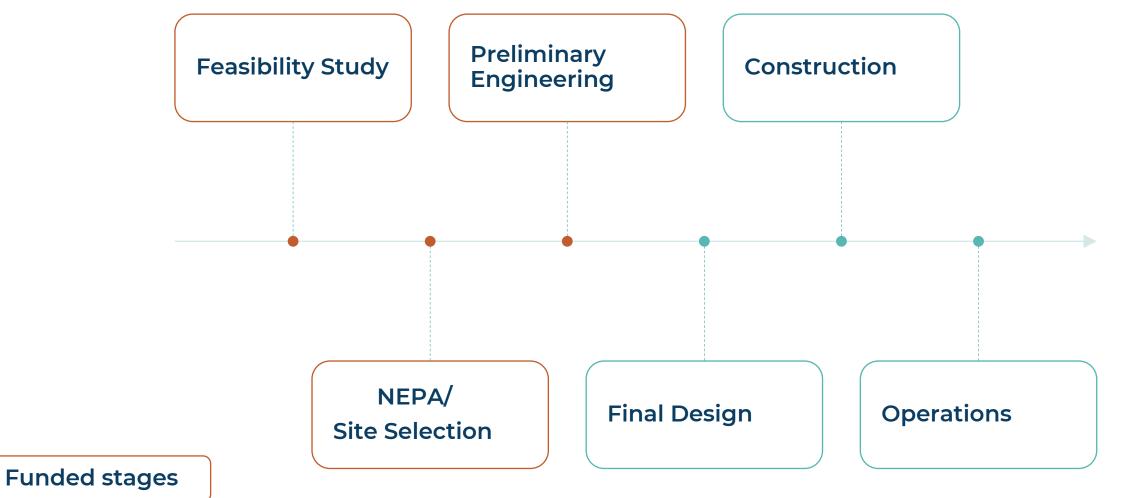

### FRA Project Lifecycle Stages – Corresponding FRA Funding Programs

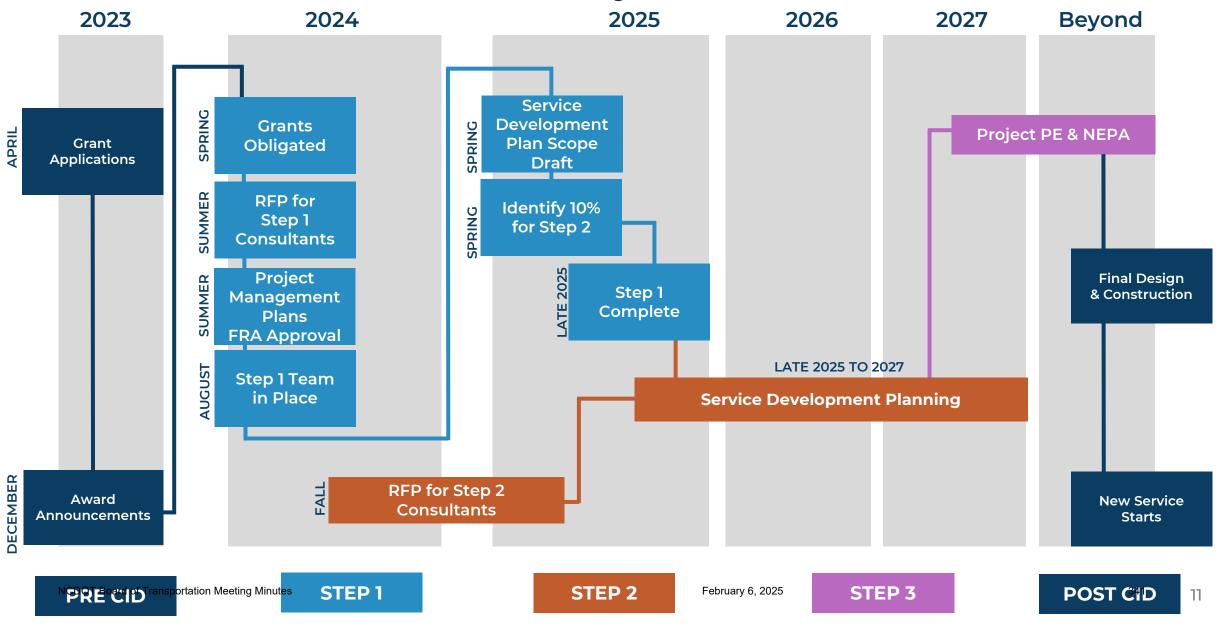

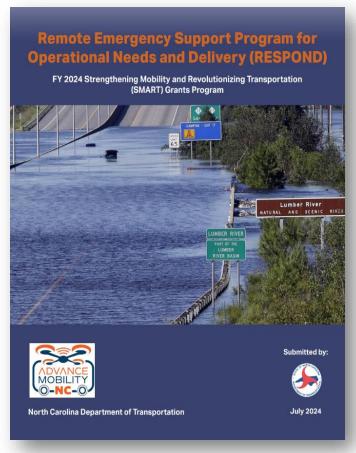
### **UAS – Helene Continued Response**

- **Continued UAS flights** throughout Western N.C. to assist with inspections, repairs, progression, and monitoring of post storm efforts.
- Multiple UAS Units and Contractors including NCDOT Aviation, Location and Surveys, Divisions, Environmental, NC Wildlife, NC Forestry, and NC Emergency Services continue to fly missions daily based on post storm efforts focusing on their specific areas of expertise.
  - Since Helene, Location and Surveys has flown 50+ missions for Express Bridge design to share with Project Managers for scoping and design work.
  - Aviation UAS work closely with these teams/units to ensure flights are captured, safety is of top
    priority, and to address any issues units or pilots may have.

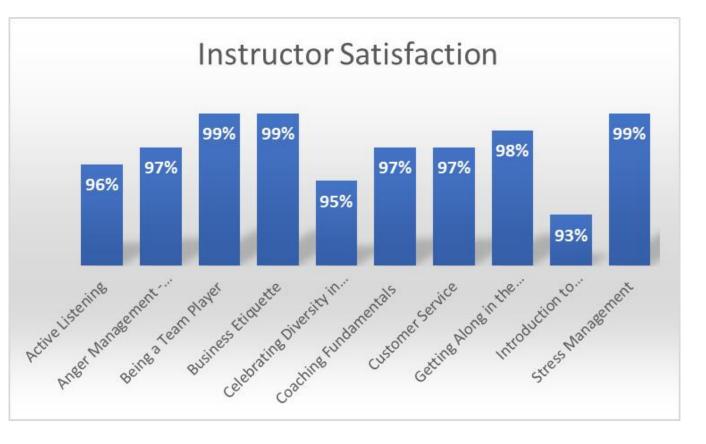

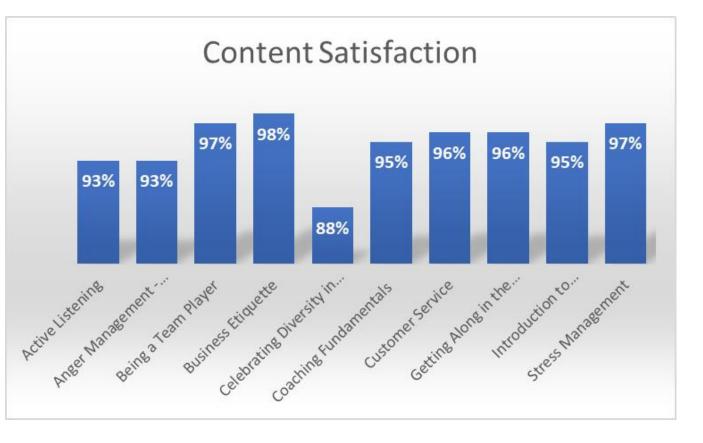

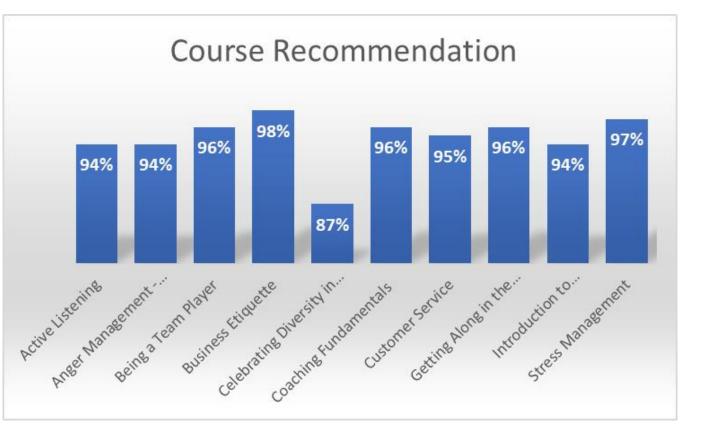

## **RESOLUTION FOR EPUTY PAUL FUTRELL** BRIDGE

WHEREAS, Paul H. Futrell was a veteran of the United States Marine Corps, where he served as a military policeman; and,

WHEREAS, Futrell was a husband and father of two, a son and a daughter; and,

WHEREAS, after leaving the Marine Corps, Futrell went on to attend Halifax Community College, where he received his certification in Basic Law Enforcement Training; and,

WHEREAS, a short time after graduating from the police academy, Futrell began his career as a deputy sheriff with the Hertford County Sheriff's Office, where he served for nearly two years until his untimely death at the age of 36; and,

WHEREAS, Futrell died in the line of duty after he was shot following a domestic dispute in Cofield, N.C.; and,
