Summer Internship Program

The N.C. Department of Transportation's Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU)/Minority-Serving Institutions (MSI) Internship Program provides hands-on, real-world experience for students. Throughout the 10-week summer program (May-July), interns gain knowledge, resources and expertise that they can apply to their future careers.

Essential components of the internship experience include professional development workshops on skills such as resume building, business writing and networking. Interns also work with executive and senior leadership staff at NCDOT and develop important connections that can be helpful in future professional endeavors. Participants work 40 hours per week and earn a stipend during the summer.

HBCU Fellows Program

The N.C. HBCU/MSI Fellows Program offers workplace experiences and learning opportunities at the NCDOT to recent graduates (must have graduated within the past one to three years) with bachelor's or master's degrees from North Carolina's HBCUs or MSI.

HBCU Fellows serve a two-year commitment in a NCDOT unit/division where they will learn about the agency and participate in professional certification and developmental opportunities. Fellows will be placed in positions at the department as needed and will gain knowledge and experience to prepare them for permanent employment.

Fellows with a bachelor's degree are paid \$20 per hour, while those with a master's degree earn \$22 per hour. (Please note that salary/other benefits are subject to change)

The N.C. HBCU/MSI Scholarship Program helps foster new and diverse transportation professionals. Scholarships support students pursuing undergraduate and master's degrees in transportation-related fields.

This program provides \$2,500 in financial assistance every academic year to help cover costs for highly motivated future transportation professionals and leaders.
