1 19A NCAC 02D .0405 is proposed for repeal through readoption as follows: 2 3 19A NCAC 02D .0405 EXAMPLES OF CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES 4 5 Maintenance funds shall be used to keep a road or highway in its existing condition and traffic carrying capacity. 6 Construction funds shall be used in improving the road or highway so that its traffic carrying capacity is improved or 7 increased. Some examples are listed below: 8 Roadway Maintenance 9 mowing shoulders and right of way; (a) 10 (b) pulling or cleaning of roadway and drainage ditches; cutting down shoulders and uniforming slopes; 11 (c) 12 (d) machining unpaved roads; 13 adding surfacing material 2 inches or less in thickness on unpaved roads; (e) 14 (f) placing of dust laying materials; 15 patching pavements; (g) 16 resurfacing 1-1/2 inches or less in thickness on paved roads; (h) 17 snow and ice removal; (i) 18 storm clean up; (j) 19 replacing existing pipe culverts whether same size or not; (k) 20 (1) patching or replacing floors, rails or individual stringers on timber bridges; 21 placing of driveway pipe purchased by property owner. Traffic Services Maintenance 26 27 (a) maintenance of traffic control equipment including traffic signals, flashers, and special 28 signaling devices and their related equipment such as signal heads, cabinets, detectors, 29 and any other auxiliary equipment; 30 (b) maintenance and replacement of signs, including posts and hardware; 31 installation of new signs when not otherwise provided for; (c) 32 (d) re marking pavements, including center lines, lane lines, edge lines, pavement symbols 33 and messages, stop bars, crosswalks, etc; new pavement markings when not otherwise provided for; 34 35 maintenance and replacement of traffic channelization devices, traffic islands and 36 curbing; 37 installation of spot traffic channelization devices, traffic islands and curbing. (g) 38 Roadway Construction adding surfacing material over 2 inches in thickness on unpaved roads; 39 (a) 40 (b) resurfacing over 1-1/2 inches in thickness on paved roads; 41 widening unpaved roads; (c) (d) widening existing pavement or shoulders; 42 widening or strengthening bridges or box culverts, extension of pipe culverts for widened 43 (e) 44 roadways; 45 (f) construction or rebuilding of bridges: 46 placing of pipe culverts on improvement projects; (g) 47 placing of storm drainage on existing roadways; (h) 48 (i) construction of curb and gutter; 49 (i) all work and materials in the widening, improvement or relocation of a road; 50 state's part in participation paving which allows adjacent property owners to contribute to 51 the cost of paving or other improvement. 52 **Landscape Construction** 53 initial seeding of improvement or new road construction, 54 (b) initial selective cutting,
