Youth, Motorcycle & Bicycle Safety Campaigns

May is National Youth Traffic Safety Month, Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month and National Bicycle Safety Month.

Modern Bridge Opens in Brunswick County

CALABASH – A taller, longer bridge spanning the Calabash River opened April 24 ahead of schedule, restoring an important coastal corridor and providing a safer evacuation route.

The new bridge on Beach Drive SW (N.C. 179 Business) replaced one built in 1975 that the N.C. Department of Transportation had to close temporarily for several past storms, including Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and Hurricane Ian in 2022. Some of the storms required emergency repairs and additional maintenance.

"This is a critical route for our beach communities, which have endured a detour while the bridge was being reconstructed to modern standards," said Trevor Carroll, the Department's Division 3 engineer based in Castle Hayne.

Wrightsville Beach Bridge Replacements

WRIGHTSVILLE BEACH – Planning and development are underway by the N.C. Department of Transportation to replace three bridges that connect Wrightsville Beach. While all three bridges remain safe, they are nearing the end of their life cycle and must be monitored, inspected and maintained on a more frequent basis.

The two bridges along West Salisbury Street (U.S. 74) that cross Lees Cut and Banks Channel and the South Banks Channel Bridge on Causeway Drive (U.S. 76) will be replaced with new structures.


