Youth, Motorcycle & Bicycle Safety Campaigns

May is National Youth Traffic Safety Month, Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month and National Bicycle Safety Month.

Raeford Road in Fayetteville Temporarily Closed




FAYETTEVILLE – A section of Raeford Road near Highland Country Club closed this spring to replace a culvert by a state highway contractor.

The 7-foot-wide concrete culvert that drains Branson Creek underneath Raeford Road was built in 1940s, and is nearing the end of its lifespan. The new culvert will improve drainage for this road. This road is scheduled to reopen by the end of this year

I-295 and I-95 Interchange Fully Opens

HOPE MILLS – Great news! You can now hop onto I-295 North (Fayetteville Outer Loop) from I-95 North at Exit 38 in northern Robeson County, or take I-295 South to I-95 North. Our contractors fully opened this interchange on April 29.

The rest of the outer loop, from <u>Camden Road to Raeford Road</u> in western Fayetteville is scheduled to be completed by early summer 2026.
