Department of Transportation Cash Balance Report Pursuant to Session

Law

Pursuant to Session Law 2014-100 §24.23(c), the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) is required to report its cash balance when in excess of one billions dollars at the end of each month. As of March 31, 2017, the balance is \$2.1 billion, which is 152 days of working capital.

Over the past 60 days, there has been an in-depth assessment of the cash balance buildup. The assessment found the following:

- Capital program delivery rate is below 80% on average
- Operation program spend plans are not being tracked
- No program delivery executive oversight
- No process for adjusting projects and programs due to revenue and delivery changes

The Department will immediately begin the following oversight measures:

- Executive Team will review bi-monthly status of all projects above \$100M
- Senior leaders will review monthly projects less than \$100M
- Spend plans will be tracked monthly to make necessary adjustments to programs

Through the recent assessment the department has made adjustments to nearly 600 project schedules that have resulted in increasing annual lettings from \$1.7B to \$2.6B. It is anticipated that with the implementation of capital project changes, operational program changes and increased oversight the cash balance will be below \$1B by the end of the 1st quarter of SFY 2018/2019.
