## **ALTERNATIVE FUTURES**

The four potential Alternative Futures the team identified were named: Globally Connected, Renewed, Innovative, and Unstable.

In a **Globally Connected** future, economic growth in manufacturing, technology, automation and services position North Carolina as a leading market for a skilled workforce. In a **Renewed** future, small towns and rural communities grow and are more connected to each other and urban centers by various forms of transportation.

In an **Innovative** future, technology in transportation drives new development patterns and economic growth. In an **Unstable** future, funding instability, policital and social events, environmental threats, and energy uncertainty stalls tourism and stagnates the economy.

Sixty-two attendees at the NC Moves 2050 stakeholder meetings represented various interest groups.

Below are some of the key takeaways from the stakeholder discussions on each future:

- Globally Connected: technology will change the way we use transportation; the future creates higher carbon demand.
- **Innovative:** overall system is more efficient and able to optimize existing capacity; access to the "connected" system not equitable, affordable, or available to all.
- significant Renewed: policy shift and investments to realize this future; increased level of affordable, accessible transportation support services and connections.
